2021 in Review: An historic season for the 'Cats

Game 1 August 26, 2021 Villanova 2 Rider 0

The Villanova Wildcats got goals from sophomore Dominic Cyriacks and senior Seidu Shamsudeen to help lift them past Rider 2-0, in a season opening men's soccer match played under blistering sunshine and temperatures in the low 90s Thursday afternoon.

Goalkeeper Carson Williams earned the shut-out with a large assist from junior defender Anthony Dragisics, whose sliding effort prevented a goal in the 60th minute after Rider's Tyrell Moore fired towards an apparent open net.

"It was hot so we defended probably a little bit more than we wanted to," stated head coach Tom Carlin. "We didn't create as many chances as we wanted to but we worked hard in transition. We had good fundamental, sound defensive work.

"Our possessions were good. We weren't getting final product out of it. We got two goals out of it, so you can't be too disappointed."

Cyriacks registered the season's first goal at 26:15, firing a low shot inside the left post. Junior Lyam MacKinnon picked up the assist on

the score.

That's where matters stood at halftime.

With time winding down and Rider pressing for the equalizer, Shamsudeen beat Broncs goalkeeper Pablo Gatinois to a loose ball 30 yards in front of goal, chipped it past him, and then deposited his shot into the open net at 88:57.

"When you're an experienced team, as we are, you find ways to win games," Carlin stated. "Whoever you are on the day is who you are. We go through all the attacking and set pieces but on the day, you are who you are. You've got to find ways to win the game and that's what experience does.

"We managed the game real well. We made a little adjustment defensively at halftime. I thought it worked. It slowed them down a little bit. On the day, we weathered the storm and got through it."

Game 2 August 30, 2021 Villanova 2 Hartford 1

A penalty kick goal off the foot of Wildcats' sophomore Jorge Garcia in the 87th minute

proved to be the difference in a 2-1 Villanova victory over Hartford at the Higgins Soccer Complex.

Hartford opened the scoring at 6:43 as Addrian Knights-Browne took a feed from Demario Cameron and sent the shot into the back of the net to stake the Hawks to the early lead.

The Wildcats, though, answered later in the first half. Junior Anthony Dragisics found classmate Lyam MacKinnon at 24:17 to draw Nova level. The goal was MacKinnon's first of the campaign.

Villanova outshot the Hawks 7-5 over the first 45 minutes and the contest remained even at halftime.

The Wildcats kept up the offensive pressure after intermission on a steamy afternoon with high humidity here. Hartford Rotem Fadida made several key saves to keep the 'Cats from gaining the advantage.

Finally, Hartford was whistled for a foul inside its own 18-yard box and Garcia capitalized. He fired the game-winner past Fadida at 86:24.

Senior Carson Williams earned the victory in goal, posting four saves on the day.

Game 3

September 3, 2021
Albany 1 Villanova 0

In its previous outing, a late penalty kick goal helped lift Villanova past Hartford (2-1). But the soccer fate turned out differently four days later, as a penalty kick awarded to the University of Albany in the 73rd minute was converted and proved to be the difference in a 1-0 win for the Great Danes (2-1 overall, 0-0 America East) Friday.

The Wildcats had controlled play for much of the afternoon, outshooting UAlbany 9-0 over the first 45 minutes and 19-8 for the game.

Villanova nearly took the lead on two separate occasions in the first half.

Junior Lyam MacKinnon's bid for a goal bounced off the crossbar in the 20th minute. Later in the period a header from classmate Viktor Benediktsson eluded Albany goalkeeper Carlos Tofern only to be blocked by a Great Danes defender with his chest.

"It's probably unrealistic for us to say we're going to give them zero shots, but I thought in the first half we really did a good job of managing the game," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "We created chances, our possessions were good and we limited our turnovers.

"I thought we did some of that in the second half too. They got some things against us in the run of play. They blocked a lot of shots defensively so credit to them. And the keeper made some big saves."

Game 4
Sept 6, 2021
Villanova 2 Yale 1

Goals from Lyam MacKinnon and Balthi Saunders helped lift Villanova past Yale 2-1 in a game played at the Higgins Soccer Complex.

With a kickoff temperature of 81 degrees and a packed grandstand (attendance for the day was 885), the setting was ideal on a sun-splashed late summer day.

Villanova got on the board in the 18th minute on a nifty play by the junior MacKinnon. The native of Switzerland found himself with the ball off a feed from Saunders after a Yale miscue, and, though he was approximately 40 yards

from goal, noticed that Yale goalkeeper Elian Haddock was off his line. He sent a majestic ball over the outstretched arm of the keeper and into the back of the net at 17:25.

"When I got the ball, I saw that it was just me, the (Yale) center back and the keeper had kind of advanced," explained MacKinnon of his second goal of the season. "I didn't think about it, I just felt it. I was just trying to connect and it went in. It felt good."

Yale drew level a little more than five minutes later. The Bulldogs were awarded a penalty kick and Paolo Carroll sent a blast into the lower right side of the net, past goalkeeper Carson Williams at 22:21.

The game remained deadlocked well into the second half when MacKinnon – who had 10 shots on the day, including six on frame – made another key play. This time he and Gray Ricca did some sharp passing to set up teammate Balthi Saunders, whose low blast produced his first college goal at 71:35.

The Wildcats moved back in front and kept Yale off the scoreboard the rest of the way to lift their record to 3-1-0 overall, 0-0 BIG EAST. The Bulldogs, preseason Ivy League favorites, drop to 1-1-0 overall.

"We injected Balthi today and he just changes our attack," noted Wildcats head coach Tom Carlin of his freshman from Brooklyn, N.Y. "I thought he changed the game. He's a nice complement to Lyam.

"But we had a lot of contributions, especially from our upperclassmen. These guys have had a lot of experiences together and they have been through these adverse moments. I thought the work ethic and our ability to stay on the front foot today was phenomenal."

Game 5
Sept 11, 2021
Villanova 2 Temple 1 (2 OT)

A goal from junior Lyam MacKinnon in overtime was the decider for Villanova tonight, against the Temple Owls (1-1-2). MacKinnon broke a 1-1 tie that was held for 50 minutes.

The Wildcats (4-1) surrendered an early first half goal at the 14:39 mark, however their stifling defense kept them in the contest. The goal was the only shot on goal allowed by Villanova in the 100+ minutes of action.

Shortly after halftime, freshman Balthi Saunders found the back of the goal to tie the score at one a piece. Saunders' equalizer at the 54:54 mark found the back of the net off a pass from junior midfielder Gray Ricca. The Brooklyn native now has two goals in his last two games played.

In the 106th minute, Temple was whistled for a foul within the box, and Villanova was awarded a penalty kick, MacKinnon lined up a shot and converted, winning the game for the 'Cats. This is also his second goal in his last two games and his third on the season.

Game 6
Sept 18, 2021
Villanova 1 Marquette 0

A first half goal from reigning BIG EAST Freshman of the Week Balthi Saunders and some stellar defensive work helped Villanova earn a 1-0 victory over Marquette in Milwaukee.

Senior goalkeeper Carson Williams anchored a stingy defense, making six saves, including several of the spectacular variety. Junior center backs Josh Belluz and Viktor Benediktsson also played pivotal roles in limiting the Golden Eagles to 12 total shots on the night.

"It wasn't our best effort," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "I thought we were a little sluggish to start and they got a hold of the game and were controlling the tempo. But midway through the first half we were able to settle in and we got a goal. We thought we could carry that into the second half but credit to Marquette, they didn't allow us to do that.

"It became obvious that this was a game where we needed to keep our defensive shape and that our back line and D-mids were really going to have to hold the middle for us. I thought guys like Josh, Viktor, Dominic (Cyriacks) and Dylan (Middlebrook) did a great job."

Saunders dribbled in on the right side and then fired a left-footed strike into the left side of the net to put the Wildcats on top 1-0 at 27:57.

"That was just Balthi being Balthi," stated Carlin. "He's really crafty and can get defenders out of position. That's what he did there."

In the 74th minute Marquette's Gabe Kash sent a shot low towards the left side of the net that Williams was able to knock away for his fifth save of the evening at Valley Fields.

Penn State 4 Villanova 0

Penn State used a potent attack to down Villanova 4-0 on a wet night in State College, Pa.

The Wildcats' three-game winning streak was halted by the Nittany Lions (5-2-1 overall, 1-0 Big Ten). Villanova falls to 5-2 overall, 1-0 BIG EAST.

Penn State's Peter Mangione scored three goals on the night.

Villanova played the final 18 plus minutes down a man after a red card was assessed to senior goalkeeper Carson Williams. The red card means Williams will miss Villanova's BIG EAST home opener Saturday afternoon against Butler (1:05 p.m. on the BIG EAST Digital Network via Flo Sports).

"We came out a little slow but then I thought we settled in pretty well," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "They got one and we lost some individual duels that gave them an advantage. We were a little tentative at times and credit to them, they are a pretty aggressive team that puts a lot of pressure on you."

Penn State notched a goal at 26:28. Feeds from Daniel Bloyou and Pierre Reedy set up a goal from the right foot of Mangione.

Mangione knocked in his second goal of the night at 34:48, re-directing a cross from Andrew Privett just under the crossbar.

Villanova nearly cut the deficit in half after intermission but could not get a goal.

"We were on our front foot and really pressing at the start of the second half," Carlin said. "The guys really battled and from where we were, it looked like Viktor's ball was going in."

Despite the pressure Villanova applied, it was Penn State that registered the all-important third goal. This one went on to the scoresheet at 69:20 as Privett got the goal off a feed from Reedy to push the lead to 3-0.

"That was tough," stated Carlin. "We had really carried the play in the second half and had some other chances but we didn't finish them."

Game 8

Sept. 25, 2021

Villanova 1 Butler 0

A goal in the 81st minute off the foot of senior forward Seidu Shamsudeen lifted Villanova to a 1-0 victory over Butler in a BIG EAST game played on a delightful weather afternoon at the Higgins Soccer Complex.

"Seidu didn't log a lot of minutes," noted head coach Tom Carlin of his forward who entered the game as a reserve and totaled 19 minutes on the day. "But he sure made the most of what he did have."

Redshirt junior Kent Dickey stepped up too in the absence of Carson Williams, who received a red card in Tuesday night's loss at Penn State. That prevented him from suiting up in this one. Dickey made four saves in posting his first career shutout, including a couple of big stops in the first 45 minutes when the Bulldogs were pressing forward in a big way.

In fact, Butler outshot the Wildcats 19-3 over the course of the first period.

"We came out on the back foot and had to defend a lot in the first half," stated Carlin. "I thought we were a little slow to start for some reason. We've been starting games slow and this was slower than usual."

There weren't an overabundance of scoring chances after intermission but Villanova made the most of its best opportunity. Sophomore Jorge Garcia threaded a ball to Shamsudeen near the top of the 18-yard box and the senior drilled a left-footed blast along the synthetic surface into the lower left side of the net at 80:05.

It was his second goal of the season.

Sophomore Jack Bonas and junior Viktor Benediktsson helped lock down the middle of the field and Dickey was ready whenever called upon. He closed down a trio of scoring bids by coming off his line to either collect or punch an incoming cross out of harm's way.

"Our goalkeeper situation was the least of my worries coming into this one," Carlin said. "Kent is an emerging leader for us. He's ready for this. We have two really good keepers in Kent and Carson so as a coach you're always comfortable."

Game 9

Villanova 1 Xavier 0

In the truncated spring season, Villanova coach Tom Carlin and his staff were intrigued by the pairing of forwards Lyam MacKinnon and Akinjide Awujo.

On Saturday, the pressure applied by the tandem helped produce a gorgeous goal that turned out to be the difference in a 1-0 Wildcats' victory over Xavier. The win pushed Villanova's record to 7-2 overall, 3-0 BIG EAST. It's the first time the 'Cats have opened the BIG EAST portion of the campaign with three consecutive victories since 2004.

"We saw glimpses of what they could do up top in the spring," noted Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "Today, I thought their activity really helped us."

At no point more than in the 16th minute. After neither team was able to produce a shot over the first 15 minutes on a warm, overcast afternoon, a smooth combination play made the first shot on frame a significant one. Sophomore Dominic Cyriacks fed a beautiful ball over the Xavier back line ahead to classmate Awujo, who deftly kept himself onside and collected the pass. He then sent a blast into the right side of the net at 15:02 to stake the 'Cats to the early lead.

"Dom was able to find some space in a pocket in front of A.J. (Cousins)," said Carlin. "Jide was running hard and he did a great job of keeping his composure once he received the pass."

Villanova controlled the pace for much of the rest of the period. However, a loose ball atop the 18 yard box gave Xavier its best chance of the half in the 42nd minute. Goalkeeper Carson Williams came up with a clutch save on a shot off the foot of the Musketeers' Bryce Curran.

Xavier continued pushing forward over the final 20 minutes but Villanova's defense held firm. Center backs Viktor Benediktsson and Jack Bonas helped clear a series of dangerous chances in front of Williams while junior Josh Belluz made his presence felt disrupting Xavier's flow as it attempted to build opportunities.

"Viktor and Jack did a great job of winning the balls in the air," noted Carlin.

A penalty kick goal in the 104th minute by Lyam MacKinnon carried Villanova past Connecticut 1-0 in double overtime. The win was Villanova's fourth straight 1-0 decision in BIG EAST action and gives the Wildcats their best BIG EAST regular season start in program history (8-2 overall, 4-0 BIG EAST).

Sophomore Akinjide Awujo drew the foul that led to the penalty kick and goalkeeper Carson Williams made several tremendous saves as Nova posted its fourth consecutive clean sheet.

"Carson was phenomenal, and our back line really held together well," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "It was kind of an end-to-end game and we defended well in space. I thought both teams were tired in the second overtime and it kind of became a battle of attrition.

"UConn's a good team and they played well. But we were resilient and got the result."

Williams had to be on point from the opening whistle. He made a diving stop to his right in the third minute and then came up with a brilliant diving stop of a Husky header re-directed from a set piece in the sixth minute to keep the contest level through the first 10 minutes.

UConn applied a steady amount of pressure as the first period moved on. Villanova's defense kept the Huskies at bay.

At halftime, the contest was level at zero.

The match remained tied at zero. after 90 minutes

After a quiet first overtime period the night's pivotal moment occurred in the 104th minute. Awujo got the inside position with the ball on a UConn defender 15 yards in front of goal and was taken down. The play was whistled as a penalty kick. Junior Lyam MacKinnon converted the opportunity, sending a shot into the top shelf of the net on the right side.

"Akinjide did a good job of working hard to establish position there," noted Carlin. "It looked like he had an open net to shoot to when he went down."

Williams finished the night with five saves.

Game 11 Oct. 9, 2021

St. John's 1, Villanova 0 (OT)

A hard-fought entertaining soccer match came to an end in the 92nd minute when Lucas Barlett of St. John's converted a penalty kick to lift the Red Storm to a 1-0 BIG EAST victory over Villanova Saturday at the Higgins Soccer Complex.

This was the fifth consecutive 1-0 game for Villanova in BIG EAST action and its first loss after a program-best 4-0 start in league play. St. John's moved its record to 8-3-1 overall, 3-1-1 BIG EAST) while the 'Cats are now 8-3 overall, 4-1 BIG EAST.

"For a new game plan in what was a little bit of a different scheme for us, I thought we did a good job," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "We only had one day of preparation for it.

"That is a very good team, a tough team. This game could have gone either way. As the game comes down the stretch and you see that it could go either way, you're hoping you're on the right end of it. We've been on the right end of a few of these. We lost our composure a little bit there at the end on the play that led to the PK but I'm really proud of the way the guys defended today."

Indeed, opportunities to attack were precious on a windy, overcast afternoon with a hint of fall in the air. The two teams produced a total of just six shots in the game's first 45 minutes, four from the Wildcats.

The game opened up a bit in the second half but each team got some clutch defensive work at key moments. Villanova goalkeeper Carson Williams made a series of clutch saves in the first 20 minutes of the period and Red Storm keeper Luke Gavran was just as stingy. Gavran stopped junior back Anthony Cousins Jr., who found himself in on goal midway through the second half on what was one of Nova's best scoring chances of the day.

After 90 minutes, the game was level at zero.

Playing its second consecutive overtime period on the heels of a 1-0 double overtime win Wednesday night at Connecticut, Villanova was working to clear a ball in front of Williams when a collision cancelled a dangerous chance for the Red Storm. The referee's whistle set up the penalty kick, which Barlett punched into the lower right side of the net at 91:24.

Creighton 4 Villanova 2

A match that was air-tight and produced zero goals over the first 45 minutes opened up in the second half, as Creighton scored four times to outlast Villanova 4-2 on an overcast afternoon at the Higgins Soccer Complex.

The Bluejays scored a pair of goals just 6:28 apart early in the second half only to see Villanova rally to level matters at two after a Jack Bonas goal off a corner kick at 73:45. But Duncan McGuire scored for the Bluejays at 78:46 and Creighton added a late goal as the 'Cats pressed forward to make the final 4-2.

"The game opened up in the second half," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "It became a game of transition. I told the guys, we were making decisions in our back third after we had gained possession that weren't intelligent. Rather than just clearing things or extending things, I thought we were trying to be cute. They made us pay."

Villanova grabbed an early 1-0 lead against the nation's top-ranked team Saturday but saw Georgetown rally on its "Senior Day" to post a 3-1 triumph at Shaw Field.

This contest, originally listed as a 1 p.m. kickoff, began instead at 11:30 a.m. as officials took note of a forecast of thunderstorms expected to hit the District of Columbia region by mid-afternoon.

The Wildcats (8-5 overall, 4-3 BIG EAST) struck first thanks to the work from junior Lyam MacKinnon after a miscue by the Georgetown goalkeeper Giannis Nikopolidis. The native of Switzerland sent a low shot into the vacated net at 5:51 to give the 'Cats a 1-0 advantage on their first shot of the day.

"They gifted us one early," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "It put us into a great spot."

Georgetown, however, found the equalizer at 10:57 as Kenny Nielsen's shot found the back of the net for an unassisted goal on a play that began with a corner kick. Carson Williams punched the ball away where Nielsen got possession.

"We've defended set pieces well all season," noted Carlin, "but we fell asleep on that one."

Not long after, the Hoyas scored again to take a 2-1 lead. This time the Hoyas' Zach Riviere collected a loose ball and fired a shot just underneath the crossbar at 25:59. An assist on the score was credited to Stefan Stojanovic.

DePaul scored a decisive goal in the 110th minute to lift it past Villanova 3-2 in a tightly contested BIG EAST match.

Earlier, Villanova had forged a tie in the 78th minute on a beautiful diving header by Anthony Dragisics off a pass from Lyam MacKinnon.

"I thought we played well," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "We showed a lot of resilience to come back. We just got a little unluck there at the end."

This battle provided action right from the opening whistle. DePaul registered the first score of the day at 3:46 as Jake Fuderer found Jack Richards, who finished the play to notch his fifth goal of the season.

It wasn't too long before the Wildcats were level.

The two-man tandem of junior Lyam MacKinnon and freshman Balthi Saunders put a nice combination together to tie the game at one at the 10:07 mark. Villanova got a pair of first half goals and kept Northwestern off the scoreboard for the duration of the match in delivering a 2-0 victory on a rainy, windswept day. in Evanston, Ill

Junior Lyam MacKinnon and sophomore Luke Pompliano scored the Villanova goals in this battle of the Wildcats. Senior Kent Dickey made four saves in goal to post his second shutout of the season. Junior Josh Belluz returned to the midfield after a four-game absence due to an injury suffered earlier this month in a 1-0 victory at Connecticut.

"I just thought it was a good effort on the part of the guys," stated Villanova head coach Tom Carlin. "For the first 60 minutes I thought we played some of the best soccer we have all season. Our possessions and our passing were very good."

"It was very, very nice to have Josh back in the lineup. He makes a huge difference for us. And it was great to see Kent get the clean sheet."

The victory locked down a berth in the BIG EAST Conference Tournament.

The win moved head coach Tom Carlin into a tie with his former boss Larry Sullivan as the Villanova men's program all-time wins leader (114).

"We were playing a team that was already out of the playoffs," noted Carlin. "You see it all the time in professional sports. When a team has nothing to lose, it's not necessarily an easy thing to deal with. I thought our possessions were good, our spacing was good but we didn't create enough quality chances. We were hoping that didn't catch up with us.

"We needed a big save from Carson (Williams), as usual. But we got it done."

The first 45 minutes offered few scoring chances.

That changed, however, after intermission. Seton Hall ratcheted up its pressure, ultimately generating 14 shots in the period. Villanova mustered eight of its own

Carson Williams was sharp throughout. The native of Plano, Tex., made all five of his saves in the second half and several were spectacular.

"This was a playoff game for us," noted Carlin. "The reality was that if we had lost, there was a chance that we weren't going to move on."

The decisive play began on the right side with junior Lyam MacKinnon finding Pompliano across the top of the 18-yard box with a pass. The victory was Tom Carlin's 115th as head coach, moving him past his predecessor Larry Sullivan (114) as the program's all-time leader in wins.

"This was a testament to this team's resilience," Carlin states. "To be down a goal in a playoff game on the road against an outstanding team like Creighton and get two late saves a lot about the strength of character of the guys."

The match was scoreless at halftime.

The Bluejays edged in front midway through the period. A run down the right side by Dominic Briggs led to a cross that Daniel Espelata redirected past Williams at 63:13. Diego Gutierrez was credited with an additional assist on the score.

Villanova earned a penalty kick, converted it, and then used sturdy defense to post a 1-0 victory here Thursday evening over America East Tournament champion Vermont in the opening round of the 2021 NCAA Soccer Tournament.

The win was Villanova's first ever in the NCAA Tournament.

Junior Lyam MacKinnon put home the penalty kick midway through the first half and the Wildcats leaned on goalkeeper Carson Williams and center backs Viktor Benediktsson and Jack Bonas to hold the line the rest of the way in the 1-0 win.

"I thought we had a good rhythm in the first half and created some good chances," noted head coach Tom Carlin. "In the second half we kind of got caught on our back foot a little bit and I thought we lost our composure a little. But we defended well and finished it out."

A turning point came shortly thereafter. Sophomore Jorge Garcia forced a Catamounts turnover just outside the 18 yard box and it went to teammate Seidu Shamsudeen, who had replaced Balthi Saunders just moments before that. As Shamsudeen made a move toward goal with the ball he was taken down by a Vermont defender and the referee's whistle signaled a corner kick.

MacKinnon sent the ball into the upper right hand corner of the net at 27:31 to push Villanova on top. It was MacKinnon's eighth goal of the season and the Wildcats' first NCAA Tournament goal.

"We came out pressing in the first half," Carlin said. "We re-pressed there with Jorge, Seidu got on to it and created a foul in the box. Lyam stepped up as he's been doing all year for us."

The Catamounts launched five shots towards the Villanova goal in the first nine minutes of the second half, but none were on frame. The Wildcats were able to relieve some of that pressure, getting shots from MacKinnon and Garcia, but Vermont began to re-press, generating three consecutive corner kicks. Nova successfully defended each of those to retain its lead.

"For us, this has been a long time coming," said Carlin. "We've been through some ups and downs. This group deserves it. They were resilient all year. I'm just so proud of them and we're looking forward to Notre Dame."

Game 21

Notre Dame 3, Villanova 0

The Villanova Wildcats season came to an end on Sunday evening when they fell to Notre Dame in the second round of the NCAA Tournament by a final of 3-0.

Jorge Garcia took the first shot on goal of the game in the 5th minute. The sophomore took a shot from the top of the box and placed it right in the middle of the goal, but it was saved by the Fighting Irish keeper. In the 18th minute Notre Dame got on the board when Paddy Burns sent a long pass from behind midfield to Jack Lynn who was on the near side of the box. Villanova's next shot came from Garcia, who was at the top of the box. The sophomore was on the run and sent a shot high to the left.

Seidu Shamsudeen came into the game in the 70th minute and took a shot on his first offensive opportunity in the 72nd minute. Shamsudeen sent a shot from outside the box right to the middle of the goal that was saved by the Notre Dame keeper.

In the 78th minute Anthony Cousins Jr. took the ball down the far side of the box and kicked the ball into the middle to Akinjide Awujo. Awujo took one touch and got a shot off that sailed just high. The Wildcats offense kept going having back-to-back corner kicks and shot from MacKinnon that was blocked.

Campolo Field is a soccer-only FieldTurf Revolution surface and it's the highest rated FIFA turf currently in existence. During the summer of 1999, new bleachers were added to the facility to seat 1,000 people. New locker rooms for both the men's and women's teams were added in the fall of 2001. Replaced in the summer of 2014, the current playing surface at Campolo Field is FieldTurf Revolution and has a FIFA 2 Star rating - the highest currently in existence.
