NOTES

- The Wildcats will host LIU in a three-game series in their final series before BIG EAST season.
- Villanova is 7-4 all-time against the Sharks. The teams last played in a three-game series in 2019, which LIU swept.
- The Wildcats have scored 10 runs and hit at least two home runs in three straight games. They have 35 hits and 32 runs over that stretch.
- Villanova has tallied at least 10 runs in 10 of 23 games.
- The 'Cats are 11-1 when they score seven or more runs this season.
- Infielder Michael Whooley has a hit in 12 of his last 13 games. He went 2-for-2 with a double and a triple in Tuesday's win over Delaware State (March 25).
- Freshman JoJo Montgomery is slashing .435 (10-for-23) over his last six games. He has five stolen bases and four runs scored over that stretch, and went 4-for-4 and 3-for-3 in his last two Sunday games, respectively.

VILLANOVA HEAD COACH KEVIN MULVEY



Kevin Mulvey embarks on his ninth season as the Villanova baseball head coach in 2025. He is the 11th full-time head coach in the program's history of more than 150 years, and was hired on July 14, 2016, after spending the previous four years as the Wildcats pitching coach. Mulvey's overall coaching record at Villanova as of the end of the 2024 season is 118-230-1, 42-83 in the BIG EAST.

Mulvey pitched professionally in the organizations of the Mets, the Minnesota

Twins and the Arizona Diamondbacks. He pitched in the major leagues for both Minnesota and Arizona, logging 10 appearances and starting four games.

Mulvey and his wife, Athena, make their home in King of Prussia, Pa. They are the parents to Jack and Max.

NOTES

VILLANOVA BASEBALL

- This is the 160th season of varsity baseball for the Wildcats, who hold a 2,009-1,674-30 (.546) all-time record. The program's first season was in 1866, debuting with a 74-9 win over the Central Club of Philadelphia on May 2. Since then, the Wildcats have appeared in 14 BIG EAST Tournaments and won five BIG EAST Championships. The program has been home to four BIG EAST players of the year, two BIG EAST pitchers of the year and 36 First Team All-BIG EAST selections. 73 Wildcats have been selected in the MLB draft, with 51 former Villanova players reaching the major leagues.

FAMILIAR FACES

- The Wildcats will return several key players for the 2025 season. Catcher Jason Neff (Gr.) and infielder Michael Whooley (Jr.) will be relied upon heavily offensively. Neff hit nine home runs in 2024, tying for second most among Wildcats, while maintaining a .260 average. He also tied a team-best 43 RBI. Whooley drew a team-best 32 walks, and finished top-five in hits, doubles, home runs and RBI in 2024. On the mound, Luke McCollough will look to put together another solid season after posting three scoreless appearances last year. Stephen Turzai and Alec Sachais will return to anchor the bullpen.

INTRIGUING TRANSFERS

- Kevin Mulvey and his staff went deep into the transfer portal this offseason to bring in five difference-making players. First, junior Bobby Finn (St. Bonaventure) will make an immediate impact as a crafty lefty out of the bullpen. Redshirt-Freshman Austin Lemon (Oklahoma State) and graduate student Jake McElroy (Holy Cross) will be effective additions to the outfield. Graduate student Bobby Olsen (Nebraska) will likely be the team's top starter upon arrival on the Main Line. Lastly, infielder Tyler Shaw (Claremont McKenna) will be a staple in the infield.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- The Wildcats have signed a remarkable 13 incoming freshmen for the 2025 season, the most of Head Coach Kevin Mulvey's nine-year tenure. It is also the most incoming freshmen for Villanova since 2009, when the program had 17 first-year players. Of the baker's dozen of newcomers, three had PerfectGame.org ratings of 8.0 or higher: Brayden Leonard (8.5), JP Podgorski (8.0) and Ben Pew (8.5).

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Since 1842, Villanova University's Augustinian Catholic intellectual tradition has been the cornerstone of an academic community in which students learn to think critically, act compassionately and succeed while serving others. There are more than 10,000 undergraduate, graduate and law students in the University's six colleges—the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the Villanova School of Business, the College of Engineering, the M. Louise Fitzpatrick College of Nursing, the College of Professional Studies and the Villanova University Charles Widger School of Law. Ranked among the nation's top universities, Villanova supports its students' intellectual growth and prepares them to become ethical leaders who create positive change everywhere life takes them.

VILLANOVA ATHLETICS

Villanova University has a long and storied athletics history defined by excellence both in competition and in the classroom. The Villanova Athletics Department is a community of student athletes, coaches and staff whose primary focus is to achieve academic excellence, while striving to produce teams and individuals committed to athletic competition and outstanding performance. Villanova Athletics sponsors 24 varsity sports, which together include more than 550 student-athletes. In the classroom, these Villanova student-athletes have registered a grade-point average higher than a 3.0 for 37 consecutive semesters. Four Villanova student-athletes have been named Rhodes Scholars, with numerous others earning Academic All-America distinction. Villanova's athletics history includes 21 NCAA team national championships as well as 129 conference championships and hundreds of individual conference champions. At least one Villanovan has participated in every Summer Olympics since 1948. Villanova is a member of the BIG EAST Conference, CAA Football, Colonial Athletic Association (Rowing) and Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (Water Polo).

ACADEMICS

Villanova had 14 of its varsity programs earn NCAA public recognition awards in May 2020 for having a multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score that ranked within the top 10 percent of their sport nationwide. This was the fourth straight year that Villanova had 14 or more of its teams recognized, while the 14 awards in 2020 put the Wildcats in the top 10 nationally and atop the BIG EAST for number of teams recognized. The most recent academic data to be announced was the November release of the NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR). Villanova earned its highest rate ever with a 98 percent GSR score, while 12 sports programs posted a 100 percent rate in the most recent data.

GAME NOTES

THE NEFF NOTES

- Catcher Jason Neff's recent play has vaulted him towards the top of the national rankings in several key hitting categories. In the last week, Neff fueled the Villanova offense to back-to-back 10-run games. On Saturday, he hit two home runs for the second time this season and recorded a career-high six RBI. Then, on Sunday, he hit a two-run home run en route to a 10-5 win over reigning Southern Conference champion Wofford. Neff was named to the BIG EAST weekly honor roll for his stellar play. As of Monday (March 24), Neff was tied for 22nd in all of Division I in home runs (9), tied for 38th in RBI (32) and ranked 41st in slugging percentage (.769). Neff's strong power numbers will be key to keeping the Villanova offense rolling into conference play.

'CATS RUNNING WILD

- The Wildcats have been more aggressive on the basepaths this season, and the new strategy has paid off thus far. Less than halfway through the season, Villanova has already stolen 37 bases. This is nearly two-thirds of the team's 2024 season total of 60, and eclipses Villanova's total from the previous two seasons by a wide margin (30, 29). Freshman JoJo Montgomery is leading the team with eight swiped bags, with first baseman Aidan Barry close behind with seven. Montgomery, Barry and center fielder Connor Hale have combined for 20 stolen bases this season and have only been caught stealing two times among them.

LIU AT A GLANCE

- The Sharks enter the weekend having won five of their last six games to improve to an 11-14 overall record. At the plate, they are led by catcher Jack Power, who has lived up to his name with a team-high nine home runs. On the mound, closer Evan Panjwani has been dominant. Opponents are hitting a mere 0.74 against Panjwani en route to three saves on the season.
