2009-10 VMI PREVIEW

An interview with head coach Duggar Baucom

Q - Here we are on the eve of fall practice, and before we talk about this coming season, what are your final reflections on the magical season of 2008-09?

Baucom - "It's a credit to our guys. Our senior class last year was awesome. The twins (Chavis and Travis Holmes) and Willie (Bell) and what they brought to our program, along with our senior student assistant coach Nick Matson - it certainly helped our recruiting this past summer. We as coaches went places and the recruits knew who VMI was. Everyone in the country knew about the Kentucky win and our playing in the championship game in the conference. So all that is great, but we start anew now, so we'll see what happens."

Q- I'm sure you've been asked this question many times. What do you do for an encore?

Baucom - "It will certainly be different. We lost basically 50 points per game in Willie and the twins, but we still have 50 points a game coming back. We just expect guys to be able to step up. We had a great freshman class last year and expect more out of those guys. They are past their Rat (freshman) year and hopefully they are a little more relaxed and understand their role. Austin Kenon had a breakout game in the championship game. The key I think for this year is what kind of leadership we'll get from our seniors, Carl Josey and Adam Lonon, whether it's on the court or off the court and what those guys can bring to the table."

Q- Let's break down the backcourt. Kenon is back and you've got great production there, but you have to replace the scoring of the Holmes brothers.

Baucom - "The way we play, it's so different. Start with Adam Lonon, who missed 14 games last year with his leg injury, but he's back healthy and we expect him to contribute this year. We have Ron Burks coming back and he was our starting point guard in 32 games. Ron will just have to be on the court, I don't know what position - he may at point and he may be at four-man because he can guard anybody. He's such a great kid and does what we ask him to do. Of course, Austin Kenon is back. I think he's the best three-point shooter in the league and one of the best in the country. Michael Sparks and Keith Gabriel who are both sophomores now had good freshman years. Keith faded a little bit at the end of the year due to fatigue, and Michael was up and down a little bit, but you always expect that out of Rats. Both those guys had great summers and we expect great things out of them. Joe Carr is a freshman who is a point guard who can also play off the ball. He's a left-handed kid from Houston and he's just tough and hard-nosed. The VMI fans will love him because he plays so hard. He knows just one speed and that's full-out."



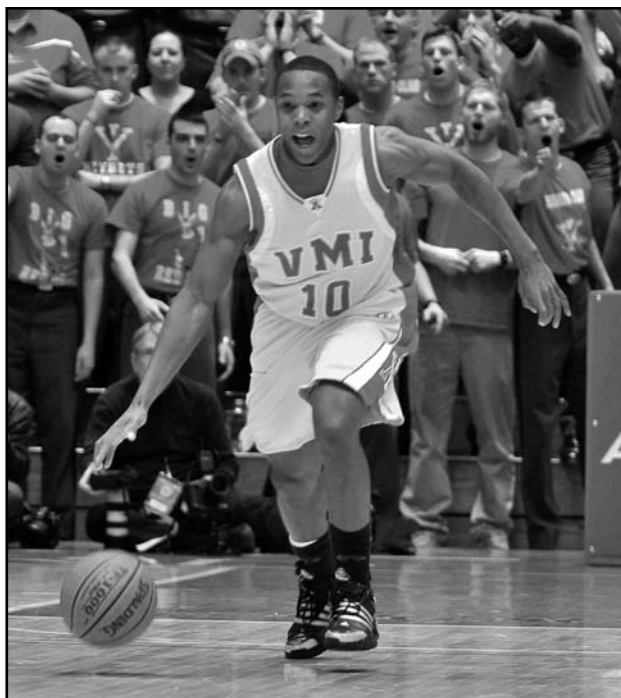

Q- Looking at the front line, a big hole with Willie Bell gone and all the leadership he provided. Someone is going to have to step up.

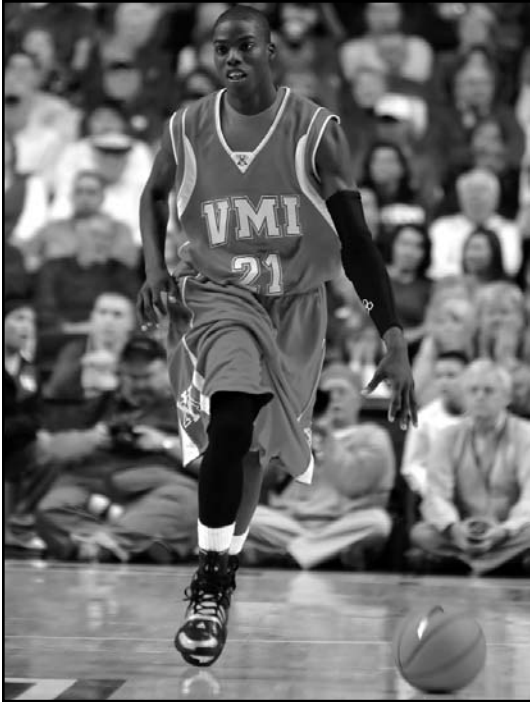
Baucom - "Front line for us is kind of an oxymoron. We don't really have big guys, but Carl Josey is a senior and we expect him to help us some this year. Those are big shoes to fill but we've been really pleased with how Wayne Whiting has developed in the preseason with our individual workouts. He's leaned up, runs great, has good hands, and he makes baseline jumpers and he plays hard. He doesn't say a word, but he plays very hard and has gotten better. Stephen Sargent is still a work in progress and we hope to get some minutes out of him. He's very good in drills but we are looking for that to carry over into games. That needs to improve. Two guys that everyone is going to like are Nick Gore and Stan Okoye, two freshman who will come in and play some minutes for us on the front line and in the trail spot. They both can shoot it, and Stan is very athletic and very strong and Nick can really shoot it and pass."

Q - Sounds like you're going to need the freshman step up like last year's newcomers did.

Baucom - "Carr, Okoye, and Gore can all play and they are all doing great in the Corps. We've been really pleased with them in workouts. Stan got hurt during Cadre Week so he's been kind of in-and-out

and missed a lot of workouts and conditioning. He may be a little behind at the start, but he's the strongest guy on the team and people are going to really like him. Coach Jack Castleberry is not happy that Stan broke his team bench press record by a large margin the first time they tested. Stan is a monster in the weight room and is going to be a good player for us."

Q -How will the preseason practice schedule look?

Baucom - "We went four days on and one day off at the outset because we go pretty hard. We scrimmaged the first two weekends of November before our opener on the 13th against Army. They have a new coach and that will be interesting."

Q - Let's talk about that schedule. It's very challenging once again and you have some great non-conference match-ups and a Big East foe back on the schedule.

Baucom - "Challenging is a good word. We've never beaten Army here after beating them a couple of times up there. We lost a couple of heartbreakers to them here. We head off to Richmond after that which has been a good game for the last three years. Out of conference, we go to Virginia Tech to play an ACC team, to Seton Hall and play a Big East team and to George

Mason, a CAA foe. Those are our three "guarantee" games and we also have a very interesting game before Thanksgiving, as we go down to face UNC Wilmington. We start the Big South Conference schedule the first week of December again, so it's going to be tough. "

Q - How do you feel about VMI being picked fifth in the preseason poll despite losing so much from last year's squad?

Baucom - "That's just a testament to our guys and how hard they play and we do play a different style than everybody else. That's good. Hopefully we can live up to and exceed those expectations. That's the goal, certainly."

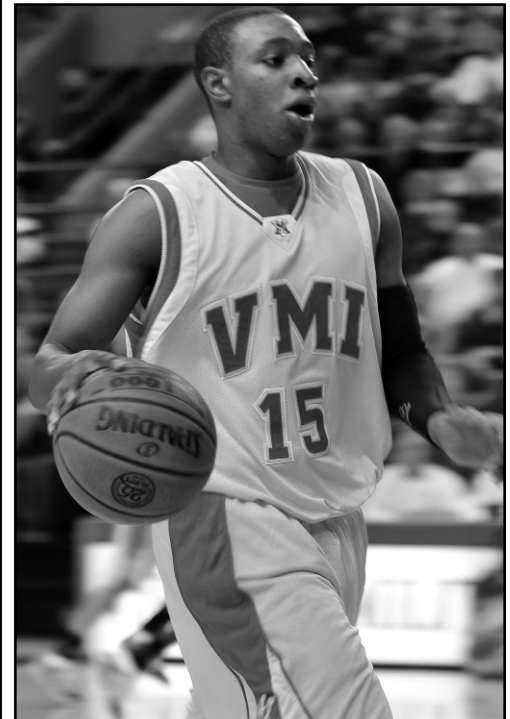

THREE-YEAR LETTERMAN/PSYCHOLOGY MAJOR

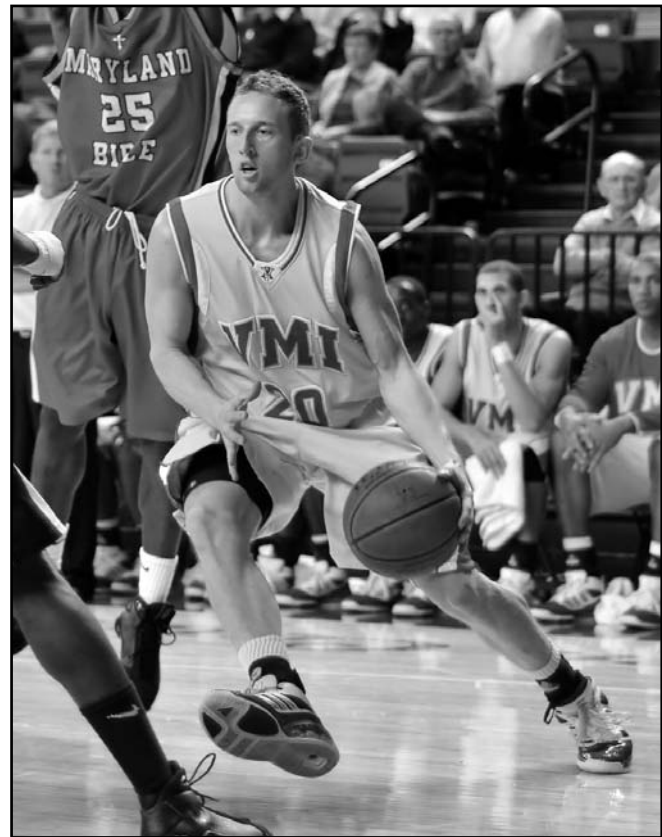
ON JOSEY - Will be counted on for rebounding and quality minutes on depth along the front-line...one of two seniors on the squad...can be a dependable performer on the wing...his role execution will be a needed asset to the Keydet fortunes this year.

2008-09: Played in 20 games with three starts...was counted on primarily for rebounding and defense...grabbed a season-high four rebounds in back-to-back games against Southern Wesleyan and Army in December...scored four points in 11 minutes of reserve action in win against Campbell, hitting of his both shots from the floor...made three consecutive starts in early January against Gardner-Webb, Charleston Southern and Coastal Carolina...played a season-high 17 minutes at Army and logged two steals...lettered for the third time.

2007-08: Developed into a dependable reserve at the end of the season and lettered for the second time...averaged four rebounds per game while coming off the bench over the last seven games of the year...played perhaps his strongest game of the year against High Point (3/1), when he scored nine points, grabbed four rebounds and drained all four shots from the floor in 15 minutes of reserve duty...also scored a career-high 10 points against Columbia Union (11/28), going 3-of-4 from the floor...had a career-high nine rebounds against Charleston Southern (2/11) and Columbia Union (11/28)...played a season-high 24 minutes in Feb. 26 win at Liberty, where he had his lone block on the year, and also played 24 minutes at Winthrop...started 10 games, including the first five of the season...pulled down five rebounds in 14 minutes at South Carolina State.

2006-07: Played in 17 games with three starts...scored 10 points in his first career start at Army on Nov. 28 and grabbed a season-high eight rebounds in the team's opening game at the William & Mary tip-off Classic against Cornell on Dec. 1...appeared in the team's first 15 games but played in only two of the last 18 contests...other starts came against Jacksonville State and Winthrop...connected on 3-of-7 3-point FG against Southern Virginia Nov. 20.

HIGH SCHOOL: Signed in the Fall 2005 period...averaged 20 points, 14 rebounds and 4.7 assists as a senior and was named All-State...received the team's impact player award at The King's Academy his junior year and averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds a game...also averaged three assists and two steals...was honored as the school's Male Athlete of the Year...attended the 2005 Blue Chip All-Star Camp and was named an all-star...named Sevier County Slam Dunk Champion in 2004...before playing at The King's Academy, played basketball for three years (2000-2003) at The Mountbatten School in England...Honor Roll student that also received a Latin award in his high school career.

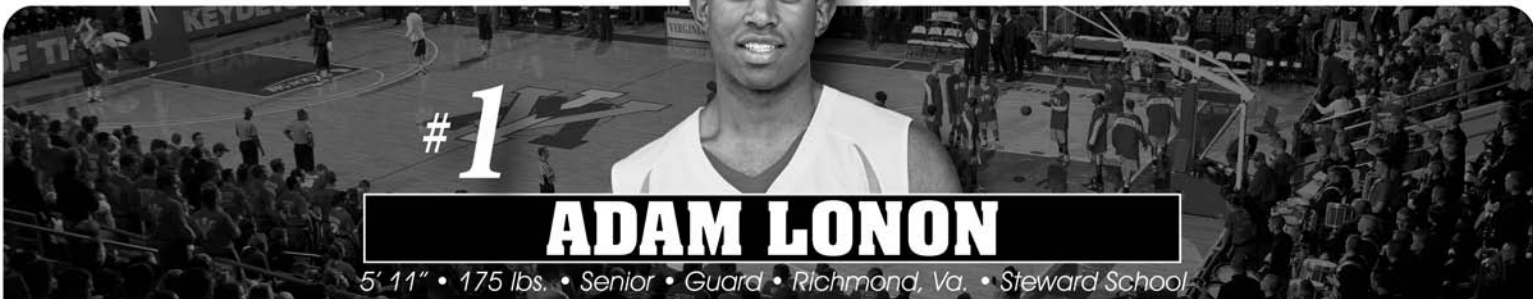

THREE-YEAR LETTERMAN/ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS MAJOR

ON LONON - Will serve as one of the team's tri-captains this year...one of the veteran backcourt performers...has the most experience on the team with 58 career starts... excellent defender who has helped in Keydet wins with staunch efforts on that end of the floor...can be effective on the dribble-drive...looking forward to productive senior season.

2008-09: Was sidelined by an aggravated hamstring pull sustained in preseason which hampered his availability the first half of the season...missed the first 11 games of the year before taking the court for 13 minutes against Richmond Dec. 31...played in 14 games in all with the Keydets victorious in 10 of those outings...played his best game of the year in the conference semifinal against Liberty, when he gave VMI 16 minutes of quality defensive effort off the bench, scored a season-high 10 points on 3-of-6 shooting and also posted four steals...scored eight points in regular season finale at High Point, hitting 6-of-7 from the free throw line...dished out four assists twice, against Liberty (2/24) and Coastal Carolina (3/3)...lettered for the third time.

2007-08: Played in 28 games with 27 starts...co-led the team in assists with 97 and averaged 3.5 assists per game, ranking eighth in the Big South Conference...ranked fifth in the Big South in steals (2.07 per game)...improved shooting percentage to 51.1% for the season (45-88)...averaged seven assists per contest over a four-game stretch in January...dished out four or more assists in 14 games...had a season-high nine assists against Columbia Union on Nov. 28 and eight assists at Charleston Southern (1/12)...scored in double figures against Columbia Union (14 points) and had 10 points against UNC Asheville (1/19)...logged a season-high five steals against S.C. State (12/4) and West Virginia Wesleyan (11/14)...ranked seventh in the Big South Conference in assist/turnover ratio (1.4)...played a season-high 38 minutes against Winthrop (1/23) and Radford (2/5)...lettered for the second time.

2006-07: Was second on the team in assists with 120...played in all 33 games with 31 starts at point guard...dished out a season-high 11 assists in record-setting win against Virginia Intermont and had 10 assists against Lees-McRae...had eight assists at Winthrop Jan. 5...gave the team a first-half scoring burst against Winthrop Jan. 31 with 12 points, hitting 4-of-7 shots from the floor and 4-of-5 from the line...ranked eighth in the Big South in assists (3.64) and was sixth in assist-turnover ratio...one of five Keydets to rank among the top 13 in steals in league games...had four-steal games against Charleston Southern, Southern Virginia, and Virginia Intermont... played 31 minutes and gave the Keydets excellent defensive play in the tourney win at Liberty.

HIGH SCHOOL: Averaged 17.3 points as a senior with 4.0 steals and 3.8 assists per game...scored a career-high 42 points in a game along with 13 rebounds, six assists, and four steals...a 2005-06 First Team All-State selection...named First Team All-Virginia Commonwealth Conference and was selected MVP of the conference tournament his senior year...also co-captained the team...helped Steward to 64 wins over his three-year high school career; played on the state championship Steward School team as a sophomore and was named MVP of the Virginia Independent Schools State Championships...also earned All-Conference and All-Academic team honors as a junior.

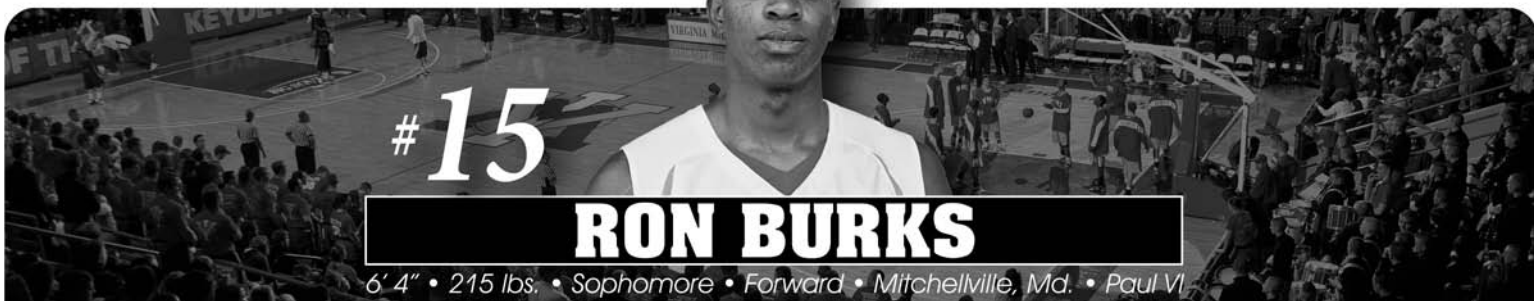

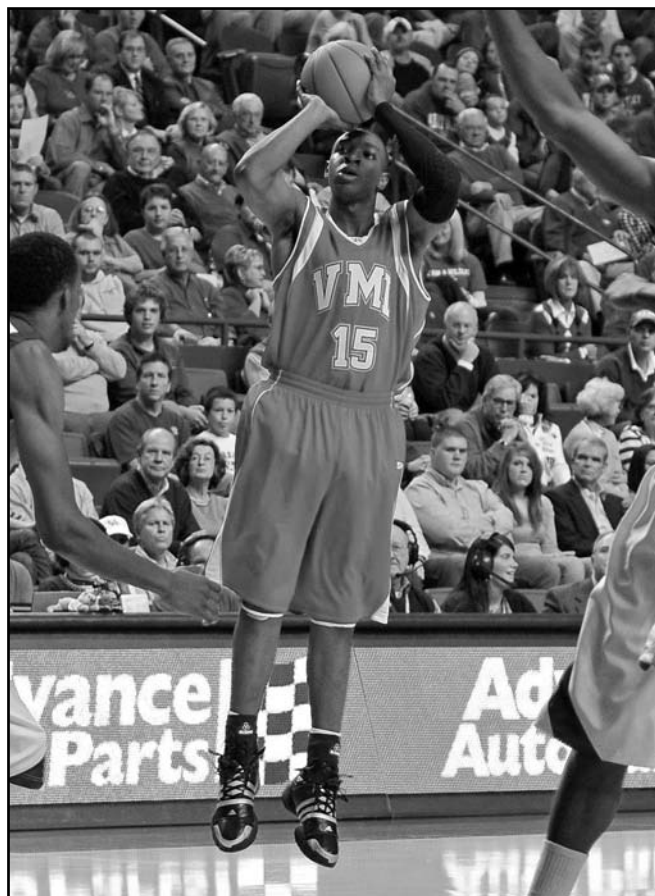

ONE-YEAR LETTERMAN/PSYCHOLOGY MAJOR

ON BURKS – Was a big reason why the Keydets produced their best season in three decades last year...played like a seasoned veteran despite being a true freshman...tough, physical and relentless...will be counted on for leadership and was voted as one of the team's tri-captains...expected to start in the backcourt again.

2008-09: Started all 32 games at guard as a true freshman...scored 11 points in his collegiate debut at Kentucky and tallied double figures four more times during the year...scored a career-high 15 points at Presbyterian College (2/15) and also grabbed nine rebounds...dished out a career-high seven assists in tourney game against Coastal Carolina (3/3)...averaged 3.0 assists per game, which ranked 13th in the Big South...hit 5-of-6 shots from the floor against Charleston Southern (2/9) in a 12-point outing...pulled down a career-high 11 rebounds in road win at Army (12/21)...hit all four shots from the floor in win at Liberty (2/24) and scored 11 points with seven rebounds in tourney action against Liberty (3/5)...was a top defender and frequently drew the toughest defensive assignment...lettered for the first time.

HIGH SCHOOL: Averaged 13.7 points, 7.0 points and 3.0 assists during his senior season at Paul VI, shooting 52% from the floor and 75% from the line...was a three-year starter and served as team captain for two seasons...named WCAC Second Team All Conference and was also named Honorable Mention All-Metro by The Washington Post.



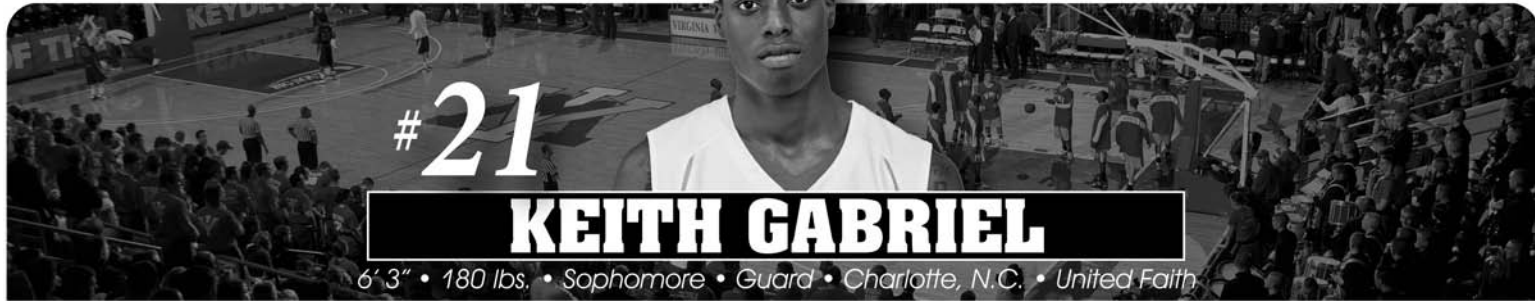

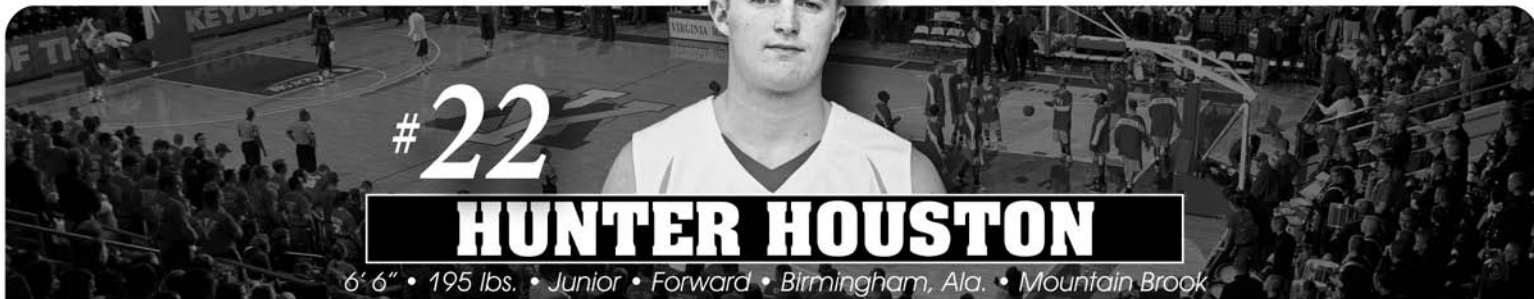

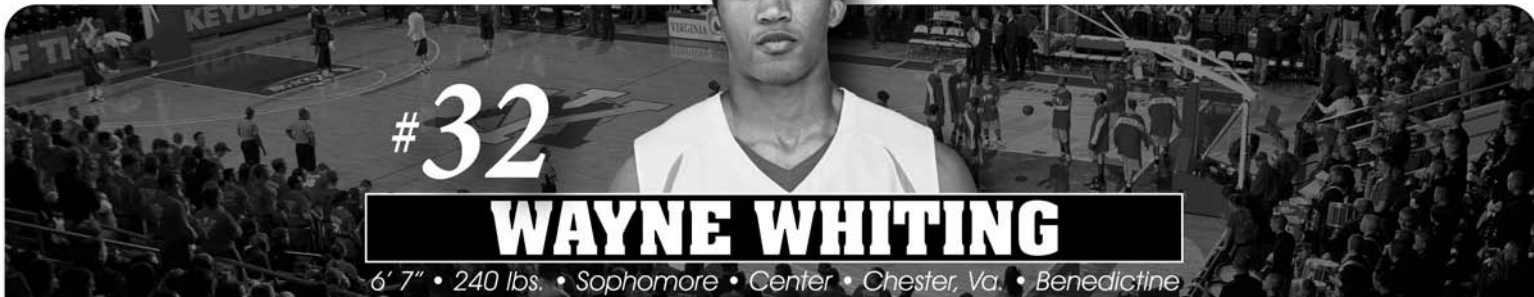

VMI KEYDET CLUB, INC.

The VMI Keydet Club celebrated its 75th Birthday this past year and saw its membership soar from 2,600 to 3,950--a 42% increase. The 75th Challenge brought in over 1,900 new members to the Keydet Club--the largest membership increase since the late 1980s.
