- A seven-run third inning elevated the Wake Forest baseball team to a 7-5 victory over Western Carolina on Tuesday night at David F. Couch ballpark.

 Trailing 3-0 in the middle of the third, the Deacons used their third inning of at least seven runs this the season
- to outlast the Catamounts (8-9, 0-0 SoCon), highlighted by a three-run home run from Nick Kurtz and RBI-singles from Pierce Bennett and Adam Cecere.
- Crawford Wade entered the game in the second inning and recorded eight outs while only giving up two hits to earn his first collegiate win. Gabe Golob relieved Wade at the top of the fourth inning and retired seven-straight batters. The Wade-Golob tandem combined for 5.2 innings of work on Tuesday night with four strikeouts and scattering
- A Catamount rally began to unfold in the ninth before Jacob Grzebinski entered the game with the bases loaded and no outs. Grzebinski recorded a strikeout and held Western Carolina scoreless, recording his first save in the Old
- Pierce Bennett led the Deacs at the plate with three hits, two RBIs and one run scored. This marks the sixth time Bennett has notched at least two base hits and heads into the weekend leading Wake Forest with a .426 batting average and 23 hits.

- Wake Forest and Georgia Tech are longtime rivals as they have faced off 115 times prior to this year's three-game series. The Deacs trail the all-time series 41-74.
- The teams have split the last 10 meetings. Last year, the Deacs and Yellow Jackets hit the diamond for the first time since the 2018 season.

- WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

 Overall, Wake Forest has outscored their opponents 170-57 to open the new campaign with a team batting average of .325 with a .444 on-base percentage and team ERA of just 2.70.
- The Deacs got off to one of the best starts in program history with an 11-0 record, the first time since 1961 Wake Forest has won their first 11 games. Additionally, the Deacs became the second team in the nation to reach 11 wins following their win against Central Michigan.
- Wake Forest's 11-game win streak marked the longest overall winning streak since the Deacs won 15 in a row during the 2012 season.
- · Wake Forest has one of the top offenses in the entire nation and ACC as the Deacs lead the ACC in two offensive categories, as well as ranking in the top-10 nationally in five.
- On the mound, Wake Forest's starting pitchers have accounted for 56.7 percent of the team's innings (85-of-150). Additionally, the Deacs' starters have tallied 52.4 percent of the team's overall strikeouts (87-of-166).
- The Demon Deacons have been able to rely on their bullpen as six relievers have given up three runs or less this season (six innings pitched minimum).
- Heading into the weekend, Wake Forest is fourth in the ACC in ERA (2.70) and fielding percentage (.984)
- Brendan Tinsman has caught eight base runners trying to steal a base, the most in the ACC.
- Nine Demon Deacons have notched at least 10 base hits this season, highlighted by Pierce Bennett with 23. Bennett also leads the team with a .426 batting average.
- The Demon Deacons have notched double-digit walks four times this season. Each of those outings, Wake Forest has also recorded double-digit hits and has averaged 17.75 runs per game.
- The Deacs continue to get strong performances from their pitchers as Wake Forest's opponents have yet to score more than five runs in a single game this season.
 Wake Forest's weekend rotation is spearheaded by sophomore right hander Rhett Lowder, who is a perfect 4-0
- this season with an ERA of 1.93. His 29 strikeouts rank fifth in the ACC. Additionally, Lowder is holding opponents to a .193 average against him.
- Wake Forest's offense has been successful from the jump as the 2022 squad posted two games of at least 20 runs for just the second time in program history. Wake Forest plated 29 runs against Argentina and 23 runs against Brazil as the United States representative in the 1951 Pan-American Games.

• The Deacs wraps up their road stand with a midweek matchup with nationally-ranked Liberty on March 22 in Lynchburg, Va. First pitch is slated for 4 p.m.

Nine Demon Deacons have notched at least 10 base hits this season, led by Pierce Bennett with 23.

Brendan Tinsman has caught eight base runners trying to steal a base, the most in the ACC.

Wake Forest tied its program-record for runs in a single inning on Opening Night against Lafayette, plating 16 runs to claim a 25-3 victory.

The Deacs currently hold a Team ERA of 2.70 and have not given up more than five runs in a game this season.

PATIENCE AT PLATE PAYING DIVIDENDS

- Wake Forest has been patient at the plate over the opening 17 games of the season as the Deacs have been walked 115 times, the most in the ACC and the fifth most in the entire nation.
- The Deacs have been walked at least 10 times in four games this season. In each of those contests, Wake Forest has notched double-digit hits, while scoring double-digit runs in three of the four instances.

 On the mound, Wake Forest's starting pitchers have accounted for 56.7 percent of the team's innings (85-of-150). Additionally, the Deacs' starters have tallied 52.4 percent of the team's overall strikeouts (87-of-166).

- In a Sunday doubleheader against No. 8 Florida State, Wake Forest's bullpen combined for 7.1 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits while fanning 12 batters.
- Overall, the Deacs have only conceded 46 earned runs through 17 games (2.71 per game) and have held every opponent to five or less runs to open the season. Their

LOWDER LEADING THE CHARGE

- After another strong performance from the Demon Deacon Friday starter against Florida State, Rhett Lowder remained perfect on the season as he is now 4-0 with a 1.93 season ERA. His 6.0 innings pitched mark the third-consecutive game he has gone through the sixth inning.
- He fanned four batters, allowing just two earned runs.

 This season, Lowder has posted a team-high 29 strikeouts (fifth in the ACC) compared to just nine walks as opponents are only hitting .193 against him.
- Lowder heads into the second weekend of ACC play as one of four pitchers in the conference with four wins.
- Last season, Lowder tallied 78 punchouts, the third most by a freshman in Wake Forest history.

BIG BAT BENNETT

- Pierce Bennett has paced Wake Forest at the plate all season and heads into the weekend with a team-high .426 batting average and 23 hits.

CORONA'S POWER SURGE LEADS DEACS TO WIN IN ACC OPENER

- Behind two home runs and six RBIs from Danny Corona as well as strong pitching from three arms, the Wake Forest baseball team posted a 9-3 victory in their Atlantic Coast Conference opener versus No. 8 Florida State on Friday, March 11.
- Corona got Wake Forest on the board with a solo home run in the bottom of the fifth inning before lifting a three-run long fly over the right field wall, increasing Wake Forest's lead to 7-2 in the bottom of the sixth.
- The freshman came up clutch again in the eighth inning. With bases loaded, Corona took advantage of the drawn-in infield, splitting the second and first basemen for a two-RBI single. It was the third hit of the day for the No. 9 hole hitter as he tallied his fifth and sixth RBIs of the afternoon. The base knock pushed the lead to 9-2.
- The six RBIs mark a career-best for Corona while the two home runs and three hits tie career-bests in first collegiate season

2022 SEASON OPENS HISTORICALLY

- The Deacs got off to one of the best starts in program history with an 11-0 record, the first time since 1961 Wake Forest has won their first 11 games. Wake Forest headed into Tuesday's game as one of five unbeaten teams in Division I. The Deacs best starts to begin a season:
- 11-0: 2022, 1961, 1949
- 12-0: 1949
- 13-0: 1949
- 14-0: 1949
- 15-0: 1949
- Wake Forest's 11-straight wins marked the longest winning streak overall since the Deacs won 15 in a row during the 2012 season. Wake Forest became the second team in the nation to reach 11 wins.

DEACS DOMINATED MIDWEEK OPENER

- Wake Forest has been dominant in their pair of midweek contests to open the season. The Demon Deacons are outscoring midweek opponents 33-5 with a .429 batting average while holding to a .153 average of their own.
- In those two games, the Deacs have tallied nine home runs, 32 RBIs and 33 hits.
- The Deacs used 21 hits, eight home runs and seven scoreless innings on the mound to defeat the Spartans 23–3 in their first midweek game of the season on Tuesday, Feb. 22. After a scoreless first frame from Seth Keener on the mound, Wake Forest jumped out to a 6–0 lead. Home runs from Brock Wilken, Adam Cecere and Danny Corona in the bottom half of the inning made sure the Demon Deacons led the rest of the way.
- Wake Forest also plated six runs in the third and eighth innings, while tacking on four in the bottom of the fifth.
- Eight Demon Deacons registered at least two hits, led by Corona and Brendan Tinsman with three apiece.
- Against Elon on March 1, Wake Forest pitchers conceded just two hits while striking out 14 and walking just three Elon batters.
- Reed Mascolo tossed a hitless three innings with five strikeouts to set the tone in his first start of the season. Mascolo retired five-straight batters over the second and third innings to keep the Phoenix offense at bay.
- Derek Crum earned the first win of his career with a two-inning outing consisting of three strikeouts and no hits.
- Additionally, both Camden Minacci (2.0 innings) and Eric Adler (1.2 innings) fanned a trio of batters in their relief appearances. Brennen Oxford was called upon with two outs in the ninth and clinched the victory with a fly out to center field.
- Elon found the scoreboard first in the top of the fifth inning, scoring a pair of runs to take a 2-0 lead. Undaunted, Wake Forest rattled off 10-straight runs over the final four frames to claim the midweek victory.

BATS EXPLODE DURING OPENING WEEKEND

- The Deacs outscored their opponents by a tally of 40-8 during Opening Weekend, highlighted by a 25-3 victory on Opening Day against Lafayette. With the victory, the Deacs won their eighth-straight season opener dating back to 2015 and marked Wake Forest's largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2003.
- The Deacons' 25 runs were the most they have scored since March 10, 2015 and Friday was the first time they scored 20-plus runs since April 13, 2019 against Pitt. Additionally, 20 hits were the most in a single game since Feb. 15, 2020 against UW-Milwaukee.
- The Deacons went on to score a program single-inning record-tying 16 runs in the fifth, and they tacked on another eight in the sixth to defeat the Leopards.

- In the weekend finale, the Deacs crushed four home runs against VCU:
- Jake Reinisch (Third)
- Nick Kurtz (Third)
- Adam Cecere (Sixth)
- Adam Cecere (Eighth)
- Heading into Tuesday, Wake Forest is second in the nation in home runs per game (2.33), fifth in on-base percentage (.518) and eighth in scoring (13.3. All three numbers are good for the top in the ACC. Additionally, Wake Forest's team batting average of .379 is 12th in the nation.

BEST DUO ON THE CAPE

- Wake Forest baseball third baseman Brock Wilken and right-handed pitcher Eric Adler received top honors from the Cape Cod Baseball League after stellar first-year performances at the top collegiate summer league.
- Wilken was named the league's most valuable player after an incredible debut season for the Harwich Mariners, while Adler was named the league's top relief pitcher as the right hander continued to slam the door as the Bourne Braves' closer.
- Wilken posted a batting average of .302 with 39 hits, 10 doubles, six home runs, 26 RBIs and 26 runs scored. The Valrico, Fla. native led the league in doubles and walks, while he also finished in the top ten in batting average (tied for eighth), hits (second), home runs (tied for fourth) and RBIs (fourth).
- On the mound, Adler struck out 29 batters while only conceding two runs and six hits in 15.2 innings. Adler fanned 22 batters and walked just three batters in 11 appearances before giving up his first earned run, becoming the first Cape Cod pitcher to post averages of 0.00 ERA, over 10 strikeouts per nine innings and less than 2.5 walks per nine innings since Marcus Stroman in 2010.

WELCOME TO THE STAFF

- Wake Forest's staff added a trio of newcomers to the program this offseason.
- Corey Muscara (Pitching Coach): Muscara comes to Winston-Salem with over a decade of collegiate coaching experience, elevating multiple program's pitching staffs to new heights. Under Muscara's leadership, his teams have finished in the top 10 in ERA and strikeouts on the conference and national level on several occasions, while developing numerous MLB draft prospects at every stop throughout his career.
- Ty Blankmeyer (Volunteer Assistant): Blankmeyer joins the Demon Deacons with a wealth of experience as a player and baseball professional, most recently serving as an Area Scout with the Milwaukee Brewers from 2017-21. During his time with the organization, Blankmeyer was in charge of all scouting responsibilities in the Northeast region of the United States, highlighted by the drafting and signing of Sal Frelick, the 15th overall pick in the 2021 MLB Draft. Blankmeyer was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2016 MLB draft and tallied a batting average of .280 in the Pioneer League before stepping into a player development role with the franchise at the Arizona Complex League (AZL) under Jose Nieves and Miguel Cairo in the summer of 2017.
- Mike McFerran (Pitching Lab Coordinator): Prior to Wake Forest, McFerran served as the Associate Head Coach, Pitching Coach, & Recruiting Coordinator at Skidmore College from 2017-2020. His pitchers saw a quick and vast improvement under his tutelage, moving from eighth in conference ERA in 2017 to fourth in 2018. Additionally, McFerran's pitchers went from last in strikeouts to fourth in a year span. In 2019, Skidmore conceded the least amount of walks in the conference.

HIGHLY-RATED NEWCOMERS

- After Wake Forest's 2021 class was ranked in the top 20 for the first time in program history, the 2022 class landed at No. 13 according to D1 Baseball.
- Freshman Josh Hartle heads into his first collegiate season as the top-rated recruit to attend college from this year's class. D1 Baseball's Andrew Fitt says "LHP Josh Hartle (5) was the top southpaw in the 2021 class, but withdrew from the MLB Draft, giving the Demon Deacons the best recruit in the country. He is loose and projectable with a fastball in the low 90s and the ability to manipulate spin on his breaking ball."
- Danny Corona was selected in the 16th round of the 2021 MLB Draft, but decided to head to Winston-Salem. Fitt on Corona: "Shortstop Daniel Corona (267) has a solid all-around skill set and an advanced feel for the game. The left-handed hitter has a good feel at the plate and actions in the infield, which gives him the look of the Deacons shortstop of the future."
- Overall, the class consists of 13 freshmen as well as six incoming transfers.

A proven program builder and player developer, Tom Walter enters his 13th season in 2022 as the head coach of Wake Forest baseball.

With 325 wins at Wake Forest, he enters 2022 as the second-winningest coach in program history, trailing only George Greer (608 wins in 16 years). Additionally, Walter is one of just two active head coaches in the country to lead three different programs to the NCAA Division I Tournament, becoming just the seventh coach all-time to do so. He joins the ranks of Larry Cochell, Augie Garrido, Sunny Golloway, Andy Lopez, Ron Polk and Jack Stallings, while Randy Mazey joined that group after Walter.

Walter has helped 41 players get drafted or sign pro contracts over the last eight years, including six Deacs drafted among the top 50 picks and back-to-back first rounders in 2021 (Ryan Cusick) and 2020 (Jared Shuster).

#ProDeacs in the major leagues include Gavin Sheets and Stuart Fairchild, who both A program-record eight Demon Deacons were selected in the 2017 MLB Draft, including records of two selected in the top 50 and four in the top seven rounds. Six selections (2012) and five selections (2021) round out the top three of Wake Forest's draft classes under Walter.

While at Wake Forest, Walter has overseen the development of 2016 National Player of the Year Will Craig, All-America selections Craig, Nate Mondou, Stuart Fairchild, Gavin Sheets, Ben Breazeale, Bobby Seymour and Chris Lanzilli, as well as a total of 22 All-ACC selections. Wake Forest had nine All-ACC picks in 2017, a program record and most in the ACC. In 2019, Seymour was named ACC Player of the Year the second at Wake Forest in Walter's tenure, and led the country with 92 RBIs.

Walter and the Deacs had a banner season in 2017, which includes Wake Forest hosting and sweeping the Winston-Salem Regional and finishing a game away from the College World Series, concluding the year with a 43-20 overall record. The Demon Deacons set program records in ACC wins (19), ACC series wins (eight), All-ACC honorees (nine) and home runs (106). The Deacs also set a new team-high with eight student-athletes drafted, including program records of two in the top 50 overall picks and four in the top seven rounds.

Wake Forest earned back-to-back NCAA Regional bids after competing in the College Station Regional in 2016. The Deacs have posted seven winning seasons in the last eight years.

To Walter and the coaching staff, development off the field is equally as important as on the field. All of the program's seniors have graduated on time for six consecutive years, and the team has raised more than \$100,000 for various charities including the ALS Association, JDRF, the Vs. Cancer Foundation and Brenner Children's Hospital. On May 1, 2021, the Deacs hosted its first-ever Fight Against Pediatric Cancer Game, where fans were given the opportunity to bid on special edition, game-worn yellow jerseys that matched the pediatric cancer ribbon. The program raised \$9,485, with all proceeds being donated to Brenner Children's Hospital.

- Most recently, Muscara served as Maryland's pitching coach for the previous four seasons. - Blankmeyer joins the Deacs prior to the 2022 season with a wealth of experience as a player and baseball professional, most recently serving as an Area Scout with the Milwaukee Brewers from 2017-21.
- During his time with the organization, Blankmeyer was in charge of all scouting responsibilities in the Northeast region of the United States, highlighted by the drafting and signing of Sal Frelick, the 15th overall pick in the 2021 MLB Draft.
- Blankmeyer was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2016 MLB draft and tallied a batting average of .280 in the Pioneer League before stepping into a player development role with the franchise at the Arizona Complex League (AZL) under Jose Nieves and Miguel Cairo in the summer of 2017. His job responsibilities included working with the infielders and assisting with day-to-day baseball tasks and operations.
- From 2013-16, Blankmeyer was an outstanding middle infielder at St. John's, appearing in 128 games and being a part of the 2015 Big East Championship team. In the summer before his senior campaign, Blankmeyer took home a Gold Glove in the Northwoods
- Blankmeyer received a degree in Communications from St. John's in 2016.
- The Morristown, N.J. native grew up in a baseball family. His father, Ed Blankmeyer, is the winningest coach in St. John's history with 869 wins. His grandfather, Mike Sheppard Sr., coached at Seton Hall for several years and earned 998 victories, 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and two College World Series

DAVID F. COUCH BALLPARK & CHRIS HURD PLAYER DEVELOPMENT CENTER

- David F. Couch Ballpark is home to the Demon Deacon baseball team. The Deacons moved in to the facility before the start of the 2009 season after playing the previous 28 seasons on campus at historic Gene Hooks Stadium.
- Formerly known as Ernie Shore Field, the park was home to Winston-Salem's Carolina League minor league team for more than 40 years. Wake Forest purchased the facility after the team, now known as the Winston-Salem Dash, moved in to a new downtown ballpark.
- In February 2016, Wake Forest baseball park was renamed David F. Couch Ballpark in honor of former baseball player David Couch ('84). A longtime supporter of Wake Forest Athletics and the baseball program, Couch made the lead gift toward a new \$12 million facility, which opened in February 2017, and included construction of a new dugout and bullpen, locker room, equipment room, training room, team lounge, nutrition area, and pitching lab.
- The latest phase of the Chris Hurd Player Development Center was made possible, in part, thanks to the generosity of Chris and Nancy Hurd who made the lead gift toward the project. It features a team meeting room, dedicated video room, coaches' offices, a biomechanist's office, a conference room, game day suites, and a baseball heritage area. It was dedicated on Oct. 12, 2018, and the construction wrapped up in January 2019.
- With the completion of the pitching lab inside the Chris Hurd Player Development Center at David F. Couch Ballpark, the state-of-the-art biomechanics lab is used to develop Wake Forest student-athletes and transform the game of baseball. Wake Forest Athletics is partnering with Wake Forest Baptist Health on a historic agreement, which combines the two units to enhance player safety and development. On Wake Forest's side, pitching coach Corey Muscara, pitching lab coordinator Mike McFerran, athletic trainer Jeff Strahm and

strength coach Mark Seaver works with Wake Baptist's Dr. Brian Waterman, the team physician specializing in shoulder and elbow care, and biophysicist Dr. Kristen Nicholson.

- Wake Forest players also have access to state-of-the-art technology with the Trackman Pro video system with cameras set up on both the first and third base dugouts, center field and behind home plate. The system allows hitters to view their swings and pitchers their pitching motions following each game, and tracks 27 different data points varying from pitch velocity to spin rate to launch angle.
- Other renovations include:
- 2020: New FieldTurf DoublePlay Classic surface installed prior to the season.
- 2015: Visiting clubhouse converted into state-of-the-art weight room facility.
- 2013: Multi-colored chairback seats replaced with modern all-black seats.
- 2012: 18' x 24' LED video board installed.
- 2011: AstroTurf GameDay 3D52H Grass installed, as well as the manual scoreboard in left field.
- 2010: Indoor hitting facility built beyond left field.
- 2009: Wake Forest purchased and moved into stadium. It previously belonged to the Winston-Salem Dash since it was built in 1956.
