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No. 8 Wake Forest Takes on No. 24 Penn State, Connecticut at UConn Classic

The eighth-ranked Wake Forest women's soccer team continues non-conference play this weekend as it faces No. 24 Penn State and Connecticut at the UConn Classic in Storrs, Conn. The Deacs and Nittany Lions face off at 5 p.m. on Friday, while kickoff between Wake and UConn is slated for 2 p.m. on Sunday.

The Demon Deacons enter the weekend with a 6-0 record and are coming off victories against Kentucky and East Carolina last weekend. The six consecutive wins to open the season is the best start for the program since 2002, when the team opened the season with nine straight victories.

Seniors Jill Hutchinson and Kaley Fountain lead Wake Forest offensively, with each player tied for the team lead with 14 points. Hutchinson has a team-best six goals and two assists, while Fountain has added five goals and a team-leading four assists.

Defensively, Wake Forest has allowed just two goals in six games and has turned in four shutouts. Senior goalkeeper Laura Morse has a 0.40 goals against average, giving up two goals and making seven saves in over 451 minutes of action. Amanda Barasha has yet to allow a goal in 88 minutes of play.

Penn State enters the weekend with a 2-3-0 record. The Nittany Lions are ranked in all four of the major women's soccer national rankings, including 23rd by Soccer America and 24th by the NSCAA. PSU is coming off a 1-0 loss to Rutgers last Sunday.

Danielle Toney leads Penn State with three goals, two assists and eight points in 2009. Katie Schoepfer, Christine Naim and Nikki Watts have each added a goal for Penn State.

Connecticut brings a 2-2 record into this weekend's action. After opening the season with a pair of losses, the Huskies have won two consecutive matches, defeating Harvard and Central Connecticut State.

Linda Ruutu has a team-leading three goals, while also contributing an assist, so far in 2009. Melissa Busque leads the Huskies with three assists on the year.

Wake Forest and Penn State are meeting for the first time in series history, while Connecticut holds a 1-0-1 series edge against the Demon Deacons.

- This is the 16th year of Wake Forest women's soccer. The Deacons have posted an all-time record of 181-116-22.
- Tony da Luz is in his 13th season as the head coach of the Wake Forest women's soccer team. He has compiled a 150-90-19 record during his tenure at Wake Forest.
- Seniors Jill Hutchinson and Kaley Fountain are tied for the team lead with 14 points. Hutchinson has a team-best six goals and two assists, while Fountain has five goals and a team-leading four assists.

The Coaches

Wake Forest: Tony da Luz is in his 13th season at the helm of the Wake Forest women's soccer program. Da Luz has led the Demon Deacons to the NCAA Tournament in each of his 12 seasons. He has a career record of 195-131-22, including a 150-90-19 mark while at Wake Forest. Da Luz is facing Penn State for the first time in his career and has an 0-1-1 record against Connecticut.

Penn State: Erica Walsh is in her third season as head coach at Penn State. Walsh has a 36-15-2 mark as the Nittany Lion head coach, leading Penn State to the Big Ten title in each of her first two years. Her career record currently stands at 76-43-5.

Connecticut: Len Tsantiris is in his 29th year leading the UConn women's soccer program. Tsantiris, who led the Huskies to 26 straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1982-2007, has a career record of 465-139-41.

Scouting Penn State

Penn State enters the weekend with a 2-3-0 record. The Nittany Lions are ranked in all four of the major women's soccer national rankings, including 23rd by Soccer America and 24th by the NSCAA. PSU is coming off a 1-0 loss to Rutgers last Sunday.

Deacs Off to Best Start Since 2002

Wake Forest has opened the 2009 season with six consecutive wins, the best start for the Demon Deacons since the 2002 season. In 2002, the Deacs opened the season with nine straight victories. The 6-0 start is also the third best beginning to a season in program history, behind the 9-0 start in 2002 and an 8-0 start in 1996.

Wake Forest in September

The Demon Deacons have fared well in the month of September, posting an 82-33-9 record in the ninth month of the year. Wake Forest is 2-0-0 in September so far in 2009.

Tony da Luz Nearing 200th Career Victory

Wake Forest head coach Tony da Luz is nearing a career milestone, as he is five victories shy of his 200th career win. Da Luz has a 195-131-22 in his 18 years of coaching. He earned his 150th win at Wake Forest last Sunday in a 4-0 victory against East Carolina. Da Luz's record as the Demon Deacon head coach currently stands at 150-90-19.

Wake Forest Features Strong Offense in 2009

One of the major storylines in the early part of 2009 for Wake Forest has been the team's explosive offense. The Demon Deacons have scored 19 goals over the first six games of the season, averaging more than three goals a game. Wake ranks in a tie for second in the ACC in goals scored and is fourth in shots attempted with 106.

Wake Moves Into Top 10 in National Polls

On the strength of six straight wins to open the 2009 season, Wake Forest has moved into the top 10 in each of the major national women's soccer rankings. The Deacs are ranked sixth by Top Drawer Soccer, while the NSCAA places Wake at No. 8. Soccer Times ranks Wake Forest No. 9 this week, while Soccer America has the Demon Deacons ranked at No. 10.

Hutchinson Heating Up

After not scoring a point in the first game of the season against High Point, senior forward Jill Hutchinson has heated up, scoring at least one point in each of the last five games. Hutchinson has two multi-goal games during the last five contests, including scoring two goals and an assist in Wake's last match against East Carolina. The Wayne, Pa.,

Deacs Continue Success in Season Openers

Wake Forest continued to play well in season lid-lifters, defeating High Point 5-0 in the 2009 season openers. The Demon Deacons are now 9-4-3 in season openers and a 14-2 all-time in home openers.

Wake Forest Switches Formations in 2009

One noticeable difference in the Wake Forest women's soccer team in 2009 will be the formation the team lines up in. After playing a 4-4-2 formation in 2008, the team will move into a 4-3-3 formation for the 2009 season. Senior Kaley Fountain is projected to move into the third forward spot after playing as a defender last year. Head coach Tony da Luz cited Barcelona, one of the top club teams in the world, as the inspiration for the switch in formations.

Deacs Picked Sixth in ACC Preseason Poll

Wake Forest was picked to finish sixth in the 2009 ACC Women's Soccer Preseason Poll, as voted on by the league's 11 head coaches.

The Deacs, who finished sixth in the conference last season, earned a total of 66 points to finish sixth in the preseason ranking.

Defending national champion North Carolina was a unanimous choice to repeat as conference champions, earning 11 first-place votes and 121 points overall. Florida State was picked to finish second, while Boston College was selected third.

Rounding out the preseason poll in order of finish was Virginia (88 points), Duke (76 points), Wake Forest, Virginia Tech (51 points), Maryland (42 points), Miami (41 points), Clemson (19 points) and NC State (17 points).

D'Agostino, Farrell Travel to England with U-23 WNT

Wake Forest senior defender Caitlin Farrell and junior midfielder Bianca D'Agostino spent part of their summer representing the United States with the U-23 Women's National Team. The duo played and

started both games on the trip for the U.S. It marked the first time that each player was selected for a U.S. youth national team.

First Goal Wins

Tony da Luz enters his 13th season at the helm of the women's soccer team at Wake Forest University. He has led the Demon Deacons to an impressive streak of 12 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and under his tutelage, Wake Forest has never experienced a losing season.

Under his guidance, 28 Deacs have earned All-ACC honors, including eight first-team selections and two ACC Rookie of the Year winners. Da Luz has helped guide two Freshmen All-Americans and seven to the ACC All-Freshman team. Also, 20 Deacs have been named All-Southeast Region and eight have been selected to ACC Championship all-tournament teams, while the team has continually been ranked among the top-25 in the nation.

In 2008, Wake Forest found itself ranked in the top 25 for all of the 2008 season. The Deacs finished the year with a 13-8-0 record and were selected to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Wake defeated Morehead State 2-0 in the first round of the tournament, before being defeated by James Madison 1-0 in the second round.

The 2007 season was another successful one for the Demon Deacons. Wake Forest finished the season with a 13-7-3 record, including an impressive 6-2-2 mark in the ACC to tie for second place. The Deacons advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 10th straight year, defeating Boston University in the first round, before falling to Connecticut in the second round.

In 2006, the Deacons matched their most successful season to date, tying the 1999 overall record of 16-6-1. Led by senior Elizabeth Remy, who was named third team All-American by Soccer Buzz Magazine, the Demon Deacons advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2002. Goalkeepers Kaitlyn Doe and Laura Morse shared minutes in the net and helped tie the team's all-time shutout record, posting 12 for the season.

In 2005, the Demon Deacons continued to make their mark nationally, earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for the 10th consecutive season and remaining in the national rankings for the majority of the year. Finishing the year with a 9-9-1 overall mark, the Deacs reached as high as eighth in the rankings. Boasting a young squad, Wake Forest was led by two seniors in 2005, Sarah Kozey and Melanie Schneider and both were named second team All-ACC. Kozey, also a 2004 All-ACC selection, finished her career as the Demon Deacons' leading scorer after leading Wake Forest for the second year in a row with eight goals.

With just one senior on the roster, the 2004 campaign marked another successful season for the Deacs, despite the youth of the squad. The Deacons once again got off to a quick start with a 6-1-1 record in the first eight games and quickly entered the polls ranked 19th.

The Deacons finished the season with a 10-7-2 record and a 4-4-1 mark in the newly expanded ACC. The lone senior, Alli Hunt, earned second team All-ACC honors along with Kozey. Wake Forest reached the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time in just 11 years of competition.

The 2003 season brought the team continued success, including the title at the Wake Forest adidas Classic. The team broke into the top 10 of the national rankings and earned the program's eighth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth. Despite a loss in the first round to UNC-Greensboro, the team closed another season with a winning record and a strong ACC finish.

Also during the 2003 season, the Deacs received the ACC Women's Soccer Fall Sportsmanship Award, an honor given annually that recognizes teams that earned the utmost regard from their peers during competition. Alena Thom and Melanie Schneider earned individual recognition by the league with spots on the ACC All-League second-team, while freshman Elizabeth Remy made the All-ACC freshman team.

The 2002 season brought Wake Forest one of its best starts in school history, as the Deacs went 9-0 during the first four weeks of action and was ranked as high as sixth nationally by Soccer

Buzz.

The Demon Deacons finished the year 13-8-1, including 2-4-1 in conference play. Wake Forest earned its seventh consecutive post-season berth and advanced to the second round of the tournament for the second time in three seasons. Three players earned All-ACC honors and were selected to the All-Southeast Region team.

Da Luz led the Deacons back to the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and finished with a final mark of 9-9-2. The Deacs advanced to the semifinals of the ACC Championship. Da Luz saw three of his seniors earn All-ACC honors and two named to the All-Southeast Region team. Da Luz earned his 100th career victory during the season, putting him in the century club in only 10 seasons - five of which at Wake Forest.

Even without a true goalkeeper, Wake finished 11-8-2 overall in 2000 and 4-3 in the ACC to finish second place in the league, the highest conference finish in school history.

The Deacons finished 15th in the polls, after reaching a season high of 12th. Da Luz led the Demon Deacons back to the NCAA Tournament, where they advanced to the second round before falling to the eventual champions, North Carolina.

Wake Forest enjoyed its best season ever in 1999, finishing 16-6-1 overall and 4-3 in the ACC, good for third place. The Demon Deacons reached the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Wake earned a national ranking as high as seventh, the highest ranking in program history, before finishing the season ranked 12th nationally by the NSCAA.

Selected the 1998 ACC Coach of the Year by a vote of his peers, da Luz led Wake Forest to a 13-7-1 overall record and a 4-3 mark in the ACC regular season race, good for a fourth-place finish.

In his first season, da Luz guided the Deacons to the NCAA Tournament, falling to eventual national champion North Carolina in the first round. Wake Forest finished the season with an 11-8-2 record against a challenging schedule and was ranked as high as 12th in the nation.

In 18 years of coaching at the collegiate level, da Luz's career record stands at 195-131-22, including a 13-year mark of 150-90-19 at Wake Forest.

Prior to coming to Wake Forest, da Luz coached five years at the University of San Diego, where he compiled a 45-41-3 record.

Da Luz was entrusted with starting the San Diego program from the ground up in 1992 and in his final two seasons he guided his teams to a 25-13-2 mark.

His final season at San Diego was his most impressive, leading the Toreros to a 15-7-1 record and into the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1996.

His success at San Diego earned him West Coast Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1996. He was named the West Region Coach of the Year by the National Soccer Coaches Association.

Da Luz has been coaching for 19 years. He worked as an assistant coach for the San Diego men's team from 1985 until 1991. He has also been active in coaching at the youth level with his involvement with the Winston-Salem Twins Club organizations. Da Luz achieved success as a player as a midfielder and defender while at San Diego. He was an All-WCC honorable mention selection in both 1981 and 1982. As team captain in 1982, he led the Toreros in assists and earned the team MVP award.

Da Luz earned his bachelor's degree in Business Administration from San Diego in 1985. He and his wife, Amy, reside in Winston-Salem with their children Tyler, Austin and Jonah. Austin is a senior midfielder on the Wake Forest men's soccer team.

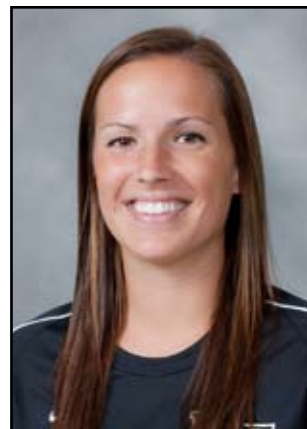

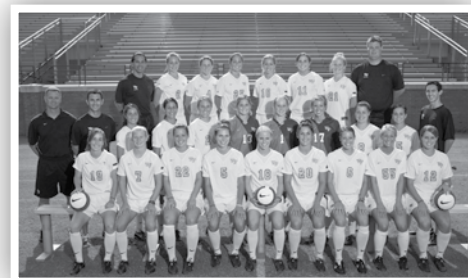
