VMI KEYDETS (0-2) VS. JACKSONVILLE UNIVERSITY (1-2)

FEB. 27, 1 P.M.

LEXINGTON, VA.

VMI lacrosse will play host to Jacksonville University, Feb. 27, for its home opener and the first meeting between the programs. The Keydets come off an impressive showing against Army, as VMI nearly pulled the upset against the Black Knights last Saturday.

VMI was paced by Stephen Robarge, who went 16 for 19 at the face-off X to jump start the Keydet offensive attack. The sophomore is now 31 for 40 in face-off attempts on the young season, for an impressive percentage of 77.5. For his efforts, Robarge was named the MAAC Defensive Player of the Week on Monday evening.

Last meeting with Jacksonville (None):

This is the first meeting between the programs in any sport. Jacksonville is one of the NCAA's newest programs, and is just three games into their inaugural season. The Dolphins enter Lexington fresh off a 13-12, triple overtime upset of #18 Denver last Saturday for the program's first win.

A win against Jacksonville would:

Give the Keydets their first win of the season.

Make the Keydets 1-0 all-time against teams from Florida.

Give the Keydets their first home win since April 5, 2008, a 14-12 win over Saint Joseph's, and their first non-conference home win since Feb. 27, 2008 (15-4 over Presbyterian).

Move VMI to 3-1 in home openers under Coach Jeff Shirk.

Robarge Named MAAC Defensive Player of the Week

VMI's Stephen Robarge has been named the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Lacrosse Defensive Player of the Week, as announced by the conference Monday evening.

Robarge has gotten off to an explosive start to his sophomore season, as he has controlled the face-off X against two highly regarded programs. In the Keydets' season opener versus Navy, he prevailed in 15 of 21 draws, and last weekend versus Army, he won 16 of 19 attempted faceoffs and had nine groundballs. On the day, Army won just four faceoffs, and the Keydets nearly pulled the upset, thanks in large part to Robarge's efforts. He now is 31 for 40 in faceoff attempts on the year, for an astounding 77.5% success rate.

VMI lacrosse will return to action Saturday, as the Keydets play host to Jacksonville University in VMI's home opener. Game time is set for 1 p.m. at VMI's turf field.

Late VMI Rally Falls Short at Army

WEST POINT, N.Y. – A fourth quarter VMI rally fell just short, as the Keydet lacrosse team dropped an 11-9 contest to the Army Black Knights Saturday afternoon at Michie Stadium in West Point, N.Y.

Trailing 10-5 with 13:15 to play, the Keydets (0-2) mounted a comeback over the next 7:24. Jacob Weimer scored just 45 seconds into the run, and Drew Leonard followed with a goal to cut the margin to three. Bobby Davis then notched a pair of goals, the last tally a man-up marker, to cut the deficit to 10-9 with 5:51 left. Unfortunately for VMI, the Keydets could get no closer, and the Black Knights (1-0) added a late insurance goal to account for the final margin.

VMI was paced by Stephen Robarge, who went 16 for 19 at the face-off X to jump start the Keydet offensive attack. The sophomore is now 31 for 40 in face-off attempts on the young season, for an impressive percentage of 77.5. Weimer had three goals for the Keydets, while Keith Long and Tim Moran each had four points in the setback.

Army jumped on the board first, just over a minute into the game. After a VMI turnover. Devin Lynch scored for the Black Knights to make it 1-0, Army. The Keydets came back at the 12:15 mark, as Long scored the first of his two goals to knot the score at one. The teams again traded goals just moments later, as Army's leading returning scorer Jeremy Boltus threaded a pass to teammate Garrett Thul. Thul beat VMI keeper Kelly McMinn to make it 2-1, but with 7:48 left in the first, Tim Moran found the

back of the net to tie the game at two.

VMI threatened again immediately following the Moran goal, as Robarge won another faceoff to give the Keydets possession. Weimer fired a shot wide right, and Black Knight keeper Tom Palesky stopped a Drew Leonard attempt. The teams exchanged fruitless possessions over the next two minutes, leading to the game's first penalty. The flag against the Keydets gave Army an extra-man chance, and the home team cashed in to go up 3-2. They would add a goal late in the period, and would hold a 4-2 lead after one quarter.

The second quarter went by scoreless, so Army maintained its 4-2 lead at the halftime intermission. The home squad had outshot VMI 14-12 in the opening half, and the Keydets' went just 5-11 in clears over the opening 30 minutes.

Army came out quickly, as attacker Tyler Seymour struck for two quick goals. The last came at 11:09 of the third, and put Army up by four, 6-2. As was the case all day, the Keydets came right back. Weimer scored back-to-back goals, the last coming with 8:20 left in the period, and the deficit was down to just two.

Seymour scored his third marker of the quarter just 90 seconds later, but Long responded at the 4:07 mark for VMI, and the Keydets remained within two at 7-5. The Black Knights then scored the game's next three goals, including two by Boltus late in the third quarter, to set the stage for the attempted VMI comeback.

On the day, the Keydets outshot Army 34-30, including 12-7 in the final period, and also outgained the Black Knights in ground balls, 34-24. Helped by Robarge's 16 for 19 effort, VMI won 19 of the 23 faceoffs contested, but 19 VMI turnovers and six Keydet penalties helped Army escape with the narrow win. Defensively, VMI netminder McMinn made 10 saves in his first collegiate start, while Palesky stopped 11 shots for the Black Knights.

VMI lacrosse will return to action Saturday, Feb. 27, as the Keydets host Jacksonville University in VMI's home opener. The contest is currently scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. at VMI's turf field.

Jeff Shirk

HEAD COACH - FOURTH SEASON – UNIV. OF MARYLAND (2001)



Jeff Shirk took the reins as VMI's head lacrosse coach in August of 2006, and will begin his fourth season at the helm of the Keydets in 2010. The former University of Maryland midfielder has wasted little time in establishing VMI as an up-and-coming team in Division I lacrosse. In only his second season at VMI (2008), Coach Shirk led the Keydets to three firsts in program history: Qualifying for the conference tournament, winning a conference tournament game and advancing to the conference championship.

Shirk came to the Institute with an impressive background in lacrosse, both as a player and as a coach. He was a four-year staple at short-stick defensive midfield for the University of Maryland, and was named team captain as a senior. After college, Shirk played three years in the National Lacrosse League (NLL) before turning his focus solely to coaching.

"Lacrosse is a great sport for VMI, and I am very happy that Jeff Shirk will lead our program," said VMI athletic director Donny White at the time of Shirk's hiring. "I am impressed with his background, both as a player and as a coach. I am confident that he will build and coach our team to be a contender for the MAAC championship."

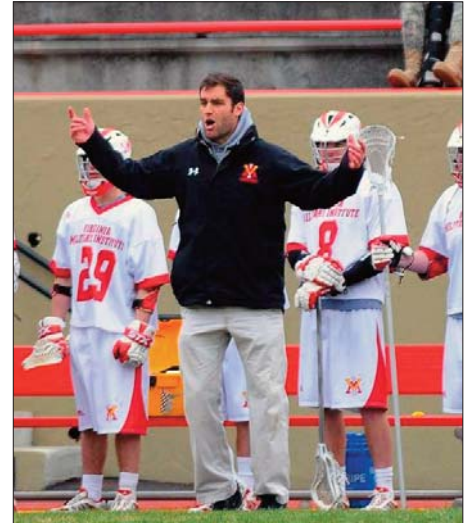
In July of 2001, Shirk began his first full-time coaching position when he was hired by Richie Meade as the head coach at the Naval Academy Preparatory School (NAPS). Over the course of three seasons at NAPS, Shirk amassed an impressive record of 22-11 and helped de-

velop future Navy All-Americans Matt Russell, Steve Looney, Jon Birsner, Bill Looney, and Nick Mirabito. While there, Shirk also served as the Associate Director of Athletics and held the rank of LTJG in the United States Navy.

Shirk then returned to his alma mater, when he was hired by Dave Cottle in August of 2004 as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland. While coaching for the Terps, Shirk helped them win an ACC Championship and earn a berth in the 2005 Final Four.

In November of 2005, Shirk continued his quick move up the coaching ranks when Scott Nelson named him the defensive coordinator at Brown University. During his short time at College Hill, Shirk helped lay a foundation that has proven instrumental in aiding Brown's success under now-Head Coach Lars Tiffany.

Shirk, a Mountain Lakes, NJ native, has high aspirations for the VMI Lacrosse program. "From the first day I stepped on Post, I have been excited about the future of VMI lacrosse. VMI has a niche that makes it unique, and in my opinion better, than any other school in the country. We have first-class, Division I athletic facilities, offer a top-notch education, provide an alumni network second-to-none, build resumes through leadership training in a military environment, and on top of all that, allow our students a choice upon graduation. Graduates can commission into one of the branches of the armed forces, or one could enter the workforce just as you would from a non-military school. It just doesn't get any better than VMI



for the student-athletes who are serious about being successful on the lacrosse field, and equally serious about building the foundation needed for success in life."

Coach Shirk resides in Lexington with his wife Elizabeth, two daughters Emily and Anna and their yellow lab Maggie. Shirk is also the founder and director of the Jeff Shirk Lacrosse Camps, which provide instructional camps for young lacrosse players throughout the year.
