INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

No. 8 William & Mary will look to extend its winning streak to six games when it hosts Villanova for Senior Day at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 1 p.m. The contest will be televised by Cox YurView, while a video stream will be available at FloFootball. A radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

Off to its best start since 2009, W&M enters Saturday's game with an 8-1 record overall and is tied for first atop the CAA standings with a 5-1 mark. W&M boasts one of the nation's most productive offenses and is averaging 32.4 points per game and 441.9 total yards per contest. The Tribe's offensive line has powered the attack, as W&M ranks third nationally in rushing (266.6) and third in fewest sacks allowed per game (0.67). Defensively, W&M has been excellent getting stops on third down and ranks fourth nationally in conversion percentage defense (30.2).

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

After suffering a 27-3 setback at Towson last week, Villanova enters Saturday's game with a 5-4 record overall and a 3-3 mark in conference play. Offensively, the Wildcats utilize a balanced attack (202.2 rushing yds/game, 192.1 passing yds/game). TD Ayo-Durojaiye leads the team with 72.6 rushing yards per contest, while Connor Watkins has thrown 15 touchdown passes and run for seven scores.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's game will mark the 37th meeting between W&M and Villanova, as the Tribe owns an 19-16-1 all-time record against the Wildcats. After losing six consecutive contests to VU from 2005-09, W&M has won five of the last eight matchups. Additionally, seven of the last nine matchups have been decided by a touchdown or less. W&M earned a 31-18 win at No. 4 Villanova last season.

■ W&M/VU NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M earned a 31-18 win at No. 4 Villanova last season. The Tribe led 31-3 in the fourth quarter.

W&M outgained the Wildcats, 367-291, and owned a 258-39 advantage on the ground. Bronson Yoder led the way with 106 yards and a touchdown, while Malachi Imoh totaled 67 rushing yards with a touchdown.

Defensively, Nate Lynn recorded a pair of sacks.

RUSHING DEFENSE IS KEY

A key to the Tribe's last five victories against Villanova has been its ability to slow down the Wildcats' rushing attack, as it has allowed just 112.6 rushing yards per game (563 yds).

Conversely, the Tribe has allowed 182.3 rushing yards per game (574 yds) in its last two losses versus VU.

CLOSELY CONTESTED

When looking at the combined total points scored by W&M and Villanova since the teams first met as league foes (in 1993), it produces a very balanced result - W&M 733, VU 705.

NATIONAL RANKING

W&M enters Saturday's game ranked in both national polls ranked eighth in both national polls - Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll. It marks W&M's highest ranking since 2015.

DEFEATING RANKED OPPONENTS

W&M owns a 2-0 record against nationally ranked teams this season with wins against No. 6 Delaware (27-21) and No. 17/18 Rhode Island (31-30).

Dating back to last season, W&M has won three of its last four games against nationally ranked teams, which includes a 31-18 win at No. 4 Villanova in 2021.

STRONG START

W&M's 8-1 start matches the program's best season-opening record since it opened 9-1 in 2009.

ON THE ROAD

W&M has posted a perfect 5-0 mark on the road this season, which marks the program's best start.

Prior to this season, W&M's best start was 4-0 in 1976.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last five seasons, W&M is 16-3 when it

commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 4-13 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 25-5 record during the last five seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last two seasons, W&M is 14-2 in such contests.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 28 of its last 33 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 45-5 record when leading after three quarters.

COACH LONDON vs. THE FBS

W&M's season-opening win at Charlotte marked the third time head coach Mike London has led an FCS team to a victory against a FBS squad - Richmond def. Duke (2009); Howard def. UNLV (2017).

London owns a 3-7 all-time record versus FBS teams as an FCS head coach.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

With wins against Campbell and Lafayette, W&M has won 39 of its last 41 games against non-conference FCS opponent during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally it owns a 42-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, defensive end Carl Fowler, tight end Lachlan Pitts, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and linebacker Trey Watkins.

Fowler is the only player in W&M's history (129 seasons) to be selected as a team captain three times, while Bessant enters his second season as a captain.

GRADUATES

Sixteen W&M football student-athletes have already earned their undergraduate degrees - Carl Fowler, Zyquan Bessant, Trey Watkins, Colby Sorsdal, Marcus Crowell, Kevin Jarrell, Hunter Klein, Lachlan Pitts, Ryan Poole, Malcolm Spencer, Will Whitehurst, Cam Spangler, Tye Freeland, Caylin Newton, Justin Johnson and Tyler Oedekoven.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Four former Tribe standouts are on NFL rosters this season - safety DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive/defensive lineman Bill Murray (Patriots) and offensive lineman Andrew Trainer (Chargers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Alan Williams '92 is currently the Chicago Bears' defensive coordinator.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

BIG NUMBERS

W&M is currently averaging 32.4 points per game, and has scored at least 27 points in all but one contest. W&M's single-season record for scoring is 36.8 (1993).

Additionally, W&M ranks 15th in the country in total offense (441.9).

RUSHING SUCCESS

After leading the CAA in rushing last season, W&M is once again producing a dominant ground game. The Tribe currently ranks third nationally in rushing (266.6). W&M's single-season rushing record is 265.0 (1972).

Additionally, W&M ranks 10th in the country with 24 rushing touchdowns.

PROTECTING THE QB

W&M has allowed just 0.67 sacks per game this season, a figure that ranks third nationally. Additionally, W&M has allowed just two sacks during the last six games.

IMPRESSIVE STRETCH

During the last four games W&M is averaging 298.5 rushing yards per game and has allowed just one sack. The Tribe has rushed for at least 300 yards in three consecutive games.

EFFICIENT PASSING ATTACK

Although W&M has produced more yards on the ground (266.6) than through the air (175.2), it has been tremendously efficient in the passing game. The Tribe currently ranks 15th nationally in passing efficiency (155.6).

COMING FROM EVERY ANGLE

Six different players on W&M's roster have thrown at least one career touchdown pass - Darius Wilson, Hollis Mathis, Caylin Newton, DreSean Kendrick, Malachi Imoh and Andrew Piercy.

FIRST DOWNS

W&M has posted at least 21 first downs in every game this season. Last fall, the Tribe earned at least 21 first downs in just one game.

QUICK STARTS

W&M has scored on its opening possession in seven of its nine games this season - four touchdowns and three field goals.

Additionally, W&M has scored the game's first points in all but one contest this fall.

4th DOWN CONVERSIONS

W&M ranks 12th nationally in fourth down conversion percentage (.636), as it has converted seven of 11 attempts.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 94 times and posted an 86-8 record in those contests. Three of those eight losses came last season.

Additionally, W&M is 44-8 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

W&M has been effective getting to opposing teams' quarterbacks and currently ranks 20th nationally in sacks per game (2.67).

THIRD DOWN STOPS

W&M is limiting opponents to a 30.2 third down conversion percentage. The impressive figure ranks fourth nationally.

RECOVERING FUMBLES

W&M's defense has recovered nine fumbles this season, a figure that ranks 10th nationally.

COVERING PUNTS

W&M ranks eighth nationally in net punting (39.92) and punt return defense (1.7).

RED ZONE DEFENSE

W&M currently ranks ninth nationally in red zone defense (.684).

GOT IT COVERED

W&M has effectively slowed down opponents passing attacks this season and ranks 15th nationally in passing efficiency defense (166.2).

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 170 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 67 games, just 22 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

W&M's defense has allowed just nine passing touchdowns this season.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

After recording three non-offensive touchdowns last season, W&M posted a pick-six this season.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 45 non-offensive touchdowns.

FOURTH QUARTER DEFENSE

W&M has held six of its nine opponents scoreless in the fourth quarter this season.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 19.3 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 70 games (1,356 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 45-25 at home during that span.

DARIUS WILSON

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his fourth year as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova. W&M finished the year with the CAA's most productive rushing offense and the nation's 12th-ranked rushing defense.

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In addition to the success on the field, London's squad distinguished itself in the classroom as 33 players were recognized on the CAA Football Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll for the fall semester.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited London's second season with the Tribe to a three-game slate during the spring, he successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) – an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time top-10 list.

The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a then-program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during the spring semester.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of

Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmie Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.
