### Quick Hitters

VMI baseball will close out its 2012 season this week, beginning with a single game at Gray-Minor Stadium against VCU. The season then wraps up with the Terry Sisisky Classic at Richmond's Diamond, where VMI will face both East Carolina and VCU on Friday afternoon.

The Keydets have already faced the Rams twice this year, and after an 18-1 loss April 10, recovered to be much more competitive three weeks later in Lexington, falling 6-3. Three Keydets - Matt Winn, Rob Dickinson and Nick Dwyer - hit solo home runs in that game, with Dwyer's being his first collegiate long ball.

These will be the final three games for the VMI senior class, including outfielder Jacob Morley. Morley is chasing several career and single-season marks, a complete list of which is available on page two.

After earning his first win of the year this past Friday, Jeremy Brown will start Thursday's game at Gray-Minor Stadium. Coby Cowgill and Campbell Henkel are set to start Friday, meaning that VMI will be closing out the year with its traditional weekend starting pitchers.

## Reed Garrett Impressing:

Freshman Reed Garrett is on a nearly two-month run of success, as he closes out his first season on Post. Since March 18's game at UNC Asheville, Garrett has allowed just three earned runs over 33 IP, good for an 0.82 ERA. Opponents are hitting just .235 against him, and he has a win and a save during the streak, with the save coming May 11 against Charleston Southern.

## Winn Showing Improvement:

Redshirt freshman catcher Matt Winn has been hitting the ball well of late, despite having a seven-game hitting streak snapped May 2 at Virginia Tech. After that run, he went on to have a game-winning RBI double May 11 against Charleston Southern, and the next day, made his first career appearance in the cleanup spot.

Prior to the streak, Winn was hitting just .194 on the year, but he hit .375 during his seven-game spurt to raise his season average to .235. The Richmond native has also started 16 straight games behind the plate.

## Dickinson Blistering the Ball:

Since just before the start of the Winthrop series (April 6), junior outfielder Rob Dickinson has been perhaps the hottest hitter in the Big South. Since that time, he is hitting precisely .400 with five of his six home runs. That included a .384 average with four HR's during the month of April, when he won his first conference player of the week honor.

## Dwyer Showing Power:

After not hitting a home run until May 1, shortstop Nick Dwyer has gone deep twice in the time since. His first collegiate home run came May 1 against these VCU Rams, while he also went deep this past weekend against Charleston Southern.

## Keydets Drop Two of Three to CSU:

VMI dropped two of three contests to Charleston Southern during the teams' series May 11-13. The Keydets took the opener, as Matt Winn turned the game around with a go-ahead double in the fifth, and Reed Garrett faced the minimum over the final four innings for the save. CSU, however, rebounded to take the final two, and in the process, eliminate VMI from Big South Tournament consideration.

## Keydets Fall to VCU and Virginia Tech:

Prior to the nine-day break for exams, VMI dropped non-conference contests to Virginia Tech (18-0) and VCU (6-3). The VCU contest saw Jonathan Kelley make his first career start and allow a run over three innings, striking out five, while Nick Dwyer hit his first collegiate home run.

## VMI Swept by Gardner-Webb:

Despite a brilliant outing from Jeremy Brown on Friday night, and Rob Dickinson going 6 for his last 7 in the other two games, VMI was swept by Gardner-Webb April 27-29 in Boiling Springs, N.C. All told, the three games, including Friday's extra-inning affair, were decided by a combined four runs.

## JMU Squeaks by Keydets in 13 Innings:

In a back and forth contest, the James Madison Dukes saw Casey Goss single home a run in the 13th inning, giving JMU a 5-4 win over the VMI Keydets Wednesday night, April 25 at Gray-Minor Stadium.

Cole McInturff led off the 13th with a walk against VMI's Reed Garrett (2-3). He was then bunted to second by Tyler Duke, and the next batter, Goss, hit a 1-1 pitch up the middle to score the eventual winning run. Ben Garner (1-2) retired the side in order in the 13th to pick up the victory for the visiting Dukes.

In VMI's longest game of the year, the teams combined to leave 23 runners on base and throw 385 pitches in the 13 innings. Reed Garrett took the loss by surrendering a run in 1/3 of an inning, while Garner allowed just one hit and two walks over his three frames, as he notched the victory. It was the longest VMI baseball game since April 19, 2008, a 16-inning contest at Liberty.

Reed Garrett's run allowed ended a streak of 19 1/3 consecutive scoreless innings by the Keydet bullpen, dating back to the sixth inning of the finale against Campbell on April 21.

## Keydet Bullpen Carries Team to Win Over Longwood:

The Longwood Lancers scored in the first inning, but the VMI Keydets answered with four runs in the second and the Keydet bullpen allowed just one hit over the final seven innings of the game, propelling VMI to a 6-2 road win over Longwood Tuesday night, April 24 in Farmville, Va.

Andrew Deal (2-1) picked up the win with a career-long outing, as he went five sensational innings, allowing just one hit. Reed Garrett and John Garrett closed out the game with a hitless inning apiece, combining to strike out five of the six hitters they faced, as the Keydets ended a 20-game road losing skid. All told, the Keydet bullpen surrendered just one hit and one walk over the final seven innings of the contest.

## Keydets Take 2 of 3 From Campbell in Dramatic Fashion:

VMI won two of three games from then-third place Campbell in a potentially crucial Big South series April 20-21 at Gray-Minor Stadium. CU took the first game 6-4, but Jacob Morley hit a go-ahead home run in the eighth inning to give the Keydets a 3-2 lead, and victory, in game two. VMI then went on to win the finale 8-7, thanks to Morley's third home run in three games, this one a walk-off shot to lead off the ninth.

## Morley's Walk-Off Notes:

Jacob Morley hit a walk-off home run to give the Keydets an 8-7 win on Saturday, April 21 against Campbell. It was the Keydets' first walk-off hit since March of 2010, as well as their first walk-off homer during that time.

## Despite Three Close Games, VMI Swept by Coastal:

Despite holding Coastal Carolina to three runs in each of the three games, VMI was swept by CCU in a three-game series April 13-15 in Conway, S.C. Jeremy Brown allowed just one earned run over seven strong innings Friday, but two first-inning unearned runs provided Coastal with a 3-2 margin for the win. VMI was shut out 3-0 Saturday, and the Chanticleers saw a walkoff home run give them another 3-2 win to end the series Sunday, in a game that was televised on ESPNU.

## Late Rally Falls Short in Loss to Longwood:

The VMI Keydets brought the potential winning run to the plate in the ninth inning, but the Longwood Lancers pulled out a dramatic 8-6 victory in non-conference baseball action Wednesday night, April 11 at Gray-Minor Stadium in Lexington.

Longwood (18-16) jumped ahead with four runs in the first against VMI (11-22) starter Campbell Henkel (1-4), making a rare midweek appearance. The Lancers then saw their lead increase to 7-1 through four and a half frames, helped by home runs from Robby Newman and Brandon Delk, before the Keydet rally began. Back to back RBI doubles in the fifth made it a four-run deficit, and that lead shrunk to two after VMI notched a pair of runs in the sixth. Unfortunately for the home team, Joey Varaksa homered in the ninth to provide an insurance run, and Cameron Walter flew out to right-center field to end the game with two runners on, with Varaksa making a sprawling catch to seal the victory.

## Keydets Fall to VCU:

Matt Winn hit his first collegiate home run, giving the VMI Keydets a 1-0 lead in the third, but the VCU Rams scored the next 18 runs en route to an 18-1 victory in non-conference baseball action Tuesday night, April 10 at The Diamond in Richmond, Va.

Winn's blast off Seth Cutler-Voltz (3-2) was hit to left field, after the VCU starter had struck out six Keydets over the first 2 2/3 innings. VCU then answered with two runs in the bottom of the inning, before scoring 15 runs in the middle three frames to put the contest away. Culter-Voltz picked up the win, allowing one run over six innings and striking out 10. Connor Bach (0-3) took the loss for VMI, giving up five runs (four earned) over 3 2/3 frames.

## Dickinson Named BSC Player of the Week:

VMI outfielder Rob Dickinson was been named the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for games played April 2-7, according to information released by the conference Tuesday, April 10. It is the first career Big South weekly honor for the junior.

Dickinson emerged from a season-long slump by going 10-for-18 at the plate (.556) in four games last week, with three runs scored, six RBI, three doubles, one triple and one home run. He posted 18 total bases, including nine in game two against Winthrop -- a game in which he fell just a single shy of the cycle. Dickinson posted seven hits in nine at-bats, while the remainder of the Keydets had just 13 total. Dickinson also had two hits in Tuesday's non-conference win over Richmond, and he finished the week with a .556 on base percentage and a 1.000 slugging percentage.

## Keydets Drop Two of Three to Winthrop:

VMI dropped two of three games to Winthrop over Easter weekend, April 6-7 at Gray-Minor Stadium. The Keydets took game one Friday, 10-4, thanks to two five-run innings and home runs by Cameron Walter and George Piccirilli, but a ninth-inning error helped Winthrop take a doubleheader opener Saturday, 6-5, and WU then held on to take game three, 7-4, despite VMI sending Jacob Morley to the plate as the tying run in the ninth. Rob Dickinson had a banner series, going 8 for 14 (.571) with 15 total bases and six RBI, while Walter was 5 for 12 (.417).

## VMI Holds on For Dramatic Win Over UR:

The VMI Keydets took the lead with three seventh-inning runs and closer John Garrett struck out the Richmond Spiders' Adam McConnell to end the game with the tying run on second, helping VMI to a dramatic 4-3 win over Richmond Tuesday night, April 3 at Gray-Minor Stadium.

After a Matt Winn sacrifice fly tied the game in the seventh, Rob Dickinson singled off James Lively (0-1) with two outs in that frame. With Dickinson running, George Piccirilli lined a ball deep into the right field gap for a double, plating the Keydet center fielder and giving VMI a 3-2 lead. Gary LeClair followed with an infield hit, a ball that was hit virtually straight into the ground, bounced well into the air and ended up no more than 35 feet from home plate. Lively then attempted a pickoff throw to first base, but the ball bounced away for an error and Piccirilli scored, making it a 4-2 game.

Chris Cowell homered in the eighth for Richmond, making it a one-run contest, and with two out in the ninth, Matt Zink singled to right off Garrett. Mike Small followed with a bouncer up the middle, putting two on, but

Garrett struck out McConnell on three pitches to end the game and record his fourth save of the season.

## Keydets Swept by High Point:

VMI suffered a sweep at the hands of the High Point Panthers March 30-April 1 in High Point, N.C. The Keydets hit just .213 in the series, as High Point pitched back to back complete games to open the three-game set and then won 5-2 in the finale. Gary LeClair led VMI by going 4 for 10 (.400).

## ODU Shuts Out VMI, 2-0:

The Old Dominion Monarchs scored twice in the fifth inning for the only runs of the game, en route to a 2-0 win over the VMI Keydets Tuesday, March 29 in non-conference baseball action at Gray-Minor Stadium.

ODU's (10-14) Josh Wright led off the decisive fifth with a walk against VMI (9-15) reliever Connor Bach (0-2). Josh Eldridge then had an infield single, and Chris Baker singled to left center, scoring Wright with the game's first run. After a foul out, Josh Tutwiler walked and Ben Verlander was announced as a pinch-hitter. Miles McQuaig relieved Bach and induced a ground ball to third, but Verlander beat the relay from second baseman Michael Donovan, allowing the second run to score.

Bach took the loss for VMI, as he allowed two runs on two hits in 1 1/3 innings. He walked three and struck out one. C.J. Huyett, the ODU starter, moved to 1-1 by allowing just four hits over five shutout innings. The teams combined to allow just six hits apiece over the course of the contest.

## Keydets Rebound With Sweep of PC:

VMI rebounded from a seven-game losing streak with a sweep of Presbyterian College, March 23-25 at Gray-Minor Stadium. The Keydets took the opener 10-5, as Coby Cowgill moved to 4-0 and Berkley Hawkins went 3 for 3 for four RBI, including his first career home run. After a 5-4 squeaker the next day, in which John Garrett got the final out with the bases loaded, VMI completed the sweep with a 10-7 win Sunday. All told, the Keydets hit .363 in the series.

## Hawkins Shows Well in Entrance to Lineup:

Sophomore Berkley Hawkins was inserted into the starting lineup March 23 against Presbyterian, and proceeded to hit .700 (7 for

10) against the Blue Hose with a home run (his first career) and five RBI. Hawkins started all three games at third base, his first career starts at the position, and played errorless ball, handling six chances without incident.

## VMI Falls to UVA:

The Virginia Cavaliers scored eight times in the third inning and went on to defeat the VMI Keydets, 12-3, in non-conference baseball action Wednesday, March 21, at Davenport Field.

With the game tied, 2-2, the first 10 batters reached for Virginia (12-8-1) in the third. The Cavaliers were aided by a VMI (6-14) error, but all eight runs in the inning were earned. The home team would tack on two runs in the fifth, and a Cameron Walter ninth-inning home run, the first of his career, would cap the scoring.

Adam Lopez (0-1), making just his second start in a return from elbow surgery, took the loss as he pitched into the third inning. Lopez allowed five runs (four earned) on five hits, striking out three.

## Keydets Go 0-5 on Spring Break Swing:

VMI struggled on its spring break trip, dropping all five games in the nearly week-long sojourn to Old Dominion and UNC Asheville. The loss included two extra innings setbacks, including a 13-12 loss at ODU on March 13 and a 5-4 loss at Asheville the following Saturday. VMI hit .294 during the trip, including Jacob Morley's .440 batting average, but the Keydets allowed opponents to hit at a .380 clip and fielded just .943 (11 errors) during the five games.

## Keydets Take Two of Three From Youngstown State:

Behind a combined 20 runs and 25 hits, VMI took the first two games from Youngstown State March 9-10 before losing the Sunday game, 10-2. The series saw Andrew Montague and George Piccirilli hit their first home runs of the year, while freshman Gary LeClair went 4 for

9 combined in the first two games and drove in three runs in game two. YSU scored nine runs over the final two frames to win the finale March 11.

### **William & Mary Defeats VMI:**

Jay McCarthy pitched seven shutout innings for William & Mary, helping the visiting Tribe to a 6-2 win over the VMI Keydets Tuesday night, March 6 at Gray-Minor Stadium.

McCarthy (1-1) gave up three hits and did not walk a batter over his seven frames, earning his first win of the season for W&M (8-5). Andrew Montague paced the Keydets (4-7) with two hits, including a ninth-inning RBI single.

While McCarthy earned the win, Connor Bach (0-1) took the loss for the Keydets in his first career start. Bach was impressive at times, striking out seven without a walk, but surrendered four earned runs on six hits over four frames of work.

### **Keydets Sweep Hartford:**

Behind strong relief pitching and strong offensive showings, the Keydets swept the Hartford Hawks in a three-game series March 3 and 4 at Gray-Minor Stadium.

The VMI bullpen was highlighted by Michael Devine, who pitched two hitless innings in the series, picking up two saves. That moved him into second in that category all-time at VMI, while offensively, the Keydets were led by Jacob Morley, who went 7 for 12 (.583) with two home runs. The Keydets won the games 6-4, 6-5 and 9-7 to post the sweep.

### **VMI Falls to William & Mary:**

The William & Mary Tribe scored the first eight runs of the game and went on to defeat the VMI Keydets, 10-2, in non-conference baseball action Feb. 28 at Williamsburg's Plumeri Park.

VMI (1-6) was looking for its first back to back wins in Williamsburg since the 1964 and 1965 seasons, but the Tribe (3-5) scored in five of the first six innings, including three runs in both the third and the fifth. Outfielder Tadd Bower was 2 for 4 with three RBI to pace the Tribe's 14-hit attack, while Matt Davenport (1-0) pitched seven innings of two-run ball for the win. Travis Thomas (0-1) took the loss for the Keydets, surrendering five runs (four earned) over 2 1/3 innings.

### **Keydets Drop Two of Three to Lafayette:**

After winning their ninth straight home opener to begin the series, the VMI Keydets dropped the next two to the Lafayette Leopards in the late-February series between the clubs. Coby Cowgill and two relievers combined on a shutout in game one, extended Cowgill's streak without allowing an earned run to 14 consecutive innings to start 2012. The shutout was the second combined SO of Cowgill's career.

Lafayette then took game two 12-5, before a ninth-inning VMI rally fell short in the finale and the Keydets fell 5-4. Jordan Tarsovich hit .500, 6 for 12, in the series.

### **VMI Impresses in Opening Series at #2 South Carolina:**

Despite being swept in its season-opening three-game set at #2 South Carolina, the VMI Keydets took the two-time defending national champions to the limit in each of the first two contests, before the Gamecocks exploded for a 13-1 win in the finale.

Game 1 saw Coby Cowgill and All-American Michael Roth duel to a 1-1 tie after seven innings, only to have South Carolina push a run across in the eighth and eake out a 2-1 win. Game 2 brough more of the same, with the Keydets battling back to tie the game at 2 in the sixth, before South Carolina scored a single run in the bottom half and held on for a 3-2 victory.

### **Keydets Bring Young Team into 2012:**

After a 2011 season that saw VMI feature as many as five seniors in its starting lineup, the Keydets expect to have many true freshmen in key

roles this year. All told, 12 true freshmen are on the Keydet roster, while Winn is joined by first baseman/DH Cameron Walter in the ranks of red-shirt freshmen.

### **Keydets Voted Seventh in Big South Preseason Poll:**

VMI baseball was voted seventh in the Big South's preseason poll, according to information released by the conference Tuesday, Jan. 24.

The Keydets earned 64 points, finishing just two points behind fifth-place Gardner-Webb, last year's tournament runners-up. Charleston Southern (65) split the two teams, with Coastal Carolina leading the pre-season poll with 120 points and 10 first-place votes. Liberty garnered one first-place vote and 98 points, with Radford holding 97 markers and finishing third.

Winthrop (76) was fourth, while High Point (59), Campbell (31), Presbyterian College (30) and UNC Asheville (20) rounded out the bottom of the voting.

Brad Zebedis of Presbyterian was voted the Preseason Player of the Year, while Josh Conway of Coastal Carolina garnered Preseason Pitcher of the Year honors.

### **2012 Schedule Includes Nine Games With 2011 Regional Teams:**

For the second straight year, the Keydets will open the season with a marquee three-game set, as VMI travels to Columbia, S.C. to take on the two-time defending NCAA Champion South Carolina Gamecocks.

The three-game series, set for Feb. 17-19, marks a trio of the nine games VMI will play against teams that advanced to Regional play in 2011. VMI will also take on Virginia (March 21 at Virginia), Coastal Carolina (April 13-15 at Coastal) and James Madison (April 25 at home, May 1 at JMU). Both Virginia and South Carolina advanced to the College World Series.

### **Ikenberry Looking to Move Up Big South Ranks:**

Last season, VMI head coach Marlin Ikenberry won his 200th game, and closed out the year with a career mark of 221-213-1. Ikenberry entered the season one of just two coaches with at least five seasons at VMI to post a winning percentage over .500, and also has the most wins of any athletic coach in Institute history.

Ikenberry currently ranks fourth on the Big South's all-time wins list, and is one of two active BSC coaches to be on that chart. With 50 victories, he would surpass Coastal's John Vrooman for third.

### **Sullivan '11 Signs With Frontier League Team:**

VMI alumnus Graham Sullivan '11 has signed a free agent contract with the Southern Illinois Miners of the independent Frontier League.

Sullivan, who left VMI ranked in the program's career top-10 in batting average, doubles and total bases, was signed after a brief stay in the California Winter League. The CWL is a winter league developed to aid players in their quest to get signed by a professional team, and Sullivan inked a deal with the Miners after going 6 for 14 in his five-game stay in that league. He will join a team that was 58-38 in 2011, and finished second in its division in the Frontier League.

### **Roberts Selected by Oakland in 2011 MLB Draft:**

Former Keydet shortstop Sam Roberts was drafted by the Oakland Athletics in the 26th round of the Major League Baseball draft this past June. It marked the seventh straight year VMI had seen a player selected in the draft.

### **Beazley Named New VMI Baseball Assistant:**

Travis Beazley, former Boston Red Sox minor leaguer and Randolph-Macon assistant coach, has been named the new pitching coach for VMI baseball, according to information released by the program Thursday, August 18.

Beazley joins VMI after spending a year as an assistant at Randolph-Macon, during which time he worked with the pitchers, infielders and hitters for the 2011 ODAC Champions and NCAA Regional participants. He also oversaw the program's recruiting and strength and conditioning, as well as the squad's academic progress.

Prior to his year as a full-time assistant at RMC, Beazley spent most of three seasons in the Boston Red Sox farm system after being selected in the 38th round of the 2006 MLB Draft. He pitched 370 total innings in his career, and led the Boston minor league system in wins and innings pitched during the 2007 season. While pitching for the Red Sox, he spent his fall seasons as a volunteer coach at RMC, working specifically with the pitchers and infielders.

Beazley graduated from Randolph-Macon in 2006, after a standout collegiate career. His 2006 season earned him a litany of awards, including a Second Team All-American Selection, the ODAC Pitcher of the Year honor and the ABCA/Rawlings Division III South Region Pitcher of the Year award. He was also an ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA First Team All-District All-Academic Selection in 2006, and was a four-year Presidential Scholarship recipient.

Beazley is also a former American Legion Assistant Coach, and has worked camps for VCU, Richmond and Clemson in past years. He is a native of Beaverdam, Va. and a graduate of Patrick Henry High School.

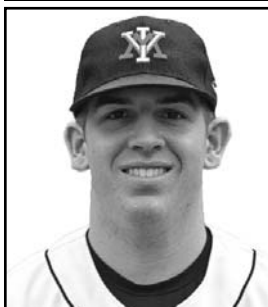
