COACHES - Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76), a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, became the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 117-year history on February 12, 2008. He brings ten years of head coaching experience at both the SEC and FCS (I-AA) level.

Woods, 54, returns to the FCS (I-AA) ranks where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was also named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 63-47-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003 through 2006 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

Jimmy Laycock (William & Mary '70) is in his 29th season as head coach of William & Mary where he holds a record of 182-135-2 record making him the winningest coach in school history. He has led the Tribe to winning seasons in 18 of the last 25 years, three A-10 championships and seven NCAA playoff appearances. William & Mary enjoyed its most successful season in history in 2004 when it posted an 11-3 record and advanced to the NCAA I-AA semifinals. The Tribe also claimed the Atlantic 10 Co-Championship in 2004.

A VMI Win Against William & Mary Would -

◆ Mark VMI's first win against the Tribe since 1985, a streak of 22 consecutive games.

◆ Give VMI their first 2-0 start to a season since 2002.

◆ Make Sparky Woods the first VMI head coach to go 2-0 to begin his career since A.W. (Slick) Morton engineered wins over Catawba and George Washington in 1947.

◆ Be the Keydets' first win against an in-state opponent since defeating Liberty 10-7 on Oct. 1, 2005.

◆ Mark VMI's first win over a CAA opponent since defeating Richmond 20-7 on Nov. 9, 1996.

Looking Ahead - VMI plays host to Chowan (N.C.) next Saturday at 1:30 p.m. The Hawks fell to 0-2 on the season by dropping a 13-0 decision to Saint Paul's. It will mark the first-ever meeting between the two schools and the first time that VMI has played a member of the CIAA.

SERIES NOTES

THE SERIES- This will be the 86th meeting between the two state schools with William & Mary holding a 50-33-2 advantage in the series. William & Mary has won 22 straight in the rivalry with VMI's last win coming in 1985, 39-38, in Lexington. William & Mary defeated the Keydets last year, 63-16 in Lexington.

LAST MEETING - After spotting VMI an early lead, William & Mary came back in full force converting nine of 12 possessions into touchdowns and defeated VMI, 63-16 to spoil a Reunion Weekend crowd of 6,830 at Alumni Memorial Field in Lexington on September 8, 2007.

William & Mary junior quarterback Jacob Phillips played a nearly flawless first half, completing 13 of 15 passes for 242 yards and tossing three touchdowns passes before giving way to senior QB Michael Potts who played the entire second half.

William & Mary and VMI both gained 249 yards rushing on the ground, but the Tribe outpassed VMI, 275-22, in rolling up 524 total yards to VMI's 271 yards total offense.

Redshirt freshman Courtland Marriner led the William & Mary ground attack with 107 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt junior tailback DeBrien Holmes scored three touchdowns while running backs Tony Viola and Thomas Schonder each added scores for the Tribe.

The Keydets were led on the ground by sophomore fullback Howard Abegesah, who rushed for 80 yards on nine carries and a touchdown.

William & Mary fumbled on the second play of the game's opening drive as redshirt defensive end Damiso Alexander pounced on a muffed snap exchange at quarterback giving the Keydets the ball at the William & Mary 34 yard line.

VMI moved to the W&M 14 before settling for a 24-yard field goal by freshman Patrick Sweeney, his first collegiate field goal giving VMI a 3-0 lead with 10:52 left in the first quarter.

The Tribe quickly answered with an eight-play, 73-yard drive capped by Holmes' first of three scores- an eight yard run that put W&M up for good with 7:54 left in the opening quarter.

LAST WEEK FOR VMI- Juniors Tim Maypray and Zach Collins each rushed for two touchdowns and eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark while VMI's defense pitched a shutout in its opener for the second straight season as the Keydets blanked Saint Francis (Pa.), 49-0, Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

Maypray, the all-purpose yardage machine who ran out of the slotback position his first two years at VMI, made his first start at quarterback and rushed for 116 yards with scoring runs of 52 and 35 yards while Collins turned in his first career 100-yard game with a career-high 112 yards on just two touches with both runs resulting in scores of 62 and 50 yards.

VMI defense, which shifted to a 3-4 alignment this season, limited Saint Francis to a school and stadium record -4 yards rushing and also forced two fumbles which led to scores.

The Keydets won their fourth consecutive season opener and posted their third blanking over that four-game span.

The Keydets outgained Saint Francis, 444-252, including 418 yards on the ground. VMI also converted 5 of 10 third down conversions while the defense generated 11 tackles-for-loss including four sacks.

SFU quarterback George Little completed 23 of 45 passes for 256 yards while Red Flash wide-outs Omar Winston and Antoine Rivera caught seven and six passes, respectively.

The Red Flash had their best opportunity to score when they held the ball for 16 plays and 59 yards while consuming 7:11 off the third and fourth quarter clock, but the drive stalled at the VMI 13.

The Keydets jumped to a 14-0 lead after one quarter scoring on two of their first three possessions. Maypray's 52-yard option keeper on the opening possession produced the contest's first score capping a four-play, 64-yard drive which ended at the 13:17 mark. VMI struck again on the last play of the first period when Collins took an option pitch and raced down the left sideline for a career-long 62-yard score. Collins followed at the 8:22 mark of the second quarter when his second and final rushing attempted resulted in a 50-yard TD run extending VMI's lead to 21-0.

VMI's defense produced the final Keydet score of the first half when Little, pressured by VMI senior linebacker Jacob Rochester tossed an inadvertent lateral that was scooped up by sophomore defensive end Damiso Alexander who raced 46 yards for a touchdown and extending VMI's lead to 28-0 at halftime.

Maypray's second touchdown, a 35-yard option keeper, capped an eight-play, 67-yard drive and pushed the margin to 35-0 with 10:28 left in the third quarter. Keydet junior back Howard Abegesah carried four times for 15 yards to help set up the score.

Fumble recoveries by redshirt freshman Emilio Calvin and freshman Josh Sneed set up VMI's final two touchdowns of the fourth quarter. Junior quarterback Kyle Hughes connected with senior tight end Travis Ludden for an eight-yard TD pass play and Abegesah capped the game's scoring with a one-yard dive with 5:16 left.

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Nikmard led the defensive charts with six tackles including two tackles-for-loss and a sack. Redshirt freshman linebacker A.J. Gross also had six tackles and 1.5 tackles-for-loss.

LAST WEEK FOR W&M - The William and Mary football team fell at North Carolina State, 34-24, in its season opener on Saturday evening in Raleigh, N.C.

Junior wide receiver D.J. McAulay led the Tribe with a pair of touchdown grabs and finished the evening with a game-high six catches for 99 yards, while senior all-conference cornerback Derek Cox also provided a score with a 45-yard interception return for a touchdown.

As a unit, the Tribe defense limited N.C. State to just 67 yards on the ground and held the Wolfpack to just 11 first downs.

Although the College trailed 14-0 at the half, W&M outgained NCSU in total yards, 103-79, and controlled the time of possession by more than three minutes. Additionally, the Tribe defense surrendered just three first downs, all of which occurred on the Wolfpack's final possession of the half.

The Tribe put up its first points of the game on the initial series of the second half when junior Brian Pate connected on a 43-yard field goal. Senior quarterback Jake Phillips completed 3-of-4 passes on the drive and had a pair of rushes for 14 yards to help set up the score.

After a three-and-out later in the quarter, N.C. State increased its lead to 21-3 with a six-play, 77-yard touchdown drive that lasted 2:37. Beck completed a 20-yard pass to tight end George Bryan on the first play of the drive and connected with wide receiver T.J. Graham for a 47-yard strike two plays later to move inside the Tribe's 10 yard line. The drive later culminated when Beck lofted a 1-yard touchdown pass to Bryan in the back left corner of the end zone.

The Tribe answered with a touchdown drive of its own that covered 77 yards on six plays during the ensuing possession. Facing a third-and-11 from its own 28 yard line, Phillips connected with sophomore wide receiver Chase Hill for 30 yards. Three plays later, Phillips completed another 30-yard strike, this time to McAulay in the end zone that narrowed the margin to 21-10. NCSU responded three minutes later with a 39-yard field goal by Josh Czajkowski to go ahead, 24-10.

On the Tribe's next series, NCSU cornerback DeAndre Morgan caused a fumble on a Hill reception and Irving picked up the loose ball, returning it 13 yards to the W&M 13 yard line. The College's defense stood strong, however, and limited the Wolfpack to just a field goal.

Following a three-and-out by the Tribe, N.C. State added another touchdown with 7:48 remaining in the game to take its biggest lead of the contest, 34-10. Beck was 3-for-3 passing for 62 yards on the drive, while running back Curtis Underwood, Jr., provided the score with a 10-yard touchdown run.

Less than two minutes later, Cox put the Tribe back on the scoreboard when he intercepted Beck and ran it back 45 yards down the left side for a touchdown.

Junior quarterback R.J. Archer engineered W&M's final scoring drive, accounting for all but two of the team's 77 yards (49 yds passing/26 yds rushing). A 17-yard strike to McAulay helped set up a 25-yard touchdown strike to the New Haven, Conn., native on the following play.

The Tribe outgained N.C. State on the ground, 115-67, while the Wolfpack held a narrow edge in total offense, 325-303. In addition to being stout against the run, W&M limited N.C. State to conversions on just two of its 16 third downs.

Phillips finished the contest 15-of-30 for 139 yards and a touchdown, while sophomore Terrence Riggins led the team on the ground with 52 yards on 12 carries.

SERIES ONE OF THE OLDEST - The VMI-William & Mary series is longest in the Keydet record books. The Keydets have played the Tribe 85 times and the rivalry is also the longest continuous series in the VMI record books as the teams have played 64 straight years (since 1944) heading into Saturday's game.

TEAM NOTES

IT HAPPENED ON....SEPTEMBER 13, 1980 -

Junior tailback Floyd Allen rushed for 153 yards on 38 carries as VMI defeats William & Mary, 13-10, at Cary Field in Williamsburg. Freshman placekicker Lee Wimbish added field goals of 27 and 32 yards in the third quarter to put the Keydets on top for the rest of the day. It was VMI's most recent victory over the Tribe in Williamsburg, Va.

SHUT IT DOWN - VMI's 49-0 victory against Saint Francis Sept.6 was the largest shutout win by VMI since defeating Central Florida 69-0 on Sept. 25, 1982. It also marked the third time over the last four years that VMI had logged a victorious blanking over its opponent in the season opener. The others were (2005- VMI 33, Davidson 0; 2007- VMI 20, Lock Haven 0). The Keydets have now won their last four season openers and are 18-6-1 in home openers since the 1953 season.

STINGY "D" RULES DAY - VMI established a new school record and a new Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium record last Saturday by holding Saint Francis to -4 rushing yards.

The fewest rushing yards a VMI defense had previously held an opponent was 8 yards against Virginia on November 5, 1977 (30-6, VMI win) and the previous home facility record for fewest rushing yards was -3 yards VMI managed against Marshall in a rain-soaked 24-20 loss to the Herd on September 24, 1988.

DOUBLE TROUBLE - Sophomore quarterback Tim Maypray (129 yds.) & sophomore slotback Zach Collins (112 yds.) each rushed for over 100 yards against Saint Francis, marking the first time since last season's game against Robert Morris (Sept. 29, 2007) that VMI had achieved the feat. Against the Colonials, VMI quarterback Kyle Hughes (136 yards), "B" back Howard Abegesah (157 yards) and slotback Joey Robinson (100 yards) passed the century mark. Maypray Collins each recorded their first 100-yard rushing games and had the longest runs of their career in the game (Maypray- 52 yard touchdown run; Collins 62-yard touchdown run).

VMI's 418 rushing yards against Saint Francis was the most piled up by an FCS team last week and were the most by the Keydets since running up 443 rushing yards against Robert Morris last season.

MAYPRAY EARNS WEEKLY ACCOLADE - In his first start at quarterback, junior Tim Maypray made a big splash, being named Big South Conference Offensive Player of the Week.

It marks the third time that the Madisonville, Ky. native has earned Big South Offensive Player of the Week honors, and it is the sixth overall weekly award he has won from the league (Freshman of the Week twice & Special Teams Player of the Week once).

WOODS SOLID IN DEBUT - Sparky Woods is

the second straight coach to record a shutout victory in his first game as VMI's head coach. In 2006, Jim Reid posted a 33-0 win over Davidson in his debut at Foster Stadium on September 2, 2006 .

LET 'EM PLAY - VMI played 63 players in the Saint Francis win last Saturday, an indication of improved depth and rosters numbers the Keydets intend to utilize in 2008. VMI dressed 85 players in the opener against Saint Francis including a group of 50 freshman that contained 27 true freshman. When the Little John cannon fired for the last time signifying the end of last Saturday's win at Foster Stadium, 33 players on the dress roster had played in their first college game.

THE MAGIC TOUCH - To say that sophomore Zach Collins had big-play ability in VMI's 49-0 win against Saint Francis is an understatement. The junior back from Universal City, Texas touched the ball two times and both resulted in long touchdown runs of 62 yards (career-high) and 50 yards.

Collins perhaps foreshadowed his big day in the season opener when he scored touchdowns on his only two touches in VMI's first spring scrimmage last April.

STEVENS PERFECT - Freshman kicker Greg Stevens (Duluth, Ga.) converted a perfect seven of seven extra point attempts in his college debut against Saint Francis. Stevens was one off the single record of eight for eight established by David Tyler in VMI's 69-0 win over Central Florida on September 25, 1982.

RUSHING THREE-PEAT IN ORDER? - The Keydets will attempt to lead the Big South in rushing for the third-straight season in 2008. VMI ranked fourth in the country in rushing in 2007, averaging a Big South leading 283.2 yards per game.

The Keydets return all of the key components of their backfield in Big South rushing leader and junior Howard Abegesah (1,121 yards), all-purpose yards leader and slotback Tim Maypray (179.5 YPG), and quarterback Kyle Hughes, who ranked fourth in the Big South in total offense with 140.1 yards per game.

ABEGESAH ON DISTINGUISHED LIST - A season ago, running back Howard Abegesah took the Big South by storm, leading the league in rushing yards with 1,121. Included in that total was five games when he rushed for over 100 yards, including three against Big South opponents.

This season, the junior back is on a distinguished list of active players with the most career 100-yard games. Among all FCS players, Colgate's Jordan Scott leads the way with 25 such games in his career, while Liberty's Rashad Jennings is tied for eighth on the list with Appalachian State quarterback Armanti Edwards with 13.

Abegesah's five career 100-yard games ties him for 29th on the list overall and eighth among juniors listed.

WILL YOUTH BE SERVED? - Youth abounds on the 2008 VMI football roster, as only four players with senior eligibility are listed on the 88-man roster. The seniors are wide receiver Keith Taylor, linebacker Jacob Rochester, tight end Travis Ludden and defensive end Andy Viola.

In all, 53 players on the team have freshman eligibility, including 28 true freshmen.

OLD FACES, NEW PLACES - There were a few positional changes in preseason camp to be aware of.

The most notable is that three-year letterman and starter Keith Taylor has moved from the defensive backfield to wide receiver. Taylor, a senior, had started 21 games at both free and strong safety over the past two years and ranked second on the team in tackles in 2007 with 70, including 27 first hits.

Offensive tackle Nick Mims (R-Jr.) was moved back to the defensive line where he will back up at end, a position he had played for a season and a half before being moved to the offensive line late last season.

NEW STAFF ADDITIONS - In addition to the hiring of Sparky Woods as head coach, the Keydet football program welcomes three other additions to the coaching staff.

A.J. Christoff brings a distinguished coaching record to his defensive coordinator position with the Keydets. He has coached at 11 universities around the country and has been a defensive coordinator for 20 years, including stops at Idaho, Oregon, Stanford, Notre Dame, Colorado and Cincinnati.

Don Woods, Sparky's brother, is serving as the program's Chief of Staff while also coaching the defensive line. Woods was a high school coach for 38 years, accruing a 247-96 career mark along with four state semifinal appearances.

Steven Humphrey is a recent graduate of Tusculum and is coaching the Keydet wide receivers. He served two years as a student assistant coach following a three-year playing career as a wideout.

Game 1: Football Shuts Out Saint

Francis 49-0 In Season Opener

LEXINGTON, Va. - Juniors Tim Maypray and Zach Collins each rushed for two touchdowns and eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark while VMI's defense pitched a shutout in its opener for the second straight season as the Keydets blanked Saint Francis (Pa.), 49-0, Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium in Lexington.

Maypray, the all-purpose yardage machine who ran out of the slotback position his first two years at VMI, made his first start at quarterback and rushed for 116 yards with scoring runs of 52 and 35 yards while Collins turned in his first career 100-yard game with a career-high 112 yards on just two touches with both runs resulting in scores of 62 and 50 yards.

The VMI defense, which shifted to a 3-4 alignment this season, limited Saint Francis to a school and stadium record -4 yards rushing and also forced two fumbles which led to scores.

The Keydets won their fourth consecutive season opener and posted their third blanking over that four-game span.

The Keydets outgained Saint Francis, 444-252, including 418 yards on the ground. VMI also converted 5 of 10 third down conversions while the defense generated 11 tackles-for-loss including four sacks.

SFU quarterback George Little completed 23 of 45 passes for 256 yards while Red Flash wideouts Omar Winston and Antoine Rivera caught seven and six passes, respectively.

The Red Flash had their best opportunity to score when they held the ball for 16 plays and 59 yards while consuming 7:11 off the third and fourth quarter clock, but the drive stalled at the VMI 13.

The Keydets jumped to a 14-0 lead after one quarter scoring on two of their first three possessions. Maypray's 52-yard option keeper on the opening possession produced the contest's first score capping a four-play, 64-yard drive which ended at the 13:17 mark. VMI struck again on the last play of the first period when Collins took an option pitch and raced down the left sideline for a career-long 62-yard score. Collins followed at the 8:22 mark of the second quarter when his second and final rushing attempted resulted in a 50-yard TD run extending VMI's lead to 21-0.

VMI's defense produced the final Keydet score of the first half when Little, pressured by VMI senior linebacker Jacob Rochester tossed an inadvertent lateral that was scooped up by sophomore defensive end Damiso Alexander who raced 46 yards for a touchdown and extending VMI's lead to 28-0 at halftime.

Maypray's second touchdown, a 35-yard option keeper, capped an eight-play, 67-yard drive and pushed the margin to 35-0 with 10:28 left in the third quarter. Keydet junior back Howard Abegesah carried four times for 15 yards to help set up the score.

Fumble recoveries by redshirt freshman Emilio Calvin and freshman Josh Sneed set up VMI's final two touchdowns of the fourth quarter. Junior quarterback Kyle Hughes connected with senior tight end Travis Ludden for an eight-yard TD pass play and Abegesah capped the game's scoring with a one-yard dive with 5:16 left.
