A&T Breakdown: The Aggies had a breakthrough on Saturday with their first win of the season as A&T defeated Norfolk State 28-26 at Price Stadium. It marked the Aggies eighth straight win over the Spartans. The Aggies were led by true freshman Kevin White, who rushed for 115 vards and two touchdowns on 11 carries. He became the first Aggie QB to rush for 100 yards in a game in years.

Coach Brown (Miss. Valley State '88): Brown became the Aggies 22nd head coach in program history when he took over on Jan. 9, 2023. Brown spent the previous four seasons as the defensive coordinator at CAA powerhouse William & Mary. He earned his first win as a head coach and as the head coach of A&T on Sept. 30, 2023, when the Aggies defeated Norfolk State 28-26 in Norfolk, Va.

Villanova Breakdown: Villanova has had an interesting two weeks. They blew out #17 Rhode Island Rams two weeks ago. But last week, Albany, picked to finish 11th in the CAA in 2023, beat the Wildcats easily. The Wildcats had 287 yards on the ground against the Rams but only had 71 yards against the Danes. Villanova is third in the conference in rushing yards per game.

Coach Ferrante (St. Lawrence '82):

Ferrante has been on the Villanova staff since 1987. Ferrante came to Nova as the program's offensive line coach before adding assistant head coach to his list of duties in 1998. When legendary Villanova head coach Andy Talley retired after the 2016 season, the Wildcats turned to Ferrante. Ferrante has led the Wildcats in seven seasons to two NCAA Division I-FCS playoff appearances.

CAA RACE WIDE OPEN AS A&T RETURNS TO **CONFERENCE PLAY**

- Crazy things happened over the weekend in the CAA. ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS Fifth-ranked William & Mary lost to Elon. Richmond lost to Hampton, and A&T's opponent this week, Villanova, had a blowout loss to the University of UAlbany.
- The Aggies have a chance to be in contention for a conference title for the seventh time in the past eight seasons they have had a season. A&T officials canceled the 2020 season because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Therefore, a schedule that looked so daunting at the start of the season seems more manageable as the Aggies return to conference play this week to play Villanova in A&T's first-ever home CAA game in program history.
- The Aggies have a chance to be in contention for a conference title for the seventh time in the past eight seasons they have had a season. A&T officials canceled the 2020 season because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- What also has the Aggies optimistic is that they captured their first win in 2023 over the weekend with a 28-26 triumph over Norfolk State at Price Stadium.
- Defensively, BJ Tumer is off to a great start. Turner had 19 tackles, including nine unassisted and 2 1/2 for loss. in the win over Norfolk. For his efforts, Turner earned CAA co-defensive player of the week. It is the program's first-ever weekly honor in the CAA.
- Turner leads the nation in solo tackles per game (9.0) and ranks third in total tackles with 54. Turner also leads the CAA in tackles per game (13.5). Turner also ranks 19th nationally in tackles for loss per game (1.5).
- The Aggies came into the game with one touchdown from scrimmage all season. They scored four on Saturday. The Aggies had not had a 100-yard rusher all season. They got two on Saturday. The Aggies had not had a reception over 25 yards all season. Amonte Jones had a 38-yard reception from Kevin White.
- A&T and Villanova will play for the first time. The Aggies have faced 10 first-time opponents since 2021. The Aggies are 5-5 in those games. Nova has become a perennial NCAA Division I-FCS playoff team. Nova joined the CAA in 2007. They have been to the playoffs nine times since.

COVERING NORTH CAROLINA A&T FOOTBALL

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: A&T will hold its weekly footbball press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at noon. Those press conferences will take place in the student center on campus, mostly in Deese Ballroom. The Sept. 4, Oct. 9 and Nov. 6 press conferences will take place in Moore Gymnasium. Head coach Vincent Brown will go first followed by players. All press conferences are streamed live on A&T Athletics' Facebook and YouTube pages. Coach Brown will also be made available on Monday morning during the CAA teleconference at 10 a.m., on Mondays.

PRACTICES: Practices are open to the media if they are given prior approval by associate athletics director for communications Brian Holloway. Video is permitted during certain moments and use of footage from practice must be limited to drills and plays after the ball has been snapped. No formations are to be shot by videographers or photographers.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to ncataggies.com, go to the left side of the website. Pulldown the menu option, scroll down to inside athletics and then scroll down to Football & Basketball Credential Requests and click the link. Fill out the form to request. Credential requests must be made as early as possible. Credentials are limited to media who are there in a working capacity. Media credentials are allotted based on websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entiity/network. They are also alloted to daily newspapers, network affiliate television stations, magazines and weekly newspapers.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located at the Laurel Street Parking Lot (orange lot). Media parking during Homecoming will be in the Pink Lot on North Benbow. Parking passes may not be picked up at will call and must be requested during the credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will call is located in the Moore Gymasium Lounge, which is on John Mitchell Drive across the street from the Student Center. The room is located behind the large plane on Mitchell Drive.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear wristband in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received at media will call or the skybox at the stadium. Gameday flip cards will be available at media will call, the multipurpose room inside the Bryan Fitness & Wellness Center or the skybox. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Usage of footage from practices is limited. Press conferences, practice footage and other content will be available to the media upon request or the athletics department social sites (Facebook, Twitter, YouTube).

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO SHOW: The A&T Football coach's show gives fans the opportunity to hear Coach Brown take questions from host Donal Ware concerning A&T Football. The talk show will air live on Facebook every Monday at 12:30 p.m., and on Thursdays on WSJS 96.3 FM and 1400AM.

LEGACY PLAYERS

BJ & Barry: North Carolina A&T has a winning tradition and a rich history in football. It is a tradition that has expanded over generations and is very evident on the Aggies current roster. A&T has four players on its current roster whose fathers played for A&T in previous years. Starting linebacker BJ Turner's father, Barry Turner, played for the Aggies from 1990-93. The elder Turner led the Aggies to the 1991 and '92 MEAC championships while leaving as the program's second-leading rusher. Barry Turner is now the seventh-leading rusher in Aggies history, and he is a North Carolina A&T Sports Hall of Famer. BJ, a Greensboro native, is a graduate transfer from Charlotte University, where he played 44 games.

Jailen & Mo: Another of A&T's all-time great running backs also has a son on the team in former NFL back Maurice Hicks. Hicks' son Jailen Hicks, a 6-foot-3, 190-pound back out of Dudley High School in Greensboro, is a true freshman for the Aggies. The elder Hicks left A&T in 2001 as its all-time leading rusher after playing only two seasons at A&T after transferring in from Clemson. Maurice Hicks is now the third all-time leading rusher in A&T history. He spent six seasons in the NFL.

Alston and Alan: Alston Hooker's father, Alan Hooker, played quarterback at A&T in the mid 80's, leading the Aggies to the MEAC title in 1986. The elder Hooker still owns many of A&T's passing records. Almost 40 years later, he is still A&T's all-time leader in career passing yards, earning him entry into the North Carolina A&T Sports Hall of Fame. Alston Hooker played in six games last season and came into the 2023 training camp in a four-way battle for the starting quarterback job.

The coaching staff too: Even the coaching staff has a little legacy. Offensive coordinator Chris Young did not

attend A&T, but he he is now employed by the university. His father, Donald B. Young, played men's basketball at A&T from 1953-57. He also played baseball for the Aggies in 1954. He also played in the Negro Baseball League and was inducted into the North Carolina A&T Sports Hall of Fame in 1996.

NO LONGER THE FAVORITES

The respect for the North Carolina A&T football program has been evident over the years. The Aggies headed into the 2022 season as the Big South Conference favorites. A&T has been preseason favorites for six of the last nine seasons. The Aggies were the MEAC preseason favorite in 2015 and 2016 and 2018-2020. In 2017, the Aggies were picked second in the preseason before going 12-0 overall and 8-0 in the conference. In 2021, Big South head coaches predicted the Aggies would finish third. But this season, the Aggies are expected to finish 10th in the 15-team CAA Football Conference. That means the Aggies are not picked to finish in the top third of a conference. not even the top half of a conference, for the first time since 2011.

QB BATTLE

The guarterback situation at A&T changed again on Sept. 30. The Aggies started Kevin White at Norfolk State, giving him a chance to become the first true freshman quarterback to win a game for A&T in 21 years. It worked. White passed for 98 yards and an interception on 6-for-10 passing. He also rushed for 115 yards and two touchdowns on 11 carries, becoming the first Aggie QB in nine years to rush for more than 100 yards. White made the start over redshirt sophomore Zach Yeager, who had played the previous 89 snaps for the Aggies. Redshirt freshman Eli Brickhandler made the start for the Aggies in the first two games but came into Saturday's game against the Spartans as the No. 3 quarterback on the depth chart.

WE ARE A QUARTERBACKING FAMILY

A&T backup quarterback Alston Hooker comes from a family of quarterbacks. His father, Alan Hooker, was the starting quarterback at A&T from 1984-87, breaking 19 A&T passing records while in an A&T uniform. Alan Hooker also led the Aggies to their first outright MEAC title when the Aggies took the title in 1986. Alan Hooker still owns 11 of A&T's passing records, including as the program's all-time leading passer. Meanwhile, the Detroit Lions recently drafted Alston's brother Hendon in the third round. Hendon Hooker played at Dudley High School in Greensboro before signing with Virginia Tech and transferring to the University of Tennessee, where he became a Heisman Trophy candidate before a knee injury ended his 2022 season. Alston Hooker also attended Dudley before transferring to nearby Ragsdale High School.

SCOUTING VILLANOVA

Last week, Villanova entered the game ranked 16th in the FCS STATS Media Poll and 23rd in the AFCA Coaches Poll. CAA coaches predicted the Wildcats to finish seventh in the conference, showing the conference has depth. The Wildcats have an effective passing game. Nova has receivers who rank first and second in the nation in yards per reception. Jaylan Sanchez leads the nation in yards per reception (26.7). Rayjoun Pringle is second at 26.3 per reception. Pringle leads the team in touchdown receptions with three. In addition, preseason All-CAA wide receiver Jaaron Hayek has nine receptions for 113 yards. The man throwing Sanchez and Pringle the football is graduate quarterback Connor Watkins. Watkins has thrown for 938 yards on 55for-102 passing. He has thrown five touchdown passes and five interceptions. The Wildcats have three running backs they turn to in DeeWill Barlee, Jalen Jackson and TD Ayo-Durojaiye. Each has run for more than 300 yards, with Barlee leading the way with 308 yards and three touchdowns. Jackson leads the team in yards per carry (7.6) and has three touchdowns. Ayo-Durojaiye has scored twice on the ground and averages 6.1 yards per carry. The Wildcats average 5.0 yards per carry. Preseason All-CAA lineman Michael Corbi leads the way up front. Defensively, senior linebacker Brendan Bell has 28 tackles, including 20 unassisted and 4 1/2 for loss. Preseason honorable mention defensive back Jalen Goodman has returned an interception 81 yards for a touchdown.

CLOSING OUT LAST WEEK

The Aggies got their first win of the season on Saturday with a 28-26 win at Norfolk State, marking their eighth straight win over their fellow HBCU. The Aggies rushed for a season-high 275 yards, led by sophomore running back Kenji Christian, who had 118 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries. True freshman quarterback Kevin White also went over 100 yards, giving the Aggies two 100-yard rushers for the first time in five years. Both men scored twice on the ground, marking the first time that has happened to Aggies in seven years. For his efforts, White became the first true quarterback to win a start for A&T in 21 years. Four games into the season, however, the Aggies are still looking for their first touchdown pass. Amonte Jones led the Aggies in the passing game with three receptions for 76 yards. Defensively, the Aggies sacked NSU quarterback Otto Khuns three times, holding him to 15-for-30 passing. BJ Turner recorded a career-high 19 tackles, including nine solo and 2 1/2 for loss. Safety Herbert Booker had a career game for the Aggies with career-highs in tackles (7) and pass breakups (2).

VILLANOVA/A&T CONNECTION

- Villanova and A&T are playing each other for the first time in football. There are not many connections between the two schools.
- The Wildcats have only one player from North Carolina in long snapper Ben Wheless, who is from Raleigh, N.C., and attended private school Cardinal Gibbons.
- A&T only has one player from Pennsylvania in tight end Darren Bennett, who is from Elkins Park. Elkins Park is only nine miles outside of Philadelphia.

ESPN+ ranked the top-30 HBCU football teams of all time. A&T had one entry in the rankings. ESPN+ ranked the Aggies 2017, 12-0 team as the 18th-best team in HBCU history. The team was led by Rod Broadway, with Sam Washington serving as the Aggies defensive coordinator. What made the Aggies' undefeated season remarkable was that they did a year after one of the greatest players in school history, Tarik Cohen, left for the NFL. In 2017, the Aggies defeated an FBS team in Charlotte, and they went 8-0 in the MEAC, with an average score of 33-13. To cap off the historic season, A&T defeated Grambling State in the Celebration Bowl, 21-14. The article also speculated Pass Completions: 209, Lamar Raynard (2017) that Broadway might be the best HBCU coach of the 21st century. Florida A&M appeared most in the rankings with five different teams recognized, including the No. 1 team of all-time, the 10-0 1961 team led by Jake Gaither.

TRANSFERRING OUT

The Aggies lost some notable players from last season's 2022 team. Most notable was running back Bhayshul Tuten. Tuten had the sixth-best rushing season in A&T program history with 1,363 yards that came along with 13 rushing touchdowns. He also had 342 yards, 1,705 all-purpose and 17 total touchdowns. He also rushed for more than 100 yards in 10 consecutive games, earning All-Big South honors. Tuten transferred to Virginia Tech in the offseason.

In addition to losing their leading rusher, the Aggies also lost their leading tackler to the transfer portal in, Tyquan King. King made 93 tackles, 5 1/2 for loss, one interception and three pass defenses TDs Scored: 19, Tarik Cohen (2016); Jah-Maine during the 2022 season. He had five double-digit tackle games and ranked second in the Big South in tackles per game. King transferred to East Carolina during the offseason.

> A&T lost another offensive weapon in Sterling Berkhalter. Berkhalter was the Aggies second-leading receiver last season, compiling 383 yards receiving and two touchdowns on 25 receptions. He ranked third on the team in receptions. Berkhalter transferred to the University of Cincinnati during the offseason.

The Aggies also lost two key players along their defensive line when Caleb Jones and Karfa Kaba entered the transfer portal. Kaba and Jones played a significant role in the Aggies having the 11thbest rushing defense in the nation. Kaba transferred to rival North Carolina Central, while Jones will

TRANSFERRING IN

The Aggies had to replinsh with the loss of so much talent leaving for Power Fives. Group of Five and other FCS programs. To help offset the loss of Tuten, the Aggies signed Kenji Christian out of Virginia Tech. Christian was ranked the No. 36 running back overall in the country and the No. 22 overall prospect in Alabama coming out of Pinson Valley High School in Birmingham, Ala. He will be looked upon to be a home run hitter for the Aggies.

The Aggies also added cornerback Damond Harmon out of Oklahoma during the season. It unsure whether he will play this season, but he will help add some punch to the Aggies. He played 17 games at OU, earning 22 tackles. He also made two career starts for the Sooners. He came out of Highland Springs as a four-star recruit.

Rashaud Pernell will make a big impact along the Aggies defensive line. With the loss of Jones and Kaba, his presence will make a difference. He was signed by Virginia Tech coming out of high school before transferring to Liberty, and eventually landing in Aggieland. Helping Pernell on the defensive side of the ball will be Mitchell Etheridge III. Etheridge transferred to the Aggies out of FCS power Jacksonville State.

The Aggies also received some kicking help from the transfer portal as Owen Daffer signed with A&T during the offseason after leaving East Carolina. Daffer scored 96 points for the Pirates in 2021, and will try to offset the absence of Andrew Brown who will miss the start of the season after having offseason surgery.

THEY ARE STAYING

Head coach Vincent Brown kept two coaches from the previous staff in offensive line coach Ron Mattes and wide receiver coach Nate Poole. Mattes, a UVa., graduate, crossed paths with Brown when both were assistants at the University of Virginia in 2010. Mattes has built one of the best offensive lines on the FCS level, with four of his linemen earning some kind of all-conference recognition last season in the Big South. He also coached Las Vegas Raiders offensive lineman Brandon Parker during Parker's time at A&T. Poole spent two seasons under former head coach Sam Washington before being retained by Brown. Poole coached Zachary Leslie to four 100-yard games receiving in 2022 and has started the development of A&T wideout Ger-Cari Caldwell, a transfer out of the University of South Carolina. Poole is a valuable coach to have on staff with his many recruiting connections from his days coaching high school football. Poole also played in the NFL for six seasons, so he knows what it takes to make it to the next Pass Yards Per Game (min. 30 games): 169.4 (39-6,607), Maseo Bolin level. His college teammate was Pro Football Hall of Famer Randy Moss.

THE NEW COACHING STAFF ARRIVES

Coordinators

Brown brought to town seven new assistant coaches, starting with his offensive and defensive coordinators. The Aggies new offensive coordinator is Chris Young. Young spent the previous four seasons (2019-22) at CAA opponent and Piedmont Triad neighbor Elon as the wide receivers coach. Elon had the 45th-best passing offense in the nation, helping the Phoenix reach the 2022 NCAA Division I-FCS Playoffs. Josh Zidenberg comes in as the new defensive coordinator. Zidenberg played at the UVa., during the time Brown was an assistant coach there. Zidenberg will double as A&T's linebacker coach. Before receiving his latest position in Aggieland, Zidenberg spent three seasons with the Ball State Cardinals as their passing game coordinator/defensive backs coach.

Offensive Coaches

A&T's other offensive coaches include Charles Bankins is the running backs and special teams coordinator and Eric Gallon as the tight ends coach. Bankins has served as a special teams coach or coordinator since 2005 at various schools like Charlotte, Old Dominion, Vanderbilt, Maryland, Richmond, Hampton, and with the NFL's St. Louis Rams. Coach Brown and Bankins crossed paths when both men were assistants at the University of Richmond under Mike London when the Spiders won the 2008 FCS National Championship. Gallon served as the offensive coordinator at Robert Morris University last season when both RMU and A&T were members of the Big South.

Defensive Coaches

The remaining defensive coaches include Kenard Lang (defensive line), Almondo Curry (cornerbacks), and Keith Henry (safeties). Lang was a standout defensive line at the University of Miami and a first-round pick of the then-Washington Redskins. Before coming to A&T, Lang spent two seasons as the head coach of his high school alma mater, Maynard Evans. Before spending time at Maynard Evans in Orlando, Fla., he spent two seasons (2019-20) as the defensive line coach at Florida International University (FIU). Curry spent two seasons at Towson University as the football program's cornerbacks coach. Before his time in Towson, Md., Curry spent a year at Maryville College. The year prior, he served as William & Mary's quality control and defensive analyst. Henry is in his second stint with A&T after coaching under Bill Hayes from 1993-95, coaching linebackers, wide receivers and defensive backs at various times during his first tenure. He was also the head baseball coach at A&T then, leading the Aggies to the 1993 MEAC championship and win over the University of North Carolina. A bulk of Henry's career was spent working on a Jim Grobe-led staff, including 11 seasons at Wake Forest and six at Ohio University.

North Carolina A&T Director of Athletics Earl M. Hilton III announced on January 6, 2023 that he appointed Vincent Brown to lead the Aggies football program as its new head coach. Brown became the 22nd head coach in program history.

A native of Atlanta, Ga., who became a 1988 second-round draft pick of the New England Patriots and a three-time All-Pro linebacker, Brown spent the previous four seasons before coming to A&T as William & Mary's associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach.

In 2022, the Tribe went 11-2 overall and 7-1 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). The Tribe won a share of the regular-season title and reached the NCAA Division I-FCS playoff guarterfinals.

Brown led an opportunistic defense in 2022. The Tribe led the nation in fumble recoveries (15) and ranked sixth nationally in turnovers gained (25). William & Mary also had the sixth-best third-down defense in the country, allowing opponents only to convert 31.5 percent of their third-down opportunities. The Tribe's defense topped the CAA in third-down defense, fumbles recovered, red zone defense and turnovers gained.

In addition, William & Mary sophomore linebacker John Pius received CAA defensive player of the year honors, and defensive back Jalen Jones claimed defensive rookie of the year. Pius joined three other Trible players on the CAA's first-team all-conference defense. Meanwhile, Jones joined two of his teammates as second-team all-conference members.

Brown has also made Division I collegiate coaching stops at Howard University (2017-18), UConn (2014-16), the University of Virginia (2010-13) and the University of Richmond (2008-09). He coached linebackers at Richmond when the Spiders won the FCS national championship in 2008. In the process, he coached All-America linebacker Eric McBride. He coached three All-CAA selections in 2009.

In addition, he served as a graduate assistant at UVa., in 2007 after serving as the Dallas Cowboys inside linebackers coach in 2006. His previous coaching experience includes a four-year stint as an assistant coach at Meadowcreek High School near Atlanta. At the same time, he was also the school's assistant athletics director for one year.

Brown earned NFL All-Pro honors for three straight seasons from 1991-93 before retiring as a New England Patriot in 1995. Brown played collegiately at Mississippi Valley State, earning Kodak All-America honors as a senior in 1987. He was a second-team Associated Press All-American as a junior. A three-time all-conference pick, Brown set a school record for career tackles (570), leading the team in his final three seasons in that statistical category. He graduated with a degree in criminal justice.

Brown and his wife, Chandra, have four children: Dane, Vincent II, Raven and Jorian.

- ➤ The Aggies improved to 4-3 against HBCU opponents since leaving the MEAC in 2020.
- ► Head coach Vincent Brown earned his first coaching victory collegiately and at A&T . The Aggies avoided their first 0-4 start in 13 years with the win.
- The Aggies started four true freshman on Saturday, Kevin White, Kade Moledor, Joshua Iseah and Brock Stukes.

- True freshman quarterback Kevin White became the first Aggie QB to win a game as a true freshman in 21 years.
- ➤ White also became the first A&T quarterback to rush for more than 100 yards in a game since Kwashawn Quick did it on Aug. 31, 2014.

- ▶ White and running back Kenji Christian both had more than 100 yards rushing, marking the first time two Aggies have gone over 100 yards in a game since Jah-Maine Martin and Marquelle Cartwright did it against Norfolk State on Nov. 3, 2018.
- Christian had his first career 100-yard rushing game and A&T's first 100-yard rushing game of the season.
- A&T receiver Amonte Jones secured career highs in receptions (3) and yards (76). He also had the longest reception of his career, 38 yards.
- Christian and White also scored twice on the ground in the same game, marking the first time that has happened since Tarik Cohen and Marquelle Cartwright did it against Delaware State on Nov. 12, 2016.

kicker on kickoffs, extra points and field goals over the past two seasons. In two seasons, he has made 24 of 35 field goals (.686) and 63 of 67 extra points (.940). However, Brown had offseason surgery on his knee, leaving him vunerable to miss the opening of the 2023 season.

It left the Aggies looking for options at the placekicker postion. Toward the end of last season, punter Caleb Brickhouse handled the Aggies kicking duties. This season, the Aggies brought in ECU transfer Owen

Daffer served as ECU's kicker for two seasons. He hade 24 of 31 field goals while with the Pirates.

THE AGGIES HAVE A TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Aggies have a challenging conference, and therefore a challenging schedule. After 46 years in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA), 50 years in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), and two years in the Big South Conference, 2023 will be A&T football's first year in the Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) Football Conference.

A&T's new conference has 15 teams, soon to be 16, with the addition of Bryant in 2024. Five CAA teams are in the STATS Perform FCS Top 25. Three ranked CAA teams are on A&T's 2023 schedule, including No. 18 Richmond, No. 21 Rhode Island and No. 22 Delaware. Elon and Villanova received votes in the preseason poll. They, too, are on the schedule.

In addition, A&T's longtime rival, North Carolna Central University went 10-2 last season, won the 2023 Celebration Bowl, the 2023 HBCU Championship and they are ranked 19th nationally. The combined 2022 record of A&T's 2023 opponents is 79-52 (.603).

A&T GRADUATES ARE STILL ON THE FIELD

North Carolina A&T has eight players who will suit up this season with undergraduate degrees already in their respective hands. Anthony "AJ" Dupree is the Aggies backup linebacker out of Snow Hill, NC. Dupree earned his degree in criminal justice last May. Last season, Dupree made 12 tackles.

Taymon Cooke is a preseason honorable mention All-CAA returner. Last season, he honorable mention honors as a kickoff reteurner in the Big South. Cooke graduated in May after transferring to A&T from Marshall four years ago. Aggies left tackle Jason Ivey will be earning his first signicant time this season. Ivey also graduated in 2023 with a degree in business.

A&T starting center Cesar Minarro will enter his redshirt junior season. Minarro was a second-team all-conference Andrew Brown has served as A&T's primary player last season. He is also the Aggies leader along the offensive line. He graduated with a degree in construction management in 2023. Janorris Robertson looks to be the Aggies starting defensive end after having a breakthrough season a year ago. In May, Robertson graduated with a degree in criminal justice.

> Jazir Staton has played a key role for the Aggies on special teams and from a safety position. Staton, who has a fumble recovery for a touchdown in his career, graduated in May with a degree in criminal justice. Meanwhile, Tim Williams has been an important part of the Aggies offensive line over his career. The Laurinburg, NC native earned his degree in information technology in 2023.

> Starting linebacker Malich Jacobs will also have a degree in hand when he steps on the field this season. Jacobs has a degree in agricultural business from A&T in May of 2023. He started at A&T in 2019.
