SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh heads down the Main Line to open its 139th season of football with a visit to No. 5/6 Villanova under Friday night lights. The Mountain Hawks closed out the 2021 season with three consecutive victories and will look that carry that momentum into the new campaign with a more veteran-laden team than in previous seasons. Lehigh returns 17 starters, including 10 on defense, led by All-Patriot League honorees TyGee Leach, LaTreil Wimberly and Mikhari Sibblis. Junior Dante Perri returns at quarterback after leading an improved unit to success in the second half of last season. Perri leads an offense that features a wealth of returning skill position players, including Lehigh's top two rushers and seven of its top eight receivers. Villanova went 10-3 last season and is coming off an appearance in the FCS quarterfinals.

KEY STATS

- •Over the final five games of the 2021 season, Lehigh averaged 205 more yards of offense and allowed 161 fewer yards than it did over its first six games.
- •The Mountain Hawks led the FCS with five blocked punts in 2021 and ranked fifth in the FCS in kickoff return defense, allowing 14.92 yards per return.
- •Lehigh's roster features 26 first-years, 18 sophomores, 29 juniors and 18 seniors (including one fifth-year and one sixth-year).

LEHIGH HEAD COACH TOM GILMORE

Tom Gilmore is in his fourth season as Lehigh's head coach. Gilmore has coached a total of 16 All-Patriot League honorees in his first three seasons. Gilmore returned to Lehigh in 2019 as head coach after four successful seasons as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2000-03. Gilmore spent 14 seasons as head coach at Holy Cross, where he was a two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year and led the Crusaders to a Patriot League Championship and FCS Playoff appearance in 2009. The 1986 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania spent the 2018 season on the coaching staff at Wake Forest. (Coach Gilmore's complete bio can be found on page 15)

VILLANOVA HEAD COACH MARK FERRANTE

A longtime member of the Villanova coaching staff, Mark Ferrante is in his fifth season as head coach. He went 5-6 in each of his first two seasons as head coach and 2-2 in the spring 2021 campaign before leading the Wildcats to a 10-3 record and NCAA quarterfinal appearance last fall. Prior to taking over in 2017, Ferrante served under Andy Talley for 30 seasons, coaching the offensive line for 27 seasons, and serving as assistant head coach for the last 18. He was an All-America quarterback for Talley at St. Lawrence, graduating in 1983.

THE SERIES

Lehigh and Villanova will meet for the 18th time, with the Wildcats holding a 12-5 edge in the series. Villanova has won the last nine meetings. Lehigh's last win in the series came back in 2006. Tom Gilmore is 0-3 against Villanova with a 38-28 loss in the opening round of the 2009 FCS playoffs while at Holy Cross and losses as Lehigh's head coach in 2019 and 2021. This will be Lehigh's sixth visit to Villanova since the series resumed in 2004 (2006, 2008, 2009, 2016, 2019). Lehigh won the first four meetings (1903, 1914, 1919 and 1924), while Villanova won in 1925 and 1927 prior to the 77-year break in the series.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

BETHLEHEN, Pa. (9/4/21) – Lehigh couldn't get past a nationally-ranked Villanova squad as the 15th-ranked Wildcats took down the Mountain Hawks 47-3 Saturday in the season-opener for both teams on Dog Day at Goodman Stadium. The Wildcats racked up over 500 yards of offense and scored 24 of their 47 points off of six Lehigh turnovers. Villanova scored the game's first 20 points before an interception by sophomore Mike DeNucci late in the first half led to a 34 yard field goal by junior Dylan Van Dusen as time expired. With the Mountain Hawks trailing 20-3 at the break, Villanova pulled away with 24 third quarter points, turning three Lehigh turnovers in the period into 17 of those points. Lehigh was held to 139 yards of offense on the day. Junior quarterback Cross Wilkinson completed 15-of-26 passes for 134 yards, but threw three interceptions. Sophomore Dante Perri entered in the second half and finished 3-of-6 for 17 yards and an interception. Lehigh also lost a pair of fumbles and yielded four sacks.

LID LIFTERS

Lehigh has an 84-48-6 all-time record in its season-opening contests. The Mountain Hawks are 4-6 in their last 10 openers, with three straight losses. Lehigh's last opening day win came against Saint Francis in 2018. Lehigh is opening against Villanova for the fifth time. The Brown and White won its 1919 opener over Villanova, while the Wildcats prevailed in 2007, 2017 and 2021.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

Lehigh's season-opener at Villanova marks its first Friday night game in seven years and just its second since 1980. The Mountain Hawks won at Central Connecticut State to open the 2015 season on Friday, Sept. 4. Prior to that, Lehigh and Penn squared off five times on a Friday night between 1973 and 1980 with the Quakers winning three of the five games. Prior to 2015, Lehigh's last non-Saturday game was a 37-26 win at Buffalo on a Thursday, Aug. 29, 2002.

BETTER AFTER THE BYE

Lehigh's Oct. 16 bye gave the Mountain Hawks an opportunity to refocus with the results showing marked improvement in several areas, leading to a 3-2 mark over Lehigh's final five games and a three-game winning streak to end the season. SUCCESS IN STREAKS

Lehigh has seven wins in head coach Tom Gilmore's three seasons as head coach with those wins having come in bunches. Gilmore's first season featured a four-game winning streak that had the Mountain Hawks battling for first place in early November. Last year, Lehigh won its final three games to establish positive momentum heading into 2022. The Mountain Hawks outscored Bucknell, Georgetown and Lafayette by an average of 26-8 to close out the 2021 season on a high note.

FOUR CAPTAINS NAMED

In late May, head coach Tom Gilmore named four captains for the 2022 season. Senior defensive linemen Dean Colton (Atlanta, Ga.) and Mikhari Sibblis (Cumming, Ga.), junior offensive lineman George Padezanin (Coraopolis, Pa.) and junior quarterback Dante Perri (Philadelphia, Pa.) will lead this year's squad.

WELCOME BACK

Lehigh had four All-Patriot League selections following the 2021 season with three of the four returning in 2022. Senior safety TyGee Leach returns as a two-time first-team All-Patriot League performer. Senior defensive lineman Mikhari Sibblis and junior defensive back LaTreil Wimberly earned second team honors in 2021, with Wimberly entering his third year as a two-time all-league honoree. All three Mountain Hawk defenders were named to the Preseason All-Patriot League team in late July. Fifth-year tight end Alex Snyder and senior cornerback Jack Bush have also previously garnered All-Patriot League recognition; Snyder in the spring of 2021 and Bush as the non-specialist special teams player following the 2019 campaign.

FROM COAST TO COAST

The Lehigh coaching staff prides itself in bringing in student-athletes from across the nation. This season, 19 states (plus Canada) are represented on the Mountain Hawks roster, including Arizona, California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Ontario, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia. Twenty-two Mountain Hawks hail from Pennsylvania while 15 are from New Jersey.

PENNSYLVANIA PROUD

The Mountain Hawks' roster features 22 student-athletes from the state of Pennsylvania. In recent years, Lehigh has had a handful of Lehigh Valley products on its roster. The Mountain Hawks' roster includes five players who played their high school football in the East Penn Conference. Junior defensive end Trevor Harris is from Bethlehem and attended Liberty High School while junior defensive back Nick Lucien is from Moore Township and attended Bethlehem Catholic High School before taking a post-graduate year at Wyoming Seminary. Sophomore quarterback Matt Rauscher is from New Tripoli and attended Allentown Central Catholic, while sophomore kicker Aidan Reinhard is from Northampton. Firstyear kicker/punter Nick Garrido is from Easton and attended Notre Dame Green Pond.

LAST TIME OUT

LEHIGH VS. LAFAYETTE

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (11/20/21) - "Finish" became a mantra for the Lehigh football team during the 2021 season and the Mountain Hawks did just that to close the campaign with their third straight win. Lehigh rode a pair of first half touchdowns and an overall strong defensive effort to a 17-10 victory over Lafayette at Goodman Stadium in the 157th meeting of college football's most played rivalry.

Sophomore Jack DiPietro had a hand in both touchdowns, with a 13-yard catch on the last play of the first quarter and then a blocked punt that junior Johnny Foley returned for a touchdown in the second. DiPietro was voted the game's most valuable player.

Fifth-year senior linebacker Pete Haffner spearheaded the defensive effort with 12 tackles and a sack. The Mountain Hawks allowed just 278 yards of offense to the Leopards and shut out their rivals in the second half.

Both teams finished the season at 3-8 overall. Lehigh finished 3-3 in the league, winning its final three games, while Lafayette finished 2-4 in league play.

Lehigh opened the scoring on its third drive of the game as the Mountain Hawks marched 75 yards in 13 plays. Sophomore quarterback Dante Perri converted a 4th-and-2 with a two yard run and later threw back to DiPietro on a wheel route for a 13 yard touchdown pass. Junior Dylan Van Dusen's extra point gave the Mountain Hawks a 7-0 lead after one.

Lafayette answered the Lehigh touchdown with an impressive 15-play, 88-yard drive and tied the game on a Jaden Sutton one yard touchdown run.

The Leopards' next possession was a 3-and-out, and on the ensuing punt, DiPietro came through with the Mountain Hawks' fifth blocked punt of the season. Foley grabbed the ball out of the air and ran 12 yards for a touchdown, which gave the Mountain Hawks a 14-7 advantage.

Lafayette kicked a late first half field goal to get within 14-10 at the half. A short field goal by junior Dylan Van Dusen was the only scoring of the second half.

PERRI TAKES THE REINS

Lehigh's offensive improvement in the second half of last season coincided with Dante Perri taking over as the Mountain Hawks' starting quarterback. Perri appeared in nine games as a sophomore with six starts. In his final five games, Perri completed 64 percent of his passes, averaging 228 yards per game and totaling five touchdowns and just two interceptions. He played a major role in Lehigh's three-game winning streak to end the season. At Fordham, Perri completed 27-of-37 passes for 317 yards and two touchdowns, for Lehigh's first 300-yard passing game since 2018. The Philadelphia native was voted one of Lehigh's four captains prior to his junior campaign.

SPECIAL TEAMS SUCCESS

A strong special teams unit helped keep the Mountain Hawks in every game during the 2021 Patriot League season. Lehigh blocked an FCS-best five punts in 2021 and also ranked fifth in the FCS in kickoff return defense, allowing just 14.92 yards per return. Wide receiver Tommy Lewis blocked a team-best two punts, while running back Jack DiPietro blocked a punt against Lafayette which was returned for the eventual game-winning touchdown. Kicker Dylan Van Dusen also returns after converting all 13 extra point attempts and going 10-for-12 on field goal attempts in 2021.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

A defensive unit that has grown together during the Tom Gilmore era is expected to be an area of strength for the Mountain Hawks in 2022. Eighteen of the 22 defensive players listed on Lehigh's depth chart have significant game experience. Lehigh ranked third in the Patriot League in both scoring and total defense in 2021 but the numbers improved significantly over the last five games. The Mountain Hawks allowed 60 fewer yards per game in its final five games compared to its first six. Lehigh's projected starting defense features 10 juniors and seniors plus sophomore Logan Jones, who appeared in all 11 games as a first-year, with eight starts. All three of Lehigh's returning All-Patriot League honorees from 2021 reside on the defensive side of the ball: lineman Mikhari Sibblis and defensive backs TyGee Leach and LaTreil Wimberly.

STARTING BLOCK

In a change from recent years, Lehigh has a more veteran-laden team with 47 juniors and seniors, plus 18 sophomores, many of who saw playing time last season. Based on Lehigh's depth chart (page 10), just three Mountain Hawks are slated to make their first career starts. Sophomore offensive lineman Caleb Bryan and first-yearwide receiver Geoffrey Jamiel are listed as starters along with senior running back Zaythan Hill, who has 180 carries and 10 touchdowns over 23 career games, but has never started one. Junior Christian Jablonski started six games over his first two seasons, but those starts came on the defensive line. Jablonski was moved to offensive line in the spring and could make his first career start at tackle.

FIRST-YEARS INTO THE FIRE

Lehigh has 26 first-year student-athletes on its roster and recent history shows that many will be relied upon to contribute right away. Five first-years appear on Lehigh's depth chart (page 10) with wide receiver Geoffrey Jamiel currently penciled in to start. Twelve of Lehigh's 18 sophomores appeared in at least one game during the 2021 season, led by defensive backs Logan Jones and DJ Lawrence who appeared in 11 and nine games, respectively, and made multiple starts in the defensive backfield. Lehigh's first-year class includes one transfer, wide receiver Martin Laham, who came to Lehigh after one year at Massachusetts.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Lehigh's offense should be bolstered by the return of a number of experienced skill position players. The Mountain Hawks' top three running backs all saw significant action last year and Lehigh had eight players catch 10 or more passes last year with six of the eight returning in 2022. Lehigh's top four receivers in terms of receptions are back, led by junior Eric Johnson (28). Seniors Johnny Foley (25) and Jalen Burbage (24) and junior Roemello Miner (22) all exclipsed the 20-catch mark last season. Fifth-year tight end Alex Snyder and junior running back Jack DiPietro also return after having double-digit receptions last season.

SECOND(ARY) TO NONE

With a number of experienced returners, the secondary should be one of Lehigh's strongest units in 2022. Leading the way is senior safety TyGee Leach, who is a two-time first team All-Patriot League selection and junior cornerback LaTreil Wimberly, who earned second team all-league honors in each of his first two seasons. Juniors Spencer Roof, Corey Melzer and Donovan Thomas and sophomore Logan Jones are all experienced safeties, while senior Jack Bush, junior Donovan Lassiter and sophomore DJ Lawrence all bring significant game experience to the cornerback position. Lehigh allowed just over 212 passing yards per game last season.

RUSHING TO VICTORY

Lehigh will look to carry its late-season success rushing the football from 2021 into the new season. The Mountain Hawks rushed for 113.8 yards per game over their final five games including a 260 yard effort at Fordham and a five-touchdown game at Bucknell, Lehigh's first game with five rushing touchdowns in five years. Senior Zaythan Hill is the top returning rusher with 399 yards and five touchdowns last season. Junior Jack DiPietro rushed for 248 and two scores and also had a receiving touchdown and a blocked punt to earn MVP honors in the rivalry win over Lafayette. Sophomore Gaige Garcia averaged 4.5 yards per carry before suffering a season-ending injury in the Princeton game. First-year DJ Brown from Texas also brings talent to the running back room.

WORKING OVERTIME

The Mountain Hawks have played 13 overtime games since overtime rules were established prior to the 1995 season. Lehigh is 8-5 in overtime games, with its most recent overtime game being an October 2019 win at Fordham. The Mountain Hawks have gone to overtime twice in season openers, with a double overtime win over Central Connecticut State in 2013 and a loss at Fordham in 1997.

THE SENIOR STORY

Lehigh's 2022 roster includes 18 seniors, including one fifth-year and one sixth-year. Fourteen of the 18 appear on Lehigh's depth chart (page 10). Tight end Alex Snyder is back for a fifth-year in the brown and white, while line-backer Nate Norris is back for his sixth year due to medical hardship and the COVID-19 pandemic. Norris played his first full season in 2021 and tied with fellow senior TyGee Leach for the team lead with 69 tackles.

OFFENSE COMES TO LIFE

Lehigh's offense enjoyed its best performance of the Tom Gilmore era last October at Fordham as the Mountain Hawks racked up 577 yards while scoring their first four touchdowns of the season. The Mountain Hawks enjoyed a balanced attack, rushing for 260 yards and passing for 317. The 577 total yards were Lehigh's most since the Mountain Hawks racked up 550 in a 45-17 win over Bucknell in 2018.

TURNING AROUND THE TURNOVER STORY

Lehigh has finished with a negative turnover margin for in seven of the last eight seasons, a trend the Mountain Hawks will look to reverse this fall. The Mountain Hawks were minus-9 during the 2021 season, with nine takeaways via five interceptions and four fumble recoveries. Lehigh was plus-1 in turnover margin against Holy Cross, snapping a 20-game streak in which the Mountain Hawks either lost the turnover battle or were even in turnovers. Lehigh has won the turnover battle in three games under Tom Gilmore, the 2019 season-opener against Saint Francis and then back-to-back weeks in 2021 against Holy Cross and Bucknell. Lehigh's three interceptions at Bucknell last November were its most since recording three at New Hampshire in the 2016 FCS playoffs.

LEHIGH VS. THE CAA ON THE GRIDIRON

Lehigh will face three CAA opponents this season as the Mountain Hawks look to snap an 11-game losing streak against teams from the conference. The Mountain Hawks' last win over a CAA team was a 34-27 win over New Hampshire at Goodman Stadium in 2013. The makeup of the CAA has changed in recent years with Massachusetts and James Madison moving up to the FBS. Albany, Elon and Stony Brook joined the league for football several years ago and this year, Hampton and Monmouth joined the league giving the CAA 13 football-playing members.

SACK ATTACK

One of Lehigh's strengths last season was its ability to get to opposing quarterbacks. The Mountain Hawks ranked second in the Patriot League with 25 sacks and registered at least two sacks in nine of their 11 games, with a season-high of four against Holy Cross. The Mountain Hawks were held sackless at Fordham but had 13 over their last four games. Lehigh utilized a balanced attack with Mikhari Sibblis leading the way with 4.5 Trevor Harris following with four. The Mountain Hawks return players that accounted for 20.5 of their 25 sacks.

QUITE THE TRIFECTA

Lehigh's game at Fordham last October featured the rare trifecta of a 300-yard passer (Dante Perri), 100-yard rusher (Zaythan Hill) and two 100-yard receivers (Eric Johnson and Roemello Miner). It marked the first time the Mountain Hawks hit all three of those benchmarks since Sept. 30, 2017 at Wagner. On that evening, Brad Mayes threw for 306, Dom Bragalone rushed for 102 and Troy Pelletier (143) and Jorge Portorreal (132) eclipsed the century mark for receiving yards. On that night, five turnovers doomed Lehigh in a 37-20 Wagner victory.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

The 2021 season saw seniors RaShawn Allen and Austin Dambach garner several prominent academic awards. In addition six members of Lehigh's class of 2022 were named to the National Football Foundation's Hampshire Honor Society. Among players on the 2022 roster, 33 Mountain Hawks own a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better, with 16 over a 3.2 and six over a 3.5. Sophomore defensive back Harrison Jenkins leads the way with a 3.96 GPA in mechanical engineering, followed by sophomore quarterback Matt Rauscher, who owns a 3.78 in Lehigh's College of Business and Economics and sophomore linebacker/long snapper Tucker Knupp, who holds a 3.75 majoring in materials science and engineering.

SCOUTING VILLANOVA

Villanova opens its season after going 10-3 in 2021. The Wildcats were the No. 5 seed in the FCS playoffs and defeated Holy Cross in the second round before falling to South Dakota State in the quarterfinals. Villanova tops the CAA preseason poll. Offensive linemen Michael Corbi and Colin Gamroth were named to the preseason All-CAA team along with wide receiver Rayjaun Pringle and special teamer TD Ayo-Durojaiye. Corbi was also named a first team preseason All-American by STATS Perform. The Wildcats lost quarterback Dan Smith to graduation with junior Connor Watkins expected to replace him.

REMEMBERING ANDY COEN

The Mountain Hawks will be honoring former head coach Andy Coen during the 2022 season. Coen won a program record-tying 85 games and led Lehigh to five Patriot League titles in 13 seasons as head coach. He passed away in April at the age of 57 after a several year battle with Early Onset Alzheimers Disease. In memory of Coen, Lehigh will wear a decal with the initials AC on the backs of their helmets during the 2022 season. Coen will also be publically remembered at a home game later this season.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH TOM GILMORE



An intense and passionate leader with more than 30 years of coaching experience at high-end academic institutions. Tom Gilmore is in his fourth season as Lehigh's head football coach. Gilmore was hired on January 8, 2019 as the 29th head football coach

in school history. The appointment marked a return to Lehigh for Gilmore, who spent four seasons as the Mountain Hawks' defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2000-2003.

In his first three seasons as Lehigh's head coach, 16 Mountain Hawks have garnered All-Patriot League recognition.

Lehigh overcame a tough start to finish the 2021 season with a flourish, as the Mountain Hawks won their final three games, capped by a 17-10 triumph over Lafayette to give Gilmore his first win as a head coach in The Rivalry.

In his first season back in Bethlehem, Gilmore's Mountain Hawks displayed grit and enthusiasm. Improvements were noticeable, especially on the defensive side of the ball, were Lehigh allowed an average of 14 fewer points and 100 fewer yards than in 2018. Eight of Lehigh's 11 games were decided by a touchdown or less. Gilmore's first win as Lehigh's head coach was a 10-3 triumph over Merrimack on Sept. 28 at Goodman Stadium. In that game, the Mountain Hawks held the Warriors to minus-25 rushing yards, while recording six sacks and a pair of takeaways. Gilmore also won his first three Patriot League contests, with victories at Colgate and Fordham and at home against Georgetown all sealed on the game's final play.

Individually, six Mountain Hawks garnered All-Patriot League recognition with wide receiver Devon Bibbens, linebacker Keith Woetzel and special teams ace Jack Bush earning first team honors. Woetzel went on to garner All-America honors from several outlets and was an All-ECAC honoree. Linebacker Pete Haffner was an Academic All-Patriot League honoree for the second straight season and added CoSIDA Academic All-District honors along with wide receiver Austin Dambach.

Gilmore spent the 2018 season at Wake Forest, working on a staff that was led by former Lehigh offensive coordinator Dave Clawson and that also featured former Lehigh head coach Kevin Higgins, who hired Gilmore to lead Lehigh's defense in 2000. He initially joined the Demon Deacons as a defensive analyst for the 2018 season but was elevated to coach the outside linebackers following an in-season change in defensive leadership. Wake Forest capped its 2018 campaign with

a 37-34 win over Memphis in the Birmingham Bowl.

Prior to the 2018 season, all of Gilmore's previous coaching experience came from Patriot League or Ivy League institutions.

Gilmore spent 14 seasons as head coach at Holy Cross, where he was a two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year and led the Crusaders to a Patriot League Championship and FCS Playoff appearance in 2009. His 72 victories rank second in Holy Cross history, and included a 41-40 Patriot League record.

During Gilmore's time at Holy Cross, 102 Crusaders were named to All-Patriot League teams. Under Gilmore's guidance, quarterback Dominic Randolph was a three-time Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and was a three-time finalist for the Walter Payton Award, given to the outstanding offensive player in the FCS. Holy Cross had eight winning seasons during Gilmore's tenure, and in a five-season stretch from 2007-2011, the Crusaders finished no worse that second in the Patriot League standings.

Gilmore's Holy Cross teams were also successful in the classroom. The Crusaders received NCAA academic progress rate public recognition awards in seven of his final 11 seasons and Holy Cross consistently ranked at or near the top of the Patriot League in terms of NCAA academic progress rates and graduation success rates

The most successful Holy Cross team of the Gilmore Era was the 2009 squad, which won the program's first Patriot League title in 18 years, with a 9-3 overall record, as the Crusaders made just their second NCAA playoff appearance. Gilmore's 2009 team led the Patriot League in scoring offense (32.2 points/game) and ranked fourth nationally in passing offense (314.9 yards/game) and sixth in total offense (433.6 yards/game).

Following the 2009 season, two Crusaders earned All-America honors, while 15 were named All-Patriot League. Gilmore was named Patriot League Coach of the Year, New England Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award. He was also named Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2006 after guiding the Crusaders to a 7-4 season and 4-2 league mark.

Gilmore took over the Holy Cross program in 2004, following four successful seasons serving as Lehigh's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. In his initial four-year stint at Lehigh, Gilmore helped lead the Mountain Hawks to a 39-9 overall record. Lehigh posted back-to-back undefeated regular seasons and won Patriot League titles and qualified for the I-AA playoffs in Gilmore's first two seasons, 2000 and 2001. The Mountain Hawks won playoff games in both of those seasons and captured the 2001 Lambert Cup.

In 2003, Gilmore molded Lehigh's defense into one of the top units at its level. Lehigh led the Patriot League in scoring defense (16.8 points/game) and sacks (34), and ranked second in rushing defense (126.2 yards/game) and total defense (304.9 yards/game).

The 2001 season saw Gilmore named Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association, after helping transform a young and inexperienced defense into one of the top units in Division I-AA. The Mountain Hawks ranked fifth nationally in rushing defense and 12th in scoring defense. Lehigh

also ranked in the top 20 in total defense and ranked fifth in turnover margin. That season, Lehigh posted a 10-0 regular season and then defeated Hofstra 27-24 in an overtime thriller at Goodman Stadium in the opening round of the I-AA playoffs.

In Gilmore's first season at Lehigh, the Mountain Hawks ranked sixth nationally in scoring defense and fifth in both rushing defense and turnover margin. In addition, Lehigh's defense ranked fourth nationally with 22 interceptions and scored five defensive touchdowns.

Gilmore came to Lehigh after eight seasons at Dartmouth, where he coached the offensive line before taking over the linebackers and eventually, serving as defensive coordinator. He helped the Big Green to two Ivy League titles, including the 1996 season in which Dartmouth went 10-0 and finished the season ranked 17th nationally. In Gilmore's tenure, Dartmouth posted a 22-game unbeaten streak from 1995-1997. He also coached a team of Ivy League All-Stars to a victory in the 1996 Epsom Ivy Bowl in Osaka. Japan.

While serving as Dartmouth's defensive coordinator in 1997, Gilmore oversaw one of the top defensive units in recent school history. The Big Green boasted the nation's second-ranked rushing defense, allowing just 77.3 yards per game and 2.3 yards per carry. Dartmouth allowed just 16.5 points per game in 1997 while recording 40 quarterback sacks and 17 interceptions in 10 games.

Gilmore's coaching career began at his alma mater, the University of Pennsylvania, where he served as assistant defensive line coach in 1986. He then moved on to Columbia for three seasons as defensive line and outside linebackers coach, before returning to Penn for two seasons as offensive line coach.

A standout defensive lineman at Penn, Gilmore earned All-Ivy honors as part of three consecutive Ivy League championship teams, and was an All-American in his final two seasons. As a senior in 1985, Gilmore received the Asa S. Bushnell Cup as the Ivy League Player of the Year, and was one of only two linemen to ever claim the honor before it was divided into offensive and defensive awards in 2012. He also earned the George A. Munger Award as the team's Most Valuable Player, the Chuck Bednarik Award as the team's top lineman and the Class of 1915 Award as Penn's top male scholar-athlete.

Gilmore is a 1986 graduate of Penn with a degree in computer mathematics. He and his wife Joan have a daughter, Sarah, and a son, Jack.
