CAA FOOTBALL PRESEASON AWARDS



Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Jaden Shirden | RB | Monmouth

Shirden rushed for a FCS-best 1,722 yards and 13 TD's last season to earn CAA Offensive Player of the Year and first-team All-America honors. He also led the nation in yards per game (156.5) and yards per carry (8.36). Shirden rushed for 100 or more yards in nine of 11 games and topped the 200-yard mark in four contests.



Preseason Defensive Player of the Year John Pius | LB | William & Mary

Pius ranked fourth nationally with 11.5 sacks and was sixth with 19.0 tackles for loss in 2022 to earn CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-America accolades. He led W&M with 72 total tackles and added 12 quarterback hurries. Pius tallied at least one TFL in 10 games and registered a sack in seven contests.

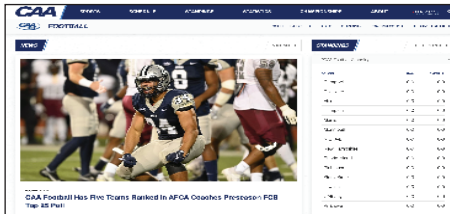

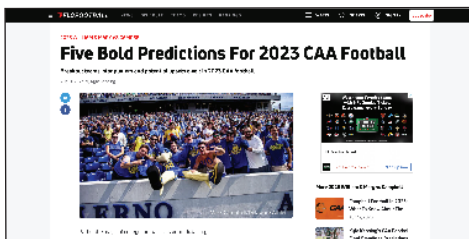

Weekly Awards

CAA Football names Offensive, Defensive, Rookie and Special Teams Players of the Week every Monday morning during the regular season. Winners are chosen from nominations provided by CAA Football media relations personnel and are announced at the beginning of the weekly teleconference. The weekly honors release can be accessed at CAAFootball.com.

Annual Awards

All-CAA Football First, Second and Third Teams, Players of the Year on offense, defense and special teams, Rookies of the Year on offense and defense, and Coach of the Year are selected by a vote of the league’s 13 head coaches at the end of the regular season. The awards will be announced by the CAA Football office on Tuesday, November 21.

CONFERENCE NOTES:

UALBANY TOPS FORDHAM TO KICK OFF 2023 SEASON: The 2023 season got off to a strong start as **UALbany** topped Fordham, 34-13, last Saturday. Reese Poffenbarger passed for 253 yards and 4 TD's and added another 47 yards rushing. The Great Danes' defense held a Fordham offense that averaged 49.5 ppg in 2022 to just 235 total yards and one touchdown. UAlbany recorded 10 sacks, including four from Anton Juncaj and three from AJ Simon.

CONFERENCE PLAY KICKS OFF ON THURSDAY: Conference play starts early in CAA Football with a pair of season-opening games on Thursday night. Preseason favorite **William & Mary** travels to **Campbell** for the Camels' inaugural contest as a member of the CAA. **Stony Brook** hosts **Delaware** as the Seawolves open with a league game for the fourth straight season and the Blue Hens start with a CAA contest for the third time in four years.

SEVEN FBS MATCHUPS HIGHLIGHT WEEK 1 NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE: In addition to Thursday's league matchups, there are 11 non-conference games in Week 1. Seven of them are against FBS opponents as CAA schools face foes from the ACC (**Elon**/Wake Forest), American (**Monmouth**/FAU and **North Carolina A&T**/UAB), Big Ten (**Towson**/Maryland), Conference USA (**Maine**/FIU) and the Sun Belt (**Rhode Island**/Georgia State and **UALbany**/Marshall). Four squads take on FCS opponents as **Villanova** visits Lehigh, **Richmond** hosts Morgan State, **New Hampshire** travels to Stonehill and **Hampton** meets Grambling at Red Bull Arena in New Jersey in a game televised nationally on NFL Network.

SUCCESS AGAINST THE FBS: CAA Football has posted 42 wins over FBS foes in its history and has won at least one game against an FBS team in 12 of the past 15 years. Since 2013, 10 different teams have recorded at least one FBS victory and the CAA has had multiple wins over FBS opponents five times since 2016, including the past two seasons.

WELCOME TO THE CAA: CAA Football will again be the largest FCS conference in the nation as the addition of Campbell and North Carolina A&T gives the league 15 members for the first time in history. The Camels recorded three straight winning seasons from 2017-19 under coach Mike Minter. North Carolina A&T, in its first season under coach Vincent Brown, captured 10 conference titles in the MEAC and has made five FCS playoff appearances. Bryant will join CAA Football in 2024, increasing membership to 16.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS: CAA teams have been dominant against FCS non-conference opponents in recent years. In 2022, the league was a combined 21-5 against FCS foes during the regular season. The 21 wins and .808 win percentage were the best of any conference.

FIVE TEAMS RANKED IN PRESEASON TOP 25: Five CAA teams are ranked in both the Stats Perform and AFCA Coaches preseason Top 25 polls. **William & Mary** leads the way at #4 in both polls, while **New Hampshire** is #11 in the Stats poll and #12 in the AFCA poll. **Richmond** is ranked #16 by the AFCA and #18 by Stats, **Delaware** is #21 in the AFCA rankings and #22 in the Stats rankings, and **Rhode Island** is ranked #21 by Stats and #23 by the AFCA. **Elon** and **Villanova** were among others receiving votes in both polls and **Campbell** and **North Carolina A&T** picked up votes in the AFCA poll. The CAA's five ranked teams trails only the Big Sky (6).

EIGHT PLAYERS ON WATCH LISTS FOR NATIONAL AWARDS: CAA Football had eight players named to a pair of Stats Perform national Player of the Year Watch Lists. New Hampshire running back **Dylan Laube**, UAlbany quarterback **Reese Poffenbarger**, Monmouth running back **Jaden Shirden** and William & Mary running back **Bronson Yoder** are on the watch list for the Payton Award, which is given to the top offensive player in FCS. William & Mary defensive end **Nate Lynn**, William & Mary linebacker **John Pius**, New Hampshire defensive end **Josiah Silver** and Richmond linebacker **Tristan Wheeler** are on the watch list for the Buchanan Award, presented to the top defensive player in FCS.

HAMPTON'S TOWNSEL ON PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST: Hampton linebacker **Qwahsin Townsel** was recognized on the Black College Football Player of the Year Watch List by the Black College Football Hall of Fame.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS: CAA Football was well-represented on numerous preseason All-America teams. The league had 14 players honored by Stats Perform, six by HERO Sports, five from Athlon Sports and 16 by Phil Steele. A complete list of preseason All-America honorees is included in the release.

SEVEN CAA PLAYERS ON REESE'S SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST: Seven CAA players have been selected to the Watch List for the Reese's Senior Bowl, one of the premier all-star games for NFL Draft prospects. Making the list were Richmond offensive lineman **Ryan Coll**, Rhode Island offensive lineman **Nick Correia**, Campbell offensive lineman **Mike Edwards**, Towson defensive lineman **Jesus Gibbs**, Campbell defensive back **Isaiah Greene**, New Hampshire running back **Dylan Laube** and William & Mary linebacker **John Pius**.

W&M PICKED TO WIN CAA TITLE: William & Mary, which is coming off an 11-2 season that included a share of the CAA title and a berth in the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs for the first time since 2009, has been picked to win the title again in 2023 by a vote of the league's head coaches. The Tribe got 13 first-place votes and 195 total points, topping second-place New Hampshire, which received one first-place vote and 235 points. Richmond was picked third, followed by Delaware, Elon, Rhode Island, Villanova, Monmouth, Towson, North Carolina A&T, UAlbany, Campbell, Maine, Stony Brook and Hampton.

MU'S SHIRDEN, W&M'S PIUS TOP PRESEASON ALL-CAA TEAM: Monmouth running back **Jaden Shirden** was chosen as the CAA preseason Offensive Player of the Year and William & Mary linebacker **John Pius** was selected as the CAA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year by the league's head coaches. Shirden led all FCS players in rushing with 1,722 yards and 13 TD's in 2022, while Pius recorded 72 total tackles and ranked among FCS leaders with 11.5 sacks and 19.0 TFL's. The complete team can be found in this release.

NEW COACHES IN THE CAA: CAA Football will have two new head coaches for the 2023 season. **Pete Shinnick** takes over at Towson after guiding West Florida to the Div. II national championship in 2019. He owns a 159-67 record over 20 seasons as a head coach. **Vincent Brown** is the new head coach at North Carolina A&T after spending the past four years as the defensive coordinator at defending CAA champion William & Mary. Brown was a three-time All-Pro linebacker for the New England Patriots.

DEEPEST CONFERENCE IN FCS: No conference has proven to be as strong from top to bottom as CAA Football in recent years. Twelve of the league's 15 current members have participated in the FCS playoffs since 2015.

MULTIPLE TEAMS IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS: CAA Football has had multiple teams in the playoffs for 32 straight years, and has had at least three teams in the playoffs in 15 of the past 17 years. Eleven times in league history at least four teams were chosen. Five teams were picked in 2007, 2008, 2011 and 2022, and the CAA set a record with six teams selected to the playoff field in 2018.

PLAYOFF SUCCESS: The CAA has had at least two teams advance to the second round of the FCS playoffs every year since the field expanded to 20 (and then 24) teams in 2010. The conference has had at least one team in the quarterfinals every year since 1995 and at least one team in the semifinals nine times in the past decade. CAA Football has had a team in the FCS championship game 11 times since 2003. The league owns six national titles - UMass (1998), Delaware (2003), James Madison (2004, 2016), Richmond (2008) and Villanova (2009).

UALBANY**1-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Never trailed in a 34-13 season-opening victory over Fordham.
- QB Reese Poffenbarger was 23-of-40 passing for 253 yards and 4 TD's and also ran for 47 yards vs. Fordham. He has thrown for 3+ TD's in five of his 12 career games.
- Roy Alexander made a team-best 6 catches for 58 yards and 2 TD's vs. Fordham. UA had 11 different players with a catch in the win.
- LB Dylan Kelly recorded a team-high 12 tackles and 2.0 sacks vs. Fordham.
- The Great Danes held the Rams to 235 total yards and one TD. UAlbany recorded 10 sacks in the win, including four from Anton Juncaj and three from AJ Simon.
- Bentley transfer Nate Larkins rushed for a team-high 69 yards on 12 carries in his UA debut.
- UAlbany played its season opener at home for the first time since 2014 in front of a capacity crowd of 8,500 at Casey Stadium.

CAMPBELL**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Makes its CAA debut by hosting preseason league favorite William & Mary. Campbell fell 37-21 to the Tribe a year ago.
- QB Hajj-Malik Williams threw for 2,221 yards and 12 TD's and ran for 338 yards and 7 TD's in 2022. He is Campbell's all-time leader in passing yards (5,639 yds) and has rushed for 1,351 yards.
- The Camels return four starters on the offensive line, led by preseason All-America tackle Mike Edwards.
- Returning WR's Jalen Kelsey, Chaney Fitzgerald and Ezeriah Anderson combined for 92 receptions and 6 TD's in 2022.
- LB CJ Tillman tallied a team-high 82 tackles, 7.5 TFL's and 2.0 sacks last season. He made the All-Big South second team.
- PK Caleb Dowden was named to the All-Big South second team last year after connecting on 14-of-16 field goals and 39-of-40 extra points.
- Campbell was 4-1 at home last season.

DELAWARE**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Visits Stony Brook for its season opener. It's the third time in the last four seasons that UD has opened with a conference game.
- WR Jourdan Townsend led UD in catches (61) and receiving yards (698) last season. The 3rd-team All-CAA pick had seven or more receptions in six games.
- RB Kyron Cumby rushed for a team-high 625 yards and 4 TD's in his first year with the Blue Hens. He also averaged 22.2 yards on kickoff returns and caught 16 passes.
- Delaware ranked No. 2 in FCS in pass defense (137.8 ypg), No. 3 in total defense (282.6 ypg) and No. 4 in scoring defense (18.2 ppg) last season.
- DE Chase McGowan earned 3rd team All-CAA accolades in 2022 after tallying team-highs in sacks (5.0) and TFL's (9.5). He added 30 tackles and 5 QB hurries.
- UD added Monmouth transfer punter Ryan Kost, who averaged 48.1 yards per kick last season and made the All-CAA first team.

ELON**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Opens the season with a Thursday night game at ACC foe Wake Forest. It's the first non-Saturday game for Elon since 2017.
- RB Jalen Hampton ran for a team-high 1,053 yards and 10 TD's in 2022. The 3rd-team All-CAA pick topped the 100-yard mark four times and became just the second player in EU's FCS history with 1,000+ yards.
- WR Chandler Brayboy caught 28 passes for 475 yards and 3 TD's last season. He also averaged 21.2 yards on kick returns and was 3rd team All-CAA as a special teams player.
- DB Bo Sanders is EU's top returning tackler after making 69 stops last season. He added 5.5 TFL's and 5 PBU's.
- Returning DL's Josh Johnson and Marvin Pearson combined for 5.0 sacks and 6.5 TFL's in 2022.
- Elon plays its first six games in the state of North Carolina. Along with three home contests, the Phoenix make short trips to Wake Forest, Gardner-Webb and Campbell. EU has eight games overall in NC.

HAMPTON**0-0 Overall/0-0 CAAFB**

- Starts the year against HBCU foe Grambling State at Red Bull Arena in New Jersey. The game will air nationally on NFL Network.
- LB Qwahsin Townsel led Hampton and ranked third in the CAA with 100 tackles last season. The 2nd team All-CAA selection has been named to the Black College Football Player of the Year Award Watch List.
