Brian Anken enter his fourth season in Lexington as the head man of the VMI Keydets lacrosse program for the 2013-14 academic year, after being hired on July 30, 2010.

In his first year on Post, the Keydets captured the first team statistical championship in VMI lacrosse history, beating out NCAA Champion Virginia to lead the nation in ground balls per game with 39.62. Coming out of his second season, Anken once again helped lead the Keydets to the national stats rankings, claiming the team face-off winning percentage of 64.4 (212-329). He also saw Stephen Robarge become the first player to win back-to-back groundballs per game (9.07) titles, as well as the individual face-off percentage (66.6) crown for a second straight season.

Following his second season in Lexington, Anken helped the Keydets double their win total from 2011, while also collecting his first Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference victory, 9-7 on the road against Manhattan. After a slow start to the season, Anken and the Keydets bounced back, winning four of their last eight games, including three of the last four. Not only did VMI begin winning, but they hung in games as well, including falling by just three combined goals to the two teams that reached the MAAC title game. Anken moved to the offensive side of the ball in 2012, and with solid results. In conference games, the Keydets finished with the program's second-best goals per game average in MAAC tilts, putting away 10.33 per game, the best since 2005 when VMI posted 10.62 a MAAC game.

After never having a player drafted under Anken's guidance, or any VMI lacrosse player, two Keydets were selected by Major League Lacrosse teams in the same calendar year. In January, 2012, VMI history was made as Robarge became the first VMI player to be drafted by Major League Lacrosse. Robarge was selected in the sixth round and 44th overall by the Denver Outlaws, one of the top teams in the league. Following the season, Robarge's teammate Keith Long was picked up by the Rochester Rattlers in June in the Supplemental Draft. The pair were two of only three MAAC players to be picked up during the 2011-12 academic year.

Prior to working at Lycoming, Anken had been the head man at Mars Hill College in North Carolina, where he helped the team post a five and a half game improvement in the standings during his final year, 2006. He earned conference Coach of the Year honors in 2004. He was also the founder and director of the Lions Lacrosse Camp, and handled game and event management as well.

Anken broke into the coaching ranks with Pfeiffer in 2001, where he was the program's top assistant. There, he was responsible for the defensive side of the ball, along with goalies. He also handled recruiting in Maryland, New York and New Jersey before leaving in 2001 to join the Rochester Institute of Technology, where again, he handled the defense and goalies. During his three years in Rochester, Anken was also an assistant to the school's Athletic Association Director of Development.

In his career, Anken has coached a pair of NCAA Division III statistical champions. He has also mentored two conference Freshman of the Year and one Player of the Year, and in nine seasons as a head coach, he has had 23 all-conference players and two All-Americans in Stephen Robarge (VMI 2012) and Andrew Chapman (Mars Hill 2006). Anken is a member of the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association's (USILA) Rankings and All-American Committees, as well as being a part of the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee.

In September 2012, Anken married his wife, Mandy. The couple reside in Lexington.

Curtis Jaques begins his fifth season on the sidelines as an assistant coach for the VMI lacrosse team, a program near and dear to the 2007 alumnus.

In September 2013, Jaques was elevated to associate head coach as he begins his fourth season on staff with head coach Brian Anken.

Jaques' returned to his alma mater on Sept. 9, 2009. Jaques served as interim head coach during the summer of 2010 while a nationally search was conducted that resulted in the hiring of Brian Anken took place.

In year one under Anken, Jaques worked primarily with the team's offense, playing a major role in the emergence of junior Drew Leonard, who tallied 31 goals, the most since Leo McNerney's 34 in 2005. Also, Jaques also engineered an extremely balanced offense, as 18 Keydets scored at least one goal on the season, a school record. He also serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Switching ends of the field for his third season, Jaques worked closely with the offensive unit, helping revamp the offense and its production. Jaques implemented an offense that averaged 10.33 goals per game in MAAC action, a full goal better than the 2011 campaign and the program's best since 2005. The Keydet offense buried 62 goals in conference play in 2012, the most since 2008. Jaques was also responsible for the team's top offensive producer, Keith Long, who became the first Keydet to earn MAAC First Team plaudits since Tim Moran in 2010. Long was later selected by the Rochester Rattlers of Major League Lacrosse in the Supplemental Draft. He was the second VMI player in program history to be selected by an MLL team, joining classmate Stephen Robarge, who was taken in the Collegiate Draft by the Denver Outlaws.

"Curtis is an outstanding coach who has played an important part in our new level of success in recruiting," said Anken of his top assistant. "We are bringing in large talented classes of cadet-athletes that truly understand what it takes to be successful at VMI. Having him on board as a coach, as well as an alumnus, has helped us embrace our past traditions while making important changes for our future success. In addition to his recruiting responsibilities, Curtis has helped design and implement a new up-tempo offense that will become a staple of our program for many years to come."

Jaques returned to VMI after a two-year stint at SUNY Geneseo, where he worked with the defense and served as top assistant to head coach Jim Lyons. At Geneseo, Jaques helped guide the squad to a No. 13 ranking in the final 2009 USILA Division III poll. The team also went undefeated in regular season conference (SUNYAC) play, before falling to No. 7 Cortland in the title game, 14-13.

Jaques graduated from the Institute in 2007 with a double major in International Studies and Modern Languages and Culture (German). He was a team captain in 2007, and was the Keydets' No. 1 defenseman during then-coach Jeff Shirk's first campaign in Lexington, when Jaques was named preseason All-MAAC selection as well.

"It's an honor to continue to coach at my alma mater, and give back to the place that has given me so much," offered Jaques. "I was once a rat, I pushed on the same stoops, climbed the same mud hill as our current cadet-athletes and now I wear my ring with pride. The VMI lacrosse program will certainly be heard from today. Rah, Virginia Mil."

College athletics runs through the Jaques family. Ali Jaques, Curtis' older sister, was a former student-athlete on the New York University women's basketball team, where she helped her team to a national championship in 1997. Ali is currently the head women's basketball coach at Siena College in Loudonville, N.Y. Sidney, the youngest of the Jaques family, recently graduated from Scranton University where she was a standout women's basketball player. Curtis' older brother, Parker, was a wide receiver on the University of Rochester football team.

A native of Rosemont, N.J., Jaques now resides in Lexington with his wife, Alecia. The couple welcomed their daughter, Ava, into the world in on March 27, 2013.



After joining the staff early in 2013, **Michael Grimm** will enter his second season as an assistant coach at VMI. Last season, Grimm served as volunteer assistant, with his coaching responsibilities including working with the goalkeepers, in-game quality control and serving as the ROTC liaison. Grimm's primary function at VMI is as a State Faculty Instructor in the Marshall-New Market Battalion of the Army ROTC Department.

Grimm's duties for the 2013-14 academic year will include working closely with the program's storied faceoff unit, as well as the offense. During games, Grimm's primary responsibilities will be running the substitution box.

Prior to his arrival at VMI, Grimm served as the head lacrosse coach at The Citadel for two seasons from 2011-12. During that time, Grimm rebuilt the program, from recruiting to fundraising. In his final year at The Citadel, his squad earned a berth in the SELC Tournament. He recruited cadet-athletes representing 11 different states while also developing the Special Operations Warrior Foundation game between The Citadel and VMI that raised \$10,000 for Special Operations families.

A former Staff Sergeant in the US Army from 2002-11, Grimm served in the 1st Ranger Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment and Special Operations. He was deployed eight times in support of the Global War On Terrorism in both Iraq and Afghanistan. His military awards include Army Commendation Medal with Valor Device and two Oak Leaves, Iraq Campaign Medal with two Campaign Stars, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with Bronze Arrowhead and four Campaign Stars, Joint Service Commendation Medal and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal.

Grimm attended Georgia Military College in 1997 and played WR for the fifth-ranked Junior College team, earning Player of the Game honors in the 1997 Macon Touchdown Classic versus Middle Georgia College. After that season, Grimm transferred to The Citadel, Military College of the South with the class of 2002, and was a walk on wide receiver and played two years of lacrosse as a midfielder. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in American history. Grimm was a member of the Veteran Cadet program at The Citadel and American Military University.

Prior to his time at Georgia Military College and The Citadel, Grimm was a three sport athlete at Kecoughtan High School in Hampton, Va.

Military schools and the Army run in the Grimm family. His father, Skip, is a retired Major and graduated from the United States Military Academy (Army) in 1976. His uncles Jeff Grimm graduated from West Point in 1974 while Edward Brennan did likewise in 1976. A strong VMI connection runs through the family as his uncle, LTC (ret) David Grimm is a 1986 graduate of the Institute.

Grimm has two children Audrey Claire (9) and William (5).



After a season away from Post, **Keith Long** returned to the lacrosse program as an assistant coach in the fall of 2013.

Long, a 2012 graduate of the Institute, returns to Post after coaching his high school alma mater, Falls Church, where he served as an assistant coach for the varsity team and the head coach for the junior varsity squad. He will be working with Jaques and Grimm on the offensive side of the field, specifically with the midfielders.

One of VMI's all-time top offensive threats, Long became VMI's 16th player in the 100-point club and is ranked 14th all-time in career points. With back-to-back 40-point seasons in 2011 and 2012, Long capped his career with 107 career points on a balanced 55 goals and 52 assists. In 2012, he led VMI in all three scoring categories with 42 points on 24 goals and 18 assists. He also led the Institute in assists as a junior with 22.

Long is ranked fifth all-time at VMI with 56 points in Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference games, netting 30 league goals and 26 assists. He is sixth all-time with 30 MAAC goals and fifth with 26 conference assists. In his senior season, Long became the first Keydet to be named first team All-MAAC since Tim Moran in 2010.

Following graduation, Long was taken by the Rochester Rattlers of Major League Lacrosse in the Supplemental Draft. He has spent the last two seasons on the Rattlers' practice roster.

LEXINGTON, Va. -- The Virginia Military Institute men's lacrosse team was the victim of a second-quarter surge Sunday afternoon at Drill Field #2 as the visiting Bears of Mercer University took down the Keydets 16-8. Mercer out-scored VMI 6-1 in the second to put VMI in a 9-2 hole at halftime.

The loss was in spite of a very close second half, which saw VMI put away six goals against Mercers seven. But the damage had been done during the second quarter, during which Mercer scored six times while VMI potted just one goal.

VMI's offensive efforts were led by a pair of three point days from senior Russell East and freshman Gage Snowbarger, both of whom tallied two goals and had one assist. Junior Bernie Mowbray netted a pair of tallied while Domenick Stumpo took advantage of a scrum on the crease for his lone goal. Sophomore Mike DeBlasio put away a goal midway through the fourth quarter.

Predictably, Mercer was led by its leading scorers, Chris Baxa and Zack Ward. The leading duo combined for eight goals, each scoring four, while also having one helper apiece. Cole Branch finished with three goals and one assist as Harry Baker tallied a pair. John Avent and Keoni Rausch each scored once. Eoin Collins was the game's leading assister with three. Timmy Geran had two helpers as Clay Rivers and Wilton McKown had one assist each.

In goal, it was another standout day for VMI's senior netminder Matt Lindemann. The 6-5 backstop made 14 saves, including eight in the second half which included several shots from in close. With his 10th double-digit save effort of the season, Lindemann moved into eighth place all-time at VMI with 310 career saves. The Oakton, Va. native has 167 saves on the season, the most by a Keydet since Brian Ward made 169 in 2002.

National Rankings - March 9

As a team, VMI is currently ranked 10th in the country in caused turnovers per game, forcing opponents into 9.86 per game. Junior defenseman Tyler Prasnicky is currently ranked fifth in the country and second in the Atlantic Sun in the same category, forcing 2.57 opponent errors per game. Freshman Tom Brown is 15th nationally with 2.0 per game.

Junior goalkeeper Evan Windisch is ranked 16th in the country in saves per game, making an average of 11.57 per game.

It's Coming...

After suffering early losses by a big margin, the Keydets have reeled teams in lately. The team record may not reflect that, but three of the team's last four games have been decided by two goals or less. VMI is 1-3 during that stretch with the win over Air Force (3/2).

Going Up!

VMI's offense got off to a slow start, but it has continued to improve with each game. In the Feb. 23 National Statistics rankings, VMI averaged 5.67 goals per game. In this week's edition, VMI has jumped to 6.29.

The Keydets have also improved their groundballs per game over four points, averaging 25.67 in the Feb. 23 stats ranks and 29.29 in the most recent rankings. VMI has gone from being ranked 48th in groundballs per game to 29th this week.

50 Nifty Points of Mickey Hofmeister

During VMI's Atlantic Sun opener at High Point, senior captain Mickey Hofmeister surpassed the 50-point milestone. His goal at the 13:02 mark in the third quarter gave the Williamsburg, Va. native his 50th career point.

Hofmeister has battled the injury bug during his time at VMI and has been healthy for just one full season as a Keydet, his freshman campaign (2011). Overcoming the injuries, Hofmeister averages 2.0 points per game with a balanced 24 goals and 28 assists in 26 games.

It's Been Four Already?

On Wednesday, the Keydets played their fourth home game of the season. Last season, VMI did not play its fourth until April 20 after starting the season on the road for the first six games.

Dan Cannon - Hall of Famer

Early in March, head coach Brian Anken received excellent news from Williamsport, Pa.; one of his former players was to be inducted into the Lycoming College Athletics Hall of Fame.

Dan Cannon, a 2008 graduate of the College, becomes the fourth men's lacrosse player to be named to the Hall of Fame.

In 2008, Cannon lead Division III in points per game with a whopping 5.69 average. A balanced player, Cannon finished his career with 156 points, 91 of which came during his senior campaign with 47 goals and 44 assists.

A Middle Atlantic Conference All-Century selection, Cannon helped lead the University of Guelph to a Baggataway Cup, the national championship for the Canadian University Field Lacrosse Association, as an assistant coach in 2013.

First Win Over an Academy

On March 2, playing under the difficult circumstances of playing in consecutive games, the Keydets did something no other team in program history had done: beat a service academy.

The Keydets needed just six goals to beat the United States Air Force Academy, just 24 hours after falling 8-6 in a back-and-forth game with University of Detroit.

VMI's win over Air Force was not only the team's first over Air Force, but Army and Navy as well.

As an Institution, VMI is now 2-0 in Lexington against the Air Force Academy, including a 71-63 win at Cameron Hall in the All-Military Classic title game.

If Six is what it takes... I'll Take It

With VMI's 6-4 win over Air Force, the Keydets won their first game of the 2014 season, snapping a five-game skid dating back to 2013.

The six goals were the second-fewest needed by VMI in program history to collect a win, trailing a 5-4 double overtime win over Limestone in 1994, also on North Post at Patchin Field.

VMI's six goals are tied for the fewest goals needed for a win in Division I this season, drawing even with a 6-4 Bucknell win over Delaware and a 6-5 UMass win over Army. Both of those games were played on February 8.

You'll Get Four and Like It

VMI held Air Force to just four goals Sunday afternoon, including a scoreless third quarter and a one-goal second half.

The four goals were the fewest allowed by a VMI defense since a 15-4 win over Presbyterian in 2008.

Windisch and Mattice Honored

Junior goalkeeper Evan Windisch and freshman Dale Mattice were named the Atlantic Sun Defensive and Offensive Player of the Week, respectively, on Monday afternoon.

Windisch earned the honor after making 33 saves in two games against Detroit and Air Force, including 19 in the former. He earned VMI's first-ever win over a Service Academy as well.

Mattice scored what proved to be the game-winning goal, the first of his career, against Air Force, while also potting an insurance goal late in fourth. He assisted the goal that gave VMI a lead it would not relinquish.

Home, Sweet Home

This season, the Keydets will enjoy seven games at home, as opposed to last season when a very road-heavy schedule challenged VMI. In 2013, VMI hosted just four home games, with the first event in Lexington not coming until March 16 - the seventh game of the season.

This year however, VMI's first home game will be on Feb. 15 against another service academy in Army. That game will be the earliest VMI has ever hosted a game in program history, surpassing the last time the Keydets and Black Knights got together in Lexington, Feb. 19, 2011.

Twice Is Nice

The Keydets will play two games at home this weekend, taking on former MAAC foe Detroit on Saturday and Air Force on Sunday.

The back-to-back games mark the first time since the 1993 season VMI will play two games in two days. It will also be the first time for a pair of home games. In 1993, VMI played Marist and Lehigh in Richmond, Va. VMI dropped those games 14-13 and 16-5, respectively.

Saturday and Sunday's games will be the fourth time in program history VMI will play back-to-back. The Keydets did likewise in 1989 and 19991 as well.

VMI is 2-4 when playing back-to-back games.

Bright Lights of Lax Vegas

This season, the Keydets will host two night games at Drill Field #2, welcoming Vermont on March 5 and Wagner on March 18. Both games are slated to begin at 7 p.m.

The contest against Vermont, VMI's first against the Catamounts since 2010, will be the first-ever night lacrosse game played on Post since the program's inception in 1983.

Fountain of Youth...

This season's roster boasts 16 newcomers to the Institute, making the Keydets one of the youngest teams in the country. Only 10 other programs have more freshmen, including conference foes Furman (46) and Richmond (22). Five other programs have 16 rookies.

...But Youthfully Experienced

Despite the large number of freshmen on the roster, VMI's junior class makes up nearly a quarter of the team. Those seven players have combined to make 94 appearances in just two seasons, including one player who has battled injury and another battling goalie depth.

The Keydets sophomores gained valuable experience last season as well, making a combined 67 appearances for the eight-man class.

All-Academies

During 2014, the Keydets will play all three Division I service academies, opening with Navy on Feb. 8, hosting Army on Feb. 15 and Air Force on March 2. It is the first time in program history the Keydets will take on all three academies in the same year, and is believed to be the same for VMI's team sports, dating back to the mid-1890s.

VMI won't be the first program to manage the feat, but it's not an every-year occurrence. This year's feat to play all three service academies in the same season will be the 11th. Both Bucknell and Maryland have done it three times, while Georgetown, Hofstra, Lehigh and Rutgers have each done it once.

Last season, Lehigh played all three service academies as well as VMI, playing all four Division I service academies and military college in the same season, the only known occurrence.

Obviously, Army can't play Army, and the same for Navy and Air Force. But three times Army has played Navy and Air Force in the same season as playing VMI, while the Falcons have played Army and Navy three times as well as the Keydets in the same year.

Life After Lacrosse

While it is not mandatory for VMI cadets to commission into the armed services after graduation, as it is at the academies, the lacrosse program prides itself on being one of the highest commissioning teams on Post. This season's roster features 11 cadet-athletes who will join a branch after graduation. Eight will join the Army, while one each will commission into the Marines, Navy and Air Force. Each of the commissioning players wears a patch on the left sleeve of his uniform with his branch. The remaining players on the team all sport Wounded Warrior Project patches, a program near and dear to the program. Below is a list of the players, their class year and branch.

Ranked By Inside Lacrosse

Freshman close defenseman Tom Brown was ranked as the No. 33 defenseman in this year's crop of freshmen, according to Inside Lacrosse's recruiting experts. It is believed that he is the first such player to come to VMI.

'17! '17! '17!

On February 1, the 16 freshmen, then called Rats, on VMI's roster experienced a right of passage at the Institute: Breakout. A day-long grind of physical tests, including a ruck and hike to McKethan Park, pushing a rugby hitting sled up a hill, sprints up steeply-graded Hospital Hill and more, the object to bring what was known as the Class of 2014+3 together into one class, now known as the Class of 2017. The 16 freshmen are now officially members of that class and Brother Rats (classmates) for life.

High Noon

The Keydets' first five games in 2014 will face off at Noon and the whole schedule features nine noon draws. VMI has two night games at 7 p.m. and two mid-afternoon games at 1 p.m. and 2 p.m.

Me, You? You, Me?

On Feb. 8 at the Naval Academy, senior Mickey Hofmeister and junior Mike DeBlasio combined to score all five VMI goals. The pair of attackmen scored once with the other on the back end with the assist.

It's not the first time Hofmeister and DeBlasio have gotten the goal/assist combination. Twice during the 2012 season DeBlasio scored with a Hofmeister assist. The latter missed all of 2013 with a lower body injury.

Pardon Our Progress

The home field for the VMI lacrosse team is getting a facelift this season. Those who have been to Drill Field #2 before can expect to see changes as the season progresses. A portable press box will be located between the teams on the Barracks side of the field, while a scoreboard is to be installed on the fan side by the stairs. There will also be a 70-foot flag pole installed between the two mast lights near the Woods Creek Trail. During these projects, we ask fans to be understanding of the construction as it gets underway.

The Difference Is Night and Day

VMI struggled to clear the ball in its season-opening game at Navy, gaining the zone just 60 percent of the time (15-25). In the Keydets' home-opener against Army however, VMI cleared at an 83.3 percent clip (25-30), including a perfect eight-for-eight in the first quarter.

10s Up

Junior goalkeeper Evan Windisch must enjoy listening to the rock band Pearl Jam's debut album "Ten". Earlier this season, Windisch made 10 saves in each of his first two starts.

Penalty Free Is The Way To Be

During the season-opening game at Navy, the Keydets played the full 60 minutes without taking a single penalty, an impressive feat in the college game today. VMI was the only team in the newly formed Atlantic Sun Conference to not take a penalty yet this season.

Conversely, High Point has taken the most penalties in the conference so far this season, with 10 through two games. Furman has taken four while Jacksonville and Mercer have taken three apiece. The Spiders of Richmond took two in the program's first-ever game.

There's a First For Everything

Several Keydets logged firsts against Navy in the season opener. Sophomore attackman Ben Huger made his first career start against the Mids, as did freshmen midfielders Brad Nardella, Nick Dodd, Dale Mattice and defensemen Tom Brown. Between the pipes, junior Evan Windisch made the first start of his VMI career. Freshman Mitch Wilson took the first faceoffs of his collegiate career while junior Andrew Erber stepped on the field for the first time after battling injury early in his career.

Sunday, Sunday

Last Sunday's game was the first time since 2011 the Keydets take the field on Sunday. Under head coach Brian Anken, VMI is 0-1 on Sundays, with the loss 13-12 against Jacksonville on April 24, 2011, played at SprinTurf Field, now called Fiorini Field.

Thrice Is Nice

So far this season, two Keydets have logged hat tricks and four-point games. Junior captain Mike DeBlasio kicked things off against Navy with a trio of goals and an assist while teammate Mickey Hofmeister completed the feat against Army in the Keydets' home-opener and adding an assist.

Game #1 - Feb. 8

ANNAPOLIS, Md. - The Virginia Military Institute men's lacrosse team opened its 2014 season on Saturday, taking on the United States Naval Academy for a seventh-straight season as the opener. The Midshipmen won 18-5 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in non-conference action.

The Keydets (0-1) got a one-two punch from senior Mickey Hofmeister and junior Mike DeBlasio, two of the team's three captains this season. DeBlasio notched three goals, the fifth hat trick of his career, while Hofmeister potted a pair. The two attackmen assisted each other once. Hofmeister's goals were his first since Apr. 14, 2012 after missing all of 2013 with a lower body injury.

The Mids (1-0) jumped out to a 10-goal lead before halftime, sparked by 10 points from Sam Jones on four goals and six assists. Tucker Hall scored three times and had two assists for five points on the day. Pat Durkin netted two goals and had one assist as Patrick Keena had one goal and one assist. Six other Mids scored goals while another had one assist each.

The Keydets struggled in clearing, gaining the zone 15 times on 25 attempts. Navy cleared 21 of their 25 tries, including several in odd-number situations that led to goals. VMI lost the ground ball game, collecting 27 against Navy's 44. The Mids won the faceoff game as well, taking 21 of the 27 attempts.

A team that pressures heavily on defense, the Keydets did not take a penalty. The Midshipmen were penalized three times, including a pair on Colin Flounlacker that resulted in a two-minute extra-man opportunity for VMI. DeBlasio's third goal of the day came during the two minute man-up period.
