LEADING THE PACK

- With four games under his belt to start the season, Reese Poffenbarger is averaging 169 passing yards per game with a 49.3% completion percentage. He's recorded seven passing touchdowns, 66 completions, and 676 total passing yards. Poffenbarger also ranks third on the team in rushing yards. He's averaging 26.5 per game with a net of 106 on the year. He has recorded two long TD rushes thus far, a 54-yard score against Marshall and a 41-yard run against Hawai'i.
- Anton Juncaj has been a monster on the defensive line to start the season. The DE recorded a program record four sacks in the team's opening game against Fordham. By adding two more against Hawai'i, and another at Morgan State, Juncaj leads the FCS with a grand total of seven. Not far behind, DE AJ Simon ranks tied for 11th in the entire FCS with four.
- Aamir Hall is finding the ball early in his first season with the Great Danes. The young corner has recorded interceptions in his outings against Marshall and Hawai'i, and also leads the team with six PBUs. He's recorded 13 total tackles, 10 solo, in four games.
- Linebacker Dylan Kelly continues to be all over the field on defense, recording 49 tackles through four games. That mark puts him in a tie for fourth in the entire FCS, and currently paces the CAA. Kelly has added two sacks for 13 yards and recorded an interception at Hawai'i.
- Poffenbarger has shown an ability to spread the love on offense, with 14 different Great Danes recording at least one reception to start the season. Caden Burtin and Brevin Easton both sit with 11 receptions each, with Burtin leading the team with 113 total yards.
- Running back Nate Larkins has been given the majority of carries over the first three games, leading the team with 43 attempts. He's averaging 4.3 yards per carry, averaging 46 yards per game. He is followed by graduate transfer Faysal Aden, who has registered 42 carries and is averaging 2.8 yards per rush.

Scouting Morgan State

Villanova heads to UAlbany this week for its first CAA Football road game of the season. The Wildcats are coming off a 35-9 victory over then-No. 17 Rhode Island in their league opener a week ago. After defeating Rhode Island in a Top 25 battle a week ago, Villanova moved up nine spots in this week's Stats Perform FCS Poll and come in at No. 16 in the rankings. Villanova has won five of its last six games in the state of New York since 2019. Villanova quarterback Connor Watkins and wide receiver Rayjuon Pringle have been the top QB-WR combination in the FCS this season. Watkins leads the nation in both passing yards per attempt (10.42) and passing yards per completion (19.47), while Pringle is leading the country with an average of 27.5 yards per reception. Senior linebacker Brendan Bell is this week's CAA Football Co-Defensive Player of the Week after he had eight tackles and two tackles for loss against URI last week.

Into the Rankings

The Great Danes have yet to break into the Stats Perform FCS Top 25, but remain just outside through four games. After dismantling Fordham to start the year, UAlbany played two incredibly strong road games against FBS level competition before getting back into the win column last week at Morgan State. The team was in the conversation for the win in both FBS matchups, putting the rest of the FCS on notice. Five CAA teams currently hold spots in the Top 25 - William & Mary (#5), Delaware (#11), New Hampshire (#14), Villanova (#16), and Rhode Island (#24). The Great Danes are set to play Villanova this week, New Hampshire on the road on Oct. 14, Rhode Island at home on Oct. 21, and William & Mary at home on Nov. 4.

TEAM NOTES

Record Breakers

The UAlbany defense combined to record 10 sacks in the season opener against Fordham, a single-game record. The previous record, eight, was set in 2017 against New Hampshire. Leading that charge was defensive end Anton Juncaj, Juncaj finished with four sacks on the day, claiming his own individual record for most sacks in a single game. Also having impressive nights were AJ Simon, who finished with three sacks, Dylan Kelly (2), and Ronnell McCorn (1).

QB Year Two

Sophomore quarterback Reese Poffenbarger enters year number two with the Great Danes in 2023. Poffenbarger joined UAlbany in the spring of 2022 as a transfer from Old Dominion, heading into a four-way quarterback battle during training camp. The rookie QB earned his starting role and never looked back. It only took him three games to surpass the UAlbany single-game passing record, throwing for 412 yards and three touchdowns. Poffenbarger went on to toss 2,999 yards on the season with a 62% completion rate. He collected 24 touchdowns, throwing just four interceptions. He was named the CAA Rookie of the Week an unprecedented six times before claiming the conference's Rookie of the Year title and being named to the CAA Third Team All-Conference. In addition, he was named the ECAC Division I FCS Rookie of the Year, the 2022 Jerry Rice Award Runner-Up, and a HERO Sports Freshman All-American.

This season, Poffenbarger looks to build off of his historic 2022 campaign. He has already been named to the Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List, which is presented to the national offensive player of the year in football's Division I subdivision, and was also named CAA Preseason All-Conference Honorable Mention. He enters year two with offensive Coordinator and Associate Head Coach Jared Ambrose guiding him from the sidelines.

Defensive Upgrades

It's no secret the Great Dane defense struggled in 2022. The unit ranked second to last in the conference, allowing 34.1 points per game and a total of 51 touchdowns. That script is looking to get flipped. Enter first-year Defensive Coordinator Bill Nesselt. Nesselt enters year seven at UAlbany, taking over the defense after serving as the team's Special Teams Coordinator last season and as the team's defensive line coach from 2018 to 2021. But it's not just Coach Nesselt that makes the 2023 defense stand out from a season ago.

Aamir Hall and DaeSean Winston look to be immediate playmakers for the purple and gold. Hall transfers in from CAA foe Richmond, where he has totaled 24 games played with two interceptions, 19 passes defended, and 5.5 tackles for loss. He was named a Phil Steele Freshman All-American in the spring of 2021. Hall comes to Upstate New York with Temple Transfer DaeSean Winston. Winston brings a plethora of experience from a top-level program and immediately slots in as the team's starting full safety. Those two will match up with a slew of returners coming into 2023 with another year under their belts, including CAA Preseason Honorable Mention winners Anton Juncaj (defensive end) and Dylan Kelly (Linebacker), defensive leader Larry Walker Jr. (strong safety), defensive lineman Joseph Greaney, AJ Simon, and Elijah Hills, linebackers Jahlil Johnson and Ori Jean-Charles, and corner Bill Hackett.

Running Back Room

In 2021, the Great Danes relied heavily on running back Karl Mofor. The same can be said with Todd Sibley in 2022. In 2023 however, UAlbany is still looking to find a potential bell cow in the backfield. Training camp has been a battle ground for all the backs looking for the coveted RB1 slot. The top names in that conversation include Utah Transfer Faysal Aden, Bentley transfer Nate Larkins, and returners Jose Lopez, Griffin Woodell, and Landon Alexander. According to the depth chart, Aden will get the nod as the top back to start the season. The number two spot comes down to Larkins and Woodell. It will be a key position battle to keep an eye on as UAlbany plays four-consecutive non-conference games before facing off against Villanova on Sept. 30.

Meet the Leadership Council

Every year, the UAlbany players and coaching staff elect a "Leadership Council" comprised of players who show an extortionary level of leadership both on and off the field. This year's council is comprised of nine total student-athletes, five coming from the offensive side of the ball and four coming from the defensive side. On offense, Leadership Council selections include quarterback Reese Poffenbarger, Tight End Ian Renninger, wide receiver Roy Alexander, and linemen Scott Houseman and Ozzie Hutchinson. On defense, safety Larry Walker Jr., lineman AJ Simon, and linebackers Dylan Kelly and Ori Jean-Charles get the nod.

A Decade at UAlbany

It's been a decade since Head Football Coach Greg Gattuso took over the reigns of the UAlbany program, replacing legendary long-time coach Bob Ford. In ten years, Gattuso has amassed a 39-57 overall record, leading the Great Danes on some of their most historic seasons. The 2019 season saw the Great Danes win nine games, including their first-ever FCS playoff game, at home against Central Connecticut State. The Danes went 9-5 overall, including 6-2 in the CAA to finish second after being picked 11th in the preseason coaches' poll. The 2019 team featured six All-CAA selections and two major awards, including Offensive Rookie of the Year Jeff Undercuffler, with Gattuso landing CAA Coach of the Year honors. Gattuso was also a finalist for the STATS Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top head coach in FCS football.

Gattuso was a defensive lineman at Penn State, where he helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach.

Villanova 35, Rhode Island 9

Quarterback Connor Watkins rushed for 113 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 10 carries and added 166 yards through the air to lead #25 Villanova (3-1, 1-0 CAA) past #17 Rhode Island (2-2, 2-1 CAA), 35-9. Watkins did most of his damage in the first half, finding the end zone of runs of 1, 23 and 5 yards to build a 21-3 advantage at halftime. The Wildcats broke the game open on their opening drive of the third quarter as TD Ayo-Durojaiye (7 carries, 103 yards) broke loose for a 63-yard scoring run. Villanova's defense was excellent, holding the Rams to 241 total yards, including 60 on the ground. Brendan Bell paced the Wildcats with eight tackles, 2.0 TFL's and a sack. For Rhode Island, Kasim Hill passed for 175 yards and the Rams got a 14-yard TD run from Jaden Griffin in the fourth quarter. Evan Stewart made 10 tackles and a TFL for the URI defense.

William & Mary 28, Maine 3

Bronson Yoder ran for a career-high 163 yards and a touchdown and Malachi Imoh added 103 yards on the ground at #5 William & Mary (4-0, 2-0 CAA) pulled away for 28-3 victory over Maine (0-4, 0-2 CAA). The Tribe finished with 331 rushing yards on a rainy afternoon while their top-ranked defense held the Black Bears to 138 total yards and seven first downs. Yoder finished a 93-yard drive with a 1-yard TD run to put W&M 7-0 early in the second quarter, but Maine trimmed the deficit to four at the half following a 20-yard Cody Williams field goal. The Tribe took advantage of a Ryan Poole interception early in the third quarter and went up 14-3 on a 1-yard Darius Wilson run. Wilson hit JT Mayo with a 2-yard scoring pass later in the period and a 4-yard TD run by Martin Lucas with 3:02 to go sealed the victory. Kevin Jarrell led the W&M defense with nine tackles and a TFL, while Nate Lynn added six stops and a pair of sacks. Maine's defense was paced by Abdul Stewart's 10 tackles, while Buggs Brown and Darius McKenzie each had eight stops and a forced fumble.

Richmond 20, Stony Brook 19

Andrew Lopez kicked a 28-yard field goal with 46 seconds remaining to lift Richmond (2-2, 1-0 CAA) to a 20-19 win over Stony Brook (0-4, 0-3 CAA). The Spiders' offense committed five turnovers on the day, but freshman quarterback Ashten Snelsire was able to put together an 11-play, 57-yard drive to set up the game-winning kick. The game was tied at 3-3 in the second quarter when Richmond got a 56-yard TD pass from Jackson Hardy to Nick DeGennaro. The Seawolves quickly answered with a 34-yard scoring pass from Casey Case to Anthony Johnson to tie the game at 10-10 at halftime. A 36-yard Savon Smith TD run put the Spiders back on top late in the third period, but a 56-yard pick six by the Seawolves' JuJu Ganthier brought the Seawolves within 17-16. SBU forced a UR fumble and went ahead 19-17 following a 31-yard Spencer Biscoe field goal with 9:29 left. Smith rushed for a team-best 106 yards and a TD to lead the UR offense. Case passed for 154 yards and a TD for SBU. Defensively, SBU's Aidan Kaler made a game-high 14 stops and UR's Tristan Wheeler had nine tackles.

Delaware 29, New Hampshire 25

Ryan O'Connor passed for 335 yards and three touchdowns as #19 Delaware (3-1, 2-0 CAA) rallied for a 29-25 victory over #11 New Hampshire (2-2, 0-1 CAA). Marcus Yarns ran for 105 yards and a TD and Jourdan Townsend had five receptions for 122 yards and a TD as the Blue Hens piled up 500 yards of total offense. New Hampshire took a quick 5-0 lead thanks to a safety and a field goal and extended the margin to 18-0 following a pair of Max Brosmer touchdown passes – a 16-yarder to Logan Tomlinson and a 2-yarder to Kyle Lepkowski. O'Connor brought the Hens back, throwing a 32-yard TD pass to Townsend, a 24-yarder to Yarns and an 18-yarder to Chandler Harvin to put UD on top, 22-18 early in the third quarter. On the ensuing kickoff, Dylan Laube put UNH ahead 25-22 with a 100-yard return for a TD. However, a 30-yard TD run by Yarns with 3:33 left in the third period proved to be the difference. Brosmer finished 34-of-58 passing for 392 yards and 2 TD's, with DJ Linkins making five catches for 110 yards. Joe Eichman had 11 stops for the UNH defense. Jackson Taylor had 11 tackles and a TFL and Khalil Dawsey added nine tackles, an interception and a forced fumble for the Blue Hens, who made a pair of fourth-down stops in the final quarter to maintain the lead.

Elon 28, Campbell 24

Jalen Hampton rushed for 169 yards and a school-record tying four touchdowns as Elon (2-2, 2-0 CAA) held off Campbell (2-2, 1-2 CAA), 28-24. After the Camels took an early 3-0 advantage, Hampton found the end zone on runs of 10, 6 and 1 yard in the second quarter to put the Phoenix ahead 21-3 at the break. Campbell got a 22-yard scramble from quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams to pull within 21-10, but Hampton scored his fourth TD to make it 28-10 after three periods. The Camels fought back as Williams found VJ Wilkins with an 11-yard TD pass and Na'Quari Rogers had a 2-yard TD run to make it 28-24 with 4:27 to play. Campbell got one final chance to complete the comeback but saw its final drive end at the Elon 37. John-carlos Miller II made four catches for 55 yards for Elon offensively, while the defense was led by Caleb Curtain with 10 tackles and a half-sack and Bo Sanders with 10 stops and an interception. Williams finished 33-of-44 passing for 367 yards with Wilkins making 10 grabs for 114 yards. Monchovia Gaffney had 10 tackles for the CU defense.

Norfolk State 21, Towson 14

A fourth-quarter comeback came up just short as Towson (1-3, 0-1 CAA) dropped a 21-14 decision to Norfolk State. After falling behind 7-0 early, the Tigers pulled even at the half following a 14-yard TD run by quarterback Nathan Kent. The Spartans tacked on a pair of third-quarter touchdowns, but Towson battled back with a 10-yard TD run by Devin Matthews to close within seven with 5:02 to go. The Tigers got a fourth-down stop drove to the NSU 12-yard line but were unable to get the tying score. Kent finished 21-of-36 passing for 201 yards, with Carter Runyon making six catches for 62 yards. Makye Smith and Mason Woods each had eight tackles and a sack defensively.

Lafayette 28, Monmouth 20

Marquez McCray passed for 234 yards, including a pair of touchdowns to Dymere Miller, but Monmouth (1-3, 1-1 CAA) was beaten 28-20 at Lafayette. The Hawks trailed 21-6 late in the third quarter when McCray hit Miller with a 20-yard scoring strike and MU added a 2-point conversion to pull within 21-14. Down 28-14, McCray and Miller hooked up for a 2-yard TD with 2:01 to go and the Hawks got one last chance to tie, but were unable to score. Miller finished with 10 receptions for 121 yards and 2 TD's. Defensively, Remi Johnson and Thomas Joe-Kamara each made eight tackles.

GREG GATTUSO - NINTH SEASON AT UALBANY



Greg Gattuso enters his 10th season at the helm of the UAlbany football program in the fall of 2023.

A former standout defensive lineman at Penn State who's worked at Duquesne, Pittsburgh and Maryland, Gattuso has led the Great Danes through six seasons in the Colonial Athletic Association, one of the top Football Championship Subdivision conferences in the nation.

In 2022, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a 3-9 season. Gattuso and his staff were responsible for brining in key pieces. Reese Poffenbarger, a transfer quarterback who made an immediate impact, was named the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year and picked up STATS Perform FCS All-America Honors. Developing tight end Thomas Greaney had a breakout year - leading the team in receiving yards and touchdowns, also picking up STATS Perform FCS First-Team All-America Honors. As a result, Greaney signed with the NFL's Cleveland Browns as a free agent following the 2023 draft.

In the 2021 fall season, the Great Danes finished with a record of 2-9. Gattuso led multiple Great Danes to individual accolades, including Karl Mofor being named to the All-CAA Second Team and the STATS Perform FCS All-America Second Team. In addition, Jared Verse dominated on the defensive end, earning FCS Freshman All-American honors with 53 tackles and 10.5 sacks.

In the shortened 2021 spring season, UAlbany finished 1-3 with a win over #14 New Hampshire to kick off the season. Under Gattuso, three Great Danes landed on the All-CAA Second Team in Danny Damico, Karl Mofor and Jared Verse. In addition, Verse showed early signs of becoming a breakout star, being named CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year and a STATS Perform FCS Jerry Rice Award Finalist.

The 2019 season saw the Great Danes win nine games, including their first-ever FCS playoff game, at home against Central Connecticut State. The Danes went 9-5 overall, including 6-2 in the CAA to finish second after being picked 11th in the preseason coaches' poll. The 2019 team featured six All-CAA selections and two major awards, including Offensive Rookie of the Year Jeff Undercuffler, with Gattuso landing CAA Coach of the Year honors. Gattuso was also a finalist for the STATS Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the top head coach in FCS football.

The 2019 team saw record-breaking performances from redshirt-freshman quarterback Jeff Undercuffler, who led the FCS with 41 passing touchdowns. Undercuffler also set single-season program records for passing yards, attempts, and completions, and single-game program records for passing touchdowns, yards, attempts, and completions. Senior wide receiver Juwan Green set single-season records for receptions, receiving yards, and led the FCS with 17 touchdown receptions. Redshirt-senior defensive end Eli Mencer set a single-season program record with 14.5 sacks. All three players landed several postseason awards, including All-America honors.

In 2017, he led the Great Danes to their first win over a Top 10 program -- a 19-10 overtime victory over No. 7 Villanova at Tom & Mary Casey Stadium. UAlbany also shut out New Hampshire, an FCS playoff qualifier, 15-0 in the season finale. It was one of several superlative efforts from a defense that finished the season ranked No. 9 nationally. The Great Danes were 4-7 overall and 2-6 in the CAA against a rigorous schedule that featured games against an FBS opponent (Old Dominion) and five matchups with Top 25 teams.

Under Gattuso's leadership, UAlbany had its best season as a CAA member in 2016, finishing 7-4 overall and 4-4 in the league. The Great Danes were ranked for five weeks, including as high as No. 16. UAlbany also earned its first victory over an FBS opponent with a 22-16 road win over Buffalo.

In his first season, in 2014, Gattuso led the Great Danes to a six-win turnaround from the previous year. The Great Danes picked up votes in the national polls for 10 straight weeks and appeared in The Sports Network Top 25 four times on their way to a 7-5 overall record and 3-5 CAA mark.

Gattuso was a defensive lineman at Penn State, where he helped lead the Nittany Lions to a national title in 1982. In his first collegiate head-coaching role, Gattuso piloted Duquesne to a 97-32 record during his 12-season tenure, and while making three bowl appearances at Pittsburgh, he turned the defensive line into one of the best in the nation as an assistant head coach.

Gattuso came to UAlbany after spending three seasons as a member Randy Edsall's staff at Maryland. There, he led the defensive line that ranked among the top in the ACC and was promoted to the position of assistant head coach in February 2012.

From 1989-1991, he served as head coach at his high school alma mater, Seton-LaSalle. Taking over a team that went 6-34 during the four seasons prior to his arrival, Gattuso led the Rebels to a 28-10-1 mark (.731), including three WPIAL playoff berths, a WPIAL championship and Parkway Conference title.

During his playing career, Gattuso was named the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Class AA Player of the Year his senior season at Seton-LaSalle.

Gattuso and his wife Colleen have two daughters, Jacqueline and Kaitlin.

ABOUT UALBANY ATHLETICS

The University at Albany is a member of the America East Conference in 16 of 18 varsity sports, while women's golf is an associate member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), and football, a Division I Football Championship Subdivision program, is an associate member of the Coastal Athletic Association (CAA). UAlbany has earned the Stuart P. Haskell Jr. Commissioner's Cup, which honors the America East's top-performing athletics department, seven times overall, including six-straight years from 2013-2018.

UAlbany has won 127 conference championships and has made 59 NCAA Tournament appearances since moving to Division I in 1999. Proving to be a perennial power, the Great Danes have won seven or more conference titles nine years in a row from 2010-2019. UAlbany claimed its 100th conference title on May 14, 2017, when softball won the America East Tournament. Entering the 2020-21 school year, UAlbany has 118 America East Tournament titles, six Northeast Conference (NEC) season titles in football, and three MAAC titles in women's golf.

UAlbany claimed three America East titles in 2022-23 and saw two teams, field hockey and women's lacrosse, make appearances in the NCAA Tournament. After defeating Stanford in a shootout in the America East final, the field hockey team upset #4 Michigan in overtime in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. The Field Hockey staff, led by head coach Phil Sykes, was named Regional Staff of the Year by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association, and Alison Smisdorn earned First Team All-America honors and was named Northeast Player of the Year. Women's lacrosse went unbeaten in America East play and defeated Binghamton to win its first America East title since 2012. The women's lacrosse team upset #12 Virginia in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. Katie Pascale earned All-Region Second Team and All-America Honorable Mention accolades from the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association. Both field hockey and women's lacrosse were nationally ranked at the end of their respective seasons, with field hockey landing at #16 and women's lacrosse at #18. Women's Track & Field continued its streak of conference titles, winning its 14th-straight America East outdoor championship, extending its longest active streak among NCAA Division I program. Louis Gordon, on the men's track & field team, earned Second Team All-America honors, placing 11th in the long jump at NCAA Outdoor Championships. UAlbany produced additional All-Americans in Jake Piseno from men's lacrosse, and Reese Poffenbarger and Thomas Greaney from football. Greaney became the 19th Great Dane in history to sign with an NFL team, joining the Cleveland Browns as an undrafted free agent. Elijah Gash, from men's lacrosse, was also selected 30th overall in the 2023 PLL College Draft.

UAlbany won four America East titles in 2021-22, and claimed their eighth overall Stuart P. Commissioner's Cup.

Throughout its Division I history, UAlbany has had 20 players selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft, nine players drafted by Major League Baseball, and 18 sign NFL contracts. The Division I era has also produced UAlbany's first female Olympian, Grace Claxton, a semifinalist in the 400m-hurdles at the Rio 2016 Games competing for Puerto Rico.

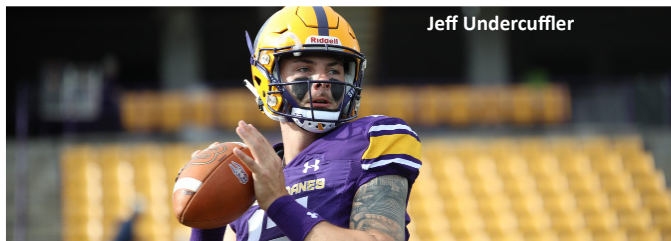

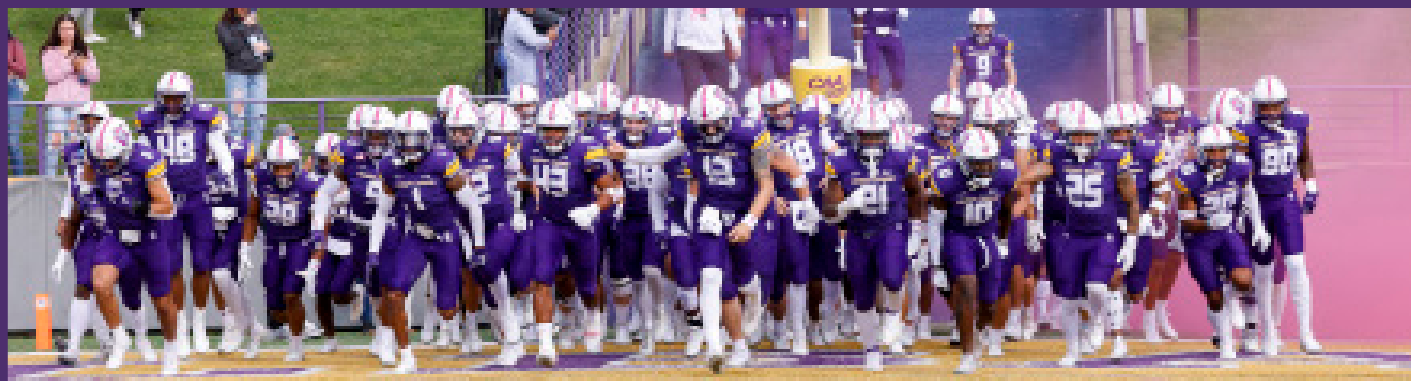
