COACHES - **Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76)**, a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, is in his second season in Lexington. In his first year on Post, the Keydets not only doubled their win total from the previous year, but also established new school and Big South records for rushing in a season, leading FCS with an impressive 357.5 yards per outing.

Woods, 55, was named the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 118-year history on February 12, 2008. That marked his return to the FCS (I-AA) ranks, where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons, from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 68-54-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003-06 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

Mike London (Richmond '83) is in his second season as the head coach of the Spiders, a program he has been a part of as a player, an assistant coach, and now as a National Championship head coach. Following his impressive debut, London earned National Coach of the Year recognition from the AFCA, was named Male Coach of the Year by the BCA and was honored as Virginia State Coach of the Year by VaSID.

Before returning home, London had two stints at the University of Virginia, the latter as the Cavs' defensive coordinator. He previously coached with the NFL's Houston Texans, at William & Mary and at Boston College.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. In addition to earning All-State honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Coaches Award.

SATURDAY'S GAME VS. RICHMOND

THE SERIES - Saturday's game against Richmond will mark the 86th meeting between VMI and Richmond. It will be VMI's last trip to the venerable UR/City Stadium which has been home to the Spiders since 1929. Richmond will be moving to an on-campus stadium next year.

The series between the two schools is deadlocked at 40-40-5 and Richmond has taken the last seven meetings. In games played in Richmond against the Spiders, VMI is 21-28-3.

Saturday's game with Richmond will tie the series with the William & Mary rivalry as the longest in the VMI record books. The Keydets and Tribe have locked horns 86 times and the series is taking a respite for the first time since the 1946 campaign.

OCTOBER RETURNS - Saturday will mark the return of VMI wide receivers coach Winston October to UR Stadium, the venue where he starred as a defensive back for his alma mater. October was a four-time All-Atlantic 10 defensive back selection during his playing days at Richmond, and served as team captain during the Spiders' Atlantic 10 championship season in 1998 and was named All-America by The Sports Network.

October has served on the VMI staff since 2007, coaching defensive backs the past two years before moving to wide receivers coach in 2009.

GROUND BATTLE - Saturday's contest between VMI and Richmond not only pits two long-time foes, but also provides an interesting match-up on the ground.

Last season, the Keydets led the nation in rushing with 357.5 yards per game. The Spiders, meanwhile, ranked 12th in the nation in rushing defense, surrendering just 94.0 yards per game on the ground on the way to their first-ever National Championship.

This season, the Keydets enter the contest sixth nationally in rushing with 237.5 ypg, while the Spiders rank fifth in FCS with 39.7 ypg allowed.

VMI VERSUS #1 - When VMI takes on top-ranked Richmond on Saturday, it will mark the first time that the Keydets have faced the nation's top team since falling 31-14 at home to Georgia Southern on Sept. 29, 2001. That game also marks the last time that VMI faced a reigning National Champion, as the Spiders are as well.

Previous to that game, the last time VMI had played a top-ranked team came in 1999, also against Georgia Southern. In addition, the Keydets also faced Marshall when they were ranked #1 in three consecutive trips to Lexington in 1992, 1994 and 1996.

VMI has never beaten a team ranked #1 in the country.

take on a ranked CAA opponent. Last week, VMI fell 44-16 to JMU in Harrisonburg.

In all this weekend, there are three games matching Big South teams against CAA opponents. In Lynchburg, #24 Liberty plays host to #6 JMU, while Stony Brook heads to #15 Massachusetts. Entering this weekend, the Big South is 0-3 against the CAA this season.

In addition, VMI will also take on future CAA football member Old Dominion in the season finale at Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium Nov. 21, as the Monarchs are resurrecting their program for the first time since the 1930's.

IT HAPPENED ON SEPTEMBER 26 - VMI

defeated Wofford, 27-11 in Lexington on Sept. 26, 1987. VMI defensive back Tracey Towe put the Keydets up for good with an interception return for a touchdown with :15 remaining in the first half.

TEAM NOTES

MAYPRAY ON VERGE OF BIG SOUTH MARK -

Senior quarterback Tim Maypray enters Saturday's game versus Richmond needing just 43 all-purpose yards to become the Big South's career leader in the category. His current total of 4,579 places him sixth currently among active FCS players, while the Big South record of 4,621 was set by VMI's Sean Mizzer (2003-06).

Maypray currently ranks fourth on the VMI career all-purpose yardage charts, needing 74 yards to pass Ronnie Moore's total of 4,652. Next up would be Mizzer, whose career total of 5,736 yards includes 1,115 all-purpose yards that he accrued during his freshman season while VMI competed in the Southern Conference.

HUGHES HITS 2,000 - With a 67-yard completion to Bryan Barnson in the second quarter against JMU, senior quarterback Kyle Hughes surpassed the 2,000-yard career passing plateau, currently with 2,076.

As the triggerman for the Keydets' option attack, Hughes has enjoyed a unique career at VMI. His finest season came in 2007, when he passed for 1,097 yards, rushed for 444 yards and even served as the team's primary punter, averaging 33.5 yards per punt on 40 attempts.

TWICE AS NICE - In VMI's opener against Robert Morris, a pair of senior backs eclipsed the 2,000 rushing yard plateau, as both Tim Maypray and Howard Abegesah joined the elite fraternity.

The two became the eighth and ninth players in VMI history to break the barrier, with Abegesah now sitting at 2,081 yards and Maypray at 2,046 yards.

Maypray hit the mark first against the Colonials, totaling 2,002 rushing yards with his 26-yard rush early in the fourth quarter. A pair of negative gains, however, left him shy until he cleared the hurdle for good with a four-yard run with five minutes remaining in the contest of VMI's decisive drive.

Abegesah, meanwhile, followed suit later on the same drive with an eight-yard rush that set up Maypray's game-tying, five-yard scoring plunge.

The Keydet duo also became just the seventh and eighth players in Big South history with 2,000 career rushing yards.

MAYPRAY & ABEGESAH AMONG NATION'S

ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS- Seniors Tim Maypray and Howard Abegesah have had impressive careers at VMI, and now as seniors, the duo appear on several lists among the FCS' Active Career Leaders.

Maypray currently ranks second among Active FCS players in career all-purpose yards per play, averaging 9.85 yards each time that he touches the ball. In fact, Maypray ranks ahead of the FBS leader, Clemson's C.J. Spiller, who averages 8.75 yards per play.

In addition, Maypray ranks third in rushing yards per carry (6.13), sixth in all-purpose yards (4,579), ninth in all-purpose yards per game (134.7), ninth (tied) in touchdowns (30) and 18th in rushing yards (2,046).

Abegesah also ranks among the nation's leaders, placing seventh in rushing yards per carry (5.58) and 16th in rushing yards (2,081).

RUSHING FOUR-PEAT IN ORDER? - In 2009, the Keydets are attempting to lead the Big South in rushing for the fourth-straight season. VMI led the country (FCS) in rushing in 2008, averaging 357.5 yards per game, and in the process, became the first Big South team to lead the circuit in rushing for three-consecutive seasons.

This season, the Keydets are at it again, leading the Big South and ranking sixth nationally with 237.5 rushing yards per outing.

In an interesting note, VMI is one of two schools to lead their league in rushing each of the past three seasons. The Keydets' neighbors from just up Interstate 81, JMU, are the other school. But when the teams hooked up in September, both attacks were severely limited on the ground, as JMU was held to just 145 rushing yards, while VMI managed just 178 rushing yards in a 44-16 loss.

MAYPRAY MOVES UP TOUCHDOWN LISTS - With his fourth quarter reception against JMU, senior quarterback Tim Maypray scored his 30th career touchdown, becoming just the fifth player in Big South history to do so.

Maypray's 30 career touchdowns are good enough for third on VMI's career charts, behind Thomas Haskins (50) and Sean Mizzer (31). He is also tied for ninth among active FCS players in the category.

The score also gave him 130 points for his career, which moved him into the fourth spot all-time at VMI past Floyd Allen (1978-81) and Matt Sharpe (2001-2003) who each had 176. Next up is Sean Mizzer, whose 186 career points put him third on the list.

WARE WEARS 'EM OUT - Redshirt junior outside linebacker Kris Ware (Chesapeake, Va.) registered the first two collegiate sacks of his career against James Madison. The tackles-for-loss went for a total of two yards. The sacks were the first allowed by JMU this year.

BOATRIGHT RETURNS - VMI center James Boatright, who was recovering from shoulder surgery performed after spring practice, returned to action against James Madison and started the game against the Dukes. Boatright did not play in VMI's opener against Robert Morris, ending a string of 20 consecutive starts. Coincidentally, it was at James Madison in 2007 that Boatright had made his college first start.

DUKES SLOW KEYDET RUSHING ATTACK - The 178 yards rushing by the Keydets against James Madison was VMI's first sub-200 yard rushing game since a 178-yard output on the ground against Lehigh on September 22, 2007 (L, 37-6). The JMU game ended a string of 19 consecutive outings with 200+ rushing yards for the Keydets.

WHAT A BOOT - In the first action of his career, redshirt freshman punter Marc Ray had an impressive debut.

The Greenville, Va. native put two of his three punts against Robert Morris inside the 20 yard line, including a game-best 56-yarder in the second quarter.

Ray's average of 50 yards per punt on the afternoon was VMI's best effort in almost seven years, dating back to Oct. 19, 2002, when Brent Barth averaged 52.5 yards per punt against Chattanooga. In addition, his 56-yard punt was VMI's second-longest boot in nearly three years, falling just shy of a 63-yard punt by Patrick Sweeney last season.

Ray currently leads the Big South in punting average at 44.2 yards per punt, while the Keydets also take top honors in net punting, gaining 37.0 yards per boot.

CHURCH NAMED BIG SOUTH DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - Eric Church, who made his first college start against Robert Morris, was named Big South Conference Defensive Player of the Week for games played the weekend of Sept. 5.

Church, a redshirt sophomore Civil Engineering major from Louisa, Va. (Louisa County), helped spearhead the defensive unit in VMI's 14-13 win over Robert Morris at Foster Stadium in Lexington. The Keydets limited the Colonials to 267 total yards - the least allowed an FCS opponent since Coastal Carolina was held to 252 yards on Oct. 11 last year.

Church logged a career-high 13 tackles, including nine solo stops and two tackles-for-loss for 11 yards. Church was also credited with a sack for seven yards and had racked up his first 10 tackles by halftime.

Church became the first VMI defensive player to be named to the weekly award since A.J. Gross was tabbed for the Coastal Carolina game last year.

KEYDETS ON 51-GAME SCORING STREAK - Dating back to a 21-0 shutout at the hands of Georgetown on Oct. 9, 2004, VMI has now scored a point in each of the past 51 games.

The streak is the longest such run in the 118-year history of the program, besting a 43-game stretch from 1919-1924.

Despite the similar numbers, the current streak doesn't quite compare to the offensive prowess of the Flying Squadron days.

During the current 51-game streak, VMI has scored 1,180 points for an average of 23.1 per game. Over the previous 43-game streak, the Keydets scored 1,138 points, averaging 26.5 points per contest.

Included in that run was the 1920 campaign that still stands as the school's only undefeated and untied mark. While going 9-0, VMI defeated Hampden-Sydney 136-0 and Catholic 96-0. That squad still holds the pre-SoCon realignment school record for points in a season, outscoring their opponents 431-20, averaging 47.9 points per game.

KEYDETS TOUGH IN OPENERS - VMI opened its 119th season with a 14-13 win over Robert

Morris on Sept. 5. The narrow victory gave the Keydets an undefeated mark in their last five season openers, with each of those coming at Foster Stadium.

VMI now holds a 73-44-2 mark since first fielding a team in 1891 and are 7-4 over the past 11 years in their season debuts.

ABEGESAH & MAYPRAY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS - Prior to the 2009 season, a pair of VMI senior backs were honored by College Sporting News, being named to their Preseason All-American squad.

Howard Abegesah earned Third Team Preseason All-American accolades as a fullback on the team, while Tim Maypray was listed as an Honorable Mention as an all-purpose back.

MAYPRAY LEADS PRE-SEASON BIG SOUTH ACCOLADES - Senior quarterback Tim Maypray (Madisonville, Ky.) was tabbed 2009 Big South Conference Offensive Player of the Year in the league's preseason squads announced July 31 at the annual Media Day in Charlotte. Maypray joined teammate George Handler on the preseason all-conference offensive squad. Handler is a three-year starter on the offensive line and is expected to play guard for the Keydets once again this fall. In addition to being voted preseason all-conference at quarterback, Maypray was also selected as the league's top punt returner.

After playing his first two seasons at slotback, Maypray moved to quarterback in 2008 and was named Second Team All-Big South Conference at quarterback after ranking third in the BSC in rushing. Last season, Maypray became the first QB in Big South history to rush for over 1,000 yards.

Handler, meanwhile, has been a three-year starter for the Keydets on the offensive line. In fact, he has experience at each of the five offensive line positions, starting primarily at center in '06, while starting at three different positions in '07. Last season, he started every game at left guard, while he has began his senior season back at center due to injuries along the line. The Quinton, Va. native was also named to the Big South Presidential Honor Roll for his work in the classroom last season.

NEW STAFF ADDITION - In year two under Sparky Woods, the VMI football coaching staff remained basically in tact. In fact, the Keydets welcome just one new face to the staff this season in Danny Verpaele.

Verpaele, a 2009 graduate of South Florida, joined the staff as a defensive assistant focusing on the secondary just prior to the start of this season's spring drills.

Verpaele joins the staff from USF, where he was both a player and undergraduate assistant coach. He lettered three years with the Bulls and participated in four consecutive bowl games. As a defensive back, Verpaele was tabbed a Third Team Freshman All-American Strong Safety by the Sporting News.

Also changing job responsibilities in the off-season was Winston October, who has shifted from secondary to wide receivers in his third year on staff.

The Keydets Last Time Out

Football Falls at #6 JMU, 44-16

HARRISONBURG, Va. - A #6 JMU passed for 341 yards and four touchdowns as the Dukes scored a 44-16 victory over visiting VMI on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium.

Rockeed McCarter (168 yards receiving) and Mike Caussin (145) each caught a pair of touchdowns for the Dukes (1-1), who were led by Drew Dudzik's 214 yards passing. Dudzik's three-touchdown performance also marked the second consecutive multiple-score effort by the redshirt junior.

The Keydets (1-1), meanwhile, totaled just 178 yards of rushing offense, the team's lowest output under second-year head coach Sparky Woods. Senior quarterback Kyle Hughes surpassed the 2,000-yard career passing mark on a 67-yard pass to Bryan Barnson in the second quarter, while Tim Maypray became just the fifth Big South player with 30 career touchdowns early in the fourth.

After VMI's opening drive stalled at the JMU45, the Dukes marched 78 yards in nine plays, capping the drive with a one-yard scoring plunge by Sullivan on fourth down. The Keydets answered early in the second quarter, as Jeff Sexton booted a 32-yard field goal to bring the margin to 7-3.

JMU's Scotty McGee returned the ensuing kickoff 64 yards, setting up a 37-yard field goal by Dixon Wright. The Keydets followed with a first down before an illegal procedure violation on a 4th-and-1 forced a punt. JMU needed only one play on the next drive to double the margin, as Drew Dudzik's 65-yard pass to Caussin brought the score to 17-3 in favor of the hosts.

Not to be outdone, the Keydets fired up their own passing attack, as Kyle Hughes found Bryan Barnson for a 67-yard connection on the next play from scrimmage, setting up VMI at the JMU 3. Two plays later, Michael Rainey-Wiles punched in his first touchdown of the season from four yards out, bringing the visitors to within a score at 17-10 with just over six minutes remaining in the half.

A 48-yard return by McGee put the Dukes back in business in VMI territory on the following kickoff. The second connection from Justin Thorpe to McCarter of the drive gave the Dukes a 14-point advantage, while a McCarter catch of Drew Dudzik's pass with six seconds remaining provided the halftime score of 31-10.

After the Keydets opened the half with a stop on fourth down, the offense marched down the field with a nine-play, 44-yard drive before the team's first turnover of the day, a fumble by Howard Abegesah. A 26-yard scoring pass from Dudzik-to-Caussin, advanced the margin to 37-10, however the extra point try was unsuccessful for JMU.

VMI scored its final touchdown of the contest early in the fourth quarter, as Maypray snagged a swing pass from Hughes with one hand and scampered 13 yards to paydirt. The Keydets, however, muffed the snap on the extra point, leaving the score at 37-16. A 19-yard scoring scramble by Thorpe with 6:36 remaining in the contest provided the final margin.

VMI was led on the ground by Abegesah's 79 yards, while Corwin Acker's 60-yard effort paced the Duke ground-gainers. Defensively, VMI got a team-high nine tackles from Byron Allen, while Josh Wine matched a career-best effort with eight stops. Kris Ware, meanwhile, netted the team's only two sacks of the contest, the first pair given up by JMU this year.

Last Meeting Against Richmond

#6 Richmond Rolls to 56-16 Win Over VMI

LEXINGTON, Va. - The sixth-ranked Richmond Spiders pulled away from VMI with a 28-6 second half outburst and defeated the Keydets, 56-16, to spoil homecoming before 7,643 Foster Stadium fans on Saturday, Oct. 4, 2008 in Lexington.

Leading 28-10 at halftime, Richmond started the second half with a bolt of energy as a jarring hit on VMI kick return man Zach Collins forced the ball free on the opening kickoff of the half. UR redshirt freshman Colin Pehanick scooped up the loose ball and raced 13 yards for the touchdown to extend the Spider lead to 35-10 before VMI could run a second-half play. Richmond added a two-yard TD run by senior running back Josh Vaughn later in the quarter and a pair of fourth quarter touchdown runs by redshirt running back Tyler Kirchoff completed the Spider scoring string.

VMI's lone second half tally came on a one-yard run by freshman fullback Bobby Epps with 2:16 left in the game.

Richmond outgained VMI, 419-267 in total yards, and the Keydets failed to complete a pass in five attempts and set a facility record for fewest passing yards in a game.

Junior quarterback Tim Maypray led the VMI ground attack with 88 yards on 19 carries and freshman fullbacks Epps (67 yards) and Chaz Jones (59 yards) combined for 126 yards rushing filling in for the injured Howard Abegesah (knee), who did not play.

Vaughn led Richmond in rushing with 123 yards and two touchdowns. Junior quarterback Eric Ward completed 10 of 13 passes for 130 yards and one TD for the Spiders (4-2), who rebounded from a 26-20 road loss against Villanova a week ago.

The VMI option attack, which led the nation in rushing entering the game and had produced 10 plays over 20 or more yards in each the previous two contests, was limited to just one play over 20 yards against the Spiders – a 45-yard run by Maypray that set up a second quarter scoring drive. The Spiders also converted all three VMI turnovers (2 fumbles, 1 interception) into scoring opportunities that produced three touchdowns.

Spider junior defensive lineman Miles Parker led all tacklers with 13 stops while Keydets defensive back Byron Allen posted eight tackles.

After being forced to punt on its opening possession, Richmond engineered a five-play 40-yard drive the second time it had the football and opened the game's scoring on a 29-yard TD pass from Ward to redshirt freshman receiver Tre Gray with 9:01 left in the first quarter. On VMI's ensuing possession, sophomore defensive back Justin Rodgers snatched in mid-air a Maypray option pitch at the VMI 41 and returned it for a touchdown to extend Richmond's advantage to 14-0.

The Keydets later halved the deficit – taking advantage of a 63-yard kick return by freshman Rajah Jenkins and a Richmond personal foul penalty that moved the ball to the Spider 25. Four plays later, sophomore slotback Gabe Itoka raced 12 yards off a pitch to the endzone to pull VMI within 14-7 with 5:24 left in the first quarter.

But the Spiders countered with a four-play, 47-yard drive set up when Rogers returned the ensuing kickoff 25 yards and VMI aided UR with a procedure penalty on the kickoff that moved the ball to the VMI 47. A 22-yard run by Vaughn to the VMI 3 set up a 3-yard TD plunge by fullback John Crone one play later to extend Richmond's lead to 21-7 with 3:31 left in the first quarter.

VMI freshman kicker Greg Stevens booted a 21-yard field goal, his third this season, to cut the UR lead to 21-10 with 12:30 remaining in the fourth quarter, but Richmond added a four-yard TD run by Vaughn at the 1:15 mark capping at 10-play, 68-yard drive.

HEAD COACH SPARKY WOODS

"I didn't see much good out there, but I thought our kids played hard throughout. You have to congratulate Richmond. They have a really fine football team. Coach London has done a really nice job with them. We just have to keep working with our players, find out who was hurt, get them healed up, and get our players ready to go for the conference opener next week. We have to get over this one and learn from it and try to get back and be a better team next week."

Game 1- VMI vs. Robert Morris

Keydets Triumph in Season Opener, 14-13

LEXINGTON, Va. - A late touchdown run by Tim Maypray and ensuing extra point by newcomer Jeff Sexton gave VMI an exciting 14-13 win over Robert Morris in the season opener for both teams at Foster Stadium on Sept. 5.

The Keydets fell behind for the first and only time in the fourth quarter when the Colonials engineered a 12-play, 85-yard drive that was capped by a one-yard TD pass from Desmond Brentley to fullback Jeff Link that put RMU on top, 13-7, with 6:22 left in the game. But the ensuing extra-point try was unsuccessful when kicker Garrett Clawson's boot was partially blocked by VMI defensive end Damiso Alexander, forcing the redirected kick to ricochet back off the cross bar. The failed PAT try spoiled the Colonials best drive of the day that produced three consecutive third down conversion tries and a 39-yard strike to wide-out Sherrod Evers to the VMI 1 which set up the go-ahead score one play later.

The Keydets then took the ball at their own 24-yard line and drew a false start penalty on their first snap of the decisive drive. VMI then went to its base attack, pounding out a 13-play, 79-yard possession that was executed entirely by Maypray and senior fullback Howard Abegesah rushes. Abegesah churned out 63 yards on seven carries on the drive including a 31-yard jaunt to the RMU 37. The Beltsville, Md. resident later slammed ahead eight yards to the RMU 5 that set up Maypray's option keeper to the end zone that tied the game at 13-13 with 1:27 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Maypray's lower left calf immediately cramped up after the score, forcing a nearly three-minute pause that gave true freshman kicker Jeff Sexton plenty of time to ponder of the ensuing tie-breaking PAT. The extended wait didn't faze Sexton, who split the uprights to put the Keydets up for good and give them their fifth straight season-opening win - all at Alumni Memorial Field at Foster Stadium.

Robert Morris took possession with all three time outs remaining but saw their final possession stall at its 37-yard line when Brentley's fourth-and-three dump pass to halfback Myles Russ fell incomplete in the left flat.

The game was scoreless after one half thanks to good defense and squandered offensive opportunities by both sides. VMI committed three turnovers in the opening half on two fumbles and an interception, but the Colonials failed to convert any of the miscues into points.

VMI took a 7-0 lead with 13:25 in the third quarter when red-shirt sophomore defensive end Emilio Calvin smothered an errant shotgun snap in the RMU endzone marking the second straight season opener where the Keydet defense produced points. Alexander scooped up a fumble and raced 46 yards in VMI's 49-0 win over Saint Francis (Pa.) to start the 2008 season.

Robert Morris got on the board when Brentley connected with Evers for a 14-yard TD with 9:43 left in the third quarter - capping a six-play, 73-yard drive that was highlighted by a Russ 34-yard scamper to the VMI 35.

VMI attained a 322-267 advantage in total offense for the game, but the Colonial defense was able to hold the Keydets to 297 yards on the ground and 25 yards passing. The Keydet defense held RMU to 5 of 15 in third-down conversion opportunities and 0 of 3 in fourth down tries.

Defensively, VMI was paced by redshirt-sophomore linebacker Eric Church who had 13 total tackles including 10 in the opening half. Allen added 11 stops including seven solos.

VMI HEAD COACH SPARKY WOODS

"I certainly want to commend Coach Walton and Robert Morris. I thought they really played an outstanding football game. They about beat us and they did a good job. Their defense was able to take the ball away and I thought their quarterback really played well."

"I was proud of our team and the poise they showed going into the last drive with the clock and execution. We had not executed well most of the day with the turnovers, and I felt on the last drive we did secure the ball and worked the clock really well. I was proud of our freshman kicker (Jeff Sexton) who came in there to kick the extra-point to win the game. I told him we'd probably have to use him to win some games, but didn't know it would be the first one."

"I'm happy with the win and what we wanted to be was 1-0. We have another week to correct a lot mistakes. Defensively, I thought we were better, but still did give up some third downs and a couple of big plays that we would like to eliminate. I think if we had not turned the ball over, we would have felt a lot better about the victory than we do now. I was pleased with our special teams and I thought we made some good plays there."



Senior Tim Maypray scored the tying touchdown with 1:23 remaining before freshman Jeff Sexton booted home the game-winning extra point to give the Keydets their fifth-straight season-opening win.
