Seahawks, Colonials to Renew Rivalry

Wagner (3-4, 1-2 NEC) and Robert Morris (2-5, 1-2) meet for the 15th time on the gridiron in a series that began in 1994. Wagner head coach **Walt Hameline** and Robert Morris head man Joe Walton have been the coaches for all 14 previous meetings and the Colonials lead the series 9-5. This year's matchup features a pair of teams who are tied for fifth place in the NEC with identical 1-2 records. The Colonials are coming off a 20-7 non-conference loss at Bryant while the Seahawks snapped a three-game losing streak last Saturday with a 17-13 come-from-behind victory at Saint Francis (PA). The teams have faced just two common opponents thus far and are each 0-2 vs. these foes. In addition to the 20-7 loss at Bryant, Robert Morris dropped a 34-26 home decision to Monmouth. Wagner, meanwhile, lost home games to Bryant (24-14) and Monmouth (31-17).



Abbey

Senior QB **Matt Abbey (La Canada, CA/ St. Francis)** was the Seahawk starter the past two seasons but was beaten out in a competitive preseason battle by junior **Adam Farnsworth (North Ogden, UT/Snow CC)**, a University of Iowa transfer. Farnsworth started the first five games of the season and completed more than 65% of his passes before suffering an injury at Central Connecticut St. (Oct. 4). Abbey took over for Farnsworth in the second quarter of that game, then started and went the whole way vs. Monmouth (10/11) and last week at Saint Francis (PA). Abbey completed 13-of-24 passes for 157 yards and two TDs vs. the Hawks and was 15-of-35 for 229 yards and one TD vs. the Red Flash. In recording the sixth 200-yard plus passing game of his career, Abbey continues his march through the Wagner all-time career lists. During the Saint Francis (PA) game, he became just the third QB in Wagner history to surpass the 300-completion mark. He now has 311 career completions, and needs just three to pass Terry O'Hare (313, 1991-92) for second place on the Seahawk all-time list. Abbey now stands sixth on the all-time career passing yardage list with 3821 yards. He is 50 yards away from passing O'Hare (3,870, 1991-92) for fifth on the all-time list and needs 75 yards to pass Greg Kovar (3895, 1985-88) for fourth place in Wagner history.

The Coaches

Walt Hameline is in his 28th season as the head man at Wagner. He became the winningest coach in Wagner College history in 1990, and boasts a .656 winning percentage at 189-101-2, which ranks in the top 10 among active FCS coaches in the United States. In 1987, Hameline led Wagner to the Division III National Championship. He is one just three NEC coaches remaining in their positions since NEC football was formed in 1996, along with Joe Walton of Robert Morris and Kevin Callahan of Monmouth. Walton was named RMU's first head football coach on July 27, 1993. He started the program from scratch, including everything from hiring assistant coaches to purchasing equipment to recruiting student-athletes for the team's inaugural season. In 2004, he had the University's on-campus football stadium named in his honor. Joe Walton Stadium hosted its first football game in 2005. His record at Robert Morris is 87-60.

Seahawks to Host Colonials

Scene-Setter...

Wagner (3-4) and Robert Morris will meet for the 15th time this afternoon and the Colonials hold a 9-5 edge in the series which began in 1994. The Seahawks won the last season's meeting in Moon Township, PA, recording a 20-13 win. The teams have split the last four meetings in the series.

Saint Francis (PA) Recap

Loretto, PA – Senior QB **Matt Abbey (La Canada, CA/ St. Francis)** hit sophomore WR **Tyrone Collins (Geneva, NY/ Geneva)** on a 33-yard touchdown strike with 7:06 left in the game to lift Wagner to a 17-13 come-from-behind Northeast Conference (NEC) victory over Saint Francis (PA). With the win, the Seahawks snapped a three-game losing streak in improving to 3-4 overall, 1-2 in the NEC play. The Red Flash fall to 0-7 overall, 0-4 in league play.

Abbey completed 15-of-35 passes for 229 yards on the afternoon in guiding the Seahawks to victory. His favorite deep threat was Collins, who corralled six passes for a career-high 112 yards, while junior WR **Lon Woods (St. Petersburg, FL/ J.P. Taravella)** also had six grabs for 57 yards. Wagner welcomed RB **Shane Smith (Susquehanna, PA/ Milford)** back to the lineup after sitting out the last two games with a leg injury. The 6-2, 230-pound Smith was Wagner's workhorse, gaining 60 hard-fought yards on 25 carries as the Red Flash were stout against the run, limiting the Seahawks to 45 net rushing yards on 41 carries.

The Wagner defense held Saint Francis (PA) to just 149 yards of total offense, 87 through the air and 62 on the ground.

Following a scoreless first quarter, Saint Francis (PA) got on the board first as QB George Little hit WR Omar Winston on a 14-yard TD pass that capped a 10-play, 74-yard drive with 14:11 left in the half. Neither team would put a dent in the scoreboard the rest of the half as Saint Francis (PA) took a 7-0 lead into intermission.

Senior WR **Kyle Trueblood (Edison, NJ/ J.P. Stevens)** returned the opening kickoff of the second half 37 yards, giving the Seahawks excellent field position at the Red Flash 48-yard line. Abbey then led Wagner on a crisp seven-play, 48-yard drive. He hit Collins and Woods for 15 and 13 yards, respectively, in the drive and Smith rambled 18 yards to the Red Flash one-yard line. On first-and-goal, Abbey took it over from the one to knot the game at 7-7.

Late in the third quarter, Saint Francis (PA) recovered a Seahawk fumble at the Wagner 14-yard line. After losing five yards on first down, the Red Flash went on top 13-7 when Little connected with TE Ryan Zarnich on a 19-yard TD completion. Wagner sophomore DB **Frantz Placide (Miami, FL/ Archbishop Curley Notre Dame)** blocked the extra point attempt which kept the Seahawks within six points.

With 12:06 left in the game, senior PK Eric Ortiz (Oceanside, CA/ Vista) booted a career-long 38-yard field goal to draw Wagner to within 13-10. With Saint Francis (PA) clinging to that three-point lead and facing a third-and-15 from its own 27-yard line, Wagner freshman DE Julian Stanford (Bloomfield, CT/ Bloomfield) turned in the defensive play of the game, sacking Little for a loss of 20 yards back to the Red Flash seven-yard line.

Trueblood returned the ensuing Saint Francis (PA) punt 11 yards to the Red Flash 33-yard line. On the very next play, Abbey went up top on first down, finding Collins in the corner of the end zone on a 33-yard connection, giving the Seahawks the lead at 17-13. From this point on, the Seahawks defense did the rest as Wagner held on for the victory.

Placide and senior LB **Jason Haskins (Cliffwood Beach, NJ/ Kean Univ.)** paced Wagner defensively with seven tackles apiece while sophomore DB **Stefen Gage (Syracuse, NY/ Henninger)** and junior DE **Patrick Abdul (Brooklyn, NY/ Bay Shore)** added six stops each.

About the Colonials

Robert Morris concluded its 2008 non-conference schedule with a 20-7 defeat at Bryant in the inaugural meeting between the two programs. The Colonials moved the chains just once in the first half and 11 times total in accumulating 141 yards of total offense, their lowest output of the season. Senior QB Erik Cwalinski was sacked eight times on the afternoon, which helped Bryant hold RMU to minus 20 yards of rushing in the game. Cwalinski finished 11-for-25 passing for 161 yards and an interception. Sophomore RB Myles Russ had 16 carries for just 37 yards and fumbling once. Senior TE Regis Flowers led the receiving corps with four catches for 59 yards. Sophomore P Nick Schirtzinger punted seven times for 252 yards, an average of 36 yards per punt. Robert Morris was led defensively by sophomore LB Alex DiMichele, who recorded a game-high 13 tackles, including a pair for losses that totaled nine yards and a sack. Junior DB Michael Landers finished with eight tackles and recorded his league-leading fourth interception of the season. Junior LB Adam Lawrence also finished with eight stops, while sophomore CB James Snider posted seven tackles, all unassisted. A total of 48 of RMU's 68 takedowns against the Bulldogs were of the solo variety. Robert Morris posted a season-high seven quarter-back hurries, including a pair each by junior DL Andy Walton and sophomore DB Troy Cree.

Head Coach Walt Hameline

Now in his 28th year as Director of Athletics and Head Football Coach at Wagner College, the relentlessly energetic and optimistic **Walt Hameline** continues to amass an astounding record of achievement and consistency.

In 2007, he guided the Seahawks to their 22nd winning season in his 27 seasons, a fine 7-4 mark. In addition, the Seahawks boasted the NEC's Offensive Player of the Year in RB Jason Butler as well as four other first-team All-NEC choices. Kicker/Punter Piotr Czech, the greatest specialist in NEC and Wagner history, was an AFCA All-American who went on to sign a free agent contract with the NFL's Baltimore Ravens. DB Al Phillips inked a free agent contract with the New York Jets while DE Robert Brown was named an Associated Press Third-Team All-American.

Hameline's overall coaching ledger includes five ECAC Championships, three NCAA Tournament appearances and the 1987 NCAA Division III National Championship — all told, 10 post-season appearances in 26 seasons. Hameline won his 175th career game - all at Wagner with a come-from-behind victory over St. Francis (PA) in the 2005 season finale. He became the winningest coach in Wagner College history in 1990, and boasts a .649 winning percentage at 189-101-2, which ranks in the top 10 among active FCS coaches in the United States.

The highlight, of course, is the 19-3 win over heavily-favored Dayton in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl for the 1987 NCAA Division III National Championship. Against one of the toughest schedules in the nation, Hameline's Seahawks rolled to a 13-1 record, winning more games than any college football team in America. The team earned the school's second Lambert Trophy, symbolic of football superiority in the East among Division III schools, and ECAC Team of the Year recognition. Hameline was honored by many organizations including the Chevrolet National Coach of the Year.

Under Hameline's leadership, the Seahawk athletic department has undergone an ambitious expansion in both sport offerings and facility improvements.

Since 1992, Hameline has added six women's sports to the athletic program. In the spring of 2002, Wagner introduced women's water polo to its slate bringing Wagner's total number of Division I teams to 22 and creating new opportunities for female athletes.

Known for his keen vision and boundless enthusiasm, Hameline was influential in establishing the Seahawk Golf Classic, now in its 19th year, and the Seahawk Club, a pair of initiatives aimed at increasing funds for the scholarship endowment and complete financial support for the athletic department.

Most recently under Hameline's direction, the Wagner College Stadium field has been resurfaced with a state-of-the-art Field Turf playing surface. This multi-purpose surface was constructed in the summer of 2006 and is used for football, soccer and lacrosse.

In 1997 Hameline governed the opening of Wagner's football stadium and outdoor track & field facility and was instrumental in erecting the Spiro Sports Center in the spring of 1999 - a 93,000 square-foot building which houses a 2,100-seat, multi-purpose arena, a six-lane swimming pool, team locker rooms and all athletic department offices.

In 1995, Hameline oversaw the opening of new athletic fields at the base of Grymes Hill to house additional teams. This multi-sport facility is presently home to the Seahawk softball team which, in 2007, underwent a vast reconstruction.

The 57 year-old administrator, has been a key developer of the Northeast Conference, serving on numerous committees and served as president of the league. Eight years ago, Hameline was honored for his playing, coaching and administrative achievements when he was inducted into the Utica Sports Hall of Fame. In addition, Hameline was given the All-America Football Foundation Johnny Vaught Lifetime Achievement Award in 1998.

Trueblood Named NEC Special Teams Player of the Week for Efforts in Win at St. Francis (PA)



Somerset, NJ - Senior Kyle Trueblood (Edison, NJ/ J.P. Stevens) had a stellar game returning kickoffs and punts vs. Saint Francis (PA) and for his efforts in helping to lead Wagner to a 17-13 victory, he has been named the Northeast Conference (NEC) Special Teams Player of the Week, the league office announced.

Trueblood, who has 21 receptions for 180 yards on the season from his wide receiver position, returned two kickoffs for 89 yards (45.5 yard average), including a 52-yarder and another for 37 yards vs. the Red Flash. He also returned five punts for 44 yards (8.8 yard average), highlighted by a long of 17 yards.

With the Seahawks trailing 7-0, the 6-1, 180-pound Trueblood returned the second half kickoff 37 yards to the Saint Francis (PA) 48-yard line which set up Wagner's game-tying touchdown. Midway through the fourth quarter, with the Seahawks behind 13-10, he returned a punt 11 yards to the Red Flash 33-yard line. On the very next play, senior QB **Matt Abbey (La Canada, CA/ St. Francis)** hit sophomore WR **Tyrone Collins (Geneva, NY/ Geneva)** for a 33-yard touchdown, lifting the Seahawks to the 17-13 victory.

Trueblood is the second Seahawk to earn a conference player of the week award this season. In week two, freshman RB **Prince Young (Neptune, NJ/ Fork Union)** was named NEC Rookie of the Week after rushing for 128 yards on 19 carries and two TDS in Wagner's 45-28 victory over Iona on Sept. 13.

NEC Gains Access to NCAA

Post-Season Bracket

Last April, the NCAA announced that the Northeast Conference will gain automatic access into the Division I Football Championships beginning in 2010. NEC Football is also eligible for automatic qualification into the championship bracket during the 2008 and 2009 seasons if its champion meets specifications of the bridge program.

"This is great for the NEC and its student-athletes," commented league commissioner Brenda Weare. "It provides greater opportunity for our league on numerous levels. It should bolster our recruiting efforts and overall competitiveness, while also helping us brand our league."

Beginning in 2010, there will be an increase in the number of FCS playoff participants to 20, a 25 percent rise from its current 16-team format. The NEC will acquire one of the four added berths and be guaranteed an opportunity to play for the 2010 FCS Championship.

"This is a great day for the Northeast Conference, college football in general and Wagner College in particular," said Wagner Director of Athletics/Head Football Coach **Walt Hameline**. "Having access to the playoffs adds value to our football program and allows NEC student-athletes a chance to compete in post-season play and, ultimately, for a national championship."

2007 All-NEC

Senior running back Jason Butler was named the 2007 Northeast Conference's Offensive Player of the Year, highlighting a stellar season that saw five Seahawk players earn seven first-team accolades.

Butler was the fifth Seahawk to earn an All-NEC major award. Rick Sarille was Offensive Player of the Year in 1996 and 1999. Mike Steed was named Defensive Rookie of the Year in 1996 while in 1997 Daryn Plummer was Defensive Rookie of the Year. The 1996 Defensive Player of the Year was Bill Sommers.

Butler, who became the first NEC player to ever rush for 100 yards or in all 11 games this year, finished second on Wagner's single-season rushing list with 1,713 yards. His 316 rushing attempts this season is also a school mark, as he finished his two-year RB career with 2,448 yards.

Senior kicker/punter Piotr Czech was named a first team selection in both kicking specialties he shouldered for the Seahawks. This marked the third straight year Czech has earned an All-NEC honor as he was named first-team all-NEC kicker and second-team punter in 2006. In 2005, Czech was also tabbed a second-team All-NEC punter. He was joined on this year's first team by fellow senior Al Phillips, who was named the top return man in the conference.

The other first team Green & White honorees were defensive stalwarts Bryan Brand at linebacker, Robert Brown at defensive end, and Al Phillips - once again - this time for his prowess at the cornerback position. This was the third year in a row he's been selected for that position.

Phillips, the premier defensive back in the conference all year, dominated the interceptions category with seven on the season to finish his career with 17 INTs, third on the Wagner all-time list.

Seahawks' defensive lineman Robert Brown also led a defensive category - sacks - as he posted 11 on the year establishing a benchmark for the NEC with nine being solo.

Senior Bryan Brand finished third in the entire conference in tackles, as the California native tallied 117 total, 55 of those coming solo.

Wagner Coming off Turnaround Season

Wagner's 2007 season represented a major turnaround from the hard-luck 2006 campaign that saw the Seahawks go 4-0 in non-conference play before dropping all seven NEC games to finish with a 4-7 overall mark. In 2007, Wagner went 7-4 and improved to 3-3 in NEC play. The seven wins are the most by the Seahawks since 2002 when Wagner was also 7-4. For head coach Walt Hameline, 2007 was the 21st winning season he has enjoyed in his 27 years at the helm of the Seahawk program.

The 2008 Wagner College Football program featured three new additions in linebackers coach Joe Todd, wide receivers coach Ivery Gaskins and safeties coach Mike Horan.

A native of Mansfield, MA, **Joe Todd** is no stranger to the New York City Metropolitan area. Todd was a three-year starter at linebacker at Hofstra and played briefly in the NFL with the New York Jets and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Todd's extensive background also includes serving as a linebackers coach at the University of Rhode Island, the University of New Hampshire and Iona College.

Todd comes to Wagner after spending one year as linebackers coach at Rhode Island. Prior to his tenure there, Todd spent the 2006 season in the same capacity for NCAA I-AA quarterfinalist New Hampshire, where he helped lead the Wildcats to a 9-4 record and their third-straight appearance in the NCAA quarterfinals. He began his college coaching career as linebackers coach at Iona College during the 2005 season.

During his playing career at Hofstra, Todd was a three-year starter at linebacker and a four-year starter on special teams. He was the leading tackler for the No. 7 ranked Pride during his senior year as Hofstra advanced to the 2000 NCAA quarterfinals.

He went on to play for the New York Jets in 2001 and also played four preseason games for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers the following season.

Ivery Gaskins attended Grambling State University from 1998-2000 and the University of Central Florida from 2000-2003 where he was a wide receiver on both of those school's football teams. In 2004, he was a member of the Hamilton Tiger Cats of the Canadian Football League.

Since 2005, Gaskins served as Director of Operations for student-athlete development at Hero Sports Performance, Inc. in Jonesboro, GA. In this role, he implemented programs for helping at-risk student-athlete's complete high school and prepare for college through mentoring, recruiting and resource management.

A native of West Palm Beach, FL, Gaskins was a scholastic standout at Cardinal Newman High School before prepping a year at Worcester Academy in Worcester, MA.

Mike Horan comes to Wagner after serving one year at the United States Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA), where he was responsible for coaching the inside linebackers. Prior to his stint at the USMMA, he spent the 2006 season as an assistant coach at Curry College where he coached the tight ends.

At Curry, he helped the Colonels to a perfect 11-0 record and their fourth consecutive New England Football Conference Championship. Curry defeated Coast Guard, 34-28, in the title game to match a school record for wins in a season and earn an automatic bid to the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

In 2005, Horan served as the defensive backs coach for Stoughton High School, which is where he graduated in 2001.

The 2005 graduate of Bates College was named to the All-NESCAC First Team twice as a defensive back. Horan also garnered All-ECAC First Team honors as a senior.

The mammoth game-winning drive, which elapsed 10:32 off the clock, was capped by a quarterback sneak by Cruz Parsons with 1:12 left to play.
