

COACHES - **Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76)**, a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, is in his fourth season in Lexington. 2011 marks the second year of Woods' pro-style offense, installed prior to last season, following two years of the triple option offense.

Woods, 57, was named the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 118-year history on February 12, 2008. That marked his return to the FCS (I-AA) ranks, where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons, from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 73-78-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003-06 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

Harold Nichols (Presbyterian '89) is in his third season as the head coach at his alma mater, having rejoined the program in January of 2009. His team won its first Big South game last season, a win over Gardner-Webb, and defeated the Runnin' Bulldogs again this year. Four of his players also earned All-Big South selections following the 2010 season. Nichols came to PC after a year at Bucknell, where he served as the offensive coordinator and assistant coach for one season. He also has worked at Rhode Island, where he was the Associate Head Coach, and at Georgia Southern.

A VMI Win against Presbyterian would -

Mark the Keydets' fourth straight win over the Blue Hose, a streak that began in 2008.

SATURDAY'S GAME VS. PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE -

THE SERIES - Saturday's contest is the fifth meeting all-time between the Keydets and Blue Hose, with VMI holding a 3-1 edge in the series. The Keydets have won the last three meetings, with the 2009 and 2010 contests being decided by 11 points apiece.

IT HAPPENED ON NOVEMBER 12 -

VMI FOOTBALL - On Nov. 12, 1983, the Keydets defeated Maine 14-12 in the only meeting between the programs.

WORLD EVENTS - On this date in 1892, William "Pudge" Heffelfinger becomes the first professional American football player on record, participating in his first paid game for the Allegheny Athletic Association.

VMI TEAM NOTES -

KORDENBROCK NAMED CONFERENCE OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - Quarterback Eric Kordenbrock was named the Big South Choice Hotels Offensive Football Player of the Week, as announced Monday, Nov. 7. Against Liberty on Nov. 5, Kordenbrock threw for a career-high 320 yards and three touchdowns with a school record 31 completions. The three touchdowns strikes represented a career-high for the sophomore.

His 31 completions set a new VMI record, surpassing the single game mark of 27 set by Kirk Monteleone in 2004 (also against Liberty). In addition, Kordenbrock's 47 attempts were the fourth-most in school history, and his 320 yards marked the first 300-yard passing game by a VMI quarterback since Jonathan Wilson had 306 yards against Austin Peay on November 8, 2003.

OTHER LIBERTY NOTES - The 403 yards total offense vs. Liberty was the first 400-yard game produced by the Keydets since the 2009 Old Dominion game.

With four extra points, junior kicker Jeff Sexton now has 102 points scored and is the sixth kicker with at least 100 points tallied in his career.

RECEIVERS LOGGING CATCHES - Passing has taken on a more critical role in this year's VMI offense, as evidenced by the number of catches Keydet receivers have posted this season. Not only do Tracy Hairston and T.J. Talley rank in the conference's top-10 in receptions, but 12 different Keydets have career highs in catches this year, paced by Talley's nine against Liberty on Nov. 5.

THE CHAZ JONES QUARTET - Redshirt senior running back Chaz Jones rushed for a season-high 112 yards on 16 carries and had a three-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter against The Citadel Oct. 29. The output was the second highest in Jones' career behind his career-high 118 yards rushing against Old Dominion last year. The 112 yards on the ground against the Bulldogs by Jones was the most by a VMI back this season.

With his fourth quarter rushing touchdown against Stony Brook (Oct. 22), Jones recorded his 17th career TD run, moving him into eighth place on the Institute's all-time list. He surpassed Howard Abegesah and Sam Horner, who each recorded 16 during their careers. Jones went on to run for another TD Oct. 29 against the Citadel, giving him 18 TD's for his career.

With 112 rushing yards against The Citadel Oct. 29, Jones now has 571 yards rushing in eight games, surpassing his 502 yards in nine games last season.

Jones missed the Liberty game due to a shoulder injury.

OTHER NOTES FROM THE CITADEL - The Keydet defense forced a season-high three turnovers (two fumble recoveries, one interception) against the Bulldogs Oct. 29 and committed just one miscue. It was the most turnovers caused since VMI picked off four passes against Charleston Southern on October 23, 2010.

Freshman running back Jabari Turner scored his first career-touchdown with a two-yard run in the fourth quarter against The Citadel. Turner saw all his action in the second half against the Bulldogs and finished with 48 yards on 12 carries. He helped the Keydets finish with a season-high 156 yards rushing against The Citadel, surpassing the previous high of 149 yards against Charleston Southern October 15.

Redshirt freshman linebacker Logan Staib made his second career start at outside linebacker against The Citadel and finished the game with 11 solo tackles and three assists for 14 stops which included 1.5 tackles-for-loss and a fumble recovery to halt Citadel's first drive.

Redshirt senior Byron Allen was moved to starting strong safety from outside linebacker against The Citadel to fill the void created when redshirt freshman Demetri Phillips withdrew from school for personal reasons after the October 22 Stony Brook game. Phillips had made seven starts at strong safety and was fourth on the team in tackles with 34 stops and a forced fumble. Sophomore cornerback Miguel Marshall missed his third straight game after sustaining a high-ankle sprain against Coastal Carolina October 8.

Redshirt senior kick returner Tracy Hairston now has 791 kick return yards for a 24.0 average which is third most in a season behind only to Tim Maypray who posted 972 yards in 2009 and 889 yards in 2007.

LONG BOMBS AGAINST THE SEAWOLVES - In the Oct. 22 game against Stony Brook, Adam Morgan hooked up with Aaron Lewis for an 81-yard touchdown, the seventh-longest pass play in school history. Not only was it a career-long completion for Morgan, and a career-long reception for Lewis, but it also marked the second straight year in which VMI had completed a pass of over 80 yards against the Seawolves. Eric Kordenbrock found Mario Scott for an 80-yard touchdown in the 2010 meeting between the schools.

STONY BROOK GAME NOTES - Nose tackle Charlie Jones had a strong game against Stony Brook on Oct. 22, as he logged career-highs in three different categories. First, he equaled his career-high in tackles with six, accomplishing that for the third time. He also logged his first solo sack, and had 3.5 tackles for loss for -10 yards, also a career-best.

Cornerback Mike Smith logged a career-high in tackles Oct. 22 against Stony Brook. He made 11 stops, leading VMI in that category.

Receiver Aaron Lewis had a career-high four catches for 118 yards, including an 81-yard touchdown reception from Adam Morgan (see above). That total is the most receiving yards for a Keydet this season, topping Mario Thompson's effort against Richmond.

Punter Cameron Murray punted 11 times in the game, a career-high and just two away from a 42-year old school record, set in 1969.

ALLEN NAMED BIG SOUTH CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - Byron Allen was named the Big South Co-Defensive Player of the Week, as announced by the league October 17. Allen, VMI's first weekly honoree this year, batted down four passes near the line of scrimmage in the Oct. 15 win against Charleston Southern. One of the break-ups was during a third quarter goal-line stand on a 3rd-and-Goal play at the VMI 1. On the next play, Allen assisted on a tackle for no gain to keep the Buccaneers out of the end zone and give the ball back to the Keydets. He broke up two passes on second down plays and one on third down, and added five tackles, including one for loss of four yards.

Allen shared the honor with Presbyterian's Justin Bethel.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN GAME NOTES -

Freshman cornerback Johnny Wimbish made his first college start against Charleston Southern for injured defensive back Miguel Marshall (ankle) and led the Keydets in tackles with nine stops including six solos.

Redshirt senior running back Chaz Jones led VMI in rushing against Charleston Southern with a season-high 96 yards rushing on a career-high 28 attempts. Jones also scored on touchdown runs of one and seven yards out and made a key two-yard run on a fourth and one in the last minute of play ensuring that VMI could run out the clock.

Jones has scored five touchdowns against Charleston Southern the last two years and has led VMI in rushing in all but one game this year.

Tight end Will Lucas made a five yard TD catch from quarterback Eric Kordenbrock for his first career touchdown reception Saturday against Charleston Southern.

When VMI took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter against Charleston Southern, it marked the first time this season the Keydets had held a lead since the first half of the opener against Delaware State. VMI also ended a long turnover drought when James Fruehan recovered a muffed CSU punt return giving VMI its first takeaway in nearly 13 quarters of action.

GROSS HITS 300 - With his seven tackles Oct. 8 against Coastal Carolina, redshirt senior linebacker A.J. Gross hit the 300-tackle mark for his career. He became just the ninth player in Big South history to achieve that feat, and is now just 20 stops shy of 10th place on VMI's all-time list (see page 5).

GROSS RETURNS AS BIG SOUTH'S LEADING TACKLER - VMI's A.J. Gross, the leader in the Big South in tackles last season (110), was the first Keydet to accomplish that feat since 2005, when Justin Huggard posted 136 total stops. It was, in fact, the first time since Huggard that a

VMI defender had gone over 100 tackles in a season. Gross' 70 assists on tackles were the most for a Keydet since Huggard's '05 campaign as well, when he posted 86 such assists. Gross now has 326 career tackles, leaving him 20 shy of 10th place in program history, currently held by Todd Baldwin '06.

AKRON GAME NOTES - Two VMI defensive backs, Michael Johnson and Demetri Phillips, led VMI in tackles against Akron with career-best efforts. Johnson had 12 stops and Phillips recorded nine. Freshman James Fruehan also made three tackles in his first career game. End Shawn Chapman also had a strong game, posting career-highs in tackles-for-loss (2.0) and sacks (2.0). Chapman is VMI's first player this season to record multiple sacks in a game.

Stefawn Ross had his first career touchdown catch against Akron, hauling in a 39-yard pass from Eric Kordenbrock. The catch was a career-long for Ross, and also helped him accumulate a career-best 49 yards receiving.

For the first time this season, T.J. Talley led VMI in rushing, notching 63 yards on the ground. That marked a career-high for the senior.

Sept. 24's contest was is the second matchup between VMI and Akron on the gridiron. The two games between the schools are the only Division I football game between school that use kangaroos as mascots. Akron's "Zippy" was developed in 1958, while VMI adapted a kangaroo (now known as "Moe") as its mascot 11 years prior. UMKC, a member of the Summit League, also has a kangaroo mascot, but neither VMI or Akron has played that institution on the gridiron.

RICHMOND GAME NOTES - Redshirt senior wide receiver Tracy Hairston turned in a big numbers game at Richmond with 212 all-purpose yards. Hairston returned five kicks for 157 yards including a career-long 74-yarder that set up VMI's first points on the night. He also caught five passes for 55 yards including a 21-yard leaping grab for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Sophomore wide receiver Trent White returned two punts for 61 yards against Richmond including a career-best 47 yarder in the fourth quarter.

Sophomore quarterback Eric Kordenbrock's 231 yards passing against the Spiders was a career-high. He also threw a 70-yard TD strike to tight end Mario Thompson in the fourth quarter of Saturday's game for the second longest completion of his career.

Senior linebacker A.J. Gross posted a season-high 12 tackles against Richmond including nine in the first half.

WILLIAM & MARY GAME NOTES - Defensive back Miguel Marshall made 10 tackles against the Tribe, marking a career-high.

The Keydets had six tackles-for-loss, setting W&M back 18 yards with the six stops. Trae Watkins and Justin Smith led the way, both setting career highs in the category with 2.5 and 2.0 respectively. Emilio Calvin, Charlie Jones and Weston Reber each had 0.5 TFL's.

VMI notched its first interception of the season against W&M, when redshirt freshman linebacker Logan Staib picked off a pass in the endzone in the fourth quarter. It was Staib's first career interception as well.

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Adam Morgan made his first appearance of the season when he was inserted for Eric Kordenbrock in the fourth quarter of the Sept. 10 game against William & Mary. Morgan engineered a 16-play, 90-yard scoring drive that was capped by an 11-yard TD pass to Trent White.

Running back T.J. Talley had a career-high six catches, while wide receiver Trent White made his second career touchdown catch, hauling in an 11-yard pass from Morgan in the fourth quarter. It was White's second career touchdown grab, and his first since his debut, last year's opener against Lock Haven.

DELAWARE STATE GAME NOTES - Eric Kordenbrock's 43 pass attempts tied for the fifth-most attempts in a game by a Keydet quarterback in VMI history, equaling the 43 tried by Robbie Chenault against Furman in 1997.

Redshirt senior Chaz Jones scored three touchdowns against DSU, matching his career-high effort from last year's contest with Charleston Southern. Jones scored on rushes of one and four yards, and also recovered his own fumble in the endzone after a three-yard rush. He now has 13 career rushing TD's, after leading all ground gainers in the DSU contest with 76 yards on 19 carries.

Linebackers Chris Harper's nine tackles were a career-high, surpassing his previous best effort of five, set against Liberty last season.

The Keydet loss was their first in a season opener since 2004, and their first in a season opener contested at home since 2000.

Five VMI receivers had career-highs in yardage, led by Tracy Hairston's 76 yards. Trent White, Mario Thompson, Chaz Jones and Stefawn Ross also had career highs in the Delaware State game.

ALLEN CLOSES IN ON RECORD BOOK - Veteran Byron Allen had a strong 2010 campaign, one that earned him preseason All-Big South honors this year. He currently has 269 career stops, leaving him 77 shy of 10th place.

ALLEN AND GROSS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG SOUTH - VMI seniors A.J. Gross and Byron Allen were both selected to the 2011 All-Big South Conference preseason team as voted by the league's head coaches and select media.

Both players are returning all-conference picks from a year ago. Gross was named first team All-Conference at linebacker in 2010 while Allen was tabbed second team All-Conference at defensive back.

Gross led all Big South defensive players in tackles with 110 stops and a 10.0 tackles per game average in the 2010 season. He ranked in the top 20 in tackles in FCS all season long and posted six double-digit tackle games coming against Charleston Southern (17), Liberty and Old Dominion (16), Gardner-Webb (13), and William & Mary and Stony Brook (10). Gross was named Big South Defensive Player of the Week October 4 with nine tackles and three tackles for loss and a forced fumble against Presbyterian College. He tied for third in the BSC in tackles for loss per game (1.0) and tied for second in the conference in fumbles forced per game.

Allen led the team defensive backs and ranked second among Big South secondary players with 78 tackles for 7.1 stops per game and had 31 solos and 47 assists on the season. He ranked seventh in the Big South in total tackles and posted a career-high 13 tackles against Coastal Carolina with 11 assists while also posting 11 tackles against Charleston Southern.

STAFF CHANGES - VMI head coach Sparky Woods continues to surround himself with familiar faces, as VMI added a pair of assistant coaches to its staff this past offseason.

Eric Brown, who played for Coach Woods at South Carolina, came to VMI from Johnson C. Smith University this past December, where he served one season as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator. Brown earlier spent three years at Livingston College in Salisbury, N.C. He served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator in 2007 and 2008, while adding the title of interim head coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009.

Brown began his college coaching career at Edward Water College in Jacksonville, Fla., where he was defensive line coach, interim defensive coordinator, and special teams coordinator during the

2004 and 2005 seasons. His special teams accounted for 15 blocked kicks versus opponents punt and field goal units during the 2005 season.

At VMI, Brown will work with the inside linebackers.

Trent Walker, who will coach the safeties and assist with the secondary, joined the VMI staff from Auburn, where he served three years in various capacities. During the Tigers' BCS title run in 2010, Walker served as a defensive quality control coach and worked under the direction of defensive coordinator Ted Roof while concentrating his efforts on assisting with the Auburn cornerbacks and specific game-planning efforts during each week.

Walker also worked the previous two seasons as a defensive student assistant at Auburn while working on a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering which he received in August 2010. He worked on the defensive side of the ball where he assisted with the safeties, scouting reports, film breakdowns, and directed the offensive scout team.

While at Auburn, Walker participated as a staff member in the 2011 Tostitos BCS National Championship Game, the 2010 SEC Championship Game, and the 2010 Outback Bowl - all victories by Auburn.

Game 1- VMI vs. Delaware State

Delaware State Slips Past VMI, 24-21

LEXINGTON, Va. - Justin Wilson had 110 yards receiving, including the third quarter touchdown that gave the Delaware State Hornets the lead for good, helping the visiting DSU squad to a 24-21 win over the VMI Keydets Saturday afternoon at VMI's Foster Stadium in Lexington. The game was the season opener for both teams.

With the game tied at 14 midway through the third period, DSU quarterback Nick Elko found Wilson on a deep route near the left hash mark. The redshirt junior made the catch at the 15 yard line and outran the VMI defense to the goal line, putting the visitors up 21-14. A Mitchell Ward field goal pushed that lead to 10, and the Hornets survived Chaz Jones' third touchdown run of the game to win by three.

The loss ended a streak of six straight season-opening wins for VMI, a run that dated back to 2005, and it was the Keydets' first home loss in a season opener since 2000. Jones had three rushing touchdowns for the Keydets, the second time in his career he accomplished that feat, after also doing so last season at Charleston Southern. VMI quarterback Eric Kordenbrock went 22 for 43, tying the fifth-most pass attempts in school history, while Chris Harper and A.J. Gross led the way defensively, making nine tackles apiece.

Travis Tarpley had 174 all-purpose yards for DSU, while Wilson caught six passes to account for his 110 yards through the air. Hornets' quarterback Nick Elko was 17 for 32 for 232 yards and three scores.

Delaware State won the coin toss and chose to receive on the warm, clear day, but Demetri Phillips forced a fumble on the return. Miguel Marshall pounced on the loose ball at the Hornets' 11, and three plays later, Jones scored from a yard out to give VMI the early edge. A Jeff Sexton PAT made it VMI 7, DSU 0 less than a minute into the season.

After the Keydet defense forced a punt, the VMI offense took over at its own 14. The first play was a Kordenbrock pass that was batted in the air and intercepted by Brandon Harvey, leading moments later to an Elko touchdown strike that put the visitors on the board. A missed PAT allowed VMI to maintain its advantage, 7-6 at the 12:03 mark of the first quarter.

That play would cap the first quarter scoring, as the teams combined to punt the ball six times the remainder of the period, including a 65-yard boot by DSU's Marko Kano. The home team put together another scoring drive at 10:14 of the second quarter, as it took over at the DSU 47. Jones accounted for the first 33 yards on the drive, and then capped the effort when he plunged into the endzone from two yards out. He was hit at the one by Harvey, fumbled the ball, but then fell on his own miscue for the touchdown and a 14-6 VMI lead.

The Hornets came right back, as Elko found Wilson for a 28-yard strike, setting up the same tandem for a seven-yard TD just two plays later. Tarpley then caught the ensuing two-point try, and the five-play, 56-yard drive tied the game with 4:27 left in the half. Neither team could mount a serious threat over the rest of the half, and contest went to the intermission deadlocked at 14.

Jones ran for 61 yards in the first half, while Kordenbrock went 10 for 18 to lead the VMI offense. Byron Allen had four stops over the first 30 minutes for the Keydet defense. The halftime story, however, was the weather, as shortly before halftime, the skies began to darken due to an approaching thunderstorm. Just before the start of the third quarter, the teams were pulled off the field and the stadium was cleared due to lightning, leading to a 68-minute weather delay.

Once the third quarter did get underway, it started with a very unorthodox play, as Kordenbrock was intercepted by Matt Spicer of Delaware State on the opening play. Spicer then fumbled the ball while being hit by Tracy Hairston, and D'Angelo Smith recovered to give the Keydets the ball once again.

VMI could not take advantage of the opportunity, and after an exchange of punts, mounted another try. Kordenbrock drove his team 51 yards in 10 plays, setting up a 4th down from the DSU 12. Sexton came on to try a field goal, but misfired wide left and the game remained tied, 14-14.

The Hornets took advantage, as Elko found Wilson for a quick first down. One play later, Jaashawn Jones marched 20 yards down the far sideline, setting up Wilson's decisive touchdown catch that gave Delaware State the lead for good, 21-14. The final drive of the quarter belonged to the visitors as well, as a spurt sparked by a Elko-to-Tarpley 37-yard connection moved DSU into position for a field goal. Ward converted the 24-yard try 2:09 into the fourth quarter, putting the Hornets up 24-14.

VMI marched back down the field once again, stringing together an 11-play, 71-yard drive that included five Kordenbrock completions, none bigger than a 40-yard strike to Trent White on 3rd down and 14. Jones ended the effort with a four-yard TD run, and Sexton's PAT made it 24-21, VMI, with 7:38 remaining.

The Keydets then kicked the ball off, and DSU ran the clock down with an eight-play drive, covering just 28 yards but burning 4:47 before they were forced to punt. The final VMI drive started at its own 20 with 2:51 remaining, but three incompletions and a pass for no gain led to a turnover on downs, and the Hornets ran out the clock to earn the 24-21 win.

The two teams were very evenly matched statistically, as DSU had 346 total yards to VMI's 340. The Hornets threw for 232 yards, while VMI accounted for 227 yards through the air, and the teams were within one yard on the ground as well, with DSU holding a 114-113 edge. In addition, the Keydets committed three turnovers to the Hornets' two. In addition, VMI held just a 14-second lead in time of possession, 30:07 to 29:53.

Game 2- VMI vs. #5 William & Mary

#5 William & Mary Prevails Over VMI, 24-7

After a scoreless first quarter, the #5 William & Mary Tribe scored the next 24 points and went on to defeat the VMI Keydets, 24-7, Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium in Lexington, Va.

The story of the day was the Tribe's (1-1) ground game, as they pounded the ball for 216 yards on the ground, including 87 by starting tailback Jonathan Grimes. Two of W&M's three touchdowns came on the ground, as Grimes and Keith McBride each scored via the run, while Grimes also caught the first score of the game, a six-yard touchdown pass from Michael Paulus.

VMI was held scoreless until the fourth quarter, when Adam Morgan relieved Eric Kordenbrock and marched the home team 90 yards in 16 plays, a drive that was capped by a fourth-down touchdown pass to Trent White. The TD strike was not only VMI's first passing touchdown of the season, but it averted what would have been the first shutout against VMI at Foster Stadium since the 2001 season.

Morgan went 5 for 9 during his time in Saturday's contest, while Kordenbrock was 13 for 26 with two interceptions. T.J. Talley led the Keydets in receptions with a career-high six, White's four grabs tied a career-best and Chaz Jones paced the Keydet ground game with 64 yards on the afternoon. The visitors received the opening kickoff and began the game with a heavy dose of Grimes, as he carried the ball eight times on W&M's first 14 plays from scrimmage. The senior amassed 45 yards on the ground in the opening quarter, but the VMI defense held the remainder of the Tribe to 36 yards of total offense to keep the visitors off the scoreboard. Unfortunately for VMI, W&M did the same, holding the Keydets to just 47 yards, and neither team could dent the scoreboard in the opening period.

W&M had the ball to open the second quarter, continuing a drive at the Keydet 22. Grimes converted a third-and-two, rushing for five yards, and three plays later, Paulus found Grimes for the game's opening touchdown. After the point after, the Tribe held a 7-0 lead just over two minutes into the second period. Kordenbrock then marched his team down the field, a drive that saw VMI convert three consecutive third-down attempts. On the fourth third-down try, Kordenbrock found Talley for a nine-yard gain, setting up a key moment on fourth down from the W&M 24. With just a yard to go, VMI opted to go for the first down, but the Tribe defense stopped Chaz Jones to force the turnover on downs.

After an exchange of punts, the Tribe got the ball back on its own 43 with 3:49 left in the half. Three plays later, Paulus found Woolfolk on a fade pattern down the left sideline, throwing the ball just beyond the VMI defender for the 34-yard completion and a first-and-goal. McBride ran the ball into the endzone on the next play, doubling the W&M lead to 14-0 and capping the first half scoring.

Grimes had 75 yards rushing at halftime, while VMI's Talley had four of his eventual six catches. Emilio Calvin had seven tackles at the intermission. The Keydets got the ball to open the second half, and were unable to pick up a first down on the initial series. On fourth down, Cameron Murray's punt was blocked by the Tribe's Marcus Hyde, and the visitors took over in VMI territory. The Keydet defense stiffened, however, and forced a punt.

VMI then took over on its own nine, and in one of the game's bigger plays, Kordenbrock's first down pass was tipped and intercepted by Hyde for the game's first turnover. Three plays later, Grimes notched a three-yard touchdown run with 10:18 remaining in the third quarter, and the extra point made it 21-0, Tribe.

W&M took over again with 6:02 left in the quarter, starting a 17-play, 88-yard drive that would end early in the fourth period with a 20-yard Drake Kuhn field goal. The short kick put the Tribe up 24-0 with 12:27 left in the contest.

Kordenbrock was again intercepted on the ensuing drive, but Logan Staib notched his first career interception in the endzone, preventing further scoring. Morgan then took over and on his initial third down, scrambled for 18 yards and a first down. With a face mask penalty tacked on, the play was good for 33 yards, more than one-third of the distance on the 90-yard march.

Completions to Tracy Hairston and Talley, and three Chaz Jones runs, moved the Keydets into position for their scoring play, the 11-yard Morgan to White TD strike. It was Morgan's fourth career touchdown pass and White's second career TD grab, pulling the Keydets to within 24-7 and capping the scoring.

Defensively, Miguel Marshall made a career high 10 tackles, while Trae Watkins' 10 stops were just one off his previous career-best.

VMI (0-2) will be back in action next Saturday, as the Keydets begin a three-game road trip by traveling to Richmond, Va. to take on the Richmond Spiders. Game time is set for 6 p.m.

Game 3- VMI vs. #6 Richmond

Rally Falls Short at Richmond, 34-19

RICHMOND, Va. - VMI outscored the No. 6 Richmond Spiders 19-7 in the second half of action, but were unable to overcome a 27-0 halftime deficit, falling to the Spiders 34-19 Sat., Sept. 17 at Richmond's Robins Stadium.

VMI's 19 straight points scored after intermission were countered by a first half that saw the Keydets turn the ball over a season-high three times alone on two mis-played punt-returns and a fumble in the end zone, which led to 13 Richmond points.

VMI (0-3) battled back in the second half however, holding the Richmond (3-0) offense to only seven points and 113 yards of total offense. Redshirt-senior Tracy Hairston collected a career-high 212 all-purpose yards on 157 kickoff return yards and 55 receiving yards as well as a touchdown reception.

After the opening Keydet drive stalled at its own 46-yard line, the ensuing punt by VMI senior Cam Murray was blocked by Spider Rodney Barnes. Ben Edwards collected the ball after the block, and scampered 34 yards for the scoop and score to give the Spiders an early 7-0 lead after a Wil Kamin extra-point. On the following Keydet possession, VMI opened up the drive as sophomore quarterback Eric Kordenbrock found redshirt-sophomore tight-end Mario Thompson on a seam route that went for 44 yards to the Richmond 34 yard line.

The Keydets then ran redshirt-senior Chaz Jones on the next five plays to the Spider six-yard line but a Jones fumble on the one-yard line was recovered in the end zone by Richmond's Colin Pehanick for the touchback. Following the VMI turnover, Richmond marched 66 yards on nine plays, with the big strike being a 48 yard pass from Aaron Corp to Tre Gray to the VMI 12. However, the Keydet defense held its ground and forced a 41-yard field goal from Kamin as Richmond took a 10-0 lead with 5:18 left in the first quarter. After the VMI defense forced a Nick Hicks punt at the 12:40 mark of the second quarter, the kick bounced off a VMI player at the 20 yard line and was recovered by Richmond's Pehanick at the VMI 20. The Keydet defense held strong once again after the turnover, holding the Spiders kicker Kamin to another 31 yard field goal to stretch the Richmond lead to 13-0 with 9:19 left in the second frame.

The Keydets forced another Richmond punt with 6:10 left in the quarter, and the punt resulted in another VMI muffed return that was recovered by Richmond at the VMI 32. After senior linebacker Emilio Calvin forced a fumble on a Kendall Gaskins run that was recovered by Richmond, Corp hit Gray on a crossing pattern that resulted in a 37-yard touchdown pass to give Richmond a 20-0 after the PAT. On a third and six deep in Richmond territory, VMI sent an all-out blitz as Corp hit Stephen Barnette on a slant route and ran 69 yards to the VMI four-yard line. On the next play, Corp hit Gray once again for the touchdown, stretching the Richmond advantage to 27-0 just before the half.

VMI got on the board midway through the third quarter thanks to a big return from Hairston following a Richmond touchdown that brought the score to 34-0. Hairston took the return a career-high 74 yards to the Richmond 15 yard line before being brought down by Richmond's Doug Howell. A four-yard Jones run brought the ball to the Richmond 11 before junior kicker Jeff Sexton nailed a 28-yard field goal to cut the Richmond advantage to 34-3 with 7:09 left in the third quarter. The Keydets forced the first Richmond turnover of the contest at the 14:16 mark of the fourth-quarter, as redshirt-sophomore Weston Reber sacked backup Richmond quarterback John Laub for a loss of 13 yards. Reber also managed to strip Laub and forced a fumble that was recovered by junior defensive lineman Shawn Chapman.

The turnover resulted in VMI's first touchdown of the night six plays later after an 11 yard pass from Kordenbrock to sophomore Alec Thompson resulted in a first down to bring to ball to Richmond's 36 yard line. Jones then rushed four times for 15 yards, resulting in a 3rd and six where Kordenbrock hit Hairston in the back right corner of the end zone from 21 yards out on a spectacular individual effort by the Keydet wide out. The PAT from Sexton brought the tally to 34-10 with 11:17 remaining in the contest. Following a Richmond three and out, VMI took over at their own 30 yard line. On the first play of the drive, Kordenbrock once again hit Mario Thompson on a seam route, this time Thompson scampered 70-yards for his first career touchdown, VMI's longest pass of the season, to cut the lead in half at 34-17.

The Richmond offense stalled with Laub in the contest, as Richmond was forced to punt once again. Trent White broke a 47 yard return to the Richmond 19, and a 10 yard unsportsmanlike penalty was tacked onto the end of the run to give VMI the ball at the Richmond nine. However, VMI was unable to punch it in, turning the ball over on downs after a Kordenbrock incomplete pass that was intended for Hairston. Richmond took over on their its one yard line, and took a safety with just over three minute left in the contest to run the score to the eventual final of 34-19. VMI took over at their 43, but the drive stalled at Richmond's 33 yard line with 1:44 remaining to seal the contest for the Spiders.

After a rough first half, Kordenbrock settled down in the second stanza and finished the contest going 15-of-35 for 231 yards and two touchdowns, while Jones rushed for 88 yards on 21 carries. The Keydets were led defensively by redshirt-senior A.J. Gross who had 12 tackles, nine in the first half, and by classmate Emilio Calvin, who had six tackles as well as a sack, two tackles for a loss, and a forced fumble. Mario Thompson's 114 receiving yards is a new career-high, and Thompson is the first receiver to over the century mark in receiving yards in a contest since Mario Scott had 107 yards receiving against Stony Brook on Oct. 9 of last year.

Corp finished the contest with 220 yards on 12-of-18 passing with two touchdown passes to Gray, who had four catches for 96 yards. Barnette added three grabs for 89 yards, while Turner had 21 rushing attempts for 84 yards. Darius McMillan had 11 tackles to lead the Richmond defense. The Keydets continue their road swing next weekend, as VMI ventures to Ohio to take on FBS opponent Akron on Sat., Sept. 24 from InfoCision Stadium. Kick-off is slated for 2 p.m.

Game 4- VMI at Akron

Big First Half Sends Akron Over VMI, 36-13

AKRON, Ohio - The Akron Zips rolled up 534 yards total offense including 359 in the first half to post a 36-13 win over VMI Saturday afternoon before a crowd of 14,257 at InfoCision Stadium.

The Zips won their first game of the year and utilized a balanced offensive attack to subdue the Keydets. Akron redshirt freshman running back Jawon Chisolm rushed for 154 yards on 20 carries in the opening half and finished the day with a career-high 188 yards and one touchdown, while sophomore wideout Keith Sconiers caught seven passes for 137 yards and two touchdowns. On the day Akron gained 294 yards on the ground and 240 through the air on 81 total offensive snaps.

VMI's scores came on a 39-yard touchdown pass from sophomore quarterback Eric Kordenbrock to junior receiver Stefawn Ross late in the first quarter and a Chaz Jones 3-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

Akron controlled the ball for 37:44 of the game including nearly 12 minutes in the first quarter alone.

The Zips (1-3) threw long on their first play of the game as Sconiers hauled in a 41-yard reception from sophomore quarterback Clayton Moore to the VMI 37. After a pair of rushes by Chisholm for 16 yards, Bennett connected with Sconiers for a 31-yard touchdown strike. Placekicker T.J. Marchese missed the extra-point and the score remained 6-0, Akron with 12:45 left in the first quarter. The Keydets' Tracy Hairston took the ensuing kickoff to the VMI 43 and had an offside penalty push the ball to the VMI 48 when VMI snapped its first play of the afternoon. Jones rushed 11 yards to the Akron 41, but an 8-yard sack and jarring hit on VMI quarterback Eric Kordenbrock resulted in a fumble recovery by Akron's Nico Caponi at the Zip 47 that squelched VMI's first possession.

After an exchange of punts, Akron went to the ground and churned out an eight-play, 60-yard drive capped by freshman running back Karl Bostick's 17-yard burst off tackle to the endzone. Marchese's extra point made it 13-0 with 7:02 to go in the opening quarter. Chisholm contributed five rushes for 33 yards on the drive.

VMI responded quickly with its first points of the day set up by a Hairston kick return to the Akron 39. Two plays later, Kordenbrock floated a 39-yard TD pass to Ross down the right sideline for his third TD pass of the year and the first career scoring reception for Ross. After Jeff Sexton's extra point, VMI cut the deficit to 13-7 with 6:04 left in the first quarter.

The score remained that way until 36 seconds left in the first quarter when Marchese booted a 26-yard field goal to cap a 12-play, 69-yard drive that was aided by a running into the punter penalty after the Keydets had forced the Zips to punt from midfield.

VMI moved to the Akron 37 on the ensuing drive, but Kordenbrock was sacked for a 10-yard loss by tackle Dan Marcoux and the Keydets were forced to punt. Akron failed to move the ball and after an exchange of punts, the Zips put together their longest drive of the day moving 72 yards in 10 plays utilizing two key third down conversion and a face mask penalty to set up a 10-yard touchdown pass from Moore to Sconiers with 6:34 left in the half. Akron's run attempt for the two-point conversion failed and the Zips took a 22-7 lead with 7:02 left in second quarter.

VMI moved to the Akron 38 on the ensuing drive following an 11-yard pass from Kordenbrock to Hairston, but the drive stalled with a 2-yard loss sandwiched by a pair of incompletions to force the Keydets to punt to the Akron 15. Chisolm ripped off a 33-yard jaunt on Akron's first play of the next drive that helped set up a seven-play, 9-yard possession capped by a Chisholm touchdown run from 9 yards out. Marchese booted through the extra point at the 1:46 mark and Akron took a 29-7 lead into halftime.

After a scoreless third quarter, both teams managed one score in the final frame as Moore connected on his third TD pass of the afternoon on a 23-yard pass to Jerrod Dillard with 8:28 left in the game. VMI capped the scoring when Jones slammed in from three yards out to give the Cleveland native his fourth rushing touchdown of the year. Moore completed 13 of 28 passes for 223 yards and three scores to help the Zips even the gridiron series in just the second ever meeting between the schools.

Kordenbrock connected on 13 of 29 attempts for 133 yards while Adam Morgan came in the fourth quarter and completed one of two passes for six yards. Defensive back Micheal Johnson led the Keydets defensive charts with a career-high 12 tackles including five solos and safety Demetrius Phillips added a career-high nine tackles in his first college start. VMI racked up six tackles for loss for 16 yards. Hairston finished with 162 all-purpose yards including 131 on kickoffs.

VMI (0-4, 0-0) will have an off-week before resuming action at Coastal Carolina in Saturday, October 8 at 7 p.m. in a televised Big South Conference opener in Conway, South Carolina.

Game 5- VMI at #24 Coastal Carolina

VMI Falls in Big South Opener, 34-10

CONWAY, S.C. - Coastal Carolina quarterback Aramis Hillary threw for 245 yards and ran for 114, helping the Chanticleers win Saturday's Big South battle with the VMI Keydets, 34-10. The matchup was the conference opener for both schools.

The homestanding Chanticleers (4-1, 1-0) scored the first 17 points before Jeff Sexton put VMI (0-5, 0-1) on the board with a 29-yard field goal with 4:30 left in the opening half. Coastal responded by scoring 10 points late in the half, aided by a Josh Norman interception, and took a 27-3 lead to halftime.

Adam Morgan led a fourth-quarter touchdown drive for the Keydets, capping the scoring by running for a touchdown in the final period. He also went 9 for 14 through the air during his time in the contest.

VMI took the opening drive from its own 48 and ran tailback Chaz Jones six straight plays to the CCU 32 yard line before seeing the drive end in downs after a dropped pass halted the possession. The Chants took over and moved 68 yards in seven plays and opened the scoring when Hillary scampered 35 yards to the end zone and the extra point was good to put the hosts up 7-0.

After a 26-yard return by Tracy Hairston on the ensuing kickoff, the Keydets got possession at their own 42 and again moved the ball well into CCU territory utilizing an 11-yard pass to Mario Thompson to the Chanticleer 44 and following it with two rushes totaling 10 yards from T.J. Talley. The Keydets however, could muster only one six-yard pass completion to Thompson over the next four snaps and turned it over on downs at the Coastal 28 when a fourth down pass intended for Hairston fell incomplete.

Coastal then chewed out a 12-play, 61 yard drive and took 5:17 off the clock and settled for a 28-yard field goal by Grant Clayton that extended the margin to 10-0 in the opening minute of the second quarter. After an exchange of punts that saw the Keydets kick it away twice, Coastal took possession at its own 37 and covered 63 yards in five plays as Hillary connected to Jamual Boswell off the play action for a 38-yard touchdown pass with 7:51 left in the half.

VMI got its first points on the next possession when Jeff Sexton booted a 29-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 17-3 with 4:29 remaining in the half. A 21-yard pass to Chaz Jones on third down to the Coastal 13 helped spark the drive.

The Chanticleers added 10 points in the final minutes of the second quarter to break open the game. A 24-yard field goal by Clayton capped a nine-play, 67-yard drive after the VMI defense stiffened following a first and goal at the VMI 2. VMI threw an interception on the first play of the next drive when cornerback Norman wrestled ball possession away from Hairston at the Coastal 33 after the two had vied on a long aerial from Kordenbrock.

The Chants wasted little time to punch the ball in the end zone and took just :52 seconds to cover 67 yards when Hillary capped the drive with a slant pass to Chris Presley for a 23-yard score. The extra point by Presley was good and Coastal took a 27-3 halftime lead after amassing 320 yards total offense in the opening half.

The Chanticleers took the opening second half possession and extended the margin to 34-3 when running back Aaron Jones scored on a 3-yard burst up the middle that ended a 10-play, 67-yard drive. A 33 yard pass to Adrian Sullivan for 29 yards to the VMI 20 proved to be a key play of the drive.

VMI was able to reach the end zone before the final gun when redshirt sophomore quarterback Morgan scrambled 9 yards for a touchdown with 4.4 seconds left in the fourth quarter.

The Keydets will return home to begin a two-game homestand next Saturday when they take on Charleston Southern on Parents Weekend at 1:30 at Foster Stadium. The game will be carried by ESPN3.com.

VMI Prevails Over CSU, 21-17

LEXINGTON, Va. - The VMI Keydets scored first and led wire to wire, but had to survive a late rally from the Charleston Southern Buccaneers to earn their first win of the season, 21-17, in Big South football action Saturday at VMI's Foster Stadium in Lexington, Va.

The Keydets (1-5, 1-1 Big South) scored first on a Chaz Jones touchdown run in the opening quarter, and held a 14-0 lead at the half. CSU (0-6, 0-1) had managed just 54 total yards in the first two quarters, but the Bucs rallied late, despite being stopped on fourth-and-goal from the VMI 1-yard line on their opening drive of the half.

After a third quarter field goal cut the deficit to 11, two fourth quarter touchdowns, the last coming with 1:04 left, made it a four-point game. CSU's onside kick was recovered by VMI, and despite needing a fourth-down conversion to run the clock out, the Keydets held on for the 21-17 victory. Jones ran for 96 yards on a career-high 28 carries, and had two scores to pace the VMI offense. Eric Kordenbrock was 16 for 28, and threw for a second quarter score to Will Lucas, but also had two interceptions. CSU's Chris Kuzdale and Zac Johnston each had 12 tackles, and Mike Davis had six catches for 81 yards.

The game began under clear skies, with a wind gusting as high as 25 miles per hour. Neither team could score on the opening handful of drives, until the Keydets took advantage of a short field midway through the first quarter. A short punt gave VMI the ball at the Bucs' 24, and four straight runs by Jones, including two of over 10 yards, got the ball in the end-zone. The spurt was capped by a one-yard TD run at the 6:22 mark, and Jeff Sexton's point after gave VMI the 7-0 advantage. That would be the only score of the first period, as the teams combined for five punts in the frame.

The home team notched its second scoring drive late in the second quarter, beginning at the VMI 12. Kordenbrock completed six straight passes, including a 22-yarder to Lucas on third down, to orchestrate a 15-play, 88-yard drive that was capped with just 1:34 left in the half, when Kordenbrock hit Lucas for a five-yard score. The point after made it 14-0, VMI.

That would be the halftime margin as well, as the Keydets took the lead to the locker room for the first time this season. Bucs' quarterback Malcolm Dixon was just 3 of 13 in the opening half, while Kordenbrock threw for 103 yards to lead VMI. As the teams came out for the third quarter, VMI was driving into the wind and that immediately played a role. After a roughing the kicker penalty gave VMI a first down, CSU's Kuzdale picked off a Kordenbrock deep pass, giving the visitors the ball with the day's first turnover.

They nearly took advantage, marching 10 plays in 57 yards to get to the VMI 1-yard line. On a third and goal, quarterback Dixon threw an incomplete pass, setting up a fourth down attempt. The Bucs ran into the middle, but Emilio Calvin and Byron Allen combined to stop B.J. Hackworth, and the visitors came away with no points. CSU did, however, get on the board on its next drive. The Bucs took over with 5:39 left in the quarter and marched eight plays, including a 28-yard pass by Dixon to Nathan Perera, to notch a 43-yard field goal by Andy Brown. With 2:29 left in the period, CSU had cut the deficit to 11, which is where the score stood after three quarters.

The teams exchanged punts once again to open the final quarter, giving CSU the ball with 12:29 to play. The visitors gained two first downs, helped by back to back pass plays of over 20 yards, but a fourth-down attempt from the VMI 20 fell incomplete, ending the drive and giving VMI the ball in its own territory.

Jones then took five straight handoffs before a Kordenbrock incompleteness, setting up fourth down. Cameron Murray lined up to punt, but a low snap allowed Corvaughn Archie to sneak in and block the kick. The ball ricocheted away and directly into the hands of Austin Wald, who returned it 22 yards for a touchdown. That cut the lead to 14-9, and Dixon threw a two-point conversion to Kevin Glears, making it 14-11 with 5:59 to go.

CSU then stopped the Keydets on the ensuing drive, and appeared to have all the momentum with just over three minutes to go. Murray punted from the Bucs' 48, and returner Charles James tracked the ball as it drifted, however, forcing him to attempt an over-the-shoulder grab. He muffed the catch and the ball fell free, allowing James Fruehan of VMI to pounce on it and give the Keydets the ball at the CSU 7-yard line. One play later, Jones scampered into the endzone to put the Keydets up, 21-11, with 3:15 to go.

The game was not over yet, however, as CSU marched 69 yards in 13 plays, a drive highlighted by two fourth-down conversions and capped by an eight-yard touchdown pass, Dixon to Kareem Givens, with 1:04 to play. Brown missed the point after, making it 21-17 as the teams lined up for the onside kick.

The attempt was recovered by VMI, and the Keydets ran the ball on first down, forcing CSU to use a timeout. VMI was then whistled for a false start, and chose to throw on second down. The swing pass to Hardy Temoney was complete, but he was forced out of bounds by Kuzdale, stopping the clock with 50 seconds remaining. A Jones run on third down caused the Bucs to use their final timeout, and set up a fourth-and-one. Jones ran into the line, but bounced off the initial tacklers and surged for two yards, giving VMI the first down and allowing the Keydets to run the clock out.

Allen had five tackles for VMI, but was extremely active in the passing game, as he was credited with four pass breakups. All told, the Keydets broke up nine Dixon pass attempts and had eight tackles for loss. Johnny Wimbish led VMI with nine tackles. VMI will be back in action next Saturday, as the Keydets play host to the Stony Brook Seawolves at Foster Stadium. Game time is set for 1:30 p.m.

Game 7- VMI vs. Stony Brook

Stony Brook Defeats VMI, 42-14

LEXINGTON, Va. - 35 second half points, including 21 in the third quarter, broke open a close game and propelled the Stony Brook Seawolves past the VMI Keydets, 42-14, in Big South football action Saturday at VMI's Foster Stadium in Lexington, Va.

Early on, the contest was a defensive struggle, with the only points coming on a late Stony Brook (4-3, 2-0 Big South) drive that gave the Seawolves a 7-0 halftime lead. The visitors then scored 21 points in the first six minutes of the second half, including 14 in a nine-second span at one point, to take a 28-0 advantage.

VMI responded with an 81-yard touchdown pass, as Adam Morgan hooked up with Aaron Lewis for the seventh-longest pass play in school history, but Stony Brook notched the next 14 points, including a 60-yard touchdown run by Miguel Maysonet, to take a 42-7 edge with 12:09 to play. Chaz Jones had a three-yard touchdown run with 5:13 to play, accounting for the final margin and moving him into eighth place on the Institute's all-time rushing touchdown list, with his 17th career TD rush.

SBU's Kyle Essington threw for 255 yards and two touchdowns, while the vaunted Seawolf rushing attack gained 228 yards on the ground, led by Maysonet's 141. VMI used three quarterbacks, led by Eric Kordenbrock's 14 for 26 effort. Morgan was 2 for 7 for 90 yards, and A.J. Augustine made his collegiate debut by going 0 for 3 on VMI's final possession. In addition, Mike Smith had a career-high 11 tackles for the Keydets. Neither team threatened in the first quarter, as the squads combined for seven punts and just 73 yards of total offense. Stony Brook had the first sustained drive of the game, as they had the ball at the end of the opening period and start of the second quarter. Their eight-play, 40-yard drive included a 21-yard pass from Essington to Kevin Norrell, but one play later, Charlie Jones forced a Maysonet fumble and A.J. Gross recovered at the Keydet 22, giving VMI the ball with 11:59 left in the half.

The next three drives, two by VMI and one by the visitors, ended in punts, and Stony Brook took over with 4:27 left in the half in a scoreless contest. After an incompletion to start the drive, Essington found Norrell for back to back first downs, putting the ball into Keydet territory. Three plays later, Matt Brevi had a 23-yard catch and run on third down, putting the ball at the Keydet 2, and Essington scored on third down, taking advantage of a bootleg and running in from one yard out. The touchdown and point after came with 27 seconds left in the half, and gave the Seawolves a 7-0 halftime lead.

Despite the touchdown drive, Stony Brook had still been held to just 51 yards rushing in the first half, but the tide of the game turned quickly after halftime. VMI's opening kickoff went out of bounds, giving SBU a short field, and the visitors took advantage. A second down pass from Essington to Jordan Gush went for 23 yards, and two plays later, the Seawolf quarterback found Norrell on a post pattern down the middle of the field. Norrell went up for the ball, which appeared to be slightly underthrown, and was able to come down with it in the endzone for the 31-yard touchdown, giving SBU a 14-0 lead just 2:33 into the second half.

After a Keydet three-and-out, the Seawolves came back once again. On first down, Maysonet galloped for 37 yards, and one play later, Essington found Gush for 18 yards, moving the ball to the VMI 15. Two runs for Brock Jackolski, the last of which covered seven yards, got the visitors in the endzone at the 9:16 mark. The point after made it 21-0, SBU. On the ensuing kickoff, Tracy Hairston returned the ball to the VMI 29, but was hit there by SBU's Jawara Dudley. Hairston fumbled the ball. Grant Nakwaasah grabbed it and brought it back for a touchdown, giving the Seawolves 14 points in nine seconds and a 28-0 edge.

Morgan relieved Kordenbrock at quarterback, and was able to move the chains, but SBU's defense held and forced a punt. The Seawolves had to punt as well, giving VMI the ball with 4:18 left in the quarter, and the Keydets took advantage. Morgan lofted a deep pass for Lewis, who caught the pattern near the right hash mark and outraced the defender to the endzone for the 81-yard touchdown pass. The point after cut the lead to 28-7, as the completion was the seventh-longest pass play in school history, just one yard further than an 80-yard effort (Kordenbrock-Mario Scott) against the Seawolves last season on Long Island.

Stony Brook responded with a 10-play, 83-yard drive on which Essington went 6 for 6, ending on an eight-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Gush, on which the quarterback rolled to his right and threaded three Keydet defenders with the bullet pass to the corner of the endzone. Gush was ruled in bounds for the touchdown, and Wesley Skiffington's extra point made it 35-7, SBU.

After a VMI punt, Maysonet took a handoff with 12:19 to go, carrying it off tackle and into the second level of defense, where he found an extra gear and galloped for a 60-yard touchdown run, SBU's longest play of the day and their final score of the afternoon as well. Skiffington added the point after, giving the visitors a 42-7 advantage. The teams traded punts, giving the Keydets the ball with 8:01 to go. Kordenbrock returned to the game and went 5 for 5 on the drive, including three passes to James Rogers, and Jones carried the ball in from three yards out to cap the six-play, 83-yard drive and make it SBU 42, VMI 14 with 5:13 to go. That would cap the day's scoring.

By moving into eighth on VMI's all-time rushing touchdown list, Jones surpassed Howard Abegesah and Sam Horner's 16 career TD runs. Rogers had five catches, while Norrell led Stony Brook with eight grabs for 129 yards.

VMI will be back in action next Saturday, as the Keydets travel to Charleston, S.C. to play The Citadel in a resumption of the Military Classic of the South series. Game time is set for 1 p.m.

Game 8- VMI at The Citadel

VMI Falls in Military Classic of the South, 41-14

CHARLESTON, S.C. - The Citadel retained the Silver Shako for another year in the Military Classic of the South as it defeated VMI, 41-14, Saturday afternoon before a crowd of 11,184 spectators at Johnson Hagood Stadium.

In the first meeting between the two state-supported military colleges since 2007, the Bulldogs blocked three punts which led to 21 points and rushed for 358 yards to even its overall season mark to 4-4. Four different Bulldog backs rushed for at least 50 yards led by redshirt senior running back Rickey Anderson with 81 yards. Sophomore running back Darien Robinson and sophomore quarterback Ben Dupree each scored two rushing touchdowns.

VMI redshirt senior running back Chaz Jones rushed for a season-high 112 yards on 16 carries and logged his eighth rushing touchdown of the season to highlight the VMI offense, but the Keydets could muster just nine completions for 68 yards through the air on the afternoon.

VMI won the toss and elected to defer and take a strong first half wind and forced a fumble on Citadel's opening drive when redshirt freshman Logan Staib pounced on Dupree's fumble at the VMI 34. Citadel forced VMI to punt after the Keydets were unable to register a first down, but senior Cameron Murray's punt was blocked by Bulldogs Carson Smith and redshirt junior Chris Billingslea scooped up the ball and raced 19 yards to the end zone for the game's first score. Ryan Sellers tacked on the extra point to put the hosts up, 7-0.

The Keydets went 3-and-out on their second drive and punted to the Citadel 14. The Bulldogs covered 86 yards in eight plays chewing up 3:51 off the clock as Dupree capped the scoring drive with a 23-yard option keeper run around the right side. Slotback Van Dyke Jones ripped off a 14-yard rush on the drive's first play and a VMI face mask penalty tacked on following a 13-yard run by Anderson sparked the possession. The Bulldogs took a 14-0 lead at the 4:13 mark of the first quarter.

VMI answered by taking advantage of good field position when return man Tracy Hairston took the ensuing kick back 45 yards to the Citadel 46. Back-to-back penalties by The Citadel allowed the Keydets to advance even further to the Bulldog 31 before Jones rushed six consecutives reaching the end zone on a three-yard thrust at the :51 mark of the opening quarter. Junior kicker Jeff Sexton booted the extra point to half the Keydet deficit 14-7.

VMI's defense stiffened in the second quarter and limited the Bulldogs to just 13 rushing yards on 13 attempts including five tackles for loss after The Citadel had generated 129 yards on the ground in the first quarter.

Both teams punted twice on their first two possessions of the second quarter, but a second blocked punt by The Citadel as VMI attempted a boot from its own 33 led to a Robinson one-yard touchdown run 1:36 before halftime. VMI escaped further damage after an Eric Kordenbrock interception on the ensuing possession at the VMI 34 was negated one play later by a Michael Johnson pick off of a Dupree pass at the VMI 5.

The Citadel led 21-7 at half and broke the game open by scoring on its first four possessions after intermission.

The Bulldogs halted VMI at the Citadel 30 on its opening drive of the third quarter when the Keydets attempted to convert a fourth-and-eight pass to Tracy Hairston against a stiff wind. The Bulldogs took over and ripped off runs of 30 and 26 yards to the VMI 14 before VMI stiffened with consecutive tackles for loss by outside linebacker Logan Staib with help from inside backer Josh Sneed. The Citadel settled for a 24-yard field goal by Sellers and the Bulldogs led 24-7 with 9:42 left in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs registered their third blocked punt of the day on VMI's next drive when redshirt senior John Synovic blocked a Murray punt that was recovered at the VMI 34. The Citadel wasted little time hitting the end zone three plays later on a 13-yard touchdown rush by Robinson at the 7:25 mark of the third quarter boosting the Bulldog lead to 31-7 following Sellers extra point conversion.

The Bulldogs added a an eight-play 63 yard scoring drive 39 seconds before the end of the quarter Dupree scored his second TD of the day on a nine yard end around run. Thomas Warren added a 37-yard field goal on the next possession to push the margin to 41-7 as the game headed into the final period.

The Keydets assembled their longest scoring drive of the fourth quarter when freshman back Jabari Turner tallied his first career collegiate TD at the 2:39 mark with a two-yard rush capping a 12-play, 65 yard drive.

VMI returns to Big South Conference play next Saturday when it travels to Lynchburg to face Liberty at Williams Stadium in a 3:30 p.m. kickoff.

Game 9- VMI at Liberty

Keydets Battle But Fall at #22 Liberty, 37-31

LYNCHBURG, Va. - In a game that was close from start to finish, VMI's Eric Kordenbrock threw for a career-high 320 yards and three touchdowns with a school record 31 completions, but #22 Liberty held on for a 37-31 win over the Keydets in Big South football action Saturday in Lynchburg, Va.

VMI (1-8, 1-3 Big South) held a 17-16 lead at halftime, looking to surprise homestanding Liberty (7-3, 5-0 Big South) and hand the Flames' senior class its first-ever home conference loss. Liberty scored midway through the third period, when quarterback Mike Brown had a one-yard touchdown run to give the Flames the lead, but VMI fired right back with a six-play drive that T.J. Talley capped with a 12-yard scamper, putting the Keydets back up by one, 24-23.

Liberty's Kevin Fogg then took the ensuing kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown, making the score 30-24, Flames, and the home team would never trail again. Dexter Bridge had a leaping touchdown grab with 14 seconds remaining, pulling the Keydets within six, but Liberty recovered the onside kick and held on for the victory.

All told, Kordenbrock was 31 of 47 on the day, with his longest pass coming on a 55-yard touchdown strike to Tracy Hairston in the opening quarter. Hairston had 94 yards receiving, while Talley made nine catches and Trent White hauled in eight passes. Liberty held the total offense edge, 420-403, as senior quarterback Brown completed 24 of 34 passes for 286 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore running back Aldreakis Allen added 75 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown to spark the Liberty attack. Senior receiver Chris Summers snared eight passes but was limited to 84 yards receiving, but a fourth quarter touchdown grab from Brown helped turn aside VMI's bid for an upset.

Senior linebacker A.J. Gross topped the VMI defensive charts with nine stops including seven solo tackles. Liberty fumbled the ball away on the opening kickoff when Hardy Temoney jarred the ball free from Fogg which resulted in a recovery by VMI's Byron Allen at the Liberty 39. VMI eventually moved to the Flame 20 but came up empty when James Devans 37-yard field goal attempt was blocked after a low snap. The Flames then punted away after a three-and-out and VMI began its second possession at its own 42.

The Keydets, facing their fourth nationally ranked opponent of the season, wasted little time producing the game's first points as Kordenbrock threw long down the right sideline to a leaping Hairston who snatched the ball over Liberty defenders at the LU 19, then turned and raced down the boundary for the 55-yard scoring pass play. Devans tacked on the extra point and VMI led 7-0, with 9:41 left in the first quarter.

Liberty answered with a 9-play, 74-yard drive capped by an Allen one-yard burst with 5:53 left in the first quarter. Redshirt freshman kicker Alex Kacere missed the extra-point and Liberty continued to trail 7-6 after a drive that saw Brown connect on passes to four different receivers covering 69 yards. An interception of a Kordenbrock pass by Liberty's redshirt freshman linebacker Nick Sigmon at the VMI 24 on the first play of the next Keydet possession set up a 35-yard field goal by Kacere to give Liberty its first lead, 9-7, with 4:45 left in the first quarter. The Keydets answered with a 12-play drive that covered 61 yards and chewed up nearly seven minutes of the first half clock as Kordenbrock completed all six of his passes including a four-yard quick out pass to Hairston in the right corner of the endzone to put VMI back on top, 14-9 following Jeff Sexton's extra point with 12:50 remaining in the second quarter. VMI recovered a fumble on the ensuing kickoff at the Liberty 44 and converted the opportunity into a 37-yard field goal by Devans to push the Keydet lead to 17-9 at the 10:58 mark.

The Flames responded by covering 78 yards on 12 snaps and reaching the endzone on a three-yard flip pass from Brown to tight end Brandon Apon in the back corner of the end zone. VMI was forced to punt on the opening drive of the second half, and the Flames produced a 90-yard drive to retake the lead. Starting at its own 10, Brown completed a trio of third down passes to junior wide receiver Pat Kelly covering 27 yards, 22 yards, and a 32-yard snag on a third and goal from the VMI 33 that setup a Brown one-yard touchdown keeper. The Flames led 23-17 following the successful extra-point conversion with seven minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The Keydet offense answered again to take a lead for the third time on the day when T.J. Talley cut loose up the middle for a 12-yard touchdown run at the 4:08 mark of the third period. Sexton's extra-point nudged VMI ahead 24-23 after a scoring drive in which Talley contributed a fourth-down conversion run of 24 yards from the VMI 44 which set up a 20-yard Hairston reception to the Flame 12 one play later. VMI's elation was quickly subdued after Fogg took the ensuing kickoff and bounced left out of a logjam and raced down the left boundary for a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown putting the Flames up 30-24. As the game moved to the fourth quarter, the Keydets came away empty handed on a scoring opportunity when Devans missed on a 38-yard field goal try from the right hash mark with 11:30 left. Liberty took over at its own 21 and Brown engineered a 79-yard scoring possession keyed by four pass completions - the last on a pump-and-go route to Summers in the left corner of the end zone to push the Liberty lead to 37-24 with 6:43 left.

The Keydets still kept Liberty sideline celebrations at bay until the final snap of the game after Kordenbrock lofted a 22-yard touchdown strike to freshman wideout Bridge who made a leaping catch of the aerial against two defenders with 13.8 seconds left. VMI attempted an on-side kick on the ensuing kickoff and nearly recovered the ball after it ricocheted off a Flames up-man but the Flames ultimately ended with possession and ran out the clock to end the contest.

VMI will wrap up its three-game road stretch next Saturday at Presbyterian College at 1 p.m.
