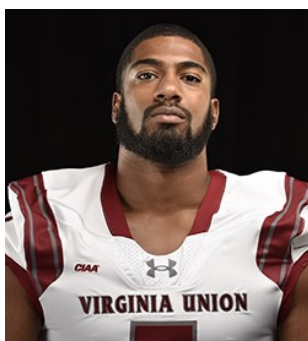
► VUU will be coached by Dr. Alvin Parker. Parker is entering his fifth year as VUU Head Coach and is 30-11 overall. He was named the CIAA Coach of the Year in 2022.

► Virginia Union University will begin its 122nd varsity football season, and the fifth under head coach Dr. Alvin Parker, when it plays Morehouse College in the Black College Hall of Fame Classic on Sunday, September 3, at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton, Oh.. Kickoff is slated for 4 p.m. and will be televised on the NFL Network.

► The Panthers own a 6-0 record against Morehouse College. The last time the two teams met was on September 10, 2000, in Hovey Field in Richmond, Va. VUU won that match-up 43-21.

► Jada Byers, who will be a junior in 2023, was named Male Athlete of the Year at the RVA Sports while rushing for a CIAA-record 1,920 yards in 2022. Byers, who is from Hammonton, N.J. and is majoring in Social Work, was also Virginia Union's first Harlon Hill Award Finalist, which is awarded to the top football player in Division II of the NCAA.

► Amonii Burden, who will be a redshirt senior in 2023, and is a 6-1, 229 lb., defensive end from Williamsburg, Va., and is majoring in Marketing. He was All-CIAA First Team in 2022 while collecting 32 tackles for the Panthers last season.

HEAD COACH DR. ALVIN PARKER

Named the 27th head football coach at Virginia Union University on Dec. 18, 2017, Alvin Parker Ph.D. a native of Washington, DC, and alumnus of Virginia Union, will begin his fifth season at the helm of the program in the fall of 2023. Parker also serves as the University's Associate Director of Athletics, a post he assumed in August of 2021.

Widely familiar with the CIAA Football landscape, the 2022 season marked Parker's 24TH year roaming the collegiate sidelines. Known for developing champions, Parker's career has featured multiple conference and divisional championships on the field, while guiding his offensive units to national leaders in multiple categories and coaching numerous all-conference and All-American student-athletes.

Parker also serves as a leader in the profession, locally and nationally, serving on the AFCA Rules Committee, AFCA Minority Issues Committee, serving as the President of the CIAA Coaches Association, and the founder and President of Home Team Foundation Inc.

In his second stint at VUU, the 2023 season marks Parker's 10th with the Panthers overall. Formerly an offensive assistant with the program under legendary coach Willard Bailey from 1999-2003, Parker returned to Lombardy Street after stints at Saint Augustine's University and Elizabeth City State University. Since his return to VUU, Parker has helped the Panthers defeat FCS programs, top 25 rankings, and has had consistent winning seasons.

Parker hoists an 23-6 CIAA record, and a 30-11 overall record after three playing seasons. Last season Parker guided the Panthers to an appearance in the NCAA Football Playoffs and has the Panthers ranked #14 in the nation in the 2023 Lindy's Pre-Season Poll.

Emphasizing discipline, Parker's team have consistently ranked among the top 25 in the country in turnover margin, total defense, scoring defense, scoring offense, and rushing offense. On special teams, VUU also has thrived, ranking tops in the nation in blocked punts and kicks. The impact Parker has had on the program in such a short time has been considerable. Following the spring 2020 semester, 47 football student athletes obtained above a 3.0 GPA, all of this culminated with a football student-athlete being named the universities co-valedictorian (Emmanuel Antwi).

Parker coached the 2019 CIAA Special Teams player of the year Jefferson Souza, who was also named the Don Hansen Super region two Special Teams player of the year. He developed Khalid Morris who led the league in passing yards per game and was also tied for first in passing TD's. 2019 also saw Charles Hall lead the nation (NCAA) in yards per catch (25.9). In his inaugural season as the head coach of the Panthers, Parker posted the best record of a first-year coach at VUU with an 8-2 overall mark. Recognized as one of the most gifted offensive football minds during his heralded career as an assistant coach, the Panthers had one of their most successful seasons in 2018.

Virginia Union ranked #1 in several categories in the CIAA including scoring offense (40.5 ppg), rushing offense (221.5 yrd/g) and rushing defense (75.2 yrd/g). The Panthers also finished first in the league in third down conversions (45.6%).

Over his previous stint on the Union staff, the Panthers won three CIAA Eastern Division crowns, captured the (2001) CIAA title and played in the 2001 Pioneer Bowl. Dr. Parker coached André Braxton, the CIAA's all-time leading rusher and single season touchdown record holder, who would go on to be named the recipient of the (2000) Alonzo "Jake" Gaither Award as the top HBCU player in the nation. Braxton was an All-CIAA honoree all four years at VUU and named Player of the Year in 2000.

Before his successes as a coach and an academician, Parker was a standout student-athlete during his playing days at VUU. He earned offensive MVP honors in 1996 and 1998, still ranks in the top ten amongst the Panther greats in single season touchdowns scored and is the Gold Bowl record holder for the longest TD — a 79-yard reception.

His dedication and success as one of the nation's top assistants had not gone unnoticed as he was named a finalist for the AFCA National Assistant Coach of the Year Award every year from 2013-2016. Parker served as the Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator at SAU for two seasons and helped orchestrate one of the biggest turnarounds in school history. The Falcons went from last in the CIAA in total offense (200.3 ppg) to putting up 335.5 yards per game good for 6th in the conference, improved their scoring average to 25.5ppg (18.1) and improved their overall touchdown output by +10 with 34 on the year. Most significantly, the Falcons went from the bottom of the CIAA South to a tie for first place in the division, just one game away from their first conference title appearance.

During his 13 years at ECSU, his offense stood out as one of the most prolific in all of NCAA Division II. Under his guidance the Vikings had 4 CIAA Title game appearances, 2 NCAA Playoff appearances, and 2 Pioneer bowl appearances. ECSU was crowned the 2012 Pioneer Bowl Champions with a 28-13 victory over SIAC power Tuskegee University in Columbus, Georgia.

During an eight-year span at ECSU (2006-2014), the Vikings were a whopping 48-15 in conference play and averaged over 30 points per game in CIAA contests. From 2010-2015 the Vikings were one of two teams to average over 30 points and over 400 yards per game.

The 2011 season was historic for ECSU as the Vikings were one of ten teams nationally who rushed for 36 touchdowns or more on the season. The Vikings potent rushing attack was led by tailback Daront'e McNeill who was named the 2011 CIAA Player of the Year

The previous year, Parker's offense finished first in sacks against, second in pass completion percentage, total offense, and rushing offense. The "multiple-attack" offense averaged 194 YPG rushing on the way to setting the school record. The Viking's offense again took up more space in the record books when in his senior season McNeill, finished seventh in the nation in rushing becoming ECSU's single season rushing leader with 1321 yards. That year, three ECSU runners averaged more than five yards per carry and a total of six offensive players received post-season honors.

In 2009, the Vikings tied for first in the CIAA Eastern Division. The offense finished 15th in the nation in scoring offense averaging 35 PPG. ECSU rushed for nearly 30 TD's which was amongst the highest in the Conference. Six members of the Viking's offense received post-season honors.

In 2008, ECSU won the CIAA Eastern Division title averaging 32 PPG. Senior quarterback Curtis Rich led the conference in all passing categories on his way to being named 2008 Offensive Player of the Year. Wide receiver Dexter Manley led the conference in all major receiving categories and was also listed in the top 5 nationally. In 2007, the Vikings had a 2nd place finish in the CIAA Eastern Division.

The Vikings' breakout season came in 2006 where ECSU's offense finished second in scoring and in total offense in route to the CIAA championship game. Additionally, the Viking offense had a record-breaking year which saw 5 offensive players being recognized as First Team All-Conference. By the end of the season Parker had taken an offensive line that featured 3 new starters and propelled it into one of the top units in the country. That offensive line featured All-American Ronnie McClary who blocked for the league's top reception leader Marvin Jackson, and the CIAA's top scorer Chris Carter. Both Jackson and Carter ranked in the top for All-Receiving Categories.

Parker received his M.S. degree in Sport Leadership/Athletic Administration from Virginia Commonwealth University, and his B.S. degree in Mass Communication/Journalism from Virginia Union University. He obtained his Doctorate in Education/Sport Management from Northcentral University in 2017. Parker is also the author of the book "Stronger than Pride".

Parker and his wife LaToya reside in Richmond. He is the proud father of a son Alan and daughter Lani.

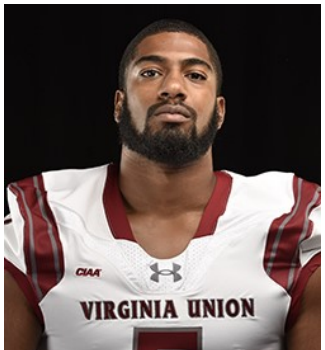

TRIO OF PANTHERS EARN LINDY'S PRE-SEASON ALL-AMERICAN STATUS

Lindy's SPORTS PRE-SEASON ALL-AMERICANS



Three Virginia Union University football players have been named Pre-Season All-Americans by Lindy's College Football Magazine, it was announced on June 6.

VUU's Jada Byers was named First-Team All-American while Armonii Burden and Justin Meade were named Second-Team All-American.

Byers, who will be a junior in 2023, was named Male Athlete of the Year at the RVA Sports while rushing for a CIAA-record 1,920 yards in 2022. Byers, who is from Hammonton, N.J. and is majoring in Social Work, was also Virginia Union's first Harlon Hill Award Finalist, which is awarded to the top football player in Division II of the NCAA.

Byers was also named the Don Hansen Division II College Football Player of the Year, First Team All-American by Don Hansen, First Team All-American by the American Football Coaches Association, First Team All-CIAA and the CIAA Player of the Year.

Burden will be a redshirt senior in 2023, and is a 6-1, 229 lb., defensive end from Williamsburg, Va., and is majoring in Marketing. He was All-CIAA First Team in 2022 while collecting 32 tackles for the Panthers last season.

Meade, who will be a redshirt senior in 2023, is a 6-2, 280 lb., offensive lineman from J.R. Tucker High School in Richmond, Va., was also First-Team All-CIAA in 2022. He was a mainstay on a Panther offensive line which led the CIAA with 2,435 rushing yards last year.

"All three of the guys are big time players who have made major contributions to our program," said VUU Head Football Coach Dr. Alvin Parker. "I am extremely happy for the individual recognition that each has received. It speaks volumes about the quality of student-athletes that are put on the field here at Virginia Union. These guys are leaders both on and off the field."

VUU FOOTBALL RANKED #14 BY LINDY'S COLLEGE FOOTBALL MAGAZINE



Virginia Union University's football team has been ranked 14th in the nation among NCAA Division II teams by Lindy's College Football Magazine, it was revealed on Tuesday, May 30.

The Panthers finished 9-2 and were ranked as high as 10th in the nation last season.

"This is huge for the program," said VUU Head Football Coach Dr. Alvin Parker. "Anytime you can get national recognition for the body of work that your program has done, it speaks volumes about the way that you're headed. We want to thank the people at Lindy's and everybody who contributed to that in recognizing our program. It's hard work, but we have a great group of kids here that do everything that I ask of them. We have a hardworking staff, and to see that published will allow other people see that as well. It makes me feel good about what we have going on here."

Willie Lanier Field at Hovey Stadium



In the Spring of 1907, Dr. George Rice Hovey (VUU's 2nd President) purchased 11 acres of land east of Lombardy Street for athletic fields. A former athlete himself, Dr. Hovey laid the foundations for VUU's Athletic Program.

He purchased, for \$8,483.55, an 11-acre tract of land on the opposite side of Lombardy Street from the main campus. Part of this was transformed into the main athletic field. Because of Dr. Hovey's interest in and commitment to athletics, the land purchased in 1907 eventually became known as Hovey Field.

The first football game that was ever played on Hovey Field took place in October 30, 1909 between Virginia Union University and Virginia State University. The two teams battled to a scoreless tie.

Originally existing simply as a field with a fence surrounding it, bleachers were installed in the 1920's. Eventually lights were installed, and the first night game took place during the 1949 season.

A new \$1.2 million FieldTurf surface was installed in the spring of 2020 and the stadium took on a new name: Willie Lanier Field at Hovey Stadium.

A \$300,000 video board and sound system was added to the stadium prior to the 2021 football season.

Over the years, Hovey Field has seen VUU evolve into a perennial football power. The Panthers have captured 2 National Championships, 10 CIAA Championships and have participated in the NCAA post-season playoffs on 7 occasions. In addition, the Panthers have finished the regular season undefeated six times in their history.
