2009-10 VMI PREVIEW

An interview with head coach Duggar Baucom

Q - Here we are on the eve of fall practice and before we talk about this coming season, what are your final reflections on the magical season of 2008-09?

Baucom - "It's a credit to our guys. Our senior class last year was awesome. The twins (Chavis and Travis Holmes) and Willie (Bell) and what they brought to our program, along with our senior student assistant coach Nick Matson - it certainly helped our recruiting this past summer. We as coaches went places and the recruits knew who VMI was. Everyone in the country knew about the Kentucky win and our playing in the championship game in the conference. So all that is great, but we start anew now, so we'll see what happens."

Q- I'm sure you've been asked this question many times. What do you do for an encore?

Baucom - "It will certainly be different. We lost basically 50 points per game in Willie and the twins, but we still have 50 points a game coming back. We just expect guys to be able to step up. We had a great freshman class last year and expect more out of those guys. They are past their Rat (freshman) year and hopefully they are a little more relaxed and understand their role. Austin Kenon had a breakout game in the championship game. The key I think for this year is what kind of leadership we'll get from our seniors, Carl Josey and Adam Lonon, whether it's on the court or off the court and what those guys can bring to the table."

Q- Let's break down the backcourt. Kenon is back and you've got great production there, but you have to replace the scoring of the Holmes brothers.

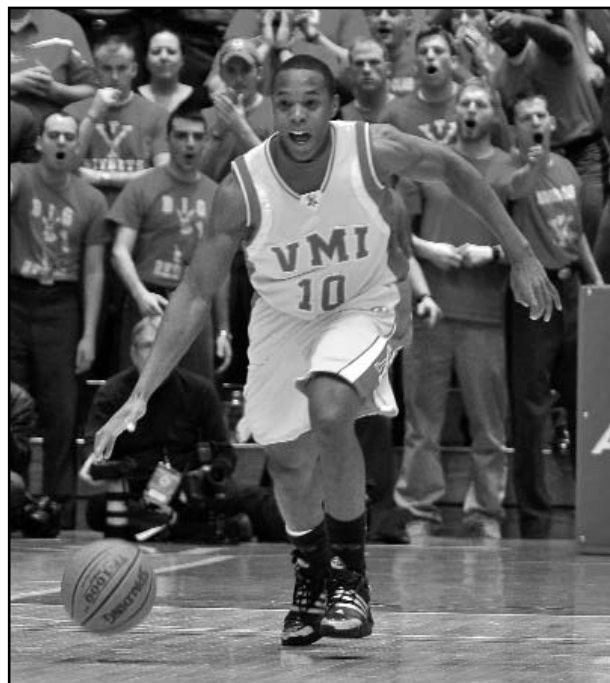
Baucom - "The way we play, it's so different. Start with Adam Lonon, who missed 14 games last year with his leg injury, but he's back healthy and we expect him to contribute this year. We have Ron Burks coming back and he was our starting point guard in 32 games. Ron will just have to be on the court, I don't know what position - he may at point and he may be at four-man because he can guard anybody. He's such a great kid and does what we ask him to do. Of course, Austin Kenon is back. I think he's the best three-point shooter in the league and one of the best in the country. Michael Sparks and Keith Gabriel who are both sophomores now had good freshman years. Keith faded a little bit at the end of the year due to fatigue, and Michael was up and down a little bit, but you always expect that out of Rats. Both those guys had great summers and we expect great things out of them. Joe Carr is a freshman who is a point guard who can also play off the ball. He's a left-handed kid from Houston and he's just tough and hard-nosed. The VMI fans will love him because he plays so hard. He knows just one speed and that's full-out."

Q- Looking at the front line, a big hole with Willie Bell gone and all the leadership he provided. Someone is going to have to step up.

Baucom - "Front line for us is kind of an oxymoron. We don't really have big guys but Carl Josey is a senior and we expect him to help us some this year. Those are big shoes to fill but we've been really pleased with how Wayne Whiting has developed in the preseason with our individual workouts. He's leaned up, runs great, has good hands, and he makes baseline jumpers and he plays hard. He doesn't say a word, but he plays very hard and has gotten better. Stephen Sargent is still a work in progress and we hope to get some minutes out of him. He's very good in drills but we are looking for that to carry over into games. That needs to improve. Two guys that everyone is going to like are Nick Gore and Stan Okoye, two freshman who will come in and play some minutes for us on the front line and in the trail spot. They both can shoot it, and Stan is very athletic and very strong and Nick can really shoot it and pass."

Q - Sounds like you're going to need the freshman step up like last year's newcomers did.

Baucom - "Carr, Okoye, and Gore can play and they are all doing great in the Corps. We've been really

pleased with them in workouts. Stan got hurt during Cadre Week so he's been kind of in-and-out and missed a lot of workouts and conditioning. He may be a little behind at the start, but he's the strongest guy on the team and people are going to really like him. Coach Jack Castleberry is not happy that Stan broke his team bench press record by a large margin the first time they tested. Stan is a monster in the weight room and is going to be a good player for us."

Q -How will the preseason practice schedule look?

Baucom - "We will go four days on and one day off at the outset because we go pretty hard. On November 1 we have our first scrimmage, with another scrimmage later and then we open the 13th against Army. They have a new coach and that will be interesting."

Q - Let's talk about that schedule. It's very challenging once again and you have some great non-conference match-ups and a Big East foe back on the schedule.

Baucom - "Challenging is a good word. We've never beaten Army here after beating them a couple of times up there. We lost a couple of heartbreakers to them here. We head off to Richmond after that which has been a good game for the last three years. Out of conference, we go to Virginia Tech to play an ACC team, to Seton Hall and play a Big East team and to George Mason, a CAA foe. Those are our three "guarantee" games and we also have a very interesting game before Thanksgiving, as we go down to face UNC Wilmington. We start the Big South Conference schedule the first week of December again, so it's going to be tough. "

Q - How do you feel about VMI being picked fifth in the preseason poll despite losing so much from last year's squad?

Baucom - "That's just a testament to our guys and hard they play and we do play a different style than everybody else. That's good. Hopefully we can live up to and exceed those expectations. That's the goal, certainly."

Duggar Baucom begins his fifth season as head coach of VMI Basketball. Since taking over the program, he has injected a brand of fast-paced, high scoring hoops that has brought the team success on the court and wide-spread acclaim off the court.

Each of the past three seasons, Baucom's Keydets have led the NCAA in scoring, a feat accomplished only two other times, and not since 1988-1990's Loyola Marymount squads. On a pair of occasions during that time, the Keydets had the nation's leading scorer donning their uniform - a feat only performed 10 times in NCAA history. In addition, the Keydets' 24 wins last season were the second-most in school history, trailing only the 1976-77 team that advanced to the NCAA Tournament's "Sweet 16", and VMI's second-place finish in the Big South was easily its best since joining the circuit in 2003-04.

Since transitioning to the up-tempo, high-flying system, the VMI record books and undergone a major facelift as 65 school individual, team and facility records been rewritten in the Baucom era. The VMI head man was rewarded with a second contract extension prior to last season, and proved himself worthy of such by leading his team to a 24-8 mark and a berth in the conference finals.

Last season's breakthrough campaign began with a bang. In a win that was described by renowned author John Feinstein as "pretty high on the all-time stunners list", VMI entered the hallowed halls of Rupp Arena and walked away with a historic, 111-103 win over Kentucky in front of a silenced crowd of 22,579. That victory kick-started an unforgettable campaign that saw the Keydets profiled in Sports Illustrated, ESPN The Magazine and the New York Times, along with several other major media outlets, all while winning 10 more games than the previous season and advancing to the program's second Big South Championship Final in three seasons. The season saw Baucom honored as the 2009 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 3 Coach of the Year, while he was also among 10 finalists for the Hugh Durham Award, given annually to the nation's top mid-major coach.

The Keydets' investment in the high-octane approach paid immediate dividends when Baucom and staff rolled out the strategy two weeks before the 2006-07 season opener. The results were astounding. Using an up-tempo system for most of the season, the Keydets won the most games (14) in nine years and advanced to the championship game of the Big South Tournament. The Keydets also set new NCAA season marks in three-pointers, both made and attempted, 3-pointers made per game and steals.



VMI was declared the 2006-07 stat champion in four team categories and two individual categories. The Keydets ranked first in Division I in scoring offense (100.9 PPG), three point field goals (13.4) made per game, assists per game (14.8), and steals per game (13.4).

Individually, junior forward Reggie Williams was declared the scoring champion in Division I after averaging 28.1 points per game. Sophomore guard Travis Holmes captured the steals per game statistical championship with 3.4 per game.

Records fell in bunches that season as well, as by season's end, nearly 75 records ranging from the VMI school annals to opponent facility marks had fresh ink on them.

During the campaign, Baucom's program garnered national recognition for their astounding offensive numbers as media outlets from all across the country wanted to tell the story. The New York Times,



ESPN.com and Sports Illustrated.com were just some of the national outlets who featured Keydet basketball.

By leading VMI to the Big South Finals where they fell to eventual champion Winthrop by a slim three-point margin, Baucom guided the Keydets to a conference championship game setting for the first time since 1988.

Baucom became the 29th head basketball coach of the Virginia Military Institute on April 12, 2005, bringing impressive credentials from Tusculum College in Greenville, Tennessee, where he directed the NCAA Division II Pioneers to back-to-back winning seasons including a conference regular season and conference tournament championship. In two seasons at Tusculum, Baucom compiled a mark of 37-19. In 2004-05, the Pioneers finished 18-11 on the year to post their fourth straight winning season. Tusculum caught fire in the postseason as the Pioneers won their first Food Lion South Atlantic Conference Tournament title, while earning the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. Tusculum was eliminated in the South Atlantic Regional quarterfinals, falling 91-88 in overtime to top-seeded and No. 3 Bowie State University.

While at Tusculum, Baucom mentored three All-South Atlantic Conference selections in Brad Hawks (2003-04, 2004-05), Drew Harmon (2003-04) and Greg McIntosh (2004-05). Baucom was named Tusculum's

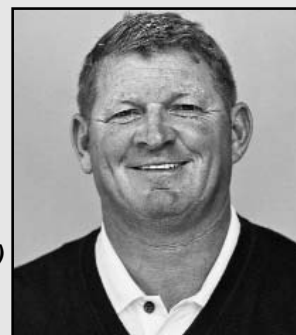

head coach in August, 2003, and guided the squad in his debut season to a 19-8 record while capturing TC's first-ever South Atlantic Conference Men's Basketball Championship. It was also Tusculum's best basketball record since the Pioneers became a NCAA Division II member. Baucom was named 2004 South Atlantic Conference Coach of the Year.

Baucom was well familiar with VMI basketball prior to his arrival, having served as an assistant at two Southern Conference schools when the Keydets competed in the SoCon. He made his collegiate coaching debut in 1995-96 at Davidson College where he served as an assistant coach with the Wildcats. Davidson had a banner season posting a 25-5 tally sheet while claiming a Southern Conference championship with a 14-0 league mark. The Wildcats were ranked fourth in the nation in scoring margin (+15.0) as they advanced to the National Invitational Tournament.

Baucom also served three seasons as an assistant coach at SoCon member Western Carolina University. While at the Cullowhee, N.C. school, he directed the Catamounts' recruiting efforts and landed several top players including guard Kevin Martin, who was a 2004 first round draft pick of the Sacramento Kings.

Baucom also served as an assistant coach at

Northwestern (La.) State in 1998-99 where he implemented a skill development program for perimeter players while directing scouting and coordination of recruiting visits for the Demons. He served the prior three seasons (1996-98) at Mars Hill College where he held a variety of duties including scouting, film exchange, recruiting coordination and the development of Mars Hill's strength and conditioning program.

The Charlotte, N.C. native has over 20 years basketball coaching experience on the collegiate and scholastic level. He started his career as a junior varsity coach at North Mecklenburg High School in Charlotte, N.C. He was later promoted to the varsity coaching staff in 1991 and served in that capacity until 1995 when he left prep coaching for the collegiate ranks. While a prep coach, he also served as head coach of the Amateur Athletic Union's Charlotte Royals from 1992-95, which included his team advancing to the AAU National Tournament.

Baucom is a 1995 graduate of UNC Charlotte, is married to the former Sherry Brown of Hayesville, N.C., and has a 24-year old son, Travis. Sherry played collegiate basketball at Mars Hill, spent several years as the Senior Woman Administrator and Assistant Academic Advisor at VMI and now teaches chemistry at Rockbridge County High School.





DANIEL WILLIS

Daniel Willis, who has coached under Duggar Baucom for seven seasons, begins his fifth season on the VMI staff. Willis spent his first two seasons at the Institute as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2007-08 campaign.

Willis was instrumental in installing the up-tempo style of play the Keydets have employed each of the past three seasons, a style that produced the nation's leading scoring team three years running, two appearances in the conference finals and a two-time national scoring champion (Reggie Williams).

Thrown into the fire in his first season at the Institute, Willis filled in admirably for Baucom in 2005-06 when the head coach was sidelined for seven games in January. Willis guided the Keydets to conference wins over Coastal Carolina and Liberty.

"Daniel has worked very hard and has great ownership of this program," offered VMI head coach Duggar Baucom. "I have been fortunate to have him by my side for the last four years here. He is going to be a great head coach in the near future."

Willis previously coached with Baucom at Tusculum, and played a key role in the Pioneers' memorable run in 2004-05. Tusculum finished 18-11 on the year to post its fourth straight winning season and the Pioneers caught fire in the postseason - winning their first South Atlantic Conference Tournament title while earning the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth.

Willis handled a wide array of duties as Baucom's right-hand man at Tusculum. Willis served as the program's recruiting coordinator; prepared scouting reports and game strategies for every game, organized budget including travel, recruiting, and purchasing, and coordinated and instructing player development sessions. Willis also monitored the team's academic progress and was the summer and fall camp director.

Willis graduated from Lenoir-Rhyne College in Hickory, N.C. in 2001 with a B.S. in Sports Management and minor in Business Administration. He is the South Atlantic Conference's all-time leading scorer, and was a consensus All-American guard at Lenoir-Rhyne College, where he recorded 1,980 points with the Bears from 1997-01. Willis also worked with fellow Lenoir-Rhyne alumnus and Hickory native Rick Barnes at the University of Texas for three summers.

Prior to his stint at Tusculum, Willis previously served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Southern Conference member Western Carolina University and faced VMI when the Keydets were members of the SoCon. Baucom and Willis served together on the WCU coaching staff as assistants from 2001-03. Willis spent his first two seasons at the Cullowhee, N.C. school as a graduate assistant coach while earning a master's degree, then moved to full-time status on the Catamount staff in 2003-04.

Willis, a native of Hickory, N.C., garnered All-American honors at Lenoir-Rhyne in 2000-01 from three different organizations, including National Association of Basketball Coaches/NCAA Division II All-American Second Team, Daktronics/NCAA II All-American Second Team and the Lutheran Brotherhood College All-American First Team. He averaged a SAC record 24.4 points per game that season, which was third best in the nation that year. He was named SAC Player of the Year, SAC Male Athlete of the Year and Lenoir-Rhyne Athlete of the Year. Willis, a three-time All-SAC performer, also holds conference records in points in a season (660), career free throws made (543), free throws made in a season (195), career free throw attempts (684) and free throw attempts in a season (241).

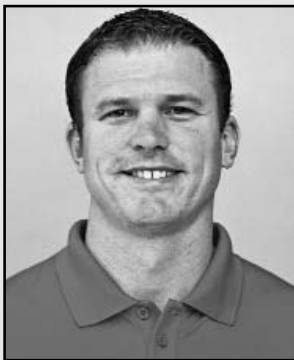

Jason Allison, a former Big South player in the collegiate ranks, begins his fifth season as an assistant coach on the VMI staff.

While at VMI, Allison has played a key role in all facets of the VMI Basketball program, serving as Recruiting Coordinator and assisting with player development. He has been a part of the prestigious offensive numbers the Keydets have put up each of the past three seasons, and worked with two-time individual scoring champion Reggie Williams '08 during that time.

"Jason has done an awesome job as our recruiting coordinator," said VMI head coach Duggar Baucom. "He deserves much of the credit for bringing in the quality cadet-athletes that we have at VMI. Jason is a tireless worker that has a great gift for evaluating talent as well as an ability to build relationships."

Allison came to VMI after serving two years at King College in Bristol, Tenn. Allison was the Tornados' recruiting coordinator for both the varsity and junior varsity teams.

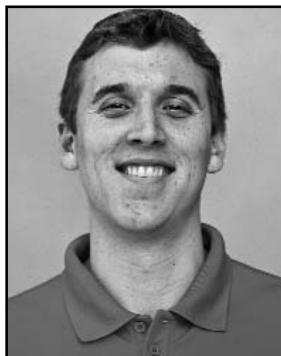
While on the staff at King College, Allison coached two all-conference players and one all-freshman team performer. The 2003-04 squad finished as co-regular season champs and made an NAIA national tournament appearance.

Prior to his stint at King, Allison coached at Gaston Day School in Gastonia, N.C. where he served as the assistant men's coach during the 2002-2003 season. Gaston Day reached the Final Four of the state tournament and compiled a 28-4 mark.

Allison played for Liberty University from 1995-1998 where he was a part of a Big South Regular season title in 1997 and a part of the best team in Liberty history with a record of 23-9.

Allison began his coaching career at Lynchburg Christian Academy at the age of 22. While completing his degree he served as the Head Coach of the junior varsity team and assistant to the varsity during the 1998-1999 season. From there, he was an assistant coach at Lees-McRae College in Banner Elk, N.C. during the 1999-2000 season.

Allison, a native of Lincolnton, NC, received his bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Liberty University in 1999. Allison is married to the former Hope McLaughlin. The couple has a three-year-old son, Riley, born in September, 2006 and their second child, Ryder, was born in December of 2008.

Former VMI player Jack Castleberry enters his second season as the Keydets' newest assistant basketball coach, after his hiring was announced on August 25, 2008. He handles a wide variety of duties, including monitoring the team's academic progress and assisting with scheduling, recruiting and travel.

"We are very excited to have Jack Castleberry back at VMI," said VMI head coach Duggar Baucom at the time of Castleberry's hiring. "As a player, Jack always brought tremendous energy, an unwavering work ethic, and outstanding leadership. We expect him to bring all of those qualities as an assistant coach, but of even greater importance, Jack is a VMI guy who knows what it is like to excel in the classroom, in the corps of cadets and on the floor. As a head coach it is very rewarding to have one of your former players come back to work with you."

"I'm excited about being back at VMI with Coach Baucom and the rest of the staff," said Castleberry at that time. "I've always had a great respect for Coach, and being given the opportunity to work with him at a school that has given me so much is a dream come true."

A three-year letterman and two-year starter for the Keydets, Castleberry graduated from VMI in May, 2007, with a degree in Economics and Business and served as assistant basketball coach at Tennessee-Martin during the 2007-08 season where he was involved in all facets of the men's basketball program, including recruiting, scouting, player development and video exchange.

During his time at VMI, Castleberry served as team captain of the Keydet basketball team in 2006-07, where he helped lead the squad to a 14-win season, marking the most wins at VMI in a decade.

Additionally, Castleberry led the Keydets to their first conference tournament final in 20 years. During that same year, the Keydets led the nation in scoring offense (100.9 ppg), three-point field goals made (13.4 per game), assists (20.6) and steals per game (14.8), including setting NCAA records for three-point field goals made in a season (442), three-point field goals attempted (1383), three-point field goals made per game (13.4), steals in a season (490) and steals per game (14.8).

For his efforts on the playing court, Castleberry was bestowed with the "Spirit of VMI Award" by the coaching staff for his leadership, toughness and hustle.

Before joining the coaching ranks, Castleberry as a summer camp aide held various different coaching roles on the East Coast as a team and teaching station coach for several camps, including stints at Duke, Winthrop, Old Dominion, East Carolina and Army.

High-Scoring Keydets Join Elite List:

VMI topped the nation in scoring for the third consecutive year in 2008-09, averaging 93.8 points per game. With that effort, the Keydets become just the third program to lead the nation in that category three straight years, and the first to do so since Loyola Marymount from 1988-90. Furman also led the nation in points per game for three consecutive seasons, accomplishing the feat from 1953-55. No team has ever led the nation in scoring for four straight years.

Keydets In The National Rankings:

The Keydets had a banner year statistically in 08-09, leading the nation not only in scoring (93.8 ppg), but in 3-pointers per game (13.7), steals (14.2), turnover margin (+9.5) and turnovers forced (23.6), while ranking third in the nation in assists (18.2). Individually, the Keydets also boasted two of the top three players nationally in steals per game, as Chavis Holmes (3.40) led the nation while Travis (3.2) ranked second. Finally, Austin Kenon ranked sixth in three-pointers per game, draining 3.7 per outing.

Leading The Way:

For the past three seasons, the Keydets have gained acclaim for leading the country in scoring (100.9 ppg in 2006-07, 91.3 ppg in 2007-08 and 93.8 ppg last season). What you may not know, however, is that VMI has also led the nation in steals (14.8 spg in 2006-07, 12.7 spg in 2007-08 and 14.2 last year) and in three-pointers made per game (13.4 3pg in 2006-07, 11.6 3pg in 2007-08 and an NCAA 13.7 in 2008-09) over the past three seasons, and also led the country in assists back in 2006-07 (20.6 apg) before placing third last year (18.2 apg).

Keydets Set NCAA Mark Once Again:

For the second time in three seasons, VMI broke the NCAA record for three-pointers made per game.

In 2006-07, VMI shattered Troy's existing mark (11.86) by hitting 13.39 3's per contest, one of five NCAA all-time marks set by the Keydets that season. Last season, the Keydets averaged a stunning 13.69 treys per game, setting the new mark.

Kenon Consistently On Target:

In only his second season on post, Austin Kenon ranked among the national leaders in 3-point shooting.

The sophomore finished last season ranked sixth nationally in 3's made per game with 3.7 per outing. Kenon has now played in 48 career games, and already has 176 career three-balls (3.57 3pg),

shooting 39.5% from distance.

He currently ranks fifth in VMI history in three-point percentage in his career. Kenon is 32 made 3's away from becoming eligible for the Big South's and NCAA's career marks regarding three-pointers. At his current numbers, Kenon would move into the top position 3's made per game in the Big South while ranking ninth on the NCAA list. With his current percentage, he would also place seventh in career 3-point % in the Big South.

VMI Posts Big Wins In Tourney Run:

During last year's postseason, the Keydets won each of their first two outings by a 20-point margin. That effort marked the first time in Big South history that a team had won each of its first two tournament games by at least 20 points, and it is the first time in VMI history the Keydets have won two postseason games in a single season by at least that margin.

The Keydets' 20-point semifinal win over Liberty was the largest margin of victory in a Big South Semifinal in 21 years, since Campbell defeated Winthrop 78-55 in 1989.

It also marked the second straight season that VMI has won back-to-back games by at least 20 points, as VMI knocked off Charleston Southern, 109-85, and UNC Asheville, 97-75, in February 2008.

Keydets Earn #2 Seed In Big South Championship:

VMI earned the #2 seed in the 2008-09 Big South Championship, the best seed the Keydets earned since joining the Big South Conference.

The team's #2 seed was also the best positioning that VMI had in a league-wide (non-divisional) tournament since the 1977-78 season. (VMI was the North division's #2 seed in the Southern Conference Tournament in 1995-96).

Interestingly, that 1977-78 tournament was also the last time that a postseason game was played at VMI, when the Keydets defeated seventh-seeded Davidson 95-80 at "The Pit." Last season, the Keydets defeated Coastal Carolina 96-76 at Cameron Hall in the Quarterfinal round of the Big South Championship.

Baucom Among Hugh Durham Award Finalists:

VMI head coach Duggar Baucom was a finalist for the last year's Hugh Durham Award, given annually to the top mid-major coach in the country.

Baucom was tabbed as one of the final candidates during his fourth season at VMI, when he led the Keydets to their best season in over 30 years. The team's 24 wins were the second-most in school history, while Baucom took VMI to its second

Championship Final appearance in the past three seasons.

The other nine finalists for the award were Randy Bennett (St. Mary's), eventual winner Todd Bozeman (Morgan State), Ed Conroy (The Citadel), Brad Greenberg (Radford), Ben Jacobson (Northern Iowa), Saul Phillips (North Dakota State), J.P. Piper (Nicholls State), Randy Rahe (Weber State) and Brad Stevens (Butler).

Chavis Named to NABC District 3 First Team:

The accolades were numerous last year for guard Chavis Holmes, including being part of the National Association of Basketball Coaches' District 3 First Team.

Holmes was one of two Big South players listed on an All-District First Team, joining Liberty's Anthony Smith while Radford's Art Parakhouski, Gardner-Webb's Grayson Flittner and Liberty's Seth Curry were each included on the District 3 Second Team.

It marked the second consecutive season that VMI had a player named to the First Team, as Reggie Williams did so the season prior. It is only the fourth time in school history that a Keydet has been so honored, as Gay Elmore (1987), Jason Conley (2002) and Williams (2008) are the school's only other First Team Honorees.

#2 VMI Advances to Semifinals With 96-76 Win Over #7 Coastal Carolina:

During VMI's 96-76 win over Coastal Carolina in last year's Big South Championship quarterfinals, four new tournament records were established, another was tied and the Keydets won by at least 20 points for the second time in three outings.

In the game, senior All-Conference First Team selection Chavis Holmes set a new tourney mark with seven steals, while VMI also grabbed the team mark with 19 thefts. VMI's 42 three-point attempts were a new record as well, as were the combined 77 three-point attempts by the two teams. Finally, the Keydets forced 25 turnovers, matching an existing standard.

Holmes Twins Named All-Conference:

VMI twin brother standouts Chavis and Travis Holmes were both named to the 2009 All-Big South Conference post-season squads.

Chavis Holmes was tabbed First Team All-Conference in the voting, which was conducted among the conference coaches and selected media. It marked the second time that he had been designated all-conference, joining the prior campaign when he was named to the league's Second Team. Travis Holmes joined his brother among the All-Conference selections, as he earned a spot among the confer-

ence's Second Team honorees.

It marked the second-straight year that VMI has had multiple players named All-Conference, as Reggie Williams earned First Team accolades in 2007-08, along with Chavis' Second Team nod.

Travis Joins Exclusive Company:

By recording three steals on Feb. 28 against High Point, Travis Holmes became only the ninth player in NCAA Division I history with 1,500 points, 500 rebounds, 300 assists and 300 steals. The list includes some standouts from the past, including Maryland's Juan Dixon, George Washington's Shawnta Rogers and Ball State's Bonzi Wells.

Earlier in the season, Travis had become the first player in Big South history with 1,500 points, 500 rebounds, 250 assists and 250 steals in his career.

Chavis Does It All:

Chavis Holmes showed impressive versatility throughout his career, and his statistics proved it.

With 19 points against High Point on Feb. 28, Chavis became just the sixth player in Big South history with 2,000 points, while also becoming the fourth member of the VMI 2,000-Point Club. Chavis was the first Big South player with 2,000 points, 300 rebounds, 300 3-pointers and 300 assists.

Keydets Turn Heads:

Last season marked the first time in school history that VMI appeared on the CollegeInsider.com's Mid-Major Top 25 Poll. The Keydets were rated as high as 11th in late January, and also placed in the Washington Post's Atlantic 11 poll, which is comprised of Mid-Atlantic Division I schools. That ranking was also a first for VMI basketball. Finally, the Keydets received votes in the AP Top 25 in four different polls last season.

Coming Up Big In Crunch Time:

VMI showed an ability to play with poise last season, posting a 13-4 mark in games decided by 10 points or less. No player was more crucial to those performances than senior Chavis Holmes.

During the last five minutes of regulation, Chavis not only led the team in scoring (3.9 ppg) and field goal percentage (55%), but also accounted for over one-third of the team's free throws. To that end, Chavis hit 87.5% (56-of-64) from the line during crunch time.

In Big South Conference play, Chavis and his brother Travis were nearly equally dominating. Chavis led the team with 4.5 points, while Travis averaged 3.8 of VMI's 13.0 points over the final five minutes of those games, combining to shoot 52% from the field and 76% from the line.

Keydets Fire On All Cylinders Versus Flames:

VMI went to Lynchburg looking for revenge on Feb. 24 after Liberty had defeated the Keydets 91-80 at Cameron Hall in front of the largest crowd in the facility's 28-year history. That loss also stopped a 10-game win streak for the Keydets and ruined VMI's perfect conference mark.

The Keydets got all the payback that they wanted at the Vines Center, scoring their largest road win in over 50 years with a 109-72 victory. It stood as the largest road win since a 97-57 dispatching of Lynchburg back in the 1953-54 season. The rout was fueled by 18-of-36 shooting from beyond the arc and six players in double-figure scoring, including Austin Kenon's 17 points.

30 x 3:

Last year, only two schools in the nation had three different players put up 30 or more points in a game against Division I opponents. Both of those two schools can be found within 100 miles of one another in Southwest Virginia.

VMI, in fact, had four different players hit the 30-point plateau during the 2008-09 campaign. The Keydets got multiple 30-point outings from seniors Chavis and Travis Holmes, while freshman Keith Gabriel rung up Gardner-Webb for 34 points and Austin Kenon matched that number with his scoring output in the Big South Championship against Radford.

and Malcolm Delaney, meanwhile, also turned the trick in 2008-09. This season, the Hokies and Keydets will do battle on Dec. 9 in Blacksburg. The meeting, however, will feature just three of the aforementioned players, as Chavis Holmes, Travis Holmes and A.D. Vassallo each graduated last spring.

Turnovers Tell The Story:

A key to the Keydets' success last season was the team's ability to win the turnover battle. Not only did the Keydets lead the nation in turnover margin (+9.5), but VMI did not lose the turnover battle in a single game last year. Additionally, the team's turnover margin increased to +10.3 in Big South games.

The squad forced at least 15 opponent miscues in each contest last season, and caused 10 more turnovers than they committed in 15 games, going 12-3 in those games.

In Big South play last season, the Keydets averaged only 12.1 turnovers per game while forcing 22.4 per outing. Overall, VMI was 23-4 when outscoring its opponent in points off turnovers.

Twenty-Four 3's Bury Knights:

Playing their final non-conference game of the season, the Keydets made it one to remember by knocking down 18 three-pointers in the first half alone en route to a 113-92 victory against Southern Virginia. For the game, VMI drained 24 treys, a new school record. For those of you counting at home, the NCAA Division I record stands at 28, set by Troy against George Mason on Dec. 11, 1994. Both Chavis Holmes and Keith Gabriel knocked down six shots from distance, while Austin Kenon and Hunter Houston each contributed four. In all, seven different Keydets hit a three-pointer in the game.

Holmes' Move Into Top Spot Among Division I Twin Scorer:

With a combined 47 points in a 92-85 win over High Point on Jan. 24, Chavis and Travis Holmes became the all-time leading scorers among twins at the Division I level.

After a clarification from the NCAA, Johnny & Eddie O'Brien, who were considered the all-time leading scorers among twins at Division I, were deemed to have played at Seattle University for two seasons (1951 & 1952) during which the school participated at the NCAA College Division, the forerunner to modern day Division II. Therefore, the O'Briens, who scored a combined 3,970 points during their three years at Seattle, in fact scored only 1,446 points while competing at the NCAA University Division (in 1953), the fore-

runner to modern day Division I.

That development affected not only the Holmes twins, but Ramon and Damon Williams, VMI Class of 1990. The Williams' scored a total of 3,252 points in their careers, and were briefly considered the leading twin scorers in Division I history, before the Holmes passed them.

A December to Remember:

Entering the month of December, VMI was off to a strong start at 4-2, including the Keydets' stunning, season-opening win at Kentucky.

But what VMI accomplished in December was remarkable. The Keydets went 6-0 during the month, running their overall record to 10-2. Included in the victories were Big South wins over the reigning co-regular season champions, Winthrop and UNC Asheville, as well as comeback wins at Army and at home against Richmond.

The last time that VMI had an undefeated month of at least four games came in 1976-77. The Keydets not only went 6-0 in December of that season, but followed that up by going 10-0 in January.

VMI Rings In New Year In Style:

Thanks to a late 15-5 run on New Year's Eve, VMI knocked off Richmond 73-70 last season. The victory was the Keydets' second in three seasons over the Spiders, and the team's first win over UR in Lexington since Jan. 21, 1991. It marked the first time VMI had ever posted 10 wins before the dawn of the new year.

VMI Escapes Army With Low-Scoring Win:

How bizarre was VMI's 62-55 win at Army last Dec. 21?

It was the fewest points that the Keydets had scored and still won the game under head coach Duggar Baucom. The previous low for a win under Baucom came, not surprisingly, at Army on Dec. 8, 2005 in a 72-63 victory. The last time that VMI scored 62 points or less and still won the game came on Feb. 21, 2004, when the Keydets scored a 61-52 decision against Liberty.

Army forced VMI into one of its worst halves of the season in the game's opening stanza, with the Keydets shooting only 4-of-22 (18.2%) and committing 13 turnovers. It was the fewest field goals that VMI had scored in a half in nearly five years, dating back to a 49-32 loss to Coastal Carolina on Jan. 26, 2004 in the lowest-scoring game in Cameron Hall history.

After connecting on only 3-of-16 (18.8%) three-pointers in the first half, VMI made 10-of-19 (52.6%) from distance in the second half. VMI, meanwhile, made only five two-point field goals and 13 three-pointers in the contest. That is the largest difference between three's made and two's made since losing to Cornell 99-94 on Dec. 1, 2006, when the Keydets hit 19 three-point field goals and nine two-pointers.

It's Raining Threes:

Over a two-game stretch in late November, VMI hit their three-pointers at nearly a historic rate. The Keydets shot an 19-40 from distance in wins against Stevenson (133-72) and Campbell (97-92).

The 19 three-pointers in back-to-back games were the most by VMI since hitting 21 and 20, respectively, against Virginia Intermont and Southern Virginia on Nov. 15 & 20, 2006. In the follow-up to those games, VMI struggled from distance, hitting only 7-of-34 attempts in a loss at Jacksonville State.

Sultans of Swat:

Against Stevenson on Nov. 20, VMI set a new Cameron Hall record with 12 blocked shots.

Leading the way was Chavis Holmes, who set a new career high with four blocks, along with a career-best nine rebounds, five steals and 21 points.

The 12 rejections against Stevenson was the

most in the Baucom era and fell three short of the school-record 15 blocks against Appalachian State in 2003.

Keydets Open Season With Historic Win Over Kentucky:

Behind a career-best 30-point performance by senior guard Travis Holmes, VMI scored its first win over an SEC program in 32 years, stunning Kentucky, 111-103 in front of 22,579 fans at Rupp Arena on Friday, Nov. 14.

The Keydets matched a facility record by an opponent with 14 three-pointers, including five by sophomore gunner Austin Kenon.

Kentucky got a valiant effort from junior Jodie Meeks, who poured in a career-best 39 points in leading a massive second-half comeback. After holding a 57-47 advantage at halftime, VMI extended the lead to 23 points on a three-pointer by freshman Keith Gabriel with 14:10 remaining. After the teams traded buckets to make it 85-62, Meeks led a 35-10 run over the next ten minutes, giving Kentucky their first lead of the game at 97-95 with 4:52 remaining.

It would be the Wildcats' only lead of the night.

Following Ramon Harris' layup to give Kentucky the lead, the Keydets answered quickly with a jumper by senior Willie Bell, knotting the score at 97. Kenon then knocked in his fifth three-pointer of the night, a dagger from the right corner, to give VMI the lead for good. The win was VMI's first against an SEC program since defeating Tennessee 81-75 in the NCAA East Regionals on March 13, 1976. It was the Keydets' first victory in the series against Kentucky since 1922, when the Keydets scored a 37-32 decision.

Kentucky Game Redux:

♦ The loss for Kentucky was only their 55th all-time at Rupp Arena in the 33 seasons of play there. Following the game, UK stood at 415-55 (.883) at the facility.

♦ VMI's 111 points were the most allowed by Kentucky at Rupp Arena since a 116-113 overtime loss to Louisiana-Lafayette on Dec. 23, 1989. It was also the most points Kentucky had given up since Dec. 27, 1989, when it lost 121-110 at North Carolina.

♦ The last time Kentucky scored 100-plus points and lost was a 104-103 overtime loss to Duke on March 28, 1992. That game ended when Grant Hill passed downcourt to Christian Laettner, who hit a turn-around jumper from the free-throw line to send Duke to the 1992 Final Four.

♦ The 14 made three-pointers by VMI were the most UK had allowed since 14 against Penn State on Nov. 25, 2000.

♦ Kentucky's 25 turnovers were the most since committing 26 mishaps against Georgia on Feb. 15,

Out With A Bang:

VMI opened its 2008-09 basketball campaign with a daunting schedule, playing four games in seven days.

The Keydets went 3-1 during the stretch, beginning with a road split at Kentucky and Virginia. In all, VMI played five of their first eight games on the road, going 6-2.

Homecoming For Sparks:

VMI's Michael Sparks began his collegiate basketball career where he ended his high school career - in Lexington, Kentucky. Sparks had five points and three rebounds in his collegiate debut, taking place at storied Rupp Arena in VMI's historic win over Kentucky.

The Tates Creek HS product averaged 19.1 points and 8.5 rebounds his senior year at the Lexington, Ky. school, and became the school's all-time leading scorer surpassing current South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn. Sparks was also selected to play in the prestigious Kentucky-Indiana All-Star game during his final high school campaign.
