•The Wake Forest baseball team was selected to the 2022 NCAA Baseball Tournament as the No. 2 seed in the College Park Regional. In addition to the second-seeded Demon Deacons (40-17-1), the regional will include No. 15 national seed Maryland (45-12), No. 3 seed UConn (46-13) and No. 4 seed Long Island (37-19).

Wake Forest will begin play against the Huskies on Friday, June 3 at 1 p.m. on ESPU in the opening game of the regional. Maryland and Long Island will follow at 7 p.m.

■ This is the Demon Deacons' 14th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance and its first since the 2017 season. Wake Forest has made two College World Series Appearances, highlighted by winning the program's first national championship in 1955. Overall, the Demon Deacons hold a 44–29 record at the national tournament.

■ In 2017, Wake Forest hosted West Virginia, Maryland and UMBC at David F. Couch Ballpark. After going a perfect 3–0, the Deacs advanced to the Gainesville Super Regional, where Wake Forest fell in three games to the eventual national champion Gators.

■ This year's opening game against UConn marks the first time the Deacs and Huskies have faced off in the NCAA Tournament. Additionally, Wake Forest has never faced off against the Terrapins or Sharks in NCAA play.

Head coach Tom Walter, the second-winningest coach in program history, won his 350th game at the helm of the Wake Forest baseball program with the 16-11 series finale victory against Duke on Sunday.

**Wake Forest's offense has been firing on all cylinders this season, ranking as one of the top offenses in the entire nation. Wake Forest ranks in the top 10 nationally in all offensive categories while ranking in the top three in the conference across the board, highlighted by an ACC-best in on-base percentage, runs and walks.

**This year's offense will go down in the record books among Wake Forest's best offenses, setting program records in home runs (115), walks (354), RBIs (513), 20-run games (four), 20-run games in ACC play (two), runs in ACC game (27) and hits in an ACC game (28).

**Seven of Wake Forest's wins have come against top-15 opponents with victories against then-No. 8 Florida State, then-No. 6 Georgia Tech twice, then-No. 15 Liberty, then-No. 10 Virginia, then-No.5 Louisville and then No. 9 Miami.

**The Deacs head into the national tournament fresh off a dominant 16-3 victory over national seed Miami in the ACC Tournament. Wake Forest's 16 runs were fueled by 15 hits and seven home runs, tying an ACC Tournament record set by last year's Louisville's squad. The offensive explosion was the most runs scored in an ACC Tournament game by Wake Forest since 2005 (20 runs vs. Maryland) and the 23rd game of the season the Demon Deacons notched double-double hits and runs.

**Rhett Lowder was named the 2022 Atlantic Coast Conference Pitcher of the Year the first Demon Deacon to win the award in program history. His 11 wins are currently lead the ACC, while ranking second in ERA (2.61), second in innings pitched (93) and third in strikeouts (98. He is the only hurter in the ACC to rank in the top three of each category. Additionally, Lowder ranks in the top 10 in WHIP (fourth), walks allowed per nine innings (seventh) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (seventh). In conference play, Lowder

(April 6), Duke (April 8) and Duke (April 9).

Freshman Nick Kurtz has strung together a stellar freshman campaign, tallying a .356 batting average with 68 hits to go along with 14 doubles and 15 home runs. Kurtz is now tied for second on the Wake Forest freshman home run list after a three-run shot against Miami in the ACC Tournament. Kurtz also ranks in the top 10 in runs (second), walks (second), RBIs (third) and doubles (tied for ninth) by a Demon Deacon freshman. The Lancaster, Pa. native finished the regular season leading the ACC with a .422 batting average and .548 on-base percentage in conference play. Brendan Tinsman has posted a career year in his fourth season in the Old Gold and Black, posting career highs in hits (81), doubles (13), home runs (23), RBIs (65) and slugging percentage (703). Tinsman is fourth in the ACC and ninth in the country in long flies. Defensively, Tinsman has been just as impressive. Tinsman has thrown out an ACC-best 13 base runners and ranks second in the conference with a .996 fielding percentage

Lowder is just the fifth pitcher in program history and the first since 2002 to reach 11 victories in a season in 10 of his 15 starts this season, Lowder has pitched at least six innings while allowing no more than three earned runs in any appearance. Additionally, Lowder has walked one or less batters in nine starts.

Lowder matched his career-high of 11 punchouts three times this season (NJIT, Clemson and Louisville).

For his complete-game gem against NC State, Lowder was named ACC and Perfect Game Pitcher of the Week.

- **DEFENSE & PITCHING THRIVING** On the mound, Wake Forest's weekend rotation has combined for 266.2 innings with 253 strikeouts and just 129 earned runs allowed.
- In the series opener against No. 6 Georgia Tech, the Deacs gave up just three runs, tying the Yellow Jackets' season low. In the series finale against Virginia, the Deacs held the nation's highest scoring offense to just one run, tying Virginia's lowest-scoring performance of the season and marking the second time this year Virginia bach the profits of the season and marking the second time this year Virginia hasn't scored at least five runs in a game.
- Through the first four games, the Deacs gave up just 11 runs, the fewest number of runs the Deacs have allowed in the first four games in head coach Tom Walter's
- In Wake Forest's doubleheader sweep of Longwood, five arms combined for 10 scoreless innings (14 overall innings) with 19 strikeouts while allowing just four
- Against High Point, eight arms combined to shut out High Point for Wake Forest's first shutout since April 16, 2021.
- Teddy McGraw, Gabe Golob, Crawford Wade and Camden Minacci combined to allow just two runs in Wake Forest's series finale victory at North Carolina, marking the 11th game this season the Deacs allowed two runs or less.
- Over the course of the weekend series against NC State, the Demon Deacons allowed just four runs, the lowest number of runs given up in an ACC series since Boston College in 2018 (one run).
- Against Louisville (9.5 runs per game), Wake Forest held the nation's thirdhighest scoring offense to 4.7 runs per game. MINACCI BRINGING ENERGY OUT OF BULLPEN

 Camden Minacci has been one of the most relied upon arms coming out of the Wake Forest bullpen.

In 43.2 innings, the sophomore has struck out 57 batters while only allowing nine earned runs. Minacci's career-high strikeout number ranks tied for second on the team, while he sports the lowest ERA (1.85) on the squad.

•Minacci has also tallied six saves, the sixth-most in the ACC, highlighted by slamming the door in three-straight games against Elon (April 6), Duke (April 8)

In 12 of Minacci's 28 appearances this season, the righthander has blanked the opposition, allowing no hits or runs.

In Wake Forest's last game against No. 5 Louisville, Minacci threw a career-long 4.1 innings with three strikeouts while allowing zero runs.

In Wake Forest's last win at North Carolina, Minacci retired the side, highlighted by a game-ending strikeout, to clinch the finale victory.

** Freshman Nick Kurtz has strung together a stellar freshman campaign, tallying a .356 batting average with 68 hits to go along with 14 doubles and 15 home runs.

** Kurtz is now tied for second on the Wake Forest freshman home run list after a three-run shot against Miami in the ACC Tournament.

** Kurtz also ranks in the top 10 in runs (second), walks (second), RBIs (third) and doubles (tied for ninth) by a Demon Deacon freshman

** Kurtz finished the regular season leading the ACC with a .422 batting average and .548 on-base percentage in conference play

** Additionally, Kurtz has the second-highest OPS (1.254) and fifth-highest slugging percentage (.706) in conference play

** In Wake Forest's historic offensive performance on March 19 at Georgia Tech, Kurtz had a historic day at the plate as the freshman became the first Wake Forest batter since 2005 to record six hits in the game. This is also tied for the second most in program history and is the most by a freshman in school history.

TURCONI TURNING HEADS

** Michael Turconi has put together a career year as the shortstop has set career bests in batting average (.320), hits (73), home runs (14), walks (41), triples (5), RBIs (66), slugging (.596), on-base (.428) and stolen bases (5).

In Wake Forest's midweek finale, Turconi blasted a home run with two doubles for a total of six RBIs, tying a career high.

Turconi is just four hits away from becoming the 29th Demon Deacon to reach

200 hits over their collegiate career.

Wake Forest has been patient at the plate as the Deacs have been walked 354times, the most in the ACC and the fourth most in the entire nation.

A proven program builder and player developer, Tom Walter enters his 13th season in 2022 as the head coach of Wake Forest baseball.

With 325 wins at Wake Forest, he enters 2022 as the second-winningest coach in program history, trailing only George Greer (608 wins in 16 years). Additionally, Walter is one of just two active head coaches in the country to lead three different programs to the NCAA Division I Tournament, becoming just the seventh coach all-time to do so. He joins the ranks of Larry Cochell, Augie Garrido, Sunny Golloway, Andy Lopez, Ron Polk and Jack Stallings, while Randy Mazey joined that group after Walter.

Walter has helped 41 players get drafted or sign pro contracts over the last eight years, including six Deacs drafted among the top 50 picks and back-to-back first rounders in 2021 (Ryan Cusick) and 2020 (Jared Shuster).

#ProDeacs in the major leagues include Gavin Sheets and Stuart Fairchild, who both A program-record eight Demon Deacons were selected in the 2017 MLB Draft, including records of two selected in the top 50 and four in the top seven rounds. Six selections (2012) and five selections (2021) round out the top three of Wake Forest's draft classes under Walter.

While at Wake Forest, Walter has overseen the development of 2016 National Player of the Year Will Craig, All-America selections Craig, Nate Mondou, Stuart Fairchild, Gavin Sheets, Ben Breazeale, Bobby Seymour and Chris Lanzilli, as well as a total of 22 All-ACC selections. Wake Forest had nine All-ACC picks in 2017, a program record and most in the ACC. In 2019, Seymour was named ACC Player of the Year the second at Wake Forest in Walter's tenure, and led the country with 92 RBIs.

Walter and the Deacs had a banner season in 2017, which includes Wake Forest hosting and sweeping the Winston-Salem Regional and finishing a game away from the College World Series, concluding the year with a 43-20 overall record. The Demon Deacons set program records in ACC wins (19), ACC series wins (eight), All-ACC honorees (nine) and home runs (106). The Deacs also set a new team-high with eight student-athletes drafted, including program records of two in the top 50 overall picks and four in the top seven rounds

Wake Forest earned back-to-back NCAA Regional bids after competing in the College Station Regional in 2016. The Deacs have posted seven winning seasons in the last eight years.

To Walter and the coaching staff, development off the field is equally as important as on the field. All of the program's seniors have graduated on time for six consecutive years, and the team has raised more than \$100,000 for various charities including the ALS Association, JDRF, the Vs. Cancer Foundation and Brenner Children's Hospital. On May 1, 2021, the Deacs hosted its first-ever Fight Against Pediatric Cancer Game, where fans were given the opportunity to bid on special edition, game-worn yellow jerseys that matched the pediatric cancer ribbon. The program raised \$9,485, with all proceeds being donated to Brenner Children's Hospital.

- Cilento has coached with Tom Walter for 13 years, including a pair of seasons at New Orleans. Cilento was a four-year starter at Siena.

The success on the mound was crucial to the team's overall success as Maryland won multiple NCAA Tournament games for the first time since 2015, defeating Norfolk State and Charlotte in back-to-back games at the Greenville Regional.

- During his time with the organization, Blankmeyer was in charge of all scouting responsibilities in the Northeast region of the United States, highlighted by the drafting and signing of Sal Frelick, the 15th overall pick in the 2021 MLB Draft.
- Blankmeyer was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2016 MLB draft and tallied a batting average of .280 in the Pioneer League before stepping into a player development role with the franchise at the Arizona Complex League (AZL) under Jose Nieves and Miguel Cairo in the summer of 2017. His job responsibilities included working with the infielders and assisting with day-to-day baseball tasks and operations.
- From 2013-16, Blankmeyer was an outstanding middle infielder at St. John's, appearing in 128 games and being a part of the 2015 Big East Championship team. In the summer before his senior campaign, Blankmeyer took home a Gold Glove in the Northwoods
- Blankmeyer received a degree in Communications from St. John's in 2016.
- The Morristown, N.J. native grew up in a baseball family. His father, Ed Blankmeyer, is the winningest coach in St. John's history with 869 wins. His grandfather, Mike Sheppard Sr., coached at Seton Hall for several years and earned 998 victories, 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and two College World Series

DAVID F. COUCH BALLPARK & CHRIS HURD PLAYER DEVELOPMENT CENTER

- David F. Couch Ballpark is home to the Demon Deacon baseball team. The Deacons moved in to the facility before the start of the 2009 season after playing the previous 28 seasons on campus at historic Gene Hooks Stadium.
- Formerly known as Ernie Shore Field, the park was home to Winston-Salem's Carolina League minor league team for more than 40 years. Wake Forest purchased the facility after the team, now known as the Winston-Salem Dash, moved in to a new downtown ballpark.
- In February 2016, Wake Forest baseball park was renamed David F. Couch Ballpark in honor of former baseball player David Couch ('84). A longtime supporter of Wake Forest Athletics and the baseball program, Couch made the lead gift toward a new \$12 million facility, which opened in February 2017, and included construction of a new dugout and bullpen, locker room, equipment room, training room, team lounge, nutrition area, and pitching lab.
- The latest phase of the Chris Hurd Player Development Center was made possible, in part, thanks to the generosity of Chris and Nancy Hurd who made the lead gift toward the project. It features a team meeting room, dedicated video room, coaches' offices, a biomechanist's office, a conference room, game day suites, and a baseball heritage area. It was dedicated on Oct. 12, 2018, and the construction wrapped up in January 2019.
- With the completion of the pitching lab inside the Chris Hurd Player Development Center at David F. Couch Ballpark, the state-of-the-art biomechanics lab is used to develop Wake Forest student-athletes and transform the game of baseball. Wake Forest Athletics is partnering with Wake Forest Baptist Health on a historic agreement, which combines the two units to enhance player safety and development. On Wake Forest's side, pitching coach Corey Muscara, pitching lab coordinator Mike McFerran, athletic trainer Jeff Strahm and

strength coach Mark Seaver works with Wake Baptist's Dr. Brian Waterman, the team physician specializing in shoulder and elbow care, and biophysicist Dr. Kristen Nicholson.

- Wake Forest players also have access to state-of-the-art technology with the Trackman Pro video system with cameras set up on both the first and third base dugouts, center field and behind home plate. The system allows hitters to view their swings and pitchers their pitching motions following each game, and tracks 27 different data points varying from pitch velocity to spin rate to launch angle.
- Other renovations include:
 - 2020: New FieldTurf DoublePlay Classic surface installed prior to the season.
 - 2015: Visiting clubhouse converted into state-of-the-art weight room facility.
 - 2013: Multi-colored chairback seats replaced with modern all-black seats.
 - 2012: 18' x 24' LED video board installed.
 - 2011: AstroTurf GameDay 3D52H Grass installed, as well as the manual scoreboard in left field.
 - 2010: Indoor hitting facility built beyond left field.
- 2009: Wake Forest purchased and moved into stadium. It previously belonged to the Winston-Salem Dash since it was built in 1956.
