COACHES - Iim Reid (Maine '73) begins his second season as head coach of VMI. Reid was named as the Institute's head coach on December 22, 2005. With over 30 years coaching experience, including 15 seasons and 85 victories as a head coach, Reid became the 29th head football coach in the 115-year gridiron history of the Institute. He also returned to the Commonwealth as a Division I-AA head coach after directing the University of Richmond football program from 1995 through 2003. Reid guided Richmond to 48 wins over his nine years as head coach, which ranks third on the school's all-time win list. His UR teams also posted three of the top 13 victory totals in school history. He led Richmond to Atlantic 10 championships and I-AA playoff appearances in 1998 and 2000 and was named conference coach of the year both times. He was also selected Yankee Conference co-coach of the year in his debut season of 1995 when Richmond went 7-3-1 and finished the season ranked 20th in I-AA. In 2000, the Spiders won a school record 10 games, including a victory over Youngstown State in the I-AA playoffs. Reid also previously guided the University of Massachusetts football program as head coach from the 1986 through 1991 seasons. He posted a 36-29-2 record over the six seasons as coach of the Minutemen and was the Yankee Conference Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1990. He led UMass to a Yankee Conference cochampionship in 1986, and followed with conference titles and I-AA playoff berths in 1988 and 1990. Reid currently has an 86-93-3 career mark and 2-11 at VMI.

Mickey Matthews (West Texas State '76) is in his ninth season at James Madison where his record is 57-41. In 2004, Matthews was named 2004 Football Coaches Association Division I-AA coach of the year after leading JMU to the national title. Prior to coming to JMU, Matthews was an assistant at Georgia (1996-98) and defensive coordinator at Marshall (1990-95). Matthews also coached at Southwest Texas State, TCU, Houston, Texas-El Paso, West Texas St., and Kansas State. He led JMU to an FCS playoff appearance in 2006 after the Dukes posted a 9-3 mark including 7-1 in the A-10.

SERIES NOTES

SERIES - Despite being only an hour's drive away, this will be only the 12th meeting between VMI and James Madison in football. The teams have met just three times over the last 13 years, in 1994 (JMU's last visit to VMI), in 2004 in Harrisonburg and in Lexington last year. The Dukes lead the series, 8-3. |MU has won the last three match-ups with VMI's last win in the series coming in 1990 in Lexington.

LAST MEETING - Fifteenth-ranked James Madison rolled up 525 yards offense and defeated VMI, 45-7, September 30, 2006 in the dedication game at Foster Stadium on homecoming weekend. Senior tailback Alvin Banks led the JMU offensive attack with 110 yards on 20 carries and scored three rushing touchdowns in the first half. VMI's lone score came on a 28yard pass from freshman quarterback Kyle Hughes to sophomore wideout Willie Bell with 7:40 left in the fourth quarter. A crowd of 8,830 fans filled the stands of VMI's newly refurbished football facility which was officially renamed Foster Stadium in a ceremony held at halftime. Hughes, making his first college start at quarterback for the injured Jonathan Wilson, who was out with a separated shoulder, completed 10 of 13 attempts for 113 yards and a touchdown. JMU produced points on all but two of nine possessions on the afternoon. The lone miscue was an interception thrown by JMU quarterback Justin Rascati that was picked off by VMI sophomore free safety Keith Taylor in the third quarter.

The Dukes assembled time consuming scoring drives on their first two possessions, going 63 and 75 yards for the game's first points. Banks opened the scoring with a two-yard run at the 7:11 mark of the first quarter, and placekicker David Rabil followed with a 20-yard field goal to put JMU ahead, 10-0, with 12:30 left in the second quarter. Banks added TD runs of I3 and five yards later in the quarter to put JMU up, 24-0, at the break. The Keydets halted JMU's first drive of the second half by interception, and after a scoreless third quarter, had the Dukes bottled up on a third and 27 from the IMU 43, but a 26-yard pass from Rascati to Banks for 26 yards followed by a 31-yard rush by Maurice Fenner on a fourth and one produced a scoring drive of 90 yards and gave JMU a 31-0 cushion with 13:52 left in the game. Reserve back Antoinne Bolton added a 29-yard TD run at the 9:22 mark, but the Keydets answered with a six-play, 80-yard drive capped by the Hughes-Bell 28-yard touchdown strike with 7:40 left. JMU sophomore quarterback Rodney Landers closed the scoring with a six-yard TD run.

LAST WEEK FOR VMI- After spotting VMI an early lead, William & Mary came back in full force converting nine of 11 possessions into touchdowns and defeated VMI, 63-16 to spoil a Reunion Weekend crowd of 6,830 at Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

William & Mary junior quarterback Jacob Phillips played a nearly flawless first half, completing 13 of 15 passes for 242 yards and tossing three touchdowns passes before giving way to senior QB Michael Potts who played the entire second half. W&M and VMI both gained 249 yards rushing on the ground, but the Tribe outpassed VMI, 275-22, in rolling up 524 total vards to VMI's 271 yards total offense.

Redshirt freshman Courtland Marriner led the William & Mary ground attack with 107 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt junior tailback DeBrian Holmes scored three touchdowns while running backs Tony Viola and Thomas Schonder each added scores for the Tribe. The Keydets were led on the ground for the second straight game by sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah, who rushed for 80 yards on nine carries and a touchdown.

William & Mary fumbled on the second play of the game's opening drive as redshirt defensive end Damiso Alexander pounced on a muffed snap exchange at quarterback giving the Keydets the ball at the William & Mary 34 yard line. VMI moved to the W&M 14 before settling for a 24-yard field goal by freshman Patrick Sweeney, his first collegiate field goal giving VMI a 3-0 lead with 10:52 left in the first quarter.

The Tribe quickly answered with an eight-play, 73-yard drive capped by Holmes' first of three scores- an eight yard run that put W&M up for good with 7:54 left in the opening quarter.

A W&M fumble recovery on the Keydet 41 on the next drive led to a four-play, 41-yard possession topped by another Holmes scoring run to make it 14-3 with 3:34 left in the first quarter. A Phillips to R.J. Archer pass covering 34 yards on a third and seven keyed the drive.

Phillips hooked up with wideout Elliott Mack for a 31-yard TD pass on the Tribe's next drive to push the William & Mary lead to 21-3 with 13:20 left in the second quarter, but VMI answered to cut the margin to 21-10 with 11:26 remaining when Abegesah broke free on a 23-yard burst up the middle to the endzone capping a six-play, 70-yard drive that stayed all

A 32-yard pass from Phillips to tight end Rob Varno to the VMI four set up Holmes' third touchdown of the day one play later to put the Tribe up, 28-10, with 9:15 left in the quarter, but W&M was able to take advantage of good field position late in the second quarter to produce two more scores before halftime and assume a 42-10 lead.

William & Mary added second half scoring runs from Marriner (10 yards), Schonder (6 yards), and Viola (4 yards) while the Keydets produced a 10-play, 75- yard drive early in the fourth quarter that ended with senior running back Nat Jackson slamming in the from the W&M I-yard line with 14:08 left in the game.

LAST WEEK FOR JMU - Junior quarterback Rodney Landers ran for 128 yards and two touchdowns and threw for 241 yards and a score to lead James Madison to a 41-24 football victory over New Hampshire in a battle of nationally ranked teams Saturday at IMU's Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

Landers, making his second college start, ran 20 times, scored on carries of nine and six yards, hit on 14 of 22 passes and connected with senior tailback Eugene Holoman on an II-yard scoring strike. Landers' 369 yards of total offense marked for the first time a JMU player had surpassed the 300-yard total offense mark in a game since Justin Rascati (2004-06) had 305 total yards in a 65-7 win over Delaware State Sept. 17, 2005.

Landers' nine-yard scoring run came with 20 seconds left in the first half and pulled JMU into a 17-17 tie. His six-yard touchdown run pulled the Dukes into a 24-24 tie with 6:25 left in the third period, and the scoring pass to Holloman put JMU in front to stay, 31-24, with 1:29 left in the third period.

JMU's offense compiled 526 yards (285 rushing, 241 passing), including 320 yards during the final half. New Hampshire finished with 432 yards (79 rushing, 353 passing) but didn't score after taking a 24-17 lead on the initial drive of the second half.

JMU drove 66 yards in seven plays to tie the score late during the first half, but New Hampshire needed only five plays to go 73 yards for a touchdown and take a 24-17 lead on the opening possession of the third period.

The Dukes then squandered a scoring chance, bobbling a snap on a field goal try after moving to the New Hampshire five, but JMU got the ball back two plays later following junior cornerback Evan McCollough's four-yard interception return

From there, the Dukes needed only four plays to pull even. Landers had carries of 17 and seven yards to start the series and scored from the six after a two-yard Holloman run.

JMU held New Hampshire to a single first down on the following series and then went 68 yards in seven plays to go in front to stay on the Landers-to-Holloman touchdown pass. Landers hit sophomore wide receiver Rockeed McCarter on a 35-yard pass early during the drive.

New Hampshire got as far as the JMU 29 before punting on the following series, and JMU went 79 yards in 10 plays before settling for an 18-yard field goal by junior Dave Stannard and a 34-24 lead with 8:30 left in the game.

New Hampshire then got a pair of first downs to reach the JMU 44, but Dukes junior cornerback Darrieus Ramsey stopped the drive with an interception at the 21, his second interception of the year. JMU senior tailback Antoinne Bolton all but sealed his team's win six plays later with a 49-yard touchdown run and a 41-24 Dukes lead with 4:05 left.

TEAM NOTES

CAA AGAIN - The Keydets face their second consecutive Colonial Athletic Association (formerly A-10) opponent this weekend when they face seventh-ranked James Madison Saturday evening at 6:00 p.m. in Harrisonburg. It will open a stretch of three straight road games for VMI and the first of two night games on the 2007 slate. It will also be the first Top Ten team VMI has faced since the Keydets faced seventh-ranked Richmond last September.

KEYDETS GROUND-GAME AMONG

LEADERS - VMI enters the James Madison game ranked third in the country in rushing averaging 323 yards per game. No Big South team has averaged 300.0 yards rushing per game since the conference began in 2002 and the current conference record is held by Coastal Carolina with 278.0 yards per game in 2004. The Keydets are bidding to become just the second Big South Conference team to lead the league in rushing offense in back-to-back seasons. The 249 yards rushing by VMI against William & Mary Sept. 8 marked the fourth straight game the Keydet offense had amassed 200 or more yards rushing in a game dating back to last season.

AT QB - VMI has started two different QB's in as many games as sophomore Kyle Hughes made his fourth career start at quarterback against William & Mary Saturday. But the Keydets again employed two quarterbacks in the game for the second straight week as redshirt sophomore Joey Robinson, who started in the opener against Lock Haven, played a part of the first half and the entire second half against William & Mary. Robinson finished second on the team in rushing against the Tribe gaining 52 yards on 16 carries with a long of 14 yards.

YOUTH ON "O' LINE - The offensive line continued to see new faces as James Boatright (6-0, 250, Grayson, Ga.) saw considerable action at center in a reserve role against William & Mary as starting center George Handler (Quinton, Va.) was moved to tackle. It was Boatright's first taste of collegiate action as he had six knockdowns on the afternoon.

SWINDELL, LLOYD POST CAREER HIGHS-

Two defenders posted career-highs in tackles against William & Mary. Strong safety Levi Swindell (Elk Grove, Ca./FUMA) had 15 tackles to lead the team while starting defensive end Tommy Lloyd (Fishersville, Va.) had four solos and nine assists including two tackles-for-loss for nine yards.

DEFENSE RULES - The Sept. I season opening 20-0 blanking of Lock Haven was the first shutout by a VMI team since September 3, 2005, when VMI opened the season with a 33-0 blanking of Davidson The VMI defense limited the Bald

Eagles to 162 yards total offense which was the best posted since Jim Reid took over as head coach in 2006. The Keydet defenders limited LHU to 66 rushing yards and 96 passing yards, also best marks posted in the Reid era. The Keydets also won their third straight season opener-all at home.

TAYLOR TABBED AS TOP DEFENDER -

VMI's Joe Taylor made his first college football start against Lock Haven Sept. I a memorable one. Taylor, a redshirt-sophomore from Benedictine High School in Richmond, Va., played his first game at outside linebacker for the Keydets, and responded with a team-high 12 tackles (four solo, eight assists) in VMI's 20-0 season-opening win over Lock Haven. For his effort he was named New Balance Big South Defensive Player of the Week. He was the only defender in double-digit stops and helped VMI to its first shutout in two years. Taylor also recorded a half-sack for minus-3 yards in helping the Keydet defense limit the Bald Eagles to 162 yards total offense.

ABEGESAH IMPRESSIVE IN DEBUT - Many thought replacing the graduated Sean Mizzer, who is VMI's second all-time leading rusher, would be a tall task this season, but sophomore Howard Abegesah took a big first step in filling those shoes by leading the Keydets in rushing with 132 carries on 22 yards in the 20-0 win over Lock Haven Sept. I. Abegesah played a major role in VMI's first two scoring drives rushing four times for 21 yards on the first scoring possession and setting up VMI's second scoring drive with a 30-yard run to the Lock Haven two-yard line. On the day, Abegesah averaged 6.0 yards per carry against LHU. Against William & Mary Sept. 8, Abegesah led the Keydets in rushing for the second straight game with 80-yards on nine carries and scored his first collegiate touchdown on a

JACKSON MOVES PAST MILESTONE -

23-yard run in the second quarter.

Senior Slotback Nat Jackson moved past the I,000 yard career rushing mark with a strong 80-yard on nine carry performance against Lock Haven Sept. I. Jackson now has I,092 yards for his four-year career and scored his 13th career rushing touchdown on a one-yard run in the fourth quarter against William & Mary. He also had I0 knockdowns blocking against the Tribe in the Keydets' triple-option attack.

The Massaponax, Va. native also serves as team captain for the 2007 season and looks forward to a big senior season after laboring through a 2006 season that saw him sustain a high ankle sprain against Norfolk State in week two which limited him to 159 yards rushing after leading the team in rushing with 622 yards and eight touchdowns in 2005. Jackson returns as the most experienced rusher on the team.

RAINEY-WILES MAKES HISTORY IN

DEBUT - Freshman slotback Michael Rainey-Wiles electrified the Foster Stadium crowd in the season opener Sept. I with an 83-yard touchdown run for VMI's final score of the day and in the process set a new mark for the longest run from scrimmage in Big South Conference football history. The run surpassed the 80-yard mark coheld by Rashaud Palmer of Liberty in 2002 and Mike Tolbert of Coastal Carolina in 2006. It was also tied him for the fourth longest run in VMI history alongside Johnny Mapp's 83-yard run against Catawba in 1953.

DEFENSIVE FRONT DEBUT - Three of VMI's four defensive front starters had never played a down before the Sept. I against Lock Haven, but the trio of new faces made a good showing in the 20-0 win. Tackle Ben Brandt (Forest, Va.) made five tackles with one solo and four assists and had a tackle for loss for 2 yards and a half-sack. End Damiso Alexander (Richmond, Va.) had three tackle including a half-sack and tackle Josh Wine (Fredericksburg, Va.) registered a sack for eight yards. The performances helped the VMI defense pile up nine tackles-for-loss on the day for 34 yards.

KEYDETS HIT '07 WITH YOUTH - A quick check of the VMI 2007 roster shows that there will be plenty of new faces taking the field for the Red, White, and Yellow this fall.

Of the 93 players listed on the opening day roster, 52 players have either true or red-shirt freshman designation with 38 true freshman and 14 red-shirt freshmen. The rest of the roster breaks down with 22 sophomores, 12 juniors, and just seven seniors.

Despite the youth, there is considerable starting lineup experience on both sides of the ball with six starters returning on the offensive side of the ball and seven starters on defense. The Keydets must replace their two kicking specialists, however.

ROBINSON MOVES IN AT QB - When redshirt sophomore quarterback Joey Robinson took his first snap as VMI starting quarterback September I, it marked a long and arduous maturing process for the Gaithersburg, Md. native.

The previous Robinson took a snap at QB in a game was in an emergency situation against Army on October 7, 2006 when starter Kyle Hughes went down with an injury. Robinson, who spent most of 2006 at slotback and rushed for 330 yards and a touchdown while catching 12 passes for 191 yards, took every snap at quarterback in the recent spring ball and the work payed off as Robinson held off challenges from four other QB's in preseason camp to solidify his starting spot at QB.

In his debut, Robinson rushed for 22 yards on 11 carries and completed two of two passes for seven yards. He engineered two fo VMI's

three scoring drives against Lock Haven, including VMI's seven-play, 57-yard drive to start the second-half.

Robinson, who produced big runs at slot-back last year with gains of 61 and 54 yards, will try to transfer that big-play capability to quarter-back in the triple-option attack.

MAYPRAY MAKES PLAYS - Sophomore slotback Tim Maypray hopes to put together another exciting season that earned him Big South Freshman of the Year in 2006.

The Madisonville, Ky. native produced big plays last year for the Keydets' triple option offense and had an immediate impact catching 14 passes for 244 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 289 yards and a score. Maypray was twice named Big South Freshman of the Week.

Maypray is again expected to play a leading role on VMI kick and punt returns. He I 04 all-purpose yards Sept. I against Lock Haven.

BROWN ANCHORS LINE - Senior offensive lineman Robert Brown (Mesquite, Texas) returns as the veteran leader on the offensive front and will be making his 27th straight start on the offensive line against Lock Haven. Brown, a second team All-Big South selection a year ago, will tabbed to the 2007 All-Big South Preseason squad. In his first two games this season, Brown has logged 17 knockdowns in each contest against Lock Haven and William & Mary.

NUMBER SWAP - A quick switch of numbers at fullback in preseason camp has temporarily caused a bit of confusion on the Keydet roster. Sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah (Beltsville, Md.) has switched from the #32 listed in the 2007 VMI Football Media Guide to #31 while freshman Julian Bowers, who had been previously assigned #31, has moved to #32.

NEW STAFF ADDITIONS- The 2007 VMI assistant coaching staff has two new faces in defensive backs coach Winston October, a former University of Richmond and CFL standout who played under Coach Jim Reid at Richmond, and former tight end Greg Harris (VMI' 97), who returns to the football game and practice field after ten years in private business. Harris will assist the defensive line and will help with video analysis.

New Chief of Staff Jeff Hanson, who coached with Jim Reid at the University of Richmond, joined the Keydets during last spring's practice and will also handle the defensive line

Game I: Keydets Prevail In Season Opener Over LHU, 20-0

LEXINGTON, Va. - Sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah (Beltsville, Md.) rushed for 134 yards on 22 carries and the VMI defense posted its first shutout in two years as the Keydets defeated Lock Haven, 20-0, before 5,862 opening game spectators at Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium.

The VMI defense limited the Bald Eagles to 162 yards total offense which was the best posted since Jim Reid took over as head coach in 2006.

The Keydet defenders limited LHU to 66 rushing yards and 96 passing yards, also best marks posted in the Reid era.

It was the first shutout by a VMI team since September 3, 2005, when VMI opened the season with a 33-0 blanking of Davidson.

The Keydets (1-0) won their third straight season opener - all at home

VMI took a 7-0 lead with 2:48 left in the first quarter when sophomore slotback Zach Collins scored on a 23-yard burst up the middle to the endzone, capping a nine-play, 80-yard drive that consumed 4:05 off the opening quarter clock. The drive was keyed by Abegasah's four carries for 21 yards while senior slotback Nat Jackson ripped off two runs for 41 yards.

Jackson's two-yard TD run with 11:51 in the third quarter on VMI's opening drive of the half gave the Keydets a 13-0 lead and was keyed by Abegesah's 30-yard run to the Lock Haven two-yard line on the preceding play. The scoring drive consisted of seven plays covering 57 yards.

Freshman slotback Michael Rainey-Wiles (Pittsburgh, Pa.) capped the scoring with an electrifying 83-yard touchdown run off an option pitch. The score came with 2:50 remaining in the game and was the fourth longest run in VMI history.

The Bald Eagles missed their best chance to put points on the board when Marc Domonkos' 34-yard field goal attempt hooked left with 6:53 left in the first quarter.

Sophomore quarterback Ilio DiPaolo completed 14 of 27 passes for 84 yards to lead the LHU offense while freshman receiver Ryan Faddish caught four passes for 23 yards.

Defensively the Keydets were led by redshirt sophomore outside linebacker Joe Taylor (Richmond, Va.) who had 12 tackles including a half-sack while senior defensive end Tommy Lloyd had 2.5 tackles for loss including a half-sack. The Keydets sacked DiPaolo three times and registered nine tackles-for-loss for 34 yards.

The Keydets turned the ball over three times on the afternoon with LHU fumble recoveries by Adam Andrsko, Shawn Crebs, and Mike Chatburn.

Redshirt sophomore Joey Robinson made his first start at quarterback for the Keydets and rushed for 22 yards on 11 carries while completing both of his two pass attempts. Sophomore Kyle Hughes spelled Robinson in both the second and fourth quarters and rushed four times for 19 yards and completed two of three passes for 35 yards.

Other top VMI rushers included Jackson with 80 yards on nine carries while sophomore slotback Tim Maypray had 104 all-purpose yards.

LEXINGTON, Va. - After spotting VMI an early lead, William & Mary came back in full force converting nine of 12 possessions into touchdowns and defeated VMI, 63-16 to spoil a Reunion Weekend crowd of 6,830 at Alumni Memorial Field in Lexington.

William & Mary junior quarterback Jacob Phillips played a nearly flawless first half, completing 13 of 15 passes for 242 yards and tossing three touchdowns passes before giving way to senior Michael Potts who played the entire second half.

William & Mary and VMI both gained 249 yards rushing on the ground, but the Tribe outpassed VMI, 275-22, in rolling up 524 total yards to VMI's 271 total yards.

Redshirt freshman Courtland Marriner led the William & Mary ground attack with 107 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt junior tailback DeBrian Holmes scored three touchdowns while running backs Tony Viola and Thomas Schonder each added scores for the Tribe.

The Keydets were led on the ground for the second straight game by sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah, who rushed for 80 yards on nine carries and a touchdown.

William & Mary fumbled on the second play of the game's opening drive as redshirt defensive end Damiso Alexander pounced on a muffed snap exchange at quarterback giving the Keydets the ball at the William & Mary 34 yard line.
