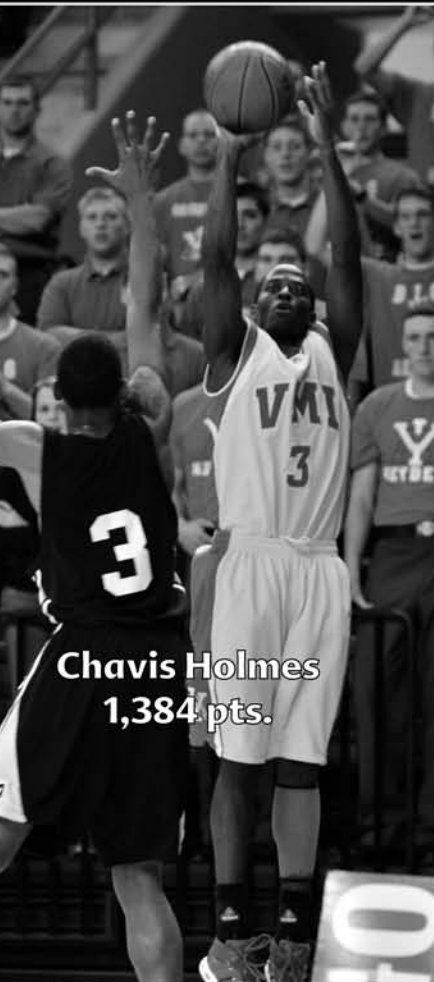
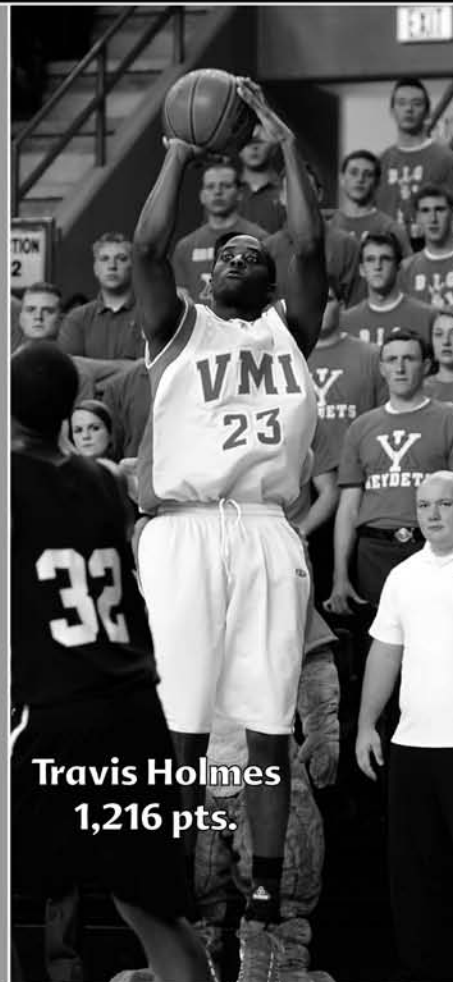


Twin Power

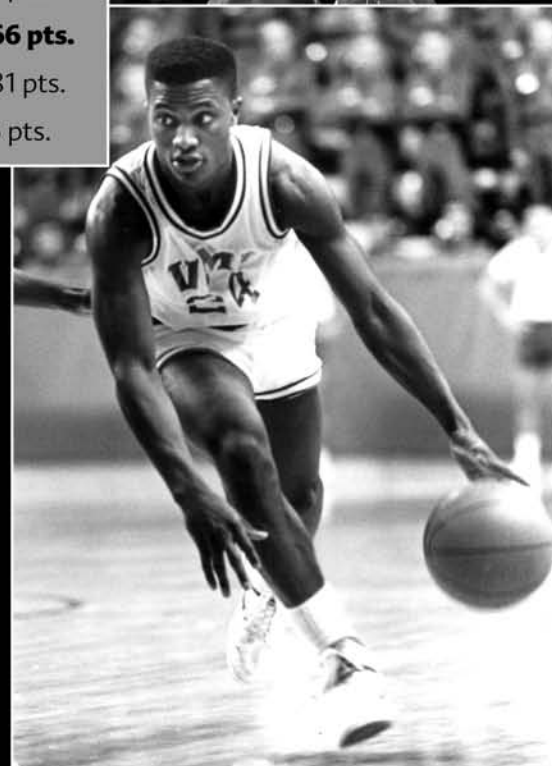



THE RUNNIN' ROOS



Since Duggar Baucom introduced his high-octane offense two seasons ago, the Keydets have seen not only their scoring averages rise, but also their win totals.

After winning only seven games in his first season on post, Baucom has led VMI to back-to-back 14-win seasons the past two years, the program's highest two-year win total in over a decade.

IMPRESSIVE FEATS:

- VMI is only the second team in NCAA Division I history to repeat as National Scoring Champions while having a player repeat as Individual Scoring Champion.
- The Keydets became the first school to repeat as NCAA Scoring Champions since Arizona (2002-03 & 2003-04).
- Reggie Williams '08 was only the seventh player in the past 50 years to repeat as the NCAA's Individual Scoring Champion.
- VMI also led the country in 2006-07 and 2007-08 in three-pointers made per game.
- Defensively, the Keydets led the nation in steals per game each of the past two seasons, while Travis Holmes topped the national ledger in individual thefts in 2006-07.

IMPRESSIVE FEATS:

- The Runnin' Roos now own NCAA all-time records in five different categories.
- The 2006-07 Keydets were the first team in 13 years to average over 100 points per game.
- Over the past two seasons, the Keydets have hit triple digits 25 times.
- In the 2007 Big South Championship, the sixth-seeded Keydets pulled off back-to-back upsets to reach the Conference Finals for the first time since 1988, falling three points short to a Winthrop team widely regarded as perhaps the best team in the Conference's 25-year history.

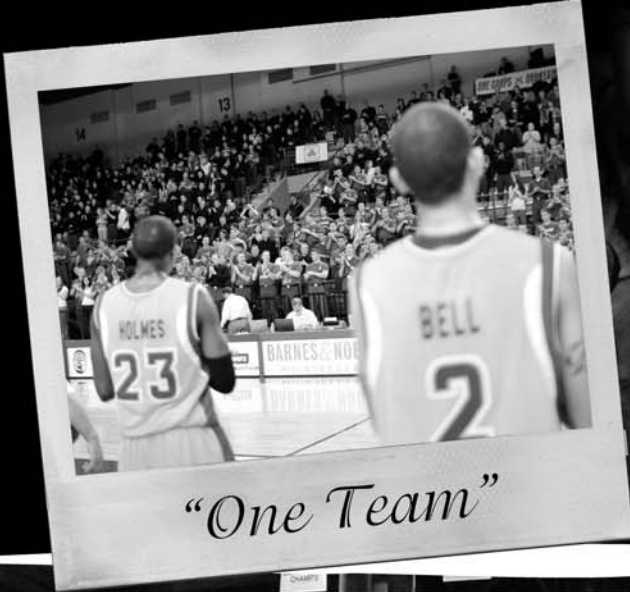

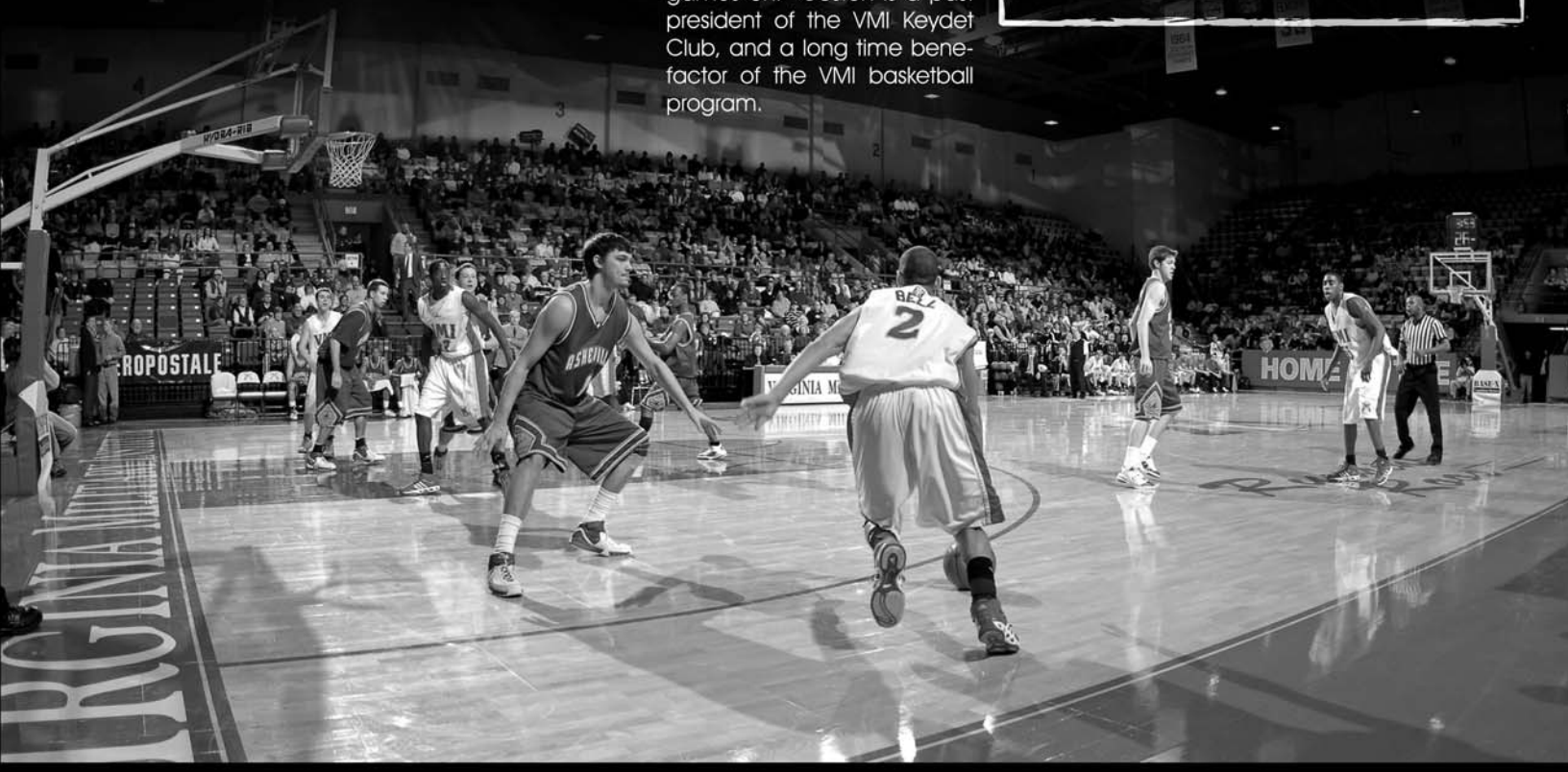


Costen Court:
