Pirates to Face No. 14 Wildcats

Hampton faces a challenge when the Pirates play at Villanova.

The Wildcats have won 18 consecutive games at Villanova Stadium --- including a 2-0 mark in 2025 --- since falling 49-42 to Monmouth on Sept. 24, 2022.

In addition, the Pirates are facing an opponent that is ranked 14th in the latest AFCA Poll and 15th in the Stats Poll.

Hampton's last win against a nationally-ranked opponent came at home on Nov. 13, 2014 in a 40-35 win over No.-20 ranked Bethune-Cookman (8-3) 40-35. The Pirates have lost the last 18 games to nationally-ranked opponents.

In 2024, the Pirates came within a whisker of beating the No. 12-ranked Wildcats, falling 20-14. Ja'Quan Snipes rushed for 85 yards while Villanova had just 92 yards on the ground.

In 2024, the Pirates played four nationally-ranked teams losing 49-7 at William & Mary, 46-44 (2 OT) to Rhode Island, 20-14 to No. 12 Villanova and 24-21 to No. 11 Richmond.

Following the game in Pennsylvania, the Pirates will enjoy a three-game homestand by hosting Monmouth (Oct. 25) for Homecoming, Maine (Nov. 8) and William & Mary (Nov. 15) before finishing the season on the road at Rhode Island on Nov. 22.

The Game

Hampton (2-5, 0-3) looks to record its first CAA win of the season when the Pirates play at Villanova (4-2, 3-1) on Oct. 18.

The Wildcats have won 18 straight games at Villanova Stadium dating back to the 2022 season. The Pirates have lost five consecutive road contests.

Hampton has ranked in the top two in the Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) since joining the league three years ago. With Ja'Quan Snipes, the centerpiece of the Pirate offense, on the shelf, Hampton rushed for just 76 yards on 36 carries in a 38-21 loss to Campbell a week ago. True freshman Gracen Goldsmith was Hampton's leading rusher with 32 yards on 10 totes.

Graduate linebacker Harold O'Neal III led all tacklers with 11 stops in the game. The Shepherd University transfer is Hampton's

leading tackler with 65 total stops with 3.5 tackles for loss. He ranked fifth in the CAA in tackles with 9.3 per game. Fellow linebacker Michael Matthews-Canty is averaging 7.0 stops per outing, 16th best in the league. The sophomore also has 4.5 tackles for loss.

Redshirt freshman kicker Brett Starling has been a big surprise -- and not just because he is 6-6, 230. He converted his first nine field goal attempts before missing a 45-yarder against Norfolk State. Starling has made all 19 PATs and is second in the CAA averaging 42.5 yards per punt.

Villanova quarterback Pat McCade ranks third in the league in passing with 226.3 yards per game. Running back David Avit is third in the CAA, averaging 89.2 yards. With a balanced defense, the Wildcats do not have any tacklers ranked among the conference's top 20.



History of Hampton Football

- Hampton fielded its first football team in 1902.
- A traditional powerhouse, Hampton is the HBCU's fourth all-time winningest football program.
- A charter member of the CIAA in 1912, Hampton's C.H. Williams was a CIAA Founding Father. Charter members included Hampton, Howard, Lincoln (Pa.), Shaw and Virginia Union.
- Hampton has won seven Black College National championships: 1922 (Coach Gideon Smith), 1985 (Coach Fred Freeman), 1994, 1997, 2004, 2005, and 2006 (Coach Joe Taylor).
- The Pirates have won 19 conference crowns including 14 in the CIAA (1913, 1914, 1915, 1916, 1922, 1925, 1926, 1928, 1931, 1985, 1987, 1992, 1993, and 1994) and five as members of the MEAC (1997, 1998, 2004, 2005, and 2006).
- Hampton earned invitations to five IAA/FCS Championships (1997, 1998, 2004, 2005 and 2006). The Pirates played in the NCAA Division II Championships three times (1985, 1992 and 1993).
- Hampton has had 20 players chosen in the NFL Draft. The last was DT Kenrick Ellis was a third-round pick by the New York Jets in 2011.
- Coach Joe Taylor was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2019. He posted a 136-49-1 record in 16 years at the Pirate helm.

The Pirates in October

The Pirates are 126-84-4 (.598) in games played in the month of October. Hampton is 1-1 in games played in October 2025 registering a 41-34 win over Norfolk State on Oct. 4 in the annual Battle of the Bay match-up and suffering a 38-21 setback against Campbell on Oct. 11.

This Date in Pirate History

Hampton has a 5-3-1 record in Oct. 18 games. Seven of the nine games played on Oct. 18 were against Norfolk State with the Pirates going 4-2-1 in those games. The first Oct. 18 contest came in 1947, a 19-0 Pirate triumph over Tuskegee at Armstrong Field. The last contest on this date was in 2014 when Norfolk State beat the Pirates 21-13.

Boykin Adds Four Assistants

Head coach Trenton Boykin added four new coaches this year: defensive tackles coach Raekwon Bethea (formerly of SMU), co-offensive coordinator Ollie Taylor (Delaware State), tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator Delbert Tyler II (Robert Morris) and defensive ends coach Marc Yellock (Valdosta State).

Pirates Boast a Veteran Coaching Staff

Hampton's coaching staff has 171 years experience. Head coach Trenton Boykin is in his 29th season and fourth as a head coach. Hampton's 10 assistants have 141 years of experience led by Howard Feggins's in 25th season and 16th stop.

Bobby Blizzard: Ballboy to Assistant Coach

Pirate coach Bobby Blizzard grew up in Hampton and his mother worked on the HU campus. He was a ballboy under Coach Fred Freeman as a child. After graduating from North Carolina, he moved into coaching and is HU's wide receivers coach.

Pirate Coaches in the Pros

Three former Hampton players are now patrolling the sidelines in professional football. Derius Swinton (HU, '07) is special teams coach with the Las Vegas Raiders, Marcus Dixon (HU, '08) is the defensive line coach for the Minnesota Vikings and Marquay McDaniels (HU, '06) is the CFL's Saskatchewan Roughriders receivers coach.

Iron Man Jackson to Witness 520th Game

Hampton Assistant Director of Athletics Buster Jackson will witness his 520th consecutive Pirates football game when Hampton plays at Villanova on Oct. 18. Starting as a student manager in 1978, he attended his 500th consecutive game when Hampton played at Elon in the 2023. The streak began Sept. 9, 1978 at Winston-Salem State. In 46+ years, the Pirates has a 310-203-6 (.602) record.



Pirate Wristbands

Hampton players are sporting special wristbands in a sign of unity this season. Inspired by Coach Trenton Boykin, they read "DHTT" --- meaning "Doing Hard Things Together."

Age before Beauty: CAA's Oldest Venues

Villanova Stadium was built in 1927 and is the CAA's oldest venue. It was dedicated on Oct. 8, 1927. The facility has been renovated several times over the years and now has a seating capacity of 12,500.

The CAAs' third-oldest facility, Armstrong Field (now Stadium) was constructed by Hampton Institute students and opened on Oct. 6, 1928 with a capacity of 1,500. The facility has added seating and other amenities over the years including endzone seating and boasts a seating capacity of 9,710. The original 1,500 seats are still in use to-day.

Rhode Island's Meade Stadium opened two weeks before Armstrong Field on Sept. 22, 1928. But while the original Armstrong Field stands are still in use, Meade Stadium was reconstructed on the original site, none of the original stadium exists today.

HU to Play FBS Teams in '26, '27, '28

Director of Athletics Anthony D. Henderson Sr. announced that Hampton will play at Maryland (Sept. 5, 2026) and at Georgia Tech (Oct. 9, 2027), marking Hampton's first-ever games against Power 4 competition. In addition, the Pirates will play FBS member Old Dominion (Sept. 16, 2028).





The Pirates in Overtime

Hampton has played 14 overtime games since overtime was adopted by the NCAA in 1996. The Pirates are 6-8 (3-3 at home) in overtime.

■ The first OT game was a 6 OT affair in which Florida A&M outlasted the Pirates 59-58.

■ In 2006, Hampton scored a TD in OT and then blocked Grambling State's PAT attempt to post a 27-26 win over the Tigers.

■ In the last OT game, Hampton lost at North Carolina A&T 33-30 in two OTs in 2025.

HU Rules CAA Commissioner's Honor Roll

Hampton has gained a well-earned reputation for academic excellence. Last semester, more than 76 percent of the Hampton football team was named to the CAA Commissioner's Honor Roll and the team posted a 3.05 GPA for the spring semester. A record 57 football student-athletes were recognized. Four players had a 4.0 GPA earning CAA High Honors with Distinction honors. Twenty-three players had a GPA of 3.7-plus earning High Honors with 30 earning Honors with a 3.0-plus GPA.

Monumental Sports to Carry Six Games

Hampton has expanded its Monumental Sports Network partnership. The network will carry six Pirate football games and is available to three million homes in the D.C.-Baltimore-Metro area.

HAMPTON, Va. ... Under threatening skies, Campbell (2-4, 2-1) outscored Hampton (2-5, 0-3) 28-7 in the second half to post a 38-21 come-from-behind victory over the Pirates before 3,358 fans at Armstrong Stadium.

Leading 14-10 at halftime, the Pirates saw the Camels score on their first two possessions of the second half and then intercept a pass and return it for another score. The trio of touchdowns put the Camels ahead 31-14 after three quarters. The two teams traded fourth quarter scores.

Campbell finished with 426 total yards while limiting the Pirates to 207 yards. Hampton came into the game as the leading rushing team in the Coastal Athletic Association averaging 202.5 yards per game but managed just 76 yards on 39 totes against the Camels.

In a game that was delayed 15 minutes after the Villanova team bus was stuck in traffic trying to navigate the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel, the Wildcats (7-2, 4-1) edged Hampton (5-4, 2-3) 20-14 at Armstrong Stadium. Hampton's crushing defense held the No. 13-ranked Wildcats at bay throughout. The game was as close as the statistics. Villanova finished with 241 total yards to Hampton's 239 and both teams ran 64 plays and each finished with 12 first downs. Hampton was first to put points on the scoreboard. Aided by three Villanova penalties, Hampton took the opening kickoff and drove 75 yards in nine plays and to score when quarterback Chris Zellous connected with Kymari Gray on a six-yard pass to give the Pirates a 7-0 lead 3:14 into the game. Ethan Gettman booted a 42-yard field goal with 2:13 left to make it 7-3 at the end of the opening quarter. Later, David Avit bulled in from the one-yard line to give Villanova the lead 10-7 with 7:11 left in the half. Gettman booted a 40-yard field goal to put the Wildcats up 13-7 with 10:06 left in the third quarter. On their next possession, Wildcat quarterback Connor Watkins hit Jaylan Sanchez with a 72-yard pass to the Hampton one-yard line. On the next play, linebacker Brendan Bell lined up in the backfield dove into the endzone for the score giving Villanova a 20-7 lead. Hampton scored its first TD since its initial possession of the game. Zellous scored from one-yard out and Brian Csehoski's extra point cut the Hampton deficit to 20-14.

Trenton Boykin, a veteran of 29 years collegiate coaching experience including 10 years on the FBS-level at Akron, Boston College, and Ball State, was promoted to permanent head coach on Oct. 16, 2024 after less than six months as interim head coach of the Pirates.

Boykin joined the Pirate staff in 2020 after serving as running game coordinator at Akron from 2012-18.

Under his guidance as offensive coordinator, Hampton's running game developed into the top unit in the CAA. In 2023, the Pirate ground game averaged a league-best 216.4 yards per contest. Elijah Burris rushed for 803 yards (114.7 yards per game) with eight TDs in seven games. Darran Butts rambled for 670 yards (74.4 ypg) with four scores giving Hampton the CAA's top one-two punch.

Prior to his time at Akron, Boykin spent a season as

running backs coach at Wayne State (Mich.). He helped lead the Warriors to a 12-win season and an appearance in the Division II national championship game. In 2011, Wayne State boasted two 1,000-yard rushers for the first time in school history.

Boykin served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Lambuth (Tenn.) in 2010 after two seasons (2008-09) as the head coach at Lane (Tenn.). From 2005-07, he worked as the assistant head coach at Kentucky State.

Boykin began his coaching career at Akron in 1996 as an offensive graduate assistant. He spent two years on the staff moving to Boston College in 1998 as an offensive graduate assistant before coaching receivers at Tiffin in 1999.

For three years, he worked at his alma mater, Youngstown State, as wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator.

From 2003-04, he coached special teams and running backs at Ball State.

Boykin graduated from Youngstown State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in organizational communication.

He played for legendary coach Jim Tressel at Youngstown State and helped lead the Penguins to I-AA national titles in 1991, 1993, and 1994.

A standout receiver, Boykin's 150 career receptions rank him second on Youngstown's all-time list and his 1,950 career receiving yards are seventh. In 1994, he was named the team's most outstanding offensive player.

In 2006, he was inducted onto the Kent Roosevelt High Hall of Fame.

He is the father of two daughters: Elivia and Brittney, and a son, Jaz. He also has three grandchildren.

Renovations and Improvements

The stadium has seen many renovations over the years. In 1978, a new press box was completed on the west side. New bleachers were installed on the west side in 1985 and on the east side in 1986.

In 1988, lights were added making night games possible and a new track was installed. A new press box was built in 1991 on the east side along with camera towers for televised games.

In 1998, the press box was renovated, the stadium was bricked, the playing field resurfaced and a new scoreboard with a Pro Video Screen was added.

In 1999, seating was added in the north end zone along with construction of a new entrance to the facility. The additions included coach's offices, team rooms, conference rooms, multipurpose audio/visual rooms, reception area, and a player lounge.

Later construction included the addition of bleachers in the south endzone.
