The VMI baseball team puts its undefeated mark on the line this weekend, as Maryland Eastern Shore and Bryant come to town for a four-game weekend in Lexington. The UMES Hawks and Keydets will play a three-game set on Friday, Saturday and Sunday before Bryant comes in for a Monday contest at Gray-Minor Stadium.

VMI is coming off its first win over an ACC opponent in two years after knocking off Maryland, 7-6, in 11 innings on Tuesday. The win also marked VMI's first victory at an ACC park since the 2005 season, as the Keydets continue their best-ever start, currently at 7-0.

The Keydets have been getting contributions from everywhere, including from a strong freshman class. Offensively, the six freshmen who have been to the plate are hitting a combined .385 with four doubles, six home runs and 19 RBIs, while on the mound, the three freshman hurlers are a combined 2-0 with a 3.21 ERA, striking out 11 in 14 innings with a

.191 opponents' batting average.

The Keydets will keep their rotation the same as they look to improve on their 6-0 all-time mark against UMES. On Friday, sophomore righty Adam Lopez (1-0) will face freshman left-hander Donnie Haines (0-1). On Saturday, Keydet freshman right-hander Coby Cowgill (1-0) faces sophomore righty Karim Gonzalez (0-2), while on Sunday, VMI junior righty Sam Roberts takes on sophomore southpaw John DesChamps (0-2).

Monday's match-up is the first-ever between the Bulldogs and Keydets, as Bryant is in its second season transitioning into Division I. The Bulldogs will be in the midst of a seven-games-in-seven-days stretch, playing games at four different venues in three states. The Bulldogs enter the trip 0-3 and will send junior right-hander Joe Michaud to the mound to oppose Keydet redshirt sophomore left-hander Jason Farley, who went six innings against Maryland, allowing just two runs on four hits.

Keydets Continue Streak at Maryland:

VMI kept its win streak rolling with an extra-inning affair at Maryland on March 2. The 7-6 win, VMI's second by that same score in three days, pushed the Keydets to 7-0 for the first time in school history.

After a strong, career-long six-inning performance from starting pitcher Jason Farley, the fireworks began in the late innings. VMI moved in front, 5-2, with a four-run eighth inning, only to give the lead back in the bottom of the frame. The same was true in the ninth after the visitors took a 6-5 lead, only to see the Terps rally to take the game to extras.

VMI then turned the game over to the capable arm of freshman John Garrett, who retired all six batters he faced to lock up his first collegiate win. That came after VMI scored its third unearned run of the game, as Justin Topping scored on Sam Roberts' groundout in the 11th.

The win was VMI's first over an ACC opponent since knocking off Virginia Tech, 8-7, on April 30, 2008. The last time VMI defeated an ACC team on the road also came against the Hokies back on April 27, 2005 a 6-2 victory in Blacksburg.

It is also believed to be VMI's first win over the Terps since the 1948 season.

Morley Has Big Weekend Against Lafayette:

Sophomore Jacob Morley enjoyed a standout weekend against Lafayette, reaching base in 11 of his 13 plate appearances (.846 OBP) while hitting .778.

In game one of the series, was 2 for 3 with a three-run home run and four RBIs, while in game

two, Morley was 3 for 3 with two doubles, two walks, three runs scored and two RBIs. The Annandale, Va. native wrapped up his series by going 2 for 3, driving in a pair of runs.

Morley is currently hitting .435 and leads VMI with a .519 on-base percentage, three doubles (tied) and three walks (tied).

Chicks Dig The Long Ball:

A large part of VMI's unprecedented 7-0 start has been the team's offensive prowess. In just seven games, VMI has already hit 17 home runs, coming from nine different players, while allowing just one.

Leading the way are senior Tanner Biagini and junior Sam Roberts with three jacks each, while freshmen Rob Dickinson, Cory Spangenberg and Erickson Keeton, along with senior Jordan Ballard, have two home runs each. Sophomores Jacob Morley, George Piccirilli and Chase Worthington have each hit one out this season.

plished in 40 games back in 1985, while last season's team came up just shy with 55 roundtrippers in 53 contests.

Spreading The Wealth:

On the mound this season, the Keydets have seemingly gotten contributions from everyone. That can be seen in the pitching staff's wins, as VMI's seven wins have gone to seven different pitchers this season.

Each of VMI's weekend starters, Adam Lopez, Coby Cowgill and Sam Roberts, have scored victories, along with relievers Jeremy Brown, Michael Devine, John Garrett and Chris Duty. In all, the Keydet bullpen is now 4-0 with two saves and a combined 3.13 ERA, striking out 32 and walking 10 in 31.2 innings.

Keydets Sweep Patriot League Foes:

VMI opened its 2010 season with a bang, sweeping two of the top teams in the Patriot League in Bucknell and Lafayette.

The Keydets began the year with by taking down the Bison, the defending co-regular season champs in the league. VMI followed that up with a blanking of the Leopards, who last season, beat the Bison in the tournament to finish as the Runners-Up in the championship.

With the wins, VMI improved to 6-0 for the first-time in school history.

Middle Relief Excels Opening Weekend:

VMI opened its 2010 campaign with an impressive sweep of Bucknell. Playing a large role in the team's success was the standout performances of the Keydet middle relief corps.

The five Keydets that made middle relief appearances on the weekend combined to allow three runs in 12.1 innings, good enough for a 2.19 ERA, striking out 11 and walking just two.

Chris Duty and Jeremy Brown each picked up wins in their relief efforts, as Duty worked 3.2 innings while allowing one run in game two after Brown gave up two runs in 3.1 innings in game one. Travis Thomas, Jason Farley and Andrew Deal each had scoreless efforts in their season debuts, as they combined to allow just one base runner in their 5.1 innings.

Freshmen Bats Pace Keydets Past Bucknell:

Several freshmen made a lasting impression in their VMI debuts on opening weekend, as VMI swept co-regular season Patriot League Champs Bucknell.

In a series moved to Prince George HS due to snow and ice at Gray-Minor Stadium, VMI freshmen Cory Spangenberg, Rob Dickinson and Erickson Keeton combined to hit 12 for 22 (.545) with two doubles, four home runs and nine RBIs.

Spangenberg was 4 for 4 in the opener, collecting two doubles, a home run and three RBIs as VMI won, 9-4. Also in that game, Keeton went 2

for 2 with two home runs and three RBIs, but injured himself in his second at bat. He was then replaced by Dickinson, who proceeded to go 3 for 4 with a home run and two runs scored in game two of the series, a 6-5 VMI win.

VMI Earns Preseason Accolades:

VMI seniors Jordan Ballard and Tanner

Biagini and junior Sam Roberts were selected to SEBaseball's Preseason All-Big South squads, as the website unveiled its season preview articles on Sunday.

Ballard was tabbed a First Team selection at first base, while Biagini was named to the Second Team at third base. Roberts, meanwhile, was listed as the Second Team Utility player.

Keydets Face Tough Schedule:

In 2010, VMI is scheduled to face a tough schedule, one that includes two teams that began the season in the top 15 in the national rankings.

The Keydets are slated to play two games against Virginia, who began the season ranked third nationally after its first appearance in Omaha, and three more against Coastal Carolina, who began the season ranked 12th. The Cavs and Chants are favored to win the ACC and Big South, respectively, as is James Madison in the CAA.

In addition, VMI will face two of the top teams in the Patriot League, including defending co-regular season champs Bucknell and tournament runners-up Lafayette. Also on the slate is The Citadel, picked as high as third in the SoCon last year, in a two-game series that will mark the first match-up against a SoCon foe since VMI left the league prior to the 2003-04 season.

Evans Named Volunteer Assistant:

Kwan Evans, a 2007 graduate of VCU, has joined the VMI Baseball coaching staff for the 2010 campaign.

A four-year letterman with the Rams as an outfielder, Evans helped the Rams to a pair of CAA Conference Championships and NCAA appearances, playing in the 2005 Coral Gables Regional and the 2007 Myrtle Beach Regional. He was also a 2005 CAA All-Rookie team selection following a freshman year during which he hit .312 with 15 doubles and 13 stolen bases.

Mau Elevated to Associate Head

Coach:

Ryan Mau, entering his fifth season with the Keydets, was recently promoted to Associate Head Coach with the program.

Mau, who also serves as the Keydets' recruiting coordinator and pitching coach, has helped the program to several milestone achievements during his tenure in Lexington. Over the past four years, the Keydets have achieved their first-ever national ranking, had eight players, including four pitchers, drafted by MLB teams, and have brought in nationally-regarded recruiting classes

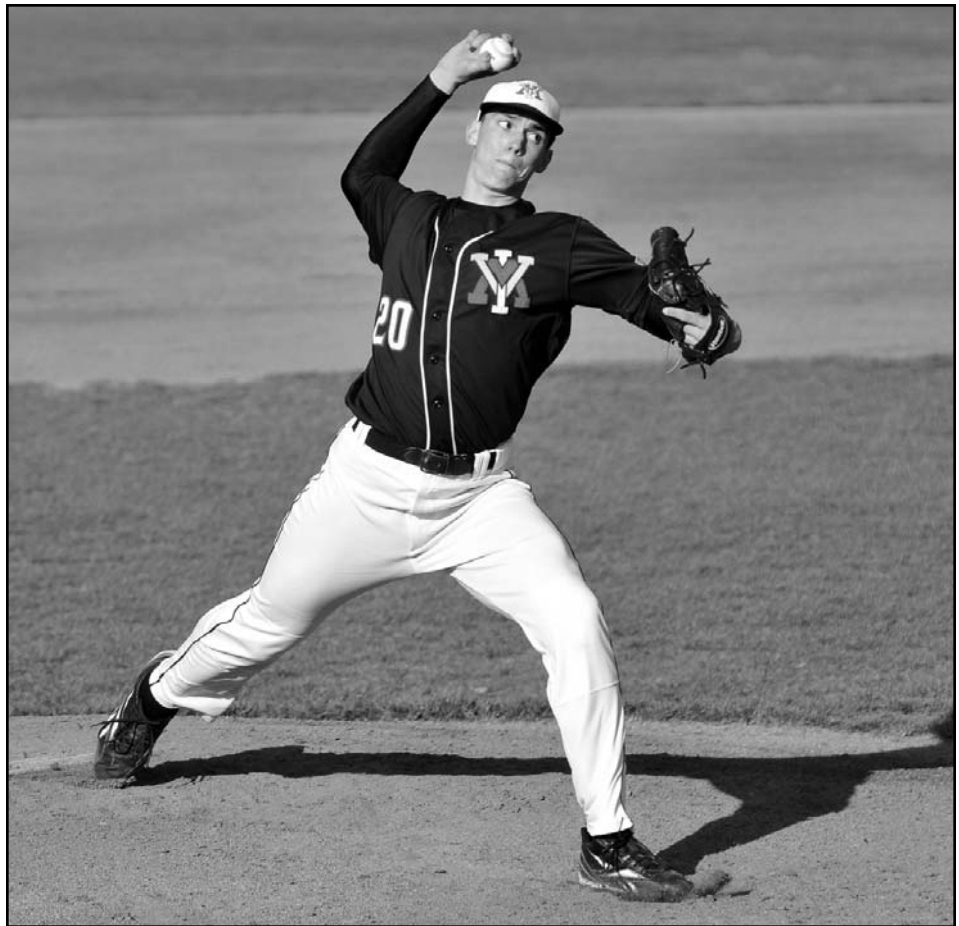

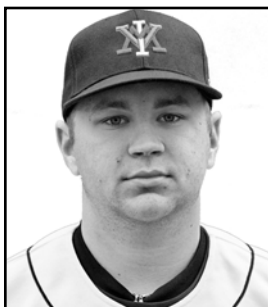
