The VMI baseball team, ranked 30th in the nation by Collegiate Baseball, looks to continue its best start in program history with a mid-week set at The Citadel. The 14-1 Keydets are coming off their fourth consecutive weekend sweep, taking four games from La Salle at Gray-Minor Stadium.

The national ranking is just the third in program history for the Keydets after being ranked 30th by Collegiate Baseball back-to-back weeks in March 2007. That season, VMI opened the year 17-4 and scored wins over third-ranked Virginia and 10th-ranked Auburn.

Senior Jordan Ballard also made national headlines Monday, earning Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week honors after hitting six home runs in five games. The first baseman slugged an astounding 1.929 on the week, driving in 14 runs in 14 at bats.

Ballard's bat has not been the only red-hot bat for the Keydets, as the team enters the week leading the nation with a .675 slugging percentage, and ranking second with a .381 batting average and 35 home runs. VMI has scored at least 11 runs in seven outings this year, ranking among the top 10 in the nation by scoring 10.7 runs per game.

This week's series against the Bulldogs renews one of VMI's oldest rivalries. The Keydets have not played a member of the Southern Conference on the diamond since leaving the league after the 2003 campaign. That year, the teams split their four meetings, with The Citadel winning two of three in the regular season finale before VMI scored a 2-1 victory in the SoCon Tournament four days later.

Tuesday's contest will pit Keydet right-hander Chris Duty (1-0) against Bulldog righty T.J. Clarkson (1-0). On Wednesday, a pair of freshmen right-handers are scheduled to face off, with VMI Coby Cowgill (2-0) and Austin Pritcher (0-0) matching up.

Each of the Keydets' five road games over Spring Furlough will be carried on the VMI Sports Network, which can be heard online at www.VMIKeydets.com, while Tuesday's and Wednesday's games will be carried on Lexington's WREL 1450 AM. In addition, fans can watch each of the next five games online, with The Citadel games available at www.CitadelSports.com and the High Point contests set to be broadcast on the Big South Network at www.BigSouthSports.com.

Keydets Turn Heads Nationally:

For the third time in program history, the VMI Baseball team has earned a national ranking, being tabbed 30th in the country by Collegiate Baseball on Monday, March 15. The Keydets were also listed as Receiving Votes in two additional polls, the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' Poll and the NCBWA Writers' Poll.

At 14-1, the Keydets are off to their best start in school history thanks to four consecutive week-end sweeps.

The Keydets' previous national rankings came three years ago, when VMI began the year 17-4. In 2007, VMI was ranked 30th in back-to-back polls by Collegiate Baseball after defeating 10th-ranked Auburn, 7-3. The Keydets also received votes four different times in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Poll (NCBWA), the most recent coming in the 2008 preseason, while the program had never before received votes in the Coaches' Poll until this season.

Ballard's Week Earns National Acclaim:

VMI senior Jordan Ballard (Troy, Va./Monticello), enjoyed the most impressive week of his career in early March, slugging six home runs in five games to become VMI's first-ever Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week.

The first baseman hit .571 on the week with a .611 on-base percentage while slugging 1.929 in the five games. In addition, Ballard had 14 RBIs in 14 at bats, driving in at least four runs in three different contests.

Ballard hit a pair of home runs in both games one and three against La Salle, as he moved into a tie for fourth place on VMI's career home runs chart with 31 and moved into third on the career slugging percentage list (.566).

Spangenberg Keeps Rolling:

Freshman Cory Spangenberg hasn't needed much time to get acclimated to the rigors of Division I baseball. Along with several other Keydet freshmen, Spangenberg has been a large part of VMI's early-season success, starting each game this season in the middle infield and leading the team with a .431 batting average and 13 stolen bases.

The Clarks Summit, Pa. native has hits in 14 of VMI's 15 games this season, and is currently on

Roberts On A Tear:

Junior Sam Roberts had an impressive week-end against Maryland Eastern Shore, leaving his mark both at the plate and on the mound. Roberts was 2 for 5 with a career-high five RBIs in Friday's win against the Hawks, before going 3 for 3 with two home runs and five RBIs again on Saturday. On Sunday, his focus shifted to the mound, as he allowed just one hit in seven innings, striking out six batters in an 8-4 win.

just 15 games are well on their way to eclipsing his career-best total of 34, set last season.

Roberts entered this week leading the Big South with 28 RBIs and 51 total bases and ranking second with 7 HR, 23 runs and an .836 slugging percentage

Getting Started:

A strength of the Keydets' 14-1 start this year has been the performance of the team's starting pitchers. In 15 combined starts, sophomore Adam Lopez, freshman Coby Cowgill, junior Sam Roberts and redshirt sophomore Jason Farley are a combined 7-1 with a 4.06 ERA, having struck out 70 batters and in 71 innings while walking just 21.

In addition, each of the starters has thrown a quality start, consisting of at least six innings pitched while allowing three earned runs or less.

Ikenberry Hits Another Milestone:

In VMI's 11-1 win over La Salle on March 14, head coach Marlin Ikenberry scored his 175th career victory.

Already the leader in career coaching wins at VMI, Ikenberry now sits at 175-168 entering this week's play. He is one of just two coaches with at least five seasons coached at VMI to post a winning percentage over .500, currently at .510.

Keydets Continue Streak at Maryland:

VMI kept its win streak rolling with an extra-inning affair at Maryland on March 2. The 7-6 win, VMI's second by that same score in three days, pushed the Keydets to 7-0 for the first time in school history.

After a strong, career-long six-inning performance from starting pitcher Jason Farley, the fireworks began in the late innings. VMI moved in front, 5-2, with a four-run eighth inning, only to give the lead back in the bottom of the frame. The same was true in the ninth after the visitors took a 6-5 lead, only to see the Terps rally to take the game to extras.

VMI then turned the game over to the capable arm of freshman John Garrett, who retired all six batters he faced to lock up his first collegiate win. That came after VMI scored its third unearned run of the game, as Justin Topping scored on Sam Roberts' groundout in the 11th.

The win was VMI's first over an ACC opponent since knocking off Virginia Tech, 8-7, on April 30, 2008. The last time VMI defeated an ACC team on the road also came against the Hokies back on April 27, 2005 a 6-2 victory in Blacksburg.

It is also believed to be VMI's first win over the Terps since the 1948 season.

Morley Has Big Weekend Against Lafayette:

Sophomore Jacob Morley enjoyed a standout weekend against Lafayette, reaching base in 11 of his 13 plate appearances (.846 OBP) while hitting .778.

In game one of the series, was 2 for 3 with a three-run home run and four RBIs, while in game two, Morley was 3 for 3 with two doubles, two walks, three runs scored and two RBIs. The Annandale, Va. native wrapped up his series by going 2 for 3, driving in a pair of runs.

Chicks Dig The Long Ball:

A large part of VMI's unprecedented 14-1 start has been the team's offensive prowess. In just 15 games, VMI has already hit 35 home runs, coming from 12 different players, while allowing just three.

Leading the way is senior Jordan Ballard with eight, thanks to his six home runs in five games in mid-March. Sam Roberts has seven round trippers, while freshman Cory Spangenberg is just behind with five. Tanner Biagini has four this season, while Graham Sullivan, Rob Dickinson and Erickson Keeton each have two to their credit. Alex Haitzuka, Jacob Morley, Steele Myers, George Piccirilli and Chase Worthington have each contributed a single home run this season.

VMI's school record stands at 56, accomplished in 40 games back in 1985, while last season's team came up just shy with 55 round-trippers in 53 contests.

Spreading The Wealth:

On the mound this season, the Keydets have seemingly gotten contributions from everyone. That can be seen in the pitching staff's wins, as VMI's 14 wins have gone to nine different pitchers this season.

Sam Roberts leads the way at 3-0, while starters Adam Lopez and Coby Cowgill, along with reliever Michael Devine, are each 2-0. Relievers Jeremy Brown, Chris Duty, Jason Farley, John Garrett and Travis Thomas have each scored a win as well. In all, the Keydet bullpen is now 7-0 with three saves and a combined 3.10 ERA, striking out 65 and walking 17 in 58 innings.

Keydets Sweep Patriot League

Foes:

VMI opened its 2010 season with a bang, sweeping two of the top teams in the Patriot League in Bucknell and Lafayette.

The Keydets began the year with by taking down the Bison, the defending co-regular season champs in the league. VMI followed that up with a blanking of the Leopards, who last season, beat the Bison in the tournament to finish as the Runners-Up in the championship.

With the wins, VMI improved to 6-0 for the first-time in school history.

Middle Relief Excels Opening Weekend:

VMI opened its 2010 campaign with an impressive sweep of Bucknell. Playing a large role in the team's success was the standout performances of the Keydet middle relief corps.
