COACHES - Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76), a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, is in his fourth season in Lexington. 2011 marks the second year of Woods' pro-style offense, installed prior to last season, following two years of the triple option offense.

Woods, 57, was named the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 118-year history on February 12, 2008. That marked his return to the FCS (I-AA) ranks, where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons, from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 72-71-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003-06 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

Jimmye Laycock (William & Mary '70) is in his 33rd year coaching his alma mater, and has proved to be one of the most successful coaches in the FCS ranks. Over the past seven years, he has guided the Tribe to a pair of NCAA Semifinal appearances. W&M has made the FCS Playoffs nine times under Laycock, who was the 2010 AFCA Region I Coach of the Year after helping W&M reach a school-record #1 ranking last season. He now has 208 career wins against just 145 losses.

A VMI Win against W&M would -

Move VMI to 1-1 for the seventh consecutive season.

Be VMI's first win over William & Mary since Oct. 26, 1985, when the Keydets won 39-38 behind three touchdown runs by quarterback Al Comer and a game-winning two-point conversion by James Wright as time expired.

SATURDAY'S GAME VS. WILLIAM & MARY -

THE SERIES - The VMI-William & Mary rivalry is the oldest on the Keydet record books with the 88th meeting slated for Saturday afternoon in Lexington. No opponent has played VMI more than the Tribe with next week's opponent, Richmond, next at 86 meetings on the all-time Keydet series list. VMI is also playing its first two games of the season at home for the first time since 2007, when it faced Lock Haven and William & Mary at Foster Stadium.

IT HAPPENED ON SEPTEMBER 10 -

VMI FOOTBALL - On Sept. 10, 1977, the Keydets defeated William & Mary 23-13 in Lexington en route to their sixth Southern Conference football championship.

WORLD EVENTS - On Sept. 10, 1929, legendary golfer Arnold Palmer was born in Latrobe, Pa. Palmer went on to become one of golf's all-time greats, winning 62 PGA Tour events and seven majors, including four Masters.

VMI TEAM NOTES -

DELAWARE STATE GAME NOTES - Eric Kordenbrock's 43 pass attempts tied for the fifth-most attempts in a game by a Keydet quarterback in VMI history, equaling the 43 tried by Robbie Chenault against Furman in 1997.

Redshirt senior Chaz Jones scored three touchdowns against DSU, matching his career-high effort from last year's contest with Charleston Southern. Jones scored on rushes of one and four yards, and also recovered his own fumble in the endzone after a three-yard rush. He now has 13 career rushing TD's, after leading all ground gainers in the DSU contest with 76 yards on 19 carries.

Linebackers Chris Harper's nine tackles were a career-high, surpassing his previous best effort of five, set against Liberty last season.

The Keydet loss was their first in a season opener since 2004, and their first in a season opener contested at home since 2000.

Five VMI receivers had career-highs in yardage, led by Tracy Hairston's 76 yards. Trent White, Mario Thompson, Chaz Jones and Stefawn Ross also had career highs in the Delaware State game.

KEYDETS ON YOUR TV - The Big South recently announced this year's football television schedule, and VMI is currently scheduled to have three games broadcast. The first of the trio comes Oct. 8, when VMI faces Coastal Carolina in Conway, S.C. on MASN. The Keydets will then face Charleston Southern on the streaming network ESPN3 in the teams contest Oct. 15, and will conclude their television schedule Nov. 5, facing Liberty on the Flames Sports Network. As always, all home and away games in the Big South (with the exception of televised contests) will be shown on the Big South Network, accessible via www.bigsouthsports.com.

CONTROLLED SCRIMMAGES HIGHLIGHT FALL PRACTICE - The Keydets held a controlled scrimmage August 18, doing so for 25 minutes and running 28 plays before distant lightning from an approaching storm was sighted. Play was called and the teams moved to the gameday locker rooms underneath the home stands, but never returned to the playing field after an hour wait and little indication the situation would improve.

The initial scrimmage however, did produce some eye-popping plays. On the third snap from scrimmage redshirt sophomore Adam Morgan floated a ball down the right sideline that was snared in mid-air by redshirt senior wideout Tracy Hairston who then raced to the endzone for a 58-yard touchdown.

On the sixth possession of the scrimmage, redshirt freshman quarterback Tyler Tolley connected on a 40-yard touchdown pass play that was executed on a one-handed grab by freshman wide receiver Michael Mey.

The offense started fast, generating four first downs before the scrimmage was eight snaps old. The defense then stiffened and did not allow a first down over the next three possessions and came up with fumble recoveries by freshman lineman Emmanuel Cooper and senior outside linebacker Emilio Calvin to halt two of the last three drives.

Morgan completed all three pass attempts for 78 yards including the TD strike to Hairston. Sophomore quarterback Eric Kordenbrock completed two of seven attempts for 16 yards but had a pair of balls dropped. Redshirt senior back Chaz Jones rushed three times for 16 yards while senior running back T.J. Talley carried twice for 15 yards.

Senior Josh Sneed topped the defensive charts with two tackles and a sack for 2 yards. Pass breakups were logged by freshman defensive backs Jon-Payne Wimbish and Justin Price.

GROSS RETURNS AS BIG SOUTH'S LEADING TACKLER - VMI's A.J. Gross, the leader in the Big South in tackles last season (110), was the first Keydet to accomplish that feat since 2005, when Justin Huggard posted 136 total stops. It was, in fact, the first time since Huggard that a VMI defender had gone over 100 tackles in a season. Gross' 70 assists on tackles were the most for a Keydet since Huggard's '05 campaign as well, when he posted 86 such assists. Gross now has 272 career tackles, leaving him 74 shy of 10th place in program history, currently held by Todd Baldwin '06.

ALLEN CLOSES IN ON RECORD BOOK - Veteran Byron Allen had a strong 2010 campaign, one that earned him preseason All-Big South honors this year. Allen recently made a position change, switching to linebacker during fall practice, and is closing in on the top 10 in career tackles at the Institute. He currently has 238 career stops, leaving him 108 shy of 10th place.

ALLEN AND GROSS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG SOUTH - VMI seniors A.J. Gross and Byron Allen were both selected to the 2011 All-Big South Conference preseason team as voted by the league's head coaches and select media.

The announcement of the preseason squad was made Thursday, July 28 in Charlotte as part of the annual football media day event being held at the Crowne Plaza.

Both players are returning all-conference picks from a year ago. Gross was named first team All-Conference at linebacker in 2010 while Allen was tabbed second team All-Conference at defensive back.

Gross led all Big South defensive players in tackles with 110 stops and a 10.0 tackles per game average in the 2010 season. He ranked in the top 20 in tackles in FCS all season long and posted six double-digit tackle games coming against Charleston Southern (17), Liberty and Old Dominion (16), Gardner-Webb (13), and William & Mary and Stony Brook (10). Gross was named Big South Defensive Player of the Week October 4 with nine tackles and three tackles for loss and a forced fumble against Presbyterian College. He tied for third in the BSC in tackles for loss per game (1.0) and tied for second in the conference in fumbles forced per game.

Allen led the team defensive backs and ranked second among Big South secondary players with 78 tackles for 7.1 stops per game and had 31 solos and 47 assists on the season. He ranked seventh in the Big South in total tackles and posted a career-high 13 tackles against Coastal Carolina with 11 assists while also posting 11 tackles against Charleston Southern. Allen logged back-to-back nine tackle games against Lock Haven and William and Mary and intercepted a pass and returned it 24 yards against Gardner-Webb in the season finale. He enters the 2011 season with 235 career tackles.

CITADEL ON 2011 SLATE - For the first time since 2007, longtime rivals VMI and the Citadel will face off for the Silver Shako, the trophy awarded to the winner of the game between the two schools. The Bulldogs had won the past four matchups, dating back to a 23-21 VMI win in 2002. This

year, the two academies will battle on Oct. 29 in Charleston.

STAFF CHANGES - VMI head coach Sparky Woods continues to surround himself with familiar faces, as VMI added a pair of assistant coaches to its staff this past offseason.

Eric Brown, who played for Coach Woods at South Carolina, came to VMI from Johnson C. Smith University this past December, where he served one season as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator. Brown earlier spent three years at Livingston College in Salisbury, N.C. He served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator in 2007 and 2008, while adding the title of interim head coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009.

Brown began his college coaching career at Edward Water College in Jacksonville, Fla., where he was defensive line coach, interim defensive coordinator, and special teams coordinator during the 2004 and 2005 seasons. His special teams accounted for 15 blocked kicks versus opponents punt and field goal units during the 2005 season.

At VMI, Brown will work with the inside linebackers.

Trent Walker, who will coach the safeties and assist with the secondary, joined the VMI staff from Auburn, where he served three years in various capacities. During the Tigers' BCS title run in 2010, Walker served as a defensive quality control coach and worked under the direction of defensive coordinator Ted Roof while concentrating his efforts on assisting with the Auburn cornerbacks and specific game-planning efforts during each week. He also helped in the development of the Auburn walk-on program by working to build a deeper, more talented program.

Walker also worked the previous two seasons as a defensive student assistant at Auburn while working on a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering which he received in August 2010. He worked on the defensive side of the ball where he assisted with the safeties, scouting reports, film breakdowns, and directed the offensive scout team.

While at Auburn, Walker participated as a staff member in the 2011 Tostitos BCS National Championship Game, the 2010 SEC Championship Game, and the 2010 Outback Bowl - all victories by Auburn.

ODD NOTES FROM 2010 - A few seemingly random tidbits about last season's Keydet football squad:

One way or another, halftime was a key factor in the outcome of games. VMI was 3-0 when leading at halftime and 0-8 when trailing at the intermission.

The Keydets had just one 2010 game that was tied at the end of any quarter.

The 10 points allowed to Gardner-Webb in last year's season finale was the first time since Nov. 20, 2004 (Wofford 19-18) that VMI had come up short in a game while holding the opposition under 20 points.

VMI SPORTS HOF TAPS 10 FOR INDUCTION - Eight former athletes and two former athletic department personnel were officially inducted into the Virginia Military Institute Sports Hall of Fame Friday night, September 2.

The 2011 VMI Sports Hall of Fame inductees are listed below.

LESLIE APEDOE '99 (Wrestling) - Earned All-America honors at the 1999 NCAA Wrestling Championships when he placed sixth in the heavyweight division...also became the first VMI heavyweight wrestler to win four consecutive titles in the Southern Conference (1996-99).

CHRIS CATANZARO '01 (Baseball) - One of the top left-handed batters in Keydet baseball and finished his career with the highest career batting average in VMI history with a .356 average.

RICH DAUGHTRIDGE '98 (Soccer) - Scored 13 goals and three assists for 29 points his senior season and finished as the program's all-time career scorer ...finished his career with 34 goals, 14 assists, and 82 points.

JOEY DUBOSE '97 (Track & Field)- Co-captained the 2006 track squad and also served as Regimental Commander in the Corps of Cadets...won the Southern Conference outdoor 400-meter hurdles in 1996 and 1995.

GIL MINOR '63 (Baseball/Football) - Selected to the All-Southern Conference baseball team at catcher as a junior in 1962... was second team all-state in football and honorable mention all-conference and played on Southern Conference championship football teams in 1960 and 1962 and captained the 1962 football team.

ISSAC MOORE '00 (Wrestling) - A two-time Southern Conference champion winning the title at 197 lbs. in 1999 and 190 lbs. in 1998...was 29-8 as a senior including a perfect 12-0 in dual match competition and helped VMI to a share of the Southern Conference title.

NEAL PETREE '52 (Football) - A three-year starter at end for VMI and caught 79 passes for more than 1,000 yards and nine touchdowns during that span... Named first team All-Conference by United Press, first team All-State by Associated Press, and was honorable mention All-America by the Associated Press in 1951.

GARY SIBAYAN '89 (Baseball) - Compiled a .306 career batting average with a then school record 92 stolen bases...named All-Southern Conference Northern Division for three straight years, 1986-87-88.

KARYLOS HAYSLETT - Inducted on Special Citation ... Former equipment manager and served as head in the post for 23 years from 1982-2005.

IKE SHERLOCK - Inducted on Special Citation...former VMI head wrestling coach from 1978-1985... amassed a dual-meet record of 84 wins against only 19 losses... his 1982-83 team recorded a perfect 19-0 dual-meet record and the 1985 team won the coveted Southern Conference Wrestling Tournament Championship.

Game 1- VMI vs. Delaware State

Delaware State Slips Past VMI, 24-21

LEXINGTON, Va. - Justin Wilson had 110 yards receiving, including the third quarter touchdown that gave the Delaware State Hornets the lead for good, helping the visiting DSU squad to a 24-21 win over the VMI Keydets Saturday afternoon at VMI's Foster Stadium in Lexington. The game was the season opener for both teams.

With the game tied at 14 midway through the third period, DSU quarterback Nick Elko found Wilson on a deep route near the left hash mark. The redshirt junior made the catch at the 15 yard line and outran the VMI defense to the goal line, putting the visitors up 21-14. A Mitchell Ward field goal pushed that lead to 10, and the Hornets survived Chaz Jones' third touchdown run of the game to win by three.

The loss ended a streak of six straight season-opening wins for VMI, a run that dated back to 2005, and it was the Keydets' first home loss in a season opener since 2000. Jones had three rushing touchdowns for the Keydets, the second time in his career he accomplished that feat, after also doing so last season at Charleston Southern. VMI quarterback Eric Kordenbrock went 22 for 43, tying the fifth-most pass attempts in school history, while Chris Harper and A.J. Gross led the way defensively, making nine tackles apiece.

Travis Tarpley had 174 all-purpose yards for DSU, while Wilson caught six passes to account for his 110 yards through the air. Hornets' quarterback Nick Elko was 17 for 32 for 232 yards and three scores.

Delaware State won the coin toss and chose to receive on the warm, clear day, but Demetri Phillips forced a fumble on the return. Miguel Marshall pounced on the loose ball at the Hornets' 11, and three plays later, Jones scored from a yard out to give VMI the early edge. A Jeff Sexton PAT made it VMI 7, DSU 0 less than a minute into the season.

After the Keydet defense forced a punt, the VMI offense took over at its own 14. The first play was a Kordenbrock pass that was batted in the air and intercepted by Brandon Harvey, leading moments later to an Elko touchdown strike that put the visitors on the board. A missed PAT allowed VMI to maintain its advantage, 7-6 at the 12:03 mark of the first quarter.

That play would cap the first quarter scoring, as the teams combined to punt the ball six times the remainder of the period, including a 65-yard boot by DSU's Marko Kano. The home team put together another scoring drive at 10:14 of the second quarter, as it took over at the DSU 47. Jones accounted for the first 33 yards on the drive, and then capped the effort when he plunged into the endzone from two yards out. He was hit at the one by Harvey, fumbled the ball, but then fell on his own miscue for the touchdown and a 14-6 VMI lead.

The Hornets came right back, as Elko found Wilson for a 28-yard strike, setting up the same tandem for a seven-yard TD just two plays later. Tarpley then caught the ensuing two-point try, and the five-play, 56-yard drive tied the game with 4:27 left in the half. Neither team could mount a serious threat over the rest of the half, and contest went to the intermission deadlocked at 14.

Jones ran for 61 yards in the first half, while Kordenbrock went 10 for 18 to lead the VMI offense. Byron Allen had four stops over the first 30 minutes for the Keydet defense. The halftime story, however, was the weather, as shortly before halftime, the skies began to darken due to an approaching thunderstorm. Just before the start of the third quarter, the teams were pulled off the field and the stadium was cleared due to lightning, leading to a 68-minute weather delay.

Once the third quarter did get underway, it started with a very unorthodox play, as Kordenbrock was intercepted by Matt Spicer of Delaware State on the opening play. Spicer then fumbled the ball while being hit by Tracy Hairston, and D'Angelo Smith recovered to give the Keydets the ball once again.

VMI could not take advantage of the opportunity, and after an exchange of punts, mounted another try. Kordenbrock drove his team 51 yards in 10 plays, setting up a 4th down from the DSU 12. Sexton came on to try a field goal, but misfired wide left and the game remained tied, 14-14.

The Hornets took advantage, as Elko found Wilson for a quick first down. One play later, Jaashawn Jones marched 20 yards down the far sideline, setting up Wilson's decisive touchdown catch that gave Delaware State the lead for good, 21-14. The final drive of the quarter belonged to the visitors as well, as a spurt sparked by a Elko-to-Tarpley 37-yard connection moved DSU into position for a field goal. Ward converted the 24-yard try 2:09 into the fourth quarter, putting the Hornets up 24-14.

VMI marched back down the field once again, stringing together an 11-play, 71-yard drive that included five Kordenbrock completions, none bigger than a 40-yard strike to Trent White on 3rd down and 14. Jones ended the effort with a four-yard TD run, and Sexton's PAT made it 24-21, VMI, with 7:38 remaining.

The Keydets then kicked the ball off, and DSU ran the clock down with an eight-play drive, covering just 28 yards but burning 4:47 before they were forced to punt. The final VMI drive started at its own 20 with 2:51 remaining, but three incompletions and a pass for no gain led to a turnover on downs, and the Hornets ran out the clock to earn the 24-21 win.

The two teams were very evenly matched statistically, as DSU had 346 total yards to VMI's 340. The Hornets threw for 232 yards, while VMI accounted for 227 yards through the air, and the teams were within one yard on the ground as well, with DSU holding a 114-113 edge. In addition, the Keydets committed three turnovers to the Hornets' two. In addition, VMI held just a 14-second lead in time of possession, 30:07 to 29:53.
