Brian Anken begins his fifth season in Lexington as the head man of the VMI Keydets lacrosse program for the 2015 season, after being hired on July 30, 2010.

In his first year on Post, the Keydets captured the first team statistical championship in VMI lacrosse history, beating out NCAA Champion Virginia to lead the nation in ground balls per game with 39.62. Coming out of his second season, Anken once again helped lead the Keydets to the national stats rankings, claiming the team face-off winning percentage of 64.4 (212-329). He also saw Stephen Robarge become the first player to win back-to-back groundballs per game (9.07) titles, as well as the individual face-off percentage (66.6) crown for a second straight season.

Following his second season in Lexington, Anken helped the Keydets double their win total from 2011, while also collecting his first Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference victory, 9-7 on the road against Manhattan. After a slow start to the season, Anken and the Keydets bounced back, winning four of their last eight games, including three of the last four. Not only did VMI begin winning, but they hung in games as well, including falling by just three combined goals to the two teams that reached the MAAC title game. Anken moved to the offensive side of the ball in 2012, and with solid results. In conference

games, the Keydets finished with the program's second-best goals per game average in MAAC tilts, putting away 10.33 per game, the best since 2005 when VMI posted 10.62 a MAAC game.

After never having a player drafted under Anken's guidance, or any VMI lacrosse player, two Keydets were selected by Major League Lacrosse teams in the same calendar year. In January, 2012, VMI history was made as Robarge became the first VMI player to be drafted by Major League Lacrosse. Robarge was selected in the sixth round and 44th overall by the Denver Outlaws, one of the top teams in the league. Following the season, Robarge's teammate Keith Long was picked up by the Rochester Rattlers in June in the Supplemental Draft. The pair were two of only three MAAC players to be picked up during the 2011-12 academic year.

The highlight of the 2014 campaign was the Keydets topping the United States Air Force Academy 6-4 on March 2, the first time in program history the Keydets not only beat Air Force, but bested a Division I Service Academy. Not only was it a milestone in program history, but came just 24 hours after the Keydets suffered an 8-6 home loss against the University of Detroit Mercy as part of VMI's record-setting Wounded Warrior Project weekend. The Keydets' 2-12 overall record was not indictive of how close the games were as VMI beat two teams that reached the NCAA tournament, Richmond and Air Force, and held opponents to single-digit goals six times.

Prior to working at Lycoming, Anken had been the head man at Mars Hill College in North Carolina, where he helped the team post a five and a half game improvement in the standings during his final year, 2006. He earned conference Coach of the Year honors in 2004. He was also the founder and director of the Lions Lacrosse Camp, and handled game and event management as well.

Anken broke into the coaching ranks with Pfeiffer in 2001, where he was the program's top assistant. There, he was responsible for the defensive side of the ball, along with goalies. He also handled recruiting in Maryland, New York and New Jersey before leaving in 2001 to join the Rochester Institute of Technology, where again, he handled the defense and goalies. During his three years in Rochester, Anken was also an assistant to the school's Athletic Association Director of Development.

In his career, Anken has coached a pair of NCAA Division III statistical champions. He has also mentored two conference Freshman of the Year and one Player of the Year, and in nine seasons as a head coach, he has had 23 all-conference players and two All-Americans in Stephen Robarge (VMI 2012) and Andrew Chapman (Mars Hill 2006). Anken is a member of the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association's (USILA) Rankings and All-American Committees, as well as being a part of the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee.

In September 2012, Anken married his wife, Mandy. The couple reside in Lexington. The couple welcomed their first child, Parker, to the world in July 2014.

After joining the staff early in 2013, *Michael Grimm* begins his third season as an assistant coach at VMI. Last season, Grimm served as volunteer assistant, with his coaching responsibilities including working with the goalkeepers, in-game quality control and serving as the ROTC liaison. Grimm's primary function at VMI is as a State Faculty Instructor in the Marshall-New Market Battalion of the Army ROTC Department.

Last season while working closely with the team's goalies, Grimm saw the Keydets hold opponents to double-digit goals on six occasions, including the historic 6-4 win over the United States Air Force Academy. VMI also claimed a 7-6 double overtime victory over eventual Atlantic Sun Conference champion, University of Richmond behind 13 saves from then-junior keeper Evan Windisch.

Prior to his arrival at VMI, served as the head lacrosse coach at The Citadel for two seasons from 2011-12. During that time, Grimm rebuilt the program, from recruiting to fundraising. In his final year at The Citadel, his squad earned a berth in the SELC Tournament. He recruit-

ed cadet-athletes representing 11 different states while also developing the Special Operations Warrior Foundation game between The Citadel and VMI that raised \$10,000 for Special Operations families.

A former Staff Sergeant in the US Army from 2002-11, Grimm served in the 1st Ranger Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment and Special Operations. He was deployed eight times in support of the Global War On Terrorism in both Iraq and Afghanistan. His military awards include Army Commendation Medal with Valor Device and two Oak Leaves, Iraq Campaign Medal with two Campaign Stars, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with Bronze Arrowhead and four Campaign Stars, Joint Service Commendation Medal and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal.

Grimm attended Georgia Military College in 1997 and played wide receiver for the fifth-ranked Junior College team, earning Player of the Game honors in the 1997 Macon Touchdown Classic versus Middle Georgia College. After that season, Grimm transferred to The Citadel, Military College of the South with the class of 2002, and was a walk on wide receiver and played two years of lacrosse as a midfielder. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in American history. Grimm was a member of the Veteran Cadet program at The Citadel and American Military University.

Prior to his time at Georgia Military College and The Citadel, Grimm was a three sport athlete at Kecoughtan High School in Hampton, Va.

Military schools and the Army run in the Grimm family. His father, Skip, is a retired Major and graduated from the United States Military Academy (Army) in 1976. His uncles Jeff Grimm graduated from West Point in 1974 while Edward Brennan did likewise in 1976. A strong VMI connection runs through the family as his uncle, LTC (ret) David Grimm is a 1986 graduate of the Institute.

Grimm has two children Audrey Claire (9) and William (5).





In June 2014, *Bobby Downes* was named volunteer assistant coach by Brian Anken, who concluded his fourth season at the helm of the program. In the fall of 2014, Downes was elevated to an assistant coach.

The newly-minted assistant coach joins VMI after a serving as an assistant coach at the Florida Institute of Technology, working with head coach Ryan McAleavey and the Panthers for the 2014 season.

Downes' duties will include working with VMI's storied faceoff unit and coordinating video, including practice and game film.

Downes joined the Florida Tech coaching staff in May of 2013 after a stellar playing career at NCAA Division II Florida Southern College in Lakeland, Florida.

During his year in Melbourne, Florida, Downes worked primarily with faceoff specialist Travis Wunder and was vital in the freshman earning All-SSC Honorable Mention honors. Wunder set Florida Tech records in single game faceoff wins, single season faceoff wins and faceoff percentage. Against Belmont Abbey College, Wunder recorded 22 faceoff wins and has the top seven marks in a single game in school history. His 131 faceoff wins are the most by any Panther and his 56 percent faceoff wins percentage is also tops in Florida Tech history. Against Brevard College, Ben Abell transitioned to faceoffs and went 2-for-2 at center field.

In the summer of 2013, he instructed attack fundamentals for the University of Denver Pioneers Camp, instructed midfield fundamentals for Princeton University's Lacrosse Camp and coached a team in the Top 205 Lacrosse Camp.

Downes was a game day intern for the Boston Cannons in the summers of 2008-2012. The Cannons, a Major League Lacrosse organization that plays all home games in Harvard Stadium in Boston, Mass., hosted the 2011 MLL All-Star Game. There, Downes assisted with game statistics, shot clock, player autograph sessions pre/post game and fan zone set ups. He also assisted with statistics for the 2008 and 2010 MLL All-Star games and the 2012 MLL Championship Weekend.

He was a volunteer assistant lacrosse coach at East Catholic High School in Manchester, Conn. and has extensive camp experience working for several of the top lacrosse schools in the country including: North Carolina, Johns Hopkins, Michigan, Ohio State, St. John's, University of Denver, West Point and Princeton. At these camps, he instructed attack midfield and faceoff techniques. Overall, he has worked over 40 camps.

He received his bachelors of science in sports management in 2013 and a minor in coaching. The Tolland, Connecticut native was named to the SSC Commissioner's Honor Roll twice in his playing career, 2012 and 2013.



In January 2015, Kevin Lerg was named volunteer assistant coach by Brian Anken.

Lerg comes to VMI with a degree in communications with a minor in journalism from the Adrian, Mich. institution. Lerg was a four-year member of the Bulldogs' program, which competes at the NCAA Division III level and was a standout goalie.

After a top-notch career at Adrian, Lerg will work closely with the Keydets' goalkeeping corps. Last season, VMI's keepers held opponents to single digits on six occasions, including a 6-4 win over the United States Air Force Academy, the first win in program history over a Division I service academy.

Lerg comes to the Institute of an outstanding career with the Bulldogs. Hailing from Farmington Hills, Mich., Lerg finished his career with a 43-10 overall record, posting double digit wins in each of the three seasons in which he was a starter (2012-14). His 43 wins represent a career-best for the program, while his 2012 mark of 17-2 is the program's single-season mark. Lerg also holds the Adrian record for career saves (486) and is second all-time in career save percentage (.532) and goals against average (8.40).

During his four seasons at Adrian, Lerg finished in the top five in nearly every major goalkeeping stat for single season marks, including single-season saves (168) in 2012, a year in which he also set the mark for save percentage (.602).

Lerg was well honored during his time at Adrian, including a second-team All-MIAA nod in 2013. That year, he was named MIAA Defensive Player of the Week twice and was second in the league in goals against average (9.68). Lerg repeated the second-team selection in his senior year, while also collecting one Player of the Week honor.

Under then-head coach Don LaSala, Lerg helped Adrian to four-straight conference titles, winning the Midwest Lacrosse Conference in 2011 and 2012, while claiming the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association titles in 2012 and 2013. During his time at Adrian, Lerg and his squad never dropped a league game, going 29-0 from 2011 to 2014. During all four years with the program, Lerg helped the Bulldogs to the NCAA tournament.

Prior to his time at Adrian, Lerg was named High School All-American in 2010 while playing for Detroit Catholic Central High School, leading his team to the state finals.

Lerg resides in Rockbridge County.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. - The Virginia Military Institute men's lacrosse team opened its 2014 season on Saturday, taking on the United States Naval Academy for a seventh-straight season as the opener. The Midshipmen won 18-5 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in nonconference action.

The Keydets (0-1) got a one-two punch from senior Mickey Hofmeister and junior Mike DeBlasio, two of the team's three captains this season. DeBlasio notched three goals, the fifth hat trick of his career, while Hofmeister potted a pair. The two attackmen assisted each other once. Hofmeister's goals were his first since Apr. 14, 2012 after missing all of 2013 with a lower body injury.

The Mids (1-0) jumped out to a 10-goal lead before halftime, sparked by 10 points from Sam Jones on four goals and six assists. Tucker Hall scored three times and had two assists for five points on the day. Pat Durkin netted two goals and had one assist as Patrick Keena had one goal and one assist. Six other Mids scored goals while another had one assist each.

Between the pipes, VMI's Evan Windisch made the first start of his career, making a 10 saves. The junior played all 60 minutes in goal for the Keydets. Opposite Windisch, John Connors got the win, making seven saves in his 52 minutes of work. Paul Zimmerman finished the game for the Mids, making one stop.

The Keydets struggled in clearing, gaining the zone 15 times on 25 attempts. Navy cleared 21 of their 25 tries, including several in odd-number situations that led to goals. VMI lost the ground ball game, collecting 27 against Navy's 44. The Mids won the faceoff game as well, taking 21 of the 27 attempts.

A team that pressures heavily on defense, the Keydets did not take a penalty. The Midshipmen were penalized three times, including a pair on Colin Flounlacker that resulted in a two-minute extra-man opportunity for VMI. DeBlasio's third goal of the day came during the two minute man-up period.

LEXINGTON, Va. -- Despite a hat trick from Mickey Hofmeister and seven caused turnovers by Tyler Prasnicki, the Virginia Military Institute fell in its 2014 home opener at Drill Field #2 by a 15-6 count against the United States Military Academy.

In its first game at Drill Field #2 this season, VMI (0-2) got three goals from senior captain Mickey Hofmeister, who added an assist to his day. Sophomore Ben Huger tacked on another two goals for VMI while posting an assist.

Freshman Dale Mattice logged his first career goal during the Sunday afternoon game as well. Junior Mike DeBlasio assisted on Huger's second goal of the day, extending DeBlasio's scoring streak to nine games with 18 points in that stretch.

Hofmeister's hat trick was the first of his career and first multiple-goal game since April 24, 2012 after sitting out 2013 with a lower body injury. The two goals mark the second time in Huger's career he had a multi-point day and first two-goal effort.

Defensively, Prasnicki forced seven Army (1-1) turnovers, crediting VMI's high-pressure defensive system with the total. On the day, the Keydets caused 14 turnovers, with freshmen Mitch Wilson forcing three of his own, while four other players logged multiple caused turnovers.

Army's scoring efforts were paced by John Glesener, who finished with seven points on five assists and two goals. Connor Cook logged a hat trick while Will Mazzone and Alex Newsome each scored twice. Mazzone chipped in with two assists on the afternoon as well.

For a second-straight game, VMI got 10 saves from starting keeper Evan Windisch, who made the first two starts of his career against Navy and Army. The junior played for 48 minutes before he was spelled for the final 12 by freshman Michael Hutwelker. The rookie made two saves and did not allow a goal.

An In-Depth Series Look: Navy

Sunday's game will be the eighth meeting alltime between the VMI Keydets and the Navy Midshipmen. The Naval Academy has served as the season opener for VMI for each of the last seven seasons, which includes every previous meeting. The Mids have won each of the previous seven meetings. However, since the teams last met, VMI snapped its skid against the Division I Service Academies, topping Air Force 6-4 on March 2, 2014.

Careers Versus Navy

Senior captain Mike DeBlasio is currently the team's active points leader against the Midshipmen. The Long Islander has six career goals, including a hat trick last season. He has eight total points against Navy, with assists in his rookie and junior campaigns. Classmate Eric Groleau has a pair of points on two assists in 2013, while another two senior, Ty Trobridge and Tyler Prasnicki, have one point each, the former on a goal in 2013 and the latter on a dish in 2012. Fellow senior Evan Windisch has played 60 career minutes in goal for VMI against Navy, making 10 saves last season and collecting three groundballs.

An In-Depth Series Look: Army

The Keydets are looking to halt a seven-game slide against the Black Knights. VMI is 0-7 all-time against Army, and is 0-5 in West Point, N.Y. VMI returns to the Hudson Valley for the first time since 2013 after the Army squad traveled to Lexington last season. Barring any changes to either the USILA Coaches' Poll or the Cascade/Maverik Media Poll, VMI meets a ranked Black Knight squad for the first time since Army was No. 12 in 2011, a 12-6 Army win in Lexington. VMI has yet to play a ranked Black Knight team in West Point.

Careers Versus Army

Mike DeBlasio leads VMI's active roster with four points on two goals and two assists. He scored three of those points during his rookie campaign in 2012 on two goals and one assist. Last season, Ben Huger stung the Black Knights for three points on a pair of markers and one assist. Sophomore Dale Mattice has one career goal against Army, as does Tyler Prasnicki. Evan Windisch played 48 minutes in goal at home last season, making 10 saves at Drill Field #2 in Lexington.

Oh Captain, My Captains

The Keydets and head coach Brian Anken have named four captains for the 2015 season. Brad Biondello, Mike DeBlasio, Eric Groleau and Tyler Prasnicki, all seniors, will serve as the team captains for this season. It is the first time since the 2010 season VMI has had four captains.

Three-Legged Stool Winner

Senior captain and defenseman Tyler Prasnicki was named the VMI Keydet Club Three-Legged Stool winner in the fall, becoming the first lacrosse player at VMI to win the coveted award. The Three-Legged Stool Award recognizes a 1st Class scholarship athlete who has the highest achievements in academics, leadership and athletics. Prasnicki is not only a leader with the lacrosse program, but is the 1st Battalion executive officer in Barracks and was a corporal last year and company platoon sergeant in 2013. The Lexington, Va. native will commission in the United States Army following graduation.

Worrell-Fallon Award Winner

Sophomore Dale Mattice was named the Worrell-Fallon Memorial Award Winner for VMI this season following the Lee-Jackson Lacrosse Classic, a fall scrimmage with next door neighbor Washington & Lee University. Mattice finished with three of VMI's nine eight goals, doing so on just four shots. His marker's bookended VMI's scoring as he logged the game's first goal and VMI's final tally of the day.

Groundhog Day

The Keydets will open against the Midshipmen for the eighth straight season. All eight meetings will be played in Annapolis, as the Mids have yet to travel to Lexington in series history. Aside from Navy, VMI has never opened more than three seasons with the same opponent. Limestone College is second, having opened the 1990, 1994 and 1999 seasons against the Saints.

What Conference Are We In Now?

Aiming for ultimate confusion, the VMI lacrosse program will be playing in its third conference in as many seasons. VMI competed as an independent program from its first season in 1983 until joining the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in 2003. VMI remained in the MAAC until last season, competing in the Atlantic Sun Conference. This season, the Southern Conference took stewardship of the former Atlantic Sun Conference.

Home Sweet Home

VMI will host seven home games at Drill Field #2 this season, equaling the number of home games from last season. The Keydets have returned to a balanced home and away schedule after hosting just four games in 2013, opening that season with six games on the road.
