About Antonelli... Sensational athlete with the ability to play all over the diamond... started all 163 games the Demon Deacons played the past three years... finished his career with a .324 batting average, 18 home runs and 110 RBI...

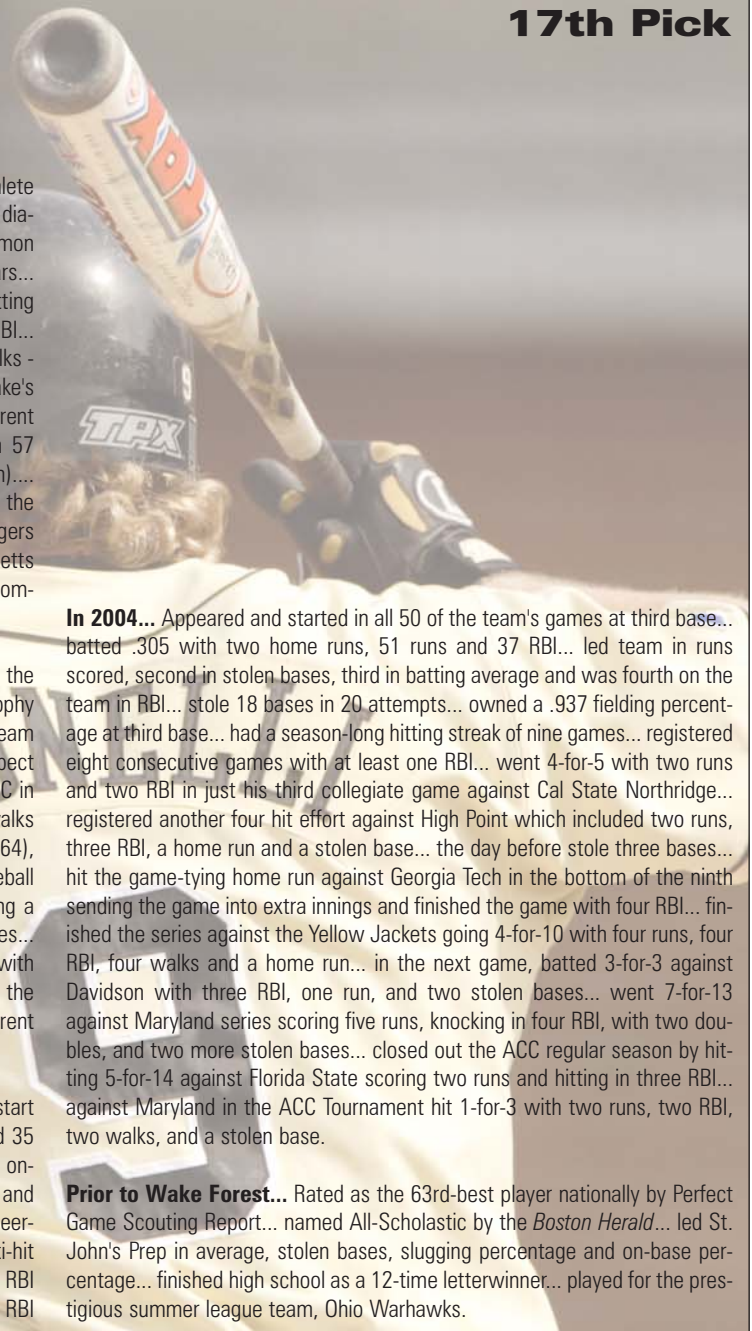
swiped 46 career bases and set a new school record with 128 career walks - surpassing Jamie D'Antona's previous mark of 113... finished sixth on Wake's all-time runs scored list with 183... stands among the top 10 in three different single-season categories... in 2005, not only set a school record with 57 walks, but also scored 68 runs (t-10th) and registered 22 doubles (t-8th)... named Cape Cod League All-Star each of the past two summers for the Falmouth Commodores... a 19th round draft pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 2004 MLB Draft... a three-sport prep superstar... the Massachusetts Player of the Year in football and hockey and the runner-up in baseball... a communications major... born April 8, 1985.

In 2006... Drafted with the 17th overall pick by the San Diego Padres in the 2006 MLB Draft... named first team All-ACC... chosen to the Howser Trophy watch list... preseason candidate for Wallace Award... named second team preseason All-American by Baseball America... rated as the No. 27 prospect in the junior class by Baseball America... ranked in the top ten in the ACC in runs scored (4th), home runs (t-8th), doubles (5th), total bases (6th), walks (8th) and slugging percentage (10th)... led Wake Forest in runs scored (64), hits (73), doubles (18) and stolen bases (15)... named to the College Baseball Foundation Honor Roll (April 3)... registered 21 multi-hit games, including a pair of four-hit games... has scored a run in 38 of the Deacons 55 games... eight of his 11 home runs have gone to the opposite field... batting .347 with runners in scoring position... has reached base, by hit or walk, in 52 of the Deacons 55 games... has homered twice in a single-game on two different occasions (Wright State and Virginia Tech).

In 2005... One of four players to start all 58 games in 2005, but only to start at the same position (third base)... batted .332 with five home runs and 35 RBI... led the team in batting average, runs scored (68), walks (57) and on-base percentage (.475)... batted .352 with 10 doubles, three home runs and 19 RBI in ACC play... batted in the lead-off spot in 47 games... had a career-best 12 game hit streak from March 2 to March 25... recorded 23 multi-hit games, including streaks of four and five games... went 3-for-4 with two RBI and five runs scored against Virginia on March 5... went 4-for-5 with an RBI and three runs scored at Georgia Tech on March 12... went 4-for-7 with three runs scored and five RBI at Appalachian State May 11... hit a remarkable .424 for the year against left-handed pitching... drew walks in 41 of the teams 58 games... established a new school record for walks.

In 2004... Appeared and started in all 50 of the team's games at third base... batted .305 with two home runs, 51 runs and 37 RBI... led team in runs scored, second in stolen bases, third in batting average and was fourth on the team in RBI... stole 18 bases in 20 attempts... owned a .937 fielding percentage at third base... had a season-long hitting streak of nine games... registered eight consecutive games with at least one RBI... went 4-for-5 with two runs and two RBI in just his third collegiate game against Cal State Northridge... registered another four hit effort against High Point which included two runs, three RBI, a home run and a stolen base... the day before stole three bases... hit the game-tying home run against Georgia Tech in the bottom of the ninth sending the game into extra innings and finished the game with four RBI... finished the series against the Yellow Jackets going 4-for-10 with four runs, four RBI, four walks and a home run... in the next game, batted 3-for-3 against Davidson with three RBI, one run, and two stolen bases... went 7-for-13 against Maryland series scoring five runs, knocking in four RBI, with two doubles, and two more stolen bases... closed out the ACC regular season by hitting 5-for-14 against Florida State scoring two runs and hitting in three RBI... against Maryland in the ACC Tournament hit 1-for-3 with two runs, two RBI, two walks, and a stolen base.

Prior to Wake Forest... Rated as the 63rd-best player nationally by Perfect Game Scouting Report... named All-Scholastic by the *Boston Herald*... led St. John's Prep in average, stolen bases, slugging percentage and on-base percentage... finished high school as a 12-time letterwinner... played for the prestigious summer league team, Ohio Warhawks.
