RHODE ISLAND VS. VILLANOVA - SERIES NOTES

- Saturday's contest will be the 26th in the history between Rhode Island and Villanova, dating back to 1988.
- The Wildcats have earned a 20-5 all-time advantage over the Rams, which includes a 13-2 edge at home at Villanova Stadium.
- Despite Villanova's overall success in the series, Rhody has been victorious in two of the past three meetings.
- A 20-6 victory for the Rams in 2017 snapped a five-game losing streak in their history with the Wildcats.
- The team then followed it up with another win in the spring 2021 season at 40-37 (OT).
- Quarterback **Kasim Hill's** 2-yard touchdown run propelled Rhody to its overtime triumph over the sixth-ranked Wildcats.
- The last time the sides faced off was in 2021 when Villanova shut out Rhode Island, 44-0, in Pennsylvania.
- Rhody's shut out at the hands of the then-No. 5 Wildcats was its first since 2016.

RAMS CRACK NATIONAL TOP 20

- Following its conference win at Maine last Friday night, Rhode Island jumped up to No. 17 in the Stats Perform Top 25 and No. 18 in the AFCA Coaches Top 25.
- Rhody improved from 21st in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 poll, presented by FedEx Ground, while jumping up from its previous ranking of 20th in the Coaches Poll.
- Joining the Rams in the Coaches Poll were three other CAA Football teams in William & Mary (5th), UNH (12th) and Delaware (16th).
- Each of the aforementioned programs was also ranked by Stats Perform, with the Tribe coming in at fifth, the Wildcats checking in at 11th and the Blue Hens slotted 19th. Villanova was also on the list at No. 25.

GROFF COLLECTS CAA FOOTBALL HONORS

- After making the first two field goals of his career on the road at Maine, rookie kicker **Ty Groff** earned Co-Special Teams Player of the Week honors from CAA Football.
- The New Canaan, Conn. native nailed a 47-yarder in the first quarter, the longest by a Rams' kicker in 10 years and added a 42-yarder in the third period that put URI up by 10.
- Groff's 47-yard boot ties for the seventh-longest field goal in program history.
- The freshman is now 2-3 on field goals as a Ram and a perfect 14-14 on PATs.
- He accounts for a team-best 20 of Rhody's 104 points so far this season.
- Groff shared Rhode Island's first weekly honors of the season with Elon's **Kyle Romenick**, who averaged 42.2 yards on five punts and threw the first touchdown pass by an Elon punter in its Division I era as the Phoenix defeated North Carolina A&T, 27-3.

LAST TIME OUT: RHODY POUNDS MAINE

- Rhode Island recorded its first win at Maine in 25 years, using its versatile and explosive offense to pull away from the Black Bears, 34-17 last Friday night.
- The Rams scored twice through the air, twice on the ground and had two field goals on the night.
- Wide receiver **Kahtero Summers** caught a pair of second-quarter touchdowns to spark the offense, while both running backs **Gabe Sloat** and **Ja'Den McKenzie** found the endzone through the run game.
- Kicker **Ty Groff** nailed a pair of 40-plus yard field goals, the first of his career.
- Safeties **Jordan Colbert** and **Brent Jackson** led Rhode Island with nine tackles each, while the defense held Maine to 3-of-11 on third down.

RHODE WARRIORS

- The Rams have put together solid records on the road over the past few seasons.
- After a 2-0 effort in the COVID-shortened 2020 campaign, Rhody has gone 3-3 in each of the past two seasons.
- Last Friday night, Rhode Island earned its first victory in Orono since Oct. 10, 1998 by defeating the Black Bears 34-17.
- The win leveled the team out to 1-1 in road games this season and helped the Rams pick up back-to-back wins over Maine for the first time since 1998-99.
- A win over the Wildcats on Saturday would be the team's second in three seasons at Villanova Stadium.

- Despite being shut out in the last meeting (44-0; Oct. 23, 2021), the Rams defeated sixth-ranked Villanova 40-37 in overtime on March 13, 2021.

FLEMING ONE WIN AWAY FROM HISTORY

- With 10 years under his belt at the helm for Rhode Island, head coach **Jim Fleming** is not only the third longest tenured coach in URI history, but is also closing in on being one of the top three winningest coaches in program history.
- He is currently tied with **Tim Stowers** (2000-07) for third all-time with 33 career wins.
- **Bob Griffin** (1976-92) holds the record with 79 career wins, followed by 70 from second-place **Frank Keaney** (1920-40).
- As for his years in Kingston, he is tied with **Marshall Tyler**, who accumulated 10 seasons between 1898-1901 and 1903-1908.
- Only **Keaney** (21 seasons) and **Griffin** (17 seasons) have more seasons as head coach on the Rhody sideline.

MCKENZIE PICKING UP STEAM

- Running back **Ja'Den McKenzie** has seen his role steadily increase through the start of the Rams' season.
- A graduate transfer from West Chester, McKenzie was a big get for the Rams last offseason as he was one of the top running backs in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference.
- He finished his career as a Golden Ram with 2,603 rushing yards and 30 touchdowns.
- After struggling at Georgia State (Aug. 31), where he rushed for -1 yards, McKenzie recorded 30 yards on the ground opposite Stony Brook (Sept. 8) and recorded his first Rhody touchdown.
- The Morton, Pa. native finally broke free at Maine (Sept. 15), punishing the Black Bears' defense for 121 rushing yards.
- McKenzie made a 17-yard run into the endzone at Maine for his second touchdown of the year and now leads the Rams with two rushing scores.

GIBBS MAKING AN IMPACT

- After appearing in just four games as a true freshman last year and preserving a redshirt, cornerback **Syeed Gibbs** has come on strong in 2023.
- The Everett, Mass. native is the team's third-leading tackler with 16.0 total stops, 10 of which are solo.
- Gibbs is credited with one pass breakup and has started all three of Rhody's games.
- Safeties **Brent Jackson** (19.0 tackles) and **Jordan Colbert** (18.0 tackles) lead the Rams defensively.

OPPOSING SECONDARIES BEWARE

- Heading into the fourth week of the season, **Kahtero Summers** is second in CAA Football with 332 receiving yards.
- That yardage ranks third nationally, behind UIW's **Brandon Porter** (376) and UNH's **Dylan Laube** (357).
- The graduate student is averaging 110.7 yards per game and 20.8 yards per catch.
- His effort in yards per catch is 15th in the country.
- Summers caught six passes for 130 yards and two touchdowns during the game at Maine.
- It was his second straight 100-yard receiving game, and the touchdowns were his first two of the season.
- Rhode Island currently has the fourth-best passing offense in the nation, with an average of 313.7 yards per game.
- Summers is joined in CAA Football's top-10 receivers by **Darius Savedge** and **Marquis Buchanan**.
- Savedge has caught 16 passes for 189 yards, while Buchanan has hauled in four passes for 182 yards.
- The duo ranks seventh and eighth in the league, respectively, and is credited with a pair of touchdowns each.

ALL-AMERICAN

- Offensive lineman **Nick Correia** garnered preseason recognition from nearly every outlet ahead of the 2023 campaign.
- The Nantucket, Mass. native was dubbed a Preseason All-American by Stats Perform (Second Team), HERO Sports and Bluebloods (Second Team).
- A 2022 Third Team All-American, Correia led a Ram offensive line that blocked for the third-highest scoring offense in the league.
- In addition to his All-American accolades, Correia and fellow offensive lineman **Lorenzo Thompson** were named to the East-West Shrine Bowl 1000 List.
- He was additionally named to the watch list for the Reese's Senior Bowl, which will be held at Hancock Whitney Stadium in Mobile, Ala. on Feb. 3, 2024.
- Correia was the team's anchor bearer in the season opener at Georgia State.

HILL CONTINUES TO CLIMB THE RANKS

- Now four-year starter **Kasim Hill** has had solid performances at the beginning of his seventh year in college football.
- The Rams got a bit of a shock in the spring when they learned that the quarterback had been granted one more season of eligibility for 2023.

- Hill threw for a career-high 408 yards at Georgia State, recording the 40th touchdown pass of his career in the second quarter.
- He now has 47 in his career and is nine away from overtaking **Chris Hixson** (1993-96) for second place.
- Hill already surpassed former Ram **Jayson Davis** (2002-05) for third all-time in the Rhody record book in yards of total offense.
- While Davis finished his tenure with 5,822, Hill is credited with 6,674.
- The signal caller checks into the national top five in numerous categories, including passing yards (941, second), passing touchdowns (8, third), passing yards per game (313.7 yards, third) and total offense (313.7 yards, fifth).

FROM KINGSTON TO FOXBOROUGH

- As the 2023 NFL season ramps up, there are numerous connections between Rhode Island Football and the New England Patriots that are worth noting.
- Former Rhody wide receiver **Ed Lee** had a nearly three-month stint with the program this summer after signing as a rookie free agent in June.
- His professional journey with the Patriots began when Second Team All-CAA selection received an invitation to attend a mini camp in April.
- Former Ram **Coby Tippet**'s father, **Andre Tippet**, was a standout for the New England Patriots and was inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in 2008.
- The defensive back, who played for the Rams in 2020 and 2021, was a First Team All-CAA performer at punt returner and earned Third Team accolades at safety.
- He recently joined Tufts Football as a cornerbacks coach.
- Freshman defensive lineman **Case Mankins** is the son of **Logan Mankins**, who was the Pats' first round draft selection in 2005.
- He played 11 seasons in the NFL as a guard and was selected to seven Pro Bowls.
- Case appeared in each of Rhody's first two games as a true freshman, recording the first tackle of his career against Stony Brook.
- Rookie punter **Devin Walter**'s father **Ken Walter** played the same position in his nine-year NFL career and was the holder for the Patriots' 2002 and 2004 Super Bowl Championship teams.
- Devin is at the top of the Rams' depth chart and has pinned four of his 11 punts inside the 20.

JIM FLEMING

Head Coach - 10th Season

Jim Fleming was named the 20th head coach in Rhode Island football history in December of 2013. He enters his tenth season at the helm in 2023-24.

For the second-straight year, Rhode Island had eight All-CAA Football selections in 2022, highlighted by a trio of First Team honorees in cornerback Jordan Jones, as well as offensive lineman Nick Correia and AJ Cornelius. Correia went on to earn Stats Perform Third Team All-American honors after anchoring an offense that ranked fourth in CAA Football in both rushing attack (168.8 yards per game) and passing attack (235.3 yards/game). As a team, the Rams finished with a 7-4 record marking the team's third-straight winning season. Rhody also saw a handful of players earn NFL opportunities in Jordan Jones (Los Angeles Rams, free agent signee), Ed Lee (New England Patriots, free agent signee) and Caleb Warren (Seattle Seahawks, mini camp invite).

In 2021, Fleming led the Rams to a 7-4 record, the most wins for the program in 17 seasons. It was his third winning season in four years, as the team was 6-5 in 2018 and 2-1 in the COVID-19 Spring season of 2021. The Rams had eight All-CAA Football selections, the most for the program in one year since 1995. Cornerback Jordan Jones was an Associated Press Second Team All-American, while fullback Joey Kenny was a Stats Perform and a Phil Steele Third Team All-American.

In a pandemic-shortened 2020-21 campaign, Fleming led the Rams to a 2-1 record before the season was ended by COVID-19 issues. After winning their first two games of the season, the Rams were ranked in both the STATS FCS and AFA FCS Coaches Top 25 polls. Rhody was ranked as high as No. 18 in the country. Redshirt freshman running back Kevin Brown, Jr. was the CAA Football Offensive Rookie of the Year, while fullback Joey Kenny was a first team all-conference honoree. Wide receiver Ivory Frimpong, offensive lineman Nick Correia and safety Coby Tippet all earned second-team honors.

Fleming has worked to turn the Rhode Island program around. In 2018, he led the team to its first winning season in 17 years. Rhody was 6-5 overall, including a 4-1 record at Meade Stadium. Fleming's team broke into the STATS FCS Top 25 on Sept. 10 for the first time for the program since 2005, and the team got as high as No. 16 in the STATS poll and No. 15 in the

AFCA FCS Coaches poll during the season. It was the first time URI was above .500 since 2001. The team also was 4-4 in CAA Football action, the first time the program was .500 in league play since 2010. Junior tackle Kyle Murphy and junior wide receiver Aaron Parker both earned CAA Football First-Team All-Conference and NEFWA All-New England recognition. Receiving second-team all-conference nods were senior quarterback JaJuan Lawson, senior tight end Tyler Burke and junior punt returner Ahmere Dorsey.

In 2017, Fleming saw six of his players earn all-conference honors. Harold Cooper earned CAA Football All-Conference Second Team honors as a running back and third-team recognition as a kick returner. Wide receiver Aaron Parker was named to the second team, while wide receiver Marven Beauvais, defensive tackle Brandon Ginnetti, offensive tackle Dino Boyd and punt returner Matt Pires were all on the third-team. The Rams also had their most victories in seven seasons.

For the second consecutive season, Fleming's team set a program mark for number of players to earn CAA Football Academic All-Conference recognition. The Rams had 22 players earn the honor in 2016, after having 18 receive the recognition in 2015. In 2016, Fleming had two players earn CAA Football All-Conference honors, as kick returner Harold Cooper was named to the second team and defensive end Jose Duncan took home third-team honors. Fleming also led the team to its first Governor's Cup victory since 2011 as the Rams defeated Brown 28-13 in the annual in-state battle.

In his second season the Rams earned eight spots on the CAA Football All-Conference Team, the most for Rhode Island since 1995. Sophomore Harold Cooper was a first-team selection as a kick returner and a third-team pick at running back. He also was named to the 2015 Division I All-New England Football Team as a kick returner. Also earning CAA Football All-Conference honors were left tackle Tyler Catalina (second team), linebacker Adam Parker (second team), safety Tim Wiendaw (second team), defensive lineman Mike Ezirike (third team), tight end Charlie McKeeman (third team) and cornerback Myles Holmes (third team).

Though the Rams went 1-11 mark in Fleming's first season in Kingston, the team improved as the year moved along. Five players - linebacker Andrew Bose, fullback Justin Favreau,

wide receiver Robbie Jackson, offensive tackle Tyler Catalina and kick returner Myles Holmes all earned a spot on the CAA Football All-Conference Team. Bose was the first Rhody linebacker to earn first-team honors in 16 seasons. He and freshman tight end Charlie McKeeman earned All-America honors from TonySoftli.com. Rhode Island also had 12 players earn a spot on the CAA Football Academic All-Conference Team.

Following the season, Bose signed as an undrafted free agent with the NFL's Baltimore Ravens, while running back Lyle McCombs signed with the Canadian Football League's Toronto Argonauts.

Fleming came to Rhode Island from the University of Central Florida, where he was the defensive coordinator for the No. 15 Knights. In 2013, Fleming helped UCF earn a spot in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

The 2013 season marked the second straight year that Fleming has helped guide UCF to a bowl game. In 2012, the Knights had the top-ranked scoring and pass defense in Conference USA and were ranked 29th nationally in scoring defense en route to a spot in the Beef O'Brady Bowl, where they defeated Ball State, 38-17.

Fleming has a track record of success, including as a head coach. In two seasons at Sacred Heart, he was a two-time Northeast Conference Coach of the Year while posting a 21-1 record. His team won the 2001 Mid Major I-AA National Championship to cap off a perfect 11-0 season. In his first year with the Pioneers, Fleming orchestrated the nation's best turnaround. Inheriting a team that had gone 2-9 the previous season, Fleming led Sacred Heart to a 10-1 mark in 2000, ending the season ranked No. 5 in the nation.

A veteran of 29 seasons of college football, Fleming has coached for teams in CAA Football, the AAC, the ACC, Conference USA, the MAC, the former Atlantic 10 (now CAA Football), the NEC, the Ivy League and the Big Sky Conference.

Fleming's defense in 2012 included safety Kemal Ishmael, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year who was a seventh-round draft pick for the Atlanta Falcons. Defensive end Troy Davis was placed on the All-C-USA First Team, cornerback A.J. Bouye grabbed a spot on the second team and lineman Deion Green was voted on to the all-freshman team. Bouye, Davis, Cam Henderson and Ray Shipman all signed rookie free-agent deals.

At Kent State in 2010, Fleming coached the linebackers for the Mid-American Conference's top-ranked defense. The Golden Flashes led the conference in sacks and tackles for loss, and Fleming's linebackers were a major reason. Middle linebacker Cobrani Mixon earned a spot on the All-MAC First Team by collecting 11.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles and 82 overall tackles, while All-MAC Third Team selection Dorian Wood led the Golden Flashes with 96 tackles (11.5 for loss). Luke Batton delivered 68 tackles at the other outside linebacker position.

Fleming spent six seasons at Akron (2004-09) as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach. He helped the Zips win their first MAC Championship and qualify for the Motor City Bowl in 2005. Under Fleming, the defense produced four All-MAC honorees, including the league's second-leading tackler in freshman Brian Wagner and the program's second-ever three-time All-MAC selection in Almondo Sewell. Fleming's defenses at Akron consistently performed among the nation's best, ranking 32nd in total defense in 2005, and 31st in passing defense in 2009.

Prior to Akron, Fleming spent two years (2002-03) as the defensive backs coach at North Carolina. That stint came after his remarkable two-year run as the head coach of Sacred Heart. During their championship run, the Pioneers ranked second in the nation in scoring, pass efficiency and turnover margin, fourth in total defense and seventh in scoring defense and passing yards allowed. Fleming was named the Northeast Conference Coach of the Year in both 2000 and 2001.

A native of New York, N.Y., Fleming also spent two years as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Villanova (1998-99) and four years (1994-97) coaching linebackers (1994) and defensive backs (1995-97) at East Carolina. His 1997 squad ranked second in Conference USA in pass defense, while in 1995, the Pirates finished 9-3 and earned a berth in the Liberty Bowl where they defeated Stanford, 19-13. That season, the ECU defense ranked seventh nationally in pass efficiency defense, producing 33 takeaways and 19 interceptions.

No stranger to the Ocean State, Fleming spent the 1993 campaign as the defensive coordinator at Brown where the Bears went from 0-10 and last place in the Ivy League, to 4-6 and a tie for fourth place in the conference. From 1987-92, he had a successful six-year stretch at Boise State, including the final three seasons as defensive coordinator. His 1991 Broncos' defense led the nation in rushing defense, was third in turnover margin and led the Big Sky Conference in every statistical category. In 1990, BSU finished 10-4 and advanced to the semifinals of the Division I-AA playoffs, leading the conference in scoring defense.

Fleming is a 1982 graduate of the University of the South with a degree in English. While there, he was a four-year starter in football and baseball, earning all-conference honors as a tight end in 1981. Fleming began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at South Carolina in 1985.

He and his wife, Leslie, have four children: Jimmy, Will, Kate and Meg.
