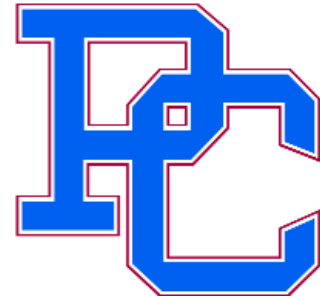

COACHES - **Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76)**, a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, became the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 117-year history on February 12, 2008. He brings ten years of head coaching experience at both the SEC and FCS (I-AA) level.

Woods, 54, returns to the FCS (I-AA) ranks where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 65-53-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003-06 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

Bobby Bentley (Presbyterian '90) is in his second season as the head coach Bobby Bentley is in his second season as the head coach at his alma mater. Bentley's first Blue Hose squad concluded 2007 with a winning record of 6-5. PC finished its first year under Bentley ranked third nationally in both passing yards and total offense. In total as a team, PC ended 2007 in the top 15 in four major offensive statistical categories. The Blue Hose were 11th in scoring in the nation at 36.80 points per game and 15th in the country in passing efficiency with a rating of 149.18.

Bentley returned to Clinton after serving as the head football coach and director of athletics at James F. Byrnes High School in Duncan, S.C. A 1986 Byrnes alumnus, Bentley served as an assistant coach for the Rebels from 1990-1994 and was named head coach in 1995. His teams compiled a 107-52 record during the next 12 years and tied a South Carolina record by winning four consecutive Class AAAA Division II state football championships from 2002 through 2005. Following the team's fourth state title, Bentley was honored as Nike's National Coach of the Year. He also was named as the South Carolina Football Coaches Association Coach of the Year in 2006.

SERIES NOTES

THE SERIES - Saturday's meeting marks the second ever between VMI and Presbyterian. A season ago, the Blue Hose scored a 45-21 win at Foster Stadium on Oct. 13, 2007.

LAST MEETING - Redshirt sophomore running back S.J. Worrell rushed for 93 yards and two scores and caught three passes for 74 yards to spark Presbyterian to a 45-21 win over VMI Saturday before a Keydet Homecoming crowd of 6,433 at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

It was the first meeting between the teams. PC raised its record to 4-3 while VMI fell to 2-4.

The Blue Hose broke open the game by outscoring VMI, 21-7, in a decisive third quarter. VMI pulled within 20-14 with 8:30 left in the third quarter when Tim Maypray hauled in his second touchdown reception of the day, a 32-yarder from quarterback Kyle Hughes.

The Keydets forced PC to punt from midfield on the ensuing possession, but the ball was short snapped in punt formation to Blue Hose quarterback Tim Webb who connected over the middle to Anthony McKnight for a 50-yard TD pass play to put Presbyterian up, 27-14, with 7:29 left in the third quarter.

VMI drove to its own 47 on the next drive but faced a fourth-and-two and elected to go for the first down, but sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah was halted for no gain by linebacker Antwan Thomas.

Two plays later Worrell dashed down the right sideline for a 32-yard touchdown run to stretch Presbyterian's lead to 35-14 with 4:19 left in period.

The Keydets assembled a five-play 74-yard drive behind redshirt sophomore Joey Robinson, who had taken over for Hughes at QB. Robinson capped the drive with a one-yard keeper to pull VMI within 35-21 with 11:18 to play. The drive was keyed by a 35-yard pass from Robinson to freshman wide receiver Bryan Barnson and a 38-yard to the VMI 1 by Maypray.

But the Blue Hose answered again on the next drive when Webb sprinted 65 yards to the endzone on a quarterback draw and silencing the VMI comeback. PC kicker Cam Miller added a 37-yard field goal at the 2:58 mark to cap the scoring.

The teams combined for 1,057 yards total offense—just three yards shy of the Foster Stadium/Alumni Memorial Field record set in 2005 in the VMI-Gardner-Webb game. Presbyterian, which entered the game leading Division I FCS in passing, outgained VMI, 553-504, with a balanced attack of 280 rushing yards and 273 passing yards. The 503 yards total offense racked up by the Keydets was their second straight 500+ yard game.

LAST GAME FOR VMI- In a battle of two of the nation's more formidable ground attacks the Stony Brook Seawolves prevailed with a 40-26 win over VMI Saturday afternoon at LaValle Stadium.

The Seawolves (5-6, 3-2 Big South) rolled up 447 yards rushing and were led by tailbacks Edwin Gowins (250 yards, 20 carries, 3 TD's) and Conte Cuttino (233 yards, 28 carries).

VMI netted 364 yards on the ground which accounted for all of its total offense on the day. Junior Howard Abegesah led the VMI offense with 109 yards and a touchdown. It was Abegesah's eight career 100-yard game and third such game this season. Junior quarterback Tim Maypray had 99 yards on 18 carries and scored on a 60-yard TD run.

For the third consecutive week, the Keydet offense struggled in third down conversion tries, going 1 for 12 while the Seawolves went 8 for 13 for the game.

Maypray became the 8th VMI back to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, and the first Big South quarterback to accomplish that feat.

VMI also topped its Big South Conference rushing record set a year ago and now has 3,149 rushing yards, surpassing the 3,115 rushing yards set in 2007.

VMI cornerback Byron Allen's interception late in the fourth quarter set up an eight play, 60-yard scoring drive capped by slotback Michael Rainey's 12-yard TD that pulled VMI within 33-26 with 7:17 remaining.

But the Seawolves closed the door shut on the Keydets when Gowins burst up the middle for a 32-yard touchdown run with 4:44 left and the Stony Brook defense kept the Keydets off the board in its last two possessions.

LAST WEEK FOR PRESBYTERIAN- Antwan Thomas concluded his efforts with nine tackles to become Presbyterian College's all-time leader in total tackles in PC's 21-13 loss to Coastal Carolina before 6,241 fans on Senior Day on Saturday afternoon at Bailey Memorial Stadium.

Thomas (Hawkinsville, Ga./Hawkinsville) now has 360 tackles in his career. He entered the Coastal Carolina game three behind Steve Stalvey (354) for the most tackles in PC history.

Chetyuane Reeder led the Blue Hose offense in the contest. The senior ended his final outing at Bailey Memorial Stadium by racking up 141 all-purpose yards. Reeder rushed for 21 yards, caught three passes for 78 yards and returned kicks for 42 yards. Reeder ended the day with two touchdowns, catching one and rushing for the other. He also blocked a Coastal Carolina field goal attempt.

PC's Brandon Clark (Duluth, Ga./Buford) led all receivers in the contest with five catches for 72 yards. He was one of eight Blue Hose to tally a catch. PC has now had five or more receivers haul in a pass in every game in 2008.

Brandon Miley (Wilmington, N.C./JT Hoggard) passed for 283 yards in the loss to the Chanticleers. PC's starting signal caller was 23-for-44 overall with one touchdown.

Redshirt-freshman running back Mario Carter (Columbia, S.C./Irmo) rushed the football a career-high 15 times in his first real significant time at running back in 2008 for PC. Carter picked up 57 yards on the 15 carries, averaging 3.8 yards per carry.

Coastal Carolina was led in its victory over the Blue Hose by running backs Jamie Fordham and Arthur Sitton, who combined for 160 yards on the ground. Fordham rushed for 91, while Sitton finished with 69 yards rushing.

Chanticleers quarterback Zach MacDowall

passed for 128 yards and one touchdown. He completed 14 of his 22 pass attempts.

TEAM NOTES

RUSH ON - With 364 yards rushing against Stony Brook last week, VMI easily surpassed its Big South record of 3,115 yards set last year. With 3,435 yards on the season, the Keydets need 52 yards rushing this Saturday to break the VMI season record of 3,486 set in 1991.

Now at 343.5 yards per game, the Keydets find themselves ranked no. 2 in the nation, marking the 11th week this season VMI has been ranked either first or second in FCS rushing. VMI is well ahead of its 283.2 rushing yards per game set last season. At current pace, VMI is on track to finish over 3,700 yards rushing.

HUGHES QUESTIONABLE - Quarterback Kyle Hughes missed his fourth straight game last Saturday against Stony Brook while dealing with a hamstring pull sustained in practice the week before the Gardner-Webb game in Week 7. Tim Maypray made his ninth start at quarterback on the year against Stony Brook and redshirt freshman Justin Hickman also saw action against the Seawolves.

Hughes is expected to dress for Saturday's finale against Presbyterian, having practiced this week, and is listed as questionable for the contest.

MAYPRAY HITS 1,000 - Junior quarterback Tim Maypray has been held under the 100-yard mark in rushing each of the last three games, but still became the first Big South quarterback to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. He set a Big South single season rushing mark for a quarterback with 656 yards back in Week 7.

He is also the eighth Keydet to hit 1,000 rushing yards in a season. It also marked the third-straight season that VMI has had a 1,000-yard rusher.

WELCOME BACK, HOWARD - Junior fullback Howard Abegesah has returned to form since missing two games recovering from a knee injury.

Against Charleston Southern (11/1), Abegesah rushed for 102 yards on 12 carries for his seventh career 100-yard game and second time over the century mark this season.

He backed that up with a 109-yard performance at Stony Brook (11/15), his eighth career 100-yard outing and third of the 2008 campaign. Abegesah also scored on a two-yard TD run for VMI's first score in the third quarter.

PICK PATROL - Redshirt freshman safety Byron Allen snagged his second interception of the season in the fourth quarter against Stony Brook, and the takeaway set up VMI's final touchdown of the afternoon. VMI now has 10 interceptions on the season after picking off just two passes last year. Allen is the lone defender on the team with more than one pick.

JENKINS BRINGS 'EM BACK - Freshman kick return specialist Rajah Jenkins has returned 29 kicks for 671 yards and now ranks third on the

school season list for kick return yardage. Jenkins is 80 yards away from moving into the No.2 slot held by Kevin Solomon who had 750 yards in 2002.

SPEEDY REEDY - Redshirt freshman safety Tyler Reedy returned an interception 50 yards for a touchdown against Charleston Southern becoming the first VMI defender to pick off a pass and return it for a score since Marcus Brown against Gardner-Webb in 2006. VMI has picked off nine passes total in 2008 (each by a different player) after getting just two interceptions all last year.

MAYPRAY ROLLS ALONG - Despite dealing with back ailments sustained in practice two days before, junior quarterback Tim Maypray collected his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the year and finished with 145 yards rushing including a long of 42 in a 34-27 setback to Gardner-Webb (10/25). Maypray continues to approach new marks in his outstanding career, and needs just 70 receiving yards to become the first player in Big South history with 1,000 career receiving yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.

VINTAGE WINE - Sophomore defensive tackle Josh Wine added to his offensive resume by scoring his first two college touchdowns, both two-yard dives into the endzone against Gardner-Webb. Wine started lining up at fullback in the Keydet fullhouse backfield in goal line situations against Coastal Carolina Oct.11. Wine is also a member of the VMI wrestling team and advanced to the 2008 NCAA tournament after winning the heavyweight division in the Southern Conference last year. He went 9-4 his freshman campaign and enters the pending wrestling season ranked 15th in the heavyweight division.

BIG PLAY FEVER - VMI's option offense has been producing big yardage plays in bunches so far in 2008.

Against both Chowan and Ohio, VMI produced 10 plays that netted over 20 or more yards. In addition, VMI had five plays that moved the football 50 yards or more in the Chowan game.

On the year, VMI's offense has netted 65 plays of 20 or more yards including 18 that have gained 50 or more yards.

NOW THAT'S PASSING EFFICIENCY - VMI attempted just three passes against Charleston Southern (11/1), but connected on a 53-yard TD strike to Zach Collins on one of their pass completions. VMI has now produced 11 touchdown passes in its 30 completions on the season. Despite its vaulted rushing attack, VMI is ranked 14th in FCS in passing efficiency (148.4).

MAYPRAY, GROSS HONORED- VMI quarterback Tim Maypray and Keydet linebacker A.J. Gross were named the Big South football Choice Hotels Offensive Player of the Week and New Balance Defensive Player of the Week, respectively, for games played in week seven of the 2008 season.

Maypray rushed for a career-high 155 yards -- a Big South single-game record by a quarterback -- and scored a touchdown in helping the Keydets defeat Coastal Carolina, 47-20 and snap their 10-game conference losing streak. Maypray also threw a 19-yard touchdown pass and caught three passes for 59 yards to finish the day with 214 all-purpose yards. His 33-yard pass reception in VMI's opening drive set up the Keydets' first touchdown.

He also had a long run of 40 yards that set up VMI's second score of the third quarter. Maypray also broke the Big South single-season rushing record by a quarterback during the

game, as his season total of 696 surpasses the previous best of 656. The award is Maypray's second Offensive Player of the Week honor this season, as the junior also won the award on Sept. 8.

Gross led VMI with 13 tackles (six solo, seven assisted) in the Keydets' win over Coastal Carolina. He tied the Big South single-game record with five tackles-for-loss (minus-27 yards) and recorded three sacks on the day for minus-20 yards. Gross' three sacks came in the second half when VMI blanked the Chanticleers 28-0, and his play helped limit Coastal Carolina to 20 yards of total offense in the third quarter.

The two awards mark the first time VMI has received multiple weekly Big South honors since the games of Oct. 1, 2007, when Kyle Hughes was tabbed the Offensive Player of the Week and Bryan Barnson earned the Freshman of the Week accolade. It is the first time the Keydet football squad has been given the Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week honors since the games of Sept. 4, 2006, when Sean Mizzer and Jamaal Walton were given the offensive and defensive honors, respectively.

SECOND HALF SHUT DOWN - VMI's defense clamped down on Coastal Carolina's offense after intermission in the 47-20 win over the Chanticleers Oct. 11 at Foster Stadium. It was the first time that VMI had not allowed a point after halftime in a Big South game and the first time overall since Lock Haven (W 20-0, 2007) and the first against an FCS opponent since a 33-0 win over Davidson in the 2005 opener.

COMEBACK KEYDETS- VMI entered the break against Coastal Carolina trailing 20-19, before outscoring the Chanticleers 28-0 in the second half en route to a win in the team's Big South opener.

The conference win while trailing at halftime is VMI's first since joining the Big South Conference. In fact, the last League game that VMI won when trailing at halftime was the Keydets' last Southern Conference match-up, defeating The Citadel 23-21 in Charlotte.

GOING THE DISTANCE- Trailing 20-19 in the third quarter against Coastal Carolina, the Keydets drew up a pass play that ended up in the recordbooks.

Kyle Hughes connected with Zach Collins for a 90-yard touchdown reception, the longest play from scrimmage in Big South history. The hook-up was also the second-longest pass play in school history and the third-longest play from scrimmage in Keydet lore.

AIR SUSPENSE - Although VMI doesn't throw the ball much in its triple action attack, the Keydets get their money's worth when they take to the air.

Of VMI's 30 passes completed this year, 11 have gone for touchdowns. Junior quarterbacks Kyle Hughes and Tim Maypray have tossed five and four, respectively, while redshirt freshman Justin Hickman has two touchdown passes.

In addition, VMI is averaging 23.4 yards per catch.

FRESHMEN FILL IN AT FULLBACK- Junior fullback Howard Abegesah has missed two games because of a knee injury sustained against Ohio (9/28).

Despite Abegesah's absence, the Keydets managed to get some noteworthy numbers from the fullback position. Redshirt freshman Chaz Jones (Cleveland, Ohio) started the two games, rushing for 112 yards and two touchdowns, while freshman Bobby Epps (Gainesville, Ga.) gained 117 yards and a touchdown over the same stretch.

MAYPRAY GOES THE DISTANCE - Tim Maypray has become quite the big-play threat since moving from slotback to quarterback.

The junior from Madisonville, Ky. had accounted for a 40+ yard rushing play in each game this season before his streak was snapped against Charleston Southern. Maypray did run for a 74-yard touchdown run against the Bucs, but the play was nullified by a penalty. Earlier in the year, his streak of having a 50+ yard rushing play was snapped against Richmond, when his longest run went for only 45 yards. Then against Coastal Carolina, Maypray could only muster a 40-yard scamper.

Also against Richmond, Maypray saw his 11-game scoring streak come to an end, as he had scored a touchdown in each game dating back to a 37-6 loss to Lehigh last Sept. 22.

Maypray collected a 60-yard touchdown run against Stony Brook (11/15), his longest run since the Chowan game on Sept. 20.

KEYDETS POST IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS AT OHIO- In their second-ever meeting against Ohio, VMI acquitted themselves nicely against their only FBS opponent of the season.

The Keydets racked up 436 yards of total offense in the game, marking the most that VMI has ever produced against an FBS/I-A opponent since Division I split prior to the 1979 season.

VMI entered the game leading FCS with 399.0 rushing yards per game, and ran up 339 rushing yards against the Bobcats.

ROLLING, ROLLING, ROLLING - The Keydets rolled up a Big South single-game record 517 yards rushing and piled up 659 yards total offense against Chowan, just five yards shy of the school record set against West Virginia Tech in

1992. The 517 rushing yards against Chowan fell short of the school record 531 yards rushing gained against Richmond in 1991.

ABEGESAH BACK ON TRACK - Against Chowan, Howard Abegesah became the first VMI back to score three rushing touchdowns in a game since Thomas Haskins did it against The Citadel on November 16, 1996. Abegesah rushed for 124 yards and three touchdowns against Chowan and scored on runs of 4, 63, and 2 yards. The 63-yard run was a career-high. It was Abegesah's sixth career 100-yard rushing game.

SCORING SURGE - The 69 points against Chowan matched the single game VMI school record for most points set on September 25, 1982 when the Keydets blanked Central Florida, 69-0.

GETTING HIS KICKS - Placekicker Greg Stevens was named Big South Conference Freshman of the Week for games played Sept. 20, the league office has announced from Charlotte, N.C.

Stevens, a graduate of Peachtree Ridge High School in Duluth, Ga., was a perfect 9-of-9 on his point-after-touchdown attempts in VMI's 69-20 victory over Chowan Saturday, setting a VMI record. He eclipsed the former school mark of 8-of-8 set by David Tyler against Central Florida in 1982. Stevens is the fifth kicker in Big South history to hit at least 9-of-9 PATs in a game.

Stevens played soccer from age four until the beginning of his senior year when he converted over to football in late September, 2007 and scored a total of 56 points for Peachtree Ridge including 41 of 45 PAT attempts.

Stevens was the second Keydet to be honored with a weekly award and joins Tim Maypray (Offensive Player 9/6) as the other VMI honoree.

MAKING A STATEMENT EARLY- In VMI's 69-20 win over Chowan, VMI ran out to a 34-0 halftime advantage thanks to four rushing touchdowns and a receiving touchdown.

The 34 points put in the first 30 minutes of play is the most by VMI since going up 42-0 in the first half against Central Florida on Sept. 25, 1982, when the Keydets set a school record for points in a 69-0 win.

GOOD DEBUT - With the win over Chowan, VMI coach Sparky Woods became the first VMI coach since A.W. "Slick" Morton (1947) to go 2-1 in his first three games as Keydet head coach.

MAYPRAY HITS CENTURY MARK AGAIN - Tim Maypray rushed for over 100 yards for the fourth time this season at quarterback by rushing for a career-high 155 yards against Coastal Carolina. Earlier this season, he gained 130 yards against Ohio, 134 yards against William & Mary and 116 yards against Saint Francis.

In the season's first two games, Maypray became the first VMI quarterback to rush for back-to-back 100 yard games since Tony Scales in 1991. Scales rambled for 167 yards on 17 attempts and two touchdowns against East Tennessee State in the opener (9/7) and followed

with 205 yards on 30 attempts and two touchdowns at Appalachian State.

KEYDETS ON 48-GAME SCORING STREAK -

Dating back to a 21-0 shutout at the hands of Georgetown on Oct. 9, 2004, VMI has now scored a point in each of the past 48 games.

The streak is the longest such run in the 118-year history of the program, besting a 43-game stretch from 1919-1924.

Despite the similar numbers, the current streak doesn't quite compare to the offensive prowess of the Flying Squadron days.

During the current 48-game streak, VMI has scored 1,101 points for an average of 22.9 per game. Over the previous 43-game streak, the Keydets scored 1,138 points, averaging 26.5 points per contest.

Included in that run was the 1920 campaign that still stands as the school's only undefeated and untied mark. While going 9-0, VMI defeated Hampden-Sydney 136-0 and Catholic 96-0. That squad still holds the pre-SoCon realignment school record for points in a season, outscoring their opponents 431-20, averaging 47.9 points per game.

MAYPRAY HITS 1,000 CAREER RUSHING

YARDS - With a 27-yard rush in the first quarter against Ohio, junior Tim Maypray went over the 1,000-yard career rushing mark.

The converted slotback now boasts 1,702 rushing yards in his career, along with 930 yards receiving in his career.

Should he be able to break the 1,000-yard barrier in both categories, he would be the first such player in Big South history to do so.

STEVENS CONNECTS FOR FIRST - Freshman placekicker Greg Stevens converted his first college field goal try against William & Mary when he connected from 38 yards out in the second quarter for VMI's first points of the evening. Stevens also remained perfect in extra points converting both attempts against W&M to make him nine of nine on the year. Stevens kicked just one year of football in high school at Peachtree Ridge in Duluth, Ga. after playing soccer since age four.

SHUT IT DOWN - VMI's 49-0 victory against Saint Francis Sept. 6 was the largest shutout win by VMI since defeating Central Florida 69-0 on Sept. 25, 1982. It also marked the third time over the last four years that VMI had logged a victorious blanking over its opponent in the season opener. The others were (2005- VMI 33, Davidson 0; 2007- VMI 20, Lock Haven 0). The Keydets have now won their last four season openers and are 18-6-1 in home openers since the 1953 season.

STINGY "D" RULES DAY - VMI established a new school record and a new Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium record on Sept. 6 by holding Saint Francis to -4 rushing yards.

The fewest rushing yards a VMI defense had previously held an opponent was 8 yards against Virginia on November 5, 1977 (30-6, VMI win) and the previous home facility record for fewest

rushing yards was -3 yards VMI managed against Marshall in a rain-soaked 24-20 loss to the Herd on September 24, 1988.

DOUBLE TROUBLE - Sophomore quarterback Tim Maypray (129 yds.) & sophomore slotback Zach Collins (112 yds.) each rushed for over 100 yards against Saint Francis, marking the first time since last season's game against Robert Morris (Sept. 29, 2007) that VMI had achieved the feat. Against the Colonials, VMI quarterback Kyle Hughes (136 yards), "B" back Howard Abegesah (157 yards) and slotback Joey Robinson (100 yards) passed the century mark. Maypray & Collins each recorded their first 100-yard rushing games and had the longest runs of their career in the game (Maypray- 52 yard touchdown run; Collins 62-yard touchdown run).

VMI's 418 rushing yards against Saint Francis was the most piled up by an FCS team last week and were the most by the Keydets since running up 443 rushing yards against Robert Morris last season.

MAYPRAY EARNS WEEKLY ACCOLADE - In his first start at quarterback, junior Tim Maypray made a big splash, being named Big South Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the week of Sept. 7.

It marks the third time that the Madisonville, Ky. native has earned Big South Offensive Player of the Week honors, and it is the sixth overall weekly award he has won from the league (Freshman of the Week twice & Special Teams Player of the Week once).

WOODS SOLID IN DEBUT - Sparky Woods is the second straight coach to record a shutout victory in his first game as VMI's head coach. In 2006, Jim Reid posted a 33-0 win over Davidson in his debut at Foster Stadium on September 2, 2006.

LET 'EM PLAY - In an indication of improved depth and rosters numbers the Keydets intend to utilize in 2008, VMI played a season-high 68 players in the Sept. 20 game against Chowan, besting the 63 players that saw action in the Saint Francis win on Sept. 6.

VMI dressed 85 players in the opener against Saint Francis including a group of 50 freshman that contained 27 true freshman. When the Little John cannon fired for the last time signifying the end of the Saint Francis contest, 33 players on the dress roster had played in their first college game.

THE MAGIC TOUCH - To say that sophomore Zach Collins had big-play ability in VMI's 49-0 win against Saint Francis is an understatement. The junior back from Universal City, Texas touched the ball two times and both resulted in long touchdown runs of 62 yards (career-high) and 50 yards.

Collins perhaps foreshadowed his big day in the season opener when he scored touchdowns on his only two touches in VMI's first spring scrimmage last April.

STEVENS PERFECT - Freshman kicker Greg Stevens (Duluth, Ga.) converted a perfect seven

of seven extra point attempts in his college debut against Saint Francis. Stevens was one off the single record of eight for eight established by David Tyler in VMI's 69-0 win over Central Florida on September 25, 1982.

RUSHING THREE-PEAT IN ORDER? - The Keydets will attempt to lead the Big South in rushing for the third-straight season in 2008. VMI ranked fourth in the country in rushing in 2007, averaging a Big South-leading 283.2 yards per game.

WILL YOUTH BE SERVED? - Youth abounds on the 2008 VMI football roster, as only four players with senior eligibility are listed on the 89-man roster. The seniors are wide receiver Keith Taylor, linebacker Jacob Rochester, tight end Travis Ludden and defensive end Andy Viola.

OLD FACES, NEW PLACES - There were a few positional changes in preseason camp to be aware of.

The most notable is that three-year letterman and starter Keith Taylor has moved from the defensive backfield to wide receiver. Taylor, a senior, had started 21 games at both free and strong safety over the past two years and ranked second on the team in tackles in 2007 with 70, including 27 first hits.

Offensive tackle Nick Mims (R-Jr.) was moved back to the defensive line where he will back up at end, a position he had played for a season and a half before being moved to the offensive line late last season.

NEW STAFF ADDITIONS - In addition to the hiring of Sparky Woods as head coach, the Keydet football program welcomes three other additions to the coaching staff.

A.J. Christoff brings a distinguished coaching record to his defensive coordinator position with the Keydets. He has coached at 11 universities around the country and has been a defensive coordinator for 20 years, including stops at Idaho, Oregon, Stanford, Notre Dame, Colorado and Cincinnati.

Don Woods, Sparky's brother, is serving as the program's Chief of Staff while also coaching the defensive line. Woods was a high school coach for 38 years, accruing a 247-96 career mark along with four state semifinal appearances.

Steven Humphrey is a recent graduate of Tusculum and is coaching the Keydet wide receivers. He served two years as a student assistant coach following a three-year playing career as a wideout.

ROSTER UPDATE - Redshirt freshman offensive lineman Derek McKnight (Richlands, Va./Richlands) has withdrawn from school for personal reasons. McKnight played three plays in VMI's opener against Saint Francis on Sept. 6.

During the bye week in mid-October, true freshmen Butch Kaczmarzewski (Winchester, Va.) and Robert Bigler (Locust Grove, Va.) withdrew from school for personal reasons. Kaczmarzewski saw action in four of the team's six games on special teams, while Bigler had not played.

Game 1: Football Shuts Out Saint Francis 49-0 In Season Opener

LEXINGTON, Va. - Juniors Tim Maypray and Zach Collins each rushed for two touchdowns and eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark while VMI's defense pitched a shutout in its opener for the second straight season as the Keydets blanked Saint Francis (Pa.), 49-0, Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

Maypray, the all-purpose yardage machine who ran out of the slotback position his first two years at VMI, made his first start at quarterback and rushed for 116 yards with scoring runs of 52 and 35 yards while Collins turned in his first career 100-yard game with a career-high 112 yards on just two touches with both runs resulting in scores of 62 and 50 yards.

The VMI defense, which shifted to a 3-4 alignment this season, limited Saint Francis to a school and stadium record -4 yards rushing and also forced two fumbles which led to scores.

The Keydets won their fourth consecutive season opener and posted their third blanking over that four-game span.

The Keydets outgained Saint Francis, 444-252, including 418 yards on the ground. VMI also converted 5 of 10 third down conversions while the defense generated 11 tackles-for-loss including four sacks.

SFU quarterback George Little completed 23 of 45 passes for 256 yards while Red Flash wideouts Omar Winston and Antoine Rivera caught seven and six passes, respectively.

The Red Flash had their best opportunity to score when they held the ball for 16 plays and 59 yards while consuming 7:11 off the third and fourth quarter clock, but the drive stalled at the VMI 13.

The Keydets jumped to a 14-0 lead after one quarter scoring on two of their first three possessions. Maypray's 52-yard option keeper on the opening possession produced the contest's first score capping a four-play, 64-yard drive which ended at the 13:17 mark. VMI struck again on the last play of the first period when Collins took an option pitch and raced down the left sideline for a career-long 62-yard score. Collins followed at the 8:22 mark of the second quarter when his second and final rushing attempted resulted in a 50-yard TD run extending VMI's lead to 21-0.

VMI's defense produced the final Keydet score of the first half when Little, pressured by VMI senior linebacker Jacob Rochester tossed an inadvertent lateral that was scooped up by sophomore defensive end Damiso Alexander who raced 46 yards for a touchdown and extending VMI's lead to 28-0 at halftime.

Maypray's second touchdown, a 35-yard option keeper, capped an eight-play, 67-yard drive and pushed the margin to 35-0 with 10:28 left in the third quarter. Keydet junior back Howard Abegesah carried four times for 15 yards to help set up the score.

Fumble recoveries by redshirt freshman Emilio Calvin and freshman Josh Sneed set up VMI's final two touchdowns of the fourth quarter. Junior quarterback Kyle Hughes connected with senior tight end Travis Ludden for an eight-yard TD pass play and Abegesah capped the game's scoring with a one-yard dive with 5:16 left.

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. - Despite a third quarter rally that almost allowed VMI to climb back from a sizable deficit, the Keydets could not withstand the big play ability of the William & Mary offense as the Tribe handed the Keydets a 52-17 loss Saturday night at Zable Stadium in Williamsburg.

William & Mary (1-1) appeared to have things well in hand following two touchdowns over the first 1:26 of the second half to take a 38-3 lead, but the Keydets trimmed some of the deficit with back-to-back scoring possessions.

Junior quarterback Tim Maypray converted a third and 15 quarterback draw call into a career-long 65-yard TD run to pull VMI within 38-10 with 11:10 left in the third quarter. The Tribe fumbled at their own 21 on the ensuing possession and junior quarterback Kyle Hughes' six-yard keeper five players later sliced the Keydet deficit to 38-17 with 7:31 remaining in the third period.

But William & Mary got back on stride with an eight-play, 72-yard scoring drive capped by quarterback Jake Phillips' third touchdown pass, an 11-yard toss to Elliott Mack to put William & Mary ahead 45-17 with 3:29 left. The Tribe would add another touchdown near the final two minutes of the game for the final margin.

William & Mary outgained VMI, 570-287, including 398 yards on the ground.

Maypray produced his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game as he gained 134 yards on 26 carries while junior fullback Howard Abegesah had 52 yards on 11 carries.

Running back Jonathan Grimes opened the scoring with a 29-yard run capping seven-play, 80-yard drive with 1:51 left in the opening quarter. Phillips added a 21-yard TD strike to tight end Rob Varno early in the second quarter to push the lead to 14-0 and the drive followed a fumble recovery that halted a Keydet drive at the William & Mary 39.

Phillips connected with wide receiver D.J. McCauley for a 28-yard TD pass for William & Mary's third straight scoring possession at the 7:27 mark of the first half, but the Keydets got on the board on the next drive when freshman kicker Greg Stevens converted his first college field goal, a 38-yard attempt that capped a 14-play, 53 yard drive.

The Tribe was able to tack on a field goal as time expired in the first half when Brian Pate converted a 42-yard field goal to send the teams into the dressing room at halftime with a 24-3 score.

VMI's defense produced four takeaways on the night, intercepting two passes on the Tribe's first two possessions and recovering two fumbles. Redshirt freshman cornerback Byron Allen wrestled the ball away from McCauley and returned it 24 yards to stop W&M's first possession, and sophomore linebacker Kyle Nikmard alertly gathered in a batted pass to stop the next drive.

The teams were flagged a total of 17 times with the Keydets drawing nine penalties for 74 yards and William & Mary penalized eight times for 80 yards.

LEXINGTON, Va. – Junior running back Howard Abegesah rushed for 124 yards and three touchdowns and junior quarterback Tim Maypray gained 73 yards rushing and tossed a 74-yard touchdown pass to lead VMI to a 69-20 victory over Chowan Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.

In a game of big yardage plays, VMI produced 10 plays that netted over 20 or more yards, including five plays that moved the football 50 yards or more.

The Keydets rolled up a Big South single-game record 517 yards rushing and piled up 659 yards total offense, just five yards shy of the school record set against West Virginia Tech in 1992.

The Keydets held a 48-0 lead until the 12:07 mark of the fourth quarter when Chowan quarterback C.J. Westler connected for a 22-yard touchdown pass with wide receiver James Fox with 12:07 left in the fourth quarter for the first VMI opponent points allowed at Foster Stadium this year.

VMI set the tone on the first play of the game when Maypray fired a 74-yard scoring strike down the left sideline to red-shirt freshman Daud Semalulu to put VMI up, 6-0, 15 seconds into the contest. It would be the first of five straight touchdown drives for the Keydets.

Abegesah, who collected his sixth career 100-yard rushing game, added TD runs of 4 and 63 yards to extend VMI's lead to 20-0 after one quarter.

VMI scored on the opening play of the second quarter when Maypray converted a quarterback sneak on a 3rd and 1 from the VMI 40 into a 60-yard TD run. The jaunt capped a five-play, 80-yard drive that was set up by an interception in the end zone by junior defensive back Levi Swindell that halted Chowan's best scoring threat in the first half.

Another interception on the ensuing CU possession by redshirt freshman linebacker Eric Church led to an 11-play, 62-yard scoring possession that was capped by Abegesah's third rushing TD of the half – a two-yard burst. Junior quarterback Kyle Hughes rushed three times for 43 yards on the drive including a 28-yard run to the Chowan 2 that set up Abegesah's score one play later.

The Keydets extended their 34-0 halftime lead with 3:07 left in the third quarter when Hughes threw a 34-yard touchdown strike to slotback Game Itoka. Three of VMI's final four tallies all came on career-first touchdowns – freshman back Bobby Epps (two-yard run), a Justin Hickman to Aaron Lewis 24-yard touchdown pass, and quarterback Cam Jones eight-yard touchdown run.

Chowan University closed out the game's scoring on the final play of the afternoon when Fox snagged a 29-yard Westler pass in the left corner of the endzone as time expired in regulation.

The 69 points matched the single game VMI school record for most points set on September 25, 1982 when the Keydets blanked Central Florida, 69-0. Keydet freshman placekicker Greg Stevens also eclipsed the single game record for PAT's by converting all nine attempts and surpassed David Tyler's 8-for-8 mark against Central Florida in 1982.

ATHENS, Ohio– A homecoming crowd of 19,938 got more than they bargained for at Peden Stadium on Saturday afternoon, as Ohio produced the game's final three scores to pull away for a 51-31 win.

The Keydets (2-2) cut the Ohio advantage to 34-31 midway through the third quarter on a one-yard scoring plunge by Tim Maypray, following a 51-yard rush by the Madisonville, Ky. native. The Bobcats (1-4) answered immediately, as L.J. Flintall took the ensuing kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown to push the advantage back to ten points. The hosts tacked on a field goal and a 37-yard touchdown pass from Brandon Jones to Steven Goulet to provide the final deficit.

A well-balanced Ohio attack accrued a season-high 575 yards of total offense. Junior quarterback Boo Jackson accounted for 287 yards passing, going 16-of-23 for two touchdowns through the air while adding in 33 yards rushing on eight attempts. Redshirt freshman running back Donte Harden rushed for 142 yards on 20 carries, including a 67-yard scoring scamper in the second quarter.

VMI entered the contest as the FCS' leading rushing team, averaging 399.0 yards per contest. The Keydets approached that number against their only FBS opponent of the season, running up 339 yards on the ground, with another 97 through the air. Maypray posted his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with a 130-yard performance, while junior back Howard Abegesah accounted for 88 yards and a touchdown on just 10 carries. Maypray and Kyle Hughes also tossed touchdown passes.

The first quarter saw VMI grab a 17-14 lead, including a span included 21 points in a 43-second span.

An Ohio 23-yard field goal knotted the score at 17 early in the second quarter, as Barrett Way, who transferred to Ohio from VMI prior to the 2007 season, connected for the first of his three field goals in the game.

The ensuing possession produced VMI's second 11-play scoring drive of the game. With Kyle Hughes in at quarterback, the Keydets marched 71 yards before Abegesah scored from a yard out to take a 24-17 lead, the team's largest of the afternoon, with 8:32 remaining in the second quarter.

The lead was once again short-lived. The Keydet defense forced a turnover on downs, stuffing the Bobcats on the VMI 25 on a 4th-and-6 play. On the next play, VMI executed an option pass, as Maypray, lined up at wideout, received the ball from the quarterback Hughes, then attempted to lateral back to Hughes. Maypray's toss hit the ground before reaching Hughes, allowing the Ohio defense to reach the quarterback. Hughes then fumbled at the VMI 9, where Michael Brown scooped up the ball and dashed in for a touchdown, as the extra point moved the contest back square at 24-24.

The Bobcats took a 31-24 advantage at the 1:37 mark of the second quarter, when LaVon Brazill caught a 22-yard touchdown pass from Jackson.

Ohio opened the second half by marching down to the VMI 5 before having to settle for a 22-yard Way field goal. The Keydets then needed only two plays to cut the lead to 34-31, with Maypray rushing for all 52 yards following a 36-yard kickoff return by Rajah Jenkins. Maypray's 51-yard rush on the drive's opening play marked the fourth consecutive game that he has posted a 50+ yard rush.

The momentum quickly shifted to the other sideline, however, as Flintall's kickoff return touchdown pushed the score beyond the Keydets' reach.

Leading 28-10 at halftime, Richmond started the second half with a bolt of energy as a jarring hit on VMI kick return man Zach Collins forced the ball free on the opening kickoff of the half. UR redshirt freshman Colin Pehanick scooped up the loose ball and raced 13 yards for the touchdown to extend the Spider lead to 35-10 before VMI could run a second-half play. Richmond added a two-yard TD run by senior running back Josh Vaughn later in the quarter and a pair of fourth quarter touchdown runs by redshirt running back Tyler Kirchoff completed the Spider scoring string.

VMI's lone second half tally came on a one-yard run by freshman fullback Bobby Epps with 2:16 left in the game.

Richmond outgained VMI, 419-267 in total yards, and the Keydets failed to complete a pass in five attempts and set a facility record for fewest passing yards in a game.

Junior quarterback Tim Maypray led the VMI ground attack with 88 yards on 19 carries and freshman fullbacks Epps (67 yards) and Chaz Jones (59 yards) combined for 126 yards rushing filling in for the injured Howard Abegesah (knee), who did not play.

Vaughn led Richmond in rushing with 123 yards and two touchdowns. Junior quarterback Eric Ward completed 10 of 13 passes for 130 yards and one TD for the Spiders (4-2), who rebounded from a 26-20 road loss against Villanova a week ago.

The VMI option attack, which led the nation in rushing entering the game and had produced 10 plays over 20 or more yards in each the previous two contests, was limited to just one play over 20 yards against the Spiders – a 45-yard run by Maypray that set up a second quarter scoring drive. The Spiders also converted all three VMI turnovers (2 fumbles, 1 interception) into scoring opportunities that produced three touchdowns.

Spider junior defensive lineman Miles Parker led all tacklers with 13 stops while Keydets defensive back Byron Allen posted eight tackles.

LEXINGTON, Va. – VMI secured its first Big South Conference win since 2005 in impressive fashion, using a dominating second half to post a 47-20 win over Coastal Carolina before a crowd of 8,157 on Parents Weekend at Foster Stadium Saturday afternoon.

VMI won its first Big South Conference opener since 2005 and snapped a 10-game BSC losing streak while moving to 1-0 in the conference and 3-3 overall. Coastal Carolina dropped to 3-4 and 0-2 in the BSC.

The Keydets scored the final 37 points of the game to break open what was a close game in the first half.

The Chanticleers held a 20-10 lead following Marquell Willis' 5-yard TD reception from quarterback with 2:32 left in the first half, but the ensuing extra-point attempt by the Chants set the stage for VMI's decisive scoring run.

Redshirt sophomore Kris Ware blocked Justin Durham's extra point attempt and the ball was scooped up by freshman Juan Thrasher who raced down the left sideline for the fifth defensive two-point score in school history, cutting Coastal Carolina's margin to 20-12.

VMI marched 80 yards in nine plays on the ensuing possession and pulled within one point, 20-19, following redshirt freshman Chaz Jones' five-yard TD run an extra-point kick by freshman Greg Stevens with :35 left before halftime.

VMI never looked back in the second half, piling up 334 yards in total offense after halftime and out-gaining the Chanticleers 246-20 in the third period alone.

VMI's defense preserved the second-half blanking by ending Coastal Carolina possessions during the final two quarters with two punts, two possessions ending on downs, and a third quarter interception by Thrasher that set up a score.

VMI piled up 546 yards total offense – 336 on the ground and a season-high 210 yards through the air. Maypray produced his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the year and gained a career-high 155 yards on 22 carries with one TD. Jones (53 yards-2 TD's) and freshman Bobby Epps (50 yards) combined for 103 yards rushing out of the fullback slot.

Coastal Carolina quarterback Zach McDowell completed 13 of 25 passes for 141 yards and a TD but was picked off twice. Redshirt sophomore Marquel Willis caught four passes for 44 yards and a touchdown.

The Keydets held a time of possession advantage of 35:18 to 24:42 for the game and converted all five red-zone scoring chances.

Redshirt freshman linebacker A.J. Gross led the Keydet defenders in tackles with 13 stops and five tackles for loss, including three sacks for -27 yards. Sophomore defensive end Damiso Alexander added two sacks to go along with his nine tackles.

VMI's bid to remaining undefeated in Big South Conference football play came up short as Gardner-Webb held off a second-half rally and posted a 34-27 win over the Keydets at Spangler Stadium.

Bulldog fifth-year senior quarterback Devin Campbell completed 28 of 38 passes for a career-high 392 yards and three touchdowns to pull GWU to 1-1 in league play and 4-4 overall.

Keydet junior quarterback Tim Maypray rushed for his fifth 100-yard game of the season after gaining 145 yards on 25 carries.

VMI trailed 24-6 at halftime, but assembled a seven-play, 81-yard drive on its first possession of the second half and pulled within 24-13 after Maypray connected with sophomore Michael Rainey-Wiles on a 46-yard TD pass on VMI's first completion of the day.

Gardner-Webb pushed the ball to the VMI 6 on the ensuing drive, but had to settle for a 23-yard FG by freshman Ryan Gates to extend the Bulldog lead to 27-13 with 5:53 left in the third quarter.

The Keydets took advantage of a good kick return and personal foul penalty tacked on after the play and took possession of the ball at mid-field. Two plays later, Maypray had the ball knocked loose after a first-down rush fighting for extra yardage and Gardner-Webb's Lyndrez Leslie recovered at the GWU 39. The Bulldogs capitalized in what would be the game's only turnover and struck quickly three plays later with a 51-yard TD bomb from Campbell to his favorite receiver, senior wideout Dobson Collins, pushing the Bulldog advantage to 34-13 with 4:02 remaining in the third quarter.

But VMI battled back with two fourth quarter TD's to push the game's outcome into the final minutes of regulation. A partially blocked punt by VMI's Mario Scott gave VMI excellent field position early in the fourth period and sophomore slotback Gabe Itoka scampered 36 yards down the left sideline for a touchdown run to close the gap to 34-20 at the 11:36 mark.

The Keydets were pinned back at their own 2 on the next possession, but marched 97 yards in 13 plays and capped the drive when sophomore Josh Wine, a defensive tackle inserted at fullback full-house goal line backfield, slammed in for the 2 with 1:51 left to pull VMI within 34-27 with 1:51 remaining.

VMI lined up for an on-side kick, but the Bulldogs recovered at the 39 and managed the clock away for the rest of regulation - utilizing two timeouts called before the 40-second play clock expired to keep snaps at a minimum and the ball out of VMI hands.

Keydet fullback Howard Abegesah returned to action after missing two games with a knee injury and finished with 48 yards on 12 carries. Junior quarterback Kyle Hughes, however, was not as fortunate and missed the game with a sore hamstring aggravated in mid-week practice.

GWU's Collins finished as the game's leading receiver and caught nine passes for 139 yards and two touchdowns.

The Bulldogs outgained VMI, 456-388, including 392 through the air. The Keydets, which had entered the game ranked first in FCS in rushing, gained 321 yards against the Bulldog defense that had been ranked fourth nationally in rushing defense.

VMI saw a fourth quarter road rally come up short for the second consecutive week as the Keydets fell 31-21 to Charleston Southern on Saturday afternoon in North Charleston, S.C.

VMI dropped its second consecutive game and dropped to 3-5 overall and 1-2 in the Big South Conference. Charleston Southern evened its overall record to 4-4 and 2-2 in the BSC. The Keydets have also dropped three straight games at CSU Stadium.

The Buccaneers controlled the ball for 37:39 to VMI's 22:21 and took advantage of two costly VMI turnovers to take a lead they would never relinquish.

Charleston Southern out-gained VMI, 431-311, and used a balanced attack of 243 rushing yards and 188 passing yards while holding VMI to 239 yards on the ground, far below its nation-leading 351.4 rushing yards per game.

Junior fullback Howard Abegesah rushed for 102 yards on 12 carries for his seventh career 100-yard game to lead the VMI attack, but it wasn't enough to overcome a season-low 38 yards on 16 carries by junior quarterback Tim Maypray, who was forced

to shoulder most of the load for the second straight week as junior quarterback Kyle Hughes missed his second straight game with a hamstring ailment.

Trailing 24-14 early in the fourth quarter, VMI pulled within three points when junior slotback Zach Collins converted a Justin Hickman dump over the middle into a 53-yard touchdown with 13:06 remaining.

But the Keydets could muster just 16 yards on their final two possessions of the game while the Bucs cushioned their lead with a 10-play, 55-yard drive that consumed a precious 5:18 off the fourth quarter clock. Redshirt freshman running back B.J. Hackworth scored on a five-yard TD run with 2:18 left to put the Bucs up, 31-21, and close out the game's scoring. The drive was keyed by a 15-yard third down and 15 conversion pass from CSU quarterback Tribble Reese to senior wideout Markus Murray to the VMI 25.

VMI, trailing by three points with 10 minutes left, had an apparent Maypray 74-yard touchdown run that would have given VMI the lead called backed on an illegal block penalty.

Reese completed 19 of 25 passes for 243 yards and two touchdowns and was picked off twice. Sophomore receiver Gerald Stevenson rushed for 80 yards on seven carries and added seven catches for 71 yards.

Game 9: Liberty Tops Keydets, 38-26, To Remain Unbeaten In BSC

LEXINGTON, Va. – Liberty held off a second half VMI rally to post a 38-26 victory over VMI Saturday before a crowd of 6,813 on Military Appreciation Day in Lexington.

VMI outgained the Flames, 435-425, but was hampered by inopportune penalties, fumbles (6), and also squandered two red-zone scoring chances.

Liberty remained unbeaten in the Big South, going 4-0 in the league and 8-2 overall. With Gardner-Webb's loss to Coastal Carolina Saturday, the Flames captured their second straight Big South football crown.

VMI dropped its third straight game and fell to 3-6, and 1-3 in the Big South.

Liberty senior tailback Rashaad Jennings rushed for 147 yards and two touchdowns and became the all-time leading rusher in Big South history moving past former Liberty back Dre Barnes who competed in the Big South from 2002-04. Jennings now has 3,418 rushing yards for his career.

VMI redshirt freshman full-back Chaz Jones led the VMI ground attack with 98 yards on 14 carries and scored two touchdowns.

The Keydets never held a lead throughout the game, but Jones slammed in from two yards out to pull VMI within 21-19 with 7:15 left in the third quarter. It was VMI's third consecutive score since late in the first half.

Liberty responded with a 10-play, 59-yard drive and capped it with a Brock Smith 1-yard quarterback sneak to extend the Flame advantage to 28-19 with 2:31 left in the third quarter. The Flames capitalized on Jennings' five carries for 37 yards while Smith connected on all three pass attempts for 18 yards.

Jones' five-yard TD run off an option pitch pulled VMI within 31-26 with 2:10 left, but the Keydets were unable to get their hands back on the football for the remainder of the game. An on-side kick attempt failed and gave the Flames possession at the VMI 36. Jennings busted 36 yards up the middle on the next play to score his second touchdown of the day and put the game out of reach. The Keydets fumbled away the ensuing kick return at its own 32 and Liberty ran out the final seconds off the clock for its third straight win over the Keydets and a assume a 5-3 lead in the series that began in 1995.

The Keydets, ranked second in the nation in scoring, rolled up 372 yards on the ground and held a 35:40 to 24:20 advantage in time of possession, but VMI converted just 7 of 17 third-down tries on the afternoon.

STONY BROOK, N.Y. – In a battle of two of the nation's more formidable ground attacks the Stony Brook Seawolves prevailed with a 40-26 win over VMI Saturday afternoon at LaValle Stadium.

The Seawolves (5-6, 3-2 Big South) rolled up 447 yards rushing and were led by tailbacks Edwin Gowins (250 yards, 20 carries, 3 TD's) and Conte Cuttino (233 yards, 28 carries, 0 TD's).

VMI netted 364 yards on the ground which accounted for all of its total offense on the day.

Junior Howard Abegesah led the VMI offense with 109 yards and a touchdown. It was Abegesah's eight career 100-yard game and third such game this season. Junior quarterback Tim Maypray had 99 yards on 18 carries and scored on a 60-yard TD run.

For the third consecutive week, the Keydet offense struggled in third down conversion tries, going 1 for 12 while the Seawolves went 8 for 13 for the game.

Maypray became the 8th VMI back to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, and the first Big South quarterback to accomplish that feat.

VMI also topped its Big South Conference rushing record set a year ago and now has 3,149 rushing yards surpassing the 3,115 rushing yards set in 2007.

VMI cornerback Byron Allen's interception late in the fourth quarter set up an eight play, 60-yard scoring drive capped by slotback Michael Rainey's 12-yard TD that pulled VMI within 33-26 with 7:17 remaining.

But the Seawolves closed the door shut on the Keydets when Gowins burst up the middle for a 32-yard touchdown run with 4:44 left and the Stony Brook defense kept the Keydets off the board in its last two possessions.

Stony Brook jumped to a 13-0 lead less than five minutes into the game on a Gowins 36-yard TD run and QB Dayne Huffman's 8-yard touchdown pass to Dwayne Eley.

But the Keydets countered when Maypray raced 59 yards for his ninth touchdown of the season and Greg Stevens followed with a 37-yard field goal to pull the Keydets within 13-7 with 8:47 left in the half.

Stony Brook took a 20-10 lead at halftime following Huffman's 1-yard sneak that ended a 5-play, 75-yard drive keyed by a 55-yard double-reverse, flip to QB pass from Huffman to Eley.

Abegesah's two-yard touchdown run at the 6:28 mark again pulled the Keydets within 20-17, but the Seawolves responded with consecutive touchdowns by Gowins (65 yards) and Donald Lee (27 yard TD reception on pass from Huffman).
