## GAME FOUR

VMI KEYDETS (1-2) VS. PRESBYTERIAN COLL. BLUE HOSE (1-1)  
 MARCH 2, 1 P.M.  
 CLINTON, S.C.

VMI lacrosse returns to action Tuesday, as the Keydets travel to Clinton, S.C. to take on the Blue Hose of Presbyterian College. Game time is set for 1 p.m.

The Keydets come off a solid performance against upstart Jacksonville University Saturday, as VMI earned a 10-9 win by holding on in the closing moments. A Colin Bosse man-up goal with just over three minutes remaining stood up as the winning margin. Brett Leonard's three goals helped the Keydets to their first win of 2010, and their first home win since the middle of 2008.

In addition to Leonard, seven other Keydets had single tallies, including Bernie Mowbray's first career goal. Kelly McMinn's 16 saves tied him for the fourth-most in VMI history in a single game, while Jacksonville was paced by Cameron Mann, who had four goals in the defeat.

### **Last meeting with Presbyterian College (2-21-09):**

Tim Moran had four goals to lead the Keydets past the Blue Hose, 9-7, in the last meeting between the teams. The game was knotted at five entering the final quarter, and Presbyterian held a 7-6 lead with 12 minutes remaining. The Keydets went on to score the final three goals, as Colin Bosse broke a 7-7 tie with 7:47 to go and Moran capped the scoring at the 5:08 mark, giving VMI its third win in three tries over Presbyterian.

### **A win against Presbyterian would:**

Make VMI 4-0 all-time against the Blue Hose.

Move the Keydets to 2-2 for the first time since the 2005 season.

### Keydets Win Thrilling Home Opener, 10-9

Eight different players notched goals, Kelly McMinn had 16 saves and VMI lacrosse survived a second-half rally by the up-start Jacksonville Dolphins to hold on for a thrilling 10-9 win Saturday, in a non-conference contest played at VMI's turf field.

VMI (1-2) saw just one player, Brett Leonard, score multiple goals in the victory. The senior scored three on the day, while six other Keydets had single tallies, including Bernie Mowbray's first career goal. In addition, McMinn's 16 saves tie him for the fourth-most in VMI history in a single game. Jacksonville (1-3) was paced by Cameron Mann, who had four goals in the defeat.

On the day, the Dolphins outshot VMI 46-26, including 30-15 in the second half. The visitors were able to capture nine face-off wins versus Robarge, who came in with a 77.5% success rate, but the Keydets won each of the four battles at the face-off X in the final period. Finally, VMI won despite being flagged for 11 penalties and serving over 10 minutes in the box, while Jacksonville was flagged seven times for six minutes. The Keydets were 20 for 22 in clear attempts, while JU finished 18 for 22 in that statistic.

**2009:** Tabbed First Team All-MAAC, making him the first VMI player to earn that honor twice...scored a team-high 25 goals during the '09 campaign, a total that ranked him fifth in the MAAC in goals per game...was eighth in the conference in points per game, averaging 2.5 per contest thanks to his 10 assists...was second in the conference in man-up goals per game, as he notched six on the year...was second in the league in shots per game, but was consistent with his attempts as nearly 60% of them were on net (58.6%)...was named MAAC Offensive POTW Feb. 23, after his four goals led VMI to a win over Presbyterian...had a five-goal game in the season finale versus Canisius, where he also dished out two assists...those seven points made him one of only seven MAAC players to have that many points in a single game during 2009...will enter 2010 having been named to Inside Lacrosse's Preseason All-MAAC team...also enters 2010 just 21 points off VMI's top-10 career points list...is just 13 goals off the Keydets' top-10 all-time in that category, and falls just seven assists shy of 10th place on the career assists list.

## Jeff Shirk

### HEAD COACH - FOURTH SEASON – UNIV. OF MARYLAND (2001)



Jeff Shirk took the reins as VMI's head lacrosse coach in August of 2006, and will begin his fourth season at the helm of the Keydets in 2010. The former University of Maryland midfielder has wasted little time in establishing VMI as an up-and-coming team in Division I lacrosse. In only his second season at VMI (2008), Coach Shirk led the Keydets to three firsts in program history: Qualifying for the conference tournament, winning a conference tournament game and advancing to the conference championship.

Shirk came to the Institute with an impressive background in lacrosse, both as a player and as a coach. He was a four-year staple at short-stick defensive midfield for the University of Maryland, and was named team captain as a senior. After college, Shirk played three years in the National Lacrosse League (NLL) before turning his focus solely to coaching.

"Lacrosse is a great sport for VMI, and I am very happy that Jeff Shirk will lead our program," said VMI athletic director Donny White at the time of Shirk's hiring. "I am impressed with his background, both as a player and as a coach. I am confident that he will build and coach our team to be a contender for the MAAC championship."

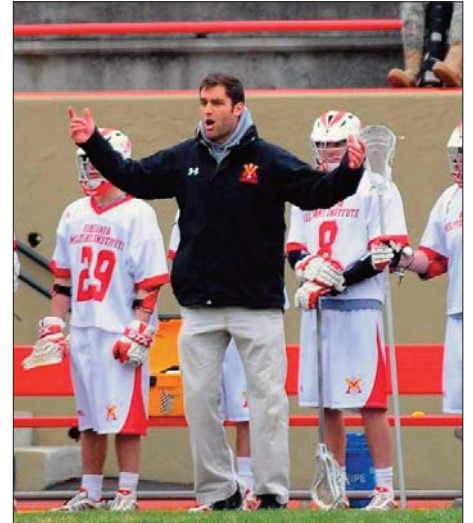
In July of 2001, Shirk began his first full-time coaching position when he was hired by Richie Meade as the head coach at the Naval Academy Preparatory School (NAPS). Over the course of three seasons at NAPS, Shirk amassed an impressive record of 22-11 and helped de-

velop future Navy All-Americans Matt Russell, Steve Looney, Jon Birsner, Bill Looney, and Nick Mirabito. While there, Shirk also served as the Associate Director of Athletics and held the rank of LTJG in the United States Navy.

Shirk then returned to his alma mater, when he was hired by Dave Cottle in August of 2004 as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland. While coaching for the Terps, Shirk helped them win an ACC Championship and earn a berth in the 2005 Final Four.

In November of 2005, Shirk continued his quick move up the coaching ranks when Scott Nelson named him the defensive coordinator at Brown University. During his short time at College Hill, Shirk helped lay a foundation that has proven instrumental in aiding Brown's success under now-Head Coach Lars Tiffany.

Shirk, a Mountain Lakes, NJ native, has high aspirations for the VMI Lacrosse program. "From the first day I stepped on Post, I have been excited about the future of VMI lacrosse. VMI has a niche that makes it unique, and in my opinion better, than any other school in the country. We have first-class, Division I athletic facilities, offer a top-notch education, provide an alumni network second-to-none, build resumes through leadership training in a military environment, and on top of all that, allow our students a choice upon graduation. Graduates can commission into one of the branches of the armed forces, or one could enter the workforce just as you would from a non-military school. It just doesn't get any better than VMI



for the student-athletes who are serious about being successful on the lacrosse field, and equally serious about building the foundation needed for success in life."

Coach Shirk resides in Lexington with his wife Elizabeth, two daughters Emily and Anna and their yellow lab Maggie. Shirk is also the founder and director of the Jeff Shirk Lacrosse Camps, which provide instructional camps for young lacrosse players throughout the year.
