QUICK HITS

KEYDETS RETURN HOME TO FACE SAMFORD – VMI returns home for its final game in the month of October when it faces conference rival Samford Saturday at Foster Stadium. It will be the fourth of five home games scheduled in the 2021 fall season and the Keydets will be looking to keep their undefeated home mark unblemished. The Keydets are 3-0 at home this season and have not reached four home wins in a season since 2008 when they were 4-2. VMI has won seven of its last eight home games at Foster Stadium.

OVERTIME, ANYONE – The last two meetings between the VMI and Samford resulted in overtime. The Keydets were able to come out on top in both shootouts with a 38-37 come from behind win in Birmingham last March and a 48-41 victory in 2019 on Family Weekend in Lexington.

BACK IN THE RANKINGS – Following an impressive 45-7 road win over Mercer October 16, the VMI football team returned to the FCS top 25 national polls after a two-week absence. In the rankings released Monday, October 18, the Keydets were No. 21 in the Stats Perform Top 25 FCS poll and No. 23 in the AFCA FCS coaches poll. After being idle last Saturday with a bye week, VMI is now no. 18 in both polls.

FIVE WIN MARK ATTAINED AGAIN – The win over Mercer October 18 secured VMI its fifth win for the third consecutive season – something that hasn't been attained in program history since the 1960 through 1962 campaigns when VMI went 7-2, 6-4, and 6-4 in successive years.

RUSHING RAMPAGE – VMI's 45-7 win over Mercer October 16 featured an outburst in the rushing attack with 306 of VMI's 436 total yards coming on the ground. It was the most rushing yards by the Keydets since rolling up 422 against Old Dominion on November 21, 2009 when VMI employed a triple-option attack.

A VMI Win over Samford would ...

- Be VMI's third consecutive win in the series.
- Move VMI to 4-0 at home this season.
- Clinch back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1961-62.

THE SERIES: This will be the ninth meeting in the rivalry and Samford holds a 6-2 lead in the rivalry. The Bulldogs claimed the first six matchups before the Keydets broke through overtime wins in 2019 in Lexington (48-41, OT) and in in Birmingham last spring (38-37 OT). The teams first met in 2001 in Lexington (Samford, 46-28) and the series resumed in 2014 when VMI rejoined the SoCon and the teams have met each year since.

- MERCER GAME NOTES -

OLIVER PICKS A PAIR - Sophomore cornerback Alex Oliver's two interceptions against Mercer October 16 was the second time this season a Keydet had two interceptions in a game. Aljareek Malry had two in the opener against Davidson September 4. Oliver's pick six for a TD return on the first play of the game was VMI's first since Tyren Cloyd returned one against Chattanooga on Oct. 27, 2018.

MORE RICE – Redshirt sophomore Jerry Rice has been a model of consistency this season his 26-yard field goal at Mercer made him 11 for 13 in field goals and he is now 26 for 26 in PAT attempts. Five of his field goals have come from 40 yards or longer including the career-high 49 yarder against Chattanooga.

Head Coach Scott Wachenheim - Seventh Season

Entering his seventh season as VMI's head football coach, Scott Wachenheim has taken VMI Football back to championship level play and guided the program toward football prominence on the FCS level.

In the spring football season of 2021, Wachenheim led the Keydets to a 6-2 season mark and the Southern Conference football championship after going 6-1 in league play – securing the Institute's first title since 1977 and first outright league championship since 1974. VMI also attained its first FCS national ranking and completed the year ranked 12th in the polls while also earning its first ever FCS playoff appearance. The season was VMI's first winning campaign since 1981. The Keydets also successfully defending the Silver Shako award for the first time since 1995-96.

The spring 2021 football season was highlighted by an undefeated 3-0 road record in the regular season – the program's first since 1922.

For his leadership in a historic year, Wachenheim was named FCS national coach of the year by Stats Perform which presented him the prestigious Eddie Robinson Award. He also was named FCS National coach of the year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). Wachenheim was also a consensus Southern Conference Coach of the Year by both the media and coaches and was tabbed top Division I coach in the Commonwealth of Virginia by both the Virginia Sports Information Directors and Touchdown Club of Richmond.

The historic 2021 spring season was a story in the making as Wachenheim laid the foundation for success by implementing the "Air Raid" offense and an aggressive defensive system.

A 1984 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy and veteran coach with over 27 years of experience in the college ranks, Wachenheim came to VMI from the University of Virginia where he had served for five seasons, including being the Cavaliers offensive line coach since 2011. Prior to his tenure in Charlottesville, Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Liberty University for three seasons (2006-08).

Wachenheim graduated from the Air Force Academy with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering and was a four-year starter from 1980-83. He earned first team All-WAC and honorable mention All-America honors his senior year.

TWO CENTURY MARK RUSHERS –

Redshirt freshman running back Rashad Raymond and true freshman running back Hunter Rice both had career-high rushing days in the win over Mercer. Raymond had a career high 163 yards including an 80-yard touchdown run against the Bears while Rice rushed for a career-high 112 yards 17 carries and three touchdowns. The last time VMI had two 100-yard rushers in a game was 2009 vs. Army (Howard Abegesah-111 and Cam Jones-100).

DEFENSE DOMINATES VS BEARS –

VMI's defense led the way in the 45-7 win at Mercer October 16 as the Keydets limited Mercer to 23 yards rushing after the Bears entered the game averaging 280 yards on the ground - fifth in FCS. Mercer was limited to 9 first downs and converted just 2 of 14 in third down conversions while the Keydets had 10 TFL for 52 yards. VMI's defense entered the Mercer game with just two sacks in the season and had three for 19 yards during the afternoon in Macon.

- CHATTANOOGA GAME NOTES -

RICE NAMED SOCON SPECIAL TEAMS

PLAYER OF THE WEEK - Redshirt sophomore Jerry Rice was named the Southern Conference Special Teams Player of the Week presented by GEICO on October 11. Rice accounted for a career-high 17 points as the Keydets downed the Mocs in overtime, 37-34. The redshirt sophomore from Daleville, Virginia, converted both of his extra-point attempts and was 5-for-5 on field-goal attempts to match VMI's single-game record for field goals set in 1977 by Craig Jones. He scored the game's first nine points, converting field goals of 32, 27 and 18 yards in the first half. His career-long 49-yard field goal with 41 seconds left in the contest put VMI up 34-31, but after Chattanooga tied it on a last-second field goal, Rice hit from 37 yards in overtime to give the Keydets their first win over a ranked opponent this season.

3-0 AT HOME – The Keydets moved to 3-0 at Foster Stadium October 9 with a come-from-behind victory over Chattanooga in OT which made them 3-0 at

Foster Stadium. It also was VMI's seventh victory out of the last eight home games and the ninth conference win over the last 11 outings.

JACKSON CLUTCH CATCHES – Senior wide receiver Michael Jackson caught six passes for a career-high 140 yards and two touchdowns to help VMI past Chattanooga SOctober 9. Jackson snagged two aeriels from VMI quarterback Seth Morgan in acrobatic fashion for second half touchdowns covering 19 and 20 yards for a career-best in TD receptions in a game. On the season, Jackson has caught 20 passes for 256 yards – third best on the team in both categories.

MORGAN ARM ACTIVE – Redshirt sophomore Seth Morgan returned to the starting quarterback role October 9 against Chattanooga and completed 30 of 42 passes for a season-high 306 yards which was his fourth career 300-yard passing game which ties him with Eric Kordenbrock for third most in school history.

Foster Stadium. It also was VMI's seventh victory out of the last eight home games and the ninth conference win over the last 11 outings.

JACKSON CLUTCH CATCHES – Senior wide receiver Michael Jackson caught six passes for a career-high 140 yards and two touchdowns to help VMI past Chattanooga SOctober 9. Jackson snagged two aeriels from VMI quarterback Seth Morgan in acrobatic fashion for second half touchdowns covering 19 and 20 yards for a career-best in TD receptions in a game. On the season, Jackson has caught 20 passes for 256 yards – third best on the team in both categories.

MORGAN ARM ACTIVE – Redshirt sophomore Seth Morgan returned to the starting quarterback role October 9 against Chattanooga and completed 30 of 42 passes for a season-high 306 yards which was his fourth career 300-yard passing game which ties him with Eric Kordenbrock for third most in school history.

MORE RICE – Redshirt sophomore Jerry Rice has been a model of consistency this season and is 10 for 11 in field goals and 20 for 20 in PAT attempts. Five of his field goals have come from 40 yards or before including the career-high 49 yarder against Chattanooga.

VMI IN OT – VMI's 37-34 overtime win over Chattanooga moved the Keydets to 4-0 against the Mocs in games decided beyond regulation with all the wins coming in Lexington. Overall, VMI is 10-5 on overtime games.

BRIDY RAMBLES ON – Senior running back Corey Bridy produced his second 100-yard rushing game of the season and fourth of his career with 165 yards on a career-high 36 carries against the Mocs. Bridy leads the team in rushing with 614 yards and averaging 102.3 yards per game which ranks third in the SoCon.

CULBREATH TOPS IN SOCON – Sophomore punter Jack Culbreath is experiencing a breakthrough year handling the Keydet punting chores and is averaging 45.2 yards per punt which is barely behind current leader Matt Campbell (45.4) for the SoCon #1 spot in punting.

HERRES STREAK CONTINUES - With five catches against Chattanooga, Jakob Herres extended his consecutive games streak with a reception to 26 contests.

HIGH MARK FOR "O" – The Keydets produced their highest total offense of the season against the Mocs with 485 yards which was fueled by season bests single game totals in rushing (179) and yards passing (306). It was the best total offense output by VMI since the spring '21 Wofford game which saw the Keydets roll up 503 yards.

- THE CITADEL GAME NOTES -

SNYDER DOUBLES UP AGAIN - Junior linebacker Stone Snyder posted back-to-back double-digit tackles when he led the Keydets with 12 tackles against The Citadel October 2. Snyder currently leads the VMI defensive charts with 68 tackles including 29 solo stops and has 4.0 tackles for loss for 13 yards. His 9.7 tackles per game are second in the SoCon in that category.

HERRES UP THE CAREER CHARTS – Senior wide receiver Jakob Herres has moved into the #2 spot in all-time receiving yards at VMI with 2,845 yards and is second only to Mark Stock (1984-88) who had 3,091 yards in his career. Herres also logged his 13th career 100+ yard receiving game with nine catches for 115 yards against The Citadel.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE – Since returning to action September 25, VMI sophomore wide receiver Chance Knox has given the offense and special teams another weapon. Against The Citadel October 2, Knox caught six passes for 42 yards including an 18-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter and returned a kickoff 84 yards to set up another second half score. In his first two games this year, Knox has 11 catches for 79 yards and two scores.

- WOFFORD GAME NOTES -

SNYDER EARNS SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - VMI junior linebacker Stone Snyder had a season-best 19 tackles in the Keydets' 31-23 win over Wofford, just two off his career high and was named SoCon Defensive Player of the Week September 27. The 2020-21 SoCon Defensive Player of the Year from Richmond, Virginia had five

solo stops and 14 assisted tackles on the afternoon, including 1.5 tackles for loss for 1 yard. Snyder also added a quarterback hurry as the Keydets beat Wofford in consecutive games for the first time since 1988 and 1992.

BRIDY HAS BREAKOUT DAY – Senior running back Corey Bridy set a new career-high in rushing yards with 171 yards on 22 carries against Wofford Saturday. Bridy scored on touchdown runs of five and 34 yards and also returned four kicks for 90 yards including a 33-yarder.

MILESTONE WATCH – Keydet receivers Jakob Herres and Leroy Thomas both surpassed milestones after the September 25 game with Wofford. Herres caught four passes for 62 yards against the Terriers and has 201 career receptions to join Aaron Sanders as the only two in program history to hit that mark. Thomas had 110 career receptions and 1,026 career yards after catching three passes for 61 yards against Wofford.

IRONSIDE SHINES AGAIN – After engineering a Keydet victory in reserve duty following Seth Morgan's injury at Cornell, Ironside led the Keydets to a win over Wofford one week later in the SoCon opener in his first college start at quarterback. Ironside completed 18 of 22 passes for 183 yards and threw for touchdowns strikes of 20 yards to Chance Knox and 47 yards to Leroy Thomas. Through four games, Ironside is completing .700 of his passes for 523 yards and four touchdowns.

RICE CONTINUES RANGE - Redshirt sophomore place kicker Jerry Rice kicked his fifth consecutive field goal over 40 yards dating back to last year when he connected on a 42-yarder in the fourth quarter against Wofford. Rice is four for five on the season with all his makes in the fall season coming from 40+ yards.

BACK-TO-BACK – With a 31-23 win over Wofford September 25, VMI logged second straight win over the Terriers and first back-to-back victories in the series since November 7, 1992 when a 44-13 victory in Lexington marked VMI's ninth straight in the rivalry.

GOOD START AGAIN – The win over Wofford September 25 marked three straight Southern Conference opening victories for the Keydets. VMI won its 2019 conference opener at ETSU and last spring knocked off Furman in Lexington which laid the foundation for a SoCon title run. The last time VMI had won three straight Southern Conference openers was 1961 through 1963 when the Keydets registered victories over Richmond once and George Washington twice.

WELCOME BACK – Two Keydets who had been sidelined for extended periods because of injury returned to the field against Wofford September 25 for their first action of 2021. Sophomore wide receiver Chance Knox missed the first three games of the season but shined his 2021 fall debut when he caught a team-high five passes for 37 yards including a 20-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. Senior outside linebacker Carter Johnson made his first start since March 13 and was credited with two tackles against the Terriers.

- CORNELL GAME NOTES -

VMI vs. IVY LEAGUE – The 31-21 win at Cornell September 18 was VMI's first win over an Ivy League opponent in program history. VMI defeated Columbia twice in 1897 and 1898 but the Ivy League athletic conference was not officially formed until 1954.

ROAD SUCCESS CONTINUES – The win at Cornell continued VMI's recent road success as it has won four of its last five games away from Lexington dating back to last season.

IRONSIDE ANSWERS THE CALL - VMI redshirt freshman quarterback Collin Ironside threw for two touchdowns to senior wide receiver Jakob Herres and completed 27 of 42 passes for 230 yards in reserve duty help lead the Keydets to victory at Cornell. Ironside was inserted into the game when starting QB Seth Morgan left the field with injury during VMI's second drive of the first quarter. Ironside later engineered a five play, 30-yard drive set up by a Stone Snyder fumble recovery. He later connected on touchdown strikes to Herres from 16 and seven yards.

HERRES TOP TARGET AGAIN – Senior wide receiver Jakob Herres led VMI in receiving for the second straight game with seven catches for 60 yards and his two touchdown receptions pushed his school record career TD catch mark to 25. He has also caught at least one pass in 24 consecutive games.

SNYDER ON THE BALL – Junior linebacker Stone Snyder has racked up some impressive numbers over the last two seasons but still did not have a fumble recovery in his career until his scoop of a loose ball and return of 20 yards to set up VMI's first score against Cornell Saturday.

RICE CONTINUES RANGE - Redshirt sophomore place kicker Jerry Rice kicked his fourth consecutive field goal over 40 yards when he connected on a 41-yarder on the last play of the first half against Cornell.

BRIDY PROVIDES SPARK IN WIN – Senior running back Korey Bridy provided the spark to key VMI's 31-21 win at Cornell September 18. Bridy added 92 yards rushing and a touchdown and his 61-yard kick return set up VMI's last second field goal in the first half which put the Keydets up for good on the afternoon.

KEYDETS OVERCOME MARKERS – VMI's uncharacteristic 11 penalties for 103 yards in the win at Cornell were the most since 11 flags when VMI took on Western Carolina on November 15, 2014 contest at Cullowhee, North Carolina.

- KENT STATE GAME NOTES -

RICE BROTHERS SHINE – Redshirt sophomore place kicker Jerry Rice kicked his third consecutive field goal over 40 yards when he connected on a 43-yarder September 11 against Kent State and younger brother Hunter, a freshman running back, scored his first touchdown in the fourth quarter with a two-yard burst. Hunter also excelled on special teams delivering a big hit on return coverage.

- DAVIDSON GAME NOTES -

VMI's 45-24 win over Davidson September 4 at Foster Stadium marked the second straight year VMI opener the season with a home victory. The 2021 fall opener was the first time VMI has played back-to-back home openers at Foster Stadium since the 2010 and 2011 seasons. The Keydets opened on the road from 2012 through 2019 before starting

the 2020-21 spring season at home against Furman when they defeated the #10 ranked Paladins, 14-13, for their first win over a ranked opponent since 2002.

SCORING OUTBURST IN OPENER – The 45 points by the Keydets against Davidson September 4 were the most in a season opener under coach Scott Wachenheim and the most in a season opener since a 48-6 win over Lock Haven State at Foster Stadium in 2010.

MALRY PICKS LEAD KEYDETS – Junior cornerback Aljareek Malry turned in two interceptions against Davidson to help the Keydet defense generate three takeaways in the season opener. It was the first career interceptions by Malry and the first time a Keydet defender had two or more interceptions in a game since the 2019 season when A.J. Smith and Kaleb Tucker each picked off two passes against Mars Hill on September 7, 2019.

MORGAN ON THE MARK – Redshirt sophomore Seth Morgan, who took over for the injured Reece Udinski at quarterback in mid-season last year and guided the Keydet offense to a SoCon title the rest of the way, returned to the starting signal caller role in the fall 2021 campaign. Against Davidson in the season opener, Morgan completed 10 of his first 11 passes of the game and finished 18 of 23 for 157 yards and two touchdowns. In his first college start last season at Wofford March 27, he accounted for 375 yards total offense which was the second most in a single game in program history. On the season, he completed 122 of 171 passes for 1,374 yards and 10 touchdowns with just four interceptions. Morgan's .713 completion percentage in 2020-21 ranked second in FCS, while his 153.46 pass efficiency ranked ninth in the nation. He was named SoCon Freshman of the Year and State of Virginia Freshman of the Year.

TWO MORE FOR HERRES – Senior wide receiver Jakob Herres hauled in touchdown receptions of nine and 13 yards to give him 23 for his career and added to his career record mark established last year when he surpassed former NFL receiver Mark Stock (1984-88) who had 20 TD catches during his career at the Institute.

RAYMOND REACHES END ZONE – Sophomore running backs Rashad Raymond scored his first collegiate touchdown against Davidson September 4. Raymond, who was VMI's third leading rusher last spring with 215 yards on eight carries, reached the endzone for the first time at VMI with a one-yard run in the fourth quarter.

RICE KICKS CAREER-BEST – Redshirt sophomore kicker Jerry Rice kicked a career-best 46-yard field goal at the end of the first half in the September 4 opener against Davidson. It surpassed his previous long of 44 yards in the FCS playoff game at James Madison April 24, 2021.

NOT BUSY AT FOSTER – Sophomore punter Jack Culbreath was called on just once in the season opener at home against Davidson marking the fewest punts by the Keydets in a game since the previous home game last spring when Culbreath punted just once against The Citadel, April 17, 2021.

GOOD DEBUTS FROM DUNN, MARTIN – Two Keydet defenders making their college debuts topped the defensive tackles charts against Davidson September 4. Redshirt freshman Christian Dunn posted seven tackles with 1.5 tackles-for-loss (7 yards) in his first game and start as a Keydet. True freshman defensive lineman Kandler Martin also had seven stops including six solos in his first appearance as a Keydet.

TWO-DEEP NOTES – VMI's starting lineup September 4 against Davidson had 11 offensive starters who had started at least one contest in their college careers. On defense, four Keydets made their first college start against the Wildcats – Christian Dunn and Aladdin Elroumy at outside linebackers, Josh Knapp at free safety and Evan Eller at strong safety.

IRONSIDE TAKES FIRST SNAPS AT QB – Redshirt freshman quarterback Colin Ironside saw his first action as a Keydet September 4 against Davidson when he was inserted into the game with two minutes remaining in the third quarter. Ironside played the entire fourth quarter and completed all four pass attempts for 16 yards and added two rushes for 12 yards.

- NOTING THE KEYDETS -

EXPERIENCE RETURNS – Many faces who contributed to VMI's historic Southern Conference Championship last spring will be back on the field contributing this fall. Most of the returnees in the starting lineup will be on the offensive side of the ball where ten with substantial starting experience return. On defense, the Keydets will have to replace four key performers including both starting safeties, but return six starters who played a key role in VMI's championship run. The Keydets also return all three key special teams positions.

KEYDETS PLACE SIX ON ALL-CONFERENCE

PRESEASON SQUADS – Six Keydets earned spots on the Southern Conference Preseason All-Conference teams announced at the league's kickoff event in Asheville, North Carolina. Landing All-SoCon preseason first team spots were wide receiver Jakob Herres, offensive lineman Marshall Gill, Snyder at linebacker, and defensive back Ethan Caselberry. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Seth Morgan was voted on the preseason second team along with senior defensive lineman Warren Dabney. The teams were voted on by the conference coaches.

SNYDER NAMED SOCON DEFENSIVE PRESEASON

PLAYER OF THE YEAR - VMI junior linebacker Stone Snyder was named 2020-21 SoCon Preseason Defensive Player of the Year and looks to build on his breakthrough All-America season established in VMI's championship season last spring. Snyder emerged as one of the top defensive players in FCS. He was named the 2020-21 Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Year in both the media and coaches' polls after leading the league in tackles per game (11.0) – 76 in seven regular season games, including a career-high 21 versus The Citadel. Snyder had 9.5 tackles for loss (64 yards), eight sacks (62 yards) and four QB hurries. He also had 12 tackles in the first round of the playoffs against #1 James Madison on April 24 and finished third in voting for the Buck Buchanan FCS defensive Player of the Year honor. Snyder was a multiple All-American after being named to Stats Perform, Athlon, and Hero Sports first teams. He was also named State Defensive Player of the Year by VASID, the Commonwealth's sports information directors.

HERRES LEADS VETERAN RECEIVING CORPS – Senior wide receiver Jakob Herres returns as one of the top performers in FCS after earning 2020-21 SoCon Offensive Player of the Year in both the coaches' and media voting. Herres led the Keydets in receiving during the season with 80 catches for 978 yards and eight touchdowns, averaging 12.2 yards per grab and 122.2 yards per game, all of which led the

Southern Conference. Herres was a consensus All-America first team selection to include Stats Perform, AFCA, and Athlon teams and was also one of 16 finalists for the Stats Perform Walter Payton Award for the national FCS Offensive Player of the Year and finished fourth in voting.

THREE KEYDETS EARN ALL-AMERICA PRESEASON HONORS

– Three VMI Keydets were represented on the 2021 Stats Perform Preseason FCS All-America Squad announced in mid-August. After a stellar 2020-21 spring season, Keydet wide receiver Jakob Herres and linebacker Stone Snyder were named to the First Team and long snapper Robert Soderholm was named to the Second Team. All 15 FCS conferences and 60 schools are represented among the 120 All-Americans, who are split into three 40-player teams. Over 80 percent of the players earned a spot on a previous Stats Perform preseason or postseason All-America squad. In June, both Snyder and Herres were announced to the Athlon FCS Preseason All-America team.

BRIDY BACK – The Keydet running game got a boost in 2020-21 when junior Korey Bridy was on the field. After a two-game absence because of injury in late season. Bridy caught a 17-yard screen pass from Seth Morgan for VMI's first score against The Citadel in VMI's title clinching game April 17. Earlier last season, Bridy posted his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game with 109 yards on 27 carries and a touchdown against Samford March 20. One week after a career-high 91 yards against Western Carolina, Bridy topped the 100-yard rushing mark for the first time in his career with 113 yards on 27 carries against Mercer March 13 as VMI netted 212 yards rushing against the Bears for its best rushing outing as a team since 220 yards against Mars Hill on September 7, 2019. Bridy led the team in rushing in 2020-21 with 344 yards and four touchdowns.

VMI SECURES WINNING SEASON, AND A LOT MORE

– With the 36-31 come-from-behind win over Wofford March 27, VMI started the 2020-21 season at 5-0 for the first time since 1960. The Keydets also secured their first winning season since 1981 ending a span of nearly four decades where the closest the Keydets could come to winning marks were a pair of consecutive 6-6 records in 2002 and 2003. VMI had also won six straight games dating back to the 2019 season finale which is the longest consecutive win streak for the program since 1959-60 when the Keydets reeled off 12 straight wins over two consecutive SoCon championship seasons. The subsequent Southern Conference championship that followed in the 2020-21 spring season was VMI's eighth conference football championship and it earned the program its first FCS playoff appearance.

WACHENHEIM RECEIVES CONTRACT EXTENSION

– Following a historic season leading VMI to its first Southern Conference title in 43 years and voted as the nation's top FCS coach, Virginia Military Institute acting director of athletics Lenny Brown announced September 1 that head football coach Scott Wachenheim has agreed to terms for a contract extension that will run through the 2025 season. Wachenheim, who led VMI football to a historic season last spring by leading the Keydets to their first Southern Conference football championship since 1977 and first FCS playoff appearance, received a three-year extension beyond the existing contract which was set to expire following the 2022 season.

Entering his seventh season as VMI's head football coach, Wachenheim guided the Keydets to a 6-2 season mark and

the 2020-21 Southern Conference football championship after going 6-1 in league play – securing the Institute's first outright league championship since 1974. VMI also attained its first FCS national ranking and completed the year ranked 12th in the polls while also earning its first ever FCS playoff appearance. The season was VMI's first winning campaign since 1981. The Keydets also successfully defended the Silver Shako trophy, awarded to the winner of the series with The Citadel, for the first time since 1995-96. Wachenheim was named 2021 Spring FCS national coach of the year by Stats Perform which presented him the prestigious Eddie Robinson Award and was also named FCS national coach of the year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). Wachenheim was a consensus Southern Conference Coach of the Year voted by both the media and coaches and was tabbed top Division I coach in the Commonwealth of Virginia by both the Virginia Sports Information Directors and Touchdown Club of Richmond. Wachenheim was also named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 2019.

ROAD WARRIORS – VMI finished its 2021 spring football season with a perfect 3-0 road mark in regular season games and went undefeated on the road for the first time since 1922 when the "Flying Squadron" under coach Blandy Clarkson went 3-0 in road tests. All three VMI football regular season road victories this year occurred where VMI had never won before and ended winless droughts at Western Carolina (13 games), Samford (three games) and Wofford (seven games).

RICE HAS IMPRESSIVE DEBUT – Redshirt sophomore Jerry Rice looks to build on an impressive debut after taking over the Keydet placekicking chores in 2020-21. Rice had his successful field goal string of six straight conversions end in the first half against Wofford on March 27, but later came back to kick a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter. He was two for two against ETSU April 3 and finished 11 of 14 overall on the year converting five of his last six attempts. Rice earlier kicked three field goals against Western Carolina March 6 in Cullowhee connecting on attempts of 27, 29, and 32 yards for his first converted field goals of his college career. It marked the first time that a VMI kicker had three field goals in a game since Barrett Way against Charleston Southern on October 21, 2006.

OT STRING CONTINUES – With a 38-37 overtime win over Samford March 20, VMI continued its string of extra play success since the rules were adopted in the 90's. The Keydets moved to 9-4 in overtime play and have won their last three contests that have gone beyond regulation time. VMI is also 4-0 all-time in road overtime games.

VMI ATTAINS FIRST FCS RANKING – For the first time since joining the FCS college football classification, VMI finished the season with a national ranking after the 2020-21 spring football season. The Keydets were ranked 12th in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 final poll released May 17. It's not the first ever national ranking for the program as VMI finished the 1957 season ranked 20th in the Associated Press poll after going 9-0-1 under legendary coach John McKenna. The Keydets attained a ranking as high as 13th during that season. In 1982, VMI was reclassified into the Division I-AA ranks which later became the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). It never attained a national ranking as an FCS member before this year, but did receive votes in 1991, 2002, and 2019.

DEFENSIVE STANDOUT ERIC WEAVER TO WEAR "0" IN 2020-21 -

With 2020-21 team captain Jordan Ward now graduated and continuing his college football career as a graduate transfer at Ball State, redshirt junior Eric Weaver now takes over the "0" jersey reserved for a top performing defensive lineman. Weaver, who wore "52" his first three years at VMI, developed into a key performer along the D-line and started all eight games at nose tackle and generated 22 tackles on the year and helped channel big tackle numbers for linebackers in the defensive scheme. He had three games of four tackles each (Samford, The Citadel, James Madison) and was credited with tackles for loss at Samford (1-2 yards) and Wofford (0.5 - 3 yards). Weaver also produced a quarterback hurry against Mercer and broke up passes against ETSU and James Madison.

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER – The 2021 VMI Football roster sports a youthful look with 29 true freshmen, 29 redshirt freshmen, 27 sophomores, 12 juniors, and 9 seniors.

KEYDETS HONOR WHITE – VMI Football will pay tribute this season to Donny White '65 by wearing a special "DW" decal on the football helmet. White, who passed away on August 17, had a 35-year relationship with Keydets athletics as a two-sport football and baseball star, defensive football coach under Bob Thalman mostly in the 70's, head VMI baseball coach from 1982-1987, and the Institute's athletic director from 1998 to 2013. White is a member of the VMI Sports Hall of Fame.

WESTERN CAROLINA GAME START MOVED TO 12:30 PM-

The November 20 season finale with Western Carolina has been moved to 12:30 pm from its original 1:30 kickoff to avoid possible issues with darkness later that afternoon. Foster Stadium does not have lights and sunset for Lexington that day will be 5:03 pm.

Keydets Win OT Thriller at Samford, 38-37

BIRMINGHAM, Va. – Junior receiver Michael Jackson hauled in a two-point conversion pass from quarterback Reece Udinski in the back of the endzone to lift #18/19 VMI to a 38-37 overtime win over Samford Saturday afternoon in Southern Conference football action in Birmingham, Alabama.

With the victory VMI remained unbeaten and moved to 4-0 on the season, keeping a half game ahead of Chattanooga (3-0) in the SoCon race as the Mocs won at Furman Saturday. The 4-0 start is also the first for the program since 1981.

The Keydets rallied from a 13-point fourth quarter deficit to gain their second overtime win over Samford in the last two meetings.

The Bulldogs (2-3) led 30-17 following the third of Michael Fineran's field goals at the 8:34 mark of the fourth quarter.

VMI answered on the ensuing drive when a wide-open Jackson took a 16-yard pass from Udinski to the endzone to pull the Keydets within a score, 30-24, with 5:25 remaining. VMI moved 77 yards on 10 plays and took just over three minutes off the fourth-quarter clock.

The Keydet defense forced Samford into a three-and-out on the next drive and the Keydets took over at their own 42. VMI had to punt it away, but the VMI defense gave the Keydets new life when Bulldog quarter Liam Welch was intercepted by sophomore safety Josh Sarratt at the Samford 45 with 2:41 left in regulation.

Udinski, who had left the game on the previous drive due to injury, returned and engineered an eight-play, 45-yard scoring drive that was capped by a 17-yard scoring toss to Herres with 1:11 left in the fourth quarter. The extra point attempt was missed off the left upright, leaving the game tied at 30-30.

Samford moved the ball to the VMI 45 with :23 left but an 11-yard sack by Tyren Cloyd on the last play of regulation snuffed out any hopes of a game ending field goal try by the hosts.

The teams headed into overtime with Samford on offense first. The Bulldogs retook the lead four snaps later when Welch floated a pass in the left corner of the endzone to wide receiver Montrell Washington and the extra point made it 37-30.

The Keydets took over and faced a 4th and 3 from the Bulldog 18. Udinski then fired a strike to the right corner of the endzone that Herres hauled in and pulled the Keydets within 37-36. Rather than kick the extra-point to force another OT, VMI called timeout and elected to go for the win on a two-point try. Udinski fire a pass over the middle which found Jackson in the back end of the end zone for the game winner sending the Keydet sideline into pandemonium.

Herres finished with a career-high 14 catches for 166 yards and his two TD grabs gave him 16 for his career. The 14 catches were also the second most in game in program history behind Aaron Sanders in 2015. Jackson also had a career-high in catches with eight receptions for 60 yards.

Udinski completed 40 of 57 passes for 353 yards and three touchdowns for his 10th 300-yard game and 22nd contest with 200 or more yards passing. He also became VMI's all-time passing leader moving past Al Cobb (2014-16) and now has 7,877 yards for the #1 spot.

Junior running back Korey Bridy posted his second straight 100-yard game with 109 yards rushing with a touchdown.

Defensively, VMI was led on the charts with 12 stops from sophomore Aljareek Malry while outside linebacker Connor Riddle added 11 tackles and an interception. Sarratt also reached double-digit tackles with 10 in addition to his fourth quarter pick.

Samford quarterback Liam Welch completed 37 of 59 passes for 570 yards and four touchdowns including a 96-yard strike to Ty King on the first Bulldog score in the first quarter.

Udinski tied the game at 17-17 before halftime with a 1-yard run at the 1:14 mark, but Samford answered in the second half with 13 unanswered points on a 60-yard TD pass to Montrell Washington flowed by a pair of Fineran field goals from 29 and 22 yards.

VMI is now 9-4 in OT in program history including 4-0 on the road.

Keydets Cruise to 45-24 Win over Davidson

LEXINGTON, Va. – Following an historic 2021 spring season, the 17th-ranked VMI football team opened the fall campaign with an impressive 45-24 win over Davidson College Saturday afternoon at Foster Stadium.



In the spring, both teams advanced to the FCS playoffs as champions of their respective conferences.

The Keydets (1-0) jumped out early on the Wildcats, opening a 21-0 lead in the second quarter and held at least two-score advantage the rest of the way. After the VMI defense forced a three-and-out in Davidson's first drive, senior running back Korey Bridy found the end zone with a 13-yard run to cap a 12-play, 69 yard drive. The Keydets took advantage of a Davidson turnover on the next possession and had to march just 40 yards to make the game 14-0. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Seth Morgan capped a two-play drive, running it in from four yards out.

Junior Aljareek Malry reeled in his first career interception at the end of the first quarter to again set up the Keydet offense in prime field position. Morgan capitalized with a nine-yard strike to Jakob Herres to push the lead to 21-0 early in the second period.

The Wildcats (0-1) got on the board at the 10:15 mark of the second quarter when Mark McCurdy took a pitch from quarterback Louis Colosimo and ran it 28 yards down the sideline for a touchdown to cut the VMI lead to 21-7. They would later add a 35-yard field goal by Caden Bonoffski with just under three minutes to play before the half.

VMI took advantage of the little time left and rushed down the field to set up a 46-yard field goal by Jerry Rice, a new career-high, as time expired to go into the half with a 24-10 lead.

Midway through the third quarter, Herres caught a 13-yard touchdown pass from Morgan to increase the VMI advantage to 31-10.

Both teams went scoreless until midway through the fourth quarter when VMI sophomore Rashad Raymond got into the endzone from one yard out to put the Keydets up, 38-10, with 7:41 to play.

Davidson's Coy Williams scored on a 34-yard run with 3:21 left to make the score 38-17, which VMI quickly countered when sophomore running back Grant Swinehart rumbled 52 yards for VMI's final touchdown of the game with 2:30 on the clock. Finishing the game strong, the Wildcats scored one final time with 32 seconds left on a 2-yard run by Bernard Turner for the game's final outcome.

Morgan finished going 18-for-23 for 157 yards and two touchdowns with only one pick. Bridy led the Keydets with 68 net yards on the ground while Leroy Thomas led all VMI receivers with 58 yards.

Williams led the Davidson rushing attack with 80 net yards on the ground while Bradyn Oakley led all Wildcats with 18 receiving yards.

The Keydets return to action next Saturday morning to face their only FBS opponent of the season in Kent State of the Mid-American Conference. Kickoff in Kent, Ohio, is set for 11:30 a.m.

Keydets Fall to FBS foe Kent State



KENT, Ohio - Facing its only FBS opponent of the season, VMI football fell by a 60-10 score to host Kent State on a warm Saturday afternoon in Kent, Ohio.

The Keydets (1-1) struggled to keep pace with the Golden Flashes (1-1) early in the game as Kent State rushed out to a 22-0 lead after the first quarter and added 17 in the second quarter to go into halftime with a commanding 39-0 advantage.

Kent State scored three rushing touchdowns in the opening quarter as Marquez Cooper, Dustin Crum and Nykeim Johnson found the end zone on consecutive drives en route to the 22-0 lead.

In the second quarter, Andrew Glass registered a 20-yard field goal early on before Bryan Bradford scored on a seven-yard rush on the ensuing possession. Moments before the half, the Golden Flashes added one more touchdown on a Nykeim Johnson 20-yard reception to give Kent State a 39-0 lead at the break.

VMI received the kick after halftime and went on a 9-play, 46-yard drive that culminated with a 43-yard field goal by redshirt sophomore Jerry Rice, the third longest distance of his career, to keep the Keydets from going scoreless in the contest.

Kent State would go on to log two more rushing touchdowns in the third quarter to make the score 53-3 with one quarter to play.

VMI freshman running back Hunter Rice scored on a five-yard run with 2:45 on the clock for his first career touchdown at VMI to give the Keydets their only touchdown for the day. Kent State's Daniel Bangura ended the contest with a 49-yard touchdown rush just seconds later for the game's final score.

Keydet quarterback Seth Morgan finished the game going 10-24 for 55 yards to go with three interceptions. Redshirt freshman Collin Ironside saw significant time on the field and went 7-12 for 91 yards and one pick.

Rashad Raymond led VMI with 57 net rushing yards while Hunter Rice finished with 39 yards on the ground.

VMI receiver Jakob Herres caught four passes for 23 yards and Leroy Thomas ended up with 13 yards on three receptions. Julio DaSilva earned a team-high 37 receiving yards on two catches.

Kent State quarterback Dustin Crum led the Golden Flashes' attack by going 12-17 for 180 yards through the air with no picks and one passing touchdown. Cooper finished with 180 yards on the ground to lead the running backs and Nykeim Johnson ended up with 55 receiving yards on five grabs.

Keydets Holds Off Cornell, 31-21



ITHACA, NY. – VMI redshirt freshman quarterback Collin Ironside threw for two touchdowns to senior wide receiver Jakob Herres and senior running back Korey Bridy added 92 yards rushing and a touchdown to lead #22 VMI to a 31-21 win over Cornell Saturday afternoon.

It was VMI's fourth road win over the last trips dating back to last spring as the Keydets took the first meeting between the schools. VMI never trailed in the contest but had to overcome 12 penalties and a resilient Cornell team to post the victory in its final non-conference test of the season.

The Big Red trimmed VMI's lead to 24-21 following a 17-yard touchdown run on a screen pass from Richie Kenney to Curtis Raymond III with 3:39 left in the third quarter, but the Keydets responded with a decisive fourth quarter 72-yard drive capped when Ironside connected with Herres on a fade throw to the right corner of the end zone for a seven-yard score with 6:57 left in the game. Bridy sparked the drive with a 42-yard rush down the right sideline and added three more rushes of 13 yards to put the Keydets in the red zone.

The VMI defense pitched a scoreless fourth quarter and limited Cornell to just 13 yards rushing in the final period and 80 yards for the game.

Ironside was inserted into the game when starting QB Seth Morgan left the field with injury during VMI's second drive of the first quarter. Ironside engineered a seven play, 30-yard drive set up by a Stone Snyder fumble recovery and return into Cornell territory. Bridy crashed in from the one-yard line and the Keydets took a 7-0 lead with 1:59 left in the first quarter.

Cornell evened the score at 7-7 on a 45-yard touchdown pass from Kenney to Thomas Glover with 11:08 left in the second quarter, but the Keydets retook the lead later in the quarter when Ironside found Herres over the middle for a 14-yard touchdown pass play at the 4:21 mark. The 36-yard scoring drive was set up when VMI sophomore punter Jack Culbreath cornered a punt at the Cornell 1-yard line and the Keydets defense held play on that end of the field.

The Big Red countered when Eric Diggs picked off a VMI pass attempt at midfield and eight plays later SK Howard darted in from three yards out to bring the Cornell even again at 14-14 with :21 seconds left.

Bridy took the ensuing kickoff to the Cornell 34-yard line and set up a Jerry Rice 41-yard field goal as time expired in the first half, putting the Keydets up for good on the afternoon.

After an exchange of punts to open the second half, VMI took a 24-14 lead with a 13-play, 53-yard scoring drive that ended when Ironside rolled right and dove into the endzone on a four-yard keeper with 6:19 remaining in the third period.

Bridy finished with 92 yards rushing while Ironside completed 27 of 42 passes for 230 yards. Herres caught seven passes for 60 yards while adding two more touchdown receptions to give him 25 for his VMI career. Junior Leroy Thomas added six catches for 54 yards and senior Michael Jackson caught four aerials for 54 yards.

Stone Snyder topped the VMI tackle charts with six stops including five solo tackles to go along with his first quarter fumble recovery.

Kenney completed 18 of 47 passes for 273 yards and two touchdowns for the Big Red while Glover led Cornell receivers with seven catches for 159 yards and a touchdown.

VMI opens Southern Conference action next Saturday against Wofford at Foster Stadium in Lexington. Kickoff is 1:30 pm.

Bridy Powers VMI to 31-23 Win over Wofford



LEXINGTON, Va. – Senior running back Korey Bridy rushed for a career-high 171 yards and scored two touchdowns Saturday to power the 22nd-ranked VMI football team to a 31-23 victory over visiting Wofford College in the first Southern Conference game of the season for both teams.

The Keydets opened a 28-17 lead late in the third quarter on Bridy's second touchdown of the day from 34 yards out. Wofford countered with an 11-play, 75 yard drive, capped by quarterback Jimmy Weirick's one-yard run on fourth down. The ensuing two-point conversion try failed, and VMI's Jerry Rice drilled a 42-yard field goal to make the score 31-23 with 8:42 remaining.

The Keydet defense came up big after Rice's field goal. Following a VMI turnover deep in its own end with 5:09 left, sophomore Austin White picked off Weirick at the VMI 15 to end the threat. The Terriers got the ball back with a last chance to tie with 1:23 on the game clock from their own 46, but couldn't convert on fourth and eight when Evan Eller brought the receiver down well short of the first-down marker.

Bridy contributed 263 all-purpose yards, including 90 kickoff return yards. Redshirt freshman quarterback Collin Ironside had a big game for VMI in his first-career start, completing 18-of-22 passes for 183 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. Leroy Thomas made three grabs for 61 yards and a touchdown, while Chance Knox had a team-best five catches for 37 yards and a score. Jakob Herres hauled in four passes for 62 yards.

Stone Snyder made 19 tackles, just two short of his career high. Josh Knapp made 10 stops and Austin White, Eller and Aladdin Elroumy each had eight tackles and Dunn had a fumble recovery.

The VMI defense made an important stand just before halftime. With the game tied at 14 and 41 seconds left before intermission, Wofford went for it on fourth and two from the VMI five. Snyder and Knapp stood up the ball carrier at the line of scrimmage and the Keydets gained possession on downs.

Wofford (1-2/ 0-1 SoCon) had four players with double-digit carries, led by Irvin Mulligan's 20 rushes for 134 yards and a touchdown. Weirick had 11 carries for 52 yards and two scores, and completed 11-of-19 passes. Jamari Broussard and Nathan Walker combined for 74 yards on 22 rushes.

VMI (3-1/1-0) travels to The Citadel next Saturday for another SoCon matchup at 2 p.m.

VMI Falls to The Citadel in Comeback Effort

CHARLESTON, S.C. – Hoping for a third straight victory over The Citadel in the Military Classic of the South, the VMI football team fell by a 35-24 score to the host Bulldogs Saturday afternoon at Johnson Hagood Stadium in Charleston, South Carolina.



With the win, the Bulldogs (2-2, 1-0) reclaim the Silver Shako that has been in VMI's possession the past two seasons.

VMI quarterback Seth Morgan finished the game going 20-30 for 208 yards through the air while running back Korey Bridy finished with 85 yards on the ground on 19 carries. Senior Jakob Herres led the receiving corps with 115 receiving yards on nine grabs.

The Citadel got on the board first on its opening possession when quarterback Jaylan Adams connected with Raleigh Webb for an 80-yard touchdown reception

After both teams went scoreless the remainder of the opening quarter, The Citadel again scored on a 14-yard rush by Logan Billings to put the Bulldogs up, 14-0, early in the second quarter.

VMI responded soon after with a three-yard touchdown scamper by Bridy to cut the deficit to 14-7 with 11:51 before the half.

The Bulldogs didn't take long to put up another touchdown on their ensuing possession when Billings scored on a 40-yard rush to increase The Citadel lead to 21-7 at the 8:36 mark.

VMI managed to score three more before the half as Jerry Rice converted a 23-yard field goal with 4:03 on the clock to go into the break with a 21-10 deficit.

Following a VMI fumble and a Citadel turnover on downs, the Keydets scored on an 18-yard pass from Seth Morgan to Chance Knox to make the score 21-17 at the 3:23 mark of the third quarter.

A Jaylan Adams 68-yard rush down the sideline set up his own three-yard rushing touchdown on the ensuing Citadel possession to increase the Bulldog lead to 28-17 with just over a minute left in the quarter.

Knox then returned The Citadel kickoff 84 yards down the sideline and was horse tackled to put VMI on The Citadel eight-yard line. Bridy scored on the first play of the first quarter on a 4-yard rush up the middle to cut the VMI deficit to 28-24 with 14:55 to play.

The Citadel converted on two fourth-down attempts on its next possession to set up a 22-yard rushing touchdown up the middle to up the Bulldog lead to 35-24 with 6:42 left in regulation.

Driving deep into The Citadel territory, an errant throw by Morgan was picked off in the endzone to give the ball back to the Bulldogs with 5:13 left.

The Keydets forced a punt, but on the resulting VMI drive Morgan was again intercepted off a throw intended for Herres. The Bulldogs successfully ran out the remaining 2:48 on the clock to end the contest.

Keydets Win OT Thriller over #19 Chattanooga

LEXINGTON, Va. – Redshirt sophomore Jerry Rice drilled a 37-yard field goal in overtime Saturday to lift the VMI football team to a 37-34 win over No. 19 Chattanooga in a Southern Conference game at Foster Stadium.

Rice converted on five field goals, including a career-long 49-yarder, with 41 seconds remaining in regulation to put VMI ahead 34-31. The Mocs forced overtime after an Aaron Sears 39-yard field goal with one second left.

The VMI defense came up big in the extra session, forcing two straight incomplete passes and Sears missed a 37-yard field goal before the Keydets got the ball. Three running plays put Rice at the same distance as Sears for his game winner.

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Seth Morgan completed 30-of-42 passes for 306 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. Senior Korey Bridy carried the ball 36 times for 165 yards while senior Michael Jackson caught six passes for 140 yards and two touchdowns. Chance Knox hauled in a team-high seven catches for 68 yards. Rice was 5-5 on the afternoon, tying the school record for most field goals in a game (Craig Jones, 1977 vs. William & Mary).

Josh Knapp had a team-best nine tackles, while Ethan Caselberry, Aljareek Malry and Stone Snyder each had eight. Will Bunton was credited with three pass breakups and Alex Oliver had two.

Chattanooga's running back tandem of Tyrell Price and Ailyn Ford each carried 17 times and scored twice. Price ran for 122 yards and Ford for 118. Cole Copeland was 18-35 passing for 192 yards while Ty Boeck and Kam Jones each made 16 stops on defense.

Rice kicked three short field goals (32, 27, 18), as the Keydets took a 9-0 lead midway through the second quarter. Price capped an eight-play 51-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run with just 15 seconds left in the first half to cut the lead to 9-7.

The Mocs' Ben Brewton gave UTC a great scoring opportunity with a strip sack early in the third quarter. The visitors got the ball at the VMI 29 and Ford capitalized with a six-yard run to give Chattanooga its first lead, 14-9, with 9:34 left in the third period.

The Keydets countered with a long drive of their own to get in the end zone. Morgan found Jackson on a 19-yard grab to cap an eight-play, 79-yard drive and make the score 17-16. Morgan hit Jackson for a 35-yard gain earlier in the drive.

Ford broke free on the next possession and rumbled for 65 yards to give Chattanooga a 24-16 lead early in the fourth.

VMI went 91 yards for a touchdown on the ensuing drive, as Morgan tossed to Thomas for a 14-yard score and Morgan hit Knox on the two-point conversion to tie the game at 24 with 8:51 left.

Price's 33-yard jaunt gave UTC a 31-24 advantage, but again VMI had the answer on a 29-yard Morgan-to-Jackson TD throw. Malry broke up a pass on third down of the next drive and, following a Chattanooga punt, Bridy set-up Rice's 49-yarder with a 30-yard run.

VMI (4-2, 2-1 SoCon) travels to Mercer next Saturday for another SoCon matchup at 4 p.m. UTC falls to 2-3 overall and 1-1 in conference play.

Keydets Dominate Mercer in 45-7 Road Victory

MACON, Ga. - An Alex Oliver pick-six on the first play of the game set the tone early for VMI as the Keydets raced to a 24-0 halftime lead and eventual 45-7 victory over the host Mercer Bears Saturday evening at Five Star Stadium in Macon, Georgia.



VMI is now in a three-way tie for first place in the SoCon race at 3-1 with ETSU and Mercer. With four league contests remaining, the Keydets will have two weeks to prepare for Samford on October 30 with a bye next Saturday.

In a dominant defensive effort, the Keydets (5-2, 3-1) limited Mercer to 23 yards rushing. The Bears entered the contest averaging 280 yards on the ground, which ranks fifth overall in the FCS. VMI also had 10 tackles for loss for 52 yards, including three sacks for 19 yards. VMI only had two sacks on the season prior to Saturday's contest. In addition, Mercer was limited to nine first downs and converted just two of 14 on third down conversions.

Playing without offensive stars Korey Bridy and Jakob Herres, the Keydets started the game with questions that were answered by backup running backs Rashad Raymond and Hunter Rice. Raymond finished with a career-high 163 yards rushing and a touchdown while Rice finished with 112 yards on 17 carries and three second-half touchdowns. The last time VMI had two 100-yard rushers occurred in 2009 against Army West Point.

The Keydets also did not turn the ball over to the Bears a single time.

After Oliver's pick-six, the Keydet defense again stepped up when Will Bunton forced a fumble deep in Bear territory which was recovered by Charles Dixon. Two plays later, VMI quarterback Seth Morgan took it in from 13 yards out to put VMI up, 14-0, just two minutes into the game.

Early in the second quarter, Raymond took a rush 80 yards to the house to put VMI up, 21-0. Kicker Jerry Rice later added three points on a short 26-yard field goal to give VMI its 24-0 halftime advantage.

Midway through the third quarter, Hunter Rice capped a 12-play, 75-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown scamper and 31-0 VMI lead. On VMI's next possession, Rice again capped an 8-play, 42-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown rush to put the Keydets up, 38-0, at the 4:05 mark of the third quarter.

Rice would go on to score his third touchdown rush of the day to end a 10-play, 71-yard drive early in the fourth quarter for VMI's final score of the game.

Mercer receiver Ethan Dirrim ensured the Bears would not be shut out with just over three minutes left to play with a 71-yard TD reception from Carter Peevy.

The Keydets return to action Saturday, October 30, against Samford at 1:30 p.m. at Foster Stadium.

Of note: Alex Oliver's pick six on the first play of the game was VMI's first since Tyren Cloyd returned one against Chattanooga on Oct. 27, 2018. His two interceptions was the second time this season a Keydet had two interceptions in the game. Aljareek Malry had two in the opener against Davidson.
