#15 RYAN ARCIDIACONO

Guard | 6-3 | 193 | Langhorne, Pa. | Neshaminy HS

Served four seasons as a Wildcats' captain ... Helped lead his teams to 117 victories in that span, including three BIG EAST regular season and one BIG EAST Tournament championship ... Capped his career by feeding a pass to Kris Jenkins on the final possession of the 2016 NCAA national championship game that resulted in a game-winning 3-pointer in the 77-74 Villanova victory over North Carolina ... Became the second Wildcats' player to be named NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player (Ed Pinckney was the first in 1985, Donte DiVincenzo the third in 2018) ... Shared the 2015 BIG EAST Player of the Year award with Kris Dunn of Providence ... Averaged 31.9 minutes per game in 144 career games, 143 of which he started ... Ended his career with 535 assists, an average of 3.8 assists per game.

#11 PAUL ARIZIN

Forward | 6-3 | 185 | Philadelphia, Pa. | La Salle HS

One of the most storied players in Villanova history ... Did not make his high school basketball team, but was discovered in the Field House by coach Alexander Severance ... Became Villanova's first 1,000 point scorer, finishing a three year career with 1,648 points, then the best in program history ... Earned the national scoring title as a senior with 735 points and became the first Wildcat ever named National Player of the Year (The Sporting News) ... Set the school record for points in a game with 85 on Feb. 12, 1949 in a game versus the Naval Air Material Center ... His No. 11 jersey was retired by Villanova in 1994 ... Played 10 seasons with the Philadelphia Warriors and was selected to 10 NBA All-Star games and led the league in scoring twice ... Selected as one of the NBA's 50 Greatest Players in its first 50 seasons in 1996 ... Inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1978.

Forward | 6-8 | 195 | Silver Spring, Md. | Sidwell Friends School

A late addition to the Wildcats' recruiting class in June 2018, this versatile forward made an immediate impact at Villanova, starting 22 games as a newcomer on a squad that claimed the BIG EAST regular season title ... Bey was named to the 2019 BIG EAST All-Freshman Team after averaging 8.2 points and 5.1 rebounds per game ... As a sophomore, Bey helped lead VU to a 24-7 record and a share of the BIG EAST regular season title ... He finished fourth in the nation in 3-point FG Percentage and averaged 16.1 points and 4.7 rebounds per outing ... Bey received the Julius Erving Award as the nation's top small forward and was a unanimous choice to the BIG EAST First Team All Conference list.

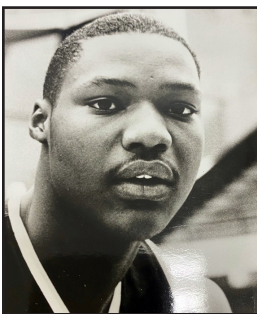
#32 JAMES BELL

Enjoyed one of the outstanding senior seasons in program history in 2013-14 after battling injuries over the course of his first three seasons at Villanova ... Averaged 14.4 points per game and captained the Wildcats to a 29-5 record and the 2013-14 BIG EAST regular season title ... Displayed a knack for hitting big shots at critical moments ... Scored a career high 30 points on Jan. 25, 2014 in an overtime victory at Marquette ... As a freshman, scored 18 points at Seton Hall to help the Wildcats lock down an NCAA Tournament berth ... Collected 493 career rebounds as a guard ... Named 2014 first team All-BIG EAST.

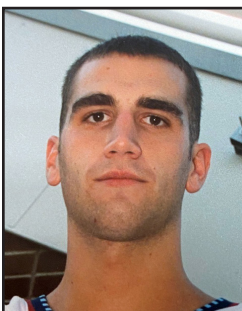
#42 ALEX BRADLEY

Made an impact immediately, earning Freshman All-America honors ... Scored 1,634 points, averaging in double digits in each of his four seasons as a Wildcat (1977-81) ... First three year captain since 1952 ... The Wildcats sported an 81-41 record across his four seasons in the Blue and White ... Scored a then freshman record 35 points against Pittsburgh on Feb. 20, 1978 ... Tallied 797 career rebounds, an average of 7.2 rebounds per game ... Selected to the 1981 BIG EAST All-Tournament Team ... Played in the NBA for the New York Knicks ... Produced a career field goal percentage of .505 and a career free throw percentage of .803.

Forward | 6-10 | 245 | Worcester, Mass. | Burncoat High School

Arrived at Villanova in the fall of 1999 after transferring from the University of Kentucky, where he won an NCAA championship as a freshman in 1997 ... Provided an instant lift after sitting out the 1999-2000 season per NCAA rules ... A consensus second team All-American choice of The Associated Press, Sporting News and Basketball Times ... A unanimous choice to the 2000-01 All-BIG EAST first team ... Connected on a school record .692 of his field goal attempts to lead the nation in that category ... Averaged 20.8 points and 9.8 rebounds in 31 games ... One of 15 finalists for the Naismith College Player of the Year Award ... Recorded 14 double-doubles and failed to reach double figures in scoring only once in 31 contests ... Shared Philadelphia Big Five Player of the Year honors

Guard | 6-3 | 195 | Baltimore, Md. | Mount Saint Joseph High School

Established a new Villanova record for games played (148), a mark since eclipsed by Collin Gillespie and Jermaine Samuels ... Earned two NCAA championships as an integral part of both the 2016 and 2018 teams ... Scored 20 points off the bench to help the Wildcats down North Carolina 77-74 in the 2016 NCAA national championship game in Houston ... Appeared in only three games in 2016-17 before being sidelined by a knee injury and was later granted a medical red-shirt ... One of only five players in NCAA history to win 13 consecutive NCAA Tournament games ... Averaged 18.6 points and 3.8 assists to lead the Wildcats in 2018-19 ... Named First Team All-BIG EAST and captured the Dave Gavitt Award as Most Outstanding Player at the 2019 BIG EAST Tournament.

Forward | 6-7 | 205 | Malvern, Pa. | Great Valley High School

A two-time NCAA national champion ... Earned All-American and first team All-BIG EAST honors as a junior in 2017-18 while serving as tri-captain for a squad that finished 36-4 and won its six NCAA Tournament games by an average margin of victory of 17.6 points per game ... Captured the 2018 Julius Erving Award as the nation's top small forward ... After redshirting in 2014-15 to gain strength, this native of nearby Malvern, Pa., became a key reserve for the Wildcats in his debut season ... His length and quickness at the top of Villanova's 1-2-2 zone press helped transform the Wildcats' defense ... Credited with five steals – including a critical one in the contest's final minute – to help Villanova outlast Kansas 64-59 in the 2016 South Regional Final.

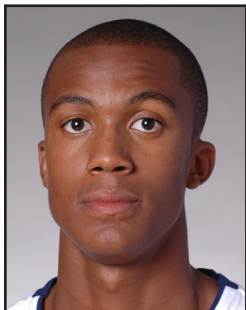
Guard | 6-3 | 180 | Lincolnshire, Ill. | Adlai Stevenson High School

Capped a phenomenal three year career by being named only the second National Player of the Year in program history (Paul Arizin is the other) ... The product of Lincolnshire, Ill., became the first Villanova player to capture the John R. Wooden, Naismith Award, and Oscar Robertson Trophy as the United States Basketball Writers Association Player of the Year ... In addition, he took home the Bob Cousy Award as the country's top point guard and was tabbed BIG EAST Player and Scholar Athlete of the Year ... He also became the first Wildcat in three decades to earn CoSIDA Academic All-American honors (second team) ... Brunson also started 39 of 40 games in Villanova's 2015-16 NCAA national championship season while being named to the BIG EAST All-Freshman unit ... Named first team All-BIG EAST as a sophomore.

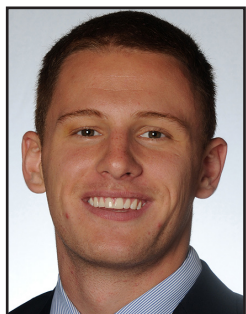
#33 DANTE CUNINGHAM

Forward | 6-8 | 220 | Silver Spring, Md. | Potomac High School

Played on a pair of Elite Eight NCAA Tournament teams and was the top scorer (16.1 points per game) and rebounder (7.5 rebounds per game) on the 2009 team that reached the Final Four ... Named BIG EAST Most Improved Player as a senior ... Also named to the All-NCAA East Regional Team in Boston ... Finished his career with 819 rebounds and also contributed 1,344 points ... Played on teams that were 9-4 (.692) in four NCAA Tournament appearances ... Selected first team All-Philadelphia Big Five as a senior and was the Big Five Rookie of the Year in 2005-06 ... Selected as the No. 33 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft by the Portland Trail Blazers and enters his 10th NBA season with the San Antonio Spurs in 2018-19.

Guard | 6-5 | 205 | Wilmington, Del. | Salesianum High School

Produced one of the great performances in NCAA Finals history, scoring 31 points to key a 79-62 victory over Michigan on April 2, 2018 ... His effort was highlighted on the cover of Sports Illustrated with the headline: "Donte's Epic" ... Following a foot injury that limited him to just seven games as a freshman and earned him a medical redshirt in 2015-16, the Delaware native emerged as Villanova's essential sixth man in the next two seasons ... He was named to the BIG EAST All-Freshman squad in 2016-17 and then averaged 18.0 points per game in two NCAA Tournament appearances ... His tip-in of a Josh Hart miss at the buzzer helped lift the Wildcats past Virginia 61-59 on Jan. 29, 2017 ... Tabbed 2018 BIG EAST Sixth Man of the Year and Most Outstanding Player at the NCAA Final Four ... Selected as the first round pick of the Milwaukee Bucks in 2018.

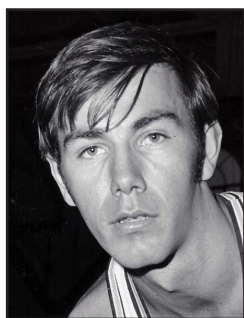
Forward | 6-8 | 265 | Willow Grove, Pa. | Abington

Became a mainstay in the Villanova rotation starting in all but 21 of his program-record 162 appearances ... #42 CHRIS FORD

Guard | 6-5 | 190 | Atlantic City, N.J. | Holy Spirit High School

During his Villanova career, the Wildcats posted a record of 65-21 and made three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances ... Scored 1,433 career points ... Named Philadelphia Big Five Player of the Year as a senior in 1971-72 ... Dished out 500 career assists in three seasons, an average of 5.5 assists per contest ... Also collected 548 rebounds in his career ... Named to Jack Kraft's All-Era team ... Great defensive player with the uncanny sense of anticipating what his opponent would do ... Scored 7,314 points in a 10-year NBA career with Detroit and Boston, winning an NBA title with the Celtics in 1981 ... He later served as head coach of the Celtics and Los Angeles Clippers ... His Villanova jersey, No. 42, was retired on Feb. 4, 2006.

Guard | 6-4 | 205 | Newark, N.J. | East Side High School

Became the first Wildcat since Kerry Kittles in 1996 to earn consensus first team All-American honors when he did so in 2006 ... Named first team All-American as a senior by the Associated Press, Sporting News and United States Basketball Writers Association ... Was also tabbed Philadelphia Big Five Player of the Year ... Finished with 1,966 career points, averaging 15.0 points per game in 131 career games ... Averaged 22.1 points and 6.4 rebounds in seven career NCAA Tournament games ... Villanova was 52-13 in his final two seasons, advancing to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 2005 and the Elite Eight the following year ... Spent his senior season playing out of position against forwards in VU's four guard lineup after classmate Curtis Sumpter was forced to the sidelines by knee surgery ... Delivered a sensational 29 point,

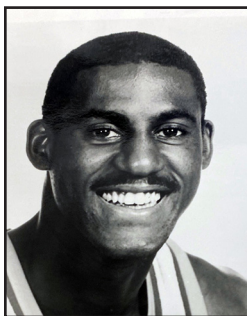
Guard | 6-3 | 195 | Huntingdon Valley, Pa. | Archbishop Wood High School

One of only six players in BIG EAST Conference history to be named Player of the Year twice ... In 2020-21 he shared the award with two others and was the lone winner in 2021-22 ... A four-year captain who was named winner of the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard in 021-22 ... Capped his career by leading the Wildcats to the 2022 NCAA Final Four ... Named third team All-American in 2021-22 ... Returned from a knee injury that ended his 2020-21 season prematurely ...
