Improved Pirates Play Wildcats

After posting back-to-back wins, Coach Trent Boykin's Pirates look to continue their winning ways against Villanova.

A win over the Wildcats would give Hampton a 6-3 record, its first non-losing season since 2018 (2020 season was canceled).

The remaining schedule is a challenging one. The four Pirate opponents have a combined 19-13 (.594) log and a 10-6 (.625) mark in CAA play. Also, the schedule includes Villanova and Richmond --- two of the three league co-champions from a year ago.

The 2023 Pirates have shown improvement in virtually every category over 2023. The offense has been more efficient and balanced and the defense has kept

Hampton close in tight games.

In four of its five wins, Hampton trailed or was tied in the second half before mounting a

comeback victory.

The improvement both on-andoff the field led Director of Athletics Anthony D. Henderson Sr. to remove Boykin's interim tag on Oct. 16, making him the permanent head coach of the Pirates.

The Game

What a difference a year makes!

With a convincing 41-21 victory over Elon (2-6, 1-3) on Oct. 26 for Homecoming, Hampton (5-3, 2-2) equaled its win total from the 2023 season. The Pirates still have five games left in 2024.

The offensive and defensive numbers tell the story.

Hampton is scoring 11.2 more points and 28.2 more yards per game than in 2023. The dominant defense is limiting opponents to 9.0 fewer points and 61.7 fewer yards than in 2023.

Hampton led the CAA in rushing last year (216.4 ypg) but boasts a more balanced offensive attack under new Head Coach

Trent Boykin. The Pirates average 205.3 yards on the ground and 182.0 yards through the air.

The game pits the Villanova's second-ranked total defense and scoring defense vs. Hampton's third-ranked scoring offense and rushing attack in the CAA.

Freshman wide receiver Brennan Ridley caught five passes against Elon and leads the team in receiving with 34 catches for 444 yards and three scores. He has 19 catches in the last three games.

The Pirate defense boasts three standouts including backs Jordan White (5.7 tpg) and Tre Everett (5.6 tpg) as well as linebacker Corey Yeoman (5.6 tpg).

The Wildcat defense is led by line-backers Brendan Bell (8.8 tpg) and Shane Hartzell (7.9 tpg). Villanova quarterback Connor Watkins averages 136.6 passing yards per game with six TDs.



History of Hampton Football

- Hampton fielded its first football team in 1902.
- A charter member of the CIAA in 1912, Hampton's C.H. Williams was a CIAA Founding Father. Charter members included Hampton, Howard, Lincoln, Shaw, and Virginia Union.
- Hampton has won seven Black College National championships: 1922 (Coach Gideon Smith), 1985 (Coach Fred Freeman), 1994 (Coach Joe Taylor), 1997 (Coach Joe Taylor), 2004 (Joe Taylor), 2005 (Coach Joe Taylor), and 2006 (Coach Joe Taylor).
- The Pirates have won 19 conference crowns including 14 in the CIAA (1913, 1914, 1915 1916, 1922, 1925, 1926, 1928, 1931, 1985, 1987, 1992, 1993, and 1994) and five as members of the MEAC (1997, 1998, 2004, 2005, and 2006).
- Hampton earned invitations to five IAA/FCS Championships (1997, 1998, 2004, 3005, and 2006). The Pirates played in the NCAA Division II Championships three times (1985, 1992, and 1993).
- Hampton has had 20 players taken in the NFL Draft. The last was in 2011 when DT Kenrick Ellis was picked by the New York Jets in the third round.
- Coach Joe Taylor was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2019. He posted a 136-49-1 record in 16 years at the Pirate helm.

Pirate coach Trent Boykin has the luxury of two first-string quarterbacks. Chris Zellous started every game in 2023. Malcolm Mays, the starter in 2022 before playing just one game in 2023, has played in every game, starting at North Carolina A&T on Oct. 19.

Hampton in November Games The Pirates are 125-103-1 (.548) in games played November. In 2023, Hampton recorded a 1-2 record in November.

CAA Honors Matthews-Canty Freshman linebacker Michael Matthews-Canty was named the CAA's Rookie of the Week in Hampton's 44-21 win over Elon

on Oct. 26. He had five tackles in the win. The dominant Pirate defense limited the Phoenix to just six first downs and minus-28 yards rushing with 168 yards total offense.

Yeoman's Duty for Yeoman

Linebacker Corey Yeoman had eight tackles (six solo and two assists) in Hampton's 59-17 win over North Carolina A&T. He also had 1.5 sacks for seven yards and 4.5 TFLs for 11 yards. He is HU's second-leading tackler with 45 stops.

Villanova (5-3, 3-2) scored 18 seconds into the contest on a 75-yard run by quarterback Connor Watkins and went on to post a 24-10 win over Hampton (4-4, 1-4) before 4,097 fans at Villanova Stadium.

The Pirates scored on a 30-yard field goal by Axel Perez midway through the second quarter before Matthew Mercurio capped a nineplay, 66-yard drive with a 26-yard field goal of his own with 3:35 left in the first half to boost Villanova's lead to 10-3 at the half.

Villanova added a touchdown by on an 11-yard pass from Watkins to Jaaron Hayek midway through the third quarter. Hampton responded when Malcolm Mays hooked up with Trent Cloud on a 23-yard scoring strike to make the score 17-10 after three quarters.

Watkins scooted 30-yards for the game's final score with 10:42 left in the contest to hand the Pirates the loss.

Hampton's Assistant Director of Athletics John "Buster" Jackson will be on hand for his 509th consecutive Pirates football game when Hampton hosts Villanova on Nov. 2. Starting as a football student manager in 1978, he attended his 500th game when Hampton played at Elon to finish the 2023 campaign. The streak began on Sept. 9, 1978. In 45 years, the Pirates are 308-195-6 (.611) record.

Zellous Works at Manning Passing Academy

Chris Zellous was one of just 45 quarterbacks from across the country invited to serve as an instructor at the nationally-famous Manning Passing Academy in May in Thibodaux, La. at Nicholls State. The camp is run by Archie Manning and his sons Payton, Eli, and Cooper. The Academy teaches the game fundamentals along with basic strategies.

Ja'Quan Snipes

With numerous family and friends from nearby Asheboro, N.C. on hand for the game at North Carolina A&T, Ja'Quan Snipes was the game's leading rusher with 71 yards on eight totes (8.9 ypc) with two scores.

Our Man Ridley: Jerry Rice Award Nominee

Wide receiver Brennan Ridley has been named to the 2024 Stats Perform Jerry Rice Award Watch List, it was announced today. The list includes 30 of the nation's top FCS freshmen. The Rice Award, now in its 14th season, is named after legendary Hall of Fame wide receiver Jerry Rice. Past recipients include Cooper Kupp, Chase Edmonds, Trey Lance, Cam Ward, and Shedeur Sanders.

Pirates Earn HBCU+FCS National Honors

Senior Malcolm Mays was named HBCU+ National Player of the Week following his performance against No. 20-ranked Rhode Island on Oct. 5. He completed 24-of-28 passes for 253 yards and four scores while rushing for 37 yards and a TD.

Following a 27-20 win over Howard on Sept. 21, Hampton was honored as the HBCU+ National Team of the Week. It marked the 100th meeting between the team and was Hampton's eighth straight win in the Battle of the Real HU.

Gideon Smith Nominated for Hall of Fame

Legendary Hampton coach Gideon Smith has been nominated for the College Football Hall of Fame. He coached the Pirates from 1921-40 recording a 102-47-13 log, winning the 1922 Black College National Championship and four CIAA crowns. If elected, Smith would join former Pirate coaches Joe Taylor in the Hall of Fame. Taylor led the Pirates to five Black College National titles (1994, 1997, 2004, 2005, and 2006) and eight league titles from 1992-07. His squads posted a 136-49-1 record with seven NCAA FCS Playoff appearances.



The Pirates in Overtime

Hampton has played nine overtime games since the overtime procedure was adopted by the NCAA in 1996. The Pirates are 4-5 in overtime. **Highlights:**

- The 2006, Hampton scored a TD in OT and then blocked Grambling State's PAT attempt to post a 27-26 win over the Tigers.
- The Pirates are 2-1 in overtime games at Armstrong Stadium.
- In the last OT game, Hampton lost to Rhode Island 46-44 in 2 OT on Oct. 5, 2024 at home.

Interim head coach Trent Boykin, a veteran of 28 years collegiate coaching experience including 10 years on the FBS-level at Akron, Boston College, and Ball State, was promoted to permanent head coach on Oct. 16, 2024 after less than six months as interim head coach.

Boykin joined the Pirate staff in 2020 after serving as running game coordinator at Akron from 2012-18.

Under his guidance offensive coordinator, Hampton's running game developed into the top unit in the CAA. In 2023, the Pirate ground game averaged a league-best 216.4 yards per contest. Elijah Burris rushed for 803 yards (114.7 yards per game) with eight TDs in seven games. Darran Burris rambled for 670 yards (74.4 ypg) with four scores giving Hampton the CAA's top one-two punch.

Prior to his time at Akron, Boykin spent a season as running backs coach at Wayne State (Mich.). He helped lead the Warriors to a 12-win season and an appearance in the Division II national championship game. In 2011, Wayne State boasted two 1,000-yard rushers for the first time in school history.

Boykin served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Lambuth (Tenn.) in 2010 after two seasons (2008-09) as the head coach at Lane (Tenn.). From 2005-07, he worked as the assistant head coach at Kentucky State.

Boykin began his coaching career at Akron in 1996 as an offensive graduate assistant. He spent two years on the staff moving to Boston College in 1998 as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching receivers at Tiffin in 1999.

For three years, he worked at his alma mater, Youngstown State, as wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator.

From 2003-04, he coached special teams and running backs at Ball State.

Boykin graduated from Youngstown State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in organizational communication.

He played for legendary coach Jim Tressel at Youngstown State and helped lead the Penguins to I-AA national titles in 1991, 1993, and 1994.

A standout receiver, Boykin's 150 career receptions rank him second on Youngstown's all-time list and his 1,950 career receiving yards are seventh. In 1994, he was named the team's most outstanding offensive player.

In 2006, he was inducted onto the Kent Roosevelt High Hall of Fame.

Renovations and Improvements

The stadium has seen many renovations over the years. In 1978, a new press box was completed on the west side. New bleachers were installed on the west side in 1985 and on the east side in 1986.

In 1988, lights were added making night games possible and a new track was installed. A new press box was built in 1991 on the east side along with camera towers for televised games.

In 1998, the press box was renovated, the stadium was bricked, the playing field resurfaced and a new scoreboard with a Pro Video Screen was added.

In 1999, seating was added in the north end zone along with construction of a new entrance to the facility. The additions included coach's offices, team rooms, conference rooms, multipurpose audio/visual rooms, reception area, and a player lounge.

Later construction included the addition of bleachers in the south endzone.
