THE MATCHUP

Wake Forest welcomes Appalachian State to David F. Couch Ballpark on Tuesday, April 19 for the first of a home-and-home season series against the in-state rivals.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Wake Forest baseball team dropped the series finale to Clemson, 10-8, Sunday afternoon at David F. Couch Ballpark.
- Every Demon Deacon batter notched a base hit as Wake Forest launched four home runs for the fifth time this season.
- Nick Kurtz led Wake Forest at the plate with two home runs and a double, his fourth three-hit game and the second two-home run performance of the season. Kurtz also scored a team-high three runs.
- Tinsman also launched a home run in the finale, his fifth long fly in Wake Forest's last six games. The redshirt junior leads the team with a career-high 14 home runs this season.
- Jake Reinisch extended his on-base streak to 35 games as the sophomore fired a two-run home run to cut the Tigers' lead to two in the bottom of the seventh.

OPPONENT & SERIES HISTORY

- Wake Forest leads the all-time series against App State, holding a 47-15 advantage.
- The first matchup between the two programs came in 1970. Last season, Wake Forest swept the season series against App State, outscoring the Mountaineers 27-7 in the two non-conference victories.

WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

- Head coach Tom Walter, the second-winningest coach in program history, won his 350th game at the helm of the Wake Forest baseball program with the 16-11 series finale victory against Duke on Sunday.
- Wake Forest has won three ACC series this season, taking Friday and Saturday contests at Georgia Tech and Boston College while sweeping Duke this past weekend for their first home conference series win of 2022.
- With their 15-10 win on Friday night against the Eagles, the 2022 Demon Deacons reeled in its 20th victory in just 26 games, the second fastest since 2000 and the fastest in the head coach Tom Walter era.
- Wake Forest heads into midweek action 15th in the RPI.
- Wake Forest is tied for the second-most wins (27) and conference wins (10) in the ACC.
- The Deacs have picked up five wins against top-15 opponents, four coming in ACC play.
- Overall, Wake Forest has outscored their opponents 342-180 this season with a team batting average of .318 with a .430 on-base percentage and slugging percentage of .538. Wake Forest's team ERA of 3.77 is fourth in the ACC.
- Wake Forest has one of the top offenses in the entire nation and ACC as the Deacs rank in the top five in the conference in every offensive category, highlighted by a conference-best 224 walks and .430 on-base percentage. Additionally, the Deacs rank in the top 10 nationally in on-base percentage (third), walks (fourth), runs (eighth), batting average (sixth), slugging percentage (eighth) and home runs (eighth).
- The 2022 Wake Forest offense is one of the most productive offenses in program history as this year's squad owns the program record for games with 20+ runs (four) as well as 20+ run games against ACC competition (two).
- The Demon Deacon offense exploded in their second game against Georgia Tech, setting a new program record for most runs (27) and hits (28) in an ACC game. Wake Forest's 28 hits rank tied for third in program history, while their 27 runs stand as the sixth-most runs scored in a single game.
- On the mound, Wake Forest's starting pitchers have combined for 161 innings with 155 strikeouts and just 79 earned runs allowed. The Demon Deacons have been able to rely on their bullpen as three relievers have given up five runs or less this season.
- 10 Demon Deacons have notched at least 10 base hits this season, led by freshman Nick Kurtz with 49. Additionally, Brendan Tinsman (14), Brock Wilken (10) and Nick Kurtz (10) have all hit double-digit HRs.
- Wake Forest has been patient at the plate as the Deacs have been walked 224 times, the most in the ACC and the fourth most in the entire nation. The Deacs have been walked at least 10 times in five games this season. In all but one of those contests, Wake Forest has notched double-digit hits, while scoring double-digit runs in three of the five instances.
- Jake Reinisch has reached base in 35-straight games and leads Wake Forest with an on-base percentage of .500 and 36 walks. Heading into midweek action, Reinisch has driven in a run in five of Wake Forest's last seven games. Reinisch ranks second in the ACC in walks and on-base percentage.
- Freshman Nick Kurtz has strung together a stellar freshman campaign, tallying a .348 batting average with a team-high 49 hits to go along with a team-high tying 11 doubles and 10 home runs. With his pair of home runs against Clemson in the series finale, Kurtz is now tied for eighth for most home runs by a freshman in program history. He joins Brock Wilken (17 in 2021) and Brendan Tinsman (10 in 2019) as the only first-year Deacs to reach double-digit home runs since 2010. Additionally, Kurtz already ranks in the top-10 in runs scored (third) and walks (tied for fourth) by a freshman in program history.
- Camden Minacci has been nails coming out of the Wake Forest bullpen. In 29 innings, the sophomore has struck out 44 batters while only allowing five earned runs. Minacci's strikeouts rank second on the team, while he sports the lowest ERA (1.55) on the squad. Against Clemson on Saturday, Minacci earned his second win of the season. Minacci has also tallied four saves, highlighted by earning back-to-back-to-back saves in three appearances in consecutive games.
- Eric Adler is set to make his first career start against the Mountaineers on Tuesday. Over his career, the Rockledge, Fla. native has made 36 relief appearances, tossing 36.2 innings with 52 strikeouts while allowing just 13 earned runs.
- Brendan Tinsman has homered in five of Wake Forest's last six games as the redshirt junior has hit a team and career-best 14 long files this season, which ranks second in the ACC. Tinsman leads the Deacs in slugging (.715) and bases (98).

Wake Forest heads into midweek action 15th in the RPI.

Wake Forest is tied for the second-most wins (27) and conference wins (10) in the ACC.

The Deacs have won their last three ACC series this season, claiming the first two games at Georgia Tech as well as against Boston College in Chestnut Hill, Mass. before sweeping Big Four rival Duke for the first time since 2008.

Five of Wake Forest's wins have come against top-15 opponents with victories against then-No. 8 Florida State, then-No. 6 Georgia Tech twice, then-No. 15 Liberty and then-No. 10 Virginia.

With their 15-10 win on Friday night against the Eagles, the 2022 Demon Deacons reeled in its 20th victory in just 26 games, the second fastest since 2000 and the fastest in the head coach Tom Walter era.

The Deacs got off to one of the best starts in program history with an 11-0 record, the first time since 1961 Wake Forest has won their first 11 games. At that point of the season, Wake Forest stood as one of five unbeaten teams in Division I. The Deacs best starts to begin a season:

- 11-0: 2022, 1961, 1949

Wake Forest's 11-straight wins marked the longest winning streak overall since the Deacs won 15 in a row during the 2012 season. Wake Forest became the second team in the nation to reach 11 wins.

HISTORIC OFFENSIVE SEASON

The Demon Deacon offense has set multiple program records this season.

In their series-clinching victory last weekend at Boston College, Wake Forest scored 20 runs to set a new program record for most games in a season with 20 runs or more as well as the most games with 20 or more runs against an ACC opponent:

Additionally, the 20-run margin of victory is the second-highest in program history for an ACC game as the Demon Deacons defeated Georgia Tech by 21 runs on April 16, 1999.

DEFENSE & PITCHING THRIVING

On the mound, Wake Forest's starting pitchers have combined for 161 innings with 155 strikeouts and just 79 earned runs allowed.

The Demon Deacons have been able to rely on their bullpen as three relievers have given up five runs or less this season (10 innings pitched minimum):

- 4: Crawford Wade
- 5: Gabe Golob, Camden Minacci

In the series opener against No. 6 Georgia Tech, the Deacs gave up just three runs, tying the Yellow Jackets' season low. In the series finale against Virginia, the Deacs held the nation's highest scoring offense to just one run, tying Virginia's lowest-scoring performance of the season and marking the second time this year Virginia hasn't scored at least five runs in a game.

Through the first four games, the Deacs gave up just 11 runs, the fewest number of runs the Deacs have allowed in the first four games in head coach Tom Walter's tenure.

Wake Forest's ranks fourth in the conference in ERA (4.11) and fielding percentage (.977)

REINISCH REACHING BASE

Jake Reinisch has reached base in 35-straight games and leads Wake Forest with an on-base percentage of .500 and 36 walks.

Heading into midweek action, Reinisch has driven in a run in five of Wake Forest's last seven games.

Reinisch ranks second in the ACC in walks and on-base percentage.

The Demon Deacon offense got off to a historic start as the 2022 team became just the second squad in program history to register at least 20 runs multiple times during the opening four games of a season, matching the 1951 squad that represented the United States at the 1951 Pan-American Games.

KURTZ JOINING ELITE COMPANY

Freshman Nick Kurtz has strung together a stellar freshman campaign, tallying a .348 batting average with a team-high 49 hits to go along with a team-high tying 11 doubles and 10 home runs.

In the series finale against Clemson, Kurtz led Wake Forest at the plate with two home runs and a double, his fourth three-hit game and the second two-home run performance of the season. Kurtz also scored a team-high three runs. With his pair of round trippers, Kurtz is now tied for eighth for most home runs by a freshman in program history. He joins Brock Wilken (17 in 2021) and Brendan Tinsman (10 in 2019) as the only first-year Deacs to reach double-digit home runs since 2010.

Additionally, Kurtz already ranks in the top-10 in runs scored (third) and walks (tied for fourth) by a freshman in program history.

In Wake Forest's historic offensive performance on March 19 at Georgia Tech, Kurtz had a historic day at the plate as the freshman became the first Wake Forest batter since 2005 to record six hits in the game. This is also tied for the second most in program history and is the most by a freshman in school history.

PATIENCE AT PLATE PAYING DIVIDENDS

Wake Forest has been patient at the plate as the Deacs have been walked 206 times, the most in the ACC and the third most in the entire nation.

The Deacs have been walked at least 10 times in five games this season. In all but one of those contests, Wake Forest has notched double-digit hits, while scoring double-digit runs in three of the five instances.

MINACCI BRINGING ENERGY OUT OF BULLPEN

Camden Minacci has been nails coming out of the Wake Forest bullpen. In 29 innings, the sophomore has struck out 44 batters while only allowing five earned runs. Minacci's strikeouts rank second on the team, while he sports the lowest ERA (1.55) on the squad. Against Clemson on Saturday, Minacci earned his second win of the season. Minacci has also tallied four saves, highlighted by earning back-to-back-to-back saves in three appearances in consecutive games. Against Boston College, Minacci struck out the side on just nine pitches. This season, Minacci has fanned at least five batters in seven appearances, while allowing no hits or runs in four. Minacci took over with the bases loaded and no one out against Elon, picking up his second save of the season as the right hander kept Wake Forest's lead at two in two innings.

ADLER READY TO MAKE FIRST CAREER START

Eric Adler is set to make his first career start against the Mountaineers on Tuesday. Over his career, the Rockledge, Fla. native has made 36 relief appearances, tossing 36.2 innings with 52 strikeouts while allowing just 13 earned runs. Adler headed into the season fresh off an award-winning summer as the right hander was named the Cape Cod Baseball League's Relief Pitcher of the Year.

TINSMAN'S POWER SURGE LEADING DEACS

Brendan Tinsman has homered in five of Wake Forest's last six games as the redshirt junior has hit a team and career-best 14 long files this season, which ranks second in the ACC. Tinsman leads the Deacs in slugging (.715) and bases (98).

BEST DUO ON THE CAPE

Wake Forest baseball third baseman Brock Wilken and right-handed pitcher Eric Adler received top honors from the Cape Cod Baseball League after stellar first-year performances at the top collegiate summer league.

Wilken was named the league's most valuable player after an incredible debut season for the Harwich Mariners, while Adler was named the league's top relief pitcher as the right hander continued to slam the door as the Bourne Braves' closer.

Wilken posted a batting average of .302 with 39 hits, 10 doubles, six home runs, 26 RBIs and 26 runs scored. The Valrico, Fla. native led the league in doubles and walks, while he also finished in the top ten in batting average (tied for eighth), hits (second), home runs (tied for fourth) and RBIs (fourth).

On the mound, Adler struck out 29 batters while only conceding two runs and six hits in 15.2 innings. Adler fanned 22 batters and walked just three batters in 11 appearances before giving up his first earned run, becoming the first Cape Cod pitcher to post averages of 0.00 ERA, over 10 strikeouts per nine innings and less than 2.5 walks per nine innings since Marcus Stroman in 2010.

WELCOME TO THE STAFF

Wake Forest's staff added a trio of newcomers to the program this offseason.

- Corey Muscara (Pitching Coach): Muscara comes to Winston-Salem with over a decade of collegiate coaching experience, elevating multiple program's pitching staffs to new heights. Under Muscara's leadership, his teams have finished in the top 10 in ERA and strikeouts on the conference and national level on several occasions, while developing numerous MLB draft prospects at every stop throughout his career.

- Ty Blankmeyer (Volunteer Assistant): Blankmeyer joins the Demon Deacons with a wealth of experience as a player and baseball professional, most recently serving as an Area Scout with the Milwaukee Brewers from 2017-21. During his time with the organization, Blankmeyer was in charge of all scouting responsibilities in the Northeast region of the United States, highlighted by the drafting and signing of Sal Frelick, the 15th overall pick in the 2021 MLB Draft. Blankmeyer was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2016 MLB draft and tallied a batting average of .280 in the Pioneer League before stepping into a player development role with the franchise at the Arizona Complex League (AZL) under Jose Nieves and Miguel Cairo in the summer of 2017.

- Mike McFerran (Pitching Lab Coordinator): Prior to Wake Forest, McFerran served as the Associate Head Coach, Pitching Coach, & Recruiting Coordinator at Skidmore College from 2017-2020. His pitchers saw a quick and vast improvement under his tutelage, moving from eighth in conference ERA in 2017 to fourth in 2018. Additionally, McFerran's pitchers went from last in strikeouts to fourth in a year span. In 2019, Skidmore conceded the least amount of walks in the conference.

A proven program builder and player developer, Tom Walter enters his 13th season in 2022 as the head coach of Wake Forest baseball.

With 325 wins at Wake Forest, he enters 2022 as the second-winningest coach in program history, trailing only George Greer (608 wins in 16 years). Additionally, Walter is one of just two active head coaches in the country to lead three different programs to the NCAA Division I Tournament, becoming just the seventh coach all-time to do so. He joins the ranks of Larry Cochell, Augie Garrido, Sunny Golloway, Andy Lopez, Ron Polk and Jack Stallings, while Randy Mazey joined that group after Walter.

Walter has helped 41 players get drafted or sign pro contracts over the last eight years, including six Deacs drafted among the top 50 picks and back-to-back first rounders in 2021 (Ryan Cusick) and 2020 (Jared Shuster).

#ProDeacs in the major leagues include Gavin Sheets and Stuart Fairchild, who both A program-record eight Demon Deacons were selected in the 2017 MLB Draft, including records of two selected in the top 50 and four in the top seven rounds. Six selections (2012) and five selections (2021) round out the top three of Wake Forest's draft classes under Walter.

While at Wake Forest, Walter has overseen the development of 2016 National Player of the Year Will Craig, All-America selections Craig, Nate Mondou, Stuart Fairchild, Gavin Sheets, Ben Breazeale, Bobby Seymour and Chris Lanzilli, as well as a total of 22 All-ACC selections. Wake Forest had nine All-ACC picks in 2017, a program record and most in the ACC. In 2019, Seymour was named ACC Player of the Year - the second at Wake Forest in Walter's tenure, and led the country with 92 RBIs.

Walter and the Deacs had a banner season in 2017, which includes Wake Forest hosting and sweeping the Winston-Salem Regional and finishing a game away from the College World Series, concluding the year with a 43-20 overall record. The Demon Deacons set program records in ACC wins (19), ACC series wins (eight), All-ACC honorees (nine) and home runs (106). The Deacs also set a new team-high with eight student-athletes drafted, including program records of two in the top 50 overall picks and four in the top seven rounds.

Wake Forest earned back-to-back NCAA Regional bids after competing in the College Station Regional in 2016. The Deacs have posted seven winning seasons in the last eight years.

To Walter and the coaching staff, development off the field is equally as important as on the field. All of the program's seniors have graduated on time for six consecutive years, and the team has raised more than \$100,000 for various charities including the ALS Association, JDRF, the V's. Cancer Foundation and Brenner Children's Hospital. On May 1, 2021, the Deacs hosted its first-ever Fight Against Pediatric Cancer Game, where fans were given the opportunity to bid on special edition, game-worn yellow jerseys that matched the pediatric cancer ribbon. The program raised \$9,485, with all proceeds being donated to Brenner Children's Hospital.

■ Bill Cilentio enters his 13th year at Wake Forest in 2022, after being promoted to Associate Head Coach in January 2019. He works primarily with the Demon Deacon hitters and infielders.

■ In his time as a coach, 63 of his student-athletes have gone on to play professionally, including seven big leaguers.

■ He oversaw the development of National Player of the Year Will Craig, the first-round pick of the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2016. After not making an all-conference team his freshman year, Craig's improvement earned him ACC Player of the Year honors in 2015 and made him a unanimous first team All-American in 2016.

■ Wake Forest has had 17 hitters earn all-ACC honors the last six seasons. In 2017, Wake Forest became the first Division I school in the nation to surpass 100 home runs in the BBCOR era, leading the nation with 106 blasts and 1.68 longballs per game. Additionally, Wake Forest led the nation in 2017 with 91 home runs at the end of the regular season.

■ Cilentio has coached with Tom Walter for 13 years, including a pair of seasons at New Orleans. Cilentio was a four-year starter at Siena.

■ He and his wife, Jen, have three daughters: Brooke, Katie, Megan and Reese.

■ Corey Muscara begins his first season with the Demon Deacons after being officially added to the staff on July 2, 2021. Muscara works directly with the Wake Forest pitching staff.


■ Muscara comes to Winston-Salem with over a decade of collegiate coaching experience, elevating multiple program's pitching staffs to new heights. Under Muscara's leadership, his teams have finished in the top 10 in ERA and strikeouts on the conference and national level on several occasions, while developing numerous MLB draft prospects at every stop throughout his career.

■ Most recently, Muscara served as Maryland's pitching coach for the previous four seasons. In 2021, the Terps' pitching staff registered a team ERA of 4.76, the fifth-best in the Big Ten and their lowest mark during Muscara's tenure. The success on the mound was crucial to the team's overall success as Maryland won multiple NCAA Tournament games for the first time since 2015, defeating Norfolk State and Charlotte in back-to-back games at the Greenville Regional.

■ In 2020, Maryland earned a program record seventh-best recruiting class in the country, highlighted by Muscara's efforts to secure a number of highly-regarded pitchers.

■ He tutored Hunter Parsons to Third Team All-Big Ten accolades in 2019 as the right hander led the conference with nine wins before. Parsons went on to be drafted in the 19th round by the New York Mets and is currently in the High-A affiliate within the organization.

■ Muscara graduated from Franklin Pierce with a degree in history in 2009. He and his wife Suzie have two sons, Theodore and Thomas.

■ Blankmeyer joins the Deacs prior to the 2022 season with a wealth of experience as a player and baseball professional, most recently serving as an Area Scout with the Milwaukee Brewers from 2017-21.

■ During his time with the organization, Blankmeyer was in charge of all scouting responsibilities in the Northeast region of the United States, highlighted by the drafting and signing of Sal Frelick, the 15th overall pick in the 2021 MLB Draft.

■ Blankmeyer was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2016 MLB draft and tallied a batting average of .280 in the Pioneer League before stepping into a player development role with the franchise at the Arizona Complex League (AZL) under Jose Nieves and Miguel Cairo in the summer of 2017. His job responsibilities included working with the infielders and assisting with day-to-day baseball tasks and operations.

■ From 2013-16, Blankmeyer was an outstanding middle infielder at St. John's, appearing in 128 games and being a part of the 2015 Big East Championship team. In the summer before his senior campaign, Blankmeyer took home a Gold Glove in the Northwoods League.

■ Blankmeyer received a degree in Communications from St. John's in 2016.

■ The Morristown, N.J. native grew up in a baseball family. His father, Ed Blankmeyer, is the winningest coach in St. John's history with 869 wins. His grandfather, Mike Sheppard Sr., coached at Seton Hall for several years and earned 998 victories, 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and two College World Series runs.

DAVID F. COUCH BALLPARK & CHRIS HURD PLAYER DEVELOPMENT CENTER

- David F. Couch Ballpark is home to the Demon Deacon baseball team. The Deacons moved in to the facility before the start of the 2009 season after playing the previous 28 seasons on campus at historic Gene Hooks Stadium.
- Formerly known as Ernie Shore Field, the park was home to Winston-Salem's Carolina League minor league team for more than 40 years. Wake Forest purchased the facility after the team, now known as the Winston-Salem Dash, moved in to a new downtown ballpark.
- In February 2016, Wake Forest baseball park was renamed David F. Couch Ballpark in honor of former baseball player David Couch ('84). A longtime supporter of Wake Forest Athletics and the baseball program, Couch made the lead gift toward a new \$12 million facility, which opened in February 2017, and included construction of a new dugout and bullpen, locker room, equipment room, training room, team lounge, nutrition area, and pitching lab.
- The latest phase of the Chris Hurd Player Development Center was made possible, in part, thanks to the generosity of Chris and Nancy Hurd who made the lead gift toward the project. It features a team meeting room, dedicated video room, coaches' offices, a biomechanist's office, a conference room, game day suites, and a baseball heritage area. It was dedicated on Oct. 12, 2018, and the construction wrapped up in January 2019.
- With the completion of the pitching lab inside the Chris Hurd Player Development Center at David F. Couch Ballpark, the state-of-the-art biomechanics lab is used to develop Wake Forest student-athletes and transform the game of baseball. Wake Forest Athletics is partnering with Wake Forest Baptist Health on a historic agreement, which combines the two units to enhance player safety and development. On Wake Forest's side, pitching coach Corey Muscara, pitching lab coordinator Mike McFerran, athletic trainer Jeff Strahm and strength coach Mark Seaver works with Wake Baptist's Dr. Brian Waterman, the team physician specializing in shoulder and elbow care, and biophysicist Dr. Kristen Nicholson.
- Wake Forest players also have access to state-of-the-art technology with the Trackman Pro video system with cameras set up on both the first and third base dugouts, center field and behind home plate. The system allows hitters to view their swings and pitchers their pitching motions following each game, and tracks 27 different data points varying from pitch velocity to spin rate to launch angle.
- Other renovations include:
 - 2020: New FieldTurf DoublePlay Classic surface installed prior to the season.
 - 2015: Visiting clubhouse converted into state-of-the-art weight room facility.
 - 2013: Multi-colored chairback seats replaced with modern all-black seats.
 - 2012: 18' x 24' LED video board installed.
 - 2011: AstroTurf GameDay 3D52H Grass installed, as well as the manual scoreboard in left field.
 - 2010: Indoor hitting facility built beyond left field.
 - 2009: Wake Forest purchased and moved into stadium. It previously belonged to the Winston-Salem Dash since it was built in 1956.

Colin Peluse recorded his best start of the season, leading Wake Forest to a 7-3 victory over No. 8 NC State at David F. Couch Ballpark on Thursday night.

Peluse tossed 6.0 innings of three-hit ball, allowing one run while matching his career high with seven strikeouts, earning the win to improve to 3-5.

The Demon Deacons (23-16, 10-9 ACC) out-hit the Wolfpack (30-9, 12-7 ACC), 11-7, also drawing nine walks.

After Wake Forest had potential rallies thwarted by double plays the first two innings, the Deacs mounted a two-out rally in the third.

Chris Lanzilli (2-for-3, 2 walks) started it off with a solo homer, his 10th of the year to tie for the team lead. Three-straight singles from Bobby Seymour (2-for-4, 2 RBIs, walk), Brendan Tinsman and Michael Ludwig (3-for-3, double, walk) and an NC State error brought in two runs, making the score 3-0.


