Brian Anken is entering his second season as the head man of the VMI Keydets lacrosse program after being hired on July 30, 2010.

In his first year on Post, the Keydets captured the first team statistical championship in VMI lacrosse history, beating out NCAA Champion Virginia to lead the nation in groundballs per game with 39.62.

“VMI is the toughest military institution in the country,” said Anken. “This staff is committed to establishing a brand of

lacrosse to reflect the level of physical and mental toughness needed to excel at VMI, as well as in our cadet-athletes impending military duties and civilian life.”

Hired by Lycoming in July of 2006, Anken implemented all offensive and defensive strategies for the team. He also supervised the assistant staff, and was responsible for a large amount of fundraising, which helped subsidize the team’s travel and equipment expenses. After posting a 4-10 record in his first year at the school, Anken’s team went 10-6 in 2008, earning him his second conference Coach of the Year honor (Mars Hill '04). The team then went on to post records of 11-5 and 11-6 in his final two years, including a share of the conference regular season title in 2009, giving them a 32-17 mark over Anken’s final three seasons in Williamsport, Pa.

Prior to working at Lycoming, Anken had been the head man at Mars Hill College in North Carolina, where he helped the team post a five and a half game improvement in the standings during his final year, 2006. He earned conference Coach of the Year honors in 2004. He was also the founder and director of the Lions Lacrosse Camp, and handled game and event management as well.

Anken broke into the coaching ranks with Pfeiffer in 2001, where he was the program’s top assistant. There, he was responsible for the defensive side of the ball, along with goalies. He also handled recruiting in Maryland, New York and New Jersey before leaving in 2001 to join the Rochester Institute of Technology, where again, he handled the defense and goalies. During his three years in Rochester, Anken was also an assistant to the school’s Athletic Association Director of Development.

In his career, Anken has coached a pair of NCAA Division III statistical champions. He has also mentored two conference Freshman of the Year and one Player of the Year, and in seven seasons as a head coach, he has had 21 all-conference players and a single All-American. Anken is a member of the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association’s (USILA) Rankings and All-American Committees, as well as being a part of the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee.

Curtis Jaques heads into his fourth season on the sidelines as an assistant coach for the VMI lacrosse team, a program near and dear to the 2007 alumnus.

Jaques' returned to his alma mater on Sept. 9, 2009. Jaques served as interim head coach during the summer of 2010 while a nationally search was conducted that resulted in the hiring of Brian Anken took place.

In year one under Anken, Jaques worked primarily with the team's offense, playing a major role in the emergence of junior Drew Leonard, who tallied 31 goals, the most since Leo McInerney's 34 in 2005. Also, Jaques also engineered an extremely balanced offense, as 18 Keydets scored at least one goal on the season, a school record. He also serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Switching ends of the field for his third season, Jaques worked closely with the offensive unit, helping revamp the offense and its production. Jaques implemented an offense that averaged 10.33 goals per game in MAAC action, a full goal better than the 2011 campaign and the program's best since 2005. The Keydet offense buried 62 goals in conference play in 2012, the most since 2008. Jaques was also responsible for the team's top offensive producer, Keith Long, who became the first Keydet to earn MAAC First Team plaudits since Tim Moran in 2010. Long was later selected by the

Rochester Rattlers of Major League Lacrosse in the Supplemental Draft. He was the second VMI player in program history to be selected by an MLL team, joining classmate Stephen Robarge, who was taken in the Collegiate Draft by the Denver Outlaws.

Jaques returned to VMI after a two-year stint at SUNY Geneseo, where he worked with the defense and served as top assistant to head coach Jim Lyons. At Geneseo, Jaques helped guide the squad to a No. 13 ranking in the final 2009 USILA Division III poll. The team also went undefeated in regular season conference (SUNYAC) play, before falling to No. 7 Cortland in the title game, 14-13.

Jaques graduated from the Institute in 2007 with a double major in International Studies and Modern Languages and Culture (German). He was a team captain in 2007, and was the Keydets' No. 1 defenseman during then-coach Jeff Shirk's first campaign in Lexington, when Jaques was named preseason All-MAAC selection as well.

College athletics runs through the Jaques family. Ali Jaques, Curtis' older sister, was a former student-athlete on the New York University women's basketball team, where she helped her team to a national championship in 1997. Ali is currently the head women's basketball coach at Siena College in Loudonville, N.Y. Sidney, the youngest of the Jaques family, recently graduated from Scranton University where she was a standout women's basketball player. Curtis' older brother, Parker, was a defensive back on the University of Rochester football team.

A native of Rosemont, N.J., Jaques now resides in Lexington with his wife, Alecia. The couple anticipate the birth of their first child this spring.

The 2012-13 academic year will mark the third on Post for **Tony Mackin** on the VMI coaching staff. He will assist with the team's faceoff unit, recruiting, and day-to-day office responsibilities.



Mackin played an instrumental role in the continued emergence of face-off specialist Stephen Robarge in his first year on Post, as the junior secured the NCAA statistical title in face-offs as well as ground balls, becoming only the second player in NCAA history to win both the face-off and ground ball category. Robarge's 10.15 ground balls per contest ranks No. 8 in NCAA history and is the highest ground ball per game average in Division I lacrosse since 2006, when Denver's Geoff Snider averaged 11.41 grounders per contest.

Additionally, Mackin was responsible for the revolution of junior Chris Rossie in a face-off wing position, as VMI had the only duo in ranked in the top-25 nationally in ground balls, as junior Chris Rossie collected 65 ground balls on the year primarily in a face-off wing position. As a team, VMI was No. 2 in the country in face-offs as a team, coming in second behind Jacksonville.

There was no drop off on the face-off unit from Mackin's first season on Post to his second. Robarge once again claimed the top groundballs per game (9.07) title and face-off percentage (66.6). The Keydets also finished tops among the nation's 61 Division I teams in face-off winning percentage, claiming draws at a 64.4 percent clip. Robarge became the first Division I player to win back-to-back groundball titles, in 2012.

A defenseman in college, Mackin also helped revamp the Keydet close defense, instituting a defense that allowed the fewest goals in MAAC play since 2009. The defense was crucial in several games, holding opponents under 10 goals in three of the last four games, helping VMI win those three games. One of the defense's shining moments of 2012 came in a 6-2 setback against then-16th ranked Lehigh, which went on to a No. 7 ranking and a spot in the NCAA tournament. Mackin's responsibilities helped lead to a pair of second-team All-MAAC selections in defenseman Kyle Hofstetter and Robarge, who was also named MAAC Face-off Specialist of the Year for a second season.

Mackin joined the Keydets after a year as a graduate assistant coach at Marymount University in Arlington, Va., earning a master's in secondary education. He is a 2008 graduate of Lycoming College in Williamsport, Pa., where he played a pair of seasons under VMI head coach Brian Anken. Serving as a team captain in 2007-08, his senior season was cut short after suffering a career-ending knee injury.

Following the injury, Mackin took on a role as an assistant coach, where he headed the man-down defense and assisted with team conditioning and scouting. During his student-teaching responsibilities at Marymount in the spring of 2009, he also served as an assistant coach at Hayfield Secondary School, which produced Robarge, who was drafted by Major League Lacrosse's Denver Outlaws. Robarge was picked up 44th overall by one of the League's top teams. The specialist helped the Outlaws to the league championships in 2012.

When Last They Met (Mar. 24, 2012)

Jacksonville 13, VMI 12 (OT)

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - For a second straight game, the VMI lacrosse battled hard but fell in heartbreaking fashion, this time 13-12 in overtime at Jacksonville University on Saturday. The Dolphins ended the game 1:22 into the extra time at D.B. Milne Field in a Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference clash.

Jacksonville's Ari Waffle capped an outstanding day in overtime, scoring the game-winner, which was his eighth goal of the day. Cameron Mann was credited with both the game-tying and game-winning assists.

Drew Leonard paced VMI's versatile scoring efforts, putting home four goals. Freshman Mike DeBlasio, who was named MAAC Rookie of the Week on Monday, tallied his third consecutive hat trick. Keith Long was the only other multiple goal scorer, netting a pair. Three other Keydets, Bernie Mowbray, Colin Bosse and Russell East, chipped in one goal each.

Three-quarters of VMI's goals came with an assist. Long finished the day with five points, adding three helpers to his pair of goals. Mowbray and sophomore Mickey Hofmeister had two helpers apiece while Bosse added one.

Waffle led the scoring for the day with eight markers and one assist for nine points. Donovan Lange had two goals while Mann, Conor Igoe and Will Vogt posted one apiece. Mann was the Dolphins' leading assister with three. Max Gurowski and TJ Kenary had two each. Lange also had one dish.

Senior face-off specialist Stephen Robarge had an outstanding effort at the X, winning 24 of the game's 28 draws. His 24 wins mark the second time in three games he has won 20 or more face-offs, collecting 22 wins against Wagner two weeks ago. Robarge was perfect at the X in the second half, going 14-14, including a win in the overtime period.

Between the pipes, junior Matt Lindemann made his first start of the 2012 season, turning away 10 Dolphin shots, including five in the third quarter.

Four current Keydets have points against the Dolphins during their time on Post. Juniors Mickey Hofmeister, who has missed this season so far with an injury, and Bernie Mowbray lead the team with four points each. Hofmesiter scored once in 2011 with an assist and handing out two helpers last season. Mowbray racked up three points in Florida last season, striking once with and handing out two helpers, while also scoring during the 2010 meeting.

Sophomore Mike DeBlasio is in a close third with three points, knocking down three goals. His hat trick was the third in a row he tallied at that point in the 2012 season.

Senior captain Russell East has two points, scoring once last season and tallying an assist in 2011.

Scouting the Keydets

VMI is coming off of a humbling 23-5 road loss at Marist last Saturday. The Keydets got off to a slow start and did not score until the third quarter.

Russell East leads VMI's offense with 19 points on 17 goals and two assists. He is currently riding a 17-game scoring streak, dating back to last season. Over the course of that run, East has logged 32 goals and eight helpers for 40 points, averaging 2.4 points per game in the streak. He needs just three goals to extend the team's run of at least one 20-goal scorer to nine consecutive seasons.

Trailing East is Bernie Mowbray, who has nine goals and four helpers for 13 points. Mowbray is second on the team in points per game, racking up nearly one and a half, including an average of one goal per outing this season.

Leading a youth-heavy team is freshman Alex Henthorn, who has seven goals and one assist while he is tied with sophomore Mike DeBlasio with eight points. The latter has six goals and two dishes.

Sophomore Eric Groleau leads the squad in the assist column, handing out five, just one ahead of Mowbray's four.

VMI has the MAAC's second-best man-up unit, putting home a goal 31.0 percent of the time (13-42). The Keydets trail only Siena in the league standings (14-28, 50.0 percent). Nationally, VMI is near the top third in the country in man-up percentage, ranking 33rd out of 63 teams.

Between the pipes, VMI's Matt Lindemann has made an astounding 129 saves so far this season. He leads the league in saves per game (14.89) and ranks second in the country in the same category. He needs just 19 saves to move into sole possession of ninth all-time at VMI for his career. Currently eighth is former teammate Kelly McMinn's 295.

Nationally, VMI has the highest saves per game average, turning away 15.44 opponent shots per game. Only three teams in the country averages 15 or more saves per game. VMI is joined by Michigan (15.40) and Bellarmine (15.11).

Lindemann has logged 503 of VMI's 540 minutes in goal this season, accounting for 93.1 percent of the time. He is third in the league in percentage of a team's time in goal.

The Keydet offense is versatile, with 17 different players recording at least one point, including 15 different goal scorers. The 17 point getters are the second-most in the Brian Anken Era at VMI, just three shy of the 20 point scorers in 2011.

Scouting the Dolphins

Jacksonville is making the long trip, over 600 miles, to Lexington on a three-game win streak. Those three wins have come by a combined five goals, with two needing overtime to determine a winner. Jacksonville is 5-3 on the year and sits in a tie with Marist at the top of the MAAC standings at 3-0.

The Dolphins have six players with double digit points, paced by TJ Kenary's 17 (11g, 6a) while Cameron Mann is hot on his heels with 16 points on 10 goals and six helpers.

Conor Igoe is alone in third with 13 points (9g, 4a) as David Goldman and James Trentini has 12 each on seven goals, five assists and six goals, six assists, respectively. Ari Waffle rounds out the double-figures with 11 (9g, 2a).

Jacksonville has struggled on the man-up this season, scoring just eight EMO goals. Kenary has three of those tallies. The Dolphins are striking at just 23.5 percent on the power play, ranking 57th in the country out of 63 total teams.

However, despite the struggles on man-up, Jacksonville is one of the nation's top man-down teams, holding foes to just eight goals on 33 tries (24.2 percent), ranking the Dolphins 11th.

In goal, Jacksonville is led by Peter DeLuca, who stops opponents 56.8 percent of the time, making 79 saves on 139 shots on goal. He is 5-2 on the season and has a goals against average of 8.48, good for 16th nationally. Brendan Niklason took Jacksonville's loss against then sixth-ranked Duke.

Over 50 percent of Jacksonville's goals have been assisted this season as the team has amassed 39 helpers. Kenary, Mann and Trentini lead the way with six apiece.

Dan McNulty leads the charge at the faceoff X, winning 53.5 percent of his draws (92-142). He leads the team in groundballs with 39 and has two assists on the season.

Getting the Offense Going

The VMI offense struggled early in the season, averaging just 4.8 goals per game through the first five games.

However, things have begun to turn around for VMI, which has averaging 7.50 goals per game in the last four contests. The Keydets have scored more goals in the last four games (30) than in the first five combined (24).

Taking more shots seems to have helped the Keydet offense. Through the first five games, VMI took 115 total shots, averaging 23.0 per game. In the last four games, VMI has taken well more than that number (134) already, averaging 33.5 shots per game.

Future Conference Alignment

While Saturday's game may be the final meeting between the Keydets and Jacksonville as MAAC opponents, the two teams will meet again next season as members of the Atlantic Sun. VMI is joining the A-Sun as an associate member, while the league serves as Jacksonville's main conference.

Jacksonville is not the only opponent on the Keydets 2013 schedule that will be moving to the Atlantic Sun next season. Mercer, currently an independent, will move into the A-Sun. Like Jacksonville, the Atlantic Sun serves as the Bears' main league.

It's a Girl!

The VMI lacrosse family got a little bigger.

Six pounds, six ounces and 20 inches long, to be exact. Assistant coach Curtis Jaques and his wife, Alecia, welcomed their first child, Ava, into the world on March 27 at 12:36 p.m.

Where are we playing!?

In the three games VMI has played against Jacksonville, the two have never used the same field twice.

The first game of the series was played at what was then known as the VMI Turf Field (now Fiorini Field) with VMI coming out on top 10-9. During the next season, the Dolphins returned to Lexington, only to battle VMI at Foster Stadium. That game was the first of back-to-back 13-12 MAAC wins for Jacksonville.

Last season, the Keydets made the trek to Florida, taking on Jacksonville at D.B. Milne Field for the first time in series history.

It's Not How You Start...

After going just 4-12 (.333) in faceoffs in the first half of VMI's game at Army (Feb. 16), sophomore specialist Gaston Ledford went a sizzling 12-13 (.923) in the second half against the Black Knights. Ledford finished his day going 16-25 (.640). He grabbed a game-high 11 groundballs and was the only player in the game to reach double-digits.

The Kid-dets

VMI has one of the youngest rosters in the nation, with 73.0 percent of the team made up of freshmen (16) and sophomores (11). Of the over 60 teams currently at the NCAA Division I level, VMI has the highest percentage of its roster comprised of freshmen and sophomores, besting the University of Delaware's 71.7 percent and Stony Brook's 71.4 percent.

Youth Movement

VMI has a young team, but that has not stopped its youngster from contributing.

So far this season, VMI's freshmen and sophomores have chipped in 25 of the team's 54 goals, while accounting for an astounding 15 of the 24 assists. Over half of VMI's point production has come from the freshmen and sophomores, notching 40 points (25g, 15a) against a team total of 78 (54g, 24a). That's 51.3 percent of the offense from freshmen and sophomores.

Leading the charge for the youth movement is Mike DeBlasio, who has six goals and two helpers this season, bringing his career total to 22 goals and six assist (28p). Rookie Alex Henthorn is pacing the freshmen and sophomores this season in goals (7) while tying DeBlasio for total points (8).

Baby It's Cold Outside...

It has not exactly been warm during VMI's eight games so far this season. Just three games (Wagner, Canisius, Marist) have surpassed the 50 degree mark.

The average temperature of a VMI men's lacrosse game this season has been a balmy 42 degrees, with an average wind speed of just under nine miles per hour.

The coldest two games in 2013 have been the first two, at Navy and Army, with temperatures just above freezing at 33 degrees.

Big Man Between the Pipes

Senior goalkeeper Matt Lindemann stands at a towering 6-5, one of three players at that height on the team.

The human skyscraper uses that height to his advantage. Since the 2010 season, Lindemann has made 277 saves, averaging 12.6 stops per game. In his 22 games over that span, the Oakton, Va. native has had 16 games with double-digit saves, including a career-best 24 at No. 6 Virginia (Feb. 19).

The keeper has withstood a barrage of shots so far this season. He logged a career-best effort on Feb. 19 at Virginia, turning aside 24 shots, staring down 64 total Cavalier shots. Opponents have already launched 294 total shots in 2013.

There are 47 Division I goalkeepers who stand 6-2 or taller, and Lindemann is among the tallest. Of those 47, only six or 6-5 or taller, including two at 6-7. Lindemann is the tallest goalkeeper in the MAAC, with Detroit's Chris Kelly coming in second at 6-3.

One of the Best

Late in the third quarter of VMI's first home game of the year against Canisius, senior goalkeeper Matt Lindemann landed in the record books. He is now 10th all-time in career saves with 265, surpassing Jeff Neal (1997-2001), who had 241.

Up next on the all-time top-10 list for Lindemann is former teammate Kelly McMinn, who made 295 saves from 2009 until midway through last season.

Most remarkable about Lindemann landing in the record books is the relatively short amount of time he has accomplished the feat. Over the last two seasons, he has made over 200 of those stops.

Up, Up And Away!

So far this season, senior captain Russell East has logged six extra man goals, a third of his season goal total. The five EMO goals are a career-high for the Leesburg, Va. native.

In the March 30 game at Marist, East surpassed Drew Leonard's five for the most man-up tallies in the Brian Anken era (2011-present). Leonard notched his five in Anken's first season at VMI.

The last time a Keydet scored at least six man-up goals in a season was in 2009 when Tim Moran, older brother of current senior Tom Moran, put away six extra man markers. Should East score a man-up goal, he will tie three other Keydets (Tim Moran in 2008, Kevin Hill in 2007, Leo McInerney in 2005) with seven man-up goals in a single season since VMI joined the MAAC in 2003. (Man-up goals for 2003 currently unavailable)

Time Changes

VMI's game time for a trio of road games have shifted from 1 p.m., as originally listed, to noon.

The Keydets will now take on MAAC foes Detroit (Mar. 23), Marist (Mar. 30) and Siena (Apr. 27) at noon.

VMI's next home game against Jacksonville on April 6 has been moved to noon (12 p.m.). The game will still be played at Drill Field #2. The same parking regulations will apply.

Long and Winding Road

This season, the VMI team will face a big challenge very early: opening the season with six-straight road games.

This marks the most road games to open the season in program history, besting the mark from the 1988 season when the Keydets played on the road four times to start the year.

This season, VMI will head to Navy, Army, Virginia, Saint Joseph's, Lehigh and Wagner before

its first home game on Mar. 16 vs. Canisius. Over the span of those six road games, VMI will log nearly 4,000 miles round trip. VMI's six-game stretch is not the longest to open the season however, as Marquette University begins the year, and its program, with nine games away from Milwaukee, covering nearly 12,000 miles.

Growing Up So Fast...

With his most recent incoming class, which contains 16 rookies this year, head coach Brian Anken has certainly beefed up the roster, not only in total numbers, but in size as well.

This year's roster averages 71.7 inches, a shade under six feet in height. That average is up by nearly a half an inch from last season's average height of 71.3 inches.

Nearly half of the 2013 roster stands over six feet tall, with 17 Keydets hitting the mark. Of those 17, six are 6-3 or taller, including a trio of towers reaching 6-5 (Matt Lindemann, Alex Guyette and Gage Snowbarger).

Of the 17 six-footers, nine of them are newcomers to the squad, including Guyette and Snowbarger.

Oh Captain, My Captain.

Head coach Brian Anken has announced that this season his team will be led by a trio of captains. This year, seniors Russell East and Taylor Jenkins will be joined by junior Rory Dillon as the team's captains.

This marks this second time in Anken's tenure at the Institute that his team will have three captains. Last season, senior Stephen Robarge was VMI's lone captain while in Anken's first season, 2011, VMI was captained by Robarge, Keith Long and Lowell Patterson.

Come East, Young Man

Lacrosse is an ever expanding game. Currently, there are three players on the 2013 team that have come to Lexington from west of the Mississippi River.

Sophomore Luke Frizzell hails from Tulsa, Oklahoma. He is the first-ever VMI player from the Sooner State.

Alex Guyette is from Eden Park, Minnesota, the second player in the Brian Anken era to come to Lexington from Minnesota.

Gage Snowbarger is native to Aurora, Colorado. Like Guyette, Snowbarger is the second VMI player from his home state in the Anken Era.

O-K-L-A-H-O-M-A

Sophomore Luke Frizzell made program history against Wagner. After winning a faceoff and collecting the ensuing groundball, Frizzell charged through the Seahawk defense to score a goal late in fourth.

With that goal, Frizzell became the first VMI player in program history to hail from Oklahoma and score a goal. The Tulsa native notched his mark at the 3:14 mark of the fourth.

Breakout

On Saturday, Feb. 2, the 16 freshman made the transition from Rats (VMI speak for first-years) to officially becoming the Class of 2016 after completing the rigorous and physically demanding, yet rewarding, process of Break Out.

Stat Statin' is a Habit

While head coach Brian Anken believes that past accomplishments do not dictate future success, last season, VMI faceoff specialist Stephen Robarge was crowned as a statistical champion in groundballs per game (9.07) and faceoff winning percentage (66.6%).

Not only was Robarge a statistical champion for a second year in a row, but the Keydets were the nation's best faceoff team, winning 212 of 329 attempts (64.4%). It marked a third-consecutive season VMI finished in the top five nationally in the category.

Now in his 10th season as a head coach, Anken has three individual statistical champions to his credit. In addition to Robarge, Mike Doherty was a champion in groundballs per game, racking up 11.06 per game in 2008 when Anken was a head coach at Lycoming College. That same season, Anken coached Dan Cannon to a stat title in points per game, watching the attackman score 5.69 points per game.

Staying out of the Sin Bin

Last season, VMI was one of the least-penalized teams in the MAAC, taking just 53 time-serving penalties, amounting in just 41 minutes of time. VMI finished second in total penalties behind Canisius' 49, however, the Golden Griffis served the same amount of time.

Conversely, Detroit was the most-penalized team in the league, taking a whopping 93 penalties for over 80 minutes of time.

Since his arrival on Post, head coach Brian Anken's teams have reduced the number of penalties each season. In 2010, his first year, the team took 79 penalties for 67 minutes, followed by 73 (65 minutes) the next season.

Since beginning MAAC play in 2003, last season's 41 minutes of penalty time are the fewest in the last 10 seasons. Not only that, but 2012's 53 total penalties rank second-fewest in the same time span.

Anken in Extra Time

In his 10th year as a head coach at various programs, Brian Anken has now been involved in at least one overtime at every institute he has been a head man.

Having coached in six overtime games, Anken's squads have been a part of 10 total periods of overtime, including an epic three overtime thriller in his very first extra stanza game.

Greedy for Groundballs

In his first two seasons as the head man at VMI, Brian Anken's teams have collected 962 groundballs, averaging 35.6 per game. Opponents have managed to grab just 856, averaging 31.7 per contest in those 27 games.

Since 2007, only once has a Brian Anken-coached team allowed more groundballs than it has collected. That season was his first at Lycoming College in 2007. The Warriors were out-groundballed 540-488 that season. After that year, Anken's teams have out-groundballed opponents by a combined over 600 groundballs (2,841-2,224) from 2008-2012.

What's in a Name: Part Deux

For a second straight year, a VMI player has been named to Inside Lacrosse's annual All-Name Team.

This year, sophomore faceoff specialist Gaston Ledford became the first Keydet to earn a spot on the prestigious First Team All-Name Team. Last season, Anderson Caldwell, VMI's first-ever selection to the All-Name Team, was selected to the third team.

The Inside Lacrosse All-Name Team is selected annually and encompasses all three NCAA divisions and began in 2007.

CLEAR!

Since coming to VMI for the 2011 season, head coach Brian Anken has helped transform several parts of the Keydets' game, and none may be more obvious than the clearing game.

Since 2011, VMI has gained the offensive zone a staggering 79.7 percent of the time (423-531), including a hefty 85.2 percent last season (213-250).

Since VMI joined the MAAC in 2003, Brian Anken coached teams have the first and third highest clearing percentages for a season. In 2011, VMI cleared at a 76.0 percent clip (200-263).

In fact, over the last 20 years*, no VMI team has cleared at a better rate than the 2012 team. The second-highest clearing percentage since the 1993 season was in 1999 when the Keydets gained the zone 79.8 percent of the time.

Fifty Nifty United States

The 37 members of the 2013 VMI lacrosse team and its cadet director of lacrosse operations and its manager, is comprised of cadets from 13 different states and one from England.

As one would expect, Virginians make up a bulk of the roster, with 16. New York is second with five, New Jersey has four representatives while Maryland has three. North Carolina sent two of its own to play at VMI while there is one Keydet from each of Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Michigan, Minnesota, New Hampshire, Ohio and Oklahoma. Alex Henthorn hails from Chatham, England.

Landing in the Books

On March 31, junior Russell East and senior Stephen Robarge etched their names in the NCAA record books, scoring the fastest back-to-back goals for a team.

East buried VMI's first goal of the day against Marist at the 11:46 mark. Just four seconds later, capitalizing on a Red Fox face-off violation, Robarge charged down the field and right through the heart of the Marist defense and finding the back of the net. Robarge's goal came just 4.1 seconds after East's, besting the NCAA

Division I record of five seconds for fastest consecutive goals by the same team. The previous record was held by several other teams, including powerhouse Syracuse, who managed the feat of five seconds on three occasions.

Robarge and East's back-to-back goals were the fastest for the same team since Syracuse's Chris Daniello and Jeremy Thompson, also a face-off man, scored five seconds apart on March 7, 2010 against University of Virginia.

Keydets In the Pros

A pair of former VMI standouts, Stephen Robarge and Keith Long, were named to rosters in the Major League Lacrosse last year.

Robarge, one of the all-time greats at VMI, was named to the Denver Outlaws' squad last year. After his first weekend of action with the eventual MLL runner-up team, Robarge was named the MLL Rookie of the Week. The Third Team All-American earned the honor after winning 17 of his 30 faceoffs against the Long Island Lizards.

His classmate, Keith Long, was selected by the Rochester Rattlers in the Supplemental Draft in June. While Long did not see any game action, he was on hand for the team practices the night before games with the potential to dress.

Robarge Draft Results

History was made for VMI on Friday Jan. 13 as senior face-off specialist Stephen Robarge was announced as the 44th pick in the 2012 Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft.

The Lorton, Va. native was selected by the Denver Outlaws as the fourth pick in the sixth round, becoming the first-ever VMI player selected during the MLL Draft. Robarge was the only player from the MAAC selected this season.

The Denver Outlaws play at Sports Authority Field at Mile High, home of the NFL's Denver Broncos, for head coach John Stagnitta, formerly of Rutgers University.

Mowbray wasn't be the only Charlottesville, Va. native playing in Tuesday's game. Virginia's Owen Van Arsdale, son of assistant coach Marc, is also from Charlottesville, but played his high school lacrosse at St. Anne's-Belfield.

With his goal against UVa, Mowbray became the first player in program history to hail from Charlottesville and score on the Cavaliers.

VMI To Move to Atlantic Sun

Beginning in the 2013-14 academic year, the Virginia Military Institute men's lacrosse team will make the switch from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference to the Atlantic Sun Conference, a move that was announced Feb. 11 by the VMI athletic department and Atlantic Sun Conference.

Joining VMI in the Atlantic Sun will be full-time A-Sun members Jacksonville and Mercer, as well as affiliates Furman, High Point and Richmond.

The six teams will play a single round robin schedule, along with the championship to be scheduled in May of 2014. As a multi-sport conference, the A-Sun is immediately eligible for automatic qualification into the NCAA championship. The NCAA Championships Cabinet determines the format for NCAA championships.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. – Despite 17 saves from senior goalkeeper Matt Lindemann, the Virginia Military Institute men's lacrosse team fell 20-7 to the United States Naval Academy in the 2013 season opener. Of its seven goals, three Keydets accounted for four assisted at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium Saturday afternoon.

In freezing temperatures and a windchill in the low 20s, 12 different Midshipmen scored on Saturday. Austin Heneveld led the game with two goals and four assists for six points while teammate Sam Jones and Erik Hoffstadt each had a hat trick along with an assist for four points apiece. Patrick Keena and Pat Durkin logged three points each, Keena with a goal and two assists while Durkin struck twice with once helper.

VMI's offense was paced by Russell East and Mike DeBlasio, who each scored two goals. Bernie Mowbray, Alex Henthorn and long stick midfielder Ty Trobridge accounted for the other three Keydet tallies. Attackman Eric Groleau had two assists, dishing once to East and DeBlasio. Trobridge's goal came in transition after a successful clear attempt.

In goal, Lindemann's 17 saves marked the eighth time in the last nine games that the 6-5 keeper made double digit saves and second straight game, dating back to the 2012 season finale, Lindemann made 17 saves.

Opposite Lindemann, Nolan Hickey got the win for Navy (1-0) while playing in 45 minutes, stopping five VMI attempts. John Connors came in to relieve Hickey in the fourth quarter, making another five saves, before he too was spelled by Paul Zimmerman for the final 1:25 of the game.

Navy's up-tempo offense rattled off 58 shots, the most VMI has allowed since allowing Siena College 57 in last season's meeting. The Keydets took just 26 shots and were held without double digit shots until the fourth quarter when they took 11. Navy posted double figure attempts in all four quarters of the game.

WEST POINT, N.Y. – The Virginia Military Institute men's lacrosse team gave the United States Military Academy all it could handle Saturday afternoon at Michie Stadium. But a four-goal fourth quarter surged the Black Knights past the Keydets 14-8 in a nonconference matchup.

With less than 10 minutes to play, the Keydets trailed by just two goals against an Army team that received votes in the USILA Preseason Coaches' Poll. But four Black Knight goals in the final seven minutes of the game sealed VMI's fate.

VMI's offense was led by senior Russell East, who logged three goals and had one assist. Junior Bernie Mowbray was the only other Keydet with multiple goals, striking twice while also logging one helper. The Black Knights opted to use two keepers, with Sam Somers starting the game, while Bobby Sincero played the final 30 minutes. The starter made just one save while allowing four goals. CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. – Despite a career-best 24 saves in goal from senior Matt Lindemann, the Virginia Military Institute men's lacrosse team could not stave off a potent University of Virginia team, currently ranked No. 6 in the USILA poll. The Cavaliers took the win 18-4 at Klöckner Stadium in a midweek game Tuesday night.

Virginia attackman Mark Cockerton led the game with six goals while fellow attackman Nick O'Reilly notched a hat trick and had one assist. Owen Van Arsdale score twice and had two helpers for a four-point day. The Cavalier's starting attack accounted for nearly two thirds of UVa's scoring for the evening.

VMI's night was led by four different goal scorers. Senior Russell East scored a goal in his 11th straight game, while sophomore Mike DeBlasio got his scoring back on track after not scoring last weekend at Army. Bernie Mowbray, who is from Charlottesville, led all Keydets with two points on one goal and an assist. Freshman Jay Hill scored his first college goal while sophomore Eric Groleau had one assist.

The story of the night came from between the Keydets' goal posts. Lindemann, who is one of the tallest goalkeepers in the country, posted a career best 24 saves, eclipsing his mark of 20 set last season against Siena College. His stops against Virginia are the most by a Keydet keeper since Feb. 18, 2012 when former VMI player Kelly McMinn made 22 at Army. Lindemann has already amassed 60 saves on the season, averaging 20 per game.

It was another grinding day for sophomore faceoff specialist Gaston Ledford, who went 12-26, but forced the Cavaliers to trot out four different players to attempt the draw. Ledford led the VMI field players with six groundballs while Lindemann accounted for seven. Virginia defenseman Scott McWilliams tied Lindemann for the game-high.

PHILADELPHIA – It was a two-goal game early in the fourth quarter, but the Virginia Military Institute lacrosse team fell victim to a five-goal surge over the final nine minutes of its game against the Saint Joseph's University Hawks, falling 10-3 Saturday afternoon at Finnesey Field.

It was a defensive battle in the first three quarters of the game, with each team scoring once in the third quarter. But the Hawks broke the game open in the fourth quarter after VMI's Russell East pulled the Keydets back within one on an extra man goal.

VMI got its goals from three different players, including East's extra man effort. Sophomores Mike DeBlasio and Eric Groleau accounted for VMI's other two goals while junior Bernie Mowbray had the only assist on the day.

The Hawks got a pair of goals from Josh Cavanaugh, while eight other Saint Joseph's players scored.. Cavanaugh finished with two assists as well, turning in four points on his afternoon. Michael Dougherty and Rob Watts each scored once and had one assist.
