QUICK HITS

UDINSKI SETS NEW FCS RECORD - With a 26-for-46, 263 yards and no interception performance at Mercer Oct. 19, junior quarterback Reece Udinski set a new FCS record with 344 passes without an interception. The former mark of 342 was held by Portland State's Jimmy Blanchard in 1999. Through eight games, Udinski leads the SoCon in passing averaging 316.8 yards per game.

RAMSEY AT RUSHING THRESHOLD - Through eight games, redshirt junior running back Alex Ramsey has 935 yards rushing on the season and is bidding to become VMI's first 1,000 yard rusher in a season since Tim Maypray rushed for 1,266 yards in 2008.

CHATTANOOGA GAME TIME MOVED TO 1 PM - The November 23 VMI-Chattanooga game at Foster Stadium has been moved to 1 pm from its previously scheduled start time of 1:30 p.m. The contest will be the Ingles SoCon "Game of the Week" telecast on Nexstar affiliates throughout conference television markets.

- Give VMI its first win over Western Carolina since 1991.

- SATURDAY'S GAME VERSUS MERCER -

THE SERIES: This will be the 26th meeting between schools that first met in 1978. Western Carolina has held the upper hand in the rivalry leading 22-3 and has claimed the last 16 in the series including a 52-50 shootout in Cullowhee, N.C. last year. VMI's last win over Western Carolina was a 27-25 decision in Lexington in 1991.

MERCER GAME NOTES

RAMSEY TIES TD SEASON MARK – With his 125-yard, two touchdown rushing effort at Mercer Oct. 19, Alex Ramsey tied the school season record for most rushing touchdowns (17) held by Thomas Haskins since 1995.

TROTMAN PICKS ANOTHER – Riuq Trotman picked off a Mercer QB Robert Riddle pass to halt a scoring threat in the first quarter and now is tied with Kaleb Tucker and A.J. Smith for the team lead in interceptions with two. Trotman is VMI's active career leader in interceptions and now has six picks for his Keydet career.

SMITH , RICHMOND TIE CAREER HIGHS – Junior safety A.J. Smith and redshirt senior defensive lineman Jarrod Richmond both tied career highs in tackles in the Oct. 19 game at Mercer. Smith's 11 stops against the Bears

Head Coach Scott Wachenheim - Fifth Season

Scott Wachenheim enters his fifth season as VMI's head football coach, and he continues to guide the program with a steady hand in one of the toughest conferences in FCS. The program continues to build a solid foundation with young personnel, and since his debut season in 2015, Wachenheim has transformed expectations and attitudes within the VMI football program and has shown that sustainable success can be attained with enthusiasm, hard work, resilience and dedication.

Three years ago, the Keydet football program showed such potential in Wachenheim's second season that the Keydets were significantly more competitive in a Southern Conference that produced four teams that reached the FCS playoffs. Overall, the scoring margin improved from -11.9 in 2015 to -7.3 and the Keydets started the season 3-2 for the first time since 2003 and in the process won back-to-back road games for the first time in 35 years. The three wins also were the most in a season since 2010.

In that same 2016 year, VMI allowed 7.3 points less per game than in 2015 and the fewest opponent points in a season since 2003. The defense also ranked third in opponents third down conversions allowed. VMI was the least penalized team in the conference and improved its turnover margin +12 from a year ago. Nine VMI football players earned postseason awards from the Southern Conference.

Off the field, Wachenheim's cadet-athletes have excelled thanks to better execution of their daily activities and the results have fostered an improved team GPA, better retention rates, and a full commitment to "winning the VMI way."

A 1984 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy and veteran coach with over 25 years of experience in the college ranks, Wachenheim came to VMI from the University of Virginia where he had served for five seasons, including being the Cavaliers offensive line coach since 2011. Prior to his tenure in Charlottesville, Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Liberty University for three seasons (2006-08).

Wachenheim graduated from the Air Force Academy with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering and was a four-year starter from 1980-83. He earned first team All-WAC and honorable mention All-America honors his senior year.

STRONG FINISH - The Keydets have been finishing strong late in games this season and are outscoring foes by a combined 110-58 in the fourth quarter and OT.

SAMFORD GAME NOTES

RAMSEY NAMED STATS FCS NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - Redshirt junior running back Alex Ramsey rewrote several VMI single game rushing marks against Samford and in the process was tabbed STATS FCS National Offensive Player of the Week and was also named SoCon Offensive Player of the Week. Ramsey rushed 37 times for 163 yards and set new VMI single game records for most touchdowns (6), most points scored (36), most TDs responsible for (6) and most rushing touchdowns (6). Ramsey currently leads the FCS in rushing with 810 rushing yards on the season. He has three 100-yard rushing games this year and four for his career.

CLEMONS EARNS SECOND STRAIGHT POTW AWARD - Senior Grant Clemons won his second straight SoCon Special Teams Player of the Week Award after Saturday's performance against Samford when he scored 12 points against the Bulldogs going 6-for-6 in PATS and converting field goals of 33 and career-best 56-yarder to force overtime in the 48-41 win. The 56-yard field goal was the second longest in school history and tied the SoCon mark for the second longest field goal.

VMI RECEIVING VOTES IN POLLS -

The Keydets received votes in both the AFCA FCS Coaches Top 25 and STATS FCS Top 25 polls this week, marking only the second year in the program's FCS history that VMI has received votes in the national polls. The Keydets also received votes in the Coaches poll in 2002.

SIGNIFICANT WIN - VMI's 48-41 win over Samford at Foster Stadium moved the Keydets to 2-0 in OT games this season and also gave them their third SoCon win of the season. The last time VMI won three SoCon games was in 2002. The Keydets also moved to 4-3 overall, their best mark over .500 this late in the season since they were 6-5 in November of 2003.

Malry made his first college start against Samford and posted a career-best 11 tackles with nine solo stops and tied linebacker Elliott Brewster for game-high in tackles.

HERRES ANOTHER CAREER HIGH– Sophomore Jakob Herres set a new career-high with 10 catches against Samford and finished with 172 yards receiving.

THE CITADEL GAME NOTES

SHAKO RETURNS TO LEXINGTON – For the first time since 2002, the Silver Shako is returning to the VMI post after the Keydets 34-21 win over The Citadel in Charleston, S.C. The Keydets had not recaptured the trophy given to the winner of “The Military Classic of the South” in 12 previous matchups but the drought ended as VMI also won its first game at Johnson Hagood Stadium since 1995.

CLEMONS NAMED SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS POTW - Senior placekicker Grant Clemons was named SoCon special teams player of the week presented by Geico after scoring 10 points in the win over The Citadel. In addition to going 4-for-4 in PAT attempts, the Daleville, Va. resident converted both field goal attempts of 22 yards and a career-best 46 yards. Clemons also handled all six kickoffs and logged two touchbacks. Clemons become the second Keydet to win a SoCon POTW accolade this season and the first VMI specialist to receive a SoCon special teams award since Dillon Christopher on September 14, 2015.

UDINSKI STREAK CONTINUES - Reece Udinski's 25-for-35, 335-yard passing performance against The Citadel did not include an interception and the feat made him the new SoCon record holder for most consecutive passes without an interception. Udinski has not thrown an interception in 252 pass attempts this year.

A HIGH FOR HERRES – Sophomore receiver Jakob Herres turned in a stellar outing in the win over The Citadel and tied his career-high with eight catches and posted a career-best 175 yards receiving including a game clinching 61-yard catch and run late in the fourth quarter. Herres previous high was 118 yards at Chattanooga in 2018. Through six games, Herres is tied with freshman Leroy Thomas for the most season receptions (29) and leads the team with 442 receiving yards.

KAUTHEN HAS CAREER DAY – VMI redshirt freshman linebacker Liam Kauthen posted a career-best 11 tackles and turned in a game changing play with a first quarter fumble recovery at the VMI 44 yard-line as The Citadel was driving with a 7-0 lead. Kauthen's 11 tackles with a 0.5 TFL vs. The Citadel matched linebacker Elliott Brewster's total of 11 team-high stops for the game.

UDINSKI NUMBERS WATCH – Following Saturday's game vs. The Citadel, junior quarterback Reece Udinski

continues to climb several school statistical charts. His 335 yards passing was his seventh career 300-yard passing game and he now has 508 career completions which is third most in school history. Udinski now has 5175 career passing yards which is fourth most in program history and his 35 touchdown passes stand third on the VMI career charts.

TOUCHDOWN JAVEON – Senior wide receiver Javeon Lara caught a 28-yard TD pass to open VMI's third quarter against The Citadel and the strike gave him 16 career TD receptions which is four behind all-time leader Mark Stock (1984-88). Lara caught five passes for 77 yards against The Citadel and moved over the century mark in career receptions with 101.

TURNOVER FREE AGAIN – VMI did not commit a turnover Saturday against The Citadel marking the second straight game and third time this season the Keydets have turned it over in a game. The Keydets also posted flawless outings against ETSU September 14 and Wofford September 28. Through six games, VMI leads the SoCon in turnover margin with a +8 number.

SO CLOSE – Redshirt junior Alex Ramsey missed a bid for a third consecutive 100-yard rushing game when he finished with 97 yards on 27 carries and a touchdown against The Citadel.

HANEY MAKES MOST OF STARTING DEBUT – Freshman defensive lineman Jaylon Haney, making his first college start as VMI employed an addition D-lineman for a five-man front against The Citadel, finished with five tackles including two sacks for six yards and also posted two quarterback hurries.

SACKS CLIMB – VMI matched his season high in sacks after logging five against The Citadel. Through six games, VMI has 13 sacks on the year after posting just 7 sacks at the same point in 2018.

TOPPING THE SOCON IN STATS – Through six games, VMI leads the SoCon in passing offense (297.8), first downs (23.3), interceptions (7), opponent third-down conversion (35.7%), opponent fourth-down conversion (44.4%-tied with Wofford), and turnover margin (+8).

WOFFORD GAME NOTES

RAMSEY RAMPAGE – Redshirt junior Alex Ramsey continues to pile up rushing yards at a brisk pace as he carried for 207 yards on 28 carries against Wofford last Saturday to set career-highs in both categories. It was the first 200-yard rushing game by a VMI back since Tim Maypray rushed for 235 yards against Presbyterian in 2008. Ramsey became the eighth Keydet player in

program history to rush for 200 or more yards in a game. His three rushing touchdowns against Wofford was also the first by a VMI running back since Quan Myers vs. Western Carolina on September 22, 2018.

UDINSKI STREAK CONTINUES - VMI junior quarterback Reece Udinski set a new SoCon single season record Saturday when he went 38 attempts without an interception extending the mark for consecutive passes without an interception to 217. He is currently one pass shy of tying Elon QB Scott Riddle who holds the SoCon mark of 218 passes without an interception set in 2008-09.

THOMAS TIES CAREER BEST - Freshman wide receiver Leroy Thomas equaled his career best in catches and set a new high in receiving yards for a single game Saturday when he gathered in 10 catches for 123 yards. Thomas also caught a four-yard TD pass from Reece Udinski in the fourth quarter against the terriers for his second touchdown reception of the season.

RED ZONE WORTHY – VMI was five for five in the red zone against Wofford last Saturday moving the 2019 red zone success rate to 90% (19 for 21).

TURNOVER FREE – VMI did not commit a turnover against Wofford marking the second time this season VMI has been error free in ball security. The Keydets did turn commit a turnover in the 31-24 OT win at ETSU September 14.

UDINSKI TIES TD MARK – Junior quarterback Reece Udinski threw a pair of fourth quarter touchdown passes against Wofford bringing his career TD pass total to 32 and tying him with Eric Kordenbrock (2010-2013). He also currently has 483 career completions which is third on the VMI all-time list.

TOPPING THE SOCON STATS – Through five games, VMI is first in the SoCon in first downs per game (23.4), interceptions (7), and turnover margin (+7).

UDINSKI PASS PERFECT – Junior quarterback Reece Udinski has not thrown an interception in 2019 and enters Saturday game with Wofford with a streak of 179 passes without an interception. It is the fourth longest

streak in SoCon history – three better than the 176 passes completed by Armani Edwards of Appalachian State in 2008 and four behind the streak of 183 set by Samford's Devlin Hodges in 2010. The record is held by Furman's Braniff Bonaventure who completed 203 passes without an interception in 2006.

RAMSEY SETS ANOTHER CAREER HIGH – Redshirt junior running back Alex Ramsey rushed for a career-high 153

yards Saturday against Robert Morris for his second career 100-yard game. The Salem, Va. native rushed for 133 yards last year vs. Tusculum on November 3. Ramsey enters Saturday's game vs. Wofford ranked fourth in the SoCon in rushing – 85.8 yards per game.

ALL SQUARE– Through four games, VMI has scored 132 total points on offense and has given up 132 points on defense.

ROBERT MORRIS GAME NOTES

TURNOVER MARGIN STILL STRONG - VMI committed two fumble recoveries but also had two takeaways against Robert Morris (interception, fumble recovery) to remain +7 in turnover margin which tops the SoCon in that stat category through games of Sept. 21.

SACKS AND PICKS UP - Through four games, VMI has generated eight sacks on the season after having just three sacks through the first four games of the 2018 season. Freshman Josh Sarratt picked off a second quarter pass vs. Robert Morris for his first career interception and gave VMI seven interceptions on the year after having just eight picks the entire 2018 season.

TALE OF TWO HALFS - The second quarter has proved to be tough on the 2019 Keydets with opponents outscoring VMI 49-26 through four games, but the second half is a different story as VMI is outpointing foes by an 82-55 margin for the entire second half and overtime.

FIRST TIME IN A WHILE - VMI's punt block by freshman Alajareek Malry and subsequent safety in the second quarter was the first time the Keydets had blocked a punt since Tony Richardson blocked a punt against The Citadel on November 22, 2014. The safety was VMI's first since Chuck Weatherman recorded a sack in the endzone against Mercer on September 29, 2018.

ETSU GAME NOTES

A GAME OF FIRSTS – The 31-24 victory over ETSU was VMI's first Southern Conference win since October 8, 2016 (37-7, ETSU) and the first SoCon road win since October 28, 2015. It was VMI's first SoCon opener victory since a 37-23 win over ETSU on September 16, 1995. VMI competed 11 years in the Big South Conference from 2003-2013 before returning to the SoCon in 2014.

OVERTIME PERFECTION – The 31-24 overtime win at ETSU moved VMI to 3-0 in road overtime games. The two previous road OT victories came against Appalachian State, 26-23, in 1994 and Bucknell, 23-17, (3OT) in 2016.

RAMSEY ROLLS – Redshirt junior running back Alex Ramsey turned in another exceptional performance in VMI's 31-24 over-

time win at ETSU Saturday night. Ramsey caught a career-high 11 passes for 56 yards and rushed 16 times for 57 yards and two touchdowns. His 29-yard rush late in the game at ETSU set up VMI's game tying field goal to force overtime. On the season, Ramsey has four rushing touchdowns and is the team's top ground gainer with 190 yards on 42 carries.

TAKEAWAYS CONTINUE – VMI continues to excel in turnover margin and is tied for fourth in FCS with a +7 mark and is the only SoCon school with a plus number in that stat category. The Keydets did not turn over the ball in Saturday night's win at ETSU while also generating an interception and recovering a fumble. VMI has intercepted six passes through three games of the season after accumulating eight picks in all of 2018.

SARRATT AND SMITH LEAD DEFENSE – Freshman safety Josh Sarratt and junior strong safety A.J. Smith have quickly established himself as a presence in the Keydet secondary this year. Sarratt led the defensive charts at ETSU with 11 tackles with five solo stops and six assists. Smith, a preseason All-SoCon pick first team defense pick, had nine tackles vs. ETSU and forced a key second half Buccaneer fumble that halted a scoring drive at the VMI 34.

CAREER HIGH CATCHES – VMI's top three receivers in the ETSU game all posted career highs in receptions. Redshirt running back Alex Ramsey posted a career-best 11 catches while senior receiver Rohan Martin grabbed a career-high nine passes including a 13-yard TD catch and sophomore receiver Jakob Herres bested his previous high of seven receptions with eight against the Bucs.

UDINSKI UPDATE - Junior quarterback Reece Udinski continued to climb the VMI career and single game lists marks following his 38 of 64 for 211 yards and two touchdowns outing against ETSU. The night was the third most single game completions in school history and Udinski now owns three of the top four single game marks in program history. The 64 pass attempts tied the third most in school history and Udinski owns all top four single game marks in the Keydet record books. On the VMI career lists, Udinski now has 4,251 career passing yards (#4 on list), 428 career pass completions (#4 on list), and 29 career TD passes (#4 on list).

DEFENSE BUCKLES DOWN ON THIRD DOWN - The Keydets held ETSU to just 1 of 12 in third down conversions. VMI is holding opponents to 26.2% conversions on third down - tops in the SoCon.

MARS HILL GAME NOTES

TUCKER NAMED SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF

THE WEEK – Senior cornerback Kaleb Tucker was named SoCon Defensive Player of the Week Monday. Tucker produced two first quarter interceptions which helped VMI build an 21-0 lead in the 63-21 win over Mars Hill last Saturday. Tucker's first pick was returned 21 yards and helped set up a score that pushed the Keydets ahead 14-0. On the next Mars Hill possession, Kaleb snagged another interception that led to an eventual 21-0 first quarter advantage. For the game, Tucker posted four solo tackles including one sack for -7 yards. Tucker now has three career interceptions. It marked the first time a VMI defender had been named Defensive Player of the Week since Ryan Francis on September 26, 2016.

RAMSEY RAMBLES ON - Redshirt junior Alex Ramsey continued his strong start to the season by accounting for 183 yards total offense in VMI's 63-21 win over Mars Hill. Ramsey rushed for 88 yards on 15 carries with an 8-yard run with 6:35 in the first quarter and added a six-yard TD run in the third quarter. The two rushing TDs scored were his first career rushing touchdowns. Ramsey also caught three passes for 95 yards including a long of 41 yards and a 34-yard catch and run that set up a touchdown on VMI's first possession of the second half and give the Keydets a 35-14.

LARA MOVING UP LIST - With two touchdown receptions against Mars Hill, senior wide receiver Javeon Lara moved past Zohn Burden (2002-05), Teray Frost (1997-2000), and Tim Maypray (2006-09) into sole possession of second place on the VMI all-time list for most touchdown receptions. Lara now has 14 career TD's which is second only to Mark Stock (1984-88) who had 20.

UDINSKI MOVES UP TOWARD MILESTONES - Senior quarterback Reece Udinski tossed four touchdown passes against Mars Hill marking the third time in his career he has achieved that in a game after reaching that mark twice in 2018 (Western Carolina, The Citadel). Now with 27 career touchdown passes, Udinski stands one TD strike shy of tying Dave Brown (1985-88) and Jonathan Wilson (2003-06) for fourth place. With 390 career pass completions, Udinski also stands 10 away from the 400 career completion plateau.

CHIMA GOES LONG - Redshirt sophomore quarterback Chima Kpaduwa raced 75 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter of VMI's win over Mars Hill September 7. It was the first career touchdown for Kpaduwa and was the longest rush by a Keydet back since Michael Rainey-Wiles (83-yard TD) on September 1, 2007.

STRAND MAKES FIRST START - Redshirt sophomore Shane Strand made his career first start on the offensive line against Mars Hill lining up at right tackle. In 2018, Strand saw reserve action in nine games and lettered for the second time.

OFFENSE ROLLS UP NUMBERS - The 571 yards total offense against Mars Hill Sept. 7 was the most in a game since a 597-yard output against Davidson on September 13, 2014. VMI's 220

yards rushing against Mars Hill was the best ground game performance since 233 yards were posted against ETSU on October 8, 2016.

TURNAROUND IN TURNOVERS - The five takeaways (four interceptions and a fumble recovery) against Mars Hill Saturday moved VMI to + 5 through two games – a marked improvement over 2018 when the Keydets had a -14 turnover margin for the season.

MARSHALL GAME NOTES

VMI got off to a good start in turnover margin in the season opener at Marshall. Junior defensive back Will Bunton had his second career interception in the second quarter against the Herd and redshirt freshman linebacker Eric Weaver recovered his first career fumble in the second half.

LARA GOES LONG AGAIN – Senior wide receiver Javeon Lara proved once again his ability to go deep as he hauled in a 50-yard strike from quarterback Reece Udinski in the second quarter of last Saturday night's season opener at Marshall. He now has eight career games with a TD reception of 50+ yards.

MARTIN TIES CAREER HIGH – The seven catches against Marshall by senior wide receiver Rohan Martin tied his career-best in a game as he reached the mark twice before – the latest against The Citadel in 2018.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT FOR MORGAN: Freshman quarterback Seth Morgan scored a touchdown on his first touch of the ball in his college career which is impressive enough, but the situation that forced him into the game made it even more noteworthy. As VMI was driving inside the red zone midway during the fourth quarter against Marshall in the season opener, Keydet redshirt freshman quarterback Chance Newman had his helmet pop off during a rush to the Herd 3-yard line. With Newman having to exit the game for one play under NCAA rules, Morgan quickly entered the game and scored untouched on three-yard keeper around the left end.

FIRST CAREER STARTS: Four Keydets got their first career start in Saturday's opener against Marshall. On the offensive side, guard redshirt freshman Nick Hartnett and sophomore wide receiver Michael Jackson both appeared on VMI's first snap from scrimmage, and on the defensive side redshirt freshman linebacker Liam Kauthen and Josh Sarratt each made their first career start.

A CAREER NIGHT FOR LAWRENCE: Redshirt defensive back Najee Lawrence racked up a career-high 11 tackles and led the Keydets on the defensive charts in the Aug. 31 opener at Marshall. Lawrence was credited with two solo stops and nine assists to surpass his previous high of three set two times – the most recent against Furman Nov. 10 of last season.

PUNTING GAME SHARP: VMI's punting game had a good night in the opener at Marshall frequently pinning the Thundering Herd deep in its own territory. Senior Reed King punted seven times for a 43.9 average included a 52-yarder and also placed four punt attempts inside the 20-yard line including one that wound up at the Herd 1-yard line. Quarterback Reece Udinski also executed two "quick kicks" that also forced Marshall to start drives inside their own 20.

VMI PRESEASON NOTES

TEAM CAPTAINS ANNOUNCED: The 2019 VMI Football captains have been selected as voted on by the team, head coach Scott Wachenheim announced Monday afternoon, August 26.

Reece Udinski, AJ Smith, Jordan Ward, and Alex Ramsey will serve as team captains.

The four figure to play leading roles on and off the field this fall. Udinski is coming off a season record 3,082 yards passing in 2018 becoming the first VMI passer to surpass the 3,000 yard threshold while tying the season mark for TD passes with 20. Smith is a two-year starter at safety and co-led the team in tackles with 90 and led the charts with 55 solo stops and also was named 2018 Google Cloud Second Team Academic All-America and Second Team All-SoCon (Media). Ward broke into the starting lineup last year on the defensive line and looks to be a mainstay at tackle after leading VMI defenders in quarterback hurries with six in 2018 and was a 2018-19 SoCon Academic Honor Roll recipient. Ramsey is VMI's leading returning rusher who looks to lead a rejuvenated running attack after gaining 317 yards on 65 carries last season.

The four will serve as permanent game captains throughout the 2019 slate.

KEYDETS REAP PRESEASON HONORS

Four VMI football players were named to the Preseason All-Southern Conference teams announced by the league July 22 at the 2019 SoCon Football Media Day in Spartanburg, South Carolina.

Senior wide receiver Javeon Lara was named to the first team offense while junior quarterback Reece Udinski was named to the second team offense. On the defensive side, junior AJ Smith was named to the first team defense and on special teams senior Rohan Martin was named a second team return specialist.

Lara is a three-year letterman and returning starter coming off an excellent 2018 season in which he accumulated the second most catches and yards among receivers with 53 catches for 825 yards.

He led the team in touchdown receptions with seven and earned the team's longest reception of the year with a 72-yard touchdown catch against Samford. He produced four 100+ yard receiving games as a junior.

AJ Smith is a two-year letterman and returning starter that earned 2018 All-SoCon second team defense honors a year ago. The Academic All-American started all 11 games at safety

a year ago extending his start streak to 18. He co-led the team in tackles with 90 for sixth in the league standing with 8.2 tackles per game. He led the Keydet defense with 55 solo stops last season and broke up three passes during the season.

Udinski rewrote the season passing record book in 2018 by throwing for over 3,000 yards and became the first quarterback in school history to surpass the 3,000 yard threshold for a single season. He set season marks for completions (302), attempts (523), total plays (570) and tied the season mark for most touchdown passes in a season with 20. Udinski established VMI single game records for passing yards when he threw for 491 yards in VMI's 52-50 loss at Western Carolina September 22 which also stood as the second most yards by a SoCon QB during the year.

Rohan Martin was a 2018 second team All-Socon specialist despite only playing in eight games due to injury. He tied for third on the team for the most receptions on the year with 30 to go with 252 yards and a touchdown. On special teams he averaged 15.9 yards per return in seven tries.

In early August, Phil Steele recognized five Keydets on his preseason All-SoCon teams as Lara was named to the second team offense Smith was named to the second team defense. Reece Udinski was chosen for the third team offense at QB and junior linebacker Elliott Brewster was selected to finish on the third team defense at LB.

SIX HOME GAMES IN 2019

VMI will play six home games at Foster Stadium in 2019 – the first time that has happened since 2015. The Keydets open the home slate Sept. 7 versus Mars Hill and continue non-conference competition Sept. 21 against Robert Morris before four SoCon opponents (Wofford, Samford, Western Carolina, and Chattanooga) visit Foster Stadium.

EXPERIENCED, BUT STILL YOUNG

The 2019 VMI Football roster reveals a squad that is much more experienced than in 2018, but still sports a youthful look. Sixteen starters return with eight back on both the offensive and defensive units, and both kicker and return specialists as well. Of the 96 players on the active roster, however, only eight seniors appear. The rest of the roster breaks down to 21 juniors (13 redshirt), 15 sophomores (six redshirt) and 52 freshmen (14 redshirt).

NEW FACES, NEW PLACES

There weren't as many position switches in the recent spring ball and preseason camp practices this year, but some notable new addresses for VMI personnel include redshirt junior Devin Carper who was moved from inside linebacker to the offensive backfield during August camp. Carper, who continues to play a big role on special teams, played in all 11 contests with starts in the first seven games in 2018 and posted 20 solos and 18 assists and produced a pick-six against ETSU Sept. 14. Senior Ryan Clark, who played at reserve tight end in 2018, returns to the defensive line where he played his first two years and was a starter in 2017.

SMITH RETURNS IN BACKFIELD

The VMI running attack should be bolstered in 2019 with the return of redshirt junior running back Tyain Smith who missed most all of 2018 with an ankle injury. Smith finished each of

the two previous seasons as VMI's second leading rusher with 289 yards and four touchdowns in 2016 and 191 yards in 2017. Smith should compliment returnees Alex Ramsey (R-Jr.) and Korey Bridy (So.) to give VMI a deep and experienced look at running back in 2018.

FRESHMEN HAVE IMPACT IN CAMP, TWO-DEEP

The first two-deep of the 2019 season revealed a true freshman projected to make his first start – Josh Sarratt at safety. A graduate of Colonial Forge in Stafford, Va., Sarratt was a Class 6 Region B as a defensive back, wide receiver, and kick returner while also earning all-state honors at defensive back and kick returner. Sarratt also earned District Defensive Player of the Year three times during his high school career. Sarratt will have company from the Keydet true freshman class on the defense as Aljareek Malry (Lanham, Md./ Duval) is listed in the two-deep at back-up outside linebacker.

COACHING STAFF HAS NEW LOOK

For the second straight season, the VMI coaching staff will have a transformed look as eight new assistant coaches have joined the Keydets. Entering their first year on the staff are Kyle Jolly (Offensive Line), Pat Kuntz (Defensive Line), Anthony Davis (Running Backs), Kenny Scott (Cornerbacks), Chris Moore (Tight Ends/Special Teams), Marshall Roberts (Secondary), Nick Conte (Kickers, Punters, and Snappers) and Jacob Menard (Volunteer). Last season, seven new assistant coaches joined the staff, however both coordinators return from 2018 as Tom Clark returns to direct the VMI defense for the fifth season and Brian Sheppard will guide the "Air Raid" offense for the second year.

FOOTBALL FACILITIES IMPROVEMENT

The summer of 2019 was a busy one as two major upgrades took place with VMI football facilities. A new all-weather artificial surface replaced the one originally installed in 2006 at Fiorini Field, the team's practice facility while Clarkson-McKenna Hall which houses football operations at Foster Stadium saw significant upgrades on the third and fourth levels of the building that originally opened in 1988. The press box level will have two additional booths to accommodate home radio as well as official's replay which becomes mandatory for all SoCon schools in 2019. The roof will also feature a dedicated shooting platform with easier access than in previous years and both home and visiting coaches boxes have been expanded. The Superintendent's area known as the Ferebee Lounge located on the third level has also been expanded with rooms for hospitality support as well as a new area that can be used for meetings or offices. The cost for the improvements totaled approximately \$2.2 million.

NEXSTAR PACKAGE TO FEATURE VMI FOUR TIMES

VMI will make four appearances on the Southern Conference TV package which Nexstar announced at the SoCon Football Media Day in July. The Keydets games

against Mars Hill Sept. 7, The Citadel Oct. 5, Samford Oct. 12, and Chattanooga Nov. 23 will appear on the Game of the Week package that will be carried on Nexstar stations in SoCon markets. VMI will also have nine games carried on either ESPN+ or ESPN3 and the November 16 date at Army West Point will be carried on CBS Sports Network.

TWO FBS FOES AGAIN

The 2019 season marks the second consecutive year that VMI will have two FBS opponents on its schedule as the Keydets take on Marshall in its season opener August 31 and also travel to West Point to play Army on November 16. Last year, VMI played FBS teams Toledo and Old Dominion.

KEYDETS REMEMBER MAYPRAY

VMI Football is honoring the memory of former standout back and assistant coach Tim Maypray, VMI '10, with a decal that will be worn on the 2019 game helmets depicting his jersey number 28. Maypray died last January in Davidson, N.C. and had served the 2018 season on the staff of Scott Abel at Davidson College as running backs coach after spending three years in the same capacity at VMI under Coach Scott Wachenheim. As a cadet, Maypray reaped numerous awards as a receiver, return specialist, running back, and quarterback at VMI and was named first team All-Big South as a kick returner in 2007 and punt returner in 2009. He was also selected second team All-Big South at wide receiver in 2007 and quarterback in 2008. Maypray was named Big South Freshman of the Year in 2006 and preseason offensive player of the year in 2009. In 2010, he received the VMI Intercollegiate Athletics Award which is presented to the most outstanding athlete and finished his VMI football career holding the Big South career record for all-purpose yards (6,129) and set the VMI single game record for all-purpose running with 346 yards against Charleston Southern in 2007. Maypray played professionally for three seasons in the Canadian Football League and made his debut for the Montreal Alouettes in 2010 and played on the Grey Cup championship team that season.

COLONIAL FORGE PIPELINE

Head coach Scott Wachenheim has certainly made Colonial Forge High School in Stafford, Va. one of his primary recruiting stops as seven former players are listed on the 2019 VMI football roster. Six former Colonial Forge athletes are currently listed in the VMI two-deep including starters wide receiver Rohan Martin, defensive back Josh Sarratt, long snapper Connor Riddle, linebacker Liam Kauthen. Defensive back DJ Dennis and offensive lineman Shane Strand are listed in the current two-deep and also on the active roster is redshirt freshman Ayden Jilson.

Keydets Fall to Western Carolina in Shootout

CULLOWHEE, N.C. - Western

Carolina scored the first two touchdowns of the second half and held off a spirited VMI rally to hand the Keydets their second-straight heartbreaking defeat in Southern Conference football action, 52-50, Saturday afternoon in Cullowhee, North Carolina.



With VMI trailing by eight points, 45-37, WCU intercepted a Reece Udinski pass and returned it 46 yards for a touchdown and the game looked bleak for the Keydets down 52-37, but VMI refused to fold.

Udinski led VMI on a 9-play drive that culminated with a 10-yard touchdown pass to junior Javeon Lara to cut the Catamount lead to 52-44, and just one play later the Keydets got the ball back when redshirt freshman Collin Loftis intercepted a pass to set VMI up at its own 38-yard line.

Fifteen plays later, the Keydets found the end zone again. Udinski fired a scoring strike to freshman tight end Jakob Herres from 12 yards out to pull VMI to within 52-50 with just 22 seconds remaining in the contest. The 50 points scored was the most for VMI since totaling 52 against Davidson in 2014.

VMI fell short on its bid to tie the game, however. Udinski's two-point pass fell incomplete, and WCU escaped with the victory.

After setting a career-high in passing last week against East Tennessee State, Udinski rewrote the VMI record books Saturday against the Catamounts, setting new single-game marks for completions, attempts and yards. The sophomore went 43-for-72 through the air for 491 yards and four touchdowns in the game.

Lara was his favorite target, snagging nine passes for 143 yards, both career bests, and a pair of scores as nine different Keydets recorded receptions. Sophomore Kris Thornton finished with eight catches for 82 yards, and junior running back Quan Myers had seven grabs. Devone Humphrey hauled in six passes.

The game was a shootout from the beginning. The two teams exchanged touchdowns early in the contest, but VMI took the lead in the second period when Myers, who led VMI with 76 rushing yards on 23 attempts and scored a one-yard touchdown late in the first quarter, scored the second of his three touchdowns from a two yards out. Reed King added the PAT kick, and the Keydets had a 21-14 advantage.

With the loss, VMI falls to 0-4 on the season, 0-2 in conference play. Western Carolina improves to 3-0, 1-0.

Keydets Drop Season Opener at Marshall

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. – Despite cutting the Marshall lead to 21-7 early in the second quarter, the VMI football team allowed two more Thundering Herd touchdowns before the half to lift Marshall to an eventual 56-17 victory over the Keydets Saturday night at Joan C. Edwards Stadium in Huntington, West Virginia.



The Keydets (0-1) trailed 14-0 at the end of the first quarter and allowed another Marshall touchdown minutes into the second quarter to find themselves in a 21-0 hole. Instead of panicking, VMI marched down the field and quarterback Reece Udinski connected with senior Javeon Lara on a 50-yard touchdown catch.

Moments later, junior defensive back Will Bunton picked off Marshall quarterback Isaiah Green and the momentum appeared to be shifting in VMI's favor. However, the Keydets were unable to convert on the drive and Marshall refocused to score two more touchdowns to go up, 35-7, before the break.

"I was pleased with our kicking game and we were much improved on special teams tonight," said VMI head coach Scott Wachenheim. "Offensively, we didn't turn the ball over until late in the game until the last possession and I think Rohan Martin showed his ability as a slot receiver and Javeon Lara showed what he could do in the out and up. As always we saw a tremendous competitor there in Reece Udinski.

"We had an improved run game, but we weren't consistent enough. We had some good production there with Korey Bridy and Alex Ramsey running hard and Tyain Smith giving us depth. Defensively, we had two takeaways with Will Bunton grabbing an interception and Eric Weaver recovering a fumble. There's a lot of things we can build upon and I'm proud of this team."

Marshall picked up two touchdowns in the third quarter on a 33-yard reception and a one-yard scamper by Brenden Knox to go up 49-7 with one quarter to play.

The Keydets continued to fight and marched downfield early in the fourth quarter to set up a 28-yard field goal conversion by Grant Clemons. On VMI's ensuing possession, true freshman quarterback Seth Morgan entered the game for a play and scored a touchdown on a three-yard run around the corner with 8:48 to play.

Udinski finished the game completing 20 of 35 passes for 192 yards and zero interceptions. Under pressure all night, he was sacked four times by an overpowering Marshall defensive frontline. Redshirt junior Alex Ramsey netted 45 rushing yards on the night to lead the running back corps while Lara led all receivers with 72 receiving yards including his 50-yard TD reception. Senior receiver Rohan Martin led the group with seven catches for 61 yards.

Marshall finished the game with 620 total yards of offense including 340 through the air and 280 on the ground. Green went 18-28 for the Herd passing for 238 yards and four touchdowns. Gammage led the receivers corps with five grabs for 82 yards, while Tyler King led the way on the ground for the Herd with 75 net rushing yards on 10 carries. Sheldon Evans also proved dominant on the ground with 56 rushing yards.

The Keydets return to Lexington for their home opener next Saturday, Sept. 7, to face Mars Hill at 1:30 p.m. at Foster Stadium.

LEXINGTON, Va. – Looking for a great start to the 2019 home season, the VMI football team took care of business with an impressive 63-21 victory over Mars Hill contested Saturday on a warm afternoon at Foster Stadium.



The Keydets (1-1, 0-0) raced to a 21-0 lead in the opening quarter and appeared to be in complete control of the game from the get-go. Javeon Lara caught a 26-yard touchdown reception from Reece Udinski on VMI's opening drive before running Alex Ramsey scored his first VMI career touchdown on an 8-yard scamper on the following Keydet possession to put VMI up, 14-0. Minutes later, true freshman Leroy Thomas scored on a seven-yard pass from Udinski to put VMI up, 21-0, before the end of the quarter had expired.

"There were three keys in winning this game," said VMI head coach Scott Wachenheim. "One, we got off to a fast start in the first and second half. The second was that we won the turnover battle (5-1) and third, the defense, other than one play, basically shut Mars Hill out in the second half."

Mars Hill responded quickly in the second quarter with touchdown passes on their opening drives of the quarter as quarterback Jimmy Urzua connected with Javon Harbison and Craig Rucker to cut the VMI lead to 21-14 with 10:31 to play before the half.

VMI would slow the rally the ultimately the momentum of the game as VMI marched down the field on the ensuing possession and Udinski spotted sophomore receiver Jakob Herres behind the Lion secondary and Herres took it in to put VMI up for good, 28-14, midway through the second quarter.

"One really good thing about this game is that we got to play a lot of players. Our young guys played hard and played fast and enjoyed playing football and I know enjoyed the win.

"We came out in the second half and played like champs and put the game out of reach midway through the third quarter."

The Keydets scored on three separate possessions in the third quarter to secure victory as Ramsey, Lara, and freshman Max Brimigion all recorded touchdown to put VMI up, 50-14, heading into the fourth quarter. Ramsey earned a career-high 95 reception yards in the game, including the longest of his career with a 41-yard reception in the third quarter. He ended the game with a career-high 183 all-purpose yards.

With only one defensive mishap late in the game that allowed Mars Hill to score with three minutes to play, the Keydets played reserves and still recorded two touchdowns as freshman quarterback Seth Morgan scored his second TD of the season and Chima Kpaduwa scored on a 75-yard run up the middle.

Defensively, Kaleb Tucker and AJ Smith both recorded two interceptions in the game, career highs for a single game.

The Keydets begin Southern Conference play next week on the road as they travel to ETSU to take on the Bucs Saturday at 7:30 p.m. in Johnson City, Tennessee.

Keydets Earn Signature Win at ETSU in Overtime

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. - In a game that featured more than two hours of weather delays, the VMI football team battled to a signature 31-24 overtime victory over ETSU late Saturday night/ Sunday morning at Greene Stadium in Johnson City, Tennessee.



With the win, VMI (2-1, 1-0) earned its first Southern Conference victory since the 2016 season when the Keydets took down ETSU by a 37-7 score in Lexington.

Trailing 24-21 late in the game after a 61-yard rushing touchdown by ETSU, the Keydets marched down the field aided by a 29-yard dash by Alex Ramsey up the middle that set up a 30-yard field goal by Grant Clemons to knot the score at 24 apiece and force overtime.

In the extra period, VMI quarterback Reece Udinski looked to senior Javeon Lara on every play and connected with him on a 21-yard reception that saw Lara break a tackle and scamper down the sideline for what proved to be the game-winning score to put VMI up, 31-24. ETSU advanced to the VMI 5-yard line on their overtime possession, but a one-yard rush and three consecutive incomplete passes sealed the win for VMI as the Keydets rushed the field in elation.

“Our team displayed our core values of grit, brotherhood, and purpose in an epic contest with the defending SoCon champions in their backyard,” said VMI head coach Scott Wachenheim. “Our players and staff earned this victory and I am proud of each and every one of them.”

In a game that was supposed to begin at 7:30 p.m., the game did not start until 8:42 p.m. Additional lightning bolt in the area forced another delay just a few minute before halftime. The teams would eventually go into the break tied at seven apiece.

VMI went up 14-7 early in the third quarter before ETSU trimmed it to four following an Buccaneer field goal. Following an ETSU touchdown, VMI would regain the lead on a one-yard rush by Ramsey to go ahead, 21-17.

Running back Alex Ramsey earned a career-high 11 receptions in the win to go with 16 rushes for 57 net yards. Senior receiver Rohan Martin grabbed a career-high nine receptions and sophomore Jakob Herres also earned a career high eight grabs for a single game.

Udinski finished the game throwing 38 completions for 281 yards and two touchdowns on 64 attempts with no interceptions.

The Keydets return to action at home next Saturday, Sept. 21 against Robert Morris. Kickoff is slated for a 1:30 p.m. start at Foster Stadium.

2019 Game Recaps VMI vs. Robert Morris - Sept. 21, 2019

Keydets Topped by Robert Morris, 31-21

LEXINGTON, Va. - Despite a career highs in both rushing yards and attempts from redshirt junior Alex Ramsey, the VMI football team was upended, 31-21, by visiting Robert Morris on a warm Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.



The Salem, Virginia native rushed a career-high 24 times for 153 yards, the most of his career for a single game. The Keydets (2-2, 1-0), however, gave up too many big plays on defense and failed to convert on crucial opportunities on offense throughout which allowed the Colonials to depart Lexington with the victory.

The Colonials (1-3, 0-0) started the game with momentum by scoring on a 47-yard run down the sideline for a score to go up quickly over the Keydets, 7-0, just a few minutes into the game.

VMI's Grant Clemons would convert a 36-yard field goal midway through the opening quarter, but Robert Morris responded quickly with another touchdown from Caleb Lewis to Garrett Houser on a 15-yard pass to go up, 14-3, by the end of the opening stanza.

Unable to capitalize in the red zone on several occasions, the Keydets again settled for a 29-yard field goal from Clemons to make the score 14-6 with 12:07 before the half. On the Colonials' ensuing possessions, the Keydets forced a punt which was blocked by freshman Aljareek Malry and rolled into the side of the endzone for a safety to trim the RMU lead to 14-8 with 10:26 left in the second quarter.

Late in the first half, Robert Morris drove down the field and scored on a 6-yard scamper up the middle to make the score 21-8 at the half.

"Give a lot of credit to Robert Morris because they played an outstanding football game," said VMI head coach Scott Wachenheim. "I think we had a great week of preparation for this contest, but unfortunately we made too many mistakes that are uncharacteristic of VMI football teams that put us in a bad position."

The teams would exchange jabs throughout the second half but the Keydets were unable to overcome the halftime deficit. Sophomore receiver Jakob Herres scored on a 21-yard pass in the third quarter and Ramsey scored on a 2-yard run early in the fourth quarter, but the damage had been done as the Colonials kept the Keydets at bay.

Junior quarterback Reece Udinski finished the game with 274 net yards passing by completing 30 of 52 pass attempts. VMI totaled 446 yards on offense to Robert Morris' 368 during the game.

The Keydets return to action next Saturday at home to resume Southern Conference play against Wofford slated for a 1:30 p.m. start at Foster Stadium.

Keydets Fall to Wofford in Lightning-Delayed Game

LEXINGTON, Va. - Despite a career-high rushing effort by redshirt junior Alex Ramsey, the VMI football team dropped a 51-36 contest to visiting Wofford College in a five hour lightning-delayed game Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.



Ramsey rushed for a career-high 207 net yards during the game, marking the first time since the 2008 season that VMI fielded a 200-yard rusher. The last to accomplish the feat was former Keydet great Tim Maypray, who ran for 235 yards against Presbyterian College on November 22, 2008. He also became just the eighth Keydet in program history to eclipse the 200-yard rushing mark.

The Salem, Virginia, native also earned career highs in rushing attempts with 28 and touchdowns in a single game with three on the day. His 232 all-purpose yards also marks a career-best effort.

VMI (2-3, 1-1) junior quarterback Reece Udinski finished the game throwing for 315 yards by completing 25 of 38 passes with zero interceptions. He has now thrown 217 passes this season without an interception, breaking a Southern Conference record formerly held by Furman's Braniff Bonaventure, who threw 203 straight passes with a pick during the 1996 season.

With his 25 completions on the day, Udinski now has 483 career completions, moving to No. 3 on the all-time VMI list just past Joey Gibson (1999-2002). With two touchdown passes on the day he also ties for the No. 3 spot on the all-time VMI list for career touchdown passes with 32, matching Eric Kordenbrock's amount from the 2010-13 seasons.

The Keydets opened the game on a strong note with eight-play, 68-yard drive that culminated in a one-yard Ramsey touchdown run to put VMI up 7-0 early. The Terriers (2-2, 1-1) responded quickly by matching the score on a 37-yard rushing touchdown by Ryan Lovelace.

The lightning delay interrupted play at 1:54 p.m. following the Wofford score and the teams, fans, and officials headed for shelter for two hours before play resumed at roughly 4 p.m.

After VMI's Grant Clemons converted a 37-yard field goal to put VMI up, 10-7, the Terriers would go on to score twice before the end of the period to earn an important 21-10 advantage with three quarters to play.

VMI returns to action next Saturday on the road against rival The Citadel in a battle for the Silver Shako billed as The Military Classic of the South at 2 p.m. in Charleston, South Carolina.

Keydets Top The Citadel to Reclaim Silver Shako

CHARLESTON, S.C. - Looking to snap a 12-game losing streak to rival The Citadel in the Military Classic of the South, the VMI football team accomplished the feat with a hard fought 34-21 victory over the Bulldogs Saturday afternoon in Charleston, South Carolina.



With the win, VMI (3-3, 2-1 SoCon) earned its first win over The Citadel since November 16, 2002, a 23-21 victory contested in Charlotte, North Carolina (the schools only competed sporadically from 2003-14 during VMI's tenure in the Big South Conference). It was also the Keydets' first win in Charleston since a 34-7 victory on November 11, 1995.

VMI junior quarterback Reece Udinski threw his ninth career 300-yard passing game by totaling 335 yards through the air on 25-35 passing and zero interceptions. He earned a new SoCon record for consecutive passes without an interception as he now has thrown 252 passes without a pick, surpassing Elon quarterback Scott Riddle's mark of 218 set between the 2008 and 2009 seasons.

Another crucial element to VMI's victory was that the Keydets did not commit a turnover for a second straight week and third time this season. VMI now has a +8 turnover margin for the year.

The Citadel opened the game on an eight-play, 75-yard drive on its first possession capped by a Brandon Rainey two-yard keeper to move quickly on the Keydets with an early 7-0 advantage.

On the Bulldogs' ensuing possession, VMI linebacker Liam Kauthen recovered a fumble forced by Brett Howell at the VMI 46. The Keydets tied the game at 7-7 late in the first quarter with a nine-yard pass to Herres in the left corner of the end zone on a fourth and 1 from the Bulldog nine.

Alex Ramsey, who totaled 97 net yards on 27 carries for the day, ran in from the one-yard to cap a 10 play-73 yard drive on the following VMI possession to put the Keydets up 14-7 at the 5:37 mark of the second quarter. Ramsey toted the ball for 42 yards on five carries on the drive.

VMI added a 22-yard field goal on the last play of the first half to make it 17-7 to enter halftime with a huge upswing of momentum. Freshman wideout Max Brimigion hauled in a 25-yard strike to The Citadel 5 with :09 left to set up the score. The drive was also aided by a personal foul roughing the passer penalty against The Citadel.

The Keydets return home next Saturday to face one of the top teams in the conference in Samford. Kickoff is slated for a 1:30 start at Foster Stadium and will be aired on Nexstar/ESPN+

Keydets top Samford in OT, Earn Fourth Win of Year

LEXINGTON, Va. - Coming off a huge win last weekend at The Citadel, the VMI football team kept the momentum going with a benchmark 48-41 overtime victory over the visiting Samford Bulldogs Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.



The win was VMI's (4-3, 3-1 SoCon) fourth of the season, marking the most wins in a season since the 2008 squad went 4-7. It was also VMI's first ever win over the Bulldogs (3-4, 2-2 SoCon) to improve to 1-6 in the all-time series with the school.

It was another career day for redshirt junior running back Alex Ramsey, who gained 163 yards on the ground on a new career-high 37 carries and six touchdowns. The Salem, Virginia, native earned school records in single game points scored (36), most touchdowns scored (6), most touchdowns responsible for (6) and most rushing touchdowns (6).

Junior quarterback Reece Udinski also had a big day contributing to his career totals by going 37-of-46 through the air for 390 yards and has now thrown 298 passes without an interception. Last week he already broke the SoCon record for consecutive passes without an INT with 252. The North Wales, Pennsylvania, native now has eight career 300-yard passing games and five career games with 37 or more completions.

After Ramsey tied the game at 38-all on a one-yard scamper with 4:16 to play in the game, Samford drove down the field and converted a 45-yard field goal with only 41 seconds left on the clock.

Udinski then drove the Keydets to the Samford 39-yard line with five seconds on the board to set up Grant Clemons for a 56-yard field goal to tie the game. The Daleville, Virginia, native split the uprights for a new career-best mark, topping his 46-yarder from last week at The Citadel to send the game into overtime.

In overtime, the Keydets were given the ball first and quickly scored on a 25-yard run around the left edge by Ramsey to put VMI up 48-41 in what proved to be the game-winning score.

On the Bulldog's possession facing a 2nd-and-5, VMI's Liam Kauthen earned a huge sack for a loss of 10 yards to put Samford in a 3rd-and-15 scenario. Bulldog quarterback Chris Oladokun found A.J. Toney for a 12-yard pass to set up a 4th-and-3 with the game on the line. A trick play on fourth down resulted in the Bulldogs' Yassar El-Amin throwing the ball over the outstretched hands of a wide open Chris Shelling in the endzone to give VMI the win and opportunity for the corps of cadets to rush the field in celebration.

Late VMI Rally Falls Short in Loss at Mercer

MACON, Ga. – Despite a furious fourth quarter rally, the VMI football team fell by a 34-27 score to host Mercer Saturday evening at Five Star Stadium in Macon, Georgia.



Down 27-6 heading into the fourth quarter, VMI (4-4, 3-2 SoCon), outscored the Bears 21-7 in the final 15 minutes but could not quite overcome the deficit in the loss. In a game that featured an hour-long weather delay, the Keydets lost just their second Southern Conference game of the season.

Despite the rainy conditions, VMI junior quarterback Reece Udinski broke the FCS record of consecutive passes without an interception held by Jimmy Blanchard of Portland State in 1999 with 344 consecutive passes without a pick. Udinski finished his record-setting day with a 26-of-46 passing effort for 263 yards and one touchdown.

Fresh off his own record-breaking game last week, redshirt junior running back Alex Ramsey gained 125 yards on the ground against the Bears and now has four 100-yard rushing games this season. Ramsey scored his 17th rushing touchdown for the season, tying the school mark set by Thomas Haskins in 1995.

Mercer would strike first with a 40-yard field goal by Caleb Dowden. The lead did not last long as VMI's Grant Clemons made back-to-back field goals from 37 and 20 yards after a critical red zone interception by Riuq Trotman to prevent a Mercer score.

Mercer answered with a short touchdown pass from Robert Riddle to freshman Steven Peterson. Dowden would add another big field goal for Mercer to increase their lead before the half.

After an initial stop in the red zone by VMI, Mercer converted a fake field goal for a nine-yard touchdown to continue their lead at the start of the second half. Mercer quarterback replacement, Kaelan Riley, would add a 12-yard touchdown pass to Yahsyn McKee to put Mercer three touchdowns ahead heading into the final quarter.

VMI would answer with a 1-yard run by Alex Ramsey at the beginning of the fourth quarter. Reece Udinski continued the building VMI comeback with a two-yard touchdown to Colby Rider.

Mercer added a 56-yard touchdown run to their lead with three minutes left in the game to regain a two-touchdown deficit for VMI and secure the win. With one-minute remaining VMI's Alex Ramsey scored his second touchdown of the game to put the game within one score.

VMI will take a break next week before hosting Western Carolina for their sixth conference game of the season on November 2. Kickoff will have a 1:30 p.m. start at Foster Stadium and will be aired on ESPN+.
