## THE GAME

Illinois State has travelled South, North and West in the 2025 FCS Playoffs and will now head East, as the Redbirds (11-4) fly to Philadelphia to take on No. 12 seed Villanova (12-2) in the semifinals at Villanova Stadium. The Redbirds are making their third appearance in the semifinals in school history, and the second under head coach Brock Spack.

## THE SERIES

Illinois State and Villanova will meet for the second time in program history, with the first meeting taking place in 1976 at Villanova. The Redbirds won that contest 19-17, thanks to four field goals including the game winner in the fourth quarter by Joel Pohlod.

## THE COACHES

**Illinois State: Brock Spack (Purdue, 1983)** is in his 17th season as the head coach at Illinois State (122-78). Spack guided the Redbirds to back-to-back shares of the MVFC title in 2014-15 and an appearance in the 2014 FCS National Championship game against North Dakota State. He has led the ISU to seven playoff appearances and two semifinal appearances and became the program's all-time wins leader in 2021.

**Villanova: Mark Ferrante (St. Lawrence, 1982)** is in his ninth season as the head coach at Villanova (69-35) and his 39th year overall with the Wildcats after spending 30 years an assistant coach from 1987-2016. He has been a part of 274 victories and all 16 of the program's FCS playoff appearances during his Villanova tenure. As head coach, Ferrante has led the Wildcats to 43 regular season CAA wins, two league titles and five playoff appearances.

**REQUESTING CREDENTIALS**

**THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT**

- Villanova University is located in Villanova, Pennsylvania, and has an enrollment of 6,700. The Wildcats are members of the Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) and play their home games at Villanova Stadium (12,500).
- The Wildcats (12-2) are the No. 12 seed and earned an at-large bid to the playoff field, after finishing in second place in CAA Football in the regular season. Villanova is making its 17th appearance in the Division I Football Championship since becoming an FCS program in 1985. This is their third straight playoff berth and fifth in the last seven seasons for the Wildcats.
- Last week, Villanova took down No. 4 Tarleton State on the road 26-21 to advance to the semifinals and set up the game with the Redbirds. With the victory, Villanova has won 11 straight games. It marks the fifth season in school history and first since 2014 that the team has won 11 or more games in a season.
- Quarterback Pat McQuaide has been stellar for the Wildcats this season, following a transfer from Nicholls. McQuaide is 224-of-371 through the air this season and has completed 60.3 percent of his passes. He has thrown for 2,924 yards and 24 touchdowns on the season, while only being picked off three times.
- Senior linebacker Shane Hartzell was named one of 30 national finalists for this year's Buck Buchanan Award. The leader of the Villanova defense, Hartzell earned his second straight selection to the CAA First Team on defense and leads the Wildcats with 94 total tackles, 55 solo tackles, 17.5 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks and eight quarterback hurries this season.

**DAN THE MAN**

Fans at Illinois State and in the MVFC have known the name Daniel Sobkowicz, but now the entire country is finding out why he is one of the best wide receivers in FCS football. The senior has caught five touchdown passes in wins over No. 1 North Dakota State (3) and at No. 8 UC Davis (2) and he finished with a game-high 150 yards receiving against the Aggies. Sobkowicz now has 38 career receiving touchdowns which puts him in the top spot on the career list, and he is tied with Tyrone Walker for the school record with 250 career receptions. In addition, Sobkowicz sits in second place on the career receiving yards list (3,410) and continues to chase Walker for first place (3,565). With his performance last week, Sobkowicz is just eight yards away from his second-straight 1,000 yard receiving season.

**ROAD WARRIORS**

Over the past two seasons, Illinois State has been very comfortable going on the road picking up key victories away from home. In the past two years, ISU is 14-3 on the road with two of those losses coming to FBS foes in Iowa (2024) and Oklahoma (2025). Last season, the Redbirds won six-straight FCS road games before suffering a second-round playoff loss to UC Davis and this year, the Redbirds are 8-0 on the road against FCS foes after their 42-31 quarterfinal win at UC Davis. In fact, only Oregon (10-0), Montana State (9-1) and North Dakota State (9-1) have a better record than the Redbirds (9-1) over their last 10 FBS/FCS road games overall.

**BIRDS IN THE POSTSEASON**

The Redbirds are making their tenth appearance in the FCS playoffs and seventh under the leadership of head coach Brock Spack. ISU is 14-9 all-time in playoff games and are making a second-straight appearance in the playoffs. Last season, the Redbirds picked up a first-round playoff win at Southeast Missouri State, before falling in the second round on the road to No. 5 seed UC Davis. Overall, the Redbirds are 11-6 in the playoffs under Spack and are 9-4 in road contests, with semifinal appearances in 2014 and 2025.

**VIC TAKES OVER**

With two 100-plus yard rushing efforts already under his belt and a near one in the win at South Dakota State, Victor Dawson has proven he's ready for the spotlight. He shined bright in that light against the Bison, rushing for a season-best 137 yards including a 69-yard touchdown dash to help lead the Redbirds to a stunning upset over the defending national champions. He followed that up with a career-high 148 yards on 29 carries in the quarterfinal win at UC Davis.

**THE BROCK SPACK FILE**

When **Brock Spack** was named the 20th head coach in Illinois State football history prior to the 2009 season, it also signaled the beginning of an entirely new belief system for Illinois State. Since that time, the Redbirds have posted 14 seasons with .500 or better campaigns, including a 13-2 record in 2014 on way to the FCS National Championship game. Spack guided the Redbirds to three-straight playoff appearances from 2014-16 and has led the Redbirds to seven playoff appearances overall. With his win at Missouri State on Nov. 4, 2023, Spack recorded his 100th at Illinois State making him just the fourth coach in MVFC history with 100 or more wins at a league school.

**TAYLOR TO THE HOUSE**

After UC Davis scored on a field goal on its first possession of the quarterfinal game, the Redbirds had an immediate answer in the form of hometown product Chris Taylor. The former Normal Community High School standout took the opening kickoff at the ISU 9 yard line and weaved his way up the sideline for a 91-yard touchdown return to give the Redbirds the lead right back. It was the first touchdown return of his career, and the first for the Redbirds since Jalen Carr's in 2022 against Valparaiso. It was also the first touchdown return in playoff history for the Redbirds.

**TOMMY BY THE NUMBERS**

It's safe to say that senior quarterback Tommy Rittenhouse is saving some of his best football for the end of his career at ISU. This season, Rittenhouse has thrown for 3,006 yards and has completed 65.5 percent of his passes, while throwing for 34 touchdowns and running for seven. His 34 passing TDs set a new single-season record, and he became just the fourth quarterback in school history to throw for over 3,000 yards in a season, joining Matt Brown, Tre Roberson and Kevin Glenn. He has also jumped up the career passing lists at ISU, with his 6,555 career passing yards ranking him fourth all-time and his 54 career passing TDs also putting him in fourth.

**THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE**

Following another stellar season at middle linebacker, Tye Niekamp was named as one of 30 finalists for the 2025 Buck Buchanan Award, which is presented to the national defensive player of the year in Division I FCS college football by Stats Perform. Niekamp is ISU's eighth finalist for the award, including 2022 Buck Buchanan Award winner Zeke Vandenburg. In addition to his national honors, Niekamp was also named the 2025 MVFC Defensive Player of the Year, after he ranked third in the MVFC in tackles with 126 (63 solo) and second in the league in tackles-for-loss with 12.0 during the regular season. Niekamp becomes the first Redbird named the MVFC Defensive Player of the Year since 2022, when Zeke Vandenburg won the honor on way to being named the Buck Buchanan Award recipient.

**TRUE GRIT**

Tommy Rittenhouse's performance against North Dakota State was something straight out of a Hollywood movie. The senior struggled at times during the game, throwing a career high five interceptions against the vaunted Bison defense. However, he never backed down and battle back to throw two touchdown passes in the final three minutes of the contest and found Scotty Presson Jr. for a 2-point conversion to win the game for the Redbirds.

**RACKING UP INTERCEPTIONS**

The Redbird defense has certainly been advantageous in each of its FCS playoff first round games the past two seasons. Last year in the first round win at Southeast Missouri State, the Redbirds recorded a playoff record five interceptions in the contest. They then followed that up this season with four interceptions in their first round playoff win at Southeastern Louisiana to earn a victory and move the total to nine in the past two first round contests. In total, the Redbirds now have 18 interceptions as a team in 2025, just five short of the team record of 22 set in 1984. ISU also ranks No. 6 in the FCS in total turnovers gained with 25.

**HONORS GALORE FOR THE REDBIRDS**

Illinois State standouts Tye Niekamp and Luke Mailander headlined a list of 12 Redbirds selected as 2025 All-Missouri Valley Football Conference selections in the annual vote conducted by the league's head coaches, media members and sports information directors. Niekamp was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year, while Mailander was named the MVFC Freshman of the Year in the annual vote. Wide receiver Daniel Sobkowicz, offensive lineman Jake Pope and defensive back Shadwel Nkuba II earned First-Team All-MVFC honors alongside Niekamp, while running back Wenkers Wright, fullback Scotty Presson Jr., offensive lineman Landon Woodard, safety La'Shavion Brown and longsnapper Dylan Calabrese each earned Second-Team All-MVFC honors. Quarterback Tommy Rittenhouse, tight end Javon Charles and defensive tackle Jake Anderson were also honored as All-MVFC Honorable Mention selections to round out the list.

## NOVEMBERS TO REMEMBER

The month of November has been very good to the Redbirds over the past two seasons. Last year, the Redbirds were 5-0 in the month of November, including a 35-27 road playoff win at Southeast Missouri State, and this year the Redbirds were 4-1 in November after the first round playoff win over Southeastern Louisiana.

## THE WRIGHT STUFF

Senior running back Wenkers Wright hit a big milestone in the win at South Dakota, as he passed 2,500 career rushing yards against the Coyotes. Wright now has 2,603 yards in his stellar career making him just the eighth player in school history to rush for 2,500 yards or more. He currently ranks sixth on the all-time rushing yards list, just ahead of Pierre Rembert (2,544) on the list. He is also just one rushing touchdown away from tying Tre Roberson (22) for eighth on the career rushing TDs list and three from tying Bruce Cullen and Ron Bell (24) for sixth place.

## BAUER COMES UP BIG

Linebacker Patrick Bauer had quite the day against South Dakota State, and it started early on SDSU's first offensive series of the day. On second down, Bauer recorded a tackle for loss to put the Jacks behind the sticks at their own 14 yard line. Then on third down, Bauer jumped the route on a pass to the flat, intercepted it and returned it five yards for the pick six. Then, on the Jacks' final possession of the game, Bauer recorded a 10-yard TFL to ice the game and allow the Redbirds to take a knee for the victory. On the year, Bauer ranks second on the team with 3.0 sacks and 7.5 TFLs to go along with 44 total tackles and two INTs.

## THOSE NIEKAMP BOYS ARE TROUBLE

One quick look at the defensive stat sheet from Illinois State's big 35-21 road win at South Dakota and a familiar name is featured heavily: Niekamp. Not only was dad Travis Niekamp calling the plays, but his two sons Tye and Dexter were all over the field making plays against the Jackrabbits. Tye led the way with a career-best 16 tackles and added a forced fumble to earn his third MVFC Defensive Player of the Week honor. Dexter also recorded a career high in tackles with five, but also recorded a career-best two sacks and hauled in his first career interception deep in coverage. They were a big part of the defensive effort that held the Jacks to just 66 yards on the ground and the group that added five sacks and 10 TFLs in the victory.

## 28 IS GREAT

In wins over Indiana State and South Dakota, Illinois State scored 28 points in a quarter in each contest. The Redbirds scored 28 points in the second quarter on way to a big win at Indiana State and followed that up with a 28-point first quarter outburst in a 35-21 win over South Dakota State. ISU is one of just three teams in the country (FBS & FCS) to achieve that feat this season, joining Florida State and Washington.

## OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

The Redbird offense seems to be firing on all cylinders at the moment and the group is coming off its best offensive output in early a decade after defeating Indiana State, 52-20. The 52 points for the Redbirds were their most since scoring 67 in the 2015 home opener against Morgan State and their most in a conference game since scoring 55 against Indiana State in 2013. ISU racked up a season-high 555 yards of total offense, marking its third game of the year with 500 yards or more, and scored 40 or more points for the fourth time this year.

## SCOTTY FINDS THE END ZONE

Whenever the Redbirds have needed a big catch this season, especially on third down, fullback Scotty Presson Jr. has been the go-to guy. At South Dakota, he caught the first two touchdown passes of his career to help the Redbirds to a win. Then, in the second-round playoff win over North Dakota State, Presson had a huge first-down catch and then caught the winning 2-point conversion with 1:00 to play to give the Redbirds the upset win.

BOONE, N.C. - Shelby Harris' blocked extra-point attempt in overtime sealed No. 15 Illinois State's (9-3) thrilling 38-37 overtime victory over No. 6 Appalachian State (8-4) in second-round action of the FCS playoffs.

Tied 31-31 after regulation, ISU received the ball first and needed only one play to find the end zone in overtime. Quarterback Matt Brown connected with tight end James O'Shaughnessy on a 25-yard completion for the score. The Mountaineers also struck quickly, needing just four plays to answer the Redbird score. Jamal Jackson's four-yard toss to Andrew Peacock made it a one-point game, but Harris blocked Sam Martin's extra point, sealing the 38-37 overtime win.

Brown finished the game 20-for-32 for 322 yards and tied a career-high with five touchdowns passes. Senior wideout Tyrone Walker led the receivers with 10 catches for a season-best 176 yards and two touchdowns. O'Shaughnessy set career-highs with receptions (3), yards (47) and touchdown receptions (2).

Leading 14-10 at halftime, ISU went to the air to get on the board first in the second half. Brown connected with Donovan Harden on a 17-yard touchdown completion, making it 21-10 ISU with 7:33 to go in the third quarter.

The Mountaineers needed just five plays to respond. After missing on his first pass attempt, Jackson connected on his next four, including a 48-yard score to Malachi Jones. The Redbirds responded immediately, as Brown found Walker for a diving 32-yard touchdown catch in the end zone to give Illinois State a 28-17 lead.

After both teams exchanged punts, the Mountaineers had possession on the ISU 46-yard line. Jackson completed each of his pass attempts, including a 44-yard toss to Simms McElfresh that spotted the ball on the Redbirds one yard line. Two plays later, Rod Chisholm dove into the end zone for a one yard score, making it 28-24.

On the ensuing drive, Brown took to the ground and picked up 20 yards on the opening snap. Two plays later, Harden caught a 30-yard toss deep into Appalachian State territory, setting up a 41-yard field goal from Aussieker, making it 31-23.

Illinois State scored first on an eight-play, 83-yard drive that featured three third-and-long completions from Brown to Walker. Facing third-and-six Brown fired to Walker, who dodged two defenders for a 41-yard touchdown play, making it 7-0.

The Mountaineers would tie the game on a 10-play, 69-yard drive that covered 3:46. Jackson threw for 31 yards over two plays, before diving into the end zone on a two-yard keeper to tie the game at 7-7 with 4:15 to go in the opening half.

After forcing a quick three-and-out, Appalachian State threatened and moved the ball into Illinois State territory. Facing fourth-and-one, Evan Frierson tallied the first sack of the game, giving ISU the ball back. Three plays later, Brown found O'Shaughnessy for a nine-yard score, making it 14-7 with 0:44 seconds to go. ASU netted a 37-yard field goal as time expired to make it 14-10 ISU at the break.

**Redbirds End Season With Loss at Eastern Washington**

CHENEY, Wash. - No. 15 Illinois State (9-4) tallied 520 yards of total offense, but could not erase a 21-point second half deficit, failing to second-seed Eastern Washington (11-2), 51-35, in the FCS quarterfinals in front of a sellout crowd at Roos Field in Cheney, Wash.

Trailing 38-17 with 11:01 to go in the third quarter, the Redbirds rallied for 18 points to cut the deficit to three at 38-35, but Kyle Padron's 76-yard touchdown pass to All-American receiver Brandon Kaufman stifled ISU's second-half rally and sealed the win for the Eagles.

Senior Matt Brown threw for 372 yards on 27-of-48 passing, with two touchdowns and two interceptions, while leading an Illinois State offense that tallied 520 yards of total offense. Tyrone Walker added nine catches for 148 yards with one touchdown and Lechein Neblett had six catches for 101 yards with one score.

Eastern Washington led 24-17 at halftime and added two quick third-quarter scores, as Padron connected with Kaufman on 47 and 17-yard touchdown passes to open the half.

With the Eagles leading 38-17, Clarke forced a Padron fumble, setting up a Nick Aussieker 26-yard field goal to make it 38-20 Eastern Washington. The Redbirds then rallied around a pair of three-and-outs, with Brown finding Neblett for a 22-yard touchdown and then rushing for a 13-yard score to make it 38-35 Eastern Washington with 13:55 to play. Padron then went to the air for the 76 yard touchdown pass to Kaufman to make it 44-35. The Eagles added a 10-yard touchdown pass to Ashton Clark to cap the scoring at 51-35.

Both teams exchanged scores in a fast-paced opening half, that saw points scored on the first six possessions of the game. Aussieker's 23-yard field goal gave ISU an early 3-0 lead, but Padron responded with a 44-yard touchdown pass to Daniel Johnson to give the Eagles a 7-3 advantage. Brown then completed a 40-yard strike to Walker for a 10-7 ISU advantage, before Jimmy Pavel's 20-yard field goal with 2:57 to play in the first quarter squared the game at 10-10.

Josh Burch's 72-yard kickoff return gave ISU field position deep in EWU territory. On third-and-goal from the three, Dunn carried the ball into the end zone for his 13th touchdown of the year, giving ISU at 17-10 lead with 14:29 to play in the opening half. Eastern Washington responded with a four-play, 21-yard drive capped by a Demetrius Bronson one-yard touchdown run to even the game at 17-17 in the second quarter.

The Eagles took advantage of a costly Illinois State turnover to score a touchdown in the closing seconds of the opening half. On third-and-long, Brown completed a pass to James O'Shaughnessy, who carried the ball into the Eastern Washington red zone, before fumbling the ball to the Eagles. Padron facilitated a 12-play, 79-yard drive, capped by a one yard pass to Zack Gehring to give the Eagles a 24-17 lead.

**ISU Avenges Lone Loss, Defeats UNI In Playoffs, 41-21**

NORMAL, Ill. - In a dominating performance, Illinois State quarterback Tre Roberson threw for 382 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Redbirds to a second-round playoff victory against Northern Iowa, 41-21, Saturday afternoon at Hancock Stadium.

After losing to the Panthers on Nov. 1 at the UNI Dome, ISU got its revenge on the only team to defeat them this season. The Redbirds exploded out of the gate with a lightning-quick, 73-yard opening touchdown drive that ended with a 6-yard inside slant pass from Roberson to senior wide receiver Cameron Meredith.

On ISU's second drive, a 28-yard back shoulder throw to freshman wide receiver Jon-Marc Anderson set up a 1-yard plunge from junior running back Marshaun Coprich for his 22nd touchdown of the year to put the Redbirds ahead, 14-0.

Coprich, the Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Year, reached the 100-yard plateau for a school-record 12th-consecutive time. With his 148-yard game, he also earned the ISU single-season rushing yard record, passing Pierre Rembert's previous record of 1,743 yards (2006).

The Redbirds scored again on their third drive of the game, after a Roberson quarterback draw set the offense up at the 5-yard line. Roberson tossed another inside slant pass to Meredith from two yards out to complete a 15-play, 87-yard drive that took nearly eight minutes off the clock. Meredith's second touchdown of the game gave him eight receiving touchdowns on the season, and the senior also surpassed the 100-yard mark for the fourth-straight game.

Senior placekicker Nick Aussieker's would-be career long field goal attempt of 51 yards was partially blocked by Xavier Williams midway through the second quarter. The Redbirds drove the field in the last minute of the first half to set up another Aussieker attempt, which he converted from 45 yards out as time expired, and ISU took a 24-0 lead into halftime.

The Panthers started Sawyer Kollmorgen at quarterback in the second half, and he drove UNI down the field for a touchdown on its first drive of the third quarter. A 39-yard Aussieker field goal and a 26-yard touchdown pass from Roberson to senior tight end James O'Shaughnessy extended the Redbird lead, 34-7. However, the Panthers would not go down without a fight, as they wasted no time on an 84-yard drive that took less than three minutes off the clock and ended in a Johnson rushing touchdown. The Panthers recovered an ISU fumble on the ensuing kickoff, and punched in a touchdown three plays later to cut the lead, 34-21.

The Panthers were unable to capitalize on its final two drives stalled out on a failed fourth down conversion, and an interception by junior defensive end Teddy Corwin. O'Shaughnessy hauled in a 36-yard pass for his second receiving touchdown of the game to conclude the scoring and put him over 100 yards on the day.

## Coprigh, Redbirds Defeat EWU In FCS Quarterfinals

CHENEY, Wash. – Marshaun Coprich rushed for a career-high 258 yards and Illinois State piled up 542 yards of total offense en route to a 59-46 victory over Eastern Washington in the FCS quarterfinals.

Following a stop on Eastern Washington's first drive of the game, the Redbirds answered with a 12-play, 66-yard scoring drive that was capped off by a 31-yard field goal off the foot of Nick Aussieker. On the ensuing drive, David Perkins forced a fumble on a reception by Kendrick Boyrue and Mike Banks recovered at the ISU 45-yard line. Coprich took over on the next drive, rushing for 36 of the team's 55 yards during the five-play scoring drive, which he ended with a seven-yard touchdown.

The Eagles answered the Redbird touchdown with one of their own, as Quincy Forte scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to cut the ISU lead to 10-7. The Redbirds battled right back, and put together an eight-play, 55-yard drive to extend the lead back to 10 points. Fullback Brady Tibbitts took his first career carry and pounced it across the goal line from three yards out to give the Redbirds a 17-7 advantage.

A 37-yard field goal from Tyler McNannay on the next drive cut the ISU lead to a touchdown at 17-10, but once again the Redbirds answered with an eight-play, 66-yard scoring drive as Tre Roberson capped off the drive with a seven-yard touchdown pass to Cameron Meredith. Meredith made a fantastic, one-handed grab that put the Redbirds up 24-10 with 6:35 left to play in the half. EWU would fight back again and cut the lead back to seven points at 24-17, after a Jabari Wilson one-yard touchdown run capped off an 11-play scoring drive at the end of the second quarter.

The Redbirds wasted little time put points on the scoreboard in the third quarter, as they drove 175 yards down the field in just under four minutes to extend the lead to 31-17. Big grabs from James O'Shaughnessy set up a 21-yard touchdown run for Coprich, who moved over 100 yards rushing for the 13th-straight time. Eastern came back and settled for a 36-yard field goal from McNannay and cut the lead to 31-20 with 5:01 left in the third quarter, after Pat Meehan sacked Adams on third down.

ISU answered again, as Coprich scored his third touchdown of the game on a 2-yard run to extend the lead to 38-20. On the ensuing drive, Alex Donnelly picked off a Vernon Adams pass attempt and returned it to the EWU 23-yard line and six plays later, Roberson ran it in from five yards out to widen the lead to 45-20.

A two-yard touchdown run by Adams early in the fourth quarter narrowed the ISU lead to 45-27, but a failed outside kick attempt by the Eagles was recovered by Collin Keoshian to give the Redbirds great field position. Four plays later, Roberson connected with Lechein Neblett on a 31-yard scoring strike to increase the lead to 52-27 with 10:30 left in the game.

EWU did not go away, as Adams connected with Cooper Kupp on a 30-yard touchdown pass and after a missed PAT try, the Redbirds lead was cut to 52-33 with 8:57 left in the game. After recovering an onside kick, Adams found Kupp again for a 35-yard touchdown to cut the ISU lead to 52-39 with 8:21 left in the game. The Eagles kicked it long on the next kickoff and Tevin Allen fair caught the ball at the 25-yard line. Two plays later, Coprich broke loose for a 74-yard touchdown run, his fourth of the game, to extend the ISU lead to 59-39. On the next drive, Mike Banks intercepted Adams, but with 1:40 to play, Adams connected with Shaq Hill for a 47-yard touchdown. That would be the final score of the game.

## Redbirds Punch Ticket To National Championship

Durham, N.H. – A 47-yard touchdown run by Illinois State quarterback Tre Roberson in the fourth quarter lifted the Redbirds (13-1) to a 21-18 win over top-seeded New Hampshire (12-2) in front of a raucous crowd at Cowell Stadium in the semifinals of the 2014 FCS Playoffs and secured ISU a spot in the national championship game.

Roberson led the comeback in the fourth quarter and finished the game 18-for-31 with 278 yards passing, including a career-long 77-yard connection to Lechein Neblett. He also added 95 yards on 12 carries, including the game winner. Running back Marshaun Coprich did not break the 100-yard barrier for the first time this season, but finished with 79 yards and the game's only other touchdown. Teddy Corwin led the way for the defense with a career-best 12 tackles and Collin Keoshian added six stops, a sack, a tackle-for-loss and an interception.

After each team punted on their first possession of the game, the Redbirds scored the first points of the day on a 33-yard field goal by Nick Aussieker mid-way through the first quarter. The Wildcats answered the score with a touchdown on their ensuing drive, as quarterback Sean Goldrich carried it in from four yards out to put UNH ahead 7-3 with 3:35 left in the first quarter.

The Redbirds attempted to answer on their last drive of the quarter and drove all the way inside the UNH 10 yard line. Roberson carried the ball eight yards to the one yard line and attempted to stretch over the goal line, but was hit and fumbled giving the ball back to the Wildcats and swinging the momentum. UNH took advantage of the turnover and put together a nine-play, 96-yard scoring drive that was capped off by a six-yard touchdown run by Nico Steriti and a two-point conversion on a run by Andy Vailas to extend the lead to 15-3 with 12:34 left in the second quarter.

ISU would add another field goal, this time a 23-yarder, with 1:45 left before halftime after a career-long 77-yard pass from Roberson to Neblett set the Redbirds up inside the UNH five yard line. However, three-straight runs by Coprich were stuffed and the Redbirds settled for the field goal to cut the UNH lead to 15-6.

UNH took the opening kickoff of the third quarter and put together a 13-play, 73-yard drive that took 4:12 off the clock to extend its lead to 18-6, after a 25-yard field goal from Brad Prasky. The rest of the third quarter was quiet for both teams, until the Redbirds took over on their final drive of the quarter. Roberson led a methodical, 10-play, 84-yard drive that was capped off on a two-yard touchdown run by Coprich that cut the UNH lead to 18-13 early in the fourth quarter.

After the defense forced another UNH punt, its third in a row, the Redbirds got the ball back on their own 11 yard line. The Redbirds marched down the field to the 47 yard line, when Roberson called his own number and took a quarterback draw 47 yards for the go-ahead touchdown. Following a quick time out, Roberson pitched the ball to Jon-Marc Anderson who dove into the end zone for the two-point conversion to put ISU in the lead at 21-18 with 7:51 left in the game.

UNH got the ball back and attempted to tie or gain the lead, but a stop of fourth down gave the Redbirds the ball back at their own 46 yard line. From there, the Redbirds picked up two first downs and took a knee to run the clock.

## ISU Avenges Lone Loss, Defeats UNI In Playoffs, 41-21

FRISCO, Texas – Illinois State's bid for its first national championship came down to the final minute, but North Dakota State ran its streak of consecutive national championships to four with a 29-27 win at Toyota Stadium.

Tre Roberson's 58-yard touchdown run with 1:38 left in the game gave the Redbirds a late lead before NDSU (15-1) quarterback Carson Wentz scored from five yards out with 37 seconds left to reclaim the lead. Roberson's pass to Joe Farmer with eight seconds left in the game was intercepted, ending the ISU comeback hopes.

The Redbirds (13-2) were led Saturday by Roberson, who completed 11-of-23 passes for 157 yards and three touchdowns. He ran for a game-high 161 yards and another score. James O'Shaughnessy caught two of Roberson's touchdown passes, while Jon-Marc Anderson hauled in the other.

The Redbird defense stopped NDSU on its first offensive drive of the game as Alex Donnelly forced a Bison fumble as they entered the red zone. The Redbirds drove to midfield before ISU punter CJ Laros pinned the Bison inside their own 5-yard-line. North Dakota State was forced to punt four plays later and the Redbirds took advantage, capping a five-play, 38-yard drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Roberson to Anderson with 5:28 remaining in the first quarter.

NDSU answered with a 41-yard field goal from Adam Keller with just over a minute remaining in the quarter, cutting the Redbirds' lead to 7-3. The Bison took the lead on their next offensive possession, as Wentz found Luke Albers on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 8:43 left in the second quarter. Illinois State trailed 10-7 at halftime.

The Bison opened the second half with a key special teams play as they recovered the second-half kickoff at the Illinois State 19-yard-line. A third-down sack by Bradon Prate forced a field goal attempt and NDSU's Keller was good from 41 yards out, giving the Bison a 13-7 lead. After a Redbird three-and-out, the Bison put together an eight-play, 76-yard drive that was topped off by a 7-yard touchdown run by John Crockett with 7:28 left in the third quarter, boosting the Bison lead to 20-7.

The Redbirds got back into the game with a 41-yard pass from Roberson to O'Shaughnessy with 2:11 remaining in the third quarter, cutting the NDSU lead to 20-13 after a Nick Aussieker extra point. The Bison made it a two-possession game again with a 24-yard field goal by Keller with 11:20 left in the game. Roberson and O'Shaughnessy hooked up again just moments later, though, on a 3-yard touchdown pass with 8:05 left, cutting the NDSU lead to 23-21.

NDSU followed with a drive that chewed up nearly six minutes of clock, and included a key fourth-and-one conversion, but a third-down sack by Collin Keoshian forced a Bison punt and the Redbirds took over at their own 20-yard-line with 2:22 left.

Roberson's career-long 58-yard touchdown run with 1:38 remaining gave the Redbirds their first lead since early in the second quarter. The Redbirds had 37 seconds left after Wentz's go-ahead touchdown, but Roberson's pass from his own 44-yard-line was intercepted by NDSU's Esley Thorton.

#### Redbirds Advance With 36-19 Win Over Western Illinois

**NORMAL, Ill.** – After falling behind early in the third quarter, the Illinois State football team bounced back for a 36-19 win over Western Illinois in the second round of the FCS Playoffs on Saturday afternoon at Hancock Stadium.

The Redbirds (10-2) used 217 yards rushing from FCS Offensive Player of the Year finalist and Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Year Marshaun Coprich to edge out the Leathernecks (7-6). It was the senior's third straight 200-yard game and his sixth career 200-plus yard performance. Quarterback Tre Roberson also contributed a solid game on the ground with 111 yards and two scores. The pair helped the Birds outlast a solid performance from WIU quarterback Sean Maguire, who finished with 341 yards passing with two touchdowns.

ISU started off hot with a first quarter touchdown run by Coprich, but a pair of turnovers allowed WIU to keep pace as the Redbirds went into the locker room at halftime with a 7-6 lead following a pair of field goals by the Leathernecks' Luke Otto.

The Leathernecks came out firing in the second half with a 91-yard drive on their first possession of the half to take a 12-7 lead following the blocked extra point attempt. However, the Birds answered immediately with a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped off by a five-yard rushing score from Roberson. The signal-caller then found Anthony Warrum in the end zone on the ensuing two-point conversion to make the score 15-12 in favor of the Redbirds.

Warrum finished with 107 yards and a touchdown on six catches. The touchdown was the 14th on the year for Warrum, who now holds the ISU single season touchdown catches record after breaking a tie at 13 with Rickey Garrett (1998).

The touchdown drive ended up being a springboard for the Redbirds, as they marched the field on their next possession and Roberson outspurred several defenders up the right sideline for a 22-12 lead. The team was able to match a WIU touchdown to make it 22-19 on the next drive with a 21-yard strike from Roberson to Warrum. Coprich then sealed the game with a 72-yard rushing touchdown with under five minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

#### Redbirds Season Comes To An End With Loss To Richmond

**NORMAL, Ill.** – A frantic comeback in the final minutes fell short, as the Redbirds (10-3) fell by a score of 39-27 to Richmond (10-3) to see their season come to an end in the FCS Quarterfinals.

After going down 32-14 with 10 minutes left in the fourth quarter, the Redbirds converted back-to-back touchdown drives to pull within five points at 32-27. ISU quarterback Tre Roberson connected with running back Marshaun Coprich for a 12-yard score. Then, after Roberson went down after taking a wicked hit and had to sit out one play, backup quarterback Jake Kolbe scrambled for a 17-yard score on his first, and only, offensive snap of the game.

Richmond then sealed the win with a 28-yard rushing touchdown from running back Jacobi Green that clinched the game and sent the program to the FCS Semifinals against the winner of North Dakota State and Northern Iowa. Richmond quarterback Kyle Lauletta was tremendous, completing 18-of-30 attempts for 369 yards and touchdown.

ISU was led by the passing attack of Roberson, who was solid and accurate throughout most of the night on his way to a 25-of-42 finish for 370 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. His main target, Anthony Warrum, finished with nine catches for 152 yards and one score, while Christian Gibbs hauled in a career-best eight catches for a career-high 96 yards.

The Spiders got off to a hot start, taking the ball 73 yards down the field on their opening drive, but the Redbird defense held them to a field goal. After a quick three-and-out by ISU, the Spiders capped off another long drive with a Broadus rushing score from 13 yards out for a 10-0 lead heading into the second quarter.

Roberson led the ISU offense on a bounce-back touchdown drive, connecting with Warrum from 20 yards on a corner route toward the back of the end zone. The Spiders were then held to another Yoder field goal, this time from 24 yards out, for a 13-7 lead. It looked like that would be the score heading into the break, but a lightning-quick 87-yard drive in under two minutes capped off by a two-yard touchdown run from Jacobi Green gave the Spiders a 19-7 lead at halftime.

ISU struck first in the second half with a five-yard touchdown run by Coprich, set up by a 26-yard catch from Warrum and a 23-yard grab by Gibbs. The Spiders quickly answered, though, when Lauletta hit Green on a wide open screen pass in which the running back sprinted 35 yards for a score and a 25-14 lead. Green would later add an insurance touchdown with a 27-yard score in the fourth quarter for the 32-14 lead.

#### UCA's Fourth Quarter Comeback Eliminates ISU

**CONWAY, Ark.** – Despite Illinois State (6-6, 4-4 MVFC) tallying 17 first-half points and limiting Central Arkansas (10-2, 8-1 SLC) to just seven points, the Bears scored 24 fourth-quarter points to come back and defeat the Redbirds 31-24 at Estes Stadium Saturday afternoon in the first round of the 2016 FCS Playoffs.

Anthony Warrum's two touchdowns helped him become the only ISU receiver in school history to post 10 or more touchdowns in back-to-back seasons and the first player to record multiple seasons with 1,000 yards receiving.

The ISU defense dominated the first-half, limiting the Bears to just six rushing yards and not allowing a first down in the first quarter.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Bears began their comeback as they blocked a momentum-changing punt at the start of the fourth quarter that was picked up by Jakari Dillard on ISU's four-yard line, and he ran it in for the touchdown to bring the Bears within a field goal of the Redbirds, 17-14. The Bears followed that up with another score around the 10-minute mark to take the lead for the first time, 21-17. Following the score, the Bears shook things up opting for the onside kick that was recovered by UCA at ISU's 36-yard line. Despite a big stop by the Redbird defense inside the red zone, UCA was still able to kick a 28-yard field goal to widen its lead to a touchdown, 24-17.

In a mere one minute 38 seconds, the Birds fought back on a four-play, 81-yard scoring drive that was highlighted by a 55-yard touchdown reception from Jake Kolbe to Warrum to tie the game at 24-24. With a minute and a half remaining, the Bears answered back, returning Reece Attard's punt 39 yards to ISU's four-yard line, before Antwon Wells ran the ball into the end zone for a touchdown to break the tie and climb ahead 31-24.
