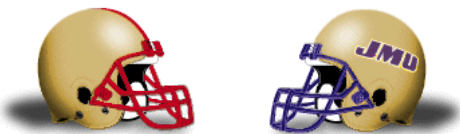

COACHES - Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76), a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, is in his second season in Lexington. In his first year on Post, the Keydets not only doubled their win total from the previous year, but also established new school and Big South records for rushing in a season, leading FCS with an impressive 357.5 yards per outing.

Woods, 55, was named the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 117-year history on February 12, 2008. That marked his return to the FCS (I-AA) ranks, where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons, from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 68-53-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003-06 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

Mickey Matthews (West Texas State '76) is in his 11th season in Harrisonburg, where he is the winningest coach in JMU football history. He has led the Dukes to an NCAA championship (2004) and to four other playoff appearances (1999, 2006, 2007, 2008) during his tenure.

Matthews has a 76-46 JMU record and during the 2008 season surpassed Challace McMillin's (1972-84) program record for wins. Matthews' teams are 49-15 over the last five years and have won the program's first national title and received four post-season bids during that time. JMU tied for the 2004 Atlantic 10 championship and won the 2008 Colonial Athletic Association title with an 8-0 record. The Dukes are 33-7 in league play during the last five seasons.

- ♦ Be VMI's first-ever win over JMU in Harrisonburg and give the Keydets their first win over the Dukes since Sept. 15, 1990.
- ♦ Improve the Keydets to 2-0 for the first time since 2002.

SATURDAY'S GAME VS. JMU

VMI & JMU COME TOGETHER FOR PRE-GAME

EVENT - In preparation for Saturday's show-down in Harrisonburg, cadets from VMI and members of the JMU ROTC have joined forces for a unique pre-game event.

Starting on Thursday at 11 a.m., cadets will leave VMI's Cameron Hall and make their way north, marching Saturday's game ball to Bridgeforth Stadium. On Thursday, one group of cadets will march approximately 17 miles before spending the night at McCormick Farm near Steeles Tavern. On Friday, they will march 12 miles before handing the ball off to a second group, which will proceed another 12 miles to the Verona Volunteer Fire Department. On Saturday, the cadets will complete the 19-mile hike to Harrisonburg and will be on hand to present the game ball to the officials before the contest.

Fans and media alike are welcomed to follow the group's progress via a number of online venues. The group will be "tweeting" along the way at www.twitter.com/VMIATH, while updates will also be posted on the VMI Athletics Facebook group.

THE SERIES - The two schools that are separated by an hour's drive on I-81 will meet for the 13th time in football on Saturday. The teams are set to square off for the fourth time since the 2004 season after the rivalry took a 10-year break from 1994-2004. James Madison leads the series 9-3 and has taken the last four contests between the teams. The Dukes have prevailed in all six games played in Harrisonburg including the last meeting, 45-17, in 2007 (See Page 8 for recap).

GROUND GAINERS - Saturday's contest between VMI and James Madison not only pits two in-state rivals against one another, but also two of the most potent rushing attacks in the country.

Over each of the past three seasons, only two FCS schools have led their respective conferences in rushing. VMI and JMU have each done so, and are currently leading their leagues for a fourth-straight year early in 2009, with the Keydets leading the FCS at 297 yards per contest while JMU ranks fourth nationally at 268 ypg.

CONFERENCES CLASH - The VMI-James Madison game September 19 in Harrisonburg marks the first of two straight weeks that VMI will take on in-state CAA foes on the road. The Keydets will travel to UR Stadium the following Saturday to take on defending national champions Richmond at 3:30 p.m.. VMI will also take on future CAA football member Old Dominion in the season finale at Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium Nov. 21, as the Monarchs are resurrecting their program for the first time since the 1930's.

James Madison will also get a good look at the Big South Conference in the coming weeks as it will take on BSC defending champion Liberty on the road September 26 after entertaining VMI in Harrisonburg this Saturday night.

IT HAPPENED ON SEPTEMBER 19 - VMI traveled to the banks of the Hudson River and defeated Army, 14-7, on September 19, 1981 at Michie Stadium in West Point, N.Y. It still stands as VMI's first and only victory over the Black Knights in the series.

The Keydets controlled the ball behind quarterback Kelly Raber and never trailed as all the game scoring took place in the first half. A six-yard TD pass by Raber with six seconds remaining in the half proved to be the game-winner. VMI outgained Army, 306-268, and completed 14 of 19 passes on the afternoon.

TEAM NOTES

TWICE AS NICE - In VMI's opener against Robert Morris, a pair of senior backs eclipsed the 2,000 rushing yard plateau, as both Tim Maypray and Howard Abegesah joined the elite fraternity.

The two became the eighth and ninth players in VMI history to break the barrier, with Maypray now sitting at 2,010 yards and Abegesah at 2,002 yards.

Maypray hit the mark first against the Colonials, totaling 2,002 rushing yards with his 26-yard rush early in the fourth quarter. A pair of negative gains, however, left him shy until he cleared the hurdle for good with a four-yard run with five minutes remaining in the contest of VMI's decisive drive.

Abegesah, meanwhile, followed suit later on the same drive with an eight-yard rush that set up Maypray's game-tying, five-yard scoring plunge.

The Keydet duo also became just the seventh and eighth players in Big South history with

MAYPRAY & ABEGESAH AMONG NATION'S ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS- Seniors Tim Maypray and Howard Abegesah have had impressive careers at VMI, and now as seniors, the duo appear on several lists among the FCS' Active Career Leaders.

Maypray currently ranks as the FCS Active Career Leader in all-purpose yards per play, averaging 10.05 yards each time that he touches the ball. In fact, Maypray even ranks ahead of the FBS leader, Clemson's C.J. Spiller, who averages 8.75 yards per play.

In addition, Maypray ranks second in rushing yards per carry (6.34), sixth in all-purpose

yards (4,410), ninth in all-purpose yards per game (133.6), 11th in touchdowns (29) and 17th in rushing yards (2,010).

Abegesah also ranks among the nation's leaders, placing seventh in rushing yards per carry (5.59) and 18th in rushing yards (18th).

RUSHING FOUR-PEAT IN ORDER? - In 2009, the Keydets are attempting to lead the Big South in rushing for the fourth-straight season. VMI led the country (FCS) in rushing in 2008, averaging 357.5 yards per game, and in the process, became the first Big South team to lead the circuit in rushing for three-consecutive seasons.

This season, the Keydets are at it again, leading both the Big South and FCS with 297 rushing yards per outing.

WHAT A BOOT - In the first action of his career, redshirt freshman punter Marc Ray had an impressive debut.

The Greenville, Va. native put two of his three punts against Robert Morris inside the 20 yard line, including a game-best 56-yarder in the second quarter.

Ray's average of 50 yards per punt on the afternoon was VMI's best effort in almost seven years, dating back to Oct. 19, 2002, when Brent Barth averaged 52.5 yards per punt against Chattanooga. In addition, his 56-yard punt was VMI's second-longest boot in nearly three years, falling just shy of a 63-yard punt by Patrick Sweeney last season.

CHURCH NAMED BIG SOUTH DEFENSIVE

PLAYER OF THE WEEK - Eric Church, who made his first college start against Robert Morris, was named Big South Conference Defensive Player of the Week for games played the weekend of Sept. 5.

Church, a redshirt sophomore Civil Engineering major from Louisa, Va. (Louisa County), helped spearhead the defensive unit in VMI's 14-13 win over Robert Morris at Foster Stadium in Lexington. The Keydets limited the Colonials to 267 total yards – the least allowed an FCS opponent since Coastal Carolina was held to 252 yards on Oct. 11 last year.

Church logged a career-high 13 tackles, including nine solo stops and two tackles-for-loss for 11 yards. Church was also credited with a sack for seven yards and had racked up his first 10 tackles by halftime.

Church became the first VMI defensive player to be named to the weekly award since A.J. Gross was tabbed for the Coastal Carolina game last year.

KEYDETS ON 50-GAME SCORING STREAK

Dating back to a 21-0 shutout at the hands of Georgetown on Oct. 9, 2004, VMI has now scored a point in each of the past 50 games.

The streak is the longest such run in the 118-year history of the program, besting a 43-game stretch from 1919-1924.

Despite the similar numbers, the current streak doesn't quite compare to the offensive prowess of the Flying Squadron days.

During the current 50-game streak, VMI has scored 1,164 points for an average of 23.3 per

game. Over the previous 43-game streak, the Keydets scored 1,138 points, averaging 26.5 points per contest.

Included in that run was the 1920 campaign that still stands as the school's only undefeated and untied mark. While going 9-0, VMI defeated Hampden-Sydney 136-0 and Catholic 96-0. That squad still holds the pre-SoCon realignment school record for points in a season, outscoring their opponents 431-20, averaging 47.9 points per game.

KEYDETS TOUGH IN OPENERS - VMI opened its 119th season with a 14-13 win over Robert Morris on Sept. 5. The narrow victory gave the Keydets an undefeated mark in their last five season openers, with each of those coming at Foster Stadium.

VMI now holds a 73-44-2 mark since first fielding a team in 1891 and are 7-4 over the past 11 years in their season debuts.

ABEGESAH & MAYPRAY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS - Prior to the 2009 season, a pair of VMI senior backs were honored by College Sporting News, being named to their Preseason All-American squad.

Howard Abegesah earned Third-Team Preseason All-American accolades as a fullback on the team, while Tim Maypray was listed as an Honorable Mention as an all-purpose back.

MAYPRAY LEADS PRE-SEASON BIG SOUTH ACCOLADES - Senior quarterback Tim Maypray (Madisonville, Ky.) was tabbed 2009 Big South Conference Offensive Player of the Year in the league's preseason squads announced July 31 at the annual Media Day in Charlotte. Maypray joined teammate George Handler on the preseason all-conference offensive squad. Handler is a three-year starter on the offensive line and is expected to play guard for the Keydets once again this fall. In addition to being voted preseason all-conference at quarterback, Maypray was also selected as the league's top punt returner.

After playing his first two seasons at slotback, Maypray moved to quarterback in 2008 and was named second team All-Big South Conference at quarterback after ranking third in the BSC in rushing. Last season, Maypray became the first QB in Big South history to rush for over 1,000 yards.

Handler, meanwhile, has been a three-year starter for the Keydets on the offensive line. In fact, he has experience at each of the five offensive line positions, starting primarily at center in '06, while starting at three different positions in '07. Last season, he started every game at left guard, while he has began his senior season back at center due to injuries along the line. The Quinton, Va. native was also named to the Big South Presidential Honor Roll for his work in the classroom last season.

NEW STAFF ADDITION - In year two under Sparky Woods, the VMI football coaching staff remained basically in tact. In fact, the Keydets welcome just one new face to the staff this season in Danny Verpaele.

Verpaele, a 2009 graduate of South Florida, joined the staff as a defensive assistant focusing on the secondary just prior to the start of this season's spring drills.

Verpaele joins the staff from USF, where he

The Keydets Last Time Out

Keydets Triumph in Season Opener, 14-13

LEXINGTON, Va. - A late touchdown run by Tim Maypray and ensuing extra point by newcomer Jeff Sexton gave VMI an exciting 14-13 win over Robert Morris in the season opener for both teams at Foster Stadium on Sept. 5.

The Keydets fell behind for the first and only time in the fourth quarter when the Colonials engineered a 12-play, 85-yard drive that was capped by a one-yard TD pass from Desmond Brentley to fullback Jeff Link that put RMU on top, 13-7, with 6:22 left in the game. But the ensuing extra-point try was unsuccessful when kicker Garrett Clawson's boot was partially blocked by VMI defensive end Damiso Alexander, forcing the redirected kick to ricochet back off the cross bar. The failed PAT try spoiled the Colonials' best drive of the day that produced three consecutive third down conversion tries and a 39-yard strike to wide-out Sherrod Evers to the VMI 1 which set up the go-ahead score one play later.

The Keydets then took the ball at their own 24-yard line and drew a false start penalty on their first snap of the decisive drive. VMI then went to its base attack, pounding out a 13-play, 79-yard possession that was executed entirely by Maypray and senior fullback Howard Abegesah rushes. Abegesah churned out 63 yards on seven carries on the drive including a 31-yard jaunt to the RMU 37. The Beltsville, Md. resident later slammed ahead eight yards to the RMU 5 that set up Maypray's option keeper to the end zone that tied the game at 13-13 with 1:27 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Maypray's lower left calf immediately cramped up after the score, forcing a nearly three-minute pause that gave true freshman kicker Jeff Sexton plenty of time to ponder of the ensuing tie-breaking PAT. The extended wait didn't faze Sexton, who split the uprights to put the Keydets up for good and give them their fifth straight season-opening win - all at Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium.

Robert Morris took possession with all three time outs remaining but saw their final possession stall at its 37-yard line when Brentley's fourth-and-three dump pass to halfback Myles Russ fell incomplete in the left flat.

The game was scoreless after one half thanks to good defense and squandered offensive opportunities by both sides. VMI committed three turnovers in the opening half on two fumbles and an interception, but the Colonials failed to convert any of the miscues into points.

VMI took a 7-0 lead with 13:25 in the third quarter when red-shirt sophomore defensive end Emilio Calvin smothered an errant shotgun snap in the RMU endzone marking the second straight season opener where the Keydet defense produced points. Alexander scooped up a fumble and raced 46 yards in VMI's 49-0 win over Saint Francis (Pa.) to start the 2008 season.

Robert Morris got on the board when Brentley connected with Evers for a 14-yard TD with 9:43 left in the third quarter - capping a six-play, 73-yard drive that was highlighted by a Russ 34-yard scamper to the VMI 35.

VMI attained a 322-267 advantage in total offense for the game, but the Colonial defense was able to hold the Keydets to 297 yards on the ground and 25 yards passing. The Keydet defense held RMU to 5 of 15 in third-down conversion opportunities and 0 of 3 in fourth down tries.

Defensively, VMI was paced by redshirt-sophomore linebacker Eric Church who had 13 total tackles including 10 in the opening half. Allen added 11 stops including seven solos.

VMI HEAD COACH SPARKY WOODS

"I certainly want to commend Coach Walton and Robert Morris. I thought they really played an outstanding football game. They about beat us and they did a good job. Their defense was able to take the ball away and I thought their quarterback really played well."

"I was proud of our team and the poise they showed going into the last drive with the clock and execution. We had not executed well most of the day with the turnovers, and I felt on the last drive we did secure the ball and worked the clock really well. I was proud of our freshman kicker (Jeff Sexton) who came in there to kick the extra-point to win the game. I told him we'd probably have to use him to win some games, but didn't know it would be the first one."

"I'm happy with the win and what we wanted to be was 1-0. We have another week to correct a lot of mistakes. Defensively, I thought we were better, but still did give up some third downs and a couple of big plays that we would like to eliminate. I think if we had not turned the ball over, we would have felt a lot better about the victory than we do now. I was pleased with our special teams and I thought we made some good plays there."



Senior Tim Maypray scored the tying touchdown with 1:23 remaining before freshman Jeff Sexton booted home the game-winning extra point to give the Keydets their fifth-straight season-opening win.

HARRISONBURG, Va. - VMI controlled the ball for 22 minutes in the first half, yet came up empty on the scoreboard as #7 JMU's quick strike offense led the Dukes to a 45-17 win over the Keydets on Sept. 15 at Bridgeforth Stadium in Harrisonburg. With the win, the Dukes moved to 2-1, while VMI fell to 1-2.

Despite having three drives beyond the JMU 35 yardline in the game's opening half, the Keydets trailed by a 21-0 margin at the half, thanks to rushing touchdowns from Jamal Sullivan and Antoine Bolton, as well as a 36-yard scoring strike just before the half from quarterback Rodney Landers to L.C. Baker.

The Keydets posted 17 points in the second half, thanks to a 27-yard scoring run by Howard Abegesah and Tim Maypray's 86-yard kickoff return. A 46-yard field goal by Patrick Sweeney accounted for the team's first points on the day, marking the longest field goal in nearly two years by a Keydet.

Abegesah led the Keydets on the ground with 71 yards, while Joey Robinson was just behind with 67 yards on the ground and 91 yards through the air. Maypray caught a game-high six receptions for 61 yards while accounting for 182 all-purpose yards.

Baker led the Dukes with 130 all-purpose yards, with 79 coming on his four receptions and 60 coming on his two carries. Sullivan led JMU on the ground with 83 yards.

The Dukes held advantages in rushing yards (298-152) and passing yards (184-102), though the Keydets held the ball for 34:44 of the game's 60 minutes.

After the Keydets failed to convert on the game's opening possession, JMU struck quickly, as their second play on the ensuing drive was a 44-yard touchdown run by Sullivan, the first tally of his career.

A time-consuming march into Duke territory came up empty on the next VMI possession. The Keydets ran off 7:35 of the clock while using 15 plays to advance 42 yards down to the JMU 28, before the drive stalled out on a fourth-down sack of Robinson.

The Keydets began their second march into Duke territory at their own 25. With Robinson and Hughes again rotating at quarterback, the visitors ran 15 plays, getting as far as the JMU 17. The Keydets came up empty, however, despite a spectacular effort on a 3rd-and-10 completion to Maypray, as he dove for the first down, and was spotted just shy of the marker.

JMU advanced their lead to 14-0 midway through the second quarter, as Bolton's three-yard plunge into the endzone capped a 10-play, 81-yard drive. Following a three-and-out by the Keydets, Kyle Hughes' 38-yard punt was fielded at the VMI 29, where Baker coughed up the ball after a hit by Damiso Alexander, while the ball was recovered by Marcus Brown, giving the Keydets their deepest possession into JMU territory.

Back-to-back carries by Abegesah, including an impressive 13-yard carry on second down, got the Keydets down to the JMU 4, while an 11-yard completion offset a VMI holding penalty, leading to a 20-yard field goal attempt that sailed wide-right with just under two minutes remaining in the opening half.

The Dukes proceeded to make the Keydets pay for that miscue, as they tacked on their third score of the day on a 36-yard pass from Landers to Baker with nine seconds left in the half to make the margin 21-0 headed into the intermission.

Coming out of the break, JMU wasted no time getting things going, as a 56-yard kickoff return by Marcus Turner preceded a 42-yard touchdown run by Baker on the period's first play from scrimmage, giving the Dukes a 28-0 cushion.

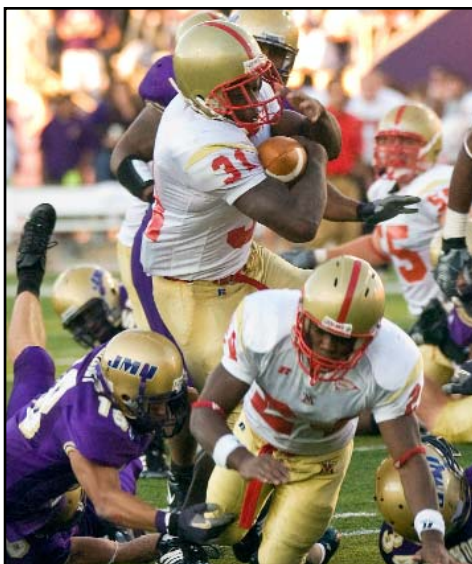
VMI's next drive resulted in the Keydets' first points of the evening, as Sweeney booted a 46-yard field goal, the Keydets' longest in nearly two years. The points came at the end of a 12-play drive that took nearly six minutes off the clock.

The Dukes answered with another touchdown, as Bolton pounded in his second score of the evening, a three-yard tally, while a seven-yard shovel pass from JMU backup quarterback Drew Dudzik to Reggie Hicks brought the advantage to 42-3 just seconds into the fourth quarter.

VMI found paydirt on their next possession, as a 21-yard completion from Robinson to Maypray got the Keydets to the JMU 27 before Abegesah took care of the rest, scampering for a touchdown on the next play.

Dave Stannard tacked on a 24-yard field goal to bring the margin to 45-10 midway through the fourth quarter, however some VMI special teams fireworks ignited the Keydets late. On the ensuing kickoff, Maypray picked up the bouncing ball at his 14-yardline and took it to the house.

HEAD COACH JIM REID: "Coming out of last week, I knew what we needed to see, but I wasn't sure what we were going to get. Monday and Tuesday were not the best that we've ever had here, but we faced these guys up and we hit them. Coach Matthews' first comments to me were 'Your guys played unbelievably hard tonight.' And I said the keyword being tonight, and it should be like that every week if we're going to improve. We got out-athleted at almost every position. We need to finish our drives offensively, because that's the strength of our ballclub right now. We need to tighten up defensively. It's sad out there to watch us getting pushed back, which we knew might happen and we just have to keep working at it."
