## VMI Heads South to Take on UNC Wilmington

Keydets Looking for 3-1 Start for Second Year in a Row

◆ **VMI Last Time Out:** VMI never trailed in knocking off West Virginia Wesleyan, 111-92, in a non-conference contest played at Cameron Hall in Lexington on Wednesday, Nov. 18. The Keydets had six players in double figures, led by freshman Nick Gore's 20 points and eight rebounds.

VMI's six players in double figures were Gore, Michael Sparks, Austin Kenon, Ron Burks, Stan Okoye and Keith Gabriel, all of whom had at least 12 points. Okoye led VMI with nine rebounds along with his 12 points, while Kenon's 14 points were accompanied by six assists against no turnovers. The Keydets took advantage of 27 WVWC turnovers, leading to a 37-2 VMI advantage in points off turnovers.

◆ VMI opened its much-anticipated 2009-10 campaign with a bang, scoring a 93-86 victory over Army on Nov. 14 at Cameron Hall. The Keydets were led by junior guard Austin Kenon's game-high 24 points, while sophomore Ron Burks netted his first career double-double with 15 points, 10 rebounds and six steals in a well-rounded effort.

The Keydets forced 34 Black Knight turnovers, the most VMI had caused by a Division I opponent in nearly three years. VMI turned those miscues into 38 points, while hitting 19 of their first 20 free throws en route to the victory. After defeating Army last season 62-55, VMI won back-to-back games against the Black Knights for the first time in the series history.

◆ The 2009-10 Keydets return 10 lettermen from last season's remarkable campaign that saw the team post the second-most wins in school history (24), the most conference wins in school history (13) and reach the Big South Championship Final for the second time in three years. VMI returns starters **Austin Kenon** and **Ron Burks**, two of the team's tri-captains, while several key reserves from last year's squad will be asked to take on larger roles in 2009-10. Sophomores **Keith Gabriel** and **Michael Sparks**, along with senior point guard **Adam Lonon**, the third of VMI's tri-captains, and junior forward **Hunter Houston**, will each be looked to for increased minutes this season.

### A VMI win against UNC Wilmington would:

◆ Give Duggar Baucom 99 career wins (98-82 currently), and move Baucom to one game under .500 in his VMI career (61-63 currently).

◆ Improve VMI to 1-0 all-time against the Seahawks, as the two programs have never met.

◆ Mark the second year in a row that VMI has opened the season 3-1 by going 2-0 at home and 1-1 on the road.

◆ Give the Keydets a win in the game before Thanksgiving break for the third consecutive season (defeated JMU 90-83 in Lexington on Nov. 21, 2007; defeated Campbell 97-92 in Buies Creek, N.C. on Nov. 24, 2008).

### VMI Runs Past West Va. Wesleyan:

Thanks to six players in double figures, led by freshman Nick Gore's 20 points and eight rebounds, the Keydets improved to 2-0 at home for the fourth straight season with a 111-92 win over West Virginia Wesleyan on Nov. 18.

The Keydets forced 27 turnovers while committing just seven, leading to a 37-2 advantage in points off turnovers. The seven turnovers committed by VMI were the fewest since March 3, 2007, when the Keydets made just seven turnovers in an 84-81 loss in the Big South Championship Final to Winthrop, a span of 64 games.

In the game, VMI set a new school record and a new facility mark by hoisting up 63 3-point attempts, while making a season-best 16.

### Board It Up:

In VMI's Nov. 18 win over West Virginia Wesleyan, rebounds were flying left and right. The two teams combined for 136 rebounds, with the Bobcats setting a new Cameron Hall record with 72 total boards.

VMI, meanwhile, grabbed an unbelievable 38 offensive rebounds, far and away the most by a Keydet team since moving to the current, up-tempo style. That led to 27 second-chance points, the most by VMI since a 95-59 win over Howard on Dec. 8, 2007.

Contributing to VMI's 64 total rebounds were eight players that at least matched their career high in the category, led by Stan Okoye's nine. Grabbing eight caroms

apiece were Nick Gore and Keith Gabriel, while Adam Lonon, Ron Burks and Michael Sparks each had six boards.

### Keydets Slowed by Spiders:

VMI's 2009 meeting with the Richmond Spiders did not turn out as well as those in 2006 and 2008, when the Keydets were victorious over their in-state rivals.

Instead, the Red, White and Yellow were taken to task by a Richmond squad picked third in the Atlantic 10 behind national powers Dayton and Xavier. In the 103-59 loss at the Robins Center, the Keydets were held to just 32 percent shooting from the floor while being out-rebounded 48-30.

The Spiders used their size advantage to outscore the Keydets 60-14 in the paint, shooting 63 percent from the floor.

Also in the game, VMI committed more turnovers (20) than the Spiders (16), marking the first time in 45 games that the Keydets lost the turnover battle. As a result, Richmond held a 20-12 advantage in points off turnovers, a stat that went the Keydets' way in 27 of 32 games a season ago.

### Hot and Cold:

The Keydet fortunes at the charity stripe have run the gamut over the first three games. VMI started out hot as pistol against Army, hitting 19 of their first 20 free throws through the first 33 minutes of action, before cool-

ing off for a 9-of-17 clip since that time.

VMI then followed that game up against Richmond, when they hit just 6-of-16 freebies.

In total, VMI hit on 95% free throws through the first 33 minutes of the season, and have connected on just 53% from the line since.

## Burks Leads Keydets Past Army in Opener:

Ron Burks kicked off his sophomore season right where he left off his impressive freshman campaign, notching his first career double-double to lead VMI past Army, 93-86 on Friday, Nov. 13.

Burks matched his career high with 15 points while also grabbing 10 rebounds against the Black Knights, whom the Keydets won back-to-back meetings against for the first time ever. The Mitchellville, Md. native also chipped in a career-best six steals in the win while knocking down five of his six free throws on the evening.

## Turnin' 'Em Over:

As always in Duggar Baucom's up-tempo system, turnovers were key to VMI's opening night win over Army. The Keydets caused 34 Black Knight turnovers, which led to 38 Keydet points in the 93-86 victory.

Army's 34 turnovers were the most that VMI had caused by a Division I opponent since forcing Radford into 41 turnovers on Jan. 25, 2007 in a 103-94 victory at Cameron Hall.

Against Army, meanwhile, VMI committed just 22 turnovers, leading to 21 Black Knight points. Last season, the Keydets averaged only 14.0 turnovers per game while causing a nation-leading 23.5.

Also last season, VMI did not lose the turnover battle in a single game, forcing at least 15 miscues in every contest. In addition, VMI was 23-4 when outscoring its opponent in points off turnovers, as they did in this year's opener.

## Season Opener at Home a Rarity:

VMI kicked off its 2009-10 campaign at Cameron Hall, a rarity for the program of late. The last time that VMI had opened a season at home came back on Nov. 21, 2005, when VMI lost a 53-49 contest to Army in the team's first game under head coach Duggar Baucom.

The Keydets fared better this season, scoring a 93-86 win on opening night. Austin Kenon was one of five Keydets in double figures, notching a game-high 24 points on 17-of-20 free throw shooting.

Overall, the Keydets have fared well in home openers, winning their first home game of the season in 10 of the past 11 years, with only the 2005 setback against Army breaking the

string.

## High-Scoring Keydets Shooting for History:

VMI topped the nation in scoring for the third consecutive year in 2008-09, averaging 93.8 points per game. With that effort, the Keydets become just the third program to lead the nation in that category three straight years, and the first to do so since Loyola Marymount from 1988-90. Furman also led the nation in points per game for three consecutive seasons, accomplishing the feat from 1953-55.

No team, however, has ever led NCAA Division I in scoring for four consecutive seasons.

## Williams & Holmes Selected in 2009 NBDL Draft:

A pair of former Keydets were selected in the 2009 NBA Development League Draft, held on Thursday, Nov. 5. In the third round, Reggie Williams '08 was selected by the Sioux Falls (S.D.) Skyforce, while Travis Holmes '09 was taken by the Utah Flash in the event's sixth round.

Williams (Prince George, Va.) spent last season with JDA Dijon Bourgogne, averaging 12.7 points, 5.3 rebounds and 2.5 assists for the French club. The all-time leading scorer in VMI, Big South and Virginia Division I history, Williams led the nation in scoring in both his junior and senior seasons, while he also ranks among the top six in VMI career rebounds, assists, steals and three-pointers made.

Last season, Holmes (Charlotte, N.C.) became just the ninth player in NCAA Division I history to amass 1,500 points, 500 rebounds, 300 assists and 300 steals in his career. He helped lead the Keydets to a historic season in 2008-09, beginning the year with a stunning 111-103 win at Kentucky, when he poured in a team-high 30 points. VMI went on to a 24-8 mark and the program's second Big South Championship Final appearance in three seasons, and Holmes was honored as an All-Conference performer by the Big South.

Holmes' twin brother, Chavis (Charlotte, N.C.), meanwhile, is averaging 13.5 points and 1.8 steals while hitting all 20 of his free throws for Caja Rioja in Spain, helping lead the club to a 4-2 start. Holmes was selected to the First Team in the Big South Conference and the NABC District 3 last season, the same accomplishments Williams earned the year previous. Chavis capped his career by becoming the first player in Big South history to total 2,000 points, 300 rebounds, 300 3-pointers and 300 assists in his four years in the league.

The selections of Williams and Holmes mark the first time that players from VMI had been selected in the NBDL Draft in the league's nine-year history.

### VMI In The National Rankings:

The Keydets had a banner year statistically last season, leading the nation not only in scoring (93.8 ppg), but in 3-pointers per game (13.7), steals (14.2), turnover margin (+9.5) and turnovers forced (23.6), while ranking third in the nation in assists (18.2). VMI has now led the country in scoring, three-pointers made per game and steals for each of the past three seasons.

Individually, the Keydets also boasted two of the top three players nationally in steals per game, as Chavis Holmes (3.4) led the nation while Travis Holmes (3.2) ranked second. Finally, Austin Kenon ranked sixth nationally in three-pointers per game, draining 3.7 per outing.

### Keydets Set NCAA Mark Once Again:

For the second time in three seasons, VMI broke the NCAA record for three-pointers made per game last season.

In 2006-07, VMI shattered Troy's existing mark (11.86) by hitting 13.39 three-pointers per contest, one of five NCAA all-time marks set by the Keydets that season. Last season, the Keydets averaged a stunning 13.69 treys per game, setting the new mark.

VMI now owns five all-time single-season NCAA Division I records, including those for three-pointers made (442), three-pointers made per game (13.69), three-point attempts (1,383), three-point attempts per game (41.9) and steals (490).

### Road Warriors:

While VMI's overall wins (24) and home court wins (13) each counted as the second-highest totals in school history last season, the Keydets did set a new school record with 10 road wins in 2008-09.

That total was highlighted by non-conference wins at Kentucky, Army and Campbell, while the team also went 7-2 away from Cameron Hall in Big South play. VMI scored historic wins at Liberty and Winthrop in league play, while also knocking off the Flames in a neutral site Big South Semifinal match-up at Radford's Dedmon Center.

### Keydets Advance to Final for Second Time in Three Seasons:

table season last March, advancing for the second time in three years to the Big South Championship Final.

In the Championship, televised on ESPN2, the Keydets jumped out to a 13-0 lead in the first two minutes thanks to a combined 10 points from Austin Kenon and Chavis Holmes. Radford fought back quickly and regained the lead some seven minutes later, and while the teams traded the lead back and forth into the second half, the Highlanders pulled away late for a 108-94 victory, despite a career-high 34 points from Kenon.

It marked the first time in 32 seasons that VMI had advanced twice to the Conference Final within three seasons.

### Roos Post Big Wins In Tourney Run:

During last year's postseason, the Keydets won each of their first two outings by a 20-point margin. That effort marked the first time in Big South history that a team had won each of its first two tournament games by at least 20 points, and it is the first time in VMI history the

Keydets have won two postseason games in a single season by at least that margin.

The Keydets' 20-point semifinal win over Liberty was the largest margin of victory in a Big South Semifinal in 21 years.

It also marked the second straight season that VMI has won back-to-back games by at least 20 points, as VMI knocked off Charleston Southern, 109-85, and UNC Asheville, 97-75, in February 2008.

### Keydets Earn #2 Seed In Big South Championship:

VMI earned the #2 seed in the 2008-09 Big South Championship, the best seed the Keydets had earned since joining the Big South Conference.

The team's #2 seed was also the best positioning that VMI had in a league-wide (non-divisional) tournament since the 1977-78 season. (VMI was the North division's #2 seed in the Southern Conference Tournament in 1995-96).

Interestingly, that 1977-78 tournament was also the last time that a postseason game was played at VMI, when the Keydets defeated seventh-seeded Davidson 95-80 at "The Pit." Last season, the Keydets defeated Coastal Carolina 96-76 at Cameron Hall in the Quarterfinal round of the Big South Championship.

### Baucom Named NABC District 3 Coach of the Year:

VMI head coach Duggar Baucom earned

District 3 Coach of the Year honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) last March after leading the Keydets to historic 24-8 season.

Baucom, who was also included as a finalist for the last year's Hugh Durham Award, given annually to the top mid-major coach in the country, led the Keydets to their best season in over 30 years in 2008-09. The team's 24 wins were the second-most in school history, while Baucom took VMI to its second Championship Final appearance in the past three seasons.

### Kenon Consistently On Target:

In only his second season on post, Austin Kenon ranked among the national leaders in 3-point shooting.

The sophomore finished last season ranked sixth nationally in 3's made per game with 3.7 per outing. Kenon has now played in 52 career games, and already has 180 career three-balls (3.53 3pg), shooting 38.1% from distance.

He currently ranks fifth in VMI history in three-point percentage in his career. Kenon is 20 made 3's away from becoming eligible for the Big South's and NCAA's career marks regarding three-pointers. At his current numbers, Kenon would move into the top position in 3's made per game in the Big South. With his current percentage, he would also place ninth in career 3-point % in the Big South.
