Game Day Services

All working media will be seated at press row, opposite the team benches. The media room will open approximately one hour prior to each game. Notes, rosters, media guides, game protocol sheets and game programs will be available in the room. Several telephones are available, upon request. Halftime stats and complete post-game packages will be distributed.

Broadcast Policy

Permission to broadcast Villanova women's basketball games in The Pavilion must be obtained from Dean Kenefick, Associate Athletics Director/Communications, no later than two weeks prior to game day. A fee of \$75 per phone line will be charged and checks can be made payable to "Villanova University." All requests must be made in writing and on company letterhead. Unless otherwise stated, there will be no electronic media timeout during games.

Post-Game Interviews

Following a 10 minute "cooling off" period, Villanova head coach Harry Perretta and Villanova players will be available to the media in The Pavilion Press Room. By Villanova University policy, the locker room is closed to all members of the media. Post-game requests for opponents should be arranged through the opponent SID. On the road, Villanova players and coaches will be available in areas designated by the host SID.

Non Game Day Interviews

All requests for interviews with Villanova players and coaches must be arranged through Dean Kenefick, Associate Athletics Director/Communications. 24-hour notice is required on all non gameday interviews. All interviews will be arranged through the Office of Media Relations.

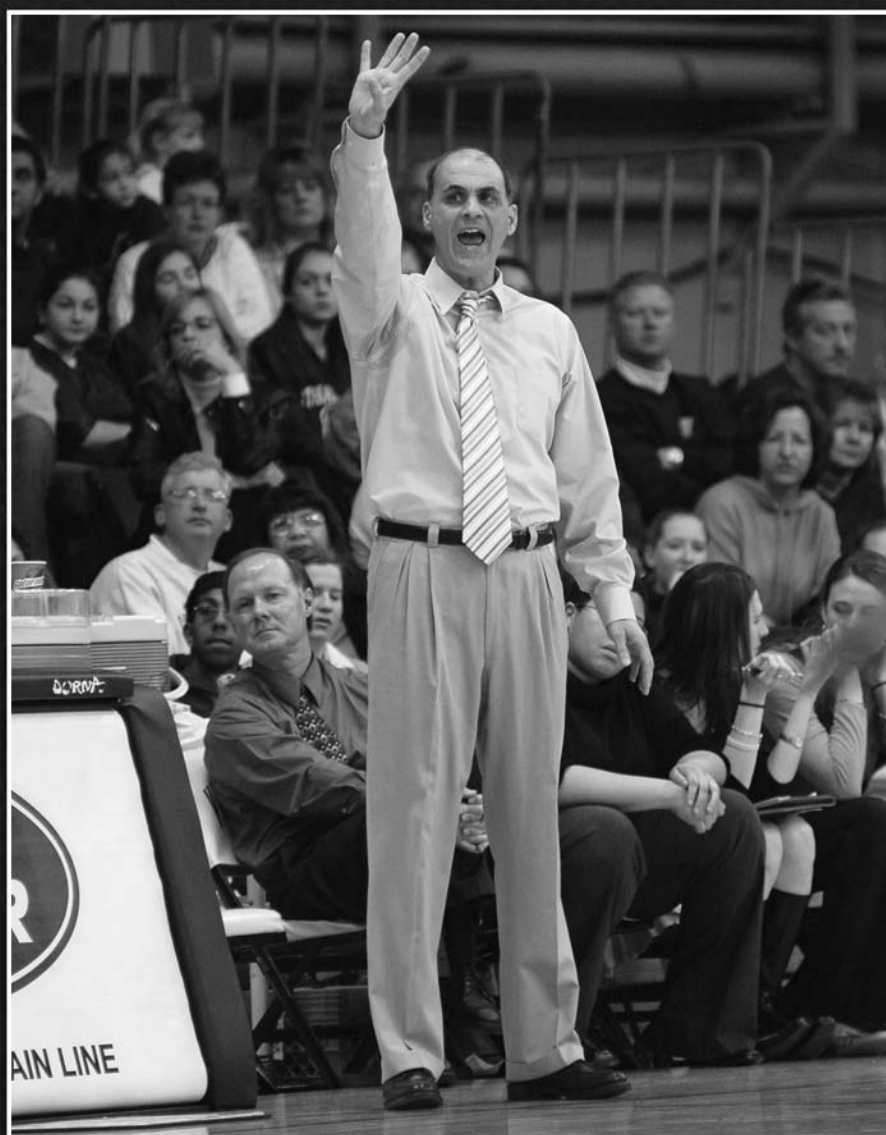

off the court, Perretta strives to have a positive influence on his student-athletes not only as basketball players, but also as people.

In his 28-year Villanova career, Perretta has tallied a career record of 528-292. His 528 wins place him 21st on the winningest active collegiate coaching list, and ranks him as the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women. Over the last six seasons, Perretta has compiled an impressive 133-56 record.

Perretta registered his 14th career 20-win season in 2005-06 by leading the Wildcats to a 21-11 record. This was the fifth time in the last six years that Perretta led his team to a 20-win campaign. Villanova earned a WNIT berth, giving the Wildcats their seventh-straight postseason appearance. After playing in the 2000 WNIT, Villanova went to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments from 2001-2004 before playing in the WNIT the last two seasons. Also, in 2005-06, Perretta coached senior forward Liad Suez-Karni to first team All-Big East accolades.

In 2004-05, Perretta became the 26th Division I women's basketball head coach to win 500 games when the Wildcats defeated Pittsburgh, 70-49, on February 2. Villanova finished the season with a 19-12 overall record and qualified for the postseason for the sixth-straight season with a WNIT berth.

One year earlier, Perretta led his team to a fourth-straight 20-win campaign and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth where the Wildcats advanced to the second round. Perretta also coached his squad to a second-straight Philadelphia Big Five title in 2003-04. For his efforts, he was named Big Five Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

The 2002-03 season was a special one for Perretta and the Wildcats. In addition to an impressive 28-6 overall record and a 12-4 Big East Conference mark, Perretta led the Wildcats to their third Big East Conference Tournament championship and first since 1987 with an improbable 52-48 upset over previously unbeaten Connecticut. The win snapped Connecticut's NCAA Division I women's basketball record of 70-straight victories and ended Connecticut's streak of

nine-straight conference tournament championships.

The 28 wins recorded in 2002-03 is the second most victories in school history. Villanova was rewarded for its season by earning a No. 2 seed in the 2002-03 NCAA Tournament which is the highest seed ever for a Philadelphia area women's basketball team. In the NCAA Tournament, the Wildcats recorded wins over St. Francis (Pa.), George Washington and Colorado and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in the program's history. Also, during the 2002-03 season, Villanova went 4-0 in the Philadelphia Big Five to capture the City Series championship and he was named the Big Five Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career. Under Perretta's guidance, senior guard Trish Juhline led the Big East in scoring and garnered first team All-Big East acclaim for the second-straight year, while senior forward Katie Davis was named second team All-Big East and junior guard/forward Courtney Mix was a Big East Honorable Mention Team selection. In addition, Juhline was named the Big East Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

In 2001-02, Perretta guided Villanova to a 20-11 mark and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA's, Villanova received the No. 9 seed in the west region where they defeated Pepperdine in the first round before losing to No. 1 seed Oklahoma in the second round. Under Perretta's tutelage, junior guard Trish Juhline became the first Wildcat since 1994-95 to be named first team All-Big East. Perretta also helped senior point guard Mimi Riley earn Big East Honorable Mention acclaim in 2001-02.

The 2000-01 season was a memorable one for Perretta, as he led his team to a 22-9 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Tournament where they

advanced to the second round. In a 60-55 win over Temple on Dec. 2, 2000, Perretta won his 400th career game and with the 61-45 victory over Providence on Feb. 24, 2001, he became the all-time winningest coach in the history of Villanova basketball for both men and women

with career win number 414. For his efforts in 2000-01, Perretta was named the Philadelphia Big Five Co-Coach of the Year. Also that season, Perretta helped senior center Brandi Barnes earn third team All-Big East distinction and sophomore guard Trish Juhline garner Big East Honorable Mention acclaim. In the Philadelphia Big Five, freshman forward Courtney Mix was named Rookie of the Year.

In 1995-96, Perretta led his team to a 21-7 record and added to his already impressive resume when he earned Big East Coach of the Year honors along with the Philadelphia Big Five Coach-of-the-Year award. Already the winningest coach in Villanova women's basketball history, on January 8, 1995 against the Georgetown Hoyas, Perretta earned his 300th career win at the age of 39. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year.

The dean of the Big East and Big 5 coaches, Perretta has brought the Wildcats national respect and success during his tenure at Villanova. Always a crowd favorite wherever he goes, he is one of the most animated and vocal coaches in the country, continually instructing his players during the course of a game. Year-in and year-out, his teams are feared for their aggressive play, disciplined style, defensive prowess and pre-game preparations of an opponent.

A teacher of basketball, Perretta also realizes the importance of the overall college experience. He and his staff follow closely each player's academic progress, and in his 29 years at Villanova, 99 percent of the student-athletes who has stayed all four years has received her degree. Perretta is also a firm believer of using the basketball experience to teach his players lessons on life. Upon graduation, it is a sure bet that Perretta's players will leave Villanova as better basketball players and, in addition to being prepared to be a success in whatever career avenue they choose.

During his career on the Main Line, he has led the Wildcats to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, national rankings in the Associated Press poll, Big East regular season and tournament championships in both 1985-86 and 1986-87, the 2003 Big East Tournament title, seven outright and four shared Big 5 titles, and fourteen 20-win or better seasons. In addition, one of his players, Shelly Pennefather, was recognized in 1987 as the nation's top women's basketball player, winning the Margaret Wade Trophy and earning Kodak All-America honors.

"This program is something I feel is my own, my own personal project," stated Perretta. "When I got here, there wasn't much to start with. Yet, all the players we have brought in have graduated, we've had an All-American and gone to the Final Four (1982). The fact that we are considered one of the better teams in the country over the last 29 years makes me proud. I can honestly say that I wouldn't want to coach anywhere but Villanova."

Perretta began his career on the Main Line in 1978 at the age of 21, the youngest coach ever to head a women's program at Villanova. In his first season, he led the 'Cats to a 17-8 record and was a finalist for the AIAW small college coach of the year. During his career, Perretta and the Wildcats have had many highlights, including reaching the Final Four of the AIAW in 1982. The 1982-83 season saw Villanova begin play in NCAA Division I and in the Big East Conference. Since joining the Big East in 1982, Perretta has compiled a 190-137 conference record.

"It is hard to believe that I have been at Villanova for 29 years. It seems like yesterday that I was just beginning my career here," said Perretta. "When I think back over the years, it is amazing to me how many special people I have come in contact with. I have been very fortunate to have some great people play for me here at Villanova. I consider myself lucky that I have been able to coach at one place my entire career."

Perretta attended Lycoming College after earning All-Catholic League honors at Monsignor Bonner High School in Upper Darby, Pa. His playing career was cut short, however, by an ankle injury during his freshman year at Lycoming.

Season Preview

2006-07 Preview

Villanova was hit hard by graduation following last year's 21-11 record. The Wildcats lost four starters and five letterwinners from last season's squad due to graduation. Head coach Harry Perretta must find a way to replace 66.6 percent of the scoring from a year ago (1,340 of 2,009 points scored by graduation seniors) and 73.6 percent of the made three-point field goals (187 of 254 made three-pointers by graduating seniors).

"It is going to be an interesting year. I don't remember having a team as young as this group is," said Perretta. "Of our first nine players, seven will be freshmen and sophomores. One thing they have going for them is that they are a very hard-working group. Hopefully, we can learn and mature as the year moves along."

Forwards

The leader of the 2006-07 Villanova team is expected to be senior forward **Jackie Adamshick (6-0, Allentown, Pa.)** who will be starting for the third consecutive season. Adamshick has the ability to score in the lane, in addition to shooting range that extends to the three-point line. Last season, Adamshick finished second on the team in scoring with a 10.7 points per game average and she led the team in rebounding with a 6.3 rebounds per contest average. As a sophomore in 2004-05, she averaged a team-best 13.2 points per game and a team-high 5.8 rebounds per contest en route to earning second team All-Conference accolades.

Joining Adamshick at forward will be junior **Stacie Witman (6-0, Plymouth Meeting, Pa.)**. After seeing time as a reserve the last two years, Witman looks poised to be a consistent contributor this season. Witman is a good athlete who can score by posting up and shooting the

three-ball. In 32 contests a year ago, Witman averaged 4.0 points per game and 2.3 rebounds per contest.

Two other Wildcats who look to be in the mix at the forwards spots are sophomore **Briana Weiss (6-0, Piedmont, Calif.)** and freshman **Amanda Swiezynski (6-0, Exeter, N.H.)**. Weiss is a fundamentally sound player who has a good feel for the game. She should use the experience she gained last year to earn valuable minutes this season. Swiezynski, who possesses a good mid-range jump shot, is a versatile performer who can play a number of positions.

"The forward position is the one spot where we have some experience," said Perretta. "Jackie is a three-year starter who has played a lot of valuable minutes during her career. We will be relying heavily on her for leadership. Stacie looks like she is ready to become a mainstay in the line-up."

Center

Sophomore **Lisa Karcic (6-1, New Hyde Park, N.Y.)** will occupy the center position. The multi-talented Karcic will be a key to the Wildcats success this season. Karcic is a player who can cause mismatch problems for opponents due to her versatility. An outstanding passer, Karcic can score inside and outside. In 12.7 minutes per game last year, she averaged 4.3 points per contest and 2.9 rebounds per game. For the Wildcats to be successful this year, Karcic will need to develop into a primetime performer. Karcic will also see time at the forward position.

"Lisa is an important player for us. Her versatility allows us to use her in a number of ways," said Perretta. "After gaining experience last year as a freshman, I am hoping Lisa is ready to raise her game to another level this season."

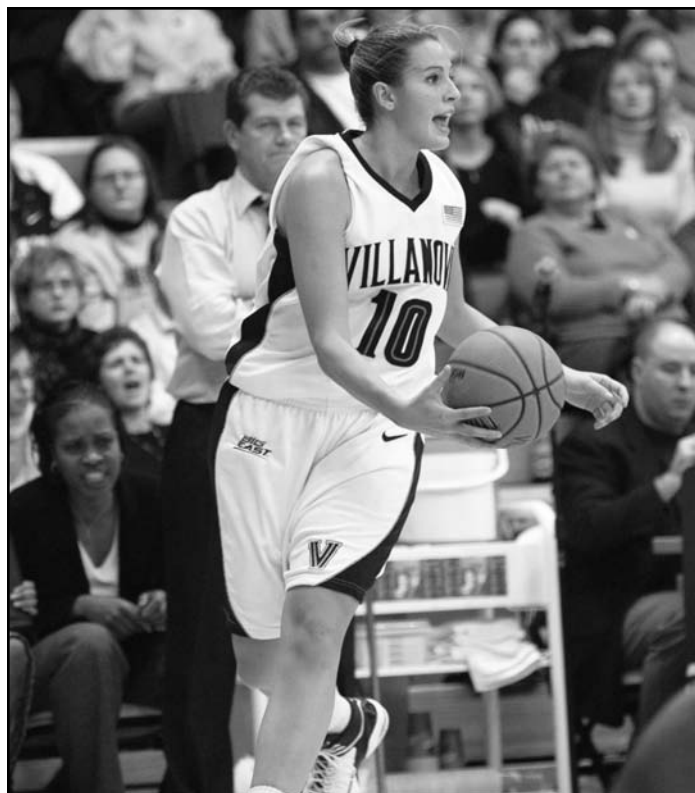
Two other players expected to be in the mix at center are freshmen **Heather Scanlon (6-3, Drexel Hill, Pa.)** and **Shannon Elliott (6-2, Wilmington, Del.)**. Scanlon is a skilled performer with a wealth of potential. She will provide Villanova with much-needed size in the middle. Elliott is a hard worker with a bright future.

Guards

There will be a youth movement in the Villanova backcourt in 2006-07. The four players expected to see playing time at guard include sophomore **Siobhan O'Connor (5-6, West Chester, Pa.)** and redshirt freshmen **Kyle Dougherty (5-10, Sayre, Pa.)**, **Maria Getty (5-9, Centerville, Ohio)** and **Tia Grant (5-11, Lido Beach, N.Y.)**. O'Connor is hard-nosed competitor who plays the game with great passion. A tough-minded defender, O'Connor will see all of her playing time at point guard.

Dougherty, Getty and Grant will all be seeing their first college game experience this year after redshirting last season. Dougherty is a skilled offensive player with good ball handling skills. She will see minutes at both guard spots. Getty is a fundamentally sound player with a winning attitude. A highly-touted high school performer, Getty was a two-time All-State honoree in Ohio and as a senior in 2005 she was named Miss Ohio Basketball by the *Associated Press*. Getty will play both guard positions. Grant is an athletic performer with outstanding shooting range. A good defender, Grant will play the two-guard spot for the Wildcats. Grant may also see playing time at the small forward position.

"We have a very young group of guards," said Perretta. "They are a very unselfish group who all have a willingness to learn. The thing they need more than anything is game experience. My goal for them is to improve their play from game to game."

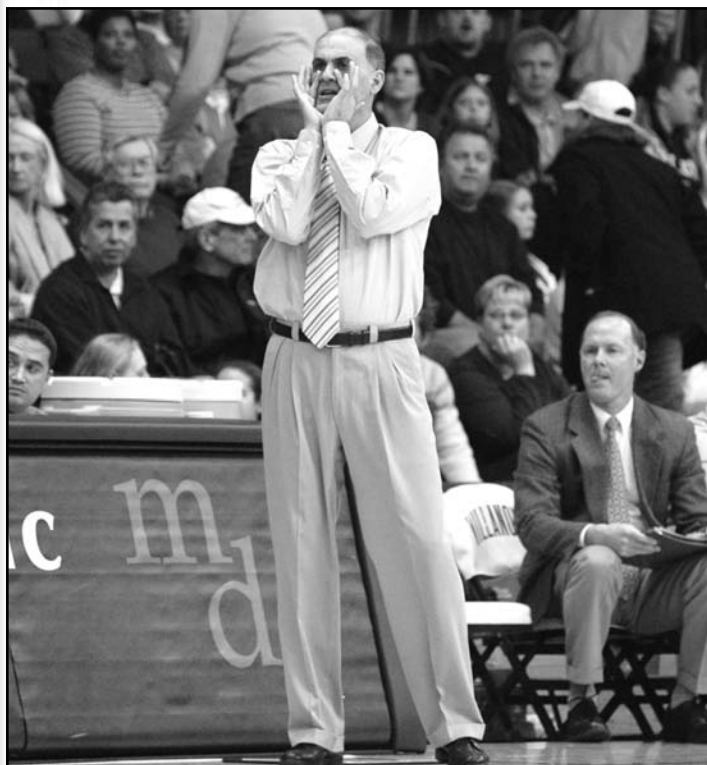
Schedule

Villanova will play a 29-game slate that includes 16 Big East Conference games, four Philadelphia Big Five contests and nine non conference clashes. The season gets underway at Delaware on Nov. 12. Two days later, the Wildcats host LaSalle in the home opener. The rest of November includes away contests at Fairfield (Nov. 17), the Florida International Tournament (Nov. 24-25) and George Washington (Nov. 29) and a home games versus Marist (Nov. 19). Joining Villanova and Florida International in the Thanksgiving Tournament are Tulane and North Florida.

December begins with the first Philadelphia Big Five battle of the year when the Wildcats travel to the Palestra to face Penn on Dec. 3. Following Penn, Villanova begins Big East play when South Florida comes to town on Dec. 7. The 'Cats play at Binghamton on Dec. 10 and host Temple on Dec. 22. The 2006 portion of the schedule ends with home dates against Loyola (Md) on Dec. 28 and Manhattan on Dec. 30.

After playing at Saint Joseph's on Jan. 3 in the final non conference game of the year, Villanova will play 15 consecutive Big East games. In conference action, the Wildcats will host South Florida, DePaul, St. John's, Louisville, Notre Dame, Rutgers and Providence and the team will play at Syracuse, Marquette, Georgetown, Pittsburgh, Seton Hall, Cincinnati and Connecticut. Villanova will play a home and home with West Virginia.

Big East Conference

In 2006-07, the BIG EAST will be in its second year as the nation's largest Division I-A conference. The first year with 16 members was wrought with curiosity among those in the world of collegiate athletics and in the media, but the league thrived in its new alignment, enjoying significant success in the athletic arenas, on the playing fields and in the classroom.

The goals of the BIG EAST have remained constant throughout its history — to compete at the highest level and to do so with integrity and sportsmanship.

In men's basketball last year, BIG EAST squads secured a league-record eight NCAA bids. Seven BIG EAST women's basketball teams earned NCAA berths. In football, West Virginia

garnered the attention of the college football world with its victory over Georgia in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The Mountaineers were the BIG EAST's representative in the Bowl Championship Series.

In 2005-06, the BIG EAST welcomed five new members to increase its membership to 16: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida. Some were ready to call the new BIG EAST alignment too unwieldy, but the league showed that there can be strength in numbers even when that number is a large one.

BIG EAST institutions reside in nine of the nation's top 34 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Milwaukee and Cincinnati. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets will contain almost one fourth of all television households in the U.S.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 25 national championships in six different sports and 124 student-athletes have won individual national titles.

In 2005-06, Providence College's Mary Cullen won the NCAA 5,000-meters crown. Also, the Villanova women's cross country team was named the NCAA's Silver Anniversary Cross Country Program. The Wildcats have won seven NCAA team titles since 1981. Former Wildcat standout Carole Zajac was named the top individual performer of the women's cross country era.

The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 350 student-athletes have earned Academic All-America honors. Last year, West Virginia's Joe Herber was named the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-American of the Year in men's basketball.

The BIG EAST has continued its basketball success in the 21st century. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA titles in the same season. With the Syracuse men and the UConn women grabbing NCAA crowns the previous year, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in consecutive seasons. In fact, the BIG EAST has won five of the last seven women's basketball crowns and three of the last eight men's titles.

Moving proactively has been a consistent strategy for the conference that was formed in 1979. The BIG EAST has continually turned challenges into opportunities to become stronger.

In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse and rowing to its growing list

of sports. The inaugural women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. The BIG EAST Conference has enjoyed a leadership role nationally. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record

of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization needs outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Dave Gavitt, moved into the Commissioner's chair in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed long-standing relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant at BIG EAST soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 550 BIG EAST athletes have earned All America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams. Several athletes earned gold medals in each of the last five summer Olympiads.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 athletes in 23 sports.

Commissioner Michael Tranghese

Mike Tranghese has accepted and answered the challenges of The BIG EAST Conference since he opened the league's doors as the first full-time employee in 1979. Now in his 17th year as Commissioner, he embarks on the second academic year of serving the nation's largest Division I-A conference. He will help the 16-member BIG EAST continue on its path of success with his effective leadership and staunch commitment to integrity.



The BIG EAST has always been a prominent player in the world of intercollegiate athletics, in large part because of Tranghese's efforts. He believes his job is to foster the best possible climates for BIG EAST student-athletes to succeed academically and athletically.

During his tenure as Commissioner, which began in 1990, Tranghese has been faced with critical membership issues on several occasions. The league has always emerged in a stronger position. In 2003-04, the BIG EAST addressed a changing national landscape and coordinated the entrance of five institutions for '05-06: the University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

The number of sponsored sports, now at 23, has risen steadily under Tranghese. He orchestrated the formation of BIG EAST football, which began in 1991. Tranghese, who is acknowledged as an industry leader in television negotiation and production, has been a central figure in every television negotiation in the league's history. All of this has been accomplished in an NCAA environment that seems to be in a continual state of change.

Tranghese's negotiating expertise has resulted in a long-term partnership with Madison Square

Garden, host of the BIG EAST Men's Basketball Championship since 1983. The league and the Garden will be partners at least through 2011.

Tranghese has ensured the league's position as a leader in television exposure. The BIG EAST has been a long-time partner with CBS Sports and ESPN and has enjoyed multi-year agreements with both entities in basketball and football. The league's current television contract also includes appearances on ABC.

Additionally, Tranghese was the force behind The BIG EAST Television Network, which was a benchmark for regional network television. In 1995, the league awarded ESPN, Inc. exclusive rights to all of its basketball and football games not broadcast on a national network.

Tranghese moved into the Commissioner's chair on June 21, 1990 and has been an active leader nationally since his appointment. During the 2002 and '03 football seasons, he was the lead administrator of the Bowl Championship Series, the group of major conferences and bowls that produces a national championship game and the best possible bowl matchups.

In 2000-01, he concluded a five-year term on the NCAA Men's Basketball Committee by serving as chair. Tranghese also has served as chair of the NCAA Men's Basketball Subcommittee on Television. He was on the NCAA's negotiating team that secured a record \$6 billion contract from CBS for broadcast rights to the men's basketball championship.

In addition, he has served as chair of the Division I-A Commissioners and the Collegiate Commissioners Association.

Shortly after being named Commissioner, Tranghese laid the groundwork and put together The BIG EAST Football Conference. In response

to the genesis of significant conference realignment nationally, he directed an expansion and created a unique eight-team football group. Despite its newborn status, the BIG EAST was a charter member of the major conference alliance now known as the Bowl Championship Series.

After establishing BIG EAST football, Tranghese guided the league through a critical time that many observers felt could have resulted in a permanent split among its members. In March, 1994, the conference added football members Rutgers University and West Virginia University as its 11th and 12th full-time members and maintained its overall structure.

Just four months later, the University of Notre Dame, clearly the nation's premier men's basketball independent, joined the BIG EAST. Rutgers, West Virginia and Notre Dame began BIG EAST competition in 1995-96.

Tranghese's career in college athletics began at American International College in his hometown of Springfield, Mass.

He was the sports information director at Providence College where he generated publicity for the nationally successful Friar teams of the 1970s under Dave Gavitt. As the media attention on Eastern college basketball and the growth of sports events on television increased, Gavitt and Tranghese were ready to take advantage. Gavitt became the BIG EAST's first Commissioner in 1979 and served until 1990 when Tranghese assumed the helm.

Under Tranghese, the BIG EAST championship slate has expanded from seven men's championships in 1979 to 23 men's and women's championships today.

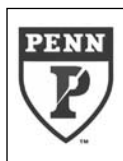
Tranghese is a 1965 graduate of St. Michael's College in Winooski, Vt. He is married to Susan Huntemann.

A Glimpse of Villanova



Founded in 1842 by the friars of the Order of St. Augustine, Villanova is a comprehensive Roman Catholic institution that welcomes students of all faiths. The University offers an extensive variety of undergraduate and graduate degree programs in business, engineering, law, liberal arts, nursing and the sciences.

A Solid Academic Reputation

The oldest and largest Catholic university in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Villanova is one of 262 institutions and one of 18 Catholic colleges or universities in the nation to have a chapter of the Phi Beta Kappa, the prestigious liberal arts honor society. For more than a decade, Villanova University has been ranked #1 by *US News and World Report* in the Best Universities-Master's category in the northern region.

The Student Body

Villanova enrolls more than 10,000 students annually in undergraduate and graduate programs. This academically talented and diverse group comes from 49 states, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and more than 40 foreign countries.

The Faculty

Villanova's 545 full-time faculty members, 90 percent of whom hold the highest degree in their field, teach classes that average 22 students. The undergraduate student/faculty ratio is 13:1.



The Campus

Located in a suburban community 12 miles (or 20 kilometers) west of Philadelphia, the picturesque 254-acre campus features more than 60 buildings, including a library with more than 800,000 volumes, an 12,000 seat

stadium, state of the art academic facilities, and 26 residence halls.

The Experience

Villanova students may choose to study abroad for a summer, semester, or year; compete on one of 11 men's or 13 women's NCAA Division I level (football is Division IAA) sports teams, immerse themselves in Campus Ministry, and take part in any of more than 130 campus organizations.

Financial Assistance

In 2006-2007, Villanova offered more than \$7.49 million in merit-based academic scholarships to first year undergraduate students. Villanova also offered more than \$31 million in need-based financial assistance to prospective freshmen through the Villanova grant program.

President, Rev. Peter M. Donohue, O.S.A.

On June 1, 2006, the Rev. Peter M. Donohue, O.S.A., began serving Villanova University as its 32nd president. He has been an integral member of the Villanova community for nearly two decades, during which time he has been immersed in all aspects of campus life.

An Active Member of the Villanova Community

Father Donohue is a tenured professor who from 1992 to 2006 served as chairman of the Villanova Theatre Department. He is an award-winning director whose productions have received nearly 30 nominations for Barrymore Awards, which recognize excellence in Philadelphia-area theatre. In 2002, Father Donohue's direction of "Chicago" won him the Barrymore's Harold Prince Award, presented for outstanding direction of a musical.

A visible presence at Villanova, Father Donohue may be best known among students for his vibrant liturgies, his longtime role as chaplain of the University's Naval ROTC program, and for regularly hosting groups for dinner at Burns Hall, one of the Augustinian friaries on campus. Father Donohue also assists at St. Thomas of Villanova Parish on weekends and has officiated at numerous



weddings of University alumni throughout the country.

Father Donohue is a member of the Augustinian Institute Advisory Board, has served as a faculty representative on the Board of Trustees Academic Affairs Committee, and has been a member of numerous committees at Villanova, including the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences Diversity Committee, the Strategic Planning Committee,

and the University Judicial Boards. In addition, he was a member of the NCAA Certification Self-Study committees of 1996-1997 and 2001-2002. Father Donohue also served two terms as a member of the Board of Trustees of Merrimack College in North Andover, Mass.

A Villanova Alumnus

Born in Bronx, N.Y., and raised in Royal Oak, Mich., Father Donohue received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Villanova in 1975. He was ordained a Roman Catholic priest in the Order of Saint Augustine in 1979. In 1983, he received a Master of Arts in theatre from the Catholic University of America and in 1985 received a Master of Divinity from the Washington Theological Union. In 1990, he was inducted into Phi Kappa Phi, the nation's oldest, largest, and most selective honor society for all academic disciplines.

Father Donohue received his doctorate in theatre history in 1992 from the University of Illinois, where he also was recognized for outstanding teaching.

A Vision for the Future

Father Donohue will be officially inaugurated as University president Sept. 8, 2006. He has chosen as the theme for his inauguration *Veritas, Unitas, Caritas: Instructing the Mind, Igniting the Heart, Illuminating the Spirit*. This theme is rooted in the principles of *truth, unity, and love*, which are central components of the University's Augustinian heritage and mission and which inspire Father Donohue's vision for Villanova's future.

Vince Nicastro

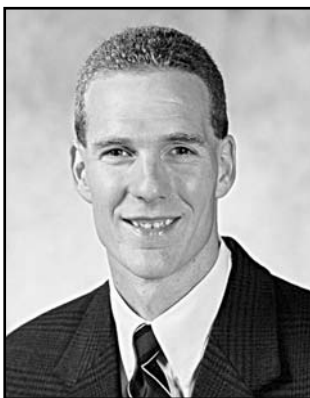
Vince Nicastro enters his seventh year as the Villanova University Director of Athletics in 2006-07. Nicastro oversees all aspects of the Wildcat athletics program and provides the leadership to bolster the Villanova "Tradition of Excellence" in the 21st century.

In his first six seasons at the helm, Nicastro has overseen significant success in the key areas of intercollegiate athletics.

Under his stewardship, the men's basketball program advanced to the Elite Eight in 2006 and Sweet 16 in 2005 and the Wildcat women's soccer team participated in four of the last five NCAA Tournaments, including a 2003 Sweet 16 berth. The Wildcat women's basketball team has tallied 20 wins or more in five of the last six seasons en route to earning seven straight postseason appearances, including a visit to the Elite Eight in 2003. The football team reached the NCAA I-AA semifinals in 2002 and Brian Westbrook earned the Walter Payton Award in 2002.

In his tenure as director, Nicastro has been instrumental in the growth of the V Club, the Athletic Department's fundraising arm. Since its inception in 2000, the V Club has generated over 14 million in contributions. During that period, Nicastro has overseen the planning and development of numerous major endowment, capital gifts and facility upgrades to benefit Villanova Athletics. The most recent capital undertaking is the Intercollegiate Athletics and Recreation Center that will serve as a state-of-the-art practice facility for use by the men's and women's basketball programs and greatly improve the recreational and fitness offerings for the campus community. Other recent facility upgrades under Nicastro's watch include the new Villanova Ballpark at Plymouth Meeting; a new Softball Press Box; the Villanova Stadium Turf Replacement; and numerous team locker room enhancements.

Achievement in the classroom has also remained a priority under Nicastro's leadership. In the 2005-06 academic year, Villanova student-athletes posted a 3.096 grade point average, while achieving exemplary graduation rates. Villanova has now had eight consecutive semesters with its student-athletes registering a GPA of 3.0 or better. In the two-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR), Villanova earned an overall APR of 985 which represents the top APR in the Big East and is among the best in the nation.



Those beyond the Villanova zip code have taken notice. *U.S. News and World Report* listed Villanova as one of the Top 20 athletic programs in the nation in 2003. In 2004, Villanova was recognized as the top program in the Big East Conference in a study conducted by the Laboratory for the Study of Intercollegiate Athletics at Texas A&M. In its first presentation of the Excellence in Athletics Cup, Villanova was cited for success in areas including NCAA postseason success, graduation rates, gender equity position and operating efficiency. Each of the six BCS conferences were assessed, and Villanova emerged on top of the Big East.

In 2003, Nicastro oversaw the second cycle of the NCAA's re-certification of Villanova University Athletics. He has also guided the University's implementation of a comprehensive Title IX compliance program which has increased opportunities for female student-athletes and enhanced resources for Villanova's women's programs.

Nicastro joined the Villanova Athletics Department in 1994 when he was hired as the school's Director of Ticket Operations. He was promoted to Assistant Athletics Director in 1997, and then elevated to the position of Associate Athletics Director soon thereafter. As an Associate Athletics Director, he was responsible for overseeing the department's administrative functions, including business operations, personnel and staffing and the sports medicine and strength/conditioning programs.

On his path to the Director's office, Nicastro served as the designated sport administrator for many of Villanova's men's and women's varsity programs, working closely to plan and develop all aspects of their sport's programs. Nicastro also coordinated Villanova's summer camp programs and the department's information technology issues.

As the Director of Athletics, Nicastro is responsible for the overall supervision of a Villanova Athletics Department that is committed to excellence both in competition and in the classroom. The broad-based Wildcat athletics program is comprised of 24 men's and women's varsity sports and over 500 student-athletes. In addition, club sports and an extensive intramurals program fall under the auspices of the Athletic Department. Villanova is a member of the Big East Conference and the Atlantic 10 Foot-

ball Conference.

Nicastro has also been active both inside and outside the University, serving on many key committees. He is currently Chair of both the Big East Conference Championships and Competitions Committee, and is the former chair of the Big East Conference Finance Committee. He is also a current member of the Big East Athletic Directors' Executive Committee. Nicastro recently served as a member of the Big East Television Committee which negotiated the most comprehensive media agreements in conference history. In addition, Nicastro is a member of the Villanova University's President's Council and the Villanova Administrative Planning and Budget Committee. He is also a member of the Atlantic 10 Football Conference Executive Committee, the Executive Committee of the Philadelphia Sports Congress, is on the Board of Advisors for the Florida Atlantic University Sports Management Program and is a board member of the National Sports Marketing Network Philadelphia Chapter. He was also just recently selected to serve as a member of the Gatorade Athletic Director Advisory Board.

A 1987 graduate of Bloomsburg University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration/Accounting, Nicastro earned his MBA from St. Joseph's University in 1994. Nicastro and his wife Liz reside in Drexel Hill, Pa., with their six-year old twin sons, Jake and Casey.

Senior Associate AD/External Operations

Bob Steitz enters his fifth year as Villanova's Senior Associate Athletics Director for external operations in 2006. In his role, Steitz oversees the department's marketing and promotion initiatives and manages the Villanova Athletics Radio Network.

Steitz arrived at Villanova in 2002 from the Atlantic 10 Conference where he had been since 1990. He served as Associate Commissioner at the Atlantic 10 since 1994 with his primary responsibilities being the Executive Producer of the Atlantic 10 Television Network, coordinating and implementing the league's marketing and television strategies, overseeing all aspects of the men's basketball tournament, and planning and implementing the conference's basketball and football schedules.

Prior to being named Associate Commissioner at the Atlantic 10, Steitz was the Associate Commissioner at the Northeast Conference where he oversaw NCAA Compliance and was the Director of Championships.

Steitz began his career in collegiate athletics at Fordham University where he was the Athletic Operations Coordinator for one year from 1982 to 1983. He was then promoted to Assistant Director of Athletics in August of 1983, a position he held until August of 1985 when he left to become Assistant Director of Athletics at Florida International University.

Lynn Tighe is in her ninth season at Villanova, and currently is a Senior Associate Athletics Director and the Senior Women's Administrator. She returned to her alma mater in November, 1998 as an Assistant Athletics Director, and earned a promotion to Associate Athletics Director in August, 2000. She was recently promoted to Senior Associate Athletics Director.

Prior to her current stint on the Main Line, Tighe served as the Director of Game Operations and Special Events for the American Basketball League's Philadelphia Rage from 1997-1998. As director, Tighe was responsible for planning, coordinating and implementing all game day operations and special events. She was also the Director of Merchandising, and created and directed the Merchandising Department. Tighe currently serves on the Division I Women's Basketball Issues Committee.

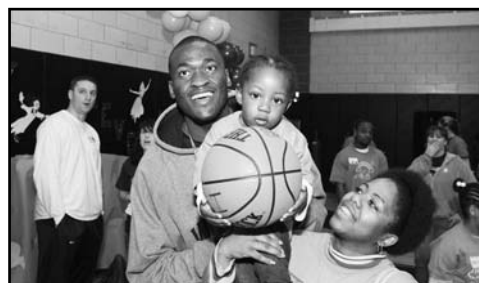

Villanova Facilities

THE JOHN "JAKE" NEVIN FIELD HOUSE

Officially opened on April 1, 1932 as the Villanova Field House, the Field House was renamed to honor long-time Wildcat athletic trainer John "Jake" Nevin on November 22, 1985. Once the home of both the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams, the building is currently home to the women's volleyball squad, as well as administrative offices and training facilities. Originally built at a cost of \$350,000, the field house has hosted Villanova's commencement exercises, numerous high school commencements, concerts, lectures, funerals, masses, dances and plays.

THE PAVILION

Officially opened in February 1986, The Pavilion is the current home of the Wildcat men's and women's basketball teams. With a seating capacity of 6,500, the Pavilion also has hosted commencements, receptions, banquets, dances and concerts since the opening. Also included in The Pavilion is a 200-meter indoor track, tennis courts and batting cages for the baseball and softball teams.

VILLANOVA STADIUM, GOODREAU FIELD & THE JUMBO ELLIOTT TRACK

Dedicated on October 8, 1927, and built at a cost of \$500,000, numerous improvements and additions have been made to the original home of the Wildcats since then. The structure is officially known as Villanova Stadium and seats 12,000 spectators. It has hosted football, field hockey, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, and international track meets, as well as commencements and other functions. The playing field was dedicated to the memory of Leo J. Goodreau, a football player who died due to injuries in practice, on May 7, 1930. On September 27, 1980, the running track was dedicated to Villanova's legendary track & field coach, James "Jumbo" Elliott. In the summer of 1992, new surfaces were placed on the playing field (Astroturf-8) and track (Rekortan S). During the summer of 1997, state-of-the-art lights were installed, improving the quality of all Wildcat night contests. In the summer of 1999, a Stadium Renovation project took place with the addition of a press facility that includes two, a 100-person meeting room for all athletic department members to utilize, along with a first-class facility for all media

members to use. The stadium playing field currently features synthetic grass surface known as AstroPlay. The new surface was used for game competition by both the men's and women's lacrosse teams and for practice by the Wildcat football squad beginning in the spring of 2002.

VILLANOVA SOFTBALL FIELD

Located behind Bartley Hall on the Main Campus is Villanova's softball field. In the Spring of 1998, the field was completely refurbished, improving the facility to one of the best in the Big East Conference. Improvements to the field include dugouts, warm-up areas and a new playing surface. To commemorate the opening of the new field, USA Softball Olympian and gold medalist Dot Richardson christened the new field by throwing out the first pitch in the Wildcats' doubleheader with Boston College on April 7, 1997. During the spring of 2001, a press box was added to the Villanova Softball Field and the site was host to the 2001 Big East Softball Championship.

VILLANOVA SOCCER COMPLEX

Located behind St. Mary's Hall on the ever-growing West Campus is Villanova's soccer field. It was established in the fall of 1992 as the new home for the Wildcat men's and women's soccer programs and was recently leveled and resodded for a top-notch facility. During the summer of 1999, new bleachers were added to the facility that seats 1,500 people. In the fall of 2001, new locker rooms for the men's and women's soccer teams were added.

VILLANOVA SWIM CENTER

Completed in July 1985 at a cost of \$1.5 mil-

lion, The Swimming Center is home to Villanova's men's and women's swimming and diving teams, and the women's water polo squad. Measuring 25 meters by 25 yards, with depths ranging from 4 1/2 feet to 13 feet, it features 10 lanes for competitive swimming, two 1-meter diving boards, and 3-meter diving platforms. During the summer of 1999, new offices and a meeting room were constructed for the swimming and women's water polo coaching staffs.

PIKE FIELD

Located across the street from Villanova Stadium, this practice facility was re-built in 1994 at a cost of \$350,000 to include a complete

state-of-the-art throwing area for track and field meets that allows three events to be contested simultaneously. This field, equipped with a drainage system to ensure high quality conditions year-round, also serves as an outstanding practice field for Villanova's varsity teams as well as intramural competition.

VILLANOVA TENNIS COMPLEX

A brand new tennis facility was constructed on Villanova's West Campus during the summer of 1999. This new facility is home to both the Wildcat men's and women's tennis teams. Recreational courts are also available on the South Campus adjacent to Stanford Hall, and on the Main Campus behind Kennedy Hall. As part of the West Campus construction, new locker rooms will also be added to the facility.

ATHLETIC TRAINING ROOM

Villanova's Jake Nevin Field House features a full-service athletic training room. The facility contains state-of-the-art equipment specifically for the treatment and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. This facility now contains 2,200 square feet of training space. All advanced treatment and rehabilitation is performed under the supervision of four full-time National Athletic Training Association certified personnel. In the cases requiring physical therapy needs, or subspecialized medical evaluation, outside consultants are utilized.

WEIGHT TRAINING & CONDITIONING FACILITIES

Villanova University offers one main weight training & conditioning facility underneath Villanova Stadium for all Wildcat student-athletes.

Recently, the weight room was renovated to a 5,900 square foot training center with weight training and cardiovascular machines. There are also other weight training and conditioning facilities for the general Villanova University community on the South Campus and the West Campus. The South Campus facility was also renovated in the summer of 1998 to fit the needs of the general student body.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT CENTER

Located within the Jake Nevin Field House is the Villanova Athletic Support Center. Working in conjunction with Dr. Dan Regan, Villanova's Academic Advisor for Athletics, Associate Director of Academic Support Amy Miller administers the daily operations of this full-service facility. In addition to monitoring the academic progress of all Wildcat student-athletes, the center includes work space for student-athletes and computer workstations with word-processing and laserjet printers for use by student-athletes. Also, various computer programs are offered, such as a resumé writing program.

ACADEMIC RESOURCE CENTER

The Villanova Department of Athletics expanded Academic Support's domain into the newly renovated stadium. With the addition of a new infrastructure during the summer of 1999, the department's new Academic Resource Center was formed. The benefits of the ARC include:

- Improved efficiency of academic support services to student-athletes.
- Expansion and consolidation of several academic resources, such as freshmen-mentoring and tutoring programs.
- Ability to offer a more personally tailored academic support system to those student-athletes in need.

The ARC includes:

- Private and semi-private tutoring areas.
- Computer equipped study hall housing 20 laptop computers.
- Increased space for freshmen-mentoring.
- Conference area for lectures and study hall.

The Equipment Room

The Equipment Room is committed to servicing the athletic teams, coaches and student-athletes at Villanova University by facilitating ordering, storage and inventory of athletic equipment and apparel; laundry services; and subcontracting of embellishment to be placed on uniforms. The Equipment Room Staff includes Peter Neal and Tom Dunphy.

Overseeing the Villanova Equipment Room is Peter Neal, who was named Villanova Equipment manager in May 2004. He graduated from the University of Oregon in 2003 with BA in Spanish and History. 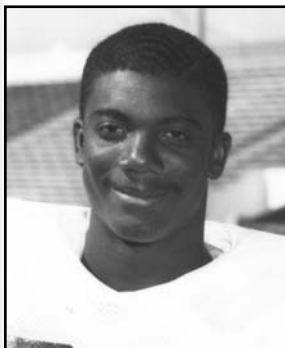

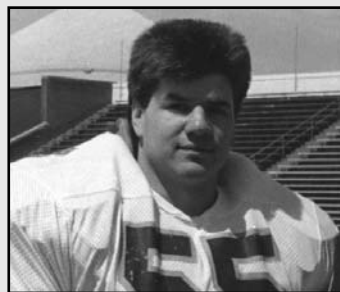

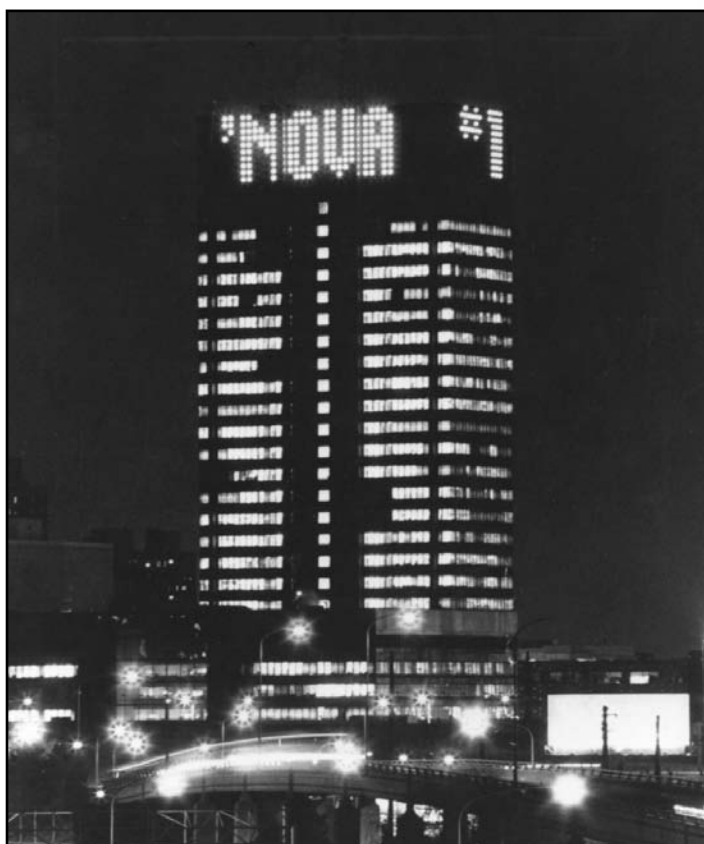
