COACHES - Jim Reid (Maine '73) is in his second season as head coach of VMI. Reid was named as the Institute's head coach on December 22, 2005. With over 30 years coaching experience, including 15 seasons and 85 victories as a head coach, Reid became the 29th head football coach in the 115-year gridiron history of the Institute. He also returned to the Commonwealth as a Division I-AA head coach after directing the University of Richmond football program from 1995 through 2003. Reid guided Richmond to 48 wins over his nine years as head coach, which ranks third on the school's all-time win list. His UR teams also posted three of the top 13 victory totals in school history. He led Richmond to Atlantic 10 championships and I-AA playoff appearances in 1998 and 2000 and was named conference coach of the year both times. He was also selected Yankee Conference co-coach of the year in his debut season of 1995 when Richmond went 7-3-1 and finished the season ranked 20th in I-AA. In 2000, the Spiders won a school record 10 games, including a victory over Youngstown State in the I-AA playoffs. Reid also previously guided the University of Massachusetts football program as head coach from the 1986 through 1991 seasons. He posted a 36-29-2 record over the six seasons as coach of the Minutemen and was the Yankee Conference Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1990. He led UMass to a Yankee Conference co-championship in 1986, and followed with conference titles and I-AA playoff berths in 1988 and 1990. Reid currently has an 87-99-3 career mark and 3-17 at VMI.

Danny Rocco (Wake Forest '84) is in his second season as head coach of the Flames where his record is 12-8. Prior to coming to Liberty, Rocco spent the previous five seasons at the University of Virginia, helping the Cavaliers to four-consecutive bowl appearances 37 victories on Coach Al Groh's staff. Rocco served as the associate head coach and linebackers coach at Virginia. He also served as an assistant to Groh for the New York Jets in 2000, and also had assistant coach college stints at Maryland, Texas, Boston College, Colorado, Tulsa, and Wake Forest.

SERIES NOTES

SERIES - This will be the seventh meeting between the teams on the gridiron with VMI and Liberty tied 3-3 lead in the series. The Flames evened the series last year in Lexington with a 38-32 win at Foster Stadium. In VMI's previous visit to Lynchburg, the Keydets won a defensive struggle, 10-7. The Keydets are 1-1 in Lynchburg. The series has produced some tight with three of the last four meetings have been decided by six points or less.

LAST MEETING - VMI's bid for victory in the 2006 season finale fell short as Liberty posted a 38-32 win over the Keydets before 6,177 Foster Stadium spectators November 18, 2006. The loss spoiled a tremendous rushing day for senior back Sean Mizzer who led all ground gainers with 171 yards and two touchdowns. Mizzer moved past Floyd Allen into second place on the VMI rushing charts with 3,733 yards and finished his final VMI season with 1,022 yards. Redshirt sophomore running back Rashad Jennings led the Liberty attack with 111 yards and scored a touchdown.

The Keydets opened the second half with a bang-using a Chris Gilliland 39-yard kick return to mount a 43-yard, eight-play drive that showcased Mizzer's running. The Prince Frederick, Md. senior rushed six times for 38 yards, the final a 12-yard burst into the endzone to cut the lead to 24-16 following Way's extra point.

VMI forced Liberty to punt on the ensuing possession, and Mizzer rushed 41 yards on the Keydets' next scoring drive, a 10-play, 57-yard possession that featured his second touchdown of the day, a one-yard dive. The Keydets went for two to tie, but a false start penalty and a pass to Mizzer halted at the four-yard line preserved the Flame lead.

The Flames quickly took the wind out of the Keydets sails when Dominac Bolden took the following kickoff 97 yards back for a score, becoming the first VMI opponent since Furman's Lamar Rembert in 2001 to take a kickoff back for a TD. Liberty led 31-22 with 4:02 left in the third.

But the Keydets again cut the deficit to two when red-shirt freshman fullback Derek Smith capped a 15-play, 73-yard drive with a two-yard TD plunge, and Way's extra-point cut the deficit to 31-29 with 12:25 remaining in the quarter. A roughing the passer penalty against Liberty kept the drive alive.

The Flames answered when Zach Terrell's 13-yard quarterback draw to the endzone capped a nine-play 50-yard possession to put the Flames up, 38-29, with 7:17 left as LU chewed up 5:08 of precious time off the fourth quarter clock.

VMI would answer as Barrett Way extended his consecutive field goal streak to eight with a 43-yarder at the 2:53 mark, but that would be as close as the Keydets would come as Liberty recovered an onside kick attempt and got two first downs to wind down the regulation clock.

VMI outgained LU, 381-242 and held a 36:34 to 23:26 advantage in time of possession. Liberty's 242 yards were the fewest allowed by a VMI defense this season. The Flames converted six of 10 third down tries, while the Keydets converted nine of 16.

LAST TIME FOR VMI - Junior defensive back Okeba Rollinson returned a fourth-quarter fumble recovery 53 yards to help lead Charleston Southern to a 37-28 win over VMI in Big South Conference action Saturday at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

The Buccaneers trailed 28-21 heading in to the fourth quarter, but outscored the Keydets 16-0 in the final period to snap a four-game league losing skid.

The Buc win overshadowed a record setting day for VMI sophomore slotback Tim Maypray (Madisonville, Ky.), who finished with a school and Big South record 346 all-purpose yards and also hauled in the longest pass play in conference history.

VMI entered the final quarter leading 28-21 following a 10-yard TD sweep run by sophomore slotback Joey Robinson on the last play of the third quarter. The Keydets had assembled a 13-play, 59-yard drive that was kept alive by a 13-yard fourth and seven pass from quarterback Kyle Hughes to Maypray to the CSU 13-yard line.

The Bucs responded quickly on the ensuing drive taking just five plays to move 58 yards to the endzone sealing the drive with an 18-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Sidney Bryant to junior wideout Dee Brown to tie the game at 28-28 with 12:32 left in the fourth quarter.

On the ensuing drive, VMI moved the ball and chewed up clock in steady fashion, moving from its own 22 to the CSU 44 in nine plays. Facing third down and four, sophomore fullback Abegesah had the ball stripped by senior tackle Marco Ramirez at the line of scrimmage and Rollinson scooped up the ball and raced 53 yards untouched down the left sideline for the score that would put CSU up for the first time on the day and a lead the Bucs would never relinquish over the final 8:17 of the game. The extra point was missed, leaving the score, 34-28.

VMI's ensuing drive stalled on downs at the Buc 32 yard line with 3:58 to play, and CSU moved 65 yards in nine plays on its next drive and took a two-score advantage at the 2:00 mark on a Nick Ellis 22-yard field goal.

Hughes completed 11 of 19 passes for 261 yards and two touchdowns as Maypray hauled in five passes for 209 yards and two touchdowns, becoming only the third VMI receiver to go over 200 yards in a game. The 209 yards also was the second most by a receiver in Big South history.

LAST WEEK FOR LIBERTY - For the third time this year, Liberty rolled up over 500 yards of total offense en route to a 37-24 victory over three-time defending Big South champion Coastal Carolina last Saturday at Williams Stadium.

With the victory, the Flames improve their record to 6-3 on the year and move into a two-way tie with Gardner-Webb for the top spot in the conference. Both squads have a 2-0 league mark. The loss drops Coastal Carolina's record to 3-6 on the season and 1-1 in Big South play.

The game played in front of 14,411 fans, marks the fourth-largest home attendance in stadium history. It also is the third time this year Liberty has had a home game with a crowd of more than 14,000 fans.

TEAM NOTES

ROAD FINALE - VMI hits the road one last time in '07 Saturday as it faces Liberty at Williams Stadium. The Keydets hold a 1-3 record in road games this year and a win Saturday would give them the most road victories since 2003 when VMI went 2-3 away from Lexington. The Keydet offense has been productive on the road with 75 points scored over the last two outings.

IN-STATE RIVALRY - VMI will be playing its third and final opponent from the Commonwealth in 2007 Saturday as it faces Liberty. The Keydets have already faced William and Mary and James Madison in games played earlier in September. Last year, VMI played five foes from the state (Norfolk State, Richmond, William & Mary, James Madison, and Liberty).

IT HAPPENED ON NOVEMBER 10 - VMI defeats Marshall, 13-3 in Huntington, W. Va. on November 10, 1979. Kicker Craig Jones kicked second-half field goals of 40 and 31 yards to lift VMI to the Southern Conference win.

A RECORD SETTING DAY - The VMI-Charleston Southern game last Saturday at Foster Stadium was one for the record books. A breakdown of significant achievements:

---Sophomore slotback Tim Maypray's 346 yards were the most in VMI history and also Big South history. Maypray broke the school record held by Thomas Haskins who had 328 yards against Richmond in 1994. Coincidentally, Haskins, who was inducted into the VMI Sports hall of Fame this weekend, was on hand last Saturday afternoon to watch Maypray surpass his mark.

---The 87-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kyle Hughes to Tim Maypray was the longest pass play in Big South history. It was also the second longest pass play in VMI history, second only to Dave Brown to Mark Stock's 93-yard TD pass against Appalachian State in 1986.

---Tim Maypray's 209 yards receiving mark the third 200+ yard game in VMI history, joining mark Stock who did it twice in 1986. It also marks the third highest receiving yardage total in VMI history.

---Tim Maypray's 209 receiving yards were the second most in a game by a Big South receiver. It fell one yard shy of Duvaughn Flagler's 210 yards in 2005 and surpassed Jerome Simpson's 207 yards in 2006. The trio represent the only Big South receivers to net 200+ yards in a game.

---VMI's 531 yards total offense marked the fourth time over the last five weeks that the Keydets have surpassed the 500-yard mark in total offense.

The 500 CLUB - The Keydet option attack has surpassed the 500+ mark four times this year including two straight weeks as VMI produced 525 yards the previous week against Coastal Carolina. The other 500+ yard total offense efforts were against Robert Morris (551) and Presbyterian (504). VMI is one game from tying the Big South season record Gardner-Webb as set the mark with five 500-yard total offense games in 2005. VMI and Gardner-Webb are the lone Big South

squads to have recorded at least four games of 500 total yards in one season.

ROLLING, ROLLING, ROLLING - VMI enters the Charleston Southern game ranked fourth in the country in rushing averaging 290.8 yards per game and well ahead of the current conference season record is held by Coastal Carolina with 278.0 yards per game in 2004. The Keydets are bidding to become just the second Big South Conference team to lead the league in rushing offense in back-to-back seasons. If VMI maintains its current clip, the Keydets would finish with 3,177 rushing yards, which would break the single-season record of 3,058, set by the Chanticleers in '04. VMI is looking to become just the second Big South team to lead the League in rushing offense in consecutive seasons, as they led the Conference last year with 206.6 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Keydets have rushed the ball at least 50 times in their past 10 games, becoming the first Big South team in League history to accomplish the feat.

TIME IS ON OUR SIDE - This season has seen the VMI triple option attack accomplish one of the components necessary for success -holding onto the football. VMI is currently ranked second behind Yale in time of possession in the FCS stats. The most glaring discrepancy in time of possession came in the October 20 game against Gardner-Webb, when VMI had the ball for a season-high 19:24 more than the Bulldogs. For the year, VMI has held possession of the football for a total of 83:56 more than the opposition.

THE MAYPRAY MAGIC - Sophomore slotback Tim Maypray (Madisonville, Ky.) was named Choice Hotels Big South Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season after a record setting performance in VMI's game against Charleston Southern at Foster Stadium last week. The announcement was made Monday at the league office in Charlotte, N.C.

Maypray, a psychology major, had five catches for 209 yards and two touchdowns against the Buccaneers. The 209 receiving yards are second-most in Big South history, while his 41.80 catch average set a Conference single-game mark. Maypray scored on touchdowns of 34 and 87 yards, the latter setting the Big South record for longest pass completion. He also rushed for 36 yards on seven carries (5.1 average) and returned four kickoffs for 102 yards (25.5 average) - setting the Big South single-game record for all-purpose yards with 346. His record output pushed his season all-purpose total to 1,542, establishing the Big South season record with two games remaining.

Maypray has caught six touchdown passes over the last four games - the most since Keydet wideout Pedro Garcia caught seven touchdown passes in 2002. He has also caught 28 passes on the year which also surpasses the 17 receptions posted by Willie Bell all last year.

On the season, Maypray is averaging 171.3 yards all-purpose yards per game, and in his last seven appearances, he has collected 1,408 yards (201.1 per game). He has surpassed 200 all-purpose yards in a game three times this season.

Maypray was also named Choice Hotels Big

South Offensive of the Player of the Week for his play against Presbyterian College October 13. Maypray, scored two of VMI's three touchdowns against future Big South member Presbyterian. He hauled in a 14-yard halfback option pass to give the Keydets a 7-0 first quarter lead, and later scored on a 32-yard touchdown catch to pull VMI within six points at 20-14 midway through the third quarter. Maypray also rushed seven times for 56 yards (8.0 average), including a long of 38, and finished the day with 116 all-purpose yards. The Psychology major currently ranks second in the Big South in kick return average with a 26.6 yards per kick mark and ranks first in all-purpose yardage with 171.3 yards per game.

So far, Maypray is putting together another exciting season similar to the one that that earned him Big South Freshman of the Year in 2006.

Against Lehigh Sept. 22, Maypray set a then VMI in Big South era record for all-purpose yards in a game when he piled up 245 against Lehigh - topping the previous high of 223 Sean Mizzer had against Davidson on Sept. 6, 2003. Against Lehigh rushed for 45 yards on nine carries, caught three passes for 53 yards, returned five kicks for 126 yards, and returned one punt for 21 yards. It tied him with two others for the third most all-purpose yards in Big South history.

Against James Madison Sept. 15, he became the first VMI kick returner to take a kickoff back for a touchdown since Kevin Solomon in 2001 when he returned a fourth-quarter James Madison kickoff 86 yards for a score. Maypray finished the JMU game with 182 all-purpose yards that including six catches for 61 yards and 16 yards rushing.

Maypray produced big plays last year for the Keydets' triple option offense and had an immediate impact catching 14 passes for 244 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 289 yards and a score. Maypray was twice named Big South Freshman of the Week in 2006.

ABEGESAH CONTINUES TO IMPRESS -

Many thought replacing the graduated Sean Mizzer, who is VMI's second all-time leading rusher, would be a tall task this season, but sophomore Howard Abegesah (Beltsville, Md.) has shouldered the load and is second in Big South in rushing with a 106.3 yards per game average. Abegesah has led VMI in rushing in nine straight games and collected his fourth 100-yard game this season with 116 yards on 23 carries vs. CCU Oct. 27. Abegesah also rushed for a career-high 180 yards on 23 carries vs. Gardner-Webb October 20 - the most by a VMI back since Sean Mizzer had 198 yards against Norfolk State on 9/8/06 and also produced 100-yard efforts against Robert Morris (157 yards) and Lock Haven (132).

HUGHES TOSSES HAT TRICK - Quarterback Kyle Hughes and Charleston Southern signal-caller Sidney Bryant each threw three touchdown passes during CSU's 37-28 win over the Keydets Saturday. It was the second time in Big South history that each quarterback threw three TD passes in the same Conference game.

The first time was Oct. 22, 2005, when VMI's Jonathan Wilson tallied four scoring strikes and Gardner-Webb's Nick Robert's had three touchdown passes in the same game, which was

won by GWU in triple-overtime, 55-52. Hughes has recorded back-to-back games with 300 total offense yards, the first Big South player since former Coastal Carolina QB Tyler Thigpen strung together three straight 300 total offense games to end the 2006 season.

Hughes has tossed at least one touchdown pass the last six games.

BUNCHES OF SNAPS - The 95 plays run by VMI against Gardner-Webb Oct. 20 matched the school record for most plays in a game set twice in the 1990 season against James Madison and East Tennessee State. VMI also has rushed the ball 50 or more times in eight straight games, the most by a team in Big South history.

BUNCHES OF FIRST DOWNS - The 28 first downs registered by VMI against Gardner-Webb October 20 was the most in a game since 30 first downs were rung up by the VMI offense on November 8, 2003.

DEFENSE GETS FIRST PICK - VMI's first interception turned in by the secondary this year turned out to be a big one as sophomore Bryant Youngblood (Youngstown, Ohio) picked off a Stan Doolittle pass in the second quarter of the Gardner-Webb game October 20 and returned it 26 yards to set up VMI's first score of the game.

OFFENSIVE SHOW - VMI and Presbyterian combined for 1,057 yards total offense October 13-just three yards shy of the Foster Stadium/Alumni Memorial Field record set in 2005 in the VMI-Gardner-Webb game. The 503 yards total offense racked up by the Keydets was their second straight 500+ yard game this season, and since the Keydets have tacked on two more 500+yard total offense games.

BARNSON TOPS CENTURY MARK - With three catches for 111 yards against Presbyterian October 13 including a 40-yarder, freshman wide receiver Bryan Barnson (Chesapeake, Va.) became the first VMI receiver to go over 100 yards in a game since Zohn Burden had 153 receiving yards against Gardner-Webb on October 22, 2005. Tim Maypray surpassed that Nov. 3 with five catches for 209 yards against Charleston Southern-the second most in league history.

LLOYD GETS TOUGH AT END - Senior defensive end Tommy Lloyd (Fishersville, Va.) continues to play outstanding defense on the line and is putting together his finest season in his first full-year on the D-line. Against Presbyterian, Lloyd was second on the team in tackles (led all down linemen) with six solos and two assists for eight stops, his second highest total of the year, and forced a fumble and had 2.5 tackles for loss including 1.5 sacks. Lloyd is second in the Big South Conference in tackles for loss with 13.5 on the season and also is the co-leader in sacks with 5.5 for -38 yards.

HUGHES, BARNSON HONORED - VMI sophomore quarterback Kyle Hughes (Williamsburg, Va./ Lafayette H.S.) and freshman

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receiver Bryan Barnson (Chesapeake, Va./Western Branch H.S.) were both honored by the Big South Conference for their play in the September 29 40-13 win over Robert Morris in Moon Township, Pa.

Hughes, named Choice Hotels Offensive Player of the Week, rushed for 136 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns (scoring on runs of 71 and four yards) and threw for 108 yards and two touchdowns in leading the Keydets to their first road win in 12 games, dating back to 2005. Hughes became the fourth different QB in Big South history with 100 rushing yards and 100 passing yards in the game, and his 136 rushing output is the third-most by a quarterback in League annals. He was also the first VMI QB to go over the century mark in rushing and passing in a game since Tony Scales against Western Carolina in 1991.

Barnson, who was named Freshman of the Week, caught two touchdown passes in the win over the Colonials. He notched his first career TD with a career-long 49-yard score with 4:17 left in the first quarter to give the Keydets a 7-0 lead. With VMI leading 20-13 and facing a 4th-and-8, Barnson's 32-yard touchdown catch capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive that helped VMI pull away from the Colonials. Barnson finished the day with two catches for 81 yards, becoming the first Keydet with two receiving touchdowns in a game since Mike Maleski against Gardner-Webb in 2005.

ROBERT MORRIS GAME HITS HIGH MARKS

- The 40 points, 551 yards total offense, and 443 yards rushing logged against Robert Morris were all VMI highs under Jim Reid. The 551 yards total offense was the most ever given up by a Robert Morris defense.

ROAD BUILDING - VMI's 40-13 win at Robert Morris Sept. 29 was its first road win since a 10-7 victory at Liberty on Oct. 1, 2005, ending a 12-game winless streak away from home. It marked the first time that the Keydets scored 40 points in a game since scoring 52 points in a triple-overtime loss to Gardner-Webb on Oct. 22, 2005. It also was the first time VMI scored 40 points on the road since scoring 47 vs. William & Mary at the Oyster Bowl in Norfolk, Va. in 1990. The last time VMI scored 40 points in a road win was in 1986, when the Keydets won 47-30 at The Citadel.

THREE HIT THE CENTURY MARK - When Joey Robinson scampered into the endzone to cap VMI's last score in the 40-13 win against Robert Morris September 29, the run put Robinson at 100 yards rushing for the game, giving VMI three 100-yard rushers in the same game for the first time since 1991, when Tony Scales, Marcus Mines, and Scott Council each turned in 100-yard rushing efforts against East Tennessee State. It was also the first time in a Big South game that a team had three 100-yard rushers.

Sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah rushed for 157 yards against the Colonials while sophomore quarterback Kyle Hughes gained 136 yards on the ground.

HUGHES A DOUBLE THREAT - VMI sophomore QB Kyle Hughes 136 yards rushing and 108 yards passing against Robert Morris Sept. 29 was the fifth time such a performance was turned in by a

Hughes' 136 rushing yards at Robert Morris was also the third-most by a quarterback in Big South history, falling just four yards short of the single-game record of 140, set by Elon's C.W. Singletary at North Carolina A&T in 2002. Hughes' 71-yard TD run against the Colonials marked the third-longest rush of scrimmage by a quarterback in Big South history, and ranked tenth longest overall.

WHAT A GRAB - Redshirt junior receiver Rick Goodwin (Richmond, Va.) caught his first collegiate touchdown pass with a 16-yard snag off the arm of Kyle Hughes late in the game against Lehigh Sept. 22. Goodwin, who had served as an understudy at wideout the last two years had not caught a pass in college competition prior to the Lehigh game.

YOUTH ON 'O' LINE - The offensive line continued to see new faces as James Boatright (6-0, 250, Grayson, Ga.) saw considerable action at center in a reserve role against William & Mary and moved into the starting role in week three where he has remained for the last seven games. Boatright joins guard Bo Wren as two true freshman who have started almost every game on the offensive line this year for the Keydets.

DEFENSE RULES - The Sept. 1 season opening 20-0 blanking of Lock Haven was the first shutout by a VMI team since September 3, 2005, when VMI opened the season with a 33-0 blanking of Davidson. The VMI defense limited the Bald Eagles to 162 yards total offense which was the best posted since Jim Reid took over as head coach in 2006. The Keydet defenders limited LHU to 66 rushing yards and 96 passing yards, also best marks posted in the Reid era. The Keydets also won their third straight season opener-all at home.

TAYLOR TABBED AS TOP DEFENDER - VMI's Joe Taylor made his first college football start against Lock Haven Sept. 1 a memorable one. Taylor, a redshirt-sophomore from Benedictine High School in Richmond, Va., played his first game at outside linebacker for the Keydets, and responded with a team-high 12 tackles (four solo, eight assists) in VMI's 20-0 season-opening win over Lock Haven. For his effort he was named New Balance Big South Defensive Player of the Week. He was the only defender in double-digit stops and helped VMI to its first shutout in two years. Taylor also recorded a half-

sack for minus-3 yards in helping the Keydet defense limit the Bald Eagles to 162 yards total offense.

JACKSON MOVES PAST MILESTONE -

Senior Slotback Nat Jackson moved past the 1,000 yard career rushing mark with a strong 80-yard on nine carry performance against Lock Haven Sept. 1. Jackson now has 1,108 yards for his four-year career and scored his 13th career rushing touchdown on a one-yard run in the fourth quarter against William & Mary. He also had 10 knockdowns blocking against the Tribe in the Keydets' triple-option attack. Jackson returned to action against Presbyterian October 13 after missing three games with a mid-section injury, but has not played the last three games.

The Massaponax, Va. native also serves as team captain for the 2007 season.

RAINEY-WILES MAKES HISTORY IN DEBUT -

Freshman slotback Michael Rainey-Wiles (Pittsburgh, Pa.) electrified the Foster Stadium crowd in the season opener Sept. 1 with an 83-yard touchdown run for VMI's final score of the day and in the process set a new mark for the longest run from scrimmage in Big South Conference football history. It has since been surpassed twice this season by conference runners. On the school record books, it also tied him for the fourth longest run in VMI history alongside Johnny Mapp's 83-yard run against Catawba in 1953.

DEFENSIVE FRONT DEBUT - Three of VMI's four defensive front regulars had never played a down before the Sept. 1 against Lock Haven, but the trio of new faces made a good showing this season. Red-shirt freshman tackle Ben Brandt (Forest, Va.) has made 33 tackles on the year with 6.5 tackles for loss and true freshman tackle Josh Wine (Fredericksburg, Va.) has 27 tackles and three sacks while end Damiso Alexander (Richmond, Va.) has 19 tackles and two sacks.

KEYDETS HIT '07 WITH YOUTH - A quick check of the VMI 2007 roster shows that there are plenty of new faces taking the field for the Red, White, and Yellow this fall.

Of the 93 players listed on the opening day roster, 52 players have either true or red-shirt freshman designation with 38 true freshman and 14 red-shirt freshmen. The rest of the roster breaks down with 22 sophomores, 12 juniors, and just seven seniors.

Despite the youth, there is considerable starting lineup experience on both sides of the ball with six starters returning on the offensive side of the ball and seven starters on defense. The Keydets had to replace their two kicking specialists, however.

BROWN LEADS KNOCKDOWN CHART -

Senior offensive lineman Robert Brown (Mesquite, Texas), the veteran leader on the offensive front, has his string of 33 straight starts snapped last week when he missed the Charleston Southern game with an ankle injury. Brown, a second team All-Big South selection a year ago, was tabbed to the 2007 All-Big South

Preseason squad. In his first two games this season, Brown logged 17 knockdowns in each contest against Lock Haven and William & Mary and followed with 12 knockdowns at JMU and leads the O-line in that category with 88.

NUMBER SWAP - A quick switch of numbers at fullback in preseason camp has temporarily caused a bit of confusion on the Keydet roster. Sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah (Beltsville, Md.) has switched from the #32 listed in the 2007 VMI Football Media Guide to #31 while freshman Julian Bowers, who had been previously assigned #31, has moved to #32.

NEW STAFF ADDITIONS - The 2007 VMI assistant coaching staff has two new faces in defensive backs coach Winston October, a former University of Richmond and CFL standout who played under Coach Jim Reid at Richmond, and former tight end Greg Harris (VMI '97), who returns to the football game and practice field after ten years in private business. Harris will assist the defensive line and will help with video analysis.

New Chief of Staff Jeff Hanson, who coached with Jim Reid at the University of Richmond, joined the Keydets during last spring's practice and will also handle the defensive line

LEXINGTON, Va. - Sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah (Beltsville, Md.) rushed for 134 yards on 22 carries and the VMI defense posted its first shutout in two years as the Keydets defeated Lock Haven, 20-0, before 5,862 opening game spectators at Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium.

The VMI defense limited the Bald Eagles to 162 yards total offense which was the best posted since Jim Reid took over as head coach in 2006.

The Keydet defenders limited LHU to 66 rushing yards and 96 passing yards, also best marks posted in the Reid era.

It was the first shutout by a VMI team since September 3, 2005, when VMI opened the season with a 33-0 blanking of Davidson.

The Keydets (1-0) won their third straight season opener - all at home.

VMI took a 7-0 lead with 2:48 left in the first quarter when sophomore slotback Zach Collins scored on a 23-yard burst up the middle to the endzone, capping a nine-play, 80-yard drive that consumed 4:05 off the opening quarter clock. The drive was keyed by Abegesah's four carries for 21 yards while senior slotback Nat Jackson ripped off two runs for 41 yards.

Jackson's two-yard TD run with 11:51 in the third quarter on VMI's opening drive of the half gave the Keydets a 13-0 lead and was keyed by Abegesah's 30-yard run to the Lock Haven two-yard line on the preceding play. The scoring drive consisted of seven plays covering 57 yards.

Freshman slotback Michael Rainey-Wiles (Pittsburgh, Pa.) capped the scoring with an electrifying 83-yard touchdown run off an option pitch. The score came with 2:50 remaining in the game and was the fourth longest run in VMI history.

The Bald Eagles missed their best chance to put points on the board when Marc Domonkos' 34-yard field goal attempt hooked left with 6:53 left in the first quarter.

Sophomore quarterback Ilio DiPaolo completed 14 of 27 passes for 84 yards to lead the LHU offense while freshman receiver Ryan Faddish caught four passes for 23 yards.

Defensively the Keydets were led by redshirt sophomore outside linebacker Joe Taylor (Richmond, Va.) who had 12 tackles including a half-sack while senior defensive end Tommy Lloyd had 2.5 tackles for loss including a half-sack. The Keydets sacked DiPaolo three times and registered nine tackles-for-loss for 34 yards.

The Keydets turned the ball over three times on the afternoon with LHU fumble recoveries by Adam Andrsko, Shawn Crebs, and Mike Chatburn.

Redshirt sophomore Joey Robinson made his first start at quarterback for the Keydets and rushed for 22 yards on 11 carries while completing both of his two pass attempts. Sophomore Kyle Hughes spelled Robinson in both the second and fourth quarters and rushed four times for 19 yards and completed two of three passes for 35 yards.

Other top VMI rushers included Jackson with 80 yards on nine carries while sophomore slotback Tim Maypray had 104 all-purpose yards.

LEXINGTON, Va. - After spotting VMI an early lead, William & Mary came back in full force converting nine of 12 possessions into touchdowns and defeated VMI, 63-16 to spoil a crowd of 6,830 at Alumni Memorial Field in Lexington.

William & Mary junior quarterback Jacob Phillips played a nearly flawless first half, completing 13 of 15 passes for 242 yards and tossing three touchdowns passes before giving way to senior Michael Potts who played the entire second half.

W&M and VMI both gained 249 yards rushing on the ground, but the Tribe outpassed VMI, 275-22, in rolling up 524 total yards to VMI's 271 total yards.

Redshirt freshman Courtland Marriner led the William & Mary ground attack with 107 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt junior tailback DeBrihan Holmes scored three touchdowns while running backs Tony Viola and Thomas Schonder each added scores for the Tribe.

The Keydets were led on the ground for the second straight game by sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah, who rushed for 80 yards on nine carries and a touchdown.

William & Mary fumbled on the second play of the game's opening drive as redshirt defensive end Damiso Alexander pounced on a muffed snap exchange at quarterback giving the Keydets the ball at the William & Mary 34 yard line.

VMI moved to the W&M 14 before settling for a 24-yard field goal by freshman Patrick Sweeney, his first collegiate field goal giving VMI a 3-0 lead with 10:52 left in the first quarter.

The Tribe quickly answered with an eight-play, 73-yard drive capped by Holmes' first of three scores- an eight yard run that put W&M up for good with 7:54 left in the opening quarter.

A William & Mary fumble recovery on the Keydet 41 on the next drive led to a four-play 41-yard possession topped by another Holmes scoring run to make it 14-3 with 3:34 left in the first quarter. A Phillips to R.J. Archer pass covering 34 yards on a third and seven keyed the drive.

Phillips hooked up with wideout Elliott Mack for a 31-yard TD pass on the Tribe's next drive to push the William & Mary lead to 21-3 with 13:20 left in the second quarter, but VMI answered to cut the margin to 21-10 with 11:26 remaining when Abegesah broke free on a 23-yard burst up the middle to the endzone capping a six-play, 70-yard drive that stayed all on the ground.

A 32-yard pass from Phillips to tight end Rob Varno to the VMI four set up Holmes' third touchdown of the day one play later to put the Tribe up, 28-10, with 9:15 left in the quarter, but William & Mary was able to take advantage of good field position late in the second quarter to produce two more scores before halftime and assume a 42-10 lead at the break.

William & Mary added second half scoring runs from Marriner (10 yards), Schonder (6 yards), and Viola (4 yards) while the Keydets produced a 10-play, 75-yard drive early in the fourth quarter that ended with senior running back Nat Jackson slamming in the from the W&M 1-yard line with 14:08 left in the game.

HARRISONBURG, Va. - VMI controlled the ball for 22 minutes in the first half, yet came up empty on the scoreboard as #7 JMU's quick strike offense led the Dukes to a 45-17 win over the Keydets on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium in Harrisonburg.

Despite having three drives beyond the JMU 35 yardline in the game's opening half, the Keydets trailed by a 21-0 margin at the half, thanks to rushing touchdowns from redshirt freshman Jamal Sullivan and redshirt senior Antoine Bolton, as well as a 36-yard scoring strike just before the half from redshirt junior quarterback Rodney Landers to senior L.C. Baker.

The Keydets posted 17 points in the second half, as red-shirt freshman Howard Abegesah collected a 27-yard touchdown run, while Tim Maypray ran back VMI's first kickoff return for a touchdown in nearly six years to cap the Keydets' scoring. A 46-yard field goal by freshman Patrick Sweeney accounted for the team's first points on the day, marking the longest field goal in nearly two years by a Keydet.

Abegesah led the Keydets on the ground with 71 yards, while Joey Robinson was just behind with 67 yards on the ground and 91 yards through the air. Maypray caught a game-high six receptions for 61 yards while accounting for 182 all-purpose yards.

Baker led the Dukes with 130 all-purpose yards, with 79 coming on his four receptions and 60 coming on his two carries. Sullivan led JMU on the ground with 83 yards.

The Dukes held advantages in rushing yards (298-152) and passing yards (184-102), though the Keydets held the ball for 34:44 of the game's 60 minutes.

BETHLEHEM, Pa. - Despite playing nearly an even second half with their hosts, the VMI football team could not overcome a quick start by the Lehigh Mountain Hawks in a 37-6 setback before 6,550 fans at Goodman Stadium in Bethlehem, Pa. VMI dropped its third straight and fell to 1-3 with the loss while Lehigh raised its record to 2-1.

The Mountain Hawks, using big plays in the passing game and special teams, scored on its first three possessions of the game to jump to a 21-0 with 14:48 remaining in the second quarter.

VMI avoided a shutout by scoring with :13 left in the game with sophomore wide receiver Rick Goodwin caught his first college TD pass off the arm of quarterback Kyle Hughes. - a 13-yard floater in the left corner of the endzone.

Keydet fullback Howard Abegesah led VMI in rushing for the fourth straight game with 58 yards on 21 carries while sophomore slot-back Tim Maypray continued to make things happen when he touched the ball by piling up 245 yards in all-purpose running.

VMI outgained the Mountain Hawks, 178-136, on the ground but Lehigh, led by quarterback Sedale Threatt, completed 16 of 22 passes as a team for 311 yards as Threatt tossed three TD's in a 14 for 19 outing.

The Mountain Hawks set the tone on the opening kickoff when John Kennedy returned it 39 yards to the VMI 47. Six plays later, Threatt found junior tight end Troy Healion on a 13-yard TD pass for the opening score with 12:18 left in the first quarter.

VMI moved to the Lehigh 32-yard line on its opening drive but turned the ball over on downs when Abegesah was dropped for a three-yard loss at the 35. It took just four plays for the Mountain Hawks to hit the endzone as Threatt found a wide open Nick Johnson at the 30-yard line and the junior eluded a final defender for a 52-yard scoring play to make it 14-0 with 5:45 remaining in the first quarter.

The Keydets then amassed another time consuming drive on its next possession, moving from its own 38 to the Lehigh nine-yard line in 11 plays, but freshman Patrick Sweeney missed a 26-yard field goal to the right and VMI missed its best opportunity for points in the first half.

Lehigh opened up its second play on the ensuing drive with a quick lateral from Threatt to receiver Pete Donchez who threw to Johnson down the right sideline for a 66-yard scoring catch and run to give Lehigh a 21-0 lead on the first play of the second quarter.

The Mountain Hawks tacked on 10 more points before halftime when freshman tailback Kwesi Kankam scored on a 13-yard draw play capping a 10-play, 65 yard drive with 5:11 remaining in the second quarter. Jason Leo added a 22-yard field on the last play of the half to put Lehigh ahead, 31-0 at the break. The score was set up when Hughes under threw a screen pass attempt and the pass was intercepted by LU defensive back Jesse Sanchez the Lehigh 45.

The VMI defense stiffened after halftime, forcing the Mountain Hawks to punt twice and also recovered a fumble by end Andy Viola and forced another punt at the start of the fourth quarter. But Threatt teamed with Healion for a 30-yard touchdown pass with 10:10 remaining for the Mountain Hawks only score after halftime.

The Keydet defense held Lehigh to 129 yards total offense in the second half after surrendering 318 yards in the first half.

MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa. - VMI's option attack rolled up a season-high 551 total yards including 443 rushing and the Keydets snapped a three-game losing streak with a 40-13 win at Robert Morris.

Sophomore quarterback Kyle Hughes (Williamsburg, Va.) rushed for 136 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns and completed touchdown strikes of 49 and 32 yards to freshman receiver Bryan Barnson (Chesapeake, Va.). Hughes became the first quarterback since Tony Scales (1991 vs. Western Carolina) to rush for over 100 yards and throw for 100 or more yards in a game.

Sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah (Beltsville, Md.) led VMI in rushing for the fifth straight game with a career-high 157 yards on 27 carries. Abegesah averaged 5.8 yards per carry on the day and set the tone for VMI's strong ground game - especially in the second half when the Keydets held off a Robert Morris comeback.

The Colonials rallied from a 20-3 late second quarter deficit and pulled within 20-13 with 8:59 left in the third quarter when junior quarterback Erik Cwalinski connected with senior receiver Alvin Hall on a 37-yard TD strike.

But the Keydets responded by scoring on their next two possessions with a pair of 80-yard drives, while the defense neutralized the Colonial passing game with constant pressure on the quarterback and tight coverage by the secondary.

Looking for breathing room, VMI took the ball from its own 20 and marched nine plays and 80 yards to the endzone, capping the decisive third quarter drive with a 34-yard TD pass from Hughes to Barnson on a fourth and eight call. The score put VMI up, 27-13 with 4:10 left in the third quarter.

After forcing RMU to punt, the Keydets took over again and assembled another 80-yard scoring drive, taking ten plays to reach the end zone on a Tim Maypray two-yard run to push the VMI lead to 33-13 with 10:46 left in the fourth quarter.

VMI capped its scoring on the day with 1:55 left with a six-yard sweep run by junior back Joey Robinson for his first touchdown on the year. The run also put Robinson at 100 yards rushing for the game, giving VMI three 100-yard rushers in the same game for the first time since 1991, when Tony Scales, Marcus Mines, and Scott Council each turned in 100-yard rushing efforts against East Tennessee State.

Defensively, the Keydets forced two turnovers and racked up 11 tackles for loss including four sacks.

Sophomore defensive back Bryant Youngblood (Youngstown, Ohio), who started at free safety while junior Keith Taylor moved to strong safety, led VMI in tackles with 10 stops and one pass break-up. Senior cornerback Marcus Brown (Norfolk, Va.) knocked down three passes to go along with his nine tackles, junior linebacker Jacob Rochester (Dallas, Tex.) had three tackles for loss including a sack, and sophomore linebacker Patrick McKinney (Big Stone Gap, Va.) added two tackles for loss for 13 yards. Redshirt defensive end Damiso Alexander (Richmond, Va.) forced a fourth quarter fumble that was recovered by tackle Josh Wine (Fredericksburg, Va.) and led to VMI's final score.

LEXINGTON, Va. - Redshirt sophomore running back S.J. Worrell rushed for 93 yards and two scores and caught three passes for 74 yards to spark Presbyterian College to a 45-21 win over VMI Saturday before a Keydet Homecoming crowd of 6,433 at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

The Blue Hose broke open the game by outscoring VMI, 21-7, in a decisive third quarter.

VMI pulled within 20-14 with 8:30 left in the third quarter when Tim Maypray hauled in his second touchdown reception of the day, a 32-yarder from quarterback Kyle Hughes.

The Keydets forced PC to punt from midfield on the ensuing possession, but the ball was short snapped in punt formation to Blue Hose quarterback Tim Webb who connected over the middle to Anthony McKnight for a 50-yard TD pass play to put Presbyterian up, 27-14, with 7:29 left in the third quarter.

VMI drove to its own 47 on the next drive but faced a fourth-and-two and elected to go for the first down, but sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah was halted for no gain by linebacker Antwan Thomas.

Two plays later Worrell dashed down the right sideline for a 32-yard touchdown run to stretch Presbyterian's lead to 35-14 with 4:19 left in period.

The Keydets assembled a five-play 74-yard drive behind redshirt sophomore Joey Robinson, who had taken over for Hughes at QB. Robinson capped the drive with a one-yard keeper to pull VMI within 35-21 with 11:18 to play. The drive was keyed by a 35-yard pass from Robinson to freshman wide receiver Bryan Barnson and a 38-yard to the VMI 1 by Maypray.

But the Blue Hose answered again on the next drive when Webb sprinted 65 yards to the endzone on a quarterback draw and silencing the VMI comeback. PC kicker Cam Miller added a 37-yard field goal at the 2:58 mark to cap the scoring.

The teams combined for 1,057 yards total offense-just three yards shy of the Foster Stadium/Alumni Memorial Field record set in 2005 in the VMI-Gardner-Webb game. Presbyterian, which entered the game leading Division I FCS in passing, outgained VMI, 553-504, with a balanced attack of 280 rushing yards and 273 passing yards. The 503 yards total offense racked up by the Keydets was their second straight 500+ yard game.

Webb, who threw for 648 yards passing the previous week in a win against North Greenville, completed 18 of 26 passes to nine different receivers including six for 40 yards to junior Terrance Butler and four for 68 yards to sophomore Larry Thomas.

Sophomore Howard Abegesah led VMI in rushing for the sixth straight game this season and gained 89 yards on 20 carries while Maypray added 56 yards on seven carries.

Defensively, Antwan Thomas led all tacklers with 15 stops for the Blue Hose while sophomore linebacker Ryan Anderson, facing his former team, had 10 tackles including a half-sack.

VMI was led defensively by sophomore Bryant Youngblood who had five solos and five assists for 10 tackles and senior end Tommy Lloyd added eight tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss for 15 yards.

LEXINGTON, Va. - Gardner-Webb rallied with two touchdowns over the last five minutes of the fourth quarter to defeat VMI, 36-22, Saturday afternoon before 8,367 Parents Weekend spectators at Foster Stadium in the Big South Conference opener for both teams. Senior wide receiver Duvaughn Flagler connected with sophomore quarterback Stan Doolittle for a 61-yard touchdown pass play with 5:00 remaining in the game to provide the Bulldogs with what proved to be the winning score.

Leading 22-21 in the fourth quarter, VMI's offense drove the ball to the Gardner-Webb 11-yard line and faced a third-and-one with six minutes remaining. But a fumbled pitch exchange between sophomore quarterback Kyle Hughes and sophomore slotback Tim Maypray resulted in a five-yard loss and was followed by a bad snap on a 33-yard field goal attempt by Patrick Sweeney to send VMI away empty handed in the red zone.

The Bulldogs emerged victorious despite being dominated statistically in many categories by the Keydets. VMI ran a school record-tying 95 plays for 449 yards total offense to Gardner-Webb's 330 yards. VMI outrushed the Bulldogs, 352-111, and held a 39:42 to 20:18 advantage in time of possession. VMI rolled up a season high 28 first downs to GWU's 13 first downs.

Doolittle completed 10 of 15 passes for 151 yards and sophomore running back David Montgomery added 97 yards rushing and two touchdowns to lead the GWU attack. Flagler hauled in four catches for 75 yards while junior wide receiver Dobson Collins caught three passes for 87 yards and a touchdown.

Gardner-Webb capitalized on big defensive plays and jumped to a 14-0 lead after one quarter on a 46-yard interception return for a touchdown by sophomore linebacker Quantavis Jackson and a 19-yard sweep TD run by Montgomery on a drive that was set up by a Cedric McGowan interception.

CONWAY, S.C. - VMI's bid to spoil Coastal Carolina's homecoming game fell short Saturday night as the Chanticleers rallied with 14 straight fourth quarter points to win a 42-35 shootout at Brooks Stadium.

Senior fullback Mike Tolbert's Big South record 86-yard touchdown run with 2:51 left proved to be the game winner as CCU withstood a 525-yard total offense attack by VMI's option offense.

VMI fell to 2-6 overall and is 0-2 in the Big South while Coastal Carolina moved to 3-5 and 1-1 in the conference.

The Keydets, who entered the game ranked fourth in the nation in rushing, pounded out 296 yards on the ground against CCU, but also generated 229 yards passing against the nation's leading pass defense in FCS (I-AA).

VMI sophomore quarterback Kyle Hughes completed 17 of 19 passes for all of VMI's 229 yards through the air and tossed two touchdown scores, one each to sophomore slotback Tim Maypray and freshman wide receiver Mario Scott. Both Maypray and Scott caught four passes with Maypray netting 94 yards and Scott 84 yards.

Sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah produced his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season and led the VMI ground attack with 116 yards on 23 carries and one touchdown.

But it was Tolbert's 244 yards rushing and two scores that proved to be the difference. Tolbert finished just one yard shy of the most rushing yards in a game by a Big South player.

A three-play, 77 yard scoring drive, with all rushes coming from Tolbert in carries of 57 yards, four yards, and a one-yard, produced a key scoring drive at the 12:00 minute mark of the fourth quarter and pulled CCU even with the Keydets, 28-28.

But the Keydets answered on the next drive with a seven play, 66-yard possession that was capped by a 19-yard run to the endzone by Hughes, who fumbled as he was hit crossing the goal line. The ball was recovered, however, by an alert Maypray in the endzone for the score. VMI led, 35-28, with 6:54 remaining in regulation.

On the ensuing kickoff, junior Arthur Sitton raced 85 yards down the right sideline to tie the game for the fifth time at 35-35 at the 6:40 mark and the Chanticleers took the lead for good on the next possession when Tolbert bounced off a pile of tacklers at the line of scrimmage and raced down the right sideline for the game-winner with 2:51 left.

VMI mounted a threat on its last possession, moving to the CCU 37-yard line before Hughes was picked off by CCU safety Brandon with :41 left in the game.

Game 9: VMI Drops Big South South Game To CSU, 37-28

LEXINGTON, Va. - Junior defensive back Okeba Rollinson returned a fourth-quarter fumble recovery 53 yards to help lead Charleston Southern to a 37-28 win over VMI in Big South Conference action Saturday at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

The Buccaneers trailed 28-21 heading in to the fourth quarter, but outscored the Keydets 16-0 in the final period to snap a four-game league losing skid.

The Buc win overshadowed a record setting day for VMI sophomore slotback Tim Maypray (Madisonville, Ky.), who finished with a school and Big South record 346 all-purpose yards and also hauled in the longest pass play in conference history.

VMI entered the final quarter leading 28-21 following a 10-yard TD sweep run by sophomore slotback Joey Robinson on the last play of the third quarter. The Keydets had assembled a 13-play, 59-yard drive that was kept alive by a 13-yard fourth and seven pass from quarterback Kyle Hughes to Maypray to the CSU 13-yard line.

The Bucs responded quickly on the ensuing drive taking just five plays to move 58 yards to the endzone sealing the drive with an 18-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Sidney Bryant to junior wideout Dee Brown to tie the game at 28-28 with 12:32 left in the fourth quarter.

On the ensuing drive, VMI moved the ball and chewed up clock in steady fashion, moving from its own 22 to the CSU 44 in nine plays. Facing third down and four, sophomore fullback Abegesah had the ball stripped

by senior tackle Marco Ramirez at the line of scrimmage and Rollinson scooped up the ball and raced 53 yards untouched down the left sideline for the score that would put CSU up for the first time on the day and a lead the Bucs would never relinquish over the final 8:17 of the game. The extra point was missed, leaving the score, 34-28.

VMI's ensuing drive stalled on downs at the Buc 32 yard line with 3:58 to play, and CSU moved 65 yards in nine plays on its next drive and took a two-score advantage at the 2:00 mark on a Nick Ellis 22-yard field goal. The Buccaneers during the drive faced fourth down and two from its own 39, but executed a 25-yard fake punt run by Josh Warrior to hold onto the football.

Maypray, who has caught six touchdown passes over the last four games, caught touchdown strikes of 34 yards and 87 yards from Hughes. The 34-yarder put VMI on the board first with 6:10 remaining in the first quarter, and the 87-yarder down the right sideline gave VMI a 21-7 cushion with 7:17 left in the third quarter. Maypray's 87-yard TD strike was the longest pass play in Big South history.

But the Bucs quickly turned the tables on the Keydets, scoring two touchdowns over a span of 1:06 in the third quarter to pull even at 21-21. Brown snagged a pass with a leaping grab at VMI 30 and raced to the endzone for a 64-yard score. The Bucs executed a successful onsideline kick on the ensuing kickoff and two plays later Bryant hit junior receiver Markus Murray for a 61-yard TD pass play with 6:14 left in the third.

Bryant, who took all second half snaps after relieving starting QB Eli Byrd, completed 12 of 20 passes for 253 yards and three scores on the day and did most of his damage in the second half, connecting on 9 of 15 aerials for 214 yards and tossing all his touchdown passes in the second half.

Hughes completed 11 of 19 passes for 261 yards and two touchdowns as Maypray hauled in five passes for 209 yards and two touchdowns, becoming only the third VMI receiver to go over 200 yards in a game. The 209 yards also was the second most by a receiver in Big South history.
