33 Sophomore/Guard/6-5/200
East Flat Rock, NC (Hargrave Military Academy)

Was perhaps the biggest surprise of last year's freshman class ... played in every game and was a key reserve off the bench ... adjusted well and quickly to the intensity of basketball in the ACC ... an athletic wing player who is one of the top defensive players on the team ... slides his feet well on defense and owns one of the team's best vertical leaps ... worked hard during the off-season to improve his outside shooting ... learned a great deal as a rookie by guarding first team All-American Josh Howard in practice every day ... Strickland's role, in fact, was that of a back-up to Howard at the big guard or small forward position ... will compete for more minutes -- if not a starting job -- at the big guard or small forward position.

Played in all 31 games, tying for the seventh-most games played by a Wake Forest freshman ... averaged 12.2 minutes per game ... ranked second on the team among non-starters in scoring (4.3 ppg.) ... shot a solid 78.8 percent from the free throw line, helping the Deacons finish among the nation's leaders ... his free throw percentage was the eighth-highest ever by a Deacon freshman ... shot an even higher free throw percentage (.806) in ACC games ... made 7-of-20 three-point field goal attempts (.350) ... scored in double figures four times ... scored in 24

Wake Forest, NC (Wake Forest-Rolesville HS)

An extremely large and powerful post player who has the potential to be a dominating player ... made the difficult transition last year from high school to full-time starter for an ACC team ... was unstoppable at times in his rookie season but lacked consistency and often was plagued with foul trouble ... needs to be more aggressive on the boards and help fill the rebounding void left by Josh Howard's graduation ... gets most of his points from point-blank range, but he has a soft shoot-



ing touch from 15 feet and in ... developed an effective jump hook last season ... got off to a fast start as a freshman, scoring in double figures 10 times in his first 12 college games.

2002-03

Started all 31 games -- the third-most games started ever by a Wake Forest freshman and tying for the seventh-most games played by a Deacon freshman ... led the Deacons in field goal percentage (.547) -- the eighth-highest percentage ever by a Wake Forest freshman ... ranked fifth on the team in scoring (8.7 ppg.) ... ranked 15th in the ACC and fourth on the team in offensive rebounds per game (1.84) ... helped Wake Forest lead the nation in rebounding ... blocked 18 shots -- the 11th-most ever by a Wake Forest freshman ... recorded two double-doubles ... committed a team-high 96 personal fouls and tied for the team high with five disqualifications ... his eight offensive rebounds against SC State on Dec. 18 tied for the most by a Deacon in 2002-03 ... had an impressive career debut with 14 points (on 6-of-8 shooting) and four steals in the season opener against Yale ... followed that effort with 19 points on 8-of-11 shooting and 10 rebounds for his first career double-double versus Temple ... earned another double-double Dec. 18 against SC State with 11 points and 10 boards ... was a key player in Wake's Dec. 21 win over visiting St. John's with 16 points (on 7-of-10 shooting), eight rebounds and a blocked shot ... scored 15 points, made 6-of-7 shots and had four steals Jan. 7 versus Elon ... made all six of his free throw attempts en route to 16 points in the Jan. 15 victory versus Maryland ... rebounded from a late January scoring slump by pouring in 16 points (on 7-of-10 shooting) to go with five rebounds and two assists in home win over NC State ... turned his game up a notch in the postseason ... scored 12 points in just 11 minutes against NC State in the ACC Tournament ... poured in a career-high 20 points, grabbed nine rebounds and blocked three shots against East Tennessee State in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament ... had two or more blocks five times.
