LEADING THE PACK

- Going into week eight, the UAlbany offense remains amongst the top in the league in scoring (3), total offense (3) and total offensive average per play (4).
- Quarterback Reese Poffenbarger rolls into week eight being named CAA Rookie of the Week for the fourth time this season (9/19, 9/26, 10/3, & 10/17). In addition, this week he was selected as the FedEx Ground FCS National Freshman Player of the Week. Thus far, he has completed 122-of-193 pass attempts for 1,683 yards. He's tossed 13 TDs with no interceptions over six games. Poffenbarger proves to be a threat while leading the CAA in passing, averaging 280.5 yards per game. The freshman has completed five straight games with 250+ pass yards.
- Todd Sibley continues making a big impact for the Great Danes. Second in the conference in rushing, Sibley is averaging 107.0 yards per game. He's rushed for eight TDs with one coming through the air. Against Hampton, he rushed for 65 yards on 19 carries, scoring one TD.
- Thomas Greaney ranks fifth in the league in receiving, averaging 5.2 receptions per game and 73.5 receiving yards per game. He has had three games this season in which he has scored two TDs.
- Tied with 54.0 tackles, Jackson Ambush (27 solo, 27 asst) and Dylan Kelly (33 solo, 21 asst) lead the UAlbany defense. Both rank in the conference's top-10 in tackles.
- On special teams, Tyler Pastula is averaging 42.72 yards per punt (5th in CAA). Kicker John Opalko is 6-8 on the season, hitting a long of 36 yards (4th in CAA).

SCOUTING REPORT

In six games this season, Villanova (3-3, 1-2 CAA) ranks in multiple categories in the CAA. The Wildcats won their first two games of the year against Lehigh, 45-17, and LIU, 38-21. Villanova then had a two-game losing streak, falling to Army 10-49 and Monmouth 42-49. The Wildcats earned a win against Maine, 45-20, before most recently a suffering a defeat against Richmond, 10-20.

Offensively, the Wildcats are averaging 31.67 points per game. In six games, the offense has totaled 2,531.0 yards, or 421.8 per game. When it comes to total offensive yards, 1,208 have come through the air and 1,323 have come on the ground.

On the defensive side of the ball, Villanova is allowing 29.33 points per game and opponents are averaging over 421 yards of offense. The defense has recorded five interceptions and three fumble recoveries.

ROOKIE MADNESS

This week, quarterback Reese Poffenbarger was once again named the CAA's Rookie of the Week. It is the fourth consecutive game the signal caller has collected the conference award. In addition, Poffenbarger also claimed national attention - being named the Stats Perform FedEx Ground FCS National Freshman Player of the Week.

In last week's game, Poffenbarger led the offense to 37 points in a narrow 37-38 overtime setback against Hampton. He completed 26 of his 35 attempts, compiling 337 yards - the second such time he's surpassed the 300-yard mark this season (417 yards vs Fordham, 9-17-22). The rookie QB also passed for four touchdowns, a career high. It's the first time a UAlbany quarterback has thrown for four touchdowns since Jeff Undercuffler did it three times in the 2019 season.

Through six games, Poffenbarger has yet to throw an interception. No FCS quarterback without an interception has thrown more attempts (193) and more TDs (13) than Poffenbarger this season.

TEAM NOTES

New Look Offense

The UAlbany offense looks much different heading into the 2022 season. Jared Ambrose joins as the team's new Offensive Coordinator after most recently serving as the OC for CAA rival Delaware. While with the Blue Hens, Ambrose's offensive unit produced record-setting numbers on its way to a Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Championship and FCS Semifinal appearance in 2020-21. Running back Dejour Lee was selected as the CAA Offensive Player of the Year, the third that Ambrose has coached, and quarterback Nolan Henderson was one of the nation's most-efficient passers. Ambrose's offense that year ranked fifth in the nation and first in the CAA in time of possession.

Another new face joining Ambrose on the coaching staff is Wide Receivers Coach Kashif Moore. Moore was a four-year letter winner at the University of Connecticut where he was elected team captain as a senior and graduated while ranking in the top 10 in program history in receptions. He competed in three postseason games, including catching four passes for 62 yards against Oklahoma in the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl - the program's first-ever BCS Bowl game. He was invited to the 2011 NFL Combine and later signed contracts with Cincinnati, Indianapolis, Pittsburgh and Kansas City.

Moore and Ambrose will have plenty of new offensive weapons heading into the new year, including four potential starting quarterbacks, a new RB1 in Pitt transfer Todd Sibley, and a slew of new wide receivers to throw the ball to.

Putt Putt Quarterback Challenge

The Great Danes entered this year's training camp with a four-way battle for the starting quarterback job. Returning to the roster this year is sophomore signal caller Joey Carino and freshman Tyler Szalkowski. They are joined by transfers Reese Poffenbarger (Sophomore, Old Dominion) and Matt Valecce (Graduate, Boston College/Colorado State). All four took reps with the first team offense during camp. To decide the order in which they would get first team reps before the start of training camp, Head Coach Greg Gattuso took an unusual, but fair, approach – which included a golf putter. All four quarterbacks got a chance in the football coaches' office to sink a putt, with the two closest to the "pin" getting the first reps with the starting offense. The winners? Poffenbarger and Szalkowski.

Heading into the start of the season, Poffenbarger officially earned the title "QB1" after a strong showing at camp. Both Carino and Szalkowski are listed in the number two spot on the depth chart. However, Coach Gattuso clarified to the media that the starting quarterback position would be an open battle that could last a few weeks into the season.

Preseason Honors

UAlbany was picked to finish in 12th place in this year's CAA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The low mark comes as no surprise as the team comes off a year in which they went 2-9. The last time the Great Danes finished with a similar record was in 2018, when the team finished with a 3-8 mark. The next year though? The Great Danes went 9-5 overall and won their first ever postseason game, a 42-14 clobbering against CCSU.

Linebacker Jackson Ambush (Defense) and punter Tyler Pastula (Special Teams) both received preseason conference honors. In addition, defensive lineman Anthony Lang was named Honorable Mention. Ambush led the team in total tackles last season as a freshman. Pastula transferred from CAA foe Delaware, but not before being named All-CAA First Team and collecting two Special Teams Player of the Week awards in 2021.

Meet the Leadership Council

Every year, the UAlbany players and coaching staff elect a "Leadership Council" comprised of guys who show an extraordinary level of leadership both on and off the field. This year's council is comprised of eight total student-athletes, five coming from the offensive side of the ball and three coming from the defensive side. Players on this year's council include offensive lineman Scott Houseman, quarterback Joey Carino, tight end Thomas Greaney, center Kobe Thomas, linebacker Jackson Ambush, linebacker AJ Mistler, running back Todd Sibley, and defensive back Larry Walker Jr.

Coach G Gets a New Deal

In late December, UAlbany Director of Athletics Mark Benson announced that Coach Gattuso had signed a contract extension through the 2024 season. Benson was quoted as saying "Greg has done a tremendous job guiding our football program to new heights during his tenure here. Although 2021 didn't produce the desired outcome we were hoping for, we have confidence in coach Gattuso leading the team moving forward." In 2019 under Gattuso, the Great Danes saw record-breaking performances en route to a 9-5 overall record and their first-ever FCS playoff game, a 42-14 win over Central Connecticut. Gattuso was named the 2019 CAA Coach of the Year and was also a finalist for the STATS Eddie Robinson Award, presented to the top head coach in FCS Football, for his efforts in making the Great Danes one of the nation's top contenders. When asked on the subject, Gattuso added "I'm very thankful to President Havidán Rodríguez and Mark Benson for this contract extension and the opportunity to continue to build this football program to be a top contender in the CAA. Mark and I talked about this after 2019, one of the best seasons in this program's history, and I'm glad we could get it done so now we can continue our focus on 2022."

On Monday, six CAA football teams ranked in FCS top 25 for a second straight week. William & Mary, which was off last week, is ranked No. 12 in the Stats Perform poll and No. 13 in AFCA Coaches poll. The Tribe is back in action this Saturday at Towson. Delaware, which was also off last week, remained at No. 12 in the AFCA poll and No. 13 in the Stats poll. The Blue Hens step out of conference and host Morgan State on Saturday. Richmond moved up to No. 19 in the Stats poll and No. 21 in the AFCA poll after its 20-10 victory over nationally ranked Villanova last Saturday. The Spiders make the short trip to Hampton this week. Rhode Island climbed to No. 19 in the AFCA poll and No. 22 in the Stats poll following its 17-10 triumph over nationally ranked Elon last Saturday. The Rams travel to Monmouth this week. Elon slipped to No. 21 in the Stats poll and No. 25 in the AFCA poll after the narrow setback at Rhode Island. The Phoenix is back on the road to face New Hampshire on Saturday. New Hampshire moved to back into the Stats poll at No. 25 and received voted in the AFCA poll after shutting out Dartmouth, 14-0, last week. The Wildcats host nationally ranked Elon on Saturday. Villanova is among others receiving voted in both polls, while Hampton picked up a vote in the AFCA poll.

GREG GATTUSO - NINTH SEASON AT UALBANY



Greg Gattuso enters his ninth season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in 2022.

A former standout defensive lineman at Penn State who's worked at Duquesne, Pittsburgh and Maryland, Gattuso has led the Great Danes through six seasons in the Colonial Athletic Association, one of the top Football Championship Subdivision conferences in the nation.

The 2019 season saw the Great Danes win nine games, including their first-ever FCS playoff game, at home against Central Connecticut State. The Danes went 9-5 overall, including 6-2 in the CAA to finish second after being picked 11th in the preseason coaches' poll. The 2019 team featured six All-CAA selections and two major awards, including Offensive Rookie of the Year Jeff Undercuffler, with Gattuso landing CAA Coach of the Year honors. Gattuso was also a finalist for the STATS Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top head coach in FCS football.

The 2019 team saw record-breaking performances from redshirt-freshman quarterback Jeff Undercuffler, who led the FCS with 41 passing touchdowns. Undercuffler also set single-season program records for passing yards, attempts, and completions, and single-game program records for passing touchdowns, yards, attempts, and completions. Senior wide receiver Juwan Green set single-season records for receptions, receiving yards, and led the FCS with 17 touchdown receptions. Redshirt-senior defensive end Eli Mencer set a single-season program record with 14.5 sacks. All three players landed several postseason awards, including All-America honors.

The 2018 season included a win over No. 10 Stony Brook in the season finale. The Great Danes played one of the most difficult schedules in the nation, with four games against ranked teams and a season-opening game against Pitt, of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

In 2017, he led the Great Danes to their first win over a Top 10 program -- a 19-10 overtime victory over No. 7 Villanova at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. UAlbany also shut out New Hampshire, an FCS playoff qualifier, 15-0 in the season finale. It was one of several superlative efforts from a defense that finished the season ranked No. 9 nationally. The Great Danes were 4-7 overall and 2-6 in the CAA against a rigorous schedule that featured games against an FBS opponent (Old Dominion) and five matchups with Top 25 teams.

Under Gattuso's leadership, UAlbany had its best season as a CAA member in 2016, finishing 7-4 overall and 4-4 in the league. The Great Danes were ranked for five weeks, including as high as No. 16. UAlbany also earned its first victory over an FBS opponent with a 22-16 road win over Buffalo.

Hallmarks of Gattuso's teams have included discipline and taking care of the football. In 2016, the Great Danes were second in the CAA with a plus-16 turnover margin.

In his first season, in 2014, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround from the previous year. The Great Danes picked up votes in the national polls for 10 straight weeks and appeared in The Sports Network Top 25 four times on their way to a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 CAA mark.

A year later, the Danes earned CAA victories over Rhode Island and perennial power Delaware.

Gattuso was a defensive lineman at Penn State, where he helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's staff at Maryland. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.

During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline and Kaitlin.

- The Great Danes have seen 18 players sign NFL contracts. In 2019, WR Juwan Green, DL/LB Eli Mencer, and DB Jarren Williams signed undrafted free agent deals. Williams made his NFL debut for the New York Giants on December 13, 2020, recording one tackle on special teams.
- UAlbany also has several NFL connections on its coaching staff:
 - Associate Head Coach **Nate Byham** was a sixth-round pick in the 2010 Draft by the San Francisco 49ers. He played in 29 NFL games, playing 14 games, including three starts, with the 49ers before signing with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for 2012 and 2013.
 - Wide Receivers Coach **Kashif Moore** has previously signed NFL contracts with signed contracts with Cincinnati, Indianapolis, Pittsburgh and Kansas City.
 - Cornerbacks Coach **Darrin Walls** was a 2011 undrafted free agent signed by the Atlanta Falcons. He also spent time with the New York Jets and Detroit Lions.

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

The University at Albany is a member of the America East Conference in 16 of 18 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), and football, a Division I Football Championship Subdivision program, is an associate member of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). UAlbany has earned the Stuart P. Haskell Jr. Commissioner's Cup, which honors the America East's top-performing athletics department, eight times overall, including six-straight years from 2013-2018.

UAlbany has won 124 conference championships and has made 57 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes won seven or more conference titles nine years in a row from 2010-2019. UAlbany claimed its 100th conference title on May 14, 2017, when softball won the America East Tournament. Entering the 2020-21 school year, UAlbany has 115 America East Tournament titles, six Northeast Conference (NEC) season titles in football, and three MAAC titles in women's golf.

Throughout its Division I history, UAlbany has had 20 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, nine players drafted by Major League Baseball, and 18 sign NFL contracts. The Division I era has also produced UAlbany's first female Olympian, Grace Claxton, a semifinalist in the 400m-hurdles at the Rio 2016 Games competing for Puerto Rico.

UAlbany's more than 400 student-athletes strive every day to be Great Leaders, Great Champions, and Great Danes.
