### Seahawks, Gaels Renew Local Rivalry

The series between the teams began in 1979 with Wagner coming up with a 28-0 home win. Of its 16 wns over Iona, eight have come via shutouts. The Seahawks lead the all-time series 16-2 and had won 10 consecutive games over the Gaels before Iona scratched out a 17-14 overtime win last season in New Rochelle.

### Hameline in Home Openers

Wagner head football coach **Walt Hameline** enters his 28th season and brings an all-time record of 186-98-2 into today's game. His record in home openers at Wagner is 18-8-1 and the Seahawks have won their last six home lid-lifters. The last time Wagner lost a home opener was on Sept. 22, 2001 when the Seahawks lost a shootout to Albany, 35-30.



### Farnsworth Tabbed Starting Quarterback.

Following a competitive battle with two-year starter Matt Abbey, 6-3, 200-pound junior **Adam Farnsworth**, a transfer from the University of Iowa, was named the starting QB.

Both quarterbacks performed well in preseason camp and Hameline says he would be comfortable inserting Abbey into the lineup. "The way I view it, we have two capable quarterbacks capable of winning ballgames for us," said Hameline. "

Farnsworth and the Seahawk offense were sharp early in the season opener last Friday at Stonehill. He led Wagner on a crisp nine-play, 53-yard TD drive in the first quarter. Farnsworth was 2-of-2 passing on the drive and completed four of his first five passes overall.

Leading 13-7 at halftime, Stonehill turned up the defensive pressure and Farnsworth was under duress often during the final 30 minutes as Stonehill posted a late TD to pull out the 14-13 win

Farnsworth enrolled at Wagner in Spring 2008 and benefited from taking part in spring practice. He demonstrated excellent arm strength, accuracy and touch on his throws throughout preseason camp and in a scrimmage vs. Fordham on Aug. 26. Farnsworth spent the the 2006 and 2007 seasons at Iowa but did not see any game action. Prior to the transferring to Iowa, he played one season at Snow Community Commnity College in Utah. Farnsworth played his high school football at Weber High School (UT) where he earned All-State, Honorable Mention All-Region and First-Team All-Area honors as a senior. Completed 140-265 passes for 1,435 yards and 13 touchdowns during his senior season, with seven interceptions. Farnsworth is 23 years old, having served a two-year Mormon mission in the Philippines.

## Seahawks Host Iona on Homecoming/Hall of Fame Day Scene-Setter...

There promises to be a charged atmosphere at Wagner College Stadium on Saturday when the Seahawks host local rival Iona at 1:00 pm on Homecoming/Hall of Fame Day. At halftime, five former Seahawk athletic greats will be inducted into the Wagner College Hall of Fame; **Chris Anderson Franzreb** (Basketball/Softball '92), **Fred Blackwell, M.D.**, (Basketball, '60) **Dominick Iorio** (Cross Country/track & Field, '82), **Donald Edwards** (Football, '84) and **Joe Murphy** (Baseball, '85).

A Sea of Green and White is expected to be on hand as the Seahawks embark on their five-game 2008 home schedule. At halftime, five former Seahawk athletic greats will be inducted into the Wagner College Hall of Fame.

The Seahawks (0-1) are eager to get back at it after dropping a tough 14-13 decision at Stonehill last Friday in their season opener. Iona (1-0) comes into the game following a 27-19 road victory over Delaware Valley last Saturday.

### Stonehill Recap

In the season opener at Stonehill, Wagner unveiled a trio of first-year offensive playmakers in junior QB **Adam Farnsworth (North Ogden, UT/ Snow C.C.)** a transfer from the University of Iowa, and the halfback tandem of freshman **Prince Young (Neptune, NJ/ Fork Union)** and junior **Shane Smith (Susquehanna, PA/Milford Academy)**. Farnsworth showed excellent poise in the pocket, good mobility and a strong arm. Facing intense pressure from the Stonehill defense all game, the 6-3, 200-pounder was sharp early and finished 11-of-23 passing for 76 yards.

The shifty 6-0,195-pound Young ran for 77 yards on 11 carries (7.0 yards/attempt) in his Seahawk debut, highlighted by a nifty 24-yard third quarter TD scamper. The bruising 6-2, 230-pound Smith is a different style runner than Young. Smith, who saw significant playing time at FBS program Central Florida as a redshirt freshman in 2006, displayed his power while steamrolling his way to a 13-yard first quarter TD run on a fourth-and-three situation.

Senior LB **Jason Haskins (Jackson, NJ/Matawan)** led the Seahawk defensive effort with 10 tackles while cornerback **Mika Padah (Kamuela, HI /Saddleback College)** and safety **Tavares Lee (Miami, FL/St. Thomas Aquinas)** registered nine tackles apiece. Unfortunately, Lee suffered a shoulder injury late in the game that will sideline him for an indefinite period. Senior DE **Robert Brown (Rome, NY/ Rome Free Academy)**, a third-team All-American last season who was fourth in the nation in sacks (10), picked up where he left off by recording three sacks for minus 13 yards.

### The Series

In last year's overtime defeat to Iona, Wagner won the toss in OT and elected to put its defense on the field. The Seahawks appeared to gain the advantage by holding Iona to a Chris Lefrese 19-yard field goal on the first possession of OT. With Iona now up 17-14, it was Wagner's turn to take over possession at the 25-yard line. But the Iona defense, aided by a first down holding penalty, stiffened and eventually forced the Seahawks into a four-and-11 at the Gaels' 26-yard line. Following an Iona timeout, Wagner placekicker Piotr Czech missed the potential game-tying 42-yard field goal field goal as the kick missed by just inches to the left.

The only previous win over Wagner in the series was in 1993 when the Gaels recorded a 30-23 win in Staten Island. Later in the season, Wagner avenged that loss with a 32-0 win in the ECAC-IFC Division I-AA Bowl.

### About the Gaels

Iona is led by 11th-year head coach Fred Mariani, Iona features a wide-open, spread-style offense with junior QB Nick Rossetti at the controls. In last year's overtime win over the Seahawks, Rossetti completed 23-of-33 passes for 212 yards and a touchdown. Defensively, the Gaels are adept at pressuring the quarterback. Given Wagner's struggles in the pass protection department in the opener vs. Stonehill, it's a good bet that Iona will be in blitz mode often during this contest. The Gaels scored three TDs in the first half against DelVal and never trailed in a contest that was played in a driving rain-storm. Rossetti finished the day 11-of-18 for 82 yards and an interception. Rossetti added 50 yards on the ground on 14 carries. RB Craig Sutura led the Gaels on the ground with 13 carries for 59 yards and a touchdown. LB and captain Andrew Lipski had 17 tackles while fellow LB Paul Mohan had 16 stops.

## Head Coach Walt Hameline

Now in his 28th year as Director of Athletics and Head Football Coach at Wagner College, the relentlessly energetic and optimistic **Walt Hameline** continues to amass an astounding record of achievement and consistency.

In 2007, he guided the Seahawks to their 22nd winning season in his 27 seasons, a fine 7-4 mark. In addition, the Seahawks boasted the NEC's Offensive Player of the Year in RB Jason Butler as well as four other first-team All-NEC choices. Kicker/Punter Piotr Czech, the greatest specialist in NEC and Wagner history, was an AFCA All-American who went on to sign a free agent contract with the NFL's Baltimore Ravens. DB Al Phillips inked a free agent contract with the New York Jets while DE Robert Brown was named an Associated Press Third-Team All-American.

Hameline's overall coaching ledger includes five ECAC Championships, three NCAA Tournament appearances and the 1987 NCAA Division III National Championship — all told, 10 post-season appearances in 26 seasons. Hameline won his 175th career game - all at Wagner with a come-from-behind victory over St. Francis (PA) in the 2005 season finale. He became the winningest coach in Wagner College history in 1990, and boasts a .656 winning percentage at 186-98-2, which ranks in the top 10 among active FCS coaches in the United States.

The highlight, of course, is the 19-3 win over heavily-favored Dayton in the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl for the 1987 NCAA Division III National Championship. Against one of the toughest schedules in the nation, Hameline's Seahawks rolled to a 13-1 record, winning more games than any college football team in America. The team earned the school's second Lambert Trophy, symbolic of football superiority in the East among Division III schools, and ECAC Team of the Year recognition. Hameline was honored by many organizations including the Chevrolet National Coach of the Year.

Under Hameline's leadership, the Seahawk athletic department has undergone an ambitious expansion in both sport offerings and facility improvements.

Since 1992, Hameline has added six women's sports to the athletic program. In the spring of 2002, Wagner introduced women's water polo to its slate bringing Wagner's total number of Division I teams to 22 and creating new opportunities for female athletes.

Known for his keen vision and boundless enthusiasm, Hameline was influential in establishing the Seahawk Golf Classic, now in its 19th year, and the Seahawk Club, a pair of initiatives aimed at increasing funds for the scholarship endowment and complete financial support for the athletic department.

Most recently under Hameline's direction, the Wagner College Stadium field has been resurfaced with a state-of-the-art Field Turf playing surface. This multi-purpose surface was constructed in the summer of 2006 and is used for football, soccer and lacrosse.

In 1997 Hameline governed the opening of Wagner's football stadium and outdoor track & field facility and was instrumental in erecting the Spiro Sports Center in the spring of 1999 - a 93,000 square-foot building which houses a 2,100-seat, multi-purpose arena, a six-lane swimming pool, team locker rooms and all athletic department offices.

In 1995, Hameline oversaw the opening of new athletic fields at the base of Grymes Hill to house additional teams. This multi-sport facility is presently home to the Seahawk softball team which, in 2007, underwent a vast reconstruction.

The 57 year-old administrator, has been a key developer of the Northeast Conference, serving on numerous committees and served as president of the league. Eight years ago, Hameline was honored for his playing, coaching and administrative achievements when he was inducted into the Utica Sports Hall of Fame. In addition, Hameline was given the All-America Football Foundation Johnny Vaught Lifetime Achievement Award in 1998.

## Homecoming Day on Grymes Hill

Today promises to be a festive occasion at Wagner College. In addition to introducing the five members of the 2008 Hall of Fame during a halftime presentation, it's Homecoming Day on Grymes Hill.

Be sure to remain in your seats at the conclusion of the game as a Homecoming tradition continues this year with the presentation of the Robb & Lia Awards. Annually at homecoming, two Wagner College football players are selected to receive special awards for outstanding play.

Selected by an alumni panel, the James Robb Memorial Trophy is presented to the outstanding offensive player, while the Nick Lia Memorial Trophy is awarded to the Seahawks' outstanding defensive player.

Established in 1949, the Robb Trophy was named in memory of James Robb, a Seahawk gridiron star who was killed in action during World War II. It was presented to Wagner's outstanding individual player in the annual homecoming game until 1969.

In that season, the Lia Trophy was introduced in honor of another Wagner football player, Nick Lia. The 1965 recipient of the Robb Trophy was killed in the Vietnam War. An outstanding defensive player and team captain, the Staten Island native was a graduate of Curtis High School.

In 2000, Lt. Nick Lia was honored for his athletic achievements by being inducted into the Wagner College Athletics Hall of Fame. Lia helped lead the 1964 football team to an undefeated season and captained the '65 team.

## NEC Gains Access to NCAA Post-Season Bracket

Last April, the NCAA announced that the Northeast Conference will gain automatic access into the Division I Football Championship beginning in 2010. NEC Football is also eligible for automatic qualification into the championship bracket during the 2008 and 2009 seasons if its champion meets specifications of the bridge program.

"This is great for the NEC and its student-athletes," commented league commissioner Brenda Weare. "It provides greater opportunity for our league on numerous levels. It should bolster our recruiting efforts and overall competitiveness, while also helping us brand our league."

Beginning in 2010, there will be an increase in the number of FCS playoff participants to 20, a 25 percent rise from its current 16-team format. The NEC will acquire one of the four added berths and be guaranteed an opportunity to play for the 2010 FCS Championship.

"This is a great day for the Northeast Conference, college football in general and Wagner College in particular," said Wagner Director of Athletics/Head Football Coach **Walt Hameline**. "Having access to the playoffs adds value to our football program and allows NEC student-athletes a chance to compete in post-season play and, ultimately, for a national championship."

## Muir Spot on at Punter

In the special teams department, junior left-footed punter **Kyle Muir (Spencerport, NY/Hudson CC)**, a transfer from Syracuse, turned in an admirable job in his first game as a Seahawk, replacing the incomparable Piotr Czech, averaging 42.3 yards on six punts. Four of those punts were downed inside the Stonehill 20-yard line and in the third quarter, he launched a 57-yarder.

## Double Vision

The 2008 Seahawks feature two sets of twins, all members of Wagner's deep and talented freshmen class.

Defensive ends **Adams** and **Moses Isaaka**, scholastic stars at Woodbridge HS in New Jersey, are fraternal twin brothers who originally hail from the African country of Ghana.

The McKillop twins, a pair of linebackers, didn't travel quite as far to Grymes Hill. Identical twin brothers **Justin** and **Ryan McKillop**, are natives of Saugus, CA

In addition, freshman long-snapper **Nick Linehan (Plainville, MA/Bishop Feehan)** is the younger brother of former Seahawk standout long-snapper Tyler Linehan.

## 2007 All-NEC

Senior running back Jason Butler was named the 2007 Northeast Conference's Offensive Player of the Year, highlighting a stellar season that saw five Seahawk players earn seven first-team accolades.

Butler was the fifth Seahawk to earn an All-NEC major award. Rick Sarille was Offensive Player of the Year in 1996 and 1999. Mike Steed was named Defensive Rookie of the Year in 1996 while in 1997 Daryn Plummer was Defensive Rookie of the Year. The 1996 Defensive Player of the Year was Bill Sommers.

Butler, who became the first NEC player to ever rush for 100 yards or in all 11 games this year, finished second on Wagner's single-season rushing list with 1,713 yards. His 316 rushing attempts this season is also a school mark, as he finished his two-year RB career with 2,448 yards.

Senior kicker/punter Piotr Czech was named a first team selection in both kicking specialties he shouldered for the Seahawks. This marked the third straight year Czech has earned an All-NEC honor as he was named first-team all-NEC kicker and second-team punter in 2006. In 2005, Czech was also tabbed a second-team All-NEC punter. He was joined on this year's first team by fellow senior Al Phillips, who was named the top return man in the conference.

The other first team Green & White honorees were defensive stalwarts Bryan Brand at linebacker, Robert Brown at defensive end, and Al Phillips - once again - this time for his prowess at the cornerback position. This was the third year in a row he's been selected for that position.

Phillips, the premier defensive back in the conference all year, dominated the interceptions category with seven on the season to finish his career with 17 INTs, third on the Wagner all-time list.

Seahawks' defensive lineman Robert Brown also led a defensive category - sacks - as he posted 11 on the year establishing a benchmark for the NEC with nine being solo.

Senior Bryan Brand finished third in the entire conference in tackles, as the California native tallied 117 total, 55 of those coming solo.

## Wagner Coming off Turnaround Season

Wagner's 2007 season represented a major turnaround from the hard-luck 2006 campaign that saw the Seahawks go 4-0 in non-conference play before dropping all seven NEC games to finish with a 4-7 overall mark. In 2007, Wagner went 7-4 and improved to 3-3 in NEC play. The seven wins are the most by the Seahawks since 2002 when Wagner was also 7-4. For head coach Walt Hameline, 2007 was the 21st winning season he has enjoyed in his 27 years at the helm of the Seahawk program.

The 2008 Wagner College Football program featured three new additions in linebackers coach Joe Todd, wide receivers coach Ivery Gaskins and safeties coach Mike Horan.

A native of Mansfield, MA, **Joe Todd** is no stranger to the New York City Metropolitan area. Todd was a three-year starter at linebacker at Hofstra and played briefly in the NFL with the New York Jets and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Todd's extensive background also includes serving as a linebackers coach at the University of Rhode Island, the University of New Hampshire and Iona College.

Todd comes to Wagner after spending one year as linebackers coach at Rhode Island. Prior to his tenure there, Todd spent the 2006 season in the same capacity for NCAA I-AA quarterfinalist New Hampshire, where he helped lead the Wildcats to a 9-4 record and their third-straight appearance in the NCAA quarterfinals. He began his college coaching career as linebackers coach at Iona College during the 2005 season.

A native of West Palm Beach, FL, Gaskins was a scholastic standout at Cardinal Newman High School before prepping a year at Worcester Academy in Worcester, MA.

**Mike Horan** comes to Wagner after serving one year at the United States Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA), where he was responsible for coaching the inside linebackers. Prior to his stint at the USMMA, he spent the 2006 season as an assistant coach at Curry College where he coached the tight ends.

The mammoth game-winning drive, which elapsed 10:32 off the clock, was capped by a quarterback sneak by Cruz Parsons with 1:12 left to play. Brendan Gorey's PAT gave Stonehill its first lead of the game and defensive back Stephen Neville sealed the win by intercepting a "Hail Mary" pass by Seahawk QB Adam Farnsworth with 10 seconds to play.

Wagner looked sharp early, marching 53 yards on nine plays in 4:56 in jumping out to the 7-0 lead. Junior RB Shane Smith (Susquehanna, PA/Milford Academy), who began his career at the University of Central Florida, busted his way loose on an impressive 13-yard jaunt on a fourth-and-three situation.

Stonehill, a Division II program coached by Staten Island native and Curtis High graduate Robert Talley, countered with 4:31 left in the first half on a 49-yard hook-up from Parsons to RB Eddie Vachon to knot the game at 7-7.

Seahawk reshman RB Prince Young then scampered 24 yards for a TD to cap the two-play, 36-yard drive but the Seahawks muffed the extra point try, leaving them with a 13-7 lead.

The second half was a defensive-minded affair as the teams combined for seven punts with the only points scored by either side coming on a Stonehill's game-winning march. In the second half, Wagner's five drives ended with four punts and an interception as the Seahawks did not cross the 50-yard line.

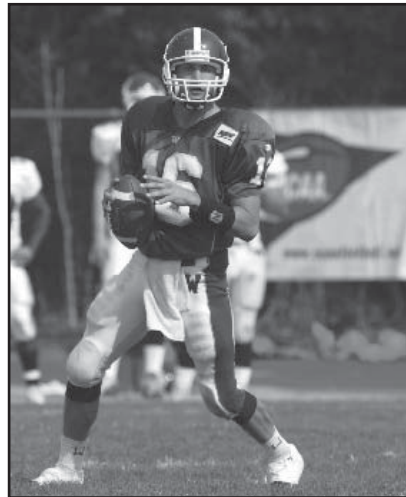
