TONIGHT'S GAME

■ Villanova opens its 128th season of varsity football with Saturday evening's 6 p.m. kickoff against Colgate at Villanova Stadium. It is only the third time in the last 21 years, although the second season in a row, that the Wildcats have begun the season at home.

■ Villanova has won eight straight season openers since 2017, a streak which happens to coincide with the start of the **Mark Ferrante** head coaching era. Only Montana (10 straight) has a longer active streak among FCS teams.

■ Villanova has won a program record 16 straight home games in a streak that began during the 2022 season. It is the second-longest active home winning streak among FCS teams, trailing only a 30-game streak by South Dakota State.

■ Villanova had two previous 15-game home winning streaks, the first of which came from 1927 to 1930 in the first 15 games ever played at Villanova Stadium. The other 15-game streak lasted from 2008 to 2010.

■ Sophomore running back **David Avit** is on the preseason watch list for the Walter Payton Award and senior linebacker **Shane Hartzell** is likewise on the preseason watch list for the Buck Buchanan Award. Villanova is one of 10 schools to have at least one player on both watch lists at the start of the season.

■ Fifth year offensive lineman **Jake Picard** (first team) and senior linebacker **Shane Hartzell** (second team) earned Stats Perform Preseason All-America honors.

VILLANOVA NOTEBOOK

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Villanova begins its 128th season of varsity football on Saturday evening when it kicks off against Colgate in the friendly confines of Villanova Stadium. The game will stream live on FloCollege with **Sam Kuperman** and **Steve Pinone** in the booth, and **Tessa Peloso** on the sidelines. The radio call with **Ryan Fannon** and **Matt Szczur** can be heard on Fox Sports Radio Philly which is accessible on mobile devices via the iHeart radio app.

ABOUT VILLANOVA

- Excitement is high for the Wildcats as the 2025 season dawns. Villanova is coming off a second round playoff appearance last season and returns 70 players from a team which compiled a 10-4 record. Head coach **Mark Ferrante** has guided the Wildcats to 36 wins over the past four years and Villanova is ranked in the Top 25 of both prominent FCS national polls entering the 2025 campaign.

ABOUT COLGATE

- One of the better games on the Week 1 FCS scoreboard was a matchup between the Raiders and CAA Football member Monmouth which featured a combined 1,219 yards of total offense. Colgate led 31-7 midway through the third quarter before the Hawks scored five unanswered touchdowns in a span of less than 13 minutes and went on to a 42-39 victory. The star of the game for the Raiders was senior wide receiver and captain Treyvhon Saunders who caught 13 passes for 223 yards and two touchdowns. Saunders, like Villanova sophomore running back *David Avit*, is on the preseason watch list for the Walter Payton Award.

SERIES STUFF

- Villanova leads the all-time series against Colgate by a 7-1 margin and has won each of the last seven meetings since losing the inaugural matchup between the teams in 1978. This will be the third straight year that the teams meet each other on the gridiron, with recent matchups taking place in 2023 at Villanova Stadium (42-19 victory) and last year in Hamilton, N.Y. (28-3 win). Those two games, along with this week's contest, all took place in Week 2 of the season.

PLAYING THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

- It is apropos that the Wildcats begin the 2025 season by playing a Patriot League foe. Earlier this year, Villanova announced that it had accepted an invitation from the Patriot League to join the conference as an associate member in football beginning with the 2026 season. The move to the Patriot League is a natural fit for the Wildcats on many levels, including geographically. The average length of a Patriot League road trip for Villanova will be 175 miles, including two opponents (Lafayette and Lehigh) who are located within 50 miles of Villanova.

FAMILIAR FOES

- The Patriot League in recent seasons has consisted of seven football members and the Wildcats have faced six of the seven at least once within the last 10 years. Villanova will also continue longstanding conference rivalries with Richmond and William & Mary, who have each announced moves to the Patriot League as football members over the past two years. The league's football membership as of 2026 will consist of 10 teams: Villanova; charter members Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette and Lehigh; and associate members Fordham, Georgetown, Richmond and William & Mary.

VILLANOVA NOTEBOOK

SEASON OPENERS

- Villanova head coach **Mark Ferrante** is 8-0 in season openers in his career. The streak began with a 38-35 win over Lehigh in 2017 and most recently continued last year when the Wildcats tallied a season-opening 24-17 victory over Youngstown State. Villanova has the second-longest active streak of season-opening wins in the FCS, trailing only Montana who has won 10 straight season openers and also begins the 2025 season this week.
- The average margin of victory for the Wildcats in their eight straight season-opening wins is 16.9 points. Villanova has allowed fewer than 20 points in each of its last seven season openers.

STARTING AT HOME

- This is the third time in the last four years and the second in a row that Villanova will begin the season at home. Prior to the 2022 lidlifter against Lehigh, the Wildcats had opened on the road in 16 consecutive seasons from 2006-21. Many of those contests were against FBS foes, while in recent years Villanova’s annual game against an FBS opponent has taken place later in the year.

FRIENDLY CONFINES

- There won’t be any argument from the Wildcats about opening the season at home. That is because Villanova is riding a program record 16-game winning streak at its venerable on-campus home. The active streak of home wins at Villanova Stadium ranks second in the FCS behind only South Dakota State’s 30-game home winning streak which began in 2021.
- Villanova’s home winning streak began during the 2022 season and — at 16 games — is longer than two previous 15-game streaks. The record-setting game came in the first round of last year’s playoffs when the Wildcats defeated Eastern Kentucky. Villanova has had an average margin of victory of 14.8 points during its home winning streak.
- The two previous occasions in which the Wildcats won 15 straight home games were notable for very different reasons. The first streak occurred from 1927 to 1930 in the first 15 games ever played at Villanova Stadium, which made its debut on October 8, 1927 with a 32-7 win over Lebanon Valley. The second 15-game home winning streak lasted from 2008 to 2010, during which time Villanova won its first national championship in 2009.

VILLANOVA NOTEBOOK

POLLING PLACES

- Villanova begins the 2025 season ranked in both the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll. It is the 33rd time in the last 38 years that the Wildcats have been nationally ranked for at some point during the season. Villanova comes in this week at No. 13 in the Stats Perform poll and No. 12 in the AFCA FCS rankings.
- Villanova ranks fourth among all teams in FCS history (since 1978) for the number of weeks appearing in the national media poll. In their 326 weeks being nationally ranked, the Wildcats have been in the top 10 for a total of 153 weeks (11th most all-time) and have been ranked in the top five for 66 weeks. Villanova has achieved a Top 5 ranking at least once in 16 seasons since 1991.

FANTASTIC FIVE

- Villanova has compiled a record of 36-15 (.706) over the last five seasons (2021-25) while making three playoff appearances and winning 10+ games three times. The overall record puts the Wildcats 12th among all FCS teams in terms of winning percentage since the start of the 2021 season. Villanova came into the 2025 season as one of six FCS teams to have won 10 games or more in at least three of the last four seasons.

DECADE OF DOMINANCE

- Villanova is the only current CAA Football member to have won at least 70 games over the past decade (2015-25). In this stretch the Wildcats have an overall record of 72-42 (.632) and have gone 47-29 (.618) in regular season conference games while making the playoffs five times.

VILLANOVA NOTEBOOK

PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Sophomore running back **David Avit** and senior linebacker **Shane Hartzell** have been named to the preseason watch lists for the Walter Payton Award and the Buck Buchanan Award, respectively. These national honors are given to the top offensive and defensive players in the FCS at the end of each season. Villanova is one of 10 teams to have at least one player on both watch lists at the start of the season. The others are Harvard, Illinois State, Montana, Montana State, North Dakota State, Rhode Island, Samford, South Dakota State and UIW.

NATIONAL ATTENTION

- Fifth year offensive lineman **Jake Picard** and senior linebacker **Shane Hartzell** generated preseason All-America buzz entering the year. Picard is on the Stats Perform Preseason All-America first team and Hartzell appears on the second team. It is the first time in their careers that either player has garnered national accolades.

CAA FOOTBALL PRESEASON POLL

- Villanova was picked to finish third in the CAA this season and had four players named to the Preseason All-Conference team. The four honorees included fifth year offensive lineman **Jake Picard** and sophomore running back **David Avit** on the offensive side of the ball along with a pair of defensive players in senior linebacker **Shane Hartzell** and fifth year defensive lineman **Obinna Nwobodo**. Two more players – senior offensive lineman **Stephane Voltaire** and sophomore cornerback **Zahmir Dawud** – were named preseason honorable mention.

VETERAN EXPERIENCE

- Villanova has 94 players on its 2025 roster and they begin the year having played in a combined 1,103 college football games. Leading the way for the Wildcats are 11 players who have played in at least 30 career games, including three who have played 40 or more. Villanova has six new graduate transfers on the team this year and each has played in at least two dozen games prior to arriving on the Main Line. The six are punter **Luke Larsen (East Carolina)**; placekicker **Jack Barnum (Central Connecticut State)**; wide receiver **Luke Colella (Princeton)**; quarterback **Pat McQuaide (Nichollas)**; and defensive backs **Jordan Adderley (Lehigh)** and **Julian Talley (Penn)**.

VILLANOVA NOTEBOOK

NEW FACE UNDER CENTER

- Villanova has had remarkable stability at the quarterback position for well over a decade, as the quartet of **John Robertson**, **Zach Bednarczyk**, **Daniel Smith** and **Connor Watkins** combined to start 141 of the 151 games the Wildcats played from 2012-24. A new starter will be under center for the Wildcats this season as graduate transfer **Pat McQuaide** takes over as the starter. McQuaide played the past two seasons at Nicholls, a member of the Southland Conference, and in 23 starts for the Colonels he was 395-of-686 for 4,414 yards with 27 touchdowns. McQuaide compiled a 57.6% completion percentage and a 118.2 efficiency rating at Nicholls while averaging 11.2 yards per completion.

- Graduate student **Pat McQuaide** will only be the third left-handed quarterback to start a game for Villanova during the program's FCS era which began in 1985. The other two are *Christian Culicerto* who started three times during the 2011 season and stalwart *Zach Bednarczyk* who started 34 career games from 2015-18.

ENTERING WITH LIFE EXPERIENCE

- The oldest active player in Division I college football this season will be Villanova punter **Luke Larsen** who recently turned 33 years old and will be making his Wildcats debut in Saturday's season opener against Colgate. Larsen is a graduate student transfer from East Carolina and a native of Australia who played Australian Rules Football, volleyball, cricket and tennis during his scholastic career prior to coming to the United States.
- Larsen appeared in 43 games at East Carolina and punted 174 times while averaging 40.8 yards per punt. He landed 51 punts inside the 20-yard line, booted 19 punts for 50+ yards and had 75 of 174 attempts fair caught. He ranked second all-time in net punting for the Pirates and was a two-time National Football Foundation Honor Society member in 2024 and 2025.

VILLANOVA NOTEBOOK

ALL ABOUT AVIT

- Sophomore running back **David Avit** burst onto the collegiate scene in a big way last year when he emerged as the Wildcats top running threat and was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award presented to the top freshman player in the FCS. Avit ran 173 times for 923 yards and nine touchdowns in 2024. He ranked third in rushing yards among all FCS freshmen and was the only Villanova player to top 1,000 all-purpose yards (1,098) on the season. Avit was named the CAA Football Offensive Rookie of the Year and an honorable mention All-CAA selection in voting by league head coaches. He earned a spot on the *Phil Steele* Freshman All-America second team.

YOU GOTTA HAVE HARTZELL

- Senior linebacker **Shane Hartzell** has developed into a mainstay on the Wildcats defense during his career. He has played in 41 games and has tackled 249 tackles, including 140 solo stops, 24.5 tackles for loss and 13 sacks. Hartzell has three career forced fumbles and one fumble recovery to go along with an interception and six total passes defended. He is coming off easily his best collegiate campaign in 2024 when he led Villanova with five sacks and recorded a team-high 67 solo tackles. He wound up second on the team with 121 total stops and 9.5 tackles for loss. Hartzell reached double figures in tackles four times last season, including a career day against New Hampshire when he had 20 total stops in a tightly contested 14-6 victory.

VILLANOVA FOOTBALL HISTORY

- Villanova has compiled a 287-170-1 (.628) record in 40 seasons as an FCS member. The program's success includes 16 appearances in the FCS playoffs and appearing in the final national rankings of the season 19 times in the last 36 years.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

- Villanova is tied for 10th in FCS history with 16 playoff appearances. In their FCS playoff history, the Wildcats have a record of 15-15 with one national championship (2009) and three semifinal berths (2002, 2009, 2010). Villanova has won at least one playoff game in 10 of its last 12 postseason appearances. The 15 playoff wins for the Wildcats are tied for the 12th most ever among current FCS programs.

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Since 1842, Villanova University's Augustinian Catholic intellectual tradition has been the cornerstone of an academic community in which students learn to think critically, act compassionately and succeed while serving others. There are more than 10,000 undergraduate, graduate and law students in the University's six colleges – the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the Villanova School of Business, the College of Engineering, the M. Louise Fitzpatrick College of Nursing, the College of Professional Studies and the Villanova University Charles Widger School of Law. Ranked among the nation's top universities, Villanova supports its students' intellectual growth and prepares them to become ethical leaders who create positive change everywhere life takes them.

VILLANOVA ATHLETICS

Villanova University has a long and storied athletics history defined by excellence both in competition and in the classroom. The Villanova Athletics Department is a community of student-athletes, coaches and staff whose primary focus is to achieve academic excellence, while striving to produce teams and individuals committed to athletic competition and outstanding performance. Villanova Athletics sponsors 24 varsity sports, which together include more than 550 student-athletes. In the classroom, these Villanova student-athletes have registered a grade-point average higher than a 3.0 for 44 consecutive semesters. Three Villanova student-athletes have been named Rhodes Scholars, with numerous others earning Academic All-America distinction. Villanova's athletics history includes 21 NCAA team national championships, as well as more than 100 conference championships. In addition, at least one Villanovan has participated in every Summer Olympics since 1948. Villanova is a member of the BIG EAST Conference, CAA Football, Coastal Athletic Association (Rowing) and Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (Water Polo).

ACADEMICS

The GPA for more than 550 student-athletes in the Spring 2025 semester was 3.495, making it 15 straight semesters that student-athletes have had a GPA of 3.3 or higher. Success in the classroom has been across-the-board for Villanova Athletics, with 87 percent of all student-athletes compiling a GPA of 3.0 or higher and 73 student-athletes from 18 sports maintaining a perfect 4.0 GPA.

The most recent NCAA data to be released was the Academic Progress Rate (APR) update in May 2025 in which Villanova Athletics had 14 earn public recognition for having a multiyear APR score which ranks in the top 10 percent of their sport nationwide. That included 13 teams who had a perfect score of 1000, making it eight straight years that the Wildcats have had 10 or more teams achieve a multi-year score of 1000.

ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

NCAA ACADEMIC DATA

■ Each year the NCAA recognizes programs that have a multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score that ranks within the top 10 percent of their sport nationwide. Villanova has earned this award nine times in the 18-year history of the APR program.

■ In the most recent APR data released in June 2025 the football program's multi-year APR score of 982 was 24 points above the national average for FCS programs.

■ New data on the NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) was released in November 2024 and Villanova recorded its fourth straight year with a score of 95 percent or higher.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

■ One of the highest honors that a student-athlete can achieve is to be named an Academic All-American, an award which encompasses both academic achievement as well as contributions on the field. Villanova has had 12 football student-athletes earn a total of 14 Academic All-America honors over the years.

CAA TEAM ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

■ Villanova has been the winner of the CAA Football Team Academic Excellence Award five times in the last nine years. The award is presented at the end of each academic year to the conference school with the highest team GPA.

CAA SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

■ Villanova has had five student-athletes be named the CAA Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Nominees for the award must have attained senior standing academically and have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

CAA ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

■ Student-athletes with a semester GPA of 3.0 or higher are named to the CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll. Villanova had 63 honorees for the Fall 2024 semester and 64 student-athletes achieve this distinction for the Spring 2025 term.

ACADEMIC ALL-AREA TEAMS

■ In conjunction with the *Philadelphia Inquirer*, the sports information directors at the colleges and universities in the Philadelphia area (PhillySIDA) name an Academic All-Area team and a football Performer of the Year each season. In the 19 years of the Academic All-Area program, which started with the 2005-06 academic year, the football team has had a total of 64 selections to the Academic All-Area Team. In addition, the Wildcats have had six Performers of the Year.

VILLANOVA HEAD COACH MARK FERRANTE



Mark Ferrante enters his ninth season as the Thomas and Diane Treacy Endowed Football Head Coach in 2025 and is in his 39th year overall with the Wildcats including his time as head coach and 30 years prior as an assistant coach from 1987-2016. He has been a part of 274 victories and all 16 of the program's FCS playoff appearances during his Villanova tenure. Entering the 2025 season Ferrante has a career head coaching record of 57-33 (.633) which includes 36 regular season CAA Football wins, two league titles and four playoff appearances.

Under Ferrante's watch, the Wildcats have consistently been one of the top teams in the country. Villanova begins the 2025 season as one of six FCS programs to have won 10+

games in at least three of the last four years. During that span (2021-24), the Wildcats have made three playoff appearances and won a share of two CAA Football titles as well as the league's automatic bid to the FCS playoffs in 2021 and 2023. Villanova's overall record over the past four seasons is 36-15 (.706) and that mark includes a 24-8 record versus CAA Football foes and a 22-3 mark at home.

Ferrante guided the Wildcats to its second straight 10-win season in 2024 and its third appearance in the playoffs in the past four seasons. Villanova finished the year ranked No. 12 in the final Stats Perform national poll and was a top 10 team at the end of the season in two of the previous three years. Ferrante ranks third in school history in head coaching wins, while his .633 career winning percentage trails only Harry Stuhldreher (1925-35) and Clipper Smith (1936-42) among Wildcats head coaches who held the position for three or more seasons.

Villanova has consistently earned national recognition for its success during Ferrante's head coaching tenure. Following the 2024 season, linebacker Brendan Bell and cornerback Isas Waxter were selected as All-American by both Stats Perform and the Associated Press. Freshman running back David Avit was the CAA Football Offensive Rookie of the Year and a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award presented to the top FCS freshman. Honors have already started to come in for the 2025 campaign with Avit on the watch list for the Walter Payton Award and linebacker Shane Hartzell on the Buck Buchanan Award preseason watch list. Their accolades make the Wildcats one of 10 schools to have at least one player on the watch lists for the top offensive and defensive honors in the FCS.

In his first eight seasons as head coach, Ferrante has seen the Wildcats win six CAA Football major awards and earn a total of 61 all-conference accolades. Five players under Ferrante's watch - Corbi, cornerback Christian Benford, linebacker Forrest Rhyne and the aforementioned duo of Bell and Waxter - have earned All-America honors from Stats Perform and/or the American Football Coaches Association. Benford and Rhyne were first team All-Americans in 2021. Ferrante is himself one of the CAA Football major award winners after earning his first Coach of the Year honor in 2021.

Villanova's recent teams have featured several players who had an opportunity to continue their football careers beyond the collegiate ranks. Most recent on the list is Isas Waxter who signed with the Seattle Seahawks as an undrafted free agent in 2025. Following the 2023 season, running back Jalen Jackson and offensive lineman Nick Torres signed free agent contracts with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Kansas City Chiefs, respectively. Three other players - running back TD Ayo-Durojaiye (Chicago Bears/Kansas City Chiefs), linebacker Danny Abraham (Seattle Seahawks) and wide receiver Jaaron Hayek (Kansas City Chiefs) - were invited to attend NFL rookie mini camps.

Ferrante coached 11 players on the 2021 team who had professional opportunities, led by Christian Benford who was a sixth round draft pick of the Buffalo Bills and has since gone on to have a successful NFL career in Buffalo. In addition, 2021 CAA Football Defensive Player of the Year and first team All-American Forrest Rhyne signed a free agent contract and played in the NFL with the Indianapolis Colts. Cornerback Denzel Williams signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Ravens.

One of the themes of Ferrante's head coaching tenure has been his ability to keep his teams largely intact throughout the COVID pandemic and the changing landscape of college sports. combined to play in more than 1,000 college football games even before the season started. Experience wins, and Nova Nation has taken notice. Villanova's average attendance for five regular season home games in 2021 was its highest mark since 2013 and represented a 23 percent increase from 2019 prior to the pandemic. The increased attendance included the Wildcats first home sellout crowd since 2015 during the 2021 Family Weekend game against Richmond.

Ferrante has continually stressed the importance of his student-athletes coming to Villanova for a complete collegiate experience which includes excellence in their academic pursuits. In his first eight years as head coach, the Wildcats have been the winner of the CAA Football Team Academic Excellence Award four times. The award is presented to the team with the highest GPA in the conference each academic year and Villanova has been a repeat winner of the honor in each of the last three years spanning the 2022-23 through 2024-25 academic years.

The football program set and tied its highest overall NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) with a mark of 96 percent in both 2022 and 2023, while the team has had a mark of at least 95 percent in four consecutive years. The most recent NCAA GSR data was released in November 2024 and the Wildcats were one of two CAA Football teams with a score of at least 95 percent.

During the 2024-25 academic year, the Wildcats had 63 student-athletes selected to the CAA Football Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll during the Fall semester and another 64 honorees for the Spring 2025 grading period. Two student-athletes each semester had perfect 4.0 GPAs: Gilbert Deglau and Chris Dobrydney in the Fall and the duo of Temi Ajitutu and Ryan Kennedy in the Spring. Villanova had a total of 34 selections to the CAA High Honors List in 2024-25 for having a 3.7 or higher semester GPA.

Villanova has had nearly 800 selections to the CAA Football Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll during Ferrante's head coaching tenure and has had more than 650 selections to the Athletic Director's Honor Roll which is announced each semester for student-athletes who post a GPA of 3.2 or higher during the grading period.

Ferrante leads one of the nation's elite FCS programs after playing an instrumental role in the Wildcats rise to national prominence. He has been a part of the coaching staff for all 16 of Villanova's appearances in the FCS playoffs, including

the 2009 national championship season and a 2010 semifinal appearance while serving as the Assistant Head Coach on Andy Talley's staff. Ferrante has been a part of Villanova teams that have won eight CAA titles, three Lambert Meadows Cups and three ECAC Team of the Year awards.

Ferrante was involved in all aspects of the Villanova program during his time as an assistant on Andy Talley's staff. On the field he coached the offensive line for 27 seasons and developed a unit that was perennially one of the best in CAA Football. Over the years he coached three All-Americans, 11 All-East performers and 15 first team all-conference selections. The offensive line had 17 All-CAA selections in a nine-year span, including three-time first team honoree Ben Ijalana along with first team selections Brant Clouser (2010), Dan Shirey (2011) and Vince Kowalski (2014).

Two of Ferrante's players went on to be selected in the NFL Draft. Ijalana was a second round selection by the Indianapolis Colts in 2011 and Brad Seaton was picked in the seventh round by the Tennessee Titans in 2017. Ijalana was a two-time All-American (2009, 2010) and a three-time first team All-CAA selection during his collegiate career. Villanova reached the FCS playoffs in each of his last three seasons on the team, winning the 2009 national title and advancing to the semifinal round a year later. Seaton was a second team CAA Football All-Conference selection in 2016 when the offensive line enabled the Wildcats to average 206.3 rushing yards and 378.7 yards of total offense per game. Villanova ranked third in the CAA and 24th nationally in rushing offense in addition to ranking fourth in the league in total offense and fifth with a scoring average of 24.4 points per game.

The other All-Americans Ferrante mentored are Eamonn Allen (2001) and Bryan Russo (1989). Allen earned first team Associated Press All-America recognition in 2001 and was also a first team All-East and first team All-Atlantic 10 selection. Russo was chosen as an All-American by the Sports Network and the American Football Coaches Association as a senior in 1989 when he was also a first team all-conference and an All-ECAC selection. He was inducted to Villanova's Varsity Club Hall of Fame in 2007.

Ferrante and his wife, Georgea, reside in Phoenixville, Pa. The couple has a son, Jimmy, who earned his undergraduate degree from Villanova in 2018.
