In the battle of the Wildcats, UNH leads the series 14-13.

In the FCS national stats, UNH ranks #4 in blocked kicks (three), #6 in both red zone defense (67%) and blocked punts (one); and #7 in fourth down conversion percentage defense (20%).

Three Wildcats are FCS national leaders: **Cameron Garner-Young** is #1 in blocked kicks (two), **Nick Reed** is #1 in field goals per game (2.20), and **Brendan Tighe** is #1 in punt return TDs (one; blocked punt return).

Graduate student defensive tackle **Justice Akinmoladun** has a tackle for loss in four of five games this season, and a sack in three of those games. He leads the team in sacks.

UNH extended its streak of consecutive games with an interception to five with an INT vs. UAlbany last week.

New Hampshire has been aggressive on 4th down this season and the Wildcats are 7-for-11 (63.6%) on 4th down conversions. In comparison, UNH's defense has held the opponents to 2-for-8 (25%) on 4th down.

Grad student safety **Duncan Moreland** recorded five tackles last week vs. UAlbany to move to the cusp of 100 career tackles with 95, which leads all active Wildcats.

Sophomore quarterback **Matt Vezza** has rushed for a touchdown each of the past three games and he leads UNH with four rushing TDs this season.

Grad student wide receiver **Chase Wilson** has 17 catches for 278 yards and two TDs the past three games.

Sophomore kicker **Nick Reed** has made 11 of 13 field goals and 10 of 11 PATs. Reed is 1-1 from 40-49 yards and 3 of 4 from 50-59.

New Hampshire has a 33-15 lifetime record for a .688 winning percentage at Wildcat Stadium, which opened in the 2016 season. That includes 23-11 (.676) against CAA opponents.

THE MATCHUP: UNH vs VILLANOVA

Series Synopsis

New Hampshire has a 14-13 lifetime record against Villanova. This is the first time these Wildcat football programs meet three consecutive years since the teams played five times in a four-year span (2008-09-10-11).

'Nova has won each of the past two meetings with a 14-6 home win last year and a 45-33 victory at UNH's Wildcat Stadium in 2023.

Prior to that, UNH won five consecutive matchups spanning the 2010-19 seasons.

VILLANOVA, Pa. – The 13th-ranked Villanova Wildcats defeated the UNH Wildcats, 14-6, on Saturday at Villanova Stadium. The home Wildcats (6-2, 3-1 CAA) registered a pair of goal-line stands to win the defensive battle and hand the visiting Wildcats (4-4, 2-2 CAA) their first setback on the Main Line since 2009.

Villanova made its first goal line stand in the second quarter to preserve a 7-3 lead and followed its second goal line stand with a 99-yard touchdown drive to build a 14-3 lead in the fourth quarter.

Seeing his first game action since sustaining an injury Aug. 29 at Central Florida, junior running back Myles Thomason established career highs with 20 rushes for 79 yards. He tacked on four receptions for 39 yards.

In his first career start, sophomore quarterback Barry Kleinpeter completed 14 of 22 passes for 125 yards and rushed 19 times for 42 yards.

Graduate student Logan Tomlinson paced the receivers with 56 yards on four receptions.

Senior defensive end Josiah Silver posted eight tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss (2.0 sacks) and a forced fumble. Senior safety Duncan Moreland set a career high with eight tackles and a forced fumble and fumble recovery on the same play.

Villanova quarterback Connor Watkins went 7-for-13 for 112 yards and two TD passes. Devin Smith was VU's leading receiver with three catches for 60 yards and a touchdown.

VU linebacker Shane Hartzell notched a game-high 20 tackles.

WILSON NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST: Chase Wilson has been named to the remarkable list of 178 semifinalists for the 2025 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award. The announcement was made Sept. 24 by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame.

Wilson is a first-year Wildcat who completed his undergraduate degree in Economics with a minor in African American Studies at Wesleyan University in December 2024 with a 3.46 cumulative GPA. The grad student is currently pursuing an MBA degree at UNH.

Off the field at Wesleyan, Wilson was a group leader in the student-Athlete of Color Council. In that role, he assisted in the planned training of two representatives per varsity team in the diversity and inclusion program. He also communicated with administration to further diversify the Wesleyan athletic platform.

Wilson assisted in the creation of PowerPoints at Wesleyan to build a foundational understanding of corporate finance through weekly meetings including accounting and valuation fundamentals, recruiting processes, and interview preparation.

WILDCAT STADIUM: New Hampshire has a 33-15 lifetime record for a .688 winning percentage at Wildcat Stadium, which opened in the 2016 season. That includes 23-11 (.676) against CAA opponents and 10-4 (.714) vs. non-conference teams.

HOME SWEET HOME: Since 2008, UNH has a 75-20 home record (.789 win percentage) in Durham with a breakdown of 52-14 (.788) against CAA conference teams and 23-6 (.793) vs. non-conference opponents.

UNH IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS: In the FCS national stats, UNH ranks #4 in blocked kicks (three), #6 in both red zone defense (67%) and blocked punts (one); #7 in fourth down conversion percentage defense (20%); #12 in interceptions (five); #14 in scoring defense (18.6) and in time of possession (32:48); #17 passing yards allowed (159.4/game); and #18 in passing efficiency defense (106.04).

Three Wildcats are FCS national leaders: **Cameron Garner-Young** is #1 in blocked kicks (two), **Nick Reed** is #1 in field goals per game (2.20), and **Brendan Tighe** is #1 in punt return TDs (one; blocked punt return).

CONFERENCE CALL: In CAA Football, the UNH defense ranks in the top three in multiple categories. The unit excels at limiting opponents' scoring, leading the conference in both scoring defense (18.6) and red zone defense (66.7%). The D limits opposing air attacks to just 159.4 yards per game with a passing efficiency defense of 106.04, which ranks third and second in the conference, respectively. Overall, the unit is second in total defense (329.2). The defense's five interceptions put them second in the conference. On fourth down, the 'Cats lead the CAA, coming up with stops on four out of five plays this season.

The special teams also play a critical role in setting up the defense's success by limiting lengthy returns. UNH ranks second in the conference in kick return defense (17.55) and punt return defense (4.43). The 'Cats have also seen success blocking kicks, leading with three, and are second in blocked punts (one).

On offense, UNH controls the clock and leads the conference with a time of possession of 32:48. The offense also protects the football well with a ranking of third in turnover margin (0.40) and in turnovers lost (4).

Several individuals rank high in conference stats. On special teams, **Cameron Garner-Young** leads the conference with two blocked kicks, coming in back-to-back weeks (Aug. 30 at NC Central and Sept. 6 vs. Holy Cross). Defensively, **Raleigh Collins III** is second with 0.4 interceptions per game and has recovered one fumble, good for third in the conference.

The 'Cats shine in the punt return game. **Myles Thomason** is second in the conference with 12.2 yards per return, while **Brendan Tighe**

owns just one of three punt return touchdowns in the conference this season (off a blocked punt).

Scoring-wise, **Nick Reed** has been a weapon for UNH as he leads the conference with 2.20 field goals per game and ranks fourth in scoring, averaging 8.6 points per game.

Matt Vezza is a dual-threat presence at quarterback, ranking fifth among all players with four rushing touchdowns, which is second amongst QBs, putting him fifth in points responsible for (56). He is also third amongst QBs with 41.0 rushing yards per game and Vezza ranks 4th in total offense averaging 248.4 total yards per game.

JUSTICE IS SERVED

Graduate student defensive tackle **Justice Akinmoladun** has a tackle for loss in four of five games this season, and a sack in three of those games. He leads the team in sacks.

Akinmoladun's stops have come at key times. With UNH leading 24-10 midway through the fourth quarter at NC Central, Akinmoladun had a 10-yard sack on 3rd and 4, forcing the Eagles to punt. At 8:11 in the 4th quarter at Ball State, he had a safety to bring the 'Cats within one score. On the final UAlbany drive of the 24-6 UNH victory, he had a 9-yard sack on 2nd-and-10 that led to the Great Danes turning the ball over on downs two plays later, which allowed the 'Cats to take a knee and run the clock out.

UNH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS: New Hampshire entered both FCS national polls following a 2-0 start to the season with a 27-10 win at NC Central and 19-16 victory in the home opener against Holy Cross. The Wildcats are receiving votes in both of this week's polls.

FIRST FOUR: UNH played an FBS school and three teams that won conference titles last season in the first four games of the 2025 season. NC Central won the MEAC and was picked as the conference favorite this year, Holy Cross has won six consecutive Patriot League titles and Dartmouth won the past two Ivy League titles.

New Hampshire played in four home openers the first four games of the season -- UNH played its home opener at Wildcat Stadium on Sept. 6; when the 'Cats were on the road, it was the home opener for NC Central, Ball State and Dartmouth.

ANOTHER GAME, ANOTHER INT: New Hampshire's defense has intercepted a pass each of the first five games of the season. **Raleigh Collins III** had an interception each of the first two games (NC Central, Holy Cross), then **Duncan Moreland** had a pick at Ball State, **Matthew Sopp** had an INT at Dartmouth and **Kelby Hampton** intercepted a pass vs. UAlbany.

UNH enters the weekend ranked #12 nationally with the five interceptions.

POSSESSING THE BALL: UNH's 24-6 win vs. UAlbany was highlighted by three lengthy drives with regards to number of plays, yards and time of possession -- New Hampshire's three longest drives of the season in time of possession.

The Wildcats took the opening kickoff and converted a pair of fourth downs in a 15-play, 75-yards touchdown drive that culminated in a touchdown and 7-0 lead.

UNH ended the first half with a 16-play, 91-yard drive that was also capped by a TD in 8 minutes, 6 seconds.

That marked UNH's longest drive of the season until the Wildcats'

first possession of the third quarter, when they marched 97 yards in 12 plays in 7:08 to score a touchdown.

New Hampshire ended the game with 34:20 time of possession for a marking of +8:40.

The Wildcats also had a +16:10 margin with 38:05 TOP at Ball State and +9:44 (34:52 TOP) at NC Central.

Through five games, UNH is #14 in the nation in time of possession (32:48).

GO FOR IT: New Hampshire head coach Rick Santos has been aggressive on 4th down this season and the Wildcats are 7-for-11 (63.6%) on 4th down conversions. UNH was 2 of 3 in the 24-6 win against UAlbany and that included two successful conversions on the game-opening touchdown drive that set the tone for the day.

One week earlier, the 'Cats went 3-for-5 on 4th down at Dartmouth. In comparison, UNH's defense has held the opponents to 2-for-8 (25%) on 4th down.

BLOCK THAT KICK: UNH's special teams has been exactly that this season with a blocked field goal, blocked PAT kick and blocked punt in the first three games.

Junior defensive tackle **Cameron Garner-Young** blocked a kick for the second consecutive week when he deflected a Holy Cross PAT kick to keep the score 6-0. He also broke through the line of scrimmage on the Crusader's 34-yard go-ahead field goal attempt with 1:40 remaining in the game to force the kicker to pull the kick wide left and keep the score tied at 16.

In the season-opening 27-10 win at NC Central, Garner-Young blocked a 31-yard field goal attempt in the first quarter to keep the score tied 0-0.

On Sept. 13 at Ball State, redshirt freshman defensive end **D.J. Johnson** blocked a punt on the fourth play of the game from scrimmage, **Brendan Tighe** scooped up the loose ball at the BSU 30 and raced into the end zone for his first career touchdown.

THREE GAMES, THREE TAKEAWAYS: Junior safety **Raleigh Collins III** intercepted a pass each of his first two games as a Wildcat and recovered a fumble in the third game.

In the Aug. 30 opener at NC Central, his interception halted a drive at the UNH 31 yard line (with the 'Cats leading 27-10 at 4:35 of the fourth quarter).

One week later (Sept. 6) against Holy Cross, he went up in the air to high-point the ball and come down with the interception at the UNH 26.

In Game 3 at Ball State (Sept. 13), he recovered a fumble on special teams as **Logan Perez** forced a fumble on a punt return and Collins III recovered it at the BSU 7 (early in the second quarter).

Collins III did not record an interception in 12 games in two seasons at West Virginia.

UPCOMING WILDCAT MILESTONES: Grad student safety **Duncan Moreland** recorded five tackles last week vs. UAlbany to move to the cusp of 100 career tackles with 95.

Grad student defensive lineman **Justice Akinmoladun** has 93 career tackles, which includes 83 in four years at Washburn.

Grad student safety **Brendan Tighe** has 92 career tackles; he has not recorded a tackle in limited action this season.

RECENT MILESTONES: Senior wide receiver **Caleb Burke** eclipsed 1,500 career receiving yards Sept. 13 at Ball State. He entered the game with 109 catches for 1,412 receiving yards and made seven catches for 89 yards at BSU to increase his career total to 1,501.

He enters Saturday's game at 1,577 receiving yards.

Burke also surpassed 1,500 career all-purpose yards and enters Saturday's game with 1,638.

Including his stats from Wesleyan, senior wide receiver **Chase Wilson** has 2,235 career receiving yards (includes 352 with UNH). He eclipsed the 2,000-yard milestone during his seven-catch, 84-yard effort Sept. 13 at Ball State.

THE CAPTAINS: Five Wildcats were named team captains at the conclusion of the 2025 spring camp -- grad student safeties **Brendan Tighe** and **Duncan Moreland**, senior defensive end **Zach Garron**, senior offensive lineman **Dylan Maciulewicz** and junior tight end **Colby Ramshaw**.

RETURNING STARTERS: UNH returned a total of six starters with a breakdown of five on offense and one on defense. The Wildcats have three starters back on the offensive line -- Dylan Maciulewicz, Tolu Olajide and Luke Swaine -- in addition to wide receiver Caleb Burke and tight end Colby Ramshaw. The lone starter returning on the defensive side of the ball is safety Brendan Tighe.

STARTERS LOST: UNH lost a total of 16 starters with a breakdown of six on offense and 10 on defense. And on special teams, the Wildcats also lost their kicker (kickoffs and placekicks), punter, long snapper and kickoff returner.

Those overall numbers include a pair of All-Americans and a total of 10 all-conference honorees.

All-American defensive bookends Josiah Silver and Flex Ruiz highlight the list of 'Cats not back in 2025. Silver was also named the Defensive Player of the Year by both CAA Football and the ECAC.

They were joined on the All-CAA First Team by safety Wande Owens and placekicker Nick Mazzie.

Six other former 'Cats received All-CAA accolades with linebacker Ryan Toscano, quarterback Seth Morgan and wide receiver Logan Tomlinson on the Second team, and punter Sean Lehane, offensive lineman Dylan Poirier and special teams player Gavin Urda on the Third Team.

On the offensive side of the ball, UNH lost its starting QB (Seth Morgan), top rusher (Isaac Seide) and top receiver (Logan Tomlinson),

as well as the #3 receiver (Joey Corcoran) and two offensive linemen (Dylan Poirier and Mason Davis). Five of the eight Wildcats who scored multiple touchdowns last year are not on the 2025 roster.

Defensively, the top four tacklers (LB Ryan Toscano, S Wande Owens, DE Josiah Silver and LB Brandon Perkins) and eight of the top 10 tacklers are gone. This also includes the top three leaders in both sacks and tackles for loss.

A deeper look at the defensive stats shows the top two leaders in pass breakups are also gone, as are all five players who recorded more than one QB hurry a year ago.

Placekicker Nick Mazzie scored a team-high 86 points as he accounted for all 23 of UNH's field goal attempts (18 made) and 32 PAT kicks.

The only 'Cat who punted was Sean Lehane, who averaged 44.8 yards per punt with 16 punts of 50+ yards.

Caleb Mead had 31 of UNH's 43 kickoff returns and averaged 24.9 yards per return. Mead was also UNH's leader in all-purpose yards with 921, 771 of which came on kickoff returns.

NEW BLOOD: The 2025 UNH football roster includes 35 newcomers with a breakdown of 11 transfers and 24 freshmen. A total of eight newcomers are listed on the 2-deep for the third consecutive week.

Grad student **Chase Wilson** (Wesleyan) is one of three starting wide receivers.

Junior **Darren Burton II** (Hampton) is the starting strong safety and is also listed as the top kickoff returner.

Grad student **Justice Akinmoladun** (Washburn) has started each of the past three games at defensive tackle.

Sophomore **Nick Reed** (Buffalo) is the placekicker and will also kick off.

Sophomore **Wyatt Rubinoff** (Marist) is the long snapper.

Junior **Brooks Bentley** (Wingate) is QB2.

Freshman **Arvid Sillberg** is the backup left guard.

Freshman **Kelby Hampton** is listed as a backup at cornerback.

GROUND GAME: Senior running back **Myles Thomason** and sophomore **Elliot Meine** have received a majority of the handoffs this season. Sophomore **Denzell Gibson** has been limited to two

games because of injury.

Thomason made a statement early in UNH's 24-6 win against UAlbany (Sept. 27) when -- on the fourth play of the game -- he broke free for a 25-yard gain on 4th-and-1 from the UNH 34. He had five rushes for 42 yards in that 75-yard touchdown drive. Thomason finished with a season-high 77 yards on 16 carries.

In the season opener at NC Central, Thomason led the team with 76 rushing yards on a career-high 22 rushes. He also had two punt returns for 63 yards, including a long of 35, to finish with 139 all-purpose yards.

Sept. 6 vs. Holy Cross, Thomason carried the ball 19 times for 46 yards and had two catches for eight yards.

Through five games, he has 80 rushes for 256 yards with 420 all-purpose yards to lead UNH in all three stats.

In 32 career games, Thomason has 225 carries for 801 yards and one TD as well as 46 catches for 286 yards and two TDs. He has amassed 1,568 all-purpose yards, which includes 242 punt return and 239 kickoff return yards (204 in 2022).

Meine has 19 rushes for 70 yards -- with a long of 15 vs. Ball State -- through five games. He had 22 yards in consecutive games against Ball State and Dartmouth. Meine had a high of six carries (for 18 yards) vs. UAlbany.

Gibson, who has not see action in three road games, had one rush for five yards against Holy Cross. He had five carries for 11 yards, including a 1-yard TD, vs. UAlbany.

THE SIGNAL CALLER: For the second consecutive year, UNH is replacing its starting quarterback. Going into the 2024 season, the Wildcats needed a successor for Max Brosmer, who went on to the University of Minnesota and is on the Minnesota Vikings roster this year. Coming into the 2025 season, the 'Cats are replacing Seth Morgan, who was an All-CAA Second Team honoree.

UNH listed two quarterbacks as the probable starter for the season opener at N.C. Central with the expectation that both would see action during the game. But sophomore **Matt Vezza** started the game and took every snap. And he has taken every snap on offense this season.

Vezza was an efficient 19 of 24 for 190 yards and a TD for a 159.4 QB efficiency rating against UAlbany (Sept. 27). He also had a three-yard rushing TD vs. the Great Danes.

Vezza threw for a career-high 279 yards by completing 22 of 35 passes at Dartmouth (Sept. 20).

Sept. 13 at Ball State, Vezza established career highs in completions (25) and attempts (44), as well as rushes (16) and rushing yards (78) with a career long of 30 yards.

Through five games, Vezza has completed 87 of 141 passes for 1,037 yards and five TDs. He has been sacked 13 times and thrown four INTs. He also ranks second in rushing yards (205) and has a team-high four rushing TDs with one each of the past three games.

In his first career start at NC Central, Vezza completed 10 of 17 passes for 186 yards and TD passes of 4 and 65 yards. He also had 11 rushes for 36 yards, including an 8-yard TD.

He settled in after the first two possessions -- both UNH punts -- by leading the Wildcats to a field goal and touchdown on the last two possessions of the first half with a time of possession of 10:06 in the second quarter.

In the comeback win against Holy Cross, Vezza led the 'Cats to a scoring drive on the final drive of both halves. Trailing 9-7 with 3:22 remaining in the second quarter, UNH drove 48 yards in seven plays and kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to take a 10-9 lead into halftime. Then in the fourth quarter, Vezza engineered a game-winning drive as Nick Reed kicked a 40-yard field goal as time expired; the sophomore QB completed 2 of 3 passes for 35 yards to help advance the ball to the HC 22 yard line; the drive began at the UNH 20 with 1:40 remaining.

In the 2024 season, Vezza recorded a 159.6 QB rating by completing 14 of 18 passes for 136 yards and one TD (no INTs). Vezza saw significant playing time vs. URI (Oct. 19), when he went 11-for-13 for 84 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown pass.

In his first two seasons, Vezza completed 15 of 20 passes for 174 yards and two touchdowns.

Vezza made his UNH debut late in the Nov. 11, 2023 game at Monmouth and completed a 38-yard TD pass to Myles Thomason with 2:18 remaining in the fourth quarter to lift UNH to a 31-24 victory.

The Wildcats have brought junior **Brooks Bentley** into the fold this season. In two years at Wingate University (Wingate, N.C.), Bentley completed 281 of 465 passes (60.4%) for 3,869 yards and 28 touchdowns. He was named the South Atlantic Conference Freshman of the Year in 2023.

In that 2023 season, Bentley completed 126 of 191 passes for 1,834 yards and 13 touchdowns, and had 57 carries for 141 yards and four TDs in 10 games

He was an All-Piedmont Offensive honoree in 2024, when he captained Wingate to a 9-2 overall record, a SAC title (6-1 conference record) and the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Super Region. Bentley's stats included 2,035 passing yards and 15 TDs by completing 155 of 274 passes in 11 games.

TOP TARGETS: Senior wide receiver **Caleb Burke** -- a CAA Football Preseason Honorable Mention selection -- caught 52 passes for 711 yards and six touchdowns last season; those numbers ranked second on the team and best among returning Wildcats.

Burke has led UNH in receptions three of the first five games and in receiving yards twice. Through five games, he has a team-high 23 catches for 298 receiving yards, which ranks second.

In the Sept. 13 game at Ball State, he led the team with 89 receiving yards on seven catches, which tied for the most.

Burke had five catches for 78 yards, with a long of 46, in the opener at NC Central to lead the Wildcats in both those stats.

Burke once again led the 'Cats with three receptions (for 55 yards) Sept. 6 against Holy Cross. He also threw a 53-yard TD pass when he caught a lateral in the right flat from quarterback **Matt Vezza** and threw a perfect strike to **Josh Fillion** behind the defense for the score.

In 38 career games, Burke has 124 catches for 1,577 yards for averages of 12.7 yards/catch and 41.5 yards/game. He also has 1,638 career all-purpose yards.

Grad student **Chase Wilson** -- a first-year Wildcat from Wesleyan University -- has made an immediate impact. He has a team-high 352 receiving yards on 21 catches, which ranks second. Wilson's two receiving TDs also leads the team. His 16.8 yards per catch and 70.4 receiving yards per game are also team bests.

The past three games (Ball State, Dartmouth, UAlbany), Wilson has 17 catches for 278 yards and two TDs.

He became the first 'Cat to record 100+ receiving yards in a game this season with 120 on six catches Sept. 20 at Dartmouth; his 38-yard TD gave UNH a 20-19 lead midway through the fourth quarter.

Wilson scored his first TD as a Wildcat Sept. 13 at Ball State on a 13-yard catch. He finished the game with seven catches for 84 yards.

In the opener at NC Central, he caught two passes for 39 yards, including a long of 28 yards that set up 1st-and-goal at the NCCU, and UNH punched it into the end zone two plays later.

In Game 2 against Holy Cross, Wilson pulled in two catches for 35 yards, one of which was a 21-yard gain on the game-winning drive.

In three seasons at Wesleyan, he caught 110 passes for 1,883 yards and 20 touchdowns in 27 games for averages of 4.1 receptions per game, 17.1 yards per reception and 69.2 receiving yards per game.

Wilson led the team in receptions, receiving yards and touchdown receptions in both the 2023 and 2024 seasons. He was All-NESCAC First Team both years and was named the conference's Offensive Player of the Year, as well as to the All-New England Team, in 2024.

In 2024 as a senior captain, Wilson had 43 catches for 834 yards and seven TDs to lead the Cardinals to an 8-1 record; those numbers calculate to averages of 19.4 yards per catch and 92.7 yards per game.

Wilson was the clear-cut No. 1 receiver as he accounted for 34 percent of the team's receptions, 42 percent of the receiving yards and 50 percent of the TD catches in the 2024 season.

As a junior in 2023, he finished with 49 catches for 785 yards and 10 touchdowns for averages of 16.0 yards per catch and 87.2 yards per game.

Wilson has five career games with multiple TD catches, including four TDs vs. Hamilton in the 2023 season.

In 31 career games, Wilson has 127 catches for 2,161 yards and 22 TDs; those numbers calculate to 17.0 yards/catch and 69.7 yards/game.

Junior **Josh Fillion** has started each of the past four games. He has seven catches for 88 yards with a high of 57 yards on two catches vs. Holy Cross.

Fillion pulled in a 53-yard touchdown catch from fellow wideout Caleb Burke on a trick play to give UNH a 7-6 lead in the first quarter vs. Holy Cross.

Sophomore **Logan Perez** saw significant playing time and was targeted once in the opener at N.C. Central. Perez has made an impact on special teams; in punt coverage, he forced a fumble at Ball State that set up 1st-and-goal at the BSU 7. He is also one of the two primary kickoff returners with six for a team-high 135 yards.

Senior **Casey McKinney** and sophomore **Ryan Blagg** are the other backup WRs on the depth chart. McKinney has 10 catches for 91 yards this season with highs of four catches and 39 yards at Dartmouth (Sept. 20). He followed that with four catches for 36 yards vs. UAlbany.

McKinney played in six games in his first year as a 'Cat in 2024 and finished with totals of four catches for nine yards. McKinney was at St. Francis for three seasons (2021-23); in 17 games, he had 23 catches for 322 yards and three touchdowns. McKinney also returned punts and kickoffs at St. Francis.

Blagg recorded his first career TD on his first career catch (of six yards) Sept. 27 against UAlbany. He has seen action every game this year after playing one game (vs. Stonehill) last season.

Junior captain **Colby Ramshaw** entered the season as the top receiving threat among the tight ends. He incurred a season-ending injury Game 3 at Ball State. He was targeted once in the opener at NC Central and had one catch for 11 yards vs. Holy Cross. In Game 3 at Ball State, he caught two passes for 26 yards.

With Ramshaw out, classmates **Peyton Strickland** and **Drew Danson** will see increased playing time and targets. Strickland has seven catches for 111 yards. He had a 65-yard TD in the opener at NC Central and three catches for 24 yards at Dartmouth (Sept. 20). Danson has three catches for 13 yards.

PAVING THE WAY: New Hampshire returns three starters return from last year's offensive line and the Wildcats also welcome back another starter who was injured in last year's opener and this group has a lot of depth that could go seven-to-eight players deep.

The starting O-line unit has been the same for 4 of 5 games this season -- the exception was Game 3 at Ball State, when **Dylan Maciulewicz** was spelled by **Tyler Habersham** at right guard.

Senior **Tolu Olajide** (6-5, 298) has started all 18 games at left tackle since the start of last year. Prior to his 2024 season with the Wildcats,

Olajide earned All-Conference First Team honors in 2023 and Second Team in 2022 while at Stonehill.

Sophomore **Luke Rogers** (6-4, 345) replaced Swaine as the starting LG in the 2024 regular-season finale at Maine, and he played in 10 games overall. Rogers has started all five games at left guard this season.

Junior **Luke Swaine** (6-4, 315) is making the transition to center this season; he was the starting left guard in 12 of 13 games and saw action off the bench in the regular-season finale at Maine.

Senior captain **Dylan Maciulewicz** (6-4, 304) started the last 12 games of the 2024 season at right guard and will be there again this season.

Maciulewicz did not play Sept. 13 at Ball State. Redshirt freshman **Tyler Habersham** stepped into the starting role at right guard and played a majority of the game. He has seen action each of the past four games.

Junior **Beau Riley** (6-7, 332) is the aforementioned Wildcat who was injured in the '24 opener and was sidelined the remainder of the season. Riley is back to the starting lineup and also back to his position at right tackle.

THE D-LINE: On the defensive line, UNH replaces four starters who

combined for 168 career starts, and two of those 'Cats garnered All-America accolades. That gives a number of Wildcats the opportunity to start and make an impact this season.

Senior captain **Zach Garron** (6-3, 232) and redshirt freshman **D.J. Johnson** (6-4, 233) are listed as the starters at defensive end.

In the opener at NCCU, Garron recorded three tackles, including a sack. He made two more stops and had another sack Game 2 vs. Holy Cross. At Ball State, Garron was credited with two tackles and a pass breakup. At Dartmouth, he assisted on a tackle for loss, and had a QB hurry.

Garron has played in all five games this season, with six solo stops and nine total tackles. He has 1.5 tackles for loss, one being a sack. Last year, Garron recorded 17 tackles, including 2.5 for loss, in 13 games.

In Game 1, Johnson finished with four tackles, including one tackle for loss, at NCCU. He recorded a career-high five tackles with four solo stops and a sack Sept. 6 vs. Holy Cross. Johnson tied that career-high five tackles the next week at Ball State. At Dartmouth, Johnson was credited with three stops. He had three solo stops with a sack versus UAlbany.

Johnson has played in all five games this season, with 20 total tackles, 14 being solo stops. Johnson also has three tackles for a loss, two being sacks, and a blocked punt on special teams. The two sacks place him second on the team in that category.

Sophomore **Jordan Mcallister** (6-3, 231) and junior **T.J. Farrell** (6-5, 258) have also seen playing time at defensive end.

In five games this season, Mcallister has 11 total tackles with three tackles for loss, including one sack. He finished with three tackles vs. Holy Cross. He finished last year with 16 tackles in 13 games -- all off the bench. His stats included three tackles for loss, one of which was a sack.

In four games played this season, Farrell has one tackle, Sept. 13 at Ball State.

Grad student and first-year Wildcat **Justice Akinmoladun** (6-0, 290) and junior **Cameron Garner-Young** (6-2, 277) are stepping into starting roles with Akinmoladun listed at nose tackle and Garner-Young at defensive tackle on this week's two-deep.

In his Wildcat debut at NCCU, Akinmoladun was credited with three tackles, including a sack. The following week against Holy Cross, he made two tackles, one being solo, with a nine-yard sack. At Ball State, Akinmoladun had three total tackles, and a tackle for loss which resulted in a safety. He added another sack to his team-leading total in the win versus UAlbany.

Through four games, Akinmoladun has 10 total tackles, five being solo stops. He also has three and a half tackles for loss, two and a half being sacks, which leads the team.

Akinmoladun was a four-year letterwinner at Washburn University (Topeka, Kan.). In 35 games, he recorded 83 tackles with 8.5 tackles for loss and four sacks.

He finished with a single-season high of 30 tackles in 2024 (10 games).

Also of note, Akinmoladun was a four-year letterwinner for the Washburn outdoor track & field Team (2021-24). He was a 2x track & field All-American -- at the NCAA Championships, eighth place in 2024 and ninth place in 2023. He holds the 10 best shot put throws in school history.

Garner-Young has also made an impact on special teams; he blocked a PAT kick Game 2 vs. Holy Cross, and in the season opener at NC Central he blocked a 31-yard field goal attempt that kept the game tied 0-0 in the first quarter. He was credited with two tackles vs. HC, three at NCCU, and three at Dartmouth. Garner-Young has played in all five games with three solo tackles and eight total stops on the season.

Last season, he recorded 19 total tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks, in 12 games (one start)

Senior **Tim Bonagura** (6-1, 290) and junior **Justin Fevrier** (6-4, 346) are the listed backups on this week's two-deep. Bonagura was credited with a pair of pass breakups at NC Central and matched his career high of four tackles, including three solo stops, against Holy Cross; he made two tackles for loss with one sack vs. the Crusaders. At Ball State, Bonagura had two tackles, one of which was behind the line of scrimmage. Bonagura had three tackles at Dartmouth. He had two solo stops vs. UAlbany.

Bonagura has played in all five games, being credited with six solo stops and 11 tackles in total. He has three tackles for loss, including a sack, and places second on the team with two pass break ups.

In 2024, Bonagura was credited with 19 tackles (in 13 games) with 1.0 tackle for loss, 0.5 sack, one pass breakup and a QB hurry.

Fevrier has in three games and has been credited with an assisted stop. In six games a year ago, Fevrier made one tackle.

NEW FACES AT LINEBACKER: UNH lost both starting linebackers -- Ryan Toscano was the team's leading tackler each of the past three years.

Redshirt freshman **Trevor Barry** was impressive in camp and earned a starter's role. He played in one game (vs. Villanova) last season. Barry led the team in each of the first three games with 10 tackles at NC Central, nine vs. Holy Cross, and eight at Ball State. He had six tackles at Dartmouth and four versus UAlbany.

Through five games, Barry leads the team in assisted (18) and total tackles (37). He co-leads the team with 19 solo stops and has half of a tackle for loss.

Redshirt freshman linebacker **Isaiah Jones** is also listed as one of the starting linebackers. He had a career-high seven tackles vs. Holy Cross, with six solo stops. Jones also assisted on a tackle for loss at Dartmouth. Jones has eight solo stops, 14 total tackles, and half a tackle for loss on the season.

Matthew Sopp, another redshirt freshman, has also seen significant playing time this season, and made his first career start Sept. 13 at Ball State, where he had three tackles. Sopp had his first career interception on Dartmouth's opening drive Sept. 20, returning it for 65 yards and setting the 'Cats up to eventually take a 7-0 lead. Sopp has played in all five games on the season, totalling eight tackles, three solo, and that interception.

Grad student **Cole Bullock**, the transfer from Montana State, was expected to make an immediate impact on the defensive side of the ball, but has been limited to one game this season. Bullock played in 14 games in two seasons (2023, 2024) at Montana State; he was a 2024 redshirt with three games played. Bullock was also at College of the Canyons for two seasons and garnered all-conference recognition in 2022.

Bullock finished with two tackles in his first game as a Wildcat at NCCU. He made four stops in the win vs. UAlbany, with half a tackle for loss.

STRENGTH IN SAFETY: Grad student free safety **Brendan Tighe** is the only returning starter on defense. His streak of 14 consecutive starts ended when he missed the NCAA first round game to end the 2024 season. He was a DNP in the opener at NC Central and vs. Holy Cross. He made his season debut at Ball State, where he recorded his first career recovered fumble, as well as his first career touchdown.

Tighe ranked fifth on the team with 55 tackles and led the 'Cats with two interceptions; he also ranked third with five pass breakups and had a forced fumble to his credit.

In 2024, Tighe secured UNH's 21-20 win at Holy Cross with an interception at midfield with 27 seconds remaining. He also finished that game with a season-high eight tackles.

Tighe pulled in his second interception of the season -- and had two pass breakups -- Oct. 19 vs. URI.

Tighe leads all active Wildcats with four interceptions.

Junior transfer **Darren Burton II** has stepped in as the starting strong safety. In his first game as a Wildcat, Burton II recorded three tackles, two of which were behind the line of scrimmage and that included a sack. Burton II had a tackle for loss versus Holy Cross. He had six tackles, and another for a loss at Dartmouth. In that game, he had a career-high 63 kickoff return yards, part of which came on a career-long 27 yard return which set the 'Cats up for a field goal drive, pulling within one-score in the third quarter, 19-13. He made two stops vs. the Great Danes.

Burton II has started all five games this season, with 14 total tackles and eight solo stops. Burton II has also been credited with four tackles for loss, one being a sack. He leads the team with four tackles for loss and ranks second on the team with 106 kickoff return yards.

In two years at Hampton University, he played in 18 games with a breakdown of seven last season and 11 as a true freshman in 2023. His stats included 32 tackles and two interceptions.

Grad student **Duncan Moreland** has started all five games this season at safety. At NC Central, he made six tackles, four being solo. Moreland set career-highs with eight tackles and six solo stops versus the Crusaders. Moreland recorded his first interception of the season Sept. 13 at Ball State, which marked the second of his career. He led the team with eight tackles at Dartmouth.

Moreland co-leads the team with 19 solo tackles, and is second in total tackles. His 11 assisted tackles place him third on the team. He ranks second on the team with 25 total tackles, as well as second with 14 solo stops.

Moreland had a breakout season in 2024. He led the team with three forced fumbles and also finished with 42 tackles, an interception, one fumble recovery and three pass breakups.

Moreland recorded 27 of his 42 tackles the last six games with a season-high eight at nationally-ranked Villanova and six at UAlbany; he forced two fumbles in that Nov. 2 game against the Great Danes.

Junior **Jackson Stone** has also seen playing time at safety, playing in all five games. He had a career-high six total tackles at Ball State; two solo stops and four assisted. Stone had three tackles at Dartmouth. He's totaled 15 tackles with seven solo stops on the season. He has 1.5 tackles for loss, one being a sack.

Stone played in all 13 games last season with 16 tackles, a forced fumble and a pass breakup. He finished with four tackles (3-1-4) and a pass breakup, as well as a forced fumble, at UCF. Stone also had four tackles and forced a fumble against Stonehill.

Redshirt freshman **Cohen Cook** and sophomore **Josh Farquharson** and are also on the 2-deep. Cook saw action in one game last season, while Farquharson played in three games a year ago and was credited with two tackles.

At NC Central, Cook had four tackles, with three being solo. Cook had five total tackles versus Holy Cross and set a personal best of four solo stops. At Ball State, Cook had a career-high six tackles, two solo stops and four assisted. He had six tackles at Dartmouth.

Cook is third on the team with 25 total tackles and second in solo stops (12).

CORNERING: Senior **Zeroun Skinner** and sophomore **Sean Webb** have been the starting cornerbacks every game this season, with redshirt freshman **Malik Diaby** and freshman **Kelby Hampton** also listed on the 2-deep.

Skinner finished with three tackles -- career-high three solo tackles -- in the opener at NC Central. At Dartmouth, he had five solo stops, and eight total tackles. He had five tackles in the UAlbany win.

Skinner has 16 tackles on the season with 12 being solo stops.

In his first year as a Wildcat in '24 (he transferred from Florida Atlantic), Skinner tallied 23 tackles with one pass breakup in 13 games. Skinner made a game-changing play at Elon when his blocked punt set up 1st-and-goal at the Elon 10 and UNH scored a touchdown on

the next play to trim the deficit to 10-7 with 10 seconds left in the first half.

Webb was credited with two tackles -- both solo stops -- and two pass breakups in the opener at NCCU. He had three tackles at Ball State. At Dartmouth, Webb had four tackles and one for loss, both of which tied career-highs. He also broke up two passes in that game.

Webb has made 12 tackles this season with eight solo stops and a tackle for loss. He also leads the team with five pass breakups.

Webb saw action in all 13 games a year ago -- including special teams coverage -- with one start. He was credited with 10 tackles and three pass breakups.

Diaby has played in two games this season, making his first career tackle at Ball State.

Hampton has played in three games, making his first career tackle at Dartmouth and totalling four on the season.

KICKING THE BALL AROUND: UNH has a new kicker, placekicker and punter this season. Former placekicker Nick Mazzie was an All-Conference First Team selection in '24 and punter Sean Lehane was named to the Third Team.

This year, sophomore **Nick Reed** leads the team with 43 points. Reed was honored as both conference and national player of the week by CAA Football and Stats Perform respectively, following the Holy Cross game. In that game he kicked the 40-yard game winning field goal as time expired to lift the Wildcats to a 19-16 victory. He had already made field goals of 33, 30, and 50 yards earlier that day. Reed made a career long 52-yard field goal at Ball State. At Dartmouth, he matched that career long, as well as added a 32-yard make.

Reed has made 11 of 13 field goals and 10 of 11 PATs. He made 50+ yard field goals in back-to-back games at Ball State and Dartmouth. Reed is 1-1 from 40-49 yards and 3 of 4 from 50-59.

Reed made 1 of 3 field goal attempts (22 yards) and made all three PAT kicks in two seasons at the University of Buffalo after joining the team as a walk-on.

Sophomore **Matt Guidebeck** took over the punting duties. He did play all 13 games last year, but that was exclusively as the holder on placekicks; he did not record a punt.

Guidebeck is averaging 41.3 yards on 19 punts, with a long of 59 this season. He has four punts of 50+ yards and has pinned the opposition inside the 20 nine times.

In the win vs. UAlbany, Guidebeck had a career-long of 59 yards. He pinned the Great Danes inside the 20 twice while averaging 47.0 yards across three punts.

Redshirt-freshman **Greg Motorny** is the backup to both Reed and Guidebeck. He did not appear in a game last season.

BACK DEEP FOR THE WILDCATS:

Junior safety **Darren Burton II** is first on UNH's depth chart at kick return and co-leads the team with six kickoff returns this year. He has a long of 27. In two years at Hampton University, he did not return any kickoffs or punts.

Sophomore wide receiver **Logan Perez** also has six kickoff returns, with an average of 22.5 and a long of 33. Perez is listed as the secondary punt returner, and he did have one punt return of 23 yards in 2024.

Senior running back **Myles Thomason** is reprising his role from 2023 as UNH's top punt returner. In the opener at NCCU, Thomason averaged 31.5 yards on two returns with a long of 35. Overall this season, he has six returns with an average of 12.2.

IT'S A SNAP: UNH has two new long snappers on this year's roster. Sophomore **Wyatt Rubinoff** is a first-year Wildcat from Marist College, where he was the Red Foxes' long snapper as a true freshman in '24. Rubinoff has exclusively been the long snapper through five games this season.

CAA PRESEASON POLL: UNH was picked fifth in the 14-team CAA Football predicted order of finish. The University of Rhode Island, Monmouth University, Villanova University and Stony Brook University all placed ahead of the Wildcats in the poll.

REED KICKS WAY TO PAIR OF WEEKLY AWARDS: Sophomore kicker **Nick Reed** received conference and national recognition Sept. 7, when he was named CAA Football Special Teams Player of the Week as well as Stats Perform FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week.

Reed, a first-year Wildcat after spending two seasons at Buffalo, kicked a 40-yard field goal as time expired in the fourth quarter to lift UNH to a 19-16 win against Holy Cross in the home opener at Wildcat Stadium.

Reed had tied the game, 16-16, at 9:13 of the fourth quarter when his career-long 50-yard field goal capped a 6-play, 41-yard drive.

Reed's first point of the game – a PAT kick on UNH's second possession of the game – gave the Wildcats a 7-6 lead.

In the second quarter, he foreshadowed what was to come when he made a 33-yard field goal on the last play of the half to send the Wildcats into the locker room with a 10-9 lead. Reed's 30-yard field goal extended UNH's lead to 13-9 at 2:05 of the third quarter.

In addition to the long of 50 yards, Reed broke single-game highs of four field goals and 13 points.

The previous time UNH won a game with a walk off field goal in regulation was Sept. 21, 2019, when Jason Hughes made a 29-yarder as time expired to lift the Wildcats to a 27-24 win against the University of Rhode Island.

The last time a Wildcat made four field goals in a game was Nov. 9, 2024 at Monmouth (Nick Mazzie).

GRANITE BOWL NOTEBOOK: UNH extended its streak of consecutive games with an interception to four.

In the Sept. 20 Granite Bowl matchup at Dartmouth, sophomore kicker **Nick Reed** made a career-long 52-yard field goal for the second consecutive week; he has made 3 of 4 attempts from 50+ yards this season.

Sophomore QB **Matt Vezza** threw for a career-high 273 yards by completing 22 of 35 passes.

Grad student WR **Chase Wilson** had six receptions for 120 yards, including a 38-yard touchdown that gave New Hampshire a 20-19 lead midway through the fourth quarter. It marked the first time this season a Wildcat eclipsed 100 receiving yards in a game.

Redshirt freshman linebacker **Matthew Sopp** had his first career interception -- with a 65-yard return -- in his first career start.

NOTABLE NUMBERS AT BALL STATE: Sophomore quarterback **Matt Vezza** established career highs in passing yards (259; surpassed one week later at Dartmouth), completions (25) and attempts (44), as well as rushes (16) and rushing yards (78) with a career long of 30 yards.

Grad student safety **Brendan Tighe** recorded his first career fumble recovery and touchdown.

Grad student safety **Duncan Moreland** recorded his first INT of the season and second career.

Sophomore kicker **Nick Reed** kicked a career long field goal of 52 yards at 3:46 of the third quarter to lift the Wildcats within 34-24. He entered the game with a career long of 50 yards established one week earlier vs. Holy Cross.

Redshirt freshman safety **Cohen Cook** finished with career highs of four assisted tackles and six total tackles.

Redshirt freshman defensive end **D.J. Johnson** tied his highs in solo tackles (four) and total tackles (five) in addition to blocking a punt.

Sophomore defensive end **Jordan Mcallister** had a career-high two tackles for loss, including one sack; he also matched his highs in solo tackles (two), assisted (two) and total (four).

In his first career start, redshirt freshman linebacker **Matthew Sopp** was credited with three tackles (2-1-3).

NEW HAMPSHIRE NOTES FROM MUNCIE: UNH's defense limited Ball State to 32 total yards of offense in the fourth quarter and did not allow a point the last 24 minutes of the game.

UNH returned a blocked punt for a TD at Ball State; on the fourth play from scrimmage, **D.J. Johnson** blocked a punt, **Brendan Tighe** picked up the loose ball at the BSU 30 and raced into the end zone. The previous time the Wildcats returned a blocked punt for a touchdown was Sept. 30, 2023, when Charles Briscoe III recovered the ball in the end zone.

After a **Matt Guidebeck** punt pinned the Cardinals at the BSU 5, Grad student defensive end **Justice Akinmoladun** ran down QB Kieal Kelly in the end zone for a safety to lift the 'Cats within 34-24 at 8:07 of the fourth quarter.

The previous time UNH recorded a safety was Sept. 21, 2024 against Bryant University, when the Bulldogs errantly snapped the ball through the end zone.

WILDCATS' CAREER HIGHS vs. HOLY CROSS: A handful of UNH Wildcats recorded personal single-game highs in the 19-16 victory vs. Holy Cross on Sept. 6.

Grad student safety **Duncan Moreland** had a personal-best eight tackles, and the six solo stops were also a personal best.

Redshirt freshman **Isaiah Jones** had a career-high seven tackles. Junior **Raleigh Collins III** finished with personal bests of five assisted tackles and seven total tackles.

Redshirt freshman **Cohen Cook** had a career-high five total tackles. Redshirt freshman **D.J. Johnson** set a career high of five tackles.

Senior **Tim Bonagura** matched his career highs of three solo tackles, four total tackles and two tackles for loss.

Junior wide receiver **Josh Fillion** recorded his first career TD with a personal-long 53-yard catch.

DEFENSE AND SPECIAL TEAMS PUT CLAMPS ON HOLY CROSS: UNH's defense stymied Holy Cross' offense with eight tackles for loss, including five sacks, to limit the Crusaders to 16 points and 251 total yards of offense. The D allowed only one touchdown -- the Crusaders' first TD was on a pick-six.

On special teams, the Wildcats' kickoff coverage quieted explosive returner Alijah Cason, who had a 97-yard TD return in Holy Cross' first game of the season. Cason was limited to 22 yards on two returns with a long of 17.

UNH's special teams also blocked at PAT.

'CATS PLAY COMPLETE GAME IN SEASON OPENER: UNH's offense had a balanced attack with no turnovers, the defense surrendered -- only 10 points with five tackles for loss -- including three sacks -- and a takeaway, and special teams contributed a pair of field goals, blocked a field goal and had two big punt returns in the Wildcats' 27-10 season-opening win at NC Central on Aug. 30.

In his first career start, sophomore quarterback **Matt Vezza** completed 10 of 17 passes for 186 yards and touchdowns to tight ends **Denin Limouris** and **Peyton Strickland**. He also had 11 rushes for 36 yards, including an 8-yard TD.

RICK SANTOS

HEAD COACH



Rick Santos '08 became the 20th head coach of the UNH football program Dec. 7, 2021, and has guided the Wildcats to a 23-14 overall record (.622 win percentage), which includes 17-7 in CAA Football (.708), in three seasons with NCAA playoff appearances in both 2022 and 2024 and a CAA Coach of the Year award (2022). Santos was a record-setting Wildcat quarterback from 2004-07 and is a 2016 UNH Hall of Fame inductee.

Santos returned to New Hampshire a second time in March 2019 as an associate head coach and quarterback coach, and shortly thereafter was named interim head coach for the 2019 season. He led UNH to a 6-5 record, including 5-3 in the CAA, and was instrumental in the development of Max Brosmer, UNH's first true freshman to start in more than four decades, and Dylan Laube, a HERO Sports Freshman Honorable Mention All-American. Following the 2023 season, Brosmer finished as runner-up for the Walter Payton Award (FCS offensive player of the year) and Laube was sixth in the voting.

Including the season as interim head coach, Santos has led UNH to a 29-19 overall record with a 22-10 mark in the CAA.

In the 2024 season, UNH won the last four games of the regular season to tie for third place in the CAA standings and earn an at-large berth into the FCS playoffs. The Wildcats, who peaked at #16 in the national polls, ended the year at 8-5 (6-2 CAA) with senior DE Josiah Silver earning multiple All-America Team awards, as well as Defensive Player of the Year from both the CAA and ECAC.

In 2023, the 'Cats went 6-5 with four losses of six points or less, including two in overtime, and Max Brosmer was named the CAA Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second consecutive year. The following April, Dylan Laube was drafted in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Las Vegas Raiders.

Santos was tabbed CAA Coach of the Year in his first year at the helm, when he led the 2022 Wildcats to a share of the CAA title, a #15 national ranking and second round of the NCAAs. New Hampshire, picked ninth in the preseason CAA poll, finished with nine wins and a 7-1 conference ledger. The eight regular-season wins marked the team's highest total since 2014. Three 'Cats garnered All-American, All-New England Team and All-Conference First Team recognition.

Following his stint as interim head coach for the 2019 season, Santos resumed his role as associate head coach, which included overseeing offensive strategy while simultaneously coaching the QBs, in the 2020 and 2021 seasons. He also spearheaded the Wildcats' recruiting efforts and took the lead on increasing alumni engagement and enhancing fundraising initiatives.

In his first tenure as a Wildcat assistant coach from 2013-15, Santos coached wide receivers. In 2015, he mentored R.J. Harris to the single greatest WR statistical season in program history. Harris tallied a school-record 100 catches and led the nation with 1,551 receiving yards, which tied the program's all-time single-season benchmark. In 2013, Harris and Justin Mello became the first WR duo in school history to both register 1,000 yards in a single season.

Santos, a native of Bellingham, Mass., worked three seasons (2016-18) as the QB coach/passing game coordinator at Columbia University of the Ivy League between his two stretches as an assistant coach and associate head coach at his alma mater.

During his playing career, Santos compiled a 37-14 record and directed the Wildcats to four NCAA Division I-AA/FCS playoff appearances. He guided UNH to its first-ever postseason victory at Georgia Southern (Nov. 27, 2004), was part of the 2005 Atlantic 10 championship team that was ranked No. 1 in the country, and he won two A-10 Northern Division titles (2004, 2006).

Santos passed for 13,212 yards and 123 touchdowns while accumulating 14,615 yards of total offense. The three-time Walter Camp All-American connected with UNH's all-time leading receiver and fellow University Hall of Famer David Ball for 53 touchdowns from 2004-06 to set an FCS record that still stands for most career TD connections for a QB-WR duo. Santos also owns the FCS single-game record for highest percentage of passes completed (96.2 percent) when he went 25 of 26 for 306 yards and five TDs in a 52-21 defeat of Northeastern on Oct. 22, 2005.

In 2006, Santos won the Walter Payton Award as the most outstanding offensive player in FCS football when he threw for 3,125 yards and 29 touchdowns. He was a three-time Atlantic-10/CAA Offensive Player of the Year (2005-07) and four-time All-Conference First Team QB. In 2004, he was named the ECAC Rookie of the Year, Atlantic 10 co-Rookie of the Year, set the FCS record for most yards gained by a freshman in a game (538, at Villanova, Oct. 2, 2004) and freshman TD passes in a season (31).

Santos possesses school career records in pass attempts (1,498), completions (1,024) and passing yards (12,189). He holds the top two and four of the top six single-season records in completions, headlined by 301 in 2005. His '05 season included a school all-time high 3,797 passing yards.

Following his graduation with a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology: Sport Studies with a concentration in sports management, Santos played football professionally for five years. He signed as an undrafted free agent with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2008 before moving north to play in the Canadian Football League from 2009-12.

COACHING STAFF

ED BORDEN*co-Offensive Coordinator / Tight Ends*

The 2025 season is Ed Borden's seventh as an assistant coach for UNH football, second as co-Offensive Coordinator and sixth year as tight ends coach; he also served as the recruiting coordinator from spring 2022 to spring 2025.

In 2023, junior tight end Kyle Lepkowski ranked third on the team in both catches (39) and receiving yards (492). Lepkowski was also one of the Wildcats' top targets in the 2022 season. He ranked second on the team in receiving yards (542) and third in receptions (42) to mark the most receptions by a UNH tight end since 2015 and most receiving yards since 2014.

The 2021 season saw the emergence of Lepkowski, who ranked third on the team in both receptions and receiving yards.

Prior to his current roles, Borden assisted with coaching wide receivers in 2019.

In 2018, Borden worked under head coach Mark Whipple at UMass as an offensive analyst for the Minutemen. He worked primarily with the team's quarterbacks.

A 2009 graduate of Bentley University, Borden also worked under Jim Fassel with the Las Vegas Locomotives of the United Football League.

RYAN WILSON*co-Offensive Coordinator / Offensive Line*

Ryan Wilson enters his second season with UNH football in 2025. He is reprising his role as offensive line coach and was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in spring 2025.

UNH's offensive line was a strong unit in 2024 anchored by CAA All-Conference Third Team center Dylan Poirier.

Wilson was previously at Saint Francis University, where he coached the offensive line for four years. In 2023, he mentored a pair of All-NEC First Team linemen. Wilson's offensive line ranked second in the NEC with 360.1 total yards of offense per game. The unit also paved the way for 168.6 rushing yards per game, which ranked third in the NEC.

In 2022, the Saint Francis offensive line led the NEC with an FCS 11th-ranked 13 sacks allowed. The unit paved the way for an offense that set a program record in total touchdowns (54), passing touchdowns (30) and total points (431). The team produced an NEC best 246.7 passing yards per game and second-ranked 182.2 rushing yards per game behind the line.

Wilson began his coaching career as a graduate assistant offensive line coach at the University at Buffalo. Wilson was a four-year starter for Edinboro University, where was also a two-year captain. He also has coaching stops at Utica College and the University of Rochester.

TOMMY HERION*Quarterbacks*

Tommy Herion enters his first season as quarterbacks coach and third year overall as a UNH football assistant coach. He was the running back coach in the 2023 and 2024 seasons.

Herion joined the staff as a student assistant coach entering the 2021 season but returned to the sidelines as a quarterback. He returned to the staff in 2022.

In 2022 and 2023, running back Dylan Laube led the FCS in all-purpose yardage.

Herion was a four-year quarterback for the Wildcats spanning the 2018-21 seasons. He came to New Hampshire as a transfer from the University of Iowa in January '18.

RYAN VANSCHELVEN*Running Backs*

Ryan VanSchelven joined UNH football as the running backs coach in February 2025.

VanSchelven was in charge of offensive quality control at Harvard University in the 2024 season. His responsibilities included running the scout team, defense, and assisting with the quarterbacks. Harvard ended the season with an 8-2 record and No. 25 national ranking.

VanSchelven is a 2023 graduate of the University of Dayton with a degree in Civil Engineering. As a quarterback for the Flyers, he was awarded the 2022 Lt. Andy Zulli Memorial Trophy, which is a character-based award regarded as the most prestigious in the football program; it acknowledges the player who best exemplifies sportsmanship, leadership and scholarship.

He remained with the Dayton football program for the 2023 season with the responsibility of offensive quality control. VanSchelven ran scout team defense and assisted with QBs.

SEAN COYNE*Wide Receivers*

Sean Coyne returns to his alma mater as the wide receivers coach for the 2025 season.

Coyne was a WR for the Wildcats spanning the 2017-22 seasons. In 36 games, he caught 88 passes for 892 yards and 11 touchdowns. He also rushed the ball 22 times for 108 yards and a pair of TDs to give him a total of 13 touchdowns.

As a senior in the 2022 season, Coyne had 27 catches for 386 yards and four TDs. He pulled in 35 receptions for 324 yards and three scores in 2021.

SCOTT JAMES*Associate Head Coach / Defensive Coordinator*

Scott James was elevated to the positions of associate head coach and defensive coordinator in spring 2025. He was the defensive pass game coordinator and safeties coach in 2024 -- his first year back at UNH.

James returned to Durham in 2024 after six seasons as the defensive coordinator for Holy Cross. During his tenure in Worcester, he led a defense that was #1 in the country in total offense, he coached numerous All-Americans and won four league championships.

Prior to joining the Crusaders, James spent five seasons as the safeties coach at UNH from 2013-17. During that time, he helped the Wildcats to an overall record of 46-22 with five trips to the NCAA playoffs. New Hampshire won the CAA championship in 2014, while advancing to the NCAA semifinals in 2013 and 2014. James also coached a pair of All-CAA selections in Manny Asam (2013) and Pop Lacey (2016).

Previously, James served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Haven from 2009-2012, with the team posting an overall record of 34-10 during that time. In 2012, he helped the Chargers to an undefeated regular season, as they beat all of their Division II opponents for the second-straight year and claimed a third consecutive Northeast-10 Conference championship. James' defense ranked third nationally in total defense (274.4 yards/game), fourth in scoring defense (14.0 points/game) and fourth in rushing defense (81.7 yards/game).

Other coaching stops for James included time at Northeastern (2005-2007 / outside linebackers), Boston College (2003-2004 / defensive graduate assistant), Holy Cross (2002 / defensive line), UAlbany (2001 / defensive tackles) and Norwich (1999-2000 / defensive line).

James is a 1999 graduate of Norwich with a bachelor's degree in sports medicine. He went on to earn master's degrees from UAlbany in 2002 and Boston College in 2005.

NICK DELLA JACONO*Linebackers / Special Teams Coordinator*

Nick Della Jacono enters his second year with UNH football in 2025, which will mark his first year as linebackers coach and as special teams coordinator. He joined the Wildcats as co-special teams coordinator, strikes in July 2024.

Della Jacono previously worked at Holy Cross as defensive line coach for two seasons (2022-23) and was in the role of defensive quality control (2020-21).

In 2023, Della Jacono mentored an All-Patriot League defensive tackle for a Crusaders team that captured their fifth consecutive conference championship.

In 2022, the Holy Cross defense ranked atop the Patriot League in total defense and scoring defense. They went 11-0 during the regular season for the third time in program history and first time since 1991, recorded the most single-season wins (12) in program history and advanced to the NCAA FCS quarterfinals for the first time since 1983.

During the 2021 season, he helped lead the nation's top defense at the FCS level, with Holy Cross allowing just 254.5 yards per game.

In 2020, Della Jacono was selected on behalf of the Chicago Bears to be a participant in the Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship.

JAYSEN THOMPSON*Defensive Line / Recruiting Coordinator*

Jaysen Thompson joined the UNH football program as the defensive line coach in February 2025.

Thompson was previously an assistant defensive line coach at West Virginia University for the 2023 and 2024 seasons. In 2023, WVU capped a 9-4 season with a win in the Duke's Mayo Bowl to finish ranked No. 25 in the final coaches poll, and the team led the Big XII in sacks. The Mountaineers played in the Frisco Bowl in '24.

Thompson was the inside linebackers coach at his alma mater, American International College, in 2022.

Thompson was a three-time All-Conference player and was named to the conference Academic Honor Roll four times at AIC. He ranks second in school history for career tackles and served as a team captain from 2018-21.

Thompson graduated from American International with two degrees: Bachelor of Science in Sports Management in 2020 and a Master of Business Administration in 2021.

He earned a second master's degree in Sport Management from West Virginia.

ISAIAH GILMORE*Cornerbacks*

Isaiah Gilmore joined the UNH football program in the 2024 season as a grad student transfer from Shippensburg University. He made the in-season transition from safety to grad assistant coach and will be the Wildcats' nickels coach in '25.

Gilmore graduated from Shippensburg in 2024 with a Psychology degree. He was a four-year member of the Raiders' football team (including a redshirt season and a season canceled by COVID).

The native of Reading, Pa. was a captain in 2022 and All-Conference honoree in 2023. In 10 games as a senior defensive back, Gilmore recorded 52 tackles (34 solo, 18 assisted), four pass breakups and an interception.

DAN HICKS*Safeties*

Dan Hicks joined the UNH football program as the safeties coach in summer 2025.

Hicks spent the 2024 season at Bryant as the strong safeties coach. Prior to arriving at Bryant, he served as a special teams coach and defensive analyst at UMass and also assisted with the outside linebackers. In his one year at UMass, he helped oversee the #9 passing defense in the country.

Prior to UMass, Hicks served as a defensive analyst at Duke University, where he worked with the defensive backs. In 2021, he assisted in mentoring three cornerbacks who registered 100 tackles, four interceptions and 14 pass breakups.

Hicks spent the 2019 season as the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator at American International College, where he guided one player to 2nd Team All NE-10 honors and another to the NE-10 All-Rookie Team. He also coached the punt/kick returners, and an AIC player earned All-NE10 Honors as a return man.

Before entering the collegiate ranks, Hicks spent the 2018 season as the head football coach at Harrison High School, where he was the youngest head coach in the State of New Jersey. He was a finalist for Gatorade / New York Giants "Coach of the Year" honors.

Hicks is a native of Harrison, N.J., and graduated from Fairleigh Dickson University - Florham in 2013 with a degree in criminology. He was a four-year letterwinner (2009-2012) as an Outside Linebacker/Strong Safety with the Devils.

Hicks concluded the year, leading Harrison to a 5-5 record, the program's most successful season in the previous 30 years.

Hicks graduated from Fairleigh Dickson University - Florham in 2013 with a degree in criminology and was a four-year letterwinner (2009-10-11-12) as an outside linebacker/safety with the Devils.
