KEYDET SEASON HIGHS - Last Saturday's game against The Citadel produced several team superlatives as the Keydets matched a season high in points (24), and averaged 9.1 yards per pass. The two rushing TD's were also a game high this season. The 81-yard swing pass catch and run to Jabari Turner that set up a fourth quarter score was VMI's longest pass play of the year and kick-started VMI's rally which fell just short.

KORDENBROCK'S NUMBERS - Junior quarterback Eric Kordenbrock has thrown two 80-yard pass completions this season and now has thrown four passes of 80 yards or more in his career. Kordenbrock also moved past the 400 career completion mark becoming one of only four quarterbacks in VMI history to do so. The others were Joey Gibson (1999-2002) with 465, Jonathan Wilson (2003-06) with 419, and Dave Brown (1985-88) with 416. He is 18 completions shy of tying Brown for third on VMI's all-time list.

SMITH SHOWS WELL - Senior cornerback Mike Smith hauled in his second interception of the year Saturday against The Citadel and also returned a first quarter kick for a career-long 55 yards that help set up VMI's first score against the Bulldogs. He wound up with a career-high 129 all-purpose yards.

JONES SETS CAREER-HIGH - Senior defensive tackle Charlie Jones had a career-high nine tackles against The Citadel including two-for-loss and now has eight TFL's for the year to lead the team defensive charts.

A VMI Win against Liberty would -

Give VMI of at least a .500 record at home for the third time in the last five years, and second in the last three seasons.

Mark the Keydets' first win over the Flames since Oct. 1, 2005, a 10-7 win in Lynchburg.

SATURDAY'S GAME VS. LIBERTY -

THE SERIES - Saturday's game against Liberty will be the 12th meeting between the Keydets and the Flames who first met in 1995. The first two games of the rivalry were non-conference tilts (1995, 2002) when VMI was a member of the Southern Conference and the schools have played each year since 2003 when VMI began play in the Big South Conference. Liberty and VMI have squared off in the regular season finale one time previously, in 2006 at Foster Stadium.

IT HAPPENED ON NOVEMBER 17 -

VMI FOOTBALL - On Nov. 17, 1990, the Keydets squeaked out a dramatic 21-20 win over East Tennessee State in Johnson City, Tenn.

WORLD HISTORY - On Nov. 17, 1968, the Oakland Raiders and New York Jets were facing off on NBC. With the Jets leading late and the game running long, NBC switched to a previous scheduled showing of the TV movie *Heidi*. Oakland went on to score two touchdowns in the final minute and win the game, prompting change to sports broadcasting in the U.S. and the Raiders/Jets game to forever be known as the "Heidi Bowl".

VMI FOOTBALL SEASON LOG -

STAYING AT HOME - VMI wraps up the 2012 season with two home games. The last time the Keydets ended the regular season with two straight games at Foster Stadium was in 2004 when they faced Liberty and Wofford.

STONY BROOK GAME NOTES

STAIB TAKES AWAY - With a fumble recovery against Stony Brook, redshirt sophomore linebacker Logan Staib produced his third takeaway of the year and fifth takeaway of his career. Staib has recovered two fumbles and intercepted a pass in 2012 to go with an interception and fumble recovery last year.

GARDNER-WEBB GAME NOTES

ROGERS CATCHES FIRE - Redshirt sophomore wide receiver James Rogers produced in an 80-yard catch and run touchdown play in the second quarter of Oct. 27's game against Gardner-

Head Coach Sparky Woods

Sparky Woods (Carson-Newman '76), a veteran coach in the college ranks with over 30 years of experience, is in his fifth season in Lexington. 2012 marks the third year of Woods' pro-style offense, installed prior to last season, following two years of the triple option offense.

Woods, 58, was named the 30th head football coach in the Institute's 118-year history on February 12, 2008. That marked his return to the FCS (I-AA) ranks, where he produced a successful run as head coach of Appalachian State for five seasons, from 1984 through 1988. Woods guided the Mountaineers to a 38-19-2 mark and two Southern Conference titles (1986, 1987) and two I-AA playoff appearances. Over the two-year span in '86-'87, Appalachian State posted a perfect 13-0 conference mark. The Southern Conference tabbed Woods as Coach of the Year for three consecutive years (1985-87) and he was named Kodak Region II Coach of the Year in 1986.

As a head coach overall, Woods holds a 76-87-5 mark. Woods was also head coach at South Carolina from 1989-93, and later served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Memphis (1995-96), Virginia (1997-98), and Mississippi State. Woods also served as running backs coach at Alabama from 2003-06 and served a one-year stint under Pete Carroll on the staff of the NFL's New York Jets in 1994.

a season-high. Starter Eric Kordenbrock completed 20 of 34 passes for 198 yards and redshirt junior quarterback A.J. Augustine completed 5 of 7 passes for 38 yards and threw a two-yard touchdown pass to tight end Phillip Pickens. It was both the first career TD pass and TD reception respectively for the duo.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN GAME NOTES

WASHINGTON RETURNS FUMBLE - Redshirt sophomore John Washington recovered a CSU fumble early in the fourth quarter and returned it 70 yards for a touchdown. It marked the first time a VMI defender had recovered an opponent fumble resulting in a touchdown since outside linebacker Emilio Calvin pounced on an endzone fumble against Robert Morris on September 5, 2009.

COPELAND BLOCKS PUNT - Redshirt freshman outside linebacker Chris Copeland blocked a punt in the second quarter against Charleston Southern, becoming the first Keydet to do so since Deon Watts blocked a Gardner-Webb punt on November 19, 2011.

COLLINS BACK IN ACTION - Redshirt junior offensive lineman Robert Collins, who had missed four games after sustaining a shoulder injury against Delaware State in the season opener, return to action in a reserve role at guard against CSU. Collins saw action on 27 snaps.

PRESBYTERIAN GAME NOTES

MORGAN NAMED BSC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - With his first two career interceptions, redshirt junior safety Adam Morgan became the first Keydet to get multi-interception games since 2006 (Christian Kelly vs. CSU). For his efforts, he was named the Big South Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 8, VMI's first weekly honor from the conference this season. Morgan also broke up two passes against Presbyterian and helped the VMI defense hold PC to three first downs and 45 yards in

Webb for his first career TD reception. The 80-yard TD pass play also tied it for the eighth longest in school history. Current VMI quarterback Eric Kordenbrock has thrown three of top eight longest pass plays in school history.

DEFENSIVE HIGH/LOW - The 55 yards rushing allowed Gardner-Webb by the VMI defense was a season low but the Keydets also gave up a season-high 345 yards passing to the Bulldogs.

COASTAL CAROLINA GAME NOTES

TURNOVER FREE - VMI did not commit a turnover against Coastal Carolina Oct. 20, marking the first time since the 2010 season opener against Lock Haven (September 4, 2010) that the Keydets went turnover-free in a game.

CAREER HIGHS FOR ROSS AND ROGERS - Senior wide receiver Stefawn Ross caught a career-high five passes for 89 yards including a 32-yard haul against Coastal Carolina and redshirt sophomore wide receiver James Rogers matched his career-high with six catches against the Chanticleers

SEVERAL TEAM SEASON-HIGHS AGAINST PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE -

VMI entered the Presbyterian game -7 in turnover margin, but produced four takeaways (three interceptions and one fumble recovery) and had its first positive turnover margin game of the year.

VMI controlled the ball for a season-high 37:46 versus PC, for a TOP margin of 15:32. VMI also committed a season-low four penalties for 44 yards against Presbyterian.

The Keydets' 12 of 22 effort on third down conversions was a season-high and marked the first time VMI had over a 50% conversion rate in third downs.

SEVERAL CONTINUE TO SET CAREER-HIGHS - Redshirt junior inside linebacker Weston Reber posted his first double-digit tackle game of his career against PC, notching three tackles and seven assists for a career-high 10 total stops, and also adding a fumble recovery. In VMI's previous game, Sept. 22 against Navy, Reber had tied his previous career-high. James Fruehan (11 tackles) and Jabari Turner (71 yards rushing) also had career-best efforts against PC.

KORDENBROCK BACK OVER 200 - Junior quarterback Eric Kordenbrock tossed his third 200-yard game of the year with 208 yards passing. It also marked the fifth time over the last seven games dating back to last year that Kordenbrock has thrown for 200 yards in a game.

NAVY GAME NOTES

KEYDETS NATIONALLY TELEVISED - The nationally televised game with Navy on Sept. 22 marked the fourth time in the last six years that the Keydets have played in a nationally televised cable TV game.

CAREER-HIGHS BEFORE THE BYE WEEK - VMI's 41-3 setback against Navy on Sept. 22 saw several players set career highs, including Weston Reber, who equaled his then-career high in tackles with seven. Quarterback A.J. Augustine also had his first career completions, and would play a hand in VMI's two longest plays from scrimmage on the day. Starting tailback Jabari Turner also posted a then career-best 67 yards rushing.

RICHMOND GAME NOTES

ROGERS AND GARVIN SET CAREER-HIGHS - Redshirt sophomore receiver James Rogers caught a career-high six passes for 52 yards with a 22-yarder against Richmond Sept. 15. His previous career-high was 5 against Stony Brook on Oct. 22, 2011. Rogers currently leads the team in catches and receiving yards with 11 receptions for 111 yards. Defensively, redshirt sophomore linebacker Ty Garvin racked up a career-high 12 tackles Saturday against Richmond surpassing his previous game-high mark of seven stops set one week before.

WHITING MAKES FIRST START - Former VMI basketball forward Wayne Whiting made his first start at tight end against Richmond Sept. 15 for the injured Mario Thompson and caught three passes for 29 yards. On the season, Whiting has five receptions for 44 yards including a 23-yarder.

SHIRLEY MAKES DEBUT - With redshirt junior tailback David Turner out for the season with a torn ACL, VMI deployed true freshman Cody Shirley in reserve action Sept. 15 to help the depth situation at running back. Shirley rushed five times for eight yards and caught three passes for 12 yards against the Spiders.

D. TURNER TO UNDERGO SURGERY, OUT FOR SEASON - Sparky Woods announced at Tuesday, Sept. 11's Big South conference call that redshirt junior running back David Turner will undergo surgery on his right knee to repair a torn ACL, and is out for the remainder of the season. Turner sustained the injury in the second quarter against Chowan.

CHOWAN GAME NOTES

J. TURNER STEPS UP - Sophomore running back Jabari Turner stepped up with big plays to help VMI post its first win of the year against Chowan Sept. 8. Turner caught four passes for 89 yards including two touchdown catch and runs of 28 and 45 yards. Turner's 4th quarter touchdown reception with 8:29 remaining gave VMI the go-ahead score. Two plays prior to his decisive TD score, Turner converted a crucial third down rush to preserve the possession. Turner also led the Keydets in rushing against the Hawks with 44 yards on 13 carries.

SEXTON MOVES UP ON ALL-TIME CHARTS - With a 36-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, senior kicker Jeff Sexton has 15 made for his career which tied him for seventh place on the all-time VMI list matching Don Culprit (1969-70) and Rick Tufaro (1974-75). Sexton stands just three field goals away from fifth place.

DEFENSE STINGY - After dropping a hard fought decision to Delaware State on Sept. 1, 17-10, the Keydets earned their first win of the season a week later, beating Chowan 24-17. The 34 points given up by VMI's defense was the fewest surrendered in the Keydets' first two games since 1987, when West Virginia Tech and Appalachian State combined to score 30 points.

DELAWARE STATE GAME NOTES

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK - VMI dominated the second half yardage and time of possession of its opener against Delaware State. The Keydets dominated the second half statistically running 47 snaps to Delaware State's 24 and piling up 229 yards to DSU's 122 while holding a 20:24 to 9:36 advantage in time of possession. For the game, the Keydets outgained the Hornets, 383 to 239.

RUNNING BACK ROTATION - The Keydets employed five different running backs in the first game against Delaware State including the first career rushes of redshirt junior fullback H.L. Temoney, sophomore Deon Watts, and redshirt freshman Derrick Zigar. In 2011, only three non-QB backs got touches for the entire season - Chaz Jones, T.J. Talley, and Jabari Turner.

FIRST STATE NOTES - The game was VMI's first season opener on the road since 2004, and was VMI's first game in Delaware since 1976. It was also the first time VMI had played the same opponent in consecutive openers since 2005-2006 (Davidson). The Keydets dominated the second half statistically running 47 snaps to Delaware State's 24 and piling up 229 yards to DSU's 122 while holding a 20:24 to 9:36 advantage in time of possession. For the game, the Keydets outgained the Hornets, 383 to 239.

TURNER HAS STRONG FIRST START - Redshirt junior running back David Turner had an impressive debut in his first college start Sept. 1 at Delaware State. Turner led the way for the Keydets, rushing for a career-high 101 yards on 23 carries with one touchdown. He also had seven catches for 83 yards receiving, giving him 184 all-purpose yards. That is the highest all-purpose yardage for a Keydet since Tracy Hairston had 212 yards last season against Richmond. Turner also became the first back to go over 100 yards rushing in a game since Chaz Jones had 112 yards against The Citadel on October 29, 2011.

NEW DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR- For the first time in the Sparky Woods era, VMI has brought in a new defensive coordinator. Jeff Farrington joined the staff in February, and came to VMI from Mercer University where he spent the past year as an assistant coach under Bobby Lamb helping the Bears launch an FCS football program that is scheduled to begin play in 2013.

Prior to his stint at Mercer, Farrington had spent the previous nine

seasons at (2002-2010) as a defensive assistant coach under Lamb at Furman University and also served as the Paladin defensive coordinator in 2010. Furman defensive units under Farrington ranked highly in the Southern Conference statistical listings on numerous occasions and helped advance the Paladins into the NCAA FCS (I-AA) playoffs four times (2002, 2004, 2005, and 2006). In 2005, Furman reached the national semi-final game.

Last Meeting with Liberty

Keydets Battle But Fall at #22 Liberty, 37-31

LYNCHBURG, Va. - In a game that was close from start to finish, VMI's Eric Kordenbrock threw for a career-high 320 yards and three touchdowns with a school record 31 completions, but #22 Liberty held on for a 37-31 win over the Keydets in Big South football action Saturday in Lynchburg, Va.

VMI (1-8, 1-3 Big South) held a 17-16 lead at halftime, looking to surprise homestanding Liberty (7-3, 5-0 Big South) and hand the Flames' senior class its first-ever home conference loss. Liberty scored midway through the third period, when quarterback Mike Brown had a one-yard touchdown run to give the Flames the lead, but VMI fired right back with a six-play drive that T.J. Talley capped with a 12-yard scamper, putting the Keydets back up by one, 24-23.



Eric Kordenbrock threw for 320 yards against Liberty last season, the most by a VMI QB since 2003.

Liberty's Kevin Fogg then took the ensuing kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown, making the score 30-24, Flames, and the home team would never trail again. Dexter Bridge had a leaping touchdown grab with 14 seconds remaining, pulling the Keydets within six, but Liberty recovered the onside kick and held on for the victory.

All told, Kordenbrock was 31 of 47 on the day, with his longest pass coming on a 55-yard touchdown strike to Tracy Hairston in the opening quarter. Hairston had 94 yards receiving, while Talley made nine catches and Trent White hauled in eight passes. Liberty held the total offense edge, 420-403, as senior quarterback Brown completed 24 of 34 passes for 286 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore running back Aldreakis Allen added 75 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown to spark the Liberty attack. Senior receiver Chris Summers snared eight passes but was limited to 84 yards receiving, but a fourth quarter touchdown grab from Brown helped turn aside VMI's bid for an upset.

Senior linebacker A.J. Gross topped the VMI defensive charts with nine stops including seven solo tackles. Liberty fumbled the ball away on the opening kickoff when Hardy Temoney jarred the ball free from Fogg which resulted in a recovery by VMI's Byron Allen at the Liberty 39. VMI eventually moved to the Flame 20 but came up empty when James Devans 37-yard field goal attempt was blocked after a low snap. The Flames then punted away after a three-and-out and VMI began its second possession at its own 42.

The Keydets, facing their fourth nationally ranked opponent of the season, wasted little time producing the game's first points as Kordenbrock threw long down the right sideline to a leaping Hairston who snatched the ball over Liberty defenders at the LU 19, then turned and raced down the boundary for the 55-yard scoring pass play. Devans tacked on the extra point and VMI led 7-0, with 9:41 left in the first quarter.

Liberty answered with a 9-play, 74-yard drive capped by an Allen one-yard burst with 5:53 left in the first quarter. Redshirt freshman kicker Alex Kacere missed the extra-point and Liberty continued to trail 7-6 after a drive that saw Brown connect on passes to four different receivers covering 69 yards. An interception of a Kordenbrock pass by Liberty's redshirt freshman linebacker Nick Sigmon at the VMI 24 on the first play of the next Keydet possession set up a 35-yard field goal by Kacere to give Liberty its first lead, 9-7, with 4:45 left in the first quarter. The Keydets answered with a 12-play drive that covered 61 yards and chewed up nearly seven minutes of the first half clock as Kordenbrock completed all six of his passes including a four-yard quick out pass to Hairston in the right corner of the endzone to put VMI back on top, 14-9 following Jeff Sexton's extra point with 12:50 remaining in the second quarter. VMI recovered a fumble on the ensuing kickoff at the Liberty 44 and converted the opportunity into a 37-yard field goal by Devans to push the Keydet lead to 17-9 at the 10:58 mark.

The Flames responded by covering 78 yards on 12 snaps and reaching the endzone on a three-yard flip pass from Brown to tight end Brandon Apon in the back corner of the end zone. VMI was forced to punt on the opening drive of the second half, and the Flames produced a 90-yard drive to retake the lead. Starting at its own 10, Brown completed a trio of third down passes to junior wide receiver Pat Kelly covering 27 yards, 22 yards, and a 32-yard snag on a third and goal from the VMI 33 that setup a Brown one-yard touchdown keeper. The Flames led 23-17 following the successful extra-point conversion with seven minutes remaining in the third quarter.

The Keydet offense answered again to take a lead for the third time on the day when TJ Talley cut loose up the middle for a 12-yard touchdown run at the 4:08 mark of the third period. Sexton's extra-point nudged VMI ahead 24-23 after a scoring drive in which Talley contributed a fourth-down conversion run of 24 yards from the VMI 44 which set up a 20-yard Hairston reception to the Flame 12 one play later. VMI's elation was quickly subdued after Fogg took the ensuing kickoff and bounced left out of a logjam and raced down the left boundary for a 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown putting the Flames up 30-24. As the game moved to the fourth quarter, the Keydets came away empty handed on a scoring opportunity when Devans missed on a 38-yard field goal try from the right hash mark with 11:30 left. Liberty took over at its own 21 and Brown engineered a 79-yard scoring possession keyed by four pass completions - the last on a pump-and-go route to Summers in the left corner of the end zone to push the Liberty lead to 37-24 with 6:43 left.

The Keydets still kept Liberty sideline celebrations at bay until the final snap of the game after Kordenbrock lofted a 22-yard touchdown strike to freshman wideout Bridge who made a leaping catch of the aerial against two defenders with 13.8 seconds left. VMI attempted an on-side kick on the ensuing kickoff and nearly recovered the ball after it ricocheted off a Flames up-man but the Flames ultimately ended with possession and ran out the clock to end the contest.

Game 1 - VMI at Delaware State

Keydets Fall in Season Opener, 17-10

Quarterback Nick Elko posted a four-yard touchdown run with 45 seconds remaining, breaking a 10-10 tie and sending the Delaware State Hornets to a 17-10 win over the VMI Keydets in non-conference football action, contested Saturday in Dover, Del. The contest was the season opener for both schools.



David Turner had 184 all-purpose yards in his first collegiate start.

The Keydets (0-1) had tied the game in the fourth quarter with a 17-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by a Jeff Sexton 22-yard field goal, but the Hornets (1-0) returned the ensuing kickoff to their own 45. A two-yard run on fourth-and-one gave them a first down in VMI territory, and one play later, the Keydets were hit with a personal foul penalty, giving DSU the ball at the VMI 26.

Four plays later, the home team had a first-and-goal with under a minute remaining. The Keydet defense held on first down, but Elko converted the second down rushing attempt for the game-winner, and Marshall Ward added the point after to account for the final margin. VMI did get the ball into DSU territory in the final seconds, but a last-second Eric Kordenbrock deep pass was intercepted by Hornet defensive back Ronald Robinson in the endzone to seal the game's result.

Junior back David Turner led the way for the Keydets in Saturday's game, rushing for a career-high 101 yards on 23 carries. He also had seven catches for 83 yards receiving, giving him 184 all-purpose yards. That is the highest all-purpose yardage for a Keydet since Tracy Hairston had 212 yards last season against Richmond. In the first half, both offenses had difficulty getting in sync and squandered opportunities while the defenses held the upper hand. The Keydets fumbled it away twice and punted three times on their first five possessions of the first half while Delaware State was forced to punt four times while fumbling it away once.

The Keydets second fumble of the first half led to the game's first score when a missed center exchange resulted in a Hornet possession at the VMI 30. But the Keydet defense stiffened and forced Delaware State to settle for a 30-yard field goal from Mitchell Ward and a 3-0 DSU lead with 6:01 remaining in the second quarter.

VMI missed a field goal try on the next possession when Sexton pushed a 31-yard attempt wide right. The Hornets countered with an eight-play 80-yard possession with a hurry-up offense that consumed 1:44 and produced a 26-yard touchdown pass over the middle from Elko to Travis Tarpley. VMI tried a 41-yarder in the final moments of the first half, but Sexton's attempt sailed left of the uprights. DSU took a 10-0 lead at halftime but the game turned toward VMI's favor as the Keydets clawed back to gain momentum in the second half.

Turning to an recharged ground game in Turner, the Roanoke native carried all nine plays on a 46-yard drive and capped it with a one-yard dive at the 2:24 mark of the third quarter. Sexton's extra point made it 10-7 as the game headed to the fourth period. The Keydets eventually tied game by gaining control of the line of scrimmage and pounding out a 17-play, 17-yard drive that chewed up 7:31 off the clock. The drive stalled at the DSU four-yard line, however, and the Keydets settled for a Sexton 22-yard field goal that tied the game at 10-10 with 2:35 left.

The Keydets dominated the second half statistically running 47 snaps to Delaware State's 24 and piling up 229 yards to DSU's 122. Statistically for the Keydets, Turner became the first VMI back to rush for over 100 yards in a game since Chaz Jones rushed for 112 yards against The Citadel on October 29, 2011. Sophomore defensive back James Fruehan was credited with seven solo stops and eight tackles while outside linebacker Chris Harper logged five solos and two assists for seven stops and recovered a fumble. Kordenbrock completed 22 of 38 passes for 225 yards for his fifth career 200-yard game.

Malcolm Williams paced the DSU ground game with 72 yards on 13 carries while Elko completed 18 of 33 passes for 156 yards and one touchdown. Elko's favorite target was Wilson who gathered in eight aerials for 71 yards. But the Hornets could muster only one pass over 20 yards on the day - the 26-yard TD strike to Tarpley near the end of the first half. The Keydets were flagged 10 times for 84 yards while the Hornets drew six infractions for 65 yards.

The Keydets return home next Saturday to begin two consecutive home games starting with the home opener against Chowan at 1:30 p.m. at Foster Stadium. Delaware State travels to Delaware to face the Blue Hens next Saturday.

Game 2 - VMI vs. Chowan

Keydets Survive Challenge From Chowan, Win 24-17

Jabari Turner had a 45-yard touchdown reception with 8:29 remaining, and after a Jeff Sexton field goal, the VMI Keydets survived a late-game drive by the Chowan Hawks to eke out a 24-17 win in NCAA football action Saturday afternoon, Sept. 8 at Foster Stadium.

After Chowan (1-1) took a 17-14 lead into the fourth quarter in the midst of a consistent, heavy-at-times rainstorm, the teams traded interceptions and then punts, giving VMI (1-1) the ball with 9:48 remaining. A five-play, 56-yard drive ended with a wide pass to Turner, who made several Hawk defenders miss en route to the endzone. Sexton tacked on the point after, making it a 21-17 game.

After CU kicker Alex Noboa missed wide left from 33, trying to cut the lead to one, Sexton tacked on a 36-yard field goal with 2:04 to play, making it a 24-17 game. Chowan got the ball back and marched to the VMI 36, but three incompletions and a sack ended the drive and the game, as Eric Kordenbrock executed two kneel-downs to run out the clock and preserve the victory. Turner had 133 all-purpose yards on the day, was one of two Keydet receivers with four catches and had two touchdowns as well. He also rushed for 45 yards, as starting tailback David Turner missed the second half due to an undisclosed injury. Chowan's Damian Ellis had eight catches for 77 yards in the losing effort, and the game was marred by 26 total penalties for 212 yards.

The Keydets struck first on a cloudy day with rain approaching, as four Chowan penalties on the Hawks' opening drive helped give VMI outstanding field position. VMI's first drive, in fact, started at the CU 17 and six plays later, a one-yard rush for David Turner opened the scoring. Sexton's point after made it VMI 7, Chowan 0.

After forcing a three-and-out, the Keydets came right back on their next drive and went 34 yards in three plays, capping the quick drive with a Kordenbrock pass to Jabari Turner for a 28-yard touchdown and a 14-0 Keydet lead. That would be the last VMI points until the fourth quarter, and Chowan cut into the advantage in the second period.

The Keydets marched down the field, going 65 yards in 10 plays and appeared to be on the verge of seizing command of the game. On the final of those plays, however, a Kordenbrock pass bounced off the hands of a Keydet receiver and was intercepted by Devahn Murphy. Murphy found a seam down the sideline and returned the pick 83 yards for a touchdown, putting Chowan on the board, 14-7, with 7:39 left in the opening half. Neither team could dent the scoreboard for the remainder of the half, and the contest went to halftime with the Keydets holding a seven-point cushion. The game remained close despite VMI outgaining CU 213-100 in the first half, and also in spite of CU's eight first half penalties.

The Keydets took the second half kickoff in a driving rainstorm, which had started just as the first half ended, and it cost VMI early. On the fifth play of the half, Kordenbrock bobbed the snap from center and CU's Chris Morris fell on the ball, giving the Hawks possession with 12:51 to play in the third. Chowan then held the ball for the next 8:04 and went 67 yards in a eye-popping 19 plays, including a third down conversion, a fourth down conversion and a VMI roughing the kicker penalty. Finally, Noboa capped the push with a 23-yard field goal, cutting the Keydet edge to 14-10 with 4:47 left in the period.

CU's defense held on the next Keydet possession, and the Hawk offense came right back once again. Aided by two penalties, Chowan went 78 yards in just five plays, and quarterback Cameron Stover threw a 17-yard touchdown to Antjuan Randall to give the Hawks a 17-14 cushion with 2:31 remaining in the quarter.

That would be the score headed to the fourth period, which opened with a CU punt, giving the Keydets the ball at their own 39. Kordenbrock, however, was promptly intercepted by Dakoria Desamme at the Chowan 24, VMI's third turnover of the day. Two plays later, Mike Smith picked off Stover to give the Keydets the ball once again, but they could not take advantage and the teams would trade punts. With CU still up 17-14, the Keydets took over with 9:48 to go and picked up a quick first down, as Jabari Turner ran for a first down on third and 3. After an incomplete pass, Kordenbrock found Turner on a swing pass for the eventual game-winner, a 45-yard strike that would put VMI up, 21-17.

CU tried to answer, driving 51 yards in 10 plays, but Noboa missed wide left with 5:56 remaining and the Keydets got the ball back. They could not take advantage, and the teams would trade punts. Chowan's punt, however, would come from its own endzone and went just 17 yards, setting up an eventual Sexton 36-yard field goal to make it 24-17 with just 2:04 left.

The visitors had one last rally, as Stover completed passes of 13 and 16 yards to move the ball into VMI territory, but three incompletions and a sack gave the Keydets the ball on downs and sealed the victory.

Kordenbrock went 19 for 37 for VMI, throwing for 275 yards, while Stover was 28 for 52 for 246 yards for the opposition. James Fruehan led the VMI defense with eight tackles, while Chowan amassed seven tackles for loss for 27 yards on the afternoon.

Game 3 - Richmond at VMI

Richmond Defeats VMI, 47-6

The Richmond Spiders opened the game by returning the opening kick for a touchdown, and went on to outgain the VMI Keydets 487-197 in total yards en route to a 47-6 victory Saturday, Sept. 15 in Lexington, Va.

After Justin Grant brought the opening kick back 90 yards for a Richmond (2-1) touchdown, the Keydets (1-2) got back within four, 10-6, early in the second quarter on a one-yard run by Jabari Turner, just Turner's second career rushing touchdown. The Spiders would go on to score the next 37 points, including 28 in the third quarter, to account for the final margin.

The Keydets were undone by three turnovers, including two interceptions in the second half, one of which was returned for a touchdown. The Spiders were led by Ben Edwards, who had 11 catches for 122 yards, and VMI saw linebacker Ty Garvin (12) and safety Adam Morgan (10) notch career-highs in tackles.

The game got underway with a bang, as UR's Grant brought the kickoff back 90 yards for an opening touchdown. It was the fastest TD in a VMI football game since Sept. 20, 2008, a 74-yard touchdown pass on the first play from scrimmage.

Leading 7-0, Richmond forced a VMI three and out, but Edwards fumbled the David Eberhardt kick and Patrick Sexton fell on the loose ball, giving the Keydets quality field position inside Spider territory. The Keydets could not take advantage, however, and after another Eberhardt punt, UR drove 91 yards in 16 plays for a Remington Hinshaw field goal. The 20-yard kick put the visitors up, 10-0, with 4:48 left in the first quarter.

The Keydets took over with 1:42 left in the opening period and would get on the board early in the second. A 10-play, 62-yard drive that saw either Eric Kordenbrock or Turner touch the ball on every play ended with Turner's one-yard plunge, making it a 10-6 contest after a missed extra point.

From there, the teams would trade relatively unproductive possessions for the remainder of the half. Richmond had two possessions inside the VMI 20, but had to settle for just one field goal until late, when UR quarterback John Laub orchestrated a two-minute drill that ended with a 37-yard Hinshaw kick, giving the visitors a 16-6 halftime lead.

The Keydets took the ball first in the second half, but after picking up one first down, Kordenbrock was intercepted by UR's Cooper Taylor, giving the visitors possession at the VMI 41. Seven plays later, Laub connected with Kevin Finney for a four-yard touchdown pass, pushing the margin to 23-6.

The Spiders got the ball back after a Keydet punt and scored once more, as Laub had a hand in all 10 plays of a 10-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a strong 14-yard quarterback draw. Laub was met by a Keydet defender at the two-yard line, but was able to spring over the tackler for a touchdown and a 30-6 UR lead.

UR's defense forced another Eberhardt punt and took possession once again at the 50-yard line with 2:32 left in the period. Jovan Smith took the handoff on the first play and ran around right tackle, reaching the sideline and getting through the Keydet defense for a touchdown and a 37-6 Richmond advantage. The visitors would cap their third quarter scoring when Taylor intercepted Kordenbrock for the second time and returned the pick for a 35-yard touchdown, making it a 44-6 contest.

Richmond controlled the clock in the fourth quarter, running the ball 15 times and eating up 11:06. The only fourth quarter scoring came off the foot of Hinshaw, as he hit a 22-yard field goal with 7:50 to go to account for the final margin, 47-6. Richmond concluded the day with a 78-50 edge in plays run, as well as the 487-197 total yard advantage.

VMI quarterback Kordenbrock finished 23 of 32 for 146 yards, but did move into the #6 position on VMI's all-time passing yardage listing. The junior also exceeded the 300 career completion mark. In addition, wide receiver James Rogers had a career-high six receptions. Hinshaw's four field goals were a school record for UR, while his 17 points also set a new scoring mark for UR's kickers.

VMI football will return to action next Saturday, Sept. 22, as the Keydets travel to Annapolis, Md. to take on the Navy Midshipmen. Game time is set for 3:30 p.m. and the contest will be broadcast on the CBS Sports Network.

Game 4 - VMI at Navy

Keydets Fall at Navy, 41-3

ANNAPOLIS, Md. - The VMI Keydets opened the scoring with a first quarter field goal, but the Navy Midshipmen scored 41 unanswered points and went on to defeat the Keydets, 41-3, in football action Saturday afternoon at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Md.

Jeff Sexton got the Keydets on the board in the first quarter, drilling a 42-yard field goal at the 8:29 mark to make it a 3-0 contest. The kick was the second-longest field goal of Sexton's career. Navy could only muster three points of their own in the opening period, and after one quarter, the game was tied, 3-3.

The Mids, however, scored 10 points late in the second quarter, had a 20-3 lead after three periods and notched three fourth-quarter touchdowns to pull away for the eventual 41-3 win.

VMI saw running back Jabari Turner run for 67 yards and post 38 yards receiving on a team-high six catches, while Navy's ground game accounted for 403 yards, including 126 from Noah Copeland and 116 from quarterback Trey Miller, who ran for three touchdowns on the day.

Despite Miller's eventual numbers, he coughed up a fumble on the game's opening possession. Chris Harper recovered, and the Keydets showed some steely nerves in their first possession.

VMI quarterback Eric Kordenbrock led the team 41 yards in 10 plays after the Navy miscue, with first down passes to H.L. Temoney and Turner opening the drive. On third down and 22, Kordenbrock then hooked up with Aaron Lewis on a 17-yard

VMI had been outgained 257-110 in the first half, but had taken full advantage of three Navy fumbles, including two recovered by the Keydets.

VMI took the ball first in the second half, and Augustine led the Keydets to two first downs, doing so on a 20-yard pass to Stefawn Ross and a 22-yard quarterback rush. VMI drove to the Navy 30, but could not convert a fourth down try.

Navy got back on the board at the tail end of the third quarter, as Miller drove his team 66 yards in eight plays and capped the drive himself, plunging in from one yard out to give Navy a 20-3 lead. That would be the score heading to the fourth quarter.

After a 27-yard Miller to Greene completion ended the third period, the Navy QB ran 40 yards for a touchdown on the third play of the fourth quarter, pushing the Mids' lead to 27-3.

The teams then exchanged possessions, with the Keydets taking the ball on their own 2 with 8:18 to go. VMI tried a pair of runs, with Derrick Ziglar just getting clear of the goal line to avoid the safety. However, on third and 11, Kordenbrock was picked off by Matt Warrick, who ran the interception back for a seven-yard return for a score, putting Navy up 34-3.

A Maika Polamalu 21-yard touchdown run at the 3:08 mark capped the scoring, and accounted for the final margin of 41-3.

Navy accounted for 510 total yards, including 403 rushing yards as the home team averaged nearly eight (7.9) yards per carry. For VMI, Turner's six catches marked a career high.

Following an off week, VMI returns to Lexington on Oct. 6 as it hosts the Blue Hose of Presbyterian College in the 2012 Big South Conference opener at Foster Stadium. Game time is set for 1:30 p.m., and the game can be seen on ESPN3.com.

Game 5 - Presbyterian College at VMI

Morgan Sparks VMI to Conference- Opening Win, 17-7

Safety Adam Morgan notched two interceptions, one in each half, to spark the VMI Keydets to a 17-7 win over the Presbyterian College Blue Hose in Big South football action contested Saturday afternoon in Lexington, Va. The game marked the Big South opener for both schools.

Morgan picked off Presbyterian (2-4, 0-1 Big South) starting quarterback Tamyn Garrick on the Blue Hose final play of the first half, and would go on to intercept backup quarterback Kaleb Griffin midway through the third quarter. The redshirt junior became the first VMI (2-3, 1-0 BSC) player with multiple interceptions in a game since Oct. 21, 2006, when Christian Kelly had three against Charleston Southern.

Logan Staib also had an interception, while Weston Reber recovered a fumble, as the Keydets won the turnover battle 4-1. VMI also posted a season-high in time of possession, as they had the ball for 37:46 of game action, in addition to logging 25 first downs, also a 2012 best. 12 of the 25 first downs came on third down conversions.

Offensively, Jabari Turner had a career-high 71 yards rushing to go along with a one-yard touchdown run, while Eric Kordenbrock and Dexter Bridge connected for a 29-yard first half TD.

Clouds rolled into Lexington during warm-ups, but in a good omen for the Keydets, the sun broke through as the teams took the field for kickoff on the moderate early fall day. The initial drives of the game were not notable, as the first four attempts all ended in punts, but the fifth was a good one for the home team. A 10-play, 43-yard drive that included five Derrick Ziglar rushing attempts ended in points, as Jeff Sexton connected on a 19-yard field goal to give VMI a 3-0 lead, which would be the score after one quarter.

After a Blue Hose punt early in the second period, VMI would notch an 18-play, 49-yard drive that ate up an impressive 9:22 on the game clock. The drive ended in a punt, but when VMI got the ball back just four plays later, the Keydets marched 66 yards in 10 plays. On fourth down, Kordenbrock found Dexter Bridge for a 29-yard touchdown, and Sexton's point after game VMI a 10-0 lead with 1:01 left in the half. Morgan then picked off Garrick on PC's ensuing try, and the Keydets took a 10-point lead to halftime. The first half saw VMI hold Presbyterian to just 45 yards of total offense, as the Blue Hose had the ball for just 8:14 of game action, compared to 21:46 for the Keydets.

PC took the ball to start the third quarter, and went to its bench for backup quarterback Griffin. After two plays, Griffin was picked off by Morgan at the Keydet 39, as the VMI defensive back intercepted a deep seam route for his second pick of the day. The Keydets nearly took advantage, as Kordenbrock completed first down passes to Aaron Lewis and Mario Thompson, but a 43-yard field goal from Sexton was wide right, keeping the score 10-0, VMI.

The visitors then took the ball with 10:39 left in the third quarter, and put together their best drive of the day. Two rushing first downs, as well as a Griffin pass to Arthur Williams, put the Blue Hose in position for their first points of the day. They came away empty, however, as an Aaron Mayes kick sailed wide left to give VMI possession once again, and the Keydets would take advantage. After five straight rushing plays to open the drive, Kordenbrock found Lewis for nine yards and one play later, hit his redshirt senior receiver for a 40-yard completion. That gave the Keydets a first and goal at the 1-yard line, and Turner ran it in on the very next play to push the VMI edge to 17-0 with 2:44 remaining in the third quarter.

The Blue Hose tried to respond, as a lengthy drive moved them to the Keydet 15. On third down from that yard line, however, PC was whistled for a 15-yard tripping penalty, and was forced into a field goal attempt from Mayes. The try sailed wide left once again, keeping the visitors off the scoreboard. Unfortunately for VMI, PC would intercept Kordenbrock on the next VMI drive, as Antarius Terrell picked off the VMI QB with 9:23 left. The Blue Hose then marched 47 yards in just five plays, and Griffin found McKie for a 23-yard strike and a touchdown, making it a 17-7 contest with 7:41 to play.

After a Keydet punt, Presbyterian would get the ball back once again with 3:52 to go. Griffin completed passes of 15 and 29 yards, both to Anderico Bailey, and after an incompletion, the PC quarterback found his target with a pass on each of the next four plays to move his team to the VMI 33.

Griffin was 6 for 7 on the drive, but on the eighth play, was hit by Shawn Chapman in the backfield. The ball came loose and Reber recovered, allowing the Keydets to run a great deal of time off the clock and seal the victory. Griffin was intercepted by Staib on a deep pass to close out the contest.

In addition to his fumble recovery, Reber had a career-high 10 tackles while James Fruehan posted 11, also a career high. John Washington also became just the second current Keydet to post two sacks in a game, joining Chapman, who accomplished the feat last season. The win was VMI's third in a Big South opener in the past five seasons, and fourth in six all-time meetings with Presbyterian College. The Keydets are now 4-2 in Big South home openers, including three wins under current head coach Sparky Woods.

VMI football will return to action next Saturday, as the Keydets travel to N. Charleston, S.C. to take on the Charleston Southern Buccaneers. Game time is set for 1:30 p.m.

Game 6 - VMI at Charleston Southern

Charleston Southern Defeats VMI, 32-14

N. CHARLESTON, S.C. – Utilizing efficient passing and scampering for over 300 yards rushing, the Charleston Southern University Buccaneers knocked off the Virginia Military Institute football team Saturday afternoon 32-14.

Charleston Southern (2-4, 1-1 Big South Conference) rushed for 307 yards on 66 attempts, averaging 4.7 yards per carry. The Buccaneers only threw the ball seven times, but four of those passes were for touchdowns at Buccaneer Field. Gabriel Johnson led the day in rushing, covering 63 yards on 15 carries.

Through the air, Malcolm Dixon went five-for-six, including three of Charleston Southern's touchdowns. Chase Jones accounted for the other passing score, throwing a 51-yard pass.

For the Keydets (2-4, 1-1 BSC), Eric Kordenbrock threw for 113 yards, completing 15 of his 33 attempts. On the ground, Jabari Turner ran for 55 yards on 13 carries, scoring VMI's only offensive touchdown on the day. Derrick Ziglar ran for 22 yards on just five carries, picking up 4.4 yards a run.

Using the option, Charleston Southern collected 24 first downs while VMI grabbed 15. The Buccaneers amassed 447 yards on the ground. Both teams fumbled the ball twice, but the Keydets capitalized on a Charleston Southern miscue as John Washington collected a loose ball and ran for a 70-yard touchdown on the fumble recovery with less than two minutes left in the game.

Time of possession was crucial in the game, but after controlling the ball for just over 25 minutes, the Keydets offensive chances were limited in the contest.

In the punting game, VMI's David Eberhardt covered 139 yards on four tries, averaging 34.8 yard a kick. Place kicker Jeff Sexton took just one field goal attempt, missing the 37-yard try in the second quarter.

Charleston Southern opened up the game by scoring on their first two possessions. The Bucs took the opening drive and moved 67 yards in eight plays - the first seven on the ground before Dixon found Zachary Frazier on an underneath crossing route that turned into a 15-yard score. The extra point was missed and CSU held a 6-0 advantage with 11:53 to go in the opening period.

VMI fumbled away the ball on its first drive when Kordenbrock was sacked and lost the ball at the Keydet 21, but the defense turned aside the Buc offense and held them on a fourth-and-13 conversion attempt at the 31-yard line following two consecutive negative rushing plays. The Keydets moved out to their own 45, but were forced to punt to the CSU 35.

The Bucs covered 65 yards on 11 plays on their second drive capped by a Dixon 31-yard touchdown pass to Jones III on a play that continued after flags were dropped at the snap because of defensive offsides. CSU capitalized on the free play and also converted two fourth downs on the possession including a fake punt that resulted in a first down at the VMI 48. The extra point was good and CSU held a 13-0 lead with 1:57 remaining in the opening quarter.

The Keydets answered with a three-yard touchdown run by Jabari Turner that culminated a 10-play, 69-yard scoring possession that consumed 5:29 off the first half clock. Turner, who collected his third rushing TD of the year, carried the bulk of rushing yards with 32 coming on six carries. Jeff Sexton's extra point was good and VMI trailed, 13-7 with 11:28 left in the second quarter.

VMI squandered a scoring opportunity later in the quarter when Sexton's 37-yard field goal attempt missed wide left after the Keydets had moved to the CSU 19 with 6:26 remaining in the half.

The Buccaneers got a jolt of momentum before halftime when a halfback option pass from the CSU 49 from Chase Jones to Larry Jones III resulted in a deflating score against the Keydets. At the VMI 15, Jones III made a leaping one-handed grab and separated from VMI cornerback Mike Smith who was called for defensive interference on the play. But the Jones III snag made the flag inconsequential when he raced the remaining yardage for the TD and the missed extra point gave CSU a 19-7 lead with 36 seconds before halftime.

VMI took possession to open the second half at its own 15 and was forced to punt from its own 35 after running five snaps. Following an Eberhardt punt to the CSU 24, the Buc offense engineered a nine-play 76-yard scoring drive capped by quarterback Teddy Allen's two-yard keeper. The drive, except for an 18-yard pass to tight end Nathan Prater to the VMI 29, consisted entirely of running plays.

After a three-and-out on VMI's ensuing drive, the Bucs assembled their final scoring drive of the day when Dixon scrambled out of the pocket but found wide receiver Charles Theodore in the right corner of the end zone. The extra point was good and the Bucs led 32-7 with 4:24 left in the third quarter.

VMI's second half points came on a 70-yard fumble recovery scoop and run down the left sideline by tackle John Washington with 11:26 left in the fourth quarter.

Game 7 - Coastal Carolina at VMI

Coastal Carolina Defeats VMI, 34-7

LEXINGTON, Va. - On the strength of 172 total yards from quarterback Aramis Hillary and a defense that had five sacks, the Coastal Carolina Chanticleers defeated the VMI Keydets, 34-7, in Big South football action Saturday afternoon at VMI's Foster Stadium.

Hillary threw for 114 yards and ran for 58 before being pulled late in the third quarter, with Coastal (3-4, 1-1 Big South) holding a 28-0 lead. The Chanticleers would notch two fourth-quarter field goals to push the lead to 34-0, but VMI (2-5, 1-2 BSC) got on the board in the final minute to avert the shutout, as A.J. Augustine drove the Keydets 65 yards in 12 plays and found Phillip Pickens with a two-yard touchdown pass to account for the final margin.

The Keydets saw veteran defensive lineman Shawn Chapman post a career-high in tackles, as he tied for the team lead with 10, while Tyler Owens also notched a career-best in stops, notching nine. Safety Adam Morgan had 10 tackles as well, equaling his career set against Richmond in mid-September. Offensively, the touchdown was the first-such throw of Augustine's career, as well as the first touchdown reception for Pickens. Also, receiver Stefawn Ross had a career-high five receptions.

Coastal got on the board first, as after an exchange of punts, the Chanticleers went 68 yards in seven plays. The drive took just 2:02, as Hillary accounted for 50 of the 68 yards and Jeremy Height capped the drive with a 19-yard touchdown run, coming with 7:39 left in the first quarter. Alex Catron's point after made it a 7-0 contest.

That margin grew to 14-0 on the next Coastal drive. Once again, the push took just over two minutes, as the visitors drove 86 yards in just eight plays. A 27-yard Hillary to Akeem Wesley completion was the drive's key, and on the next play, Lorenzo Taliaferro carried the ball in from 16 yards out for the touchdown. Catron's extra point made a 14-0 game, and that would be the score after one quarter of play.

VMI forced a punt on the next Coastal possession, but the Chanticleers got the ball back with 11:51 left in the half. Hillary and Height factored in every play on the eight-play, 63-yard drive, while the Coastal quarterback finding DeMario Bennett for a 10-yard touchdown and a 21-0 lead. From there, the game settled down a bit and neither team could find the scoreboard for the remainder of the half.

The first half saw Coastal outgain VMI 328-87, and post 18 first downs to six for the Keydets.

The Chanticleers added to their margin quickly in the second half. After forcing a punt from the VMI 30 on the first Keydet possession, Tyler Watkins broke through the VMI line and blocked the attempt. The ball caromed toward the goal line, was picked up by Lorenzo Boyles at the four-yard line and run in for a touchdown, giving Coastal a 28-0 lead. That would prove to be the only score of the third quarter, as the two teams combined for just 140 total yards during those 15 minutes.

In the fourth quarter, Catron hit a field goal from 30 yards out, before Grant Clayton added a second, that one coming from 29 yards with 4:58 left, to cap the Coastal scoring and make it a 34-0 contest. Augustine then relieved Eric Kordenbrock and led VMI on its longest drive of the day, a 65-yard march that included 18 yards rushing by the quarterback. Three straight completions ended the spurt, with Pickens' touchdown grab putting VMI on the board with 32 seconds remaining and also accounting for the final margin.

Coastal Carolina had 241 yards of total offense in the first quarter, as well as 14 first downs. Those numbers compared to 223 yards over the final three periods, with 11 first downs during that time. Height finished with 97 yards rushing for the visitors, who ran for 331 yards on the day, while James Rogers led VMI with six receptions. Kordenbrock was 20 for 34 for 198 yards and moved into fifth place on VMI's all-time passing yardage chart, while Augustine completed five of seven attempts for 38 yards on his drive.

Game 8 - VMI at Gardner-Webb

Keydets Fall at Gardner-Webb, 38-7

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C. – James Rogers put the VMI Keydets up 7-3 with an 80-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter, but the Gardner-Webb Runnin' Bulldogs scored 35 unanswered points to close out the game and win, 38-7, in Big South football action Saturday in Boiling Springs, N.C.

After Gardner-Webb (2-6, 1-2 Big South) notched a first quarter field goal to take the early lead, VMI (2-6, 1-3 BSC) responded on their first play of the second period, when Eric Kordenbrock found Rogers for the 80-yard strike. It was VMI's longest play of the season, a career-long reception for Rogers and an effort that tied for the ninth-longest pass play in Institute history, equaling a Kordenbrock pass to Mario Scott in 2010.

Unfortunately for VMI, Kordenbrock was picked off in the endzone on the next Keydet drive, and GWU responded with a touchdown drive late in the half to take a 10-7 halftime advantage. That appeared to turn the momentum, as just two plays into the third quarter, GWU quarterback Lucas Beatty threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to Demarcus White to increase the home team's lead to 10. That long pass opened a 28-point third quarter for Gardner-Webb, helped by two long punt returns and a pair of VMI turnovers, as the Runnin' Bulldogs pulled away for the victory.

In the setback, Kordenbrock went 19 for 35 for 254 yards and the touchdown pass to Rogers. He also completed passes to 10 different receivers, with Rogers leading the way with five grabs for 103 yards. The redshirt sophomore became the first Keydet receiver to top 100 yards since last November, when Aaron Lewis accomplished the feat against these same Runnin' Bulldogs.

The Keydets took the ball first on the 67-degree, overcast day, and promptly marched down the field. Dexter Bridge had a critical 22-yard first down grab on 3rd and 10, a play that had an additional 15 yards tacked on to it when GWU was whistled for roughing Kordenbrock. That set up a first down at the Runnin' Bulldog 22, and Jabari Turner moved the ball to the 16 one play later, but Kordenbrock was sacked on third down. Jeff Sexton's 43-yard field goal try then hit the right upright, and the Keydets came away empty. Gardner-Webb responded by going 63 yards in 13 plays, getting the ball inside the VMI 15, but the Keydet defense stiffened and forced a 29-yard field goal, which Trever Austin hit to put the home team up, 3-0. Once again, VMI came right back down the field. First down passes to Derrick Ziglar and Stefawn Ross helped move the ball into GWU territory, and on 4th and 8 from the Gardner-Webb 31, the Keydets went for the first down. Kordenbrock's pass attempt, however, was hurried and fell incomplete, and the 10-play drive went by the boards.

Gardner-Webb could not score on its next drive, and would take a 3-0 lead into the second quarter, as they kicked the ball to VMI three plays into that period. On the first Keydet play from scrimmage, Rogers found the endzone from 80 yards out for a touchdown, and a 7-3 Keydet lead. The Keydet defense again stiffened following the touchdown, as GWU lost a yard on its first two plays, and Charlie Jones broke through for a sack on the third, forcing a punt. VMI continued to move the ball well, proceeding down the field and gaining first downs on passes to Mario Thompson (20 yards) and Ziglar (14 yards).

The Keydets, in fact, got to the Gardner-Webb 14, and seemed poised to take command of the game, but on first down from the 14, Kordenbrock floated a pass into the endzone that was picked off by Tiko Thompson for a touchback.

Gardner-Webb then went 80 yards in 12 plays, a drive capped by Beatty's three-yard touchdown pass to Kenny Cook with 1:07 left in the half. The point after gave the home team a 10-7 lead, which would be the score at halftime. The first half had seen the Keydets hold a 217-163 edge in total yards, while Kordenbrock had posted a solid 13 for 20 effort, including 194 yards.

GWU received the second half kick, and it was returned 35 yards by J.J. Hubbard to set up a third-quarter pattern, as Hubbard would have 112 return yards in the third period alone. On the opening drive, however, he was stopped on a second-down run to set up a 3rd and 14, but Beatty found White for a 64-yard touchdown strike. The long play would give Gardner-Webb a 17-7 edge, a margin that grew to 24-7 moments later. After the Keydets turned the ball over on a fumble on their next possession, GWU used a halfback pass to increase its lead. Juanne Blount was able to get the ball to Hudson Smith for a 17-yard touchdown, and a 17-point lead for Gardner-Webb with 10:41 left in the third.

Austin then kicked the ball off, but Mike Smith lost it at his own 33 and Exavier Johnson fell on the loose ball, giving the Runnin' Bulldogs prime field position. This time, they could not take advantage, as Austin shanked a 27-yard field goal and the lead remained 17, 24-7. The Keydets could not respond, as they would go three and out, and a David Eberhardt punt was returned 30 yards by Hubbard.

That gave GWU the ball at the VMI 31, and five plays later, Beatty found Cook for a 24-yard touchdown and a 31-7 lead. The Keydets picked up a first down on their next possession, but again, were forced to punt. Two plays into the ensuing drive, White made his second touchdown grab of the day, this one a 47-yard strike, to put the margin to 31, 38-7. That would cap the scoring, as neither team tallied points in the final period.

The 31-point margin of victory is easily the widest in the 10-game history between the programs, as previously, no game between GWU and VMI had been decided by more than 14 points. Keydet defensive tackle Charlie Jones equaled his career-highs in tackles (6) and tackles for loss (3.5), while VMI accumulated 12 total tackles for loss, the most in the Sparky Woods era.

Game 9 - VMI at #9 Stony Brook

VMI Falls to #9 Stony Brook, 45-7

STONY BROOK, N.Y. – Miguel Maysonet ran for 149 yards and three touchdowns, leading the #9-ranked Stony Brook Seawolves over the VMI Keydets, 45-7, in Big South football action Saturday evening, Nov. 3 at LaValle Stadium in Stony Brook, N.Y.

The Seawolves (9-1, 5-0 Big South) amassed 309 total yards on the ground, including Maysonet's efforts and 139 yards by #2 back Marcus Coker, en route to a 475-162 edge in total yards. The home squad won despite having 13 penalties that cost it 137 yards. VMI (2-7, 1-4 Big South) quarterback Eric Kordenbrock went 16 for 24 with a touchdown, completing two-thirds of his passes, but was held to just 100 yards through the air. The Keydets did see defensive lineman Justin Smith post a career-high 10 tackles in the setback.

Stony Brook took the ball first on the windy day, an evening that saw the game start with a temperature of 53 degrees, and immediately drove down the field. 10 straight rushing plays pushed SBU to the VMI 5, and quarterback Kyle Essington finished off the drive with a five-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Norrell. The point after gave the home squad a 7-0 lead, and the Seawolves added on their next drive, as a five-play, 46-yard drive ended with a 16-yard touchdown dash by Maysonet. That gave SBU a 14-0 lead with 3:59 left in the first quarter, and that would be the score after 15 minutes of play.

The Keydets had the ball for nearly five minutes to end that period and start the second, but had an odd drive that involved a 20-yard completion, a Stony Brook penalty and three plays that lost yardage as they were forced to punt. Logan Staib made a big defensive play on the ensuing SBU drive, as on 2nd and 7, he hit Maysonet just beyond the line of scrimmage and forced a fumble. Staib then fell on the ball for the recovery, and the Keydets had the game's first turnover.

They could not take advantage, however, and the home team found the scoreboard again on its next drive. This effort was spearheaded by Essington, who went 5 of 7 on the 13-play, 80-yard drive that ate up over seven minutes. The SBU quarterback ended the drive as well, finding Norrell for the 11-yard touchdown pass and a 21-0 lead with 3:25 left in the half.

The Seawolves added on again before the end of the half, as they would take advantage of field position. A sequence of penalties would wind up giving SBU the ball at the VMI 34 with 2:14 left in the half, and Maysonet immediately ran 32 yards to give his team a first and goal. On the next play, the Big South's leading rusher punched it in from two yards out, and the point after made it a 28-0 contest. That would be the score at halftime, a first half that saw the home team have nearly a five-minute edge in time of possession.

The Keydets got the ball first to open the second half, and quickly picked up a first down on an 11-yard run by Derrick Ziglar. That was all VMI could muster, however, and the Keydets were forced to punt. Stony Brook then went 81 yards in nine plays, eight of which were rushes by either Maysonet or Coker. In fact, Maysonet posted his third rushing touchdown of the day, squirming in from a yard out and making it a 35-0 game.

VMI would answer on its next drive, posting its best effort of the day. A 13-play, 75-yard drive included two first down passes to Stefawn Ross, a 13-yard run by Ziglar and three SBU penalties. Kordenbrock capped the drive with an eight-yard TD pass to Dexter Bridge, his second touchdown grab of the year, and Jeff Sexton's extra point made it a 35-7 game.

The Keydet defense stiffened on its next effort, and forced a Stony Brook punt. Unfortunately for the Keydets, the punt was fumbled and SBU was able to fall on the ball at the Keydet 41. On the next play, Essington found Norrell for a 41-yard touchdown and a 42-7 Seawolf advantage. The home team then capped the scoring at the 6:02 mark, when Wesley Skiffington connected on a 42-yard field goal to account for the final margin, 45-7.

In addition to the home team's efforts on the ground, Essington went 12 of 17 for 166 yards and three scores. For the Keydets, Kordenbrock completed passes to seven different receivers, while an eighth, Cody Shirley, made a catch off a pass thrown by A.J. Augustine late in the game. The eight different receivers marked the third consecutive game in which the Keydets have had at least eight players post a reception.

VMI football will return to action next Saturday, November 10, playing host to The Military Classic of the South and facing The Citadel. Game time at Foster Stadium is set for 1:30 p.m.

Game 10 - The Citadel at VMI

Keydet Comeback Falls Short Against The Citadel, 27-24

LEXINGTON, Va. -- Despite a furious fourth-quarter comeback, the Virginia Military Institute football squad fell in the Military Classic of the South 27-24 to former Southern Conference foe The Citadel in football action contested Saturday, Nov. 10 at VMI's Foster Stadium.

Down 24-10 heading into the final quarter of play, the Keydets, led by Eric Kordenbrock's 191 passing yards, scored twice in the fourth quarter, pulling within a field goal of the Bulldogs with just over three minutes to play.

After Mario Thompson caught a four-yard dart from Kordenbrock, the Keydets trailed just 27-24, but after failing to recover an onside kick, The Citadel, which claimed the coveted Silver Shako with the win, ran out the clock to preserve the win.

Kordenbrock finished with 191 passing yards, 81 of which came in a single passing play to Jabari Turner in the fourth quarter, setting up a VMI touchdown. The Keydet rushing attack was paced by Derrick Ziglar, who netted 51 yards. Turner picked up another 46 ground yards, including a 20-yard scamper.

An option team, The Citadel (6-4) ran the ball 62 times, amassing 262 yards on the ground. Quarterback Aaron Miller threw for 72 yards while teammate Ben Dupree completed all three of his pass attempts for 49 yards. Miller was picked off once, as VMI's Mike Smith snapped the ball out of the air and returned it 17 yards.

On the defensive side, Adam Morgan led the Keydets with 15 total tackles, including six solo stops. Another three Keydets managed double-digit tackles as well, with Smith, Ty Garvin and Weston Reber each logging 11 stops.

The Citadel jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead just five minutes into the game as Dupree ran for 10-yards, capping a 10-play, 54-yard drive. But the Keydets answered back, marching 39 yards on 11 plays, setting up a Jeff Sexton field goal.

In the second quarter, The Citadel struck twice, first on a one-yard run by Vinny Miller, ending a 77-yard drive. During the series, the Bulldogs completed a pair of plays that each went for 20-yards, helping put them on top 14-3. At the tail end of the quarter, The Citadel picked up a field goal from Thomas Warren to go into the break up 17-3.

Despite the halftime deficit, VMI (2-8) rallied and out-scored The Citadel 21-10 in the second half, aided by big plays from the defense and special teams units.

As the Bulldogs slowly mounted a drive, reaching VMI's 24-yard line, The Citadel set up for a field goal attempt, but the kick was blocked, allowing Logan Staib to recover the ball. Two plays later however, the Bulldog defense got to Kordenbrock, forcing a fumble that Derek Douglas recovered for a touchdown after a 22-yard run to the endzone, extending The Citadel's lead to 24-3.

That would be the last time the Bulldogs reached the VMI endzone, as the Keydets scored the game's next 14 points. With four minutes left in the third, Jabari Turner punched in the first of VMI's two rushing touchdowns on the day. His scoring play was setup by special teams miscues by The Citadel, which was hit with a facemask penalty and an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty, setting the Keydets up at the Bulldogs' 18-yard line.

Opening the fourth quarter, Kordenbrock and Turner connected for the 81-yard catch and run off a swing pass VMI's longest play of the season thus far, along the VMI side of the field. Two players later, Cody Shirley helped VMI get within a touchdown of the Bulldogs' 24-17 lead.

But the Bulldogs pushed the lead out to 27-17 with just under five minutes left in the game as Warren kicked another field goal, following a clock-chewing drive of 13-plays in 6:52, covering on 33 yards.

Down but not out, VMI responded quickly, scoring two minutes later on a six-play, 59-yard drive. It became a one-score game as Kordenbrock zipped his lone passing touchdown of the day into Thompson. It was too little, too late however, as the Bulldogs escaped with the 27-24 victory in the 68th meeting between the two teams.

VMI concludes its 2012 campaign next Saturday when it hosts local foe Liberty University. Action between the two Big South Conference opponents is set to kickoff at Foster Stadium at 1:30 p.m.
