QUICK HITTERS

New Hampshire has a 14-12 lifetime record against Villanova. The Wildcats out of Philadelphia were 45-33 victors last season at UNH's Wildcat Stadium to snap New Hampshire's five-game win streak in the series that spanned 2010-2019.

The last time UNH travelled to Villanova was Oct. 27, 2018, and returned home with a 34-0 win.

Senior captain **Josiah Silver** is No. 3 in the nation in both sacks per game (1.07) and tackles for loss per game (1.8).

Grad student captain **Logan Tomlinson** is No. 6 in receptions per game (6.0) and No. 9 in TD receptions (six).

Junior **Sean Lehane** is No. 8 in punting (45.8 yards/punt).

Grad student **Wande Owens** is 14th total tackles (9.3 per game).

UNH has scored 16 of its 19 touchdowns through the air. Conversely, the opponents have scored 13 of 19 touchdowns on the ground.

Grad student linebacker **Ryan Toscano** reached 250 career tackles with the first of 11 tackles Oct. 19 against URI. He enters Saturday's game with 260.

Junior wide receiver **Caleb Burke** surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards Oct. 19 during his 51-yard effort vs. URI. Burke enters Saturday's game with 1,019.

Senior **Zedane Williams** recorded his 150th tackle with the fourth of six tackles against URI on Oct. 19. He has 152.

New Hampshire has a 14-12 lifetime record against Villanova. The Wildcats out of Philadelphia were 45-33 victors last season at UNH's Wildcat Stadium to snap New Hampshire's five-game win streak in the series that spanned 2010-2019.

The last time UNH travelled to Villanova was Oct. 27, 2018, and returned home with a 34-0 win.

New Hampshire has won each of its last two trips to Villanova. UNH also prevailed 31-24 in 2010.

DURHAM, N.H. – Senior running back Dylan Laube recorded 307 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns, but UNH was defeated 45-33 by 17th-ranked Villanova University at Wildcat Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Laube recorded 132 rushing yards on 19 carries with a season-long 75 yard run for a touchdown. He also caught 10 passes for 72 yards and had three kickoff returns for 103 yards.

Max Brosmer completed 27 of 40 pass attempts for 259 yards and one touchdown; he had thrown only one interception through eight games but was intercepted three times by 'Nova.

Junior linebacker Ryan Toscano finished with a team-high nine tackles to increase his career total to 201, which is best among active UNH players. Junior Caleb Mead scored his first career touchdown on an 87-yard kickoff return. Senior Max Oxendine recorded UNH's takeaway with a 47-yard interception return.

Villanova's Jalen Jackson recorded a season-high 145 rushing yards on 19 attempts and two touchdowns. Rayjuon Pringle had a team-high four receptions for 104 yards and one TD. Quarterback Connor Watkins went 15 of 25 for 188 yards and two touchdowns and he also had four rushes for 26 yards and a pair of TDs.

Villanova's defense recorded four takeaways with three INTs and a fumble recovery, as well as six tackles for loss, including three sacks. Ty Trinh led all players with 13 tackles (eight solo) and Brendan Bell had 12 (seven solo).

'Nova improved to 7-2 overall and 5-1 in the CAA. UNH fell to 4-5, 2-4 CAA.

UNH held a 10-3 lead at the end of the first quarter and the home Wildcats held second-quarter leads of 17-10 and 20-17. New Hampshire went back in front, 27-24, early in the third quarter but Villanova scored the next two touchdowns to build a 38-27 lead. UNH closed within 38-33 early in the fourth quarter but the visitors responded immediately with a TD to push the margin to 45-33.

UNH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS: The Wildcats dropped out of both national polls following its 26-9 Homecoming loss to (then) No. 17/16 Rhode Island.

New Hampshire made its season debut in both national polls Sept. 23 following a 38-17 victory against Bryant that extended the Wildcats' winning streak to three games.

NATIONAL NUMBERS: New Hampshire is ranked in the top 20 in a handful of national stats.

Defensively, the 'Cats are No. 9 in sacks per game (2.86), are No. 8 in Red Zone defense by holding the opponents to points on 66.7% of their trips inside the 20, and are 10th in 3rd down conversion percentage by limiting opponents to a 31.4% success rate.

On offense, UNH is No. 16 in completion percentage (67.5%).

New Hampshire is 10th in fewest penalty yards per game (37.29).

Josiah Silver is No. 3 in both sacks per game (1.07) and tackles for loss per game (1.8).

Logan Tomlinson is No. 6 in receptions per game (6.0) and No. 9 in TD receptions (six).

Caleb Mead is No. 3 in combined kick returns (537 yards).

Sean Lehane is No. 8 in punting (45.8 yards/punt).

Seth Morgan is No. 11 in passing touchdowns (15).

Wande Owens is 14th total tackles (9.3 per game).

UPCOMING WILDCAT MILESTONES: Grad student wide receiver **Logan Tomlinson** has 2,944 career receiving yards, which puts him 56 away from 3,000.

Tomlinson is also at 2,971 career all-purpose yards.

Senior running back **Isaac Seide** has 918 career rushing yards.

Grad student **Wande Owens** enters Saturday's game at Villanova with 230 career tackles (including four seasons at Yale).

Junior linebacker **Brandon Perkins** has 86 career tackles.

RECENT WILDCAT MILESTONES: Grad student linebacker **Ryan Toscano** reached 250 career tackles with the first of 11 tackles Oct. 19 against URI. He enters Saturday's game with 260.

Junior wide receiver **Caleb Burke** surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards Oct. 19 during his 51-yard effort vs. URI. Burke enters Saturday's game with 1,019.

Senior **Zedane Williams** recorded his 150th tackle with the fourth of six tackles against URI on Oct. 19. He has 152.

First-year Wildcat **Wande Owens** recorded his 200th career tackle with the eighth of his nine tackles Sept. 21 against Bryant. Owens is currently at 230 tackles.

Josiah Silver recorded his 200th career tackle Sept. 14 against Stonehill and now has 217.

Joey Corcoran recorded his 100th career catch with the second of his two catches Sept. 21 against Bryant.

Logan Tomlinson recorded his 25th career TD catch with an 11-yard score vs. Bryant on Sept. 21.

3-2 AT THE HALF?: No. 17/24 New Hampshire led No. 16/15 Rhode Island by a 3-2 score at halftime last week at Wildcat Stadium. UNH's defense limited the Rams to three first downs and 57 yards in the first half.

URI converted an interception into three points to take a 5-3 lead at 9:43 of the third quarter, and then recovered a muffed punt in the end zone for a touchdown and 12-3 lead at 6:33 (on 103 total yards of offense).

HOMECOMING NOTEBOOK: **Brendan Tighe** recorded his second interception of the season and fourth career against Rhode Island on Oct. 19.

Both **Ryan Toscano** and **Wande Owens** recorded double-digit tackles vs. URI with 11 and 10, respectively.

UNH's defense did not record a sack for the first time this season. The previous time the Wildcats' D was held without a sack was last November at Villanova (eight consecutive games with a sack).

DOUBLE-DIGIT TACKLES: Grad student safety **Wande Owens** has recorded 10 tackles each of the past two games at Elon and vs. Rhode Island. He has a total of four games this season with 10+ tackles -- the others were in consecutive games at UCF (14) and at Holy Cross (10).

The rest of the team has two 10-tackle efforts, both by Ryan Toscano (10 at UCF and 11 vs. URI).

OPPOSITES: UNH has scored 16 of its 19 touchdowns through the air. Conversely, the opponents have scored 13 of 19 touchdowns on the ground.

GROUND GAME: As a team, UNH has rushed for more than 100 yards in a game twice in seven games -- 172 at Holy Cross and 102 vs. Stonehill. In three games since the bye week, the Wildcats have a total of 98 rushing yards with a season low of 20 last week against Rhode Island.

SPLITTING THE UPRIGHTS: Junior kicker **Nick Mazzie** has been near perfect through seven games with 17 successful PAT kicks and made field goals on 7 of 9 attempts. Mazzie made a career-long 52-yard field goal Oct. 4 at Harvard and tied his high of three field goals in a game vs. the Crimson. He missed a 45-yard field goal attempt Sept. 21 against Bryant and a 47-yarder vs. URI.

DRIVE STOPPERS: UNH's defense has been stingy on third down this season by allowing only 31 conversions on 102 attempts (31.4%). The Wildcats have been notably strong in the first three quarters: 6 of 27 (22.2%) in the first; 8 of 26 (30.8%) in the second; and 5 of 19 (26.3%) in the third.

PRODUCING TDs IN THE RED ZONE: New Hampshire's offense has scored a touchdown on 14 of 21 possessions in the Red Zone, which calculates to 66.7%.

Add three field goals to those possessions and UNH has scored on 17 of 21 trips inside the 20 (81.0%).

The opposition has not been as successful in the Red Zone. They have scored a TD 10 of 24 times (41.7%) and scored any points on 16 of 24 (66.7%). The Red Zone scoring percentage dropped three consecutive games: Elon was 0-for-2, Harvard was 3 of 5 and Bryant was 2-for-4.

IT'S YOUR LOSS: The UNH defense pushed the Elon offense behind the line of scrimmage on 11 of 63 plays, which calculates to 17% (and that's almost 1 in 5 plays).

Of the 11 tackles for loss, nine were sacks, which is the Wildcats' highest team sack total since UNH also recorded nine sacks vs. Fordham on Dec. 6, 2014.

The D-line recorded nine of the 11 sacks at Elon; the other two were by linebackers.

While you have to go back nearly a decade to find the last time New Hampshire had 9+ sacks in a game, you only have to go back seven games to find the last time the 'Cats had 11+ tackles for loss in a game -- Nov. 11, 2023 at Monmouth (second-to-last game of the '23 season).

THE LAST TIME A WILDCAT: **Josiah Silver** recorded four sacks and five tackles for loss Oct. 12 at Elon. The last player to record either 4+ sacks or 5+ tackles for loss in a game was also Josiah Silver on Nov. 13, 2021 at Rhode Island.

D-D-D-D-FENSE: UNH's defense was stout in the last three quarters of the game at Elon. The Wildcats shut out the Phoenix the last 45 minutes while limiting them to minus-5 yards rushing and 41 passing yards for 36 yards of total offense.

In eight consecutive possessions spanning the second through fourth quarters, Elon did not record a first down with negative-12 total yards of offense. Three of those possessions began in UNH territory.

The 'Cats did not allow Elon to score on either trip inside the Red Zone.

BLOCKTHAT KICK: New Hampshire transformed its first blocked punt of the season into a touchdown late in the first half at Elon.

The Phoenix got the ball back 1st-and-10 at the Elon 17 with 40 seconds remaining in the second quarter. Instead of opting to run out the clock and take a 10-0 lead into halftime, the home team sandwiched a pair of incompletions around an 8-yard gain that went out-of-bounds to stop the clock.

On fourth down from the Elon 25 with 23 seconds remaining, **Zeroun Skinner** broke through to block the punt. **Duncan Moreland** scooped up the ball at the Elon 17 and was tackled at the 10 yard line.

On the next play, **Seth Morgan** rolled to the right to evade the pass rush and found **Logan Tomlinson** in the back of the end zone to trim the deficit to 10-7 with 10 seconds remaining.

UNH outscored the Phoenix 7-0 in the second quarter, thanks in part to a 1-play, 10-yard TD drive, despite being limited to 29 yards.

MORE NEWS ABOUT MORELAND: In addition to recovering the blocked punt to set up UNH's first touchdown at Elon, **Duncan Moreland** recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter to protect UNH's 17-10 lead.

The Phoenix advanced to the UNH 30 before facing 4th-and-22 at the 42 yard line, and that's when Moreland picked off a deep pass down the middle at the UNH 20 and his 30-yard INT return gave the Wildcats 1st-and-10 at the 50 with 1:12 remaining.

TOMLINSON TIMES TWO: Grad student wide receiver **Logan Tomlinson** scored both UNH touchdowns at Elon. The first was a 10-yard reception in which he settled into an open space in the back of the end zone to lift the Wildcats within 10-7 with 10 seconds left in the first half. Tomlinson struck again on an option play when he took the toss down the left sideline for his first career rushing TD on a four-yard scamper; that play gave UNH a 14-7 lead at 8:13 of the third quarter.

It was the third time in his career Tomlinson scored two TDs in a game.

MAKING THE MOST OF IT: UNH recorded 151 total yards of offense at Elon; 109 of that came on back-to-back drives in the third quarter in which the Wildcats scored a touchdown and field goal to transform a 10-7 deficit into a 17-10 lead. The 'Cats had possession for 11:55 of the 15 minutes in the third quarter.

New Hampshire had its longest drive of the season with regards to both number of plays (12) and time of possession (7:05) on the drive that culminated with the 38-yard field goal by **Nick Mazzie**.

BIG-PLAY PASS GAME: UNH recorded pass plays of 49 and 46 yards at Harvard, but they did not crack the Wildcats' Top 5 longest

pass plays of the 2024 season. That means the 'Cats have five pass plays of 50+ yards with a long of 68.

The most frequent big-play pass combination has been **Seth Morgan to Caleb Burke** -- three times -- but both **Joey Corcoran** and **Logan Tomlinson** have a reception of 50+ yards this season.

PAIR OF 100-YARD RECEIVERS TIMES TWO: UNH had a pair of 100-yard receivers consecutive games against Stonehill and Bryant. Junior wide receivers **Caleb Burke** (134) and **Joey Corcoran** (129) both eclipsed 100 vs. Stonehill, then Burke (151) and grad student wide receiver **Logan Tomlinson** (106) did that against Bryant.

Neither Burke nor Corcoran had a 100-yard receiving game prior to this season.

Prior to this year, UNH did not have a pair of 100-yard receivers in a game since the 2016 season, when Neil O'Connor (192) and Malik Love (127) did it Oct. 15, 2016, vs. James Madison.

MORGAN TIES UNH PASSING TD RECORD: Senior quarterback **Seth Morgan** tied the UNH single-game record for passing touchdowns in a game with six in the Sept. 14 home-opening 45-6 win against Stonehill.

Morgan threw for a pair of TDs each of the first three quarters to lead the Wildcats to a 45-6 lead, and then he watched the fourth quarter from the sidelines.

The New Hampshire benchmark of six TD passes in a game was established by current head coach **Rick Santos** on Oct. 2, 2004 at Villanova.

200+ TACKLES: Grad student linebacker **Ryan Toscano** (260), senior defensive end **Josiah Silver** (217) and grad student safety **Wande Owens** (230) have all surpassed 200 career tackles.

Silver is UNH's active leader in both sacks (33.5) and tackles for loss (59.0).

100 TACKLES: Including Ryan Toscano and Josiah Silver and Wande Owens, seven current 'Cats have eclipsed 100 career tackles.

Senior CB **Noah Stansbury** enters Saturday's game with 176 tackles.

Senior safety and captain **Zedane Williams** has made 152 career tackles.

Senior defensive end **Flex Ruiz** has 127 total tackles.

Jacoby Sherard, another first-year Wildcat, surpassed 100 career tackles with five stops Sept. 7 at Holy Cross. He is currently at 117, which includes 96 tackles at Shippensburg.

TOSCANO NAMED A CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST: Grad student linebacker and captain **Ryan Toscano** was named a semifinalist for the 2024 William V. Campbell Trophy by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame on Sept. 25.

Celebrating its 35th year, the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

SILVER NAMED TO BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST: For the third consecutive year, UNH senior defensive end and captain **Josiah Silver** was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Preseason Watch List. The award recognizes the top defensive player in FCS football.

Silver has started all 36 games in three-plus seasons at UNH.

PAIR OF PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTIONS: Senior defensive end and captain **Josiah Silver** was named to the Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-America First Team as well as the Phil Steele FCS Preseason All-America Second Team.

REESE'S SENIOR BOWL WATCHLIST: Grad student defensive back **Wande Owens**, a first-year Wildcat, was named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watchlist.

Owens helped lead the 2023 Yale Bulldogs to a 7-5 overall record that included 5-2 in the Ivy League. The captain ranked second on

the team with 55 total tackles (42 solo, 13 assisted). Owens tied for the lead with seven pass breakups and made five tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Owens was named to both the All-Ivy First Team and All-New England Team twice at Yale.

This is the second consecutive year a Wildcat has been named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watchlist. **Dylan Laube** went on to play in the game and was selected by the Las Vegas Raiders in the sixth round of the NFL Draft this past April.

The Reese's Senior Bowl is widely regarded as the preeminent college football all-star game and the first stage in the NFL Draft process. The longest continual-running all-star game has taken place in Mobile, Alabama the past 75 years.

THE SIGNAL CALLER: UNH has a new starting QB this season with the departure of Max Brosmer, the 2023 Walter Payton Award runner-up (FCS offensive national player of the year), to the University of Minnesota.

Senior **Seth Morgan**, who joined the UNH football program in the spring 2024 semester, earned the starting quarterback role coming out of camp.

He was named the New England Football Writers Association Gold Helmet recipient and CAA Football co-Offensive Player of the Week after his record-tying six-TD performance vs. Stonehill on Sept. 14.

Through seven games, Morgan has a 142.4 QB rating by completing 143 of 215 passes for 1,471 yards and 15 TDs (with five INTs). After being sacked once the first three games, he has been sacked 10 times the past four games.

In UNH's back-to-back home games -- 45-6 win vs. Stonehill and 38-17 win vs. Bryant -- Morgan completed 45 of 60 passes (75%) for 701 yards and 10 touchdowns; that included five passes of 50+ yards.

In Game 4 vs. Bryant, Morgan finished with a 208.6 QB rating by completing 23 of 30 passes for 314 yards and four touchdowns.

In his first home game as a Wildcat, Morgan tied the school record of six touchdown passes in a game as he led UNH to victory against Stonehill. He completed 22 of 30 passes for 387 yards -- including three passes of 50+ yards -- in just three quarters of play for a 247.7 QB rating.

Morgan started all 12 games last season at Shepherd University (Shepherdstown, W. Va.), where he had a 149.91 QB rating by completing 239 of 264 passes for 2,970 yards and 24 touchdowns; he was also intercepted 11 times.

On the Division II leaderboard in 2023, Morgan ranked 13th in the nation in passing yards, 14th in completion percentage, 15th in completions per game, 18th in passing yards per game, and 22nd in passing TDs.

Morgan's 2023 accolades included All-American Honorable Mention, All-Super Region One Second Team and all-conference First Team.

Prior to his year at Shepherd, Morgan was at VMI (Virginia Military Institute) for four years (2019-22). He threw for 4,852 yards and 28 TDs.

Redshirt freshman **Matt Vezza** is second on the QB depth chart. In two games, he has a 159.6 QB rating by completing 14 of 18 passes for 136 yards and one TD (no INTs.). Vezza saw significant playing time last week vs. URI, when he went 11-for-13 for 84 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown pass.

In his season debut at Stonhill, he played the fourth quarter against Stonehill and completed 3 of 5 passes for 52 yards on two drives.

Vezza made his UNH debut late in the Nov. 11, 2023 game at Monmouth and completed a 38-yard TD pass to Myles Thomason with 2:18 remaining in the fourth quarter to lift UNH to a 31-24 victory.

Sophomore **Barry Kleinpeter**, who was listed as co-No. 2 on the depth chart the first three games of the season, saw action in three games at QB a year ago and completed 1 of 5 passes for nine yards. His career stats: five games, 1-for-5, 9 yards; one rushing TD.

Kleinpeter saw time as the third-string running back in the fourth quarter against both Stonehill and Bryant.

TOP TARGETS: Dylan Laube -- last year's leader in receptions (68), receiving yards (688) and TD receptions (seven) out of the backfield as a running back -- is currently on the Las Vegas Raiders' roster.

The corps of wide receivers has plenty of experience and talent returning, led by grad student and captain **Logan Tomlinson** as well as juniors **Caleb Burke** and **Joey Corcoran** and the addition of junior transfer **Casey McKinney**, who made his debut in Game 6 at Elon on Oct. 12.

Through seven games, Tomlinson is UNH's leader in both receptions (48) and receiving yards (505), as well as TD receptions (six). He has led UNH in receptions in 6 of 7 games and in receiving yards four times.

In the season opener at UCF, Tomlinson was targeted on 11 of 26 passes and had six receptions for 73 yards -- all team highs. In fact, he accounted for 73 of UNH's 95 receiving yards (77%).

Tomlinson was once again the top target in Week 2 at Holy Cross. He caught eight passes for 85 yards and two touchdowns on nine targets. The rest of the Wildcats combined for nine catches on 13

WILDCAT SPORTS RADIO NETWORK: Wildcat Sports Properties, a property of Learfield Sports, is the multimedia rights holder for UNH Athletics. The Wildcat Sports Network consists of flagship station WGIR-AM 610 (Manchester), which has been the headquarters for UNH play-by-play since 2008, as well as affiliates WQSO-FM 96.7 (Portsmouth) and WPKX-AM 930 (Rochester). Each game is streamed live online at www.unhwildcats.com. All games will be broadcast live, with the pregame show beginning 30 minutes prior to kickoff.

This is the eighth year in the UNH Football Radio booth for **Justin Mclsaac** and second as "Voice of the Wildcats" after spending six years as the analyst. Mclsaac is a three-time NSMA New Hampshire Sportscaster Of The Year. He is also the radio voice of UNH men's basketball. A life-long New Hampshire resident, Mclsaac lives in Rochester, N.H. with his family. UNH football alum **Brian Espanet** will be joining Mclsaac in the analyst role this year.

Tomlinson pulled in seven catches for 106 yards, including an 11-yard score, against Bryant on Sept. 21.

He had 10 receptions for 105 yards, including a 3-yard TD, at Harvard.

Tomlinson scored both UNH touchdowns in the 17-10 win at Elon on Oct. 12. He pulled in a 10-yard TD catch and also scored on a 4-yard run for his first career rushing touchdown.

Tomlinson scored the Wildcats' lone touchdown vs. Rhode Island on a 13-yard catch; he finished with eight catches for 57 yards.

Prior to UNH, Tomlinson was a team captain at Wesleyan University in 2022. He received two Arthur Ashe awards for academic and athletic achievement as well as devotion to the community.

Burke, who was a DNP in the opener at UCF and did not catch a pass at Elon, is ranks second in receiving yards (451) and TD catches (five), as well as third in receptions (28). His 16.1 yards/catch and 75.2 receiving yards/game are both best on the team.

In three consecutive games (vs. Stonehill, Bryant, Harvard), Burke recorded 17 catches for 377 yards and five touchdowns for averages of 22.2 yards per catch and 125.7 yards per game. He pulled in three catches of 50+ yards, as well as one for 49 yards, in those three games.

Burke had a breakout game vs. Stonehill on Sept. 14 by recording his first career 100+ yard receiving game (134) and first game with multiple TDs (two). He had two catches of 50+ yards with 53- and 68-yard touchdowns.

He followed that with six catches for a career-high 151 yards, including a long of 59 and two touchdowns against Bryant on Sept. 21.

Corcoran also had a breakout game vs. Stonehill with his first career 100+ receiving yard game (129) and first multiple-TD game with three touchdown catches -- 11, 56 and 32 yards; the 56-yards was a career-long catch.

Corcoran pulled in eight catches for 58 yards at Harvard. And then at Elon, his 62 receiving yards accounted for more than half the team total of 119.

Through seven games, Corcoran ranks second in catches (30) and third in both receiving yards (354) and TD receptions (three).

Sophomore tight end **Colby Ramshaw** has eight catches for 71 yards and a touchdown. He had three catches in back-to-back games vs. Stonehill and Bryant.

Sophomore **Josh Fillion** and freshman **Logan Perez**, as well as the aforementioned **McKinney**, are listed as backup WRs on the depth chart.

Fillion has season totals of four catches for 26 yards, including a long of eight; he had two catches for 12 yards in the opener at UCF. Perez recorded his first two catches (for a total of six yards) against Stonehill; he has six catches for three yards in six games.

McKinney made two catches for a net total of zero yards in his Wildcat debut Oct. 12 at Elon; has totals of three catches for five yards in two games.

McKinney was at St. Francis for three seasons (2021-23); in 17 games, he had 23 catches for 322 yards and three touchdowns. McKinney also returned punts and kickoffs at St. Francis.

GROUND GAME: The graduation of Dylan Laube, who led FCS in all-purpose yards in 2022 and 2023 before going on to join the Las Vegas Raiders, leaves opportunity for junior **Myles Thomason** and senior **Isaac Seide** to see an increased role in UNH's offense this season.

Thomason will miss a seventh consecutive game Saturday vs. URI.

Seide has 100 rushes for 428 yards and a pair of scores through seven games; that calculates to 4.3 yards per carry and 61.1 yards per game. The rest of the team has 86 carries for 110 yards.

Seide was a workhorse Game 2 at Holy Cross. He toted the ball 18 times for a career-high 161 yards, including a long of 61, and the game-winning 1-yard TD with 9:18 remaining in the game. The rest of the team had 10 rushes for 11 yards with no other Cat recording more than three rushes.

The 161 rushing yards not only marked a personal best, it exceeded his total for the entire 2023 season (122 yards on 28 carries).

Seide had six carries for 61 yards, including an explosive 33-yard touchdown, in limited playing time against Bryant (Sept. 21).

In the season opener at UCF, Thomason led the team with 10 rushes for 20 yards, including a long of nine yards, and Seide carried the ball eight times for 13 yards.

PAVING THE WAY: New Hampshire has used the same starting O-Line each of the past six games. The Wildcats had to make an adjustment to the starters between Game 1 and Game 2 following an injury in the season opener.

Senior captain **Dylan Poirier** (6-4, 304) anchors UNH's offensive line. Poirier has shifted to the role of center this season and has made 31 consecutive starts (32 starts overall). He started all 11 games at left tackle last season.

As a mainstay in the 2023 offensive line, Poirier paved the way for UNH's offense that ranked No. 5 in the nation with a CAA-leading 37.5 points per game.

The only other returning starter is junior **Mason Davis** (6-3, 299), who started 9 of 11 games at right tackle a year ago. He started at right guard in Game 1, then was shifted back to right tackle in Game 2 (because of injury to Beau Riley) and has remained there.

Senior **Tolu Olajide** (6-5, 298) is the starting left tackle in his first year as a Wildcat. He earned All-Conference First Team honors last year and Second Team in 2022 while at Stonehill.

Sophomore **Luke Swaine** (6-4, 315) has stepped into the left

guard starting position. He saw action in three games last season.

With Riley sidelined the past six games, junior **Dylan Maciulewicz** (6-4, 3-4) has started at right guard.

BOOKEND ALL-AMERICANS: New Hampshire boasts a pair of All-Americans on defense, and both can be found at the ends of the defensive line with seniors **Josiah Silver** (6-2, 247) and **Flex Ruiz** (6-1, 260) wreaking havoc on opposing offenses.

Silver has the team's longest active streak of 42 consecutive starts and Ruiz has started 31 consecutive games.

Silver is currently No. 3 in the nation in sacks per game (1.07) and is also third in tackles for loss per game (1.8).

The captain was named CAA Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14 in recognition of tying his career highs in both sacks (4.0) and tackles for loss (5.0) in UNH's 17-10 win at Elon. He finished with seven total tackles.

Silver recorded his 200th career tackle with the last of his four tackles Sept. 14 against Stonehill.

Through seven games, Silver leads the team in both tackles for loss (12.5) and sacks (7.5). He ranks second in solo tackles (22) and third with 37 total tackles. He also has a QB hurry to his credit.

In the opener at UCF, Silver made six solo tackles and two assisted for eight total tackles, which included a team-high two tackles for loss. He made eight more tackles, including a sack, at Holy Cross.

Silver built on the success of his 2021 CAA Football Defensive Rookie of the Year award to earn four All-America Team selections in 2022.

His 2024 preseason honors included Stats Perform All-America First Team, Phil Steele All-America Second Team and CAA Football All-Conference Team.

Ruiz ranks second in both sacks (4.0) and tackles for loss (8.0); he also has three QB hurries, a forced fumble and a pass breakup.

He recorded four tackles each of the first three games of the season. In his return home to Orlando against UCF, Ruiz recorded four tackles with 1.5 for loss. In Game 2 at Holy Cross, his stats included a sack and a forced fumble. Ruiz had another sack and 1.5 tackles for loss vs. Stonehill.

In the Oct. 4 game at Harvard, Ruiz was credited with 2.5 tackles for loss and four total tackles.

Ruiz was named to three All-America teams in 2022.

THE D-LINE: In addition to the return of All-Americans Josiah Silver and Flex Ruiz on the ends, senior **Neil Politano** (6-3, 300) returns as a starting defensive tackle to strengthen the trenches.

Politano, who has 31 consecutive starts and 33 career starts, has seven tackles and blocked a PAT kick this season; that block denied Stonehill from tying the game (it remained 7-6) and the Skyhawks did not score again the rest of the game. Politano recorded his first sack of the season at Elon (Oct. 12).

Grad student **Jacoby Sherard** (6-0, 303) has six starts in seven games this season — he was a DNP vs. Bryant. He returned to action Oct. 4 at Harvard and made a season-high six tackles. Sherard has 21 tackles in six games.

Sherard was previously at Shippensburg University, where he recorded 96 tackles (50-46-96) with 23 tackles for loss, 15.5 sacks, four pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

Sherard made five tackles at Holy Cross to eclipse 100 career tackles; he enters Saturday's game at 117.

Junior **Zach Garron** (6-3, 232) and redshirt freshman **Jordan Mcallister** (6-3, 231) are on the 2-deep at defensive end. Garron has nine tackles, including 2.5 for loss, through seven games. Mcallister recorded a season-high three tackles vs. Bryant and has 10 overall, including one sack.

Junior **Tim Bonagura** (6-1, 290) and sophomore **Cameron Garner-Young** give depth to the middle of the defensive line.

Garner-Young, who stepped into the starting lineup vs. Bryant, recorded his career highs of 1.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks to match his personal best of four tackles at Elon. Garner-Young has 14 total tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks.

He recorded his first career tackles with two in the 2024 opener at UCF and that included one behind the line of scrimmage. He established a high of four tackles at Holy Cross.

Bonagura has been credited with eight tackles in seven games, including a high of two against both UCF and Stonehill.

WE'RE TALKING ABOUT LINEBACKING: UNH's defensive scheme has two linebackers on the field and there is plenty of leadership in grad student captain **Ryan Toscano**. Junior **Brandon Perkins** has consistently demonstrated why he has earned the other starting LB spot.

Toscano has started 38 consecutive games with 40 career starts and Perkins has nine career starts, including every game this season.

Toscano recorded double-digit tackles for the fifth time in his career with 10 at UCF, and that included a career-high nine assisted tackles. He finished with a season-high 11 tackles vs. URI.

Toscano is currently second on the team with 47 total tackles. Toscano's numbers include 3.0 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two pass breakups and a QB hurry.

Toscano has been UNH's top tackler each of the past two seasons with 74 last year and 72 in 2022.

Perkins ranks fourth on the team with 36 total tackles and he has a team-high three quarterback hurries. He made a career-high eight tackles at Harvard, including a best of six assisted tackles, as well as seven stops at UCF and five at Holy Cross. Perkins recorded four tackles at Elon, including his first sack of the season (the hit on the play also forced a fumble).

Junior **Will Coty** and true freshman **Trevor Barry** are next in line. Coty has six tackles in two games played with a high of five vs. Stonehill; he has been a DNP the past four games. Barry has

yet to play in the 2024 season.

Grad student **Mateo Vandamia** played each of the first six games but was a DNP Oct. 19 vs. URI. He has 16 total tackles.

In the opener at UCF, Vandamia was credited with two tackles and he followed that with four stops at Holy Cross and a season-high five vs. Stonehill.

He was at CAA rival Delaware for four years before coming to New Hampshire in the offseason; he made his collegiate debut against UNH in the 2019 season. Vandamia converted to line-backer (from RB) in the 2022 season. In 20 games as a linebacker, he recorded 39 tackles with seven tackles for loss and a pair of pass breakups.

STRENGTH IN SAFETY: UNH's safety corps has been strengthened by the addition of grad student **Wande Owens** from Yale. He was named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watchlist in the preseason.

Owens has recorded 10+ tackles in a game four times, has a team-high 65 tackles, and has been the team's top tackler in 5 of 7 games.

In his UNH debut, Owens made a career-high 14 tackles with six solo stops and eight assisted at UCF. He also led the Wildcats with 10 tackles at Holy Cross and tied for the team lead with nine stops against Bryant. He once again was the top 'Cat with nine tackles at Harvard and 10 at Elon. Owens finished with 10 tackles Oct. 19 against Rhode Island.

Owens helped lead the 2023 Yale Bulldogs to a 7-5 overall record that included 5-2 in the Ivy League. The captain ranked second on the team with 55 total tackles (42 solo, 13 assisted). Owens tied for the lead with seven pass breakups and made five tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Owens was named to both the All-Ivy First Team and All-New England Team twice at Yale.

Senior captain **Zedane Williams** made the transition from linebacker to safety last season. He has been the starting strong safety this season when healthy -- Williams was sidelined two consecutive games against Harvard and Elon. He returned to action last week and made six tackles vs. URI, and he is projected to start this weekend.

In five games, Williams has 24 tackles, including one tackle for loss, as well as an interception, a forced fumble and a quarterback hurry.

In the opener at UCF, he recorded his second career interception and also finished the game with six tackles. Williams forced a fumble vs. Stonehill (recovered by the Skyhawks) in the Red Zone.

Senior **Brendan Tighe** secured UNH's 21-20 win at Holy Cross with an interception at midfield with 27 seconds remaining. He also finished that game with a season-high eight tackles.

Tighe pulled in his second interception of the season -- and had two pass breakups -- Oct. 19 vs. URI and he ranks second among active Wildcats with four INTs. Tighe has 35 total tackles this season; he matched his career high of eight against URI.

Sophomore **Jackson Stone**, who is listed as Owens' backup on the 2-deep, has forced two fumbles in seven games. He finished with four tackles (3-1-4) and a pass breakup, as well as a forced fumble, at UCF. Stone also had four tackles and forced a fumble against Stonehill. He has 11 tackles overall.

Jackson Downey made his first career start in Williams' absence at Harvard and got the start again at Elon. He has nine tackles in seven games with a high of three vs. Stonehill.

CORNERING: Seniors **Noah Stansbury** and **Caleb Mead** are the starting corners with classmate **Jonathan Collins, Jr.** and redshirt freshman **Sean Webb** as the backups.

In the opener at UCF, both Collins, Jr. and Stansbury finished with four tackles and Mead made three tackles. Both Stansbury and Mead were also credited with a pass breakup.

Stansbury, who has 38 career starts, leads the 'Cats with seven pass breakups; he also has one interception and 31 tackles.

He recorded stats nearly across the board vs. Stonehill with three tackles, a sack, an interception and two pass breakups. He followed that with season highs of nine tackles and three pass breakups against Bryant.

Mead, who is also the team's primary kickoff returner, has tallied 17 tackles and six pass breakups; he recorded three pass breakups in the game vs. Rhode Island.

Collins, Jr. has seven tackles and one pass breakup.

Zeroun Skinner, a junior transfer from Florida Atlantic, has 17 tackles with one pass breakup. Skinner made a game-changing play at Elon when his blocked punt set up 1st-and-goal at the Elon 10 and UNH scored a touchdown on the next play to trim the deficit to 10-7 with 10 seconds left in the first half.

Skinner made three stops in his UNH debut at UCF and followed that with six tackles at Holy Cross.

KICKING THE BALL AROUND: Junior **Nick Mazzie** was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 7. In the Oct. 4 game at Harvard, he made all three field goal attempts, including a career long of 52 yards, and both PAT kick attempts.

Mazzie's 52-yard field goal ranks 11th best in FCS this season and was the first time UNH made a field goal of 50 yards or longer since Nov. 21, 2009, when Tom Manning kicked a 52-yarder vs. the University of Maine.

It ranks second in UNH history and trails only Manning's 54-yard field goal vs. Hofstra University on Oct. 24, 2009. The 52-yarder bested the 47-yard field goal last year at Stonehill.

And with field goals of 43 and 29 yards at Harvard, Mazzie became the first UNH kicker with two field goals of 40+ yards in a game since Oct. 5, 2019, when Jason Hughes connected from 42 and 45 yards.

Mazzie has made 7 of 9 field goal attempts this season and is perfect 17-for-17 on PAT kicks for a total of 38 points, which ranks second on the team.

Mazzie scored the first UNH points of the 2024 season with a 38-yard field goal in the second quarter of Game 1 at UCF. He remained perfect on the season by making all three PAT kicks at Holy Cross, then six PATs and a 44-yard field goal vs. Stonehill.

His first miss of the season was a 45-yard field goal attempt vs. Bryant that sailed wide right. He also missed a 47-yarder against URI.

Eight of Mazzie's 33 kickoffs have been touchbacks and the opponent's average starting position is the 28 yard line.

Senior **Sean Lehane** is the primary punter for the third consecutive year. He has effectively changed field position this season with an average of 45.8 yards per punt -- that's No. 8 in the country -- and 12 punts of 50+ yards, including a season long of 68.

Lehane punted a career-high 10 times in the opener at UCF with a average of 44.6 yards, including a long of 59. He bested those numbers Game 2 at Holy Cross with an average of 54.5 yards per punt and a long of 68.

Last week at Elon, he averaged 47.9 yards on seven punts with

two of 50+ yards, including a long of 55. He pinned the Phoenix inside the 20 twice.

Also of note, Lehane has pinned the opponent inside the 20 six times and punted twice into the end zone for a touchback.

BACK DEEP FOR THE WILDCATS: Senior **Caleb Mead** has been atop the depth chart as the kickoff returner. He is averaging 24.4 yards on 22 returns this season with a long of 63.

Last season with opponents frequently kicking away from All-American Dylan Laube, Mead returned 14 kickoffs (Laube had 15) with an average of 21.8 yards. He had an 87-yard TD return.

Caleb Burke has four punt returns for 30 yards (7.5 yards/return), including a long of 14. **Joey Corcoran** has three punt returns for 25 yards (8.3 yards/return) with a long of 13.

IT'S A SNAP: Junior **Kevin Gallic** stepped into the role of long snapper in his first year as a Wildcat in 2022, reprised that role last season and has continued that in '24.

WILDCAT STADIUM: New Hampshire has a 29-14 lifetime record for a .674 winning percentage at Wildcat Stadium, which opened in the 2016 season. That includes 20-11 (.645) against CAA opponents and 9-3 (.750) vs. non-conference teams.

HOME SWEET HOME: Since 2008, UNH has a 71-19 home record (.788 win percentage) in Durham with a breakdown of 49-14 (.778) against CAA conference teams and 22-5 (.815) vs. non-conference opponents.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: UNH has a 12-game regular-season schedule for the first time since 2003, when the CAA Football conference was known as the Atlantic-10.

WE'RE BACK: UNH returns five starters on both offense and defense, as well as five on special teams -- the kickoff specialist, placekicker, holder, punter and kickoff returner.

The Wildcat starters back on offense are offensive linemen **Dylan Poirier** and **Mason Davis**, and wide receivers **Caleb Burke**, **Joey Corcoran** and **Logan Tomlinson**.

The returning starters on defense are linemen **Neil Politano**, **Flex Ruiz** and **Josiah Silver**, as well as linebacker **Ryan Toscano** and cornerback **Noah Stansbury**.

THE CAPTAINS: Five Wildcats captain the 2024 team: offensive lineman **Dylan Poirier**, defensive end **Josiah Silver**, wide receiver **Logan Tomlinson**, linebacker **Ryan Toscano** and safety **Zedane Williams**. As a grad student and second-year 'Cat, Tomlinson is the only non-senior in the quintet.

SILVER NAMED CAA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior defensive lineman and captain Josiah Silver was named the CAA Football Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 14. Silver matched his career highs of four sacks and five tackles for loss -- and finished with seven total tackles -- to lead UNH to a 17-10 win at Elon (on Oct. 12).

He recorded a sack on the last play of both the first and second quarters and sacked the quarterback twice more in the fourth quarter to preserve the 17-10 lead.

MAZZIE RECEIVES CAA WEEKLY AWARD: Nick Mazzie was perfect in UNH's Oct. 4 game at Harvard University by making all three field goal attempts, including a career long of 52 yards, and both PAT kick attempts to earn the CAA Football Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 7.

Mazzie's 52-yard field goal last Friday at Harvard Stadium ranks 11th best in FCS this season and was the first time UNH made a field goal of 50 yards or longer since Nov. 21, 2009, when Tom Manning kicked a 52-yarder vs. the University of Maine.

The 52-yard field goal ranks second in UNH history and trails only Manning's 54-yard field goal vs. Hofstra University on Oct. 24, 2009.

Mazzie's 52-yard field goal eclipsed his previous long of 47 yards established Sept. 2, 2023 at Stonehill.

With field goals of 52 and 43 yards, Mazzie became the first UNH kicker with two field goals of 40+ yards in a game since Oct. 5, 2019, when Jason Hughes connected from 42 and 45 yards.

The three field goals tied his single-game high, which he has now done four times.

MORGAN EARNS TWO WEEKLY AWARDS: Senior quarterback **Seth Morgan** received two weekly awards in recognition of his record-tying performance against Stonehill on Sept. 14. He was named recipient of the New England Football Writers Gold Helmet Award and then was named CAA Football co-Offensive Player of the Week.

Morgan completed 22 of 30 passes for 387 yards and he matched the UNH record of six TD passes in a game while not committing a turnover.

He combined with **Joey Corcoran** for scores of 11, 56 and 32 yards, connected with **Caleb Burke** for 53 and 68 yards and with **Colby Ramshaw** for a 19-yard TD.

SEIDE EARNS CAA FOOTBALL WEEKLY AWARD: Senior running back **Isaac Seide** was named the CAA Football co-Offensive Player of the Week on Monday. Seide rushed for a career-high 161 yards on 18 carries, including the game-winning TD with 9:18 to play, in UNH's 21-20 triumph at Holy Cross.

He also had a 35-yard run to the 2-yard line that set up a go-ahead TD for UNH in the third quarter before his game-winning score in the fourth.

Seide, who averaged 8.9 ypc, also had a career-best 61-yard burst in the game.

A DEFINITE NEW ENGLAND FLAVOR: New Hampshire concluded its stretch of four consecutive games against New England schools Oct. 4 at Harvard. During this stretch, the Wildcats played Holy Cross (Worcester, Mass.; 21-20 win), Stonehill (Easton, Mass.; 45-6 win), Bryant (Smithfield, R.I.; 38-17 win) and Harvard (Cambridge, Mass.; 28-23 loss).

The last time UNH went up against four consecutive New England teams (in a single season) was 1987, when the 'Cats ended with games against URI, Maine, UMass and UConn.

The Wildcats play Rhode Island and Maine later in the season to mark half of the team's 12 games against New England foes.

CAREER HIGHS AT HARVARD: Nick Mazzie kicked a career-long 52-yard field goal.

Brandon Perkins recorded a career-high eight tackles Oct. 4 at Harvard, and that included a personal best of six assisted tackles.

Neil Politano finished with a career-high three assisted tackles.

Sean Webb made a career-high four tackles.

Caleb Burke recorded a career-high eight catches.

Joey Corcoran matched his high of eight catches.

Noah Cundiff made his first career catch (for five yards).

Seth Morgan finished with season highs in both completions (34) and pass attempts (47).

Caleb Mead tied his personal best of 93 kickoff return yards.

Logan Tomlinson had 10 catches -- his highest total as a Wildcat.

NOTABLE NUMBERS FROM CAMBRIDGE: **Seth Morgan** completed his first 17 passes of the game and registered season highs of 34 completions and 47 attempts Oct. 4 at Harvard. He finished the first quarter 12-for-12 for 84 yards and one TD.

Wande Owens tallied a team-high nine tackles.

UNH scored on its first three possessions of the game vs. the Crimson to build a 13-7 lead.

UNH WINS BATTLE OF 'CATS VS. BULLDOGS: New Hampshire scored a touchdown each of its first four possessions of the game to roll out to a 31-3 lead en route to a 38-17 victory against Bryant at Wildcat Stadium on Sept. 21.

UNH's game-opening 10-play, 74-yard drive of 5 minutes, 26 seconds was the Wildcats' longest drive of the game with regards to plays, distance and time.

Seth Morgan completed 23 of 40 passes for 314 yards and four touchdowns.

Caleb Burke finished with six catches for a career-high 151 yards, including TD receptions of 10 and 31 yards.

Logan Tomlinson had a team-high seven catches for 106 yards, including an 11-yard touchdown.

'CATS GROUND SKYHAWKS: UNH scored a touchdown on the opening possession of the game and never looked back en route to a 45-6 win against Stonehill in the Sept. 14 home opener.

The Skyhawks also scored a TD on their first possession, but **Noah Stansbury** blocked the PAT kick to prevent the visitors from tying the score.

The Wildcats replied with another touchdown to take a 14-6 lead into the second quarter and extended the advantage to 28-6 before halftime.

UNH scored two touchdowns and a field goal on the first three possessions of the third quarter to push the lead to 45-6.

NOTABLE NUMBERS FROM THE HOME OPENER: In addition to the obvious -- record-tying six TD passes by Seth Morgan and 100-yard receiving games by Caleb Burke and Joey Corcoran -- there were quite a few notable numbers from the 45-6 win against Stonehill.

Senior cornerback **Noah Stansbury** had a solid all-around game with three tackles, including a pair of assisted tackles behind the line of scrimmage, an interception, two pass breakups and a blocked PAT kick.

Sophomore tight end **Colby Ramshaw** had career highs of three catches and 36 yards, including a 19-yard TD.

UNH passed for 439 yards and limited the Skyhawks to 77 yards through the air.

CAREER FIRSTS - OFFENSE: Four Wildcats recorded their first career catches in the Sept. 14 win against Stonehill.

Redshirt freshman **Dylan Evans** finished the game with two catches for 45 yards, including a long of 36.

Freshman **Logan Perez** had two catches for six yards.

Sophomore tight end **Peyton Strickland** had a 16-yard catch.

Sophomore wide receiver **Sam Brecker** had a seven-yard reception.

Sophomore quarterback **Barry Kleinpeter** made his debut as a running back and carried the ball four times for eight yards. As a QB in the 2022 and 2023 seasons, he had 10 carries for 25 yards.

CAREER FIRSTS - DEFENSE: A number of 'Cats recorded their first career tackle in the Sept. 14 win against Stonehill. Sophomore defensive end **T.J. Farrell** led the first-timers with two tackles (0-2-2).

Sophomore defensive lineman **Jake Cuddire** and redshirt freshman cornerback **Sean Webb** both made one solo stop.

Huck Flanagan, another sophomore defensive end, and junior linebacker **Kristian Larouche** were both credited with an assisted tackle.

CATS CLAW CRUSADERS: New Hampshire took a 21-20 lead with 9:18 remaining and the defense made three stops the rest of the game -- including an interception in the final minute -- as the Wildcats defeated Holy Cross at Fitton Field on Sept. 7.

After trailing 3-0, UNH took a 7-3 lead on a **Seth Morgan** to **Logan Tomlinson** 12-yard TD connection at 12:43 of the second quarter.

The combination of Morgan-to-Tomlinson combined for a 2-yard TD and 14-13 lead at 10:21 of the third quarter.

Pass plays of 21 yards to Tomlinson and 17 yards to **Joey Corcoran** helped advance the ball to the HC 1, where **Isaac Seide** bulled up the middle and the ensuing PAT kick by **Nick Mazzie** gave UNH a 21-20 lead it would not relinquish.

UNH NOTEBOOK FROM WORCESTER: Senior running back **Isaac Seide** rushed the ball 18 times for a personal-best of 161 yards, including a career-long 61-yarder, and scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 1-yard run at 9:18 of the fourth quarter.

Grad student wide receiver **Logan Tomlinson** matched his career high of two TD receptions. He finished with eight catches for 85 yards, including the 12- and 2-yard touchdowns.

Senior safety **Brandon Tighe** secured the 21-20 win at Holy Cross with an interception at midfield on a 3rd-and-43 play from the HC 24 with 27 seconds remaining.

Tighe ranks second among active 'Cats with three career INTs.

NOTABLE NUMBERS AT UCF: UNH's defense limited UCF (of the Big XII) to 87 yards and a pair of field goals on three possessions in the first quarter. The Knights scored their first touchdown on a drive that started at the UNH 3 yard line.

New Hampshire's defense forced two turnovers with a **Zedane Williams** interception and **Sam Rumelhart** fumble recovery (fumble forced by **Jackson Stone**).

UNH's offensive line did not allow a sack.

In his first game as a Wildcat, **Wande Owens** recorded a game- and career-high 14 tackles, including six solo stops.

Senior linebacker and captain **Ryan Toscano** recorded 10 tackles to mark his fifth career game with double-digit tackles; he made a personal-best nine assisted tackles vs. the Knights.

Also in his first game as a Wildcat, **Seth Morgan** completed 14 of 28 passes for 95 yards; he was intercepted twice.

Captain **Logan Tomlinson** caught six passes for 73 yards on 11 targets. UNH's totals were 14 catches for 95 yards on 26 targets. That calculates to 77% of the team's receiving yards.

Junior linebacker **Brandon Perkins** recorded a career-high seven tackles at UCF; both the three solo tackles and four assisted tackles matched personal bests.

In his Wildcat debut, junior cornerback **Zeroun Skinner** made a career-high three tackles (2-1-3). He also had a pass breakup.

In his collegiate debut, redshirt freshman **Denzell Gibson** carried the ball six times for 10 yards.

Four Wildcats recorded their first career tackles -- **Will Coty** (1-0-1), **Jackson Downey** (0-1-1), **Josh Farquharson** (2-0-2) and **Cameron Garner-Young** (2-0-2).

TWO WILDCATS PICKED TO CAA PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM: Senior defensive linemen **Flex Ruiz** and **Josiah Silver** were both named to the CAA Football Preseason All-Conference Team.

CAA PRESEASON POLL: UNH was picked seventh in the 16-team CAA Football predicted order of finish. Villanova topped the list and was followed by Richmond, UAlbany, William & Mary, Delaware, Elon and UNH.

RICK SANTOS

HEAD COACH



Rick Santos '08 was named the 20th head coach in UNH football history on Dec. 7, 2021. Santos, a record-setting quarterback from 2004-07 and a 2016 UNH Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, served as associate head coach and quarterbacks coach for three seasons (2019-21) in his return to the Wildcats' staff before being elevated to head coach.

In the 2023 season, UNH was the only FCS school that could boast having two players finish in the top six of the Walter Payton Award voting. Quarterback Max Brosmer finished as the runner-up while Dylan Laube, who went on to be selected by the Las Vegas Raiders in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL draft, finished sixth. Brosmer was a repeat honoree as the CAA Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

The Wildcats finished the '23 season with a 6-5 overall record that was capped by a 44-25 win against border rival Maine to retain the Brice-Cowell Musket. Two of the losses were in overtime and another

was to FBS' Central Michigan by three points.

New Hampshire returned to national prominence in Santos' first year at the helm in the 2022 season, when the Wildcats won a share of the CAA title with a 7-1 conference record, advanced to the second round of the FCS playoffs and peaked at No. 15 in the national polls before finishing with a 9-4 record that marked a six-game improvement in the win column from the previous year. Three 'Cats received a total of 14 All-America Team honors in 2022 and sophomore quarterback Max Brosmer was named the CAA Football co-Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

In March 2019, Santos was hired as New Hampshire's associate head coach and quarterbacks coach, which brought him back to his alma mater in a coaching capacity for the second time. With head coach Sean McDonnell stepping aside for health reasons on Aug. 26, 2019, Santos was promoted to interim head coach.

In the 2019 season, the Wildcats finished 6-5 overall with a perfect 5-0 home record. UNH knocked off nationally-ranked teams Stony Brook and Villanova to enter the top 25 polls, and brought the Brice-Cowell Musket back to Durham by defeating Maine in the regular-season finale. That season saw the rise of Max Brosmer as the team's first true freshman to start at quarterback in more than four decades, as well as that of running back Dylan Laube, who was a HERO Sports Freshman Honorable Mention All-American.

Santos resumed the position of associate head coach/quarterbacks coach for the 2020-21 season. He also took the lead on increasing alumni engagement and enhancing fundraising initiatives, highlighted by record-setting donations secured by UNH football in April 2021 during The (603) Challenge, which is an annual University-wide fundraising drive.

In his first tenure as a Wildcat assistant coach from 2013-15, Santos coached wide receivers. In 2015, he mentored R.J. Harris to the single greatest WR statistical season in program history. Harris tallied a school-record 100 catches and led the nation with 1,551 receiving yards, which tied the program's all-time single-season benchmark. In 2013, Harris and Justin Mello became the first WR duo in school history to each register 1,000 yards in a single season.

Santos, a native of Bellingham, Mass., worked three seasons (2016-18) as the QB coach/passing game coordinator at Columbia University of the Ivy League between his two stretches as an assistant coach and associate head coach at his alma mater.

Santos, whose uniform No. 2 is one of four jerseys retired by the UNH football program, compiled a 37-14 record and directed the Wildcats to four NCAA Division I-AA/FCS playoff appearances. He guided UNH to its first-ever postseason victory at Georgia Southern (Nov. 27, 2004), was part of the 2005 Atlantic 10 championship team that was ranked No. 1 in the country, and he won two A-10 Northern Division titles (2004, 2006).

Santos passed for 13,212 yards and 123 touchdowns while accumulating 14,615 yards of total offense. The three-time Walter Camp All-American connected with UNH's all-time leading receiver and fellow University Hall of Famer David Ball for 53 touchdowns from 2004-06 to set an FCS record that still stands for most career TD connections for a QB-WR duo. Santos also owns the FCS single-game record for highest percentage of passes completed (96.2 percent) when he went 25 of 26 for 306 yards and five TDs in a 52-21 defeat of Northeastern on Oct. 22, 2005.

In 2006, Santos won the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding offensive player in FCS football when he threw for 3,125 yards and 29 touchdowns. He was a three-time Atlantic-10/CAA Offensive Player of the Year (2005-07) and four-time All-Conference First Team QB. In 2004, he was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year, Atlantic 10 co-Rookie of the Year, set the FCS record for most yards gained by a freshman in a game (538, at Villanova, Oct. 2, 2004) and freshman TD passes in a season (31).

Santos possesses school career records in pass attempts (1,498), completions (1,024) and passing yards (12,189). He holds the top two and four of the top six single-season records in completions, headlined by 301 in 2005. His '05 season included a school all-time high 3,797 passing yards.

Following his graduation with a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology: Sport Studies with a concentration in sports management, Santos played football professionally for five years. He signed as an undrafted free agent with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2008 before moving north to play in the Canadian Football League from 2009-12.

COACHING STAFF

ED BORDEN

co-Offensive Coordinator / Tight Ends / Recruiting Coordinator

The 2024 season will be Ed Borden's sixth as an assistant coach for the UNH football program, first as co-Offensive Coordinator and fifth year as tight ends coach; he was also named the recruiting coordinator during the staff reorganization in spring 2022.

In 2023, junior tight end Kyle Lepkowski ranked third on the team in both catches (39) and receiving yards (492).

Lepkowski was also one of the Wildcats' top targets in the 2022 season. He ranked second on the team in receiving yards (542) and third in receptions (42) to mark the most receptions by a UNH tight end since 2015 and most receiving yards since 2014.

The 2021 season saw the emergence of Lepkowski, who ranked third on the team in both receptions and receiving yards.

Prior to his current roles, Borden assisted co-offensive coordinator Michael Ferzoco with coaching wide receivers in 2019.

In 2018, Borden worked under head coach Mark Whipple at UMass as an offensive analyst for the Minutemen. He worked primarily with the team's quarterbacks.

A 2009 graduate of Bentley University, Borden also worked under Jim Fassel with the Las Vegas Locomotives of the United Football League.

DREW BELCHER

co-Offensive Coordinator / Quarterbacks

Drew Belcher enters his first year as co-Offensive Coordinator, third year as QB coach and fourth season overall as an assistant coach with the Wildcats. Belcher became quarterbacks coach in 2022 after serving as the UNH running backs coach in his first year (2021).

In 2023, pupil Max Brosmer finished second in the voting for the Walter Payton Award, which is presented to the FCS offensive player of the year. He also earned All-America honors from the American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press, Stats Perform, FCS Football Central, and Phil Steele.

Brosmer completed 294 of 459 passes for 3,464 yards and 29 touchdowns in 11 games. Those numbers rank second on UNH's list of single-season superlatives in completions, pass attempts and passing yards.

He led FCS football in two statistics: passing yards per game and total offense (325.0 yards/game). He also ranked #2 in passing yards, passing touchdowns and points responsible for per game (18.9), as well as #4 in completions per game (26.64) and points responsible for (208).

In the 2022 season, Brosmer had a breakout passing year by completing 263 of 420 passes (62.6%) for 3,157 yards and 27 TDs; those numbers ranked No. 9 in the nation in both passing yards and passing touchdowns.

In the 2021 season, UNH's top three running backs combined for 1,230 yards and six rushing TDs on 233 carries for an average of 5.3 yards per carry.

Belcher had a standout career at the University of Maine (2014-18) as a quarterback and tight end, and played one season in the NFL.

In 2019, Belcher broke into the NFL by signing an undrafted free agent contract with the Arizona Cardinals to compete for a roster spot on the squad at tight end.

At Maine, Belcher played a pivotal role in the Black Bears' historical 2018 season, which ended in the longest postseason run in program history. During that season, Maine captured the CAA championship, appeared in the FCS national semifinals, and finished the year with a No. 4 FCS national ranking. Individually in 2018, Belcher earned All-CAA Second Team honors at tight end and received the Jack Cosgrove Leadership Award.

Belcher's career accolades at Maine also included four Maine Scholar-Athlete awards and the 2016 Maine Football Strength and Conditioning Award.

Belcher graduated from Maine with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration in Management.

TOMMY HERION

Running Backs

Tommy Herion enters his second season as running back coach in 2024. He joined the staff as a student assistant coach entering the 2021 season but returned to the sidelines as a quarterback. He returned to the staff in 2022.

In 2022 and 2023, running back Dylan Laube led the FCS in all-purpose yardage.

Herion was a four-year quarterback for the Wildcats spanning the 2018-21 seasons. He came to New Hampshire as a transfer from the University of Iowa in January '18.

CHARLES WATKINS

Wide Receivers

Charles Watkins joined the UNH football staff as a wide receivers coach in spring 2023. He was previously at St. Thomas, where he served as running backs coach for two seasons (2021-22).

He began his coaching career as the secondary coach at Coe College (Iowa) for three years (2015-17) before moving on to Southeastern Oklahoma State as wide receivers coach and academic coordinator in 2018.

Later that year, Watkins went on to serve as a grad assistant coach at Rutgers University, where his responsibilities included wide receivers and special teams. In 2019, he became defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Concordia University (Chicago).

Watkins was a wide receiver at both Wagner and then Duke, where he was a multi-time All-ACC academic selection. He also played professionally in the Arena Football League.

Watkins graduated from Duke in 2013 with a Sociology degree.

RYAN WILSON

Offensive Line

Ryan Wilson comes to Durham from Saint Francis University, where he coached the offensive line for four years. In 2023, he mentored a pair of All-NEC First Team linemen. Wilson's offensive line ranked second in the NEC with 360.1 total yards of offense per game. The unit also paved the way for 168.6 rushing yards per game, which ranked third in the NEC.

In 2022, the Saint Francis offensive line led the NEC with an FCS 11th-ranked 13 sacks allowed. The unit paved the way for an offense that set a program record in total touchdowns (54), passing touchdowns (30) and total points (431). The team produced an NEC best 246.7 passing yards per game and second-ranked 182.2 rushing yards per game behind the line.

Wilson previously worked at the University at Buffalo where he was a graduate assistant offensive line coach. Wilson was a four-year starter for Edinboro University where he was also a two-year captain. He also has coaching stops at Utica College and the University of Rochester.

GARRETT GILICK

Associate Head Coach / Defensive Coordinator / Linebackers

Garrett Gillick enters his 11th season on the UNH coaching staff in 2024. He was promoted to associate head coach and defensive coordinator prior to the Spring 2022 season. Gillick has been the Wildcats' linebacker coach since 2014.

In the 2022 and 2023 season, linebacker protegee Ryan Toscano was the team's top tackler with 72 and 74, respectively. He also tied for the team lead in pass breakups in '22.

In the 2021 season, the young linebacking duo of Toscano and Bryce Shaw ranked 2-3 on the team in tackles with 67 and 65, respectively.

The 2019 season's linebacking unit helped UNH to the No. 2 ranking in scoring defense, total defense and pass defense efficiency, as well as No. 3 in rush defense. The two starting LBs were the top two Wildcats in tackles for loss; they also ranked 1st and 3rd in sacks as well as 1st and 5th in total tackles, and they were credited with five of the team's 11 forced fumbles. The LBs helped New Hampshire's defense to CAA conference rankings of first in pass defense, second in total defense, tied for second in sacks, and fourth in scoring defense.

In 2017, a UNH linebacker led the CAA with 124 tackles. In 2016, the LBs ranked 3-4-5 on the team in tackles and those three combined for 23 of the team's 76 tackles for loss.

Prior to coming to Durham, Gillick had a three-season stint (2011-13) at Bentley University, including two years as defensive line coach and one as secondary coach.

SCOTT JAMES

Defensive Pass Game Coordinator / Safeties

Scott James returned to Durham in 2024 after six seasons as the defensive coordinator for Holy Cross. During his tenure in Worcester, he led a defense that was #1 in the country in total offense, he coached numerous All-Americans and won four league championships.

Prior to joining the Crusaders, James spent five seasons as the safeties coach at UNH from 2013-17. During that time, he helped the Wildcats to an overall record of 46-22 with five trips to the NCAA playoffs. New Hampshire won the Colonial Athletic Association championship in 2014, while advancing to the NCAA semifinals in 2013 and 2014. James also coached a pair of All-CAA selections in Manny Asam (2013) and Pop Lacey (2016).

Previously, James served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Haven from 2009-2012, with the team posting an overall record of 34-10 during that time. In 2012, he helped the Chargers to an undefeated regular season, as they beat all of their Division II opponents for the second-straight year and claimed a third consecutive Northeast-10 Conference championship. James' defense ranked third nationally in total defense (274.4 yards/game), fourth in scoring defense (14.0 points/game) and fourth in rushing defense (81.7 yards/game).

Other coaching stops for James include time at Northeastern (2005-2007 / outside linebackers), Boston College (2003-2004 / defensive graduate assistant), Holy Cross (2002 / defensive line), Albany (2001 / defensive tackles) and Norwich (1999-2000 / defensive line).

James is a 1999 graduate of Norwich with a bachelor's degree in sports medicine. He went on to earn master's degrees from Albany in 2002 and Boston College in 2005.

RANDALL JETTE

Cornerbacks

Randall Jette joined the UNH football staff as cornerbacks coach in spring 2023.

In the 2023 season, Noah Stansbury had a team-high seven pass breakups and ranked third on the team in tackles with 49.

Jette came to UNH from Wagner College, where he served in the role of running backs coach in 2019. Prior to Wagner, he was part of the Howard staff as quality control for the offense.

Jette was a standout cornerback at UMass, where he started 44 games spanning the 2011-15 seasons. He earned All-Mid-American Conference Second Team honors as a junior and finished his career with 210 tackles, nine interceptions and 36 pass breakups. Jette had the distinction of being named to the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List, which is awarded to the top Football Bowl Championship (FBS) defensive back.

Jette signed as an undrafted free agent with the Green Bay Packers.

He graduated from UMass in 2016 and went on to earn a Master's of Business Administration at Wagner.

MATT ELSKER

Linebackers / Special Teams / Video Coordinator

Matt Elsker is in his ninth season coaching college football in 2024, and this will be his third year as part of the Wildcat coaching staff.

He spent 2018 and 2023 in support staff roles at UNH. In 2018, assisting the offense, and in 2023 assisting the defense and special teams.

Prior to UNH, Matt spent six seasons at Plymouth State University, where he served in a variety of roles including Video Coordinator, In-season Recruiting Coordinator, Running Backs Coach and Offensive Coordinator. During his time as OC the Panthers were one of the most well-disciplined offenses in all of Division III, having three consecutive seasons of top ten national rankings in fewest penalties, fewest penalty yards, fewest turnovers, and fewest interceptions thrown. In the 2022 season, they were also ranked as the top red zone offense in the country and top ten in fewest sacks allowed. This success led to a 9-2 season and victory in the New England Bowl.

NICK DELLA JACONO

co-Special Teams Coordinator / Strikes

Nick Della Jacono joined the Wildcats as co-special teams coordinator, strikes in July 2024. Della Jacono previously worked at Holy Cross as defensive line coach for two seasons (2022-23) and previously in the role of defensive quality control (2020-21).

In 2023, Della Jacono mentored an All-Patriot League defensive tackle for a Crusaders team that captured their fifth consecutive conference championship.

In 2022, the Holy Cross defense ranked atop the Patriot League in total defense and scoring defense. They went 11-0 during the regular season for the third time in program history and first time since 1991, recorded the most single-season wins (12) in program history and advanced to the NCAA FCS quarterfinals for the first time since 1983.

During the 2021 season, he helped lead the nation's top defense at the FCS level, with Holy Cross allowing just 254.5 yards per game.
