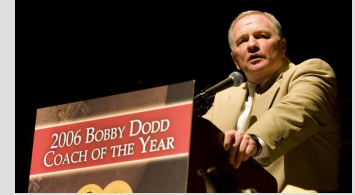

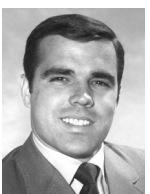

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ACC PLAYERS OF THE YEAR



BILL BARNES ■ 1956

One of the first stars of the ACC was Wake Forest running back Bill Barnes. The "Bullet" from Landis, N.C., established five school records. He was chosen to the LOOK Magazine All-America team and a second team Associated Press All-American as a senior.

In addition, Barnes was a unanimous choice for All-ACC honors. He was voted the most outstanding player for the South team in the North-South Shrine All-Star game in Miami. His 1,010 yards rushing in 1956 ranked second nationally. He also ranked 13th in total offense and 13th in kickoff returns. Barnes' number 33 jersey was retired following his senior season.

BRIAN PICCOLO ■ 1964

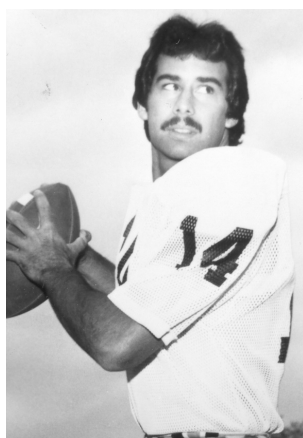
After toiling in relative obscurity during his first two years on the varsity team, Brian Piccolo emerged as a senior to lead the nation in rushing.

Piccolo rushed 252 times for 1,044 yards and 15 touchdowns. His rushing total and 111 points scored (17 overall touchdowns and 9 PATs) ranked first in the NCAA. In all, Piccolo set six new conference marks and established nine new school records en route to being named a Football News All-American.

Piccolo left Wake Forest as the school's all-time leading rusher and scorer.

JAY VENUTO ■ 1979

Jay Venuto re-wrote the Wake Forest and ACC record books when it came to passing. The native of Salem, N.J., broke six ACC season records, including total offense (2,485 yards), passing attempts (367), pass completions (198), passing yards (2,432), total plays (443), and a ACC single game record when he completed 28 passes against East Carolina.

Venuto threw for 16 touchdowns and guided the Deacons to the 1979 Tangerine Bowl against LSU under head coach John Mackovic. Mackovic was the quarterback in the same backfield with Wake Forest's previous ACC Player of the Year, Brian Piccolo.

CHRIS BARCLAY ■ 2005

Chris Barclay was offered only one Division I scholarship out of high school. He proved to be the ultimate diamond in the rough.

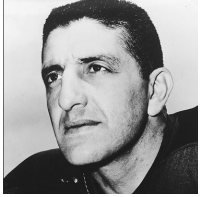
Barclay led the ACC in rushing during the regular season three times, the only player in history to do so. As a senior, he was chosen as the league's Player of the Year.

The native of Louisville, Ky., carried 218 times for 1,127 yards, both league-highs, and 10 touchdowns in 2005. He added 381 receiving and return yards to lead the ACC in all-purpose yards. Barclay had two 200-yard rushing days, one against East Carolina and the other against Duke. Against the Blue Devils, Barclay broke the school's all-time career rushing mark.

ALL-AMERICANS



BILL GEORGE

1949 | 1st Team AP, 2nd Team NEA

George was the first Demon Deacon ever to be named an All-American. He gained that distinction as a sophomore in 1949 after an outstanding season at defensive tackle. That achievement highlighted an excellent overall career which saw him named all-conference three times (1948, '49 and '51). He was outstanding as a professional player, too, with both the Chicago Bears and Los Angeles Rams, earning all-pro honors as a linebacker eight times and being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1974. He joined the WFU Hall of Fame in 1998 and his number 47 is retired.



JIM STATON

1950 | 2nd Team AP

One year after Bill George received All-America acclaim, Staton followed him to that lofty status, also as a defensive tackle. He was named to the all-conference team that same year and was chosen as the Deacons' MVP as well. Staton also was successful professionally, primarily in the Canadian Football League with the Montreal Alouettes, where he earned all-league honors playing under former Wake Forest coach Peahead Walker. He was inducted into the WFU Hall of Fame in 1982.



BOB BARTHOLOMEW

1955 | 2nd Team INS, 2nd Team UPI

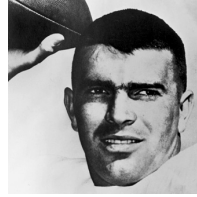
Wake Forest's list of outstanding linemen continued in 1955 with Bartholomew earning All-America honors as a tackle. He additionally received Academic All-America recognition that same year, making him the first individual in school history to be named to both all-star squads in the same season. Bartholomew was a four-year starter and a three-time All-ACC pick (twice on the first team). He served WFU as director of the Deacon Club for more than 16 years (1968-1984) and was inducted into the WFU Hall of Fame in 1984.



BILL BARNES

1956 | 1st Team Look, 2nd Team AP

One of the top all-around players in Wake Forest history, Barnes received All-America notice as a running back in 1956. He became the first Deacon — and the first individual ever in the ACC — to rush for more than 1,000 yards in one season (1,010) and was named the conference player of the year. The two-time All-ACC performer went on to an all-pro career with the Philadelphia Eagles, later playing for Washington and Minnesota as well. He was a 1974 inductee into the WFU Hall of Fame. The sports lounge in Bridger Field House is named in his honor and his number 33 is retired.



NORM SNEAD

1960 | 2nd Team UPI, 2nd Team FWAA

The only Deacon QB to earn All-America honors, Snead ranks as one of the premier passers ever in the ACC. Three times he was all-conference (first team in 1959 and '60), and as a junior and senior he led the league in passing and total offense, which led to his selection on the ACC 50th Anniversary team in 2002. Despite playing in a run-oriented era, Snead's career numbers rate him among the top all-time passers at WFU. He played for five NFL teams during a 16-year career that saw him gain All-Pro honors. The WFU Hall of Fame inducted him in 1977, the banquet room in Bridger Field House is named in his honor and his number 16 is retired.



BRIAN PICCOLO

1964 | 1st Team FN, 1st Team FD, 1st Team, Helms, 1st Team NY Daily News, 2nd Team AP, 2nd Team UPI, 2nd Team NEA

One of Wake Forest's most famed athletes, Piccolo earned All-America status in 1964 after leading the nation in rushing (1,044 yards) and scoring (111 points). That same season he also became the second Demon Deacon to earn ACC Player of the Year honors. Wake Forest's leading rusher in 1962, 1963 and 1964, Piccolo played for the NFL's Chicago Bears four seasons before his career came to an end due to his now well-known bout with cancer. He died in June of 1970 and was posthumously inducted into the WFU Hall of Fame later that year. In 2002, Piccolo was named to the ACC 50th Anniversary Team and his number 31 is retired.



WIN HEADLEY

1970 | 2nd Team Walter Camp

A three-year starter, Headley earned All-America recognition as a defensive tackle on Wake Forest's 1970 ACC Championship squad. He also was honored that year as an All-ACC selection and was voted team Most Valuable Player. In the spring of 1971, Headley and basketball player Charlie Davis were co-recipients of WFU's Arnold Palmer Award. He played briefly with the Green Bay Packers and in the CFL, and later returned to Wake Forest as an assistant coach under Chuck Mills. He was inducted into the WFU Hall of Fame in 1994.

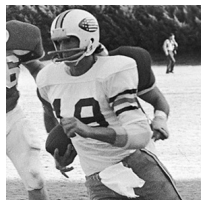


CHUCK RAMSEY

1973 | 1st Team FWAA

The 1973 season was not a successful one for the Demon Deacons, who managed only one win and one tie in 11 outings, but Ramsey led the country in punting with a 44.8-yard average. He led the ACC in punting as a sophomore, junior and senior (1971-73), and upon his graduation, his career average of 44.0 was the third-best in ACC history. He spent eight productive years (1977-84) with the New York Jets in the NFL.

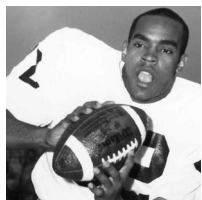

BILL ARMSTRONG

1975 | 3rd Team AP
1976 | CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICAN
1st Team AP, UPI, Walter Camp, FN,
FWAA, AFCA, TSN

Armstrong was the first player in Wake Forest history to be named a consensus All-American. A quarterback early in his Deacon career, he became an all-league safety in 1975 and again in 1976, leading the team in tackles both years. His 271 career unassisted tackles are the most in school history. He received the Arnold Palmer Award, and in 1996, he was inducted into the WFU Hall of Fame. In 2002, Armstrong was named to the ACC 50th Anniversary Team and his number 19 is retired.



WAYNE BAUMGARDNER

1979 | 2nd Team NEA

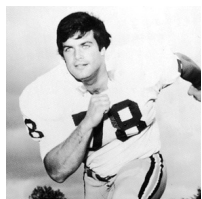
Wayne Baumgardner put up one of the most prolific seasons in school history among wide receivers in 1979. Baumgardner finished seventh in the nation with 55 receptions and became the first Demon Deacon to have 1,000 receiving yards in a season. He had eight 100-yard receiving games including 100 yards in an upset of No. 12 Georgia and 159 yards in a victory over No. 13 Auburn. For the year, Baumgardner recorded 55 catches for 1,000 yards and eight touchdowns.



JAMES PARKER

1979 | 2nd Team Football News

Nose guard James Parker garnered All-America honors in 1979 as his leadership helped Wake put together an impressive 8-4 record and a Tangerine Bowl appearance. The Deacons posted three victories over ranked opponents during the season, including road wins over Georgia and North Carolina. Parker was also named first team All-ACC that season and received WFU's Bill George Award, given to the team's top lineman. He went on to a long and successful career in the Canadian Football League, playing for Edmonton, British Columbia and Toronto. Parker still ranks among WFU's all-time leaders in total tackles, solo tackles, tackles for loss and sacks.



BILL ARD

1980 | 1st Team TSN

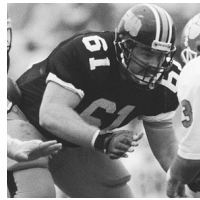
One of the top offensive linemen in Wake Forest history, Bill Ard was an All-America selection in 1980, his third year as a starter. He was named All-ACC and was a recipient of the Bill George Award that same season while also serving as team captain. Following his graduation, he enjoyed a very successful career in the NFL, winning a Super Bowl during a 10-year stint with the New York Giants before concluding his career with the Green Bay Packers. He was inducted into the WFU Hall of Fame in 1993.



HARRY NEWSOME

1983 | 3rd Team AP

Harry Newsome was an All-America punter as a junior in 1983, ranking as the nation's third-leading punter with a 45.5-yard average. That average ranked as the best season mark in school history. Newsome's career punting average of 43.6 ranks third in the Deacon record books behind All-Americans, Chuck Ramsey and Ryan Plackemeier. He became the 15th player in WFU history to be named first team All-ACC twice. He was drafted in 1985 and spent nine seasons in the NFL with Pittsburgh and Minnesota.



PAUL KISER

1986 | 1st Team AP, 1st Team TSN

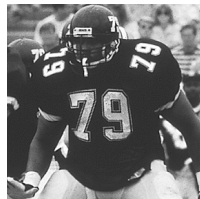
The 1986 Deacons established eight offensive school records and led the ACC in scoring. A major factor was Kiser's play up front in that offensive unit, and he was recognized for his efforts as a first team All-American. In addition, he was named All-ACC that year as a senior and became the first Deacon since the formation of the ACC to receive the Jacobs Blocking Trophy as the league's premier blocker.



GEORGE COGHILL

1992 | 3rd Team AP

One of the most popular members of WFU's 1992 Independence Bowl champion squad, Coghill was a third-team AP All-America selection. He was the leading vote-getter among defensive backs on the 1992 All-ACC team, making that elite group for the second year. He started 44 of 45 contests during a career that saw him finish fourth in interceptions (12) while becoming the school's career punt return leader. In 1997 and 1998 he was a member of the Denver Broncos' World Championship teams.



BEN COLEMAN

1992 | 1st Team AFCA

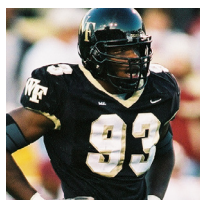
Wake Forest's Ben Coleman emerged as one of the country's premier offensive linemen during his senior season, gaining first team recognition on the Kodak Coaches (AFCA) squad. He had not become an offensive player until after his sophomore year and did not earn a starting job until his final campaign. His other 1992 honors included the Bill George Award and the Jacobs Blocking Trophy as the top blocker in the ACC. After being selected in the second round of the 1993 NFL draft, Coleman spent nine seasons in the league (1993-2001) with four different teams.

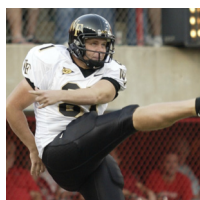
MICHAEL COLLINS
2001 | 3rd Team TSN

Despite moving from tackle to guard and learning a new offensive system prior to his senior year, offensive lineman Michael Collins was named third-team All-America and earned first-team All-ACC honors in 2001. Collins anchored a line that helped WFU lead the ACC in rushing and fewest sacks allowed en route to a 6-5 record. Collins played three years with the Baltimore Ravens.



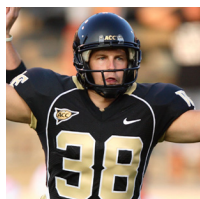
CALVIN PACE
2002 | 1st Team AFCA, 3rd Team AP,
4th Team TSN

Defensive end Calvin Pace became WFU's first first-team All-America selection in 10 years after leading the Deacs to a 7-6 overall record and Seattle Bowl victory in 2002. Pace, who became Wake Forest's career tackles for loss leader during his senior campaign, also led the ACC in sacks and finished second in the WFU career record book in that category. Named the ACC Defensive Player of the Year by The Sporting News, Pace was a first-team All-ACC selection as well as WFU team MVP. He became the school's third first-round pick when Arizona chose him as the 18th overall pick.



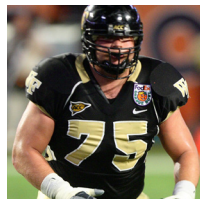

In addition to his consensus All-America honors, Plackemeier won the 2005 Ray Guy Award as the nation's best punter. He led the nation in both net punting and average per punt. As a senior, he punted 67 times with an average of 47.2 yards per punt to break his own school record. Among those with 200 career attempts, Plackemeier is the NCAA's all-time leading punter with a career average of 45.26 yards per punt. He was a three-time first team All-ACC selection. As a senior, he nailed three punts of at least 70 yards, including an 82-yard blast against NC State. Plackemeier was drafted in the seventh round by Seattle.

Placekicker Sam Swank, a native of Jacksonville Beach, Fla., was named first team All-American by three publications. He kicked three field goals in the ACC Championship Game and was named Most Valuable Player. Swank was selected first team All-ACC by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association as a placekicker and honorable mention All-ACC by ACMSA as a punter. He was the only player in the nation to be named a semifinalist for both the Lou Groza Award and the Ray Guy Award. Swank tied the NCAA record for most 50-yard field goals in a game, making three at NC State. He set 11 new school records during his sophomore campaign.



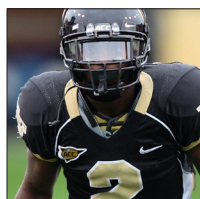

Steve Vallos, an offensive tackle from Boardman, Ohio, was one of the vocal and emotional leaders of the 2006 ACC Championship team. He was a first team All-ACC pick and one website even selected him as the conference's Player of the Year. Vallos won the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week award twice and graded out at 90 percent for the season. He had 92.5 knockdown blocks, 23 more than any other teammate. Vallos enjoyed one of his best career games with an ACC Championship game berth on the line at Maryland when he earned a career-best 96 percent to go with 10 knockdown blocks. Vallos started all 48 games of his career, the most in Wake Forest history. He was drafted in the seventh round by the Seattle Seahawks.

Steve Justice is the most decorated center in school history. A consensus All-America selection, Justice was also the recipient of the Atlantic Coast Conference's Jacobs Blocking Trophy and the national runner-up for the Rimington Trophy. A three-year starter, Justice helped pave the way for Wake Forest to win the 2006 ACC Championship and the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl. Justice was a first team All-ACC selection as a senior and a sixth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts.

Alphonso Smith was just the second Deacon to earn All-American honors in two different seasons. His seven interceptions in 2008 and eight in 2007 were both tied for the most in the country and his career total of 21 broke Dry Bly's ACC record of 20. The 2008 Bronko Nagurski Award finalist, finished his career with a school-record 61 passes defended and his 249 interception return yards are second-most in school-history. His 20 passes defended in 2008 not only led the ACC but was also tied for the most in the country. Smith also proved to be one of the most capable defensive backs in the country as a junior in 2007. He once again led the ACC in interceptions and passes defended. Three of his interceptions resulted in touchdown returns but none was more important than his return against Maryland on Sept. 22. With the Deacons trailing 24-3, the Terps threatened to score again when Smith intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for the score. Besides being the longest return in school history, the return sparked the Deacons to an amazing 31-24 overtime win.

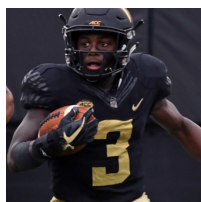
Aaron Curry returned for his senior season and had arguably one of the best years in school history. Curry was the key to the Demon Deacons' defense, leading the squad with 105 total tackles and 66 solo stops. He received the Butkus Award, which is given to the nation's top linebacker, and he was a finalist for the Lott Trophy, which recognizes the country's top defensive player. In perhaps the team's best defensive game of the year against Florida State, Curry made eight tackles, had a fumble recovery and recorded his sixth career interception. He returned the pick 22 yards, adding to his school-record total of 278 interception return yards. The Wake Forest defense also held the Seminoles to just three points in the game, and beat FSU for the second-straight time in Tallahassee. He also became one of four Deacons to start three-straight bowl games.



JOSH BUSH

Josh Bush made his final season for the Deacs his best. He finished among the national leaders in interceptions with six during the 2011 season. He was tied for ninth in the nation and second in the ACC in interceptions. Bush was fifth on the team with 59 tackles and totaled 11 passes defended. Bush was a first team All-ACC selection and a third team Associated Press All-America pick. He became the first Demon Deacon chosen to the AP All-America team since 2008 when Alphonso Smith was a first team selection and Aaron Curry was named to the second team. Bush had two interceptions against Notre Dame with his other picks coming against NC State, Boston College, Florida State and Clemson.



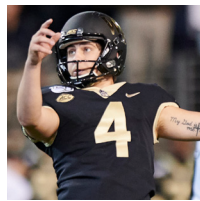

Greg Dortch made his presence felt in his two seasons as a Demon Deacon, scoring 19 touchdowns in 20 career games. In 2018, Dortch led the ACC in all-purpose yards and led the nation in punt return touchdowns with two. Against Towson, Dortch returned two punts for touchdowns, each covering 60 yards. He added 94 yards in receptions with two touchdowns and had 85 yards in kickoff returns, totaling 310 all-purpose yards. Dortch was a first team All-ACC pick at two positions: return specialist and all-purpose player, earning All-America honors as a returner.

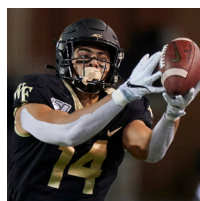

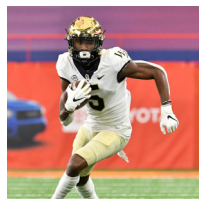
Nick Sciba, a Lou Groza Award semifinalist, proved himself to be one of the most accurate kickers in Wake Forest, ACC and NCAA history in 2019 when he set the new record of 34 consecutive field goals made. Hitting 24-of-25 field goal attempts during the season and going a perfect 50-of-50 in PATs, Sciba set a new Wake Forest single-season record with 119 in 2019. Against Florida State on October 19, he tied the school single-game record with five field goals and tied the school record and set career-high with 16 points.

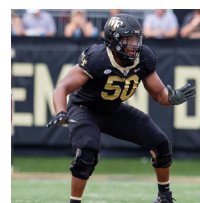
Before a season-ending injury, Sage Surratt was the most explosive wide receiver in the country, leading all Power-5 receivers with 1,001 receiving yards. In just nine games, he notched 11 touchdown catches, the second-most in a season by a Deacon and the most since Ricky Proehl had 11 in 1989. Surratt tallied four games of 150 or more yards receiving and has five for his career. No other Deacon has more than two in a season or four in a career. During the October 12 game vs. Louisville, he totaled 196 receiving yards, the third-most in a game in school history by a Wake receiver, the second-most by an ACC receiver in 2019.



JAQUARII ROBERSON

Roberson proved he is one of the best wide receivers in the ACC and the country in 2020. Roberson finished the year in the top 10 in Wake Forest's single season records in receiving yards (926) and receiving touchdowns (8). Additionally, he tied a program record by finishing the 2020 campaign with four-straight 100-yard receiving yard games. His 102.9 receiving yards per game were a program record and he was the only receiver in the ACC to have an average of over 100 yards in 2020. The Murfreesboro, N.C. native earned Second Team All-America honors from Pro Football Focus for his performance. PFF also ranked Roberson as the No. 6 wide receiver in the country entering the 2021 campaign.



ZACH TOM

Tom also earned First Team All-ACC honors from the league and associated press. The Prairieville, La. native was also voted as the Jim Tatum Award winner given annually in memory of the late Jim Tatum to the top senior student-athlete among the league's football players. He was a semifinalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy this season. In 2021, Tom played more than 1,100 plays and graded out at 94 percent for the season and graded out above 90 percent in every game this year. According to PFF, he had the highest pass blocking grade at 92.1 percent of any FBS offensive lineman who played over 25 snaps.

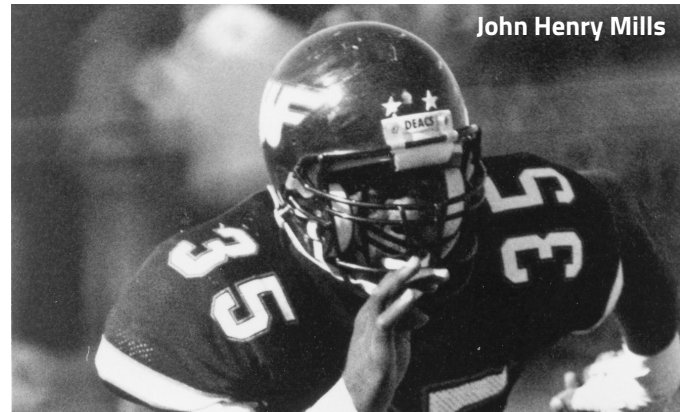

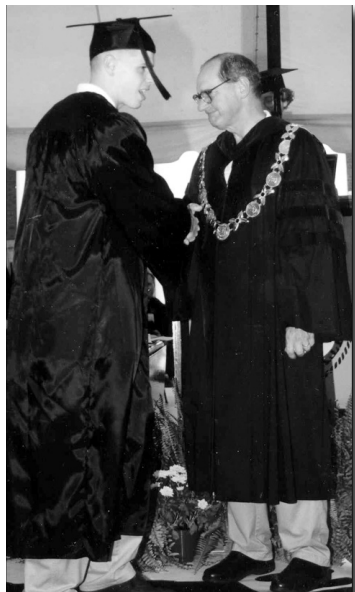

BILL GEORGE AWARD

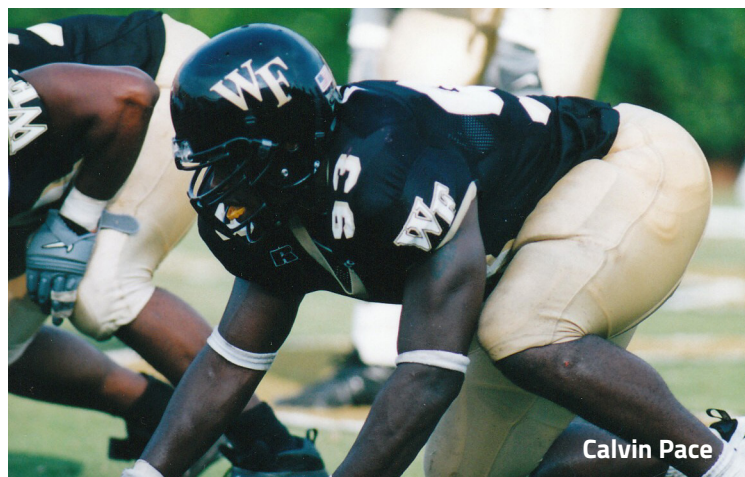

BEATTIE FEATHERS AWARD

For 20 years, from 1981 to 2000, the Wake Forest coaching staff selected the most improved players from spring practice and presented them with an award named after the late Beattie Feathers, a Deacon assistant coach from 1961 until 1977. Feathers, an All-America football player at Tennessee, played professional football from 1934 to 1937 as a member of the Chicago Bears. He was an All-Pro player his rookie season and became the first player in NFL history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season. He is a member of the National College Football Hall of Fame. Feathers died in March of 1979.

Wake Forest's first-ever postseason appearance came in the inaugural Gator Bowl in Jacksonville, Fla., and Coach Peahead Walker's squad made that initial bowl trip a successful one, defeating South Carolina, 26-14. A crowd of more than 10,000 fans was on hand to witness the rematch between the two future ACC members who had played to a 13-13 tie earlier in the season. This time Wake took control at the outset, capping its opening possession with a three-yard run by Nick Sacrinty. A missed extra-point, however, resulted in the Gamecocks taking a 7-6 lead with the only score of the second quarter.

The Deacs regained the lead and took control in the second half behind their bruising ground attack. Rock Brinkley finished off two time-consuming drives with short TD runs of five and four yards, then Bob Smathers clinched the verdict with a 20-yard run on a reverse. The 378 yards rushing in the game stood as a Wake Forest single game record for 22 years. The victory culminated a dramatic turnaround season that had started with three straight losses but ended at 5-3-1.

Three years after competing in the first Gator Bowl, the Demon Deacons were invited to Birmingham, Ala., to compete in the second -- and last -- Dixie Bowl. Unlike that first postseason experience, though, this venture proved unfulfilling from a won-lost standpoint as Wake Forest dropped a hard-fought 20-7 contest to Baylor in what was frequently referred to at the time as the "Battle of the Baptists."

A crowd of over 20,000 was in attendance as Baylor jumped out to a 20-0 lead with three touchdowns in the first half, two coming on lengthy drives, the third following a long pass interception. The Deacs of Coach Peahead Walker refused to quit, however, and rallied to pull within striking distance on a TD by Mike Sprock in the third period after recovering a Baylor fumble. Wake went on to control most of the game and held the advantage statistically overall (six more first downs, 63 more yards in total offense), but never could reach paydirt again. The contest marked the first time that a Wake Forest football team had played in a January bowl game. The Demon Deacons finished the season with a 6-4 record.

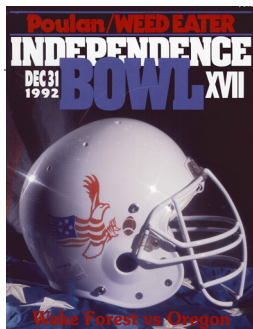
The Tigers seized the momentum early with touchdown drives on their first two possessions. Wake Forest, meanwhile, was struggling offensively and committed three turnovers before Phil Denfeld made the score 24-3 with a field goal as the first half ended.

Coach John Mackovic's Deacs came back to play much better after intermission, taking the second half kickoff and scoring their lone TD of the night on an eight-play drive that ended with a 34-yard pass from Jay Venuto to Wayne Baumgardner. Two other drives into LSU territory were halted, though, and the SEC power eventually built its advantage with 10 more points in the final period.

Wake Forest staged a stirring second half rally for a 39-35 victory over Oregon before 31,337 fans and a national television audience on ESPN, concluding a stunning year in appropriate fashion. The Deacons had been 1-3 in September until reeling off six straight wins to climb into the national polls for the first time in 13 years and capture the imagination of college football followers everywhere.

Oregon held the upper hand early, taking advantage of four first-half turnovers to build a 22-10 halftime lead, then adding another TD late in the third period that left the Deacs trailing, 29-10, with less than 20 minutes remaining in the game. Ned Moultrie scored on a short run, then Todd Dixon, who was named the game's Most Outstanding Player, exploded with TD receptions of 30 and 61 yards in less than four minutes to give his team a 31-29 edge that it would never

relinquish. John Leach, who ran for 116 yards, added what proved to be the deciding score later in the final quarter. Dixon finished with five receptions for 166 yards and two TDs, while veteran coach Bill Dooley completed his outstanding career with victory No. 162.

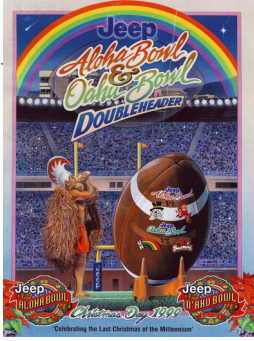

A Wake Forest team anchored by 26 seniors earned the first winning season and first bowl bid in head coach Jim Caldwell's tenure. That veteran leadership helped the Deacs to an impressive 23-3 win over Arizona State in the nationally-televised Jeep Aloha Bowl on Christmas Day.

Both teams got off to a slow start offensively, and the score was tied 3-3 at intermission. The Deacs got rolling in the second half, however, blanking ASU 20-0. After another field goal, Wake broke the game open as quarterback Ben Sankey hit Coach's son, Jimmy Caldwell, across the middle, and Caldwell scampered 56 yards into the endzone. The Sun Devils managed just 42 yards of offense after that point, as Morgan Kane's 1-yard TD leap and Matt Burdick's third field goal provided the final margin.

Sankey earned Bowl MVP honors, passing for 188 yards and rushing for 56.

The Deacon defense was stifling, holding the Sun Devils to just 164 yards of total offense. Adrian Duncan led the defense with eight tackles and a sack, while Fred Robbins collected three sacks.

In his last game at WFU, James MacPherson passed for a season-high 241 yards and two touchdowns as the Deacons beat Oregon 38-17 in the Seattle Bowl.

MacPherson, who also ran for a score, hit Jason Anderson with TD tosses of 57 and 63 yards to earn MVP honors. Wake Forest (7-6) finished with a winning record for the second straight year. The Deacons last had consecutive winning seasons in 1987-88.

The second annual Seattle Bowl marked the first meeting between the Ducks and Demon Deacons since Dec. 31, 1992 in the Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. Wake Forest also won that game, 39-35.

Entering the game, Wake Forest was ranked eighth nationally in rushing offense, averaging 239.9 yards a game. The Deacs ran for 256 against Oregon, even with their early emphasis passing.

The Ducks opened the game with a 45-yard field goal, but Wake Forest answered with a seven-play, 65-yard drive, topped by Ovie Mughelli's one-yard touchdown run.

MacPherson found Anderson for a 57-yard scoring pass early in the second quarter to push Wake's lead to 14-3. MacPherson also added a one-yard touchdown dash just before halftime.

MacPherson, who had just six touchdown passes going into the game, closed the third quarter with his 63-yard touchdown pass to Anderson. Chris Barclay added a 12-yard TD run late in the game for the final margin. Anderson caught three passes for a career-best 157 yards.

He hooked up with John Tereshinski for a 39-yard gain on third-and-10, setting up Swank's second field goal, a 33-yarder with

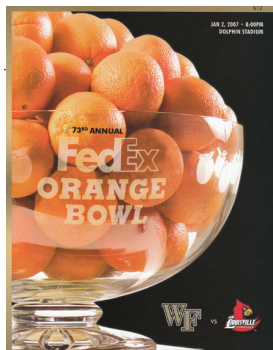

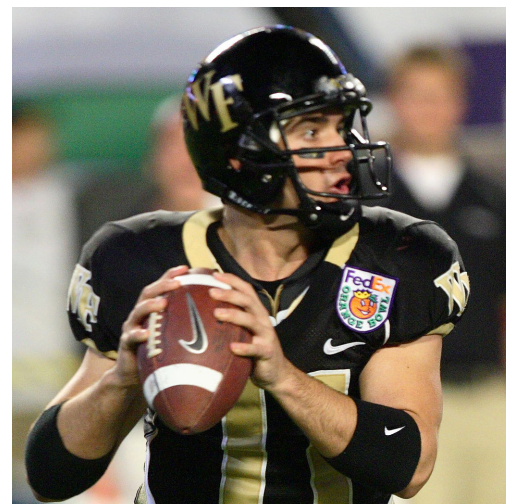

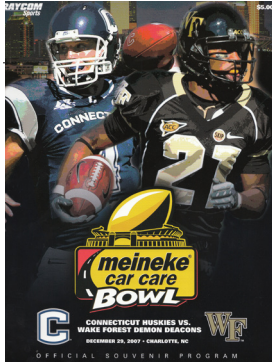

Linebacker Stanley Arnoux highlighted a series of big plays for Wake Forest with an interception and two fourth-down stops.

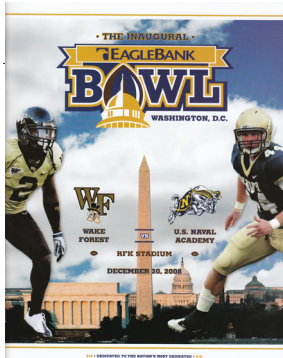
"Stanley Arnoux is one of those guys nobody talks about, but he might be our best defensive player," Grobe said.

Skinner went 11-for-11 and threw the go-ahead touchdown pass to Ben Wooster with 7:52 left, leading Wake Forest to a 29-19 comeback victory over the Midshipmen in the inaugural EagleBank Bowl to open the 2008 bowl season. He finished with 166 yards passing and was named the game's Most Valuable Player.

It was a rematch of a September game played at Wake Forest, when Navy took advantage of five turnovers by Skinner--four interceptions and a fumble--to pull off a 24-17 upset.

Navy scored the first 17 points in that game, but Skinner didn't flinch, directing Wake Forest (8-5) to a touchdown in the final minute of the first half and opened the third quarter with a 73-yard drive that ended with a 5-yard run by Josh Adams for a 14-13 lead.

Navy (8-5) went back in front when Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada scored on a 2-yard run with 12:30 to go, but Skinner went 4-for-4 for 69 yards in an 80-yard drive that ended with his 8-yard pass to Wooster. Skinner then hit Devon Brown in the back of the end zone for the conversion that made it 22-19.

Kevin Harris rushed for 136 yards in his first start since 2006, and Josh Adams scored two touchdowns for Wake Forest.

Senior cornerback Alphonso Smith set an ACC record with his 21st career interception.

After the Deacs had fallen behind by two scores in the fourth quarter, Jimmy Newman nailed a 46-yard field goal with 3:24 remaining in the game to cut the MSU lead to six points and Wake Forest followed by forcing a three and out to get the ball back. But Tanner Price fired incomplete on three straight passes to give the ball back to the Bulldogs, who were able to run out the clock and secure the victory.

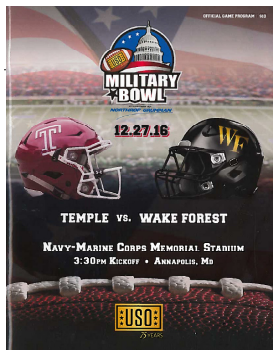

ANNAPOLIS, Md. -- The Wake Forest football team jumped out to a 31-7 lead and held on to defeat No. 23-ranked Temple, 34-26, to claim the 2016 Military Bowl inside Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium on Tuesday, Dec. 27. The victory was the Demon Deacons' first bowl win since 2008, and the first victory over a ranked team since 2011.

After the Owls (10-4) cut Wake Forest's (7-6) lead to 31-26 with 3:39 remaining, John Armstrong returned a kickoff 80 yards, leading to a Mike Weaver field goal with 1:59 left.

Temple returned the kickoff to its own 47-yard-line and completed a 9-yard pass, but the Deacons' defense held strong with a pass breakup by Thomas Brown and a tackle for loss by Duke Ejiofor, then an incomplete pass for a turnover on downs. Wake Forest entered victory formation and twice took a knee to seal the win.

Brown was named the Military Bowl MVP for his efforts on defense. He tied for the team lead with seven tackles, also adding a sack, 2.5 TFLs and a forced fumble, helping the Deacons shut down the Owl rushing game, limited to -20 yards.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. -- Wake Forest and Texas A&M engaged in the most entertaining bowl game of the season as the Demon Deacons came away with a 55-52 win over the Aggies on Dec. 29 in the Belk Bowl at Bank of America Stadium.

The game was a back-and-forth affair all afternoon and wasn't settled until Wake Forest running back Matt Colburn scored on a one-yard run with just 2:18 to play. The Deacon defense then forced the Aggies into a fourth down incomplection with 28 seconds remaining to seal the win.

The contest featured five lead changes and over 1,200 yards of total offense. The two teams combined to set NCAA bowl game records for total offense plays (191) and pass completions (74) by both teams. Colburn had 150 yards on 21 carries including an electric 66-yard run. Wide receiver Scotty Washington caught nine passes for 138 yards and a score while tight end Cam Serigne had a touchdown reception to go with nine catches and 112 yards receiving.

Linebacker Jaboree Williams led the Deacon defense with 11 tackles and an interception while safety Cam Glenn and linebacker Justin Strnad

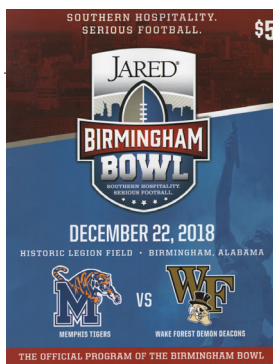
each had 10 tackles in the contest.

Memphis led 34-30 with 1:15 remaining in the game. The Deacons started their final drive of the day at their own 25 as Newman drove them to the one-yard line behind completions of 49 and 20 yards to senior Alex Bachman, the latter giving Wake Forest a first and goal at the Memphis one. Newman scored the final touchdown, his third of the game, on a one-yard run with 34 seconds left to play.

Wake Forest had to overcome a 28-10 deficit after the Tigers returned an interception and a kickoff for touchdowns in the second quarter.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Wake Forest football team fell to Wisconsin, 42-28, in the Duke's Mayo Bowl on Wednesday afternoon.

The Deacs are now 15-12 all-time in neutral site games played in Charlotte. It snapped a three-game winning streak in the Queen City that included 2017 Belk Bowl and 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl wins.

A four-game winning streak in October highlighted the Demon Deacons' run to a program record fifth-straight bowl appearance. The streak is the third longest in the ACC, trailing just Clemson and Miami (FL).

CHARLOTTE – Wake Forest's 2021 season will be remembered following a 10-win regular season and an Atlantic Division Championship. The Demon Deacons' (10-3, 7-1 ACC) bid to bring home the ACC Championship fell short on Saturday, Dec. 4 as Pitt (11-2, 7-1 ACC) defeated Wake Forest, 45-21.

It was an exciting week for the Wake Forest program since claiming its second division crown at Boston College last Saturday, as All-ACC left tackle Zach Tom was announced as the league's 2021 Jim Tatum Award recipient and head coach Dave Clawson earned the league's Coach of the Year honor. Additionally, a program record 15 players were named to the league's All-ACC team.

Despite the loss on Saturday in the ACC Championship to Pitt, Wake Forest's 10-3 record this season marks the second time in program history that it has won double-digit games. With that, Coach Clawson is the only active Power 5 head coach in the country to win double-digit games in a single season at four different Division I institutions.

The Deacs earned their 10 victories against a difficult schedule that featured nine bowl-eligible programs. Wake Forest was the first school in the ACC to become bowl eligible with a perfect mark of 6-0 and the Deacs 8-0 start to the season was the best in school history in addition to having the longest winning streak in school history.

JACKSONVILLE -- The 2021 Wake Forest football team capped off its historic season on New Year's Eve, defeating Big Ten foe Rutgers in the 77th annual TaxSlayer Gator Bowl 38-10 inside TIAA Bank Field on Friday.

No. 17 Wake Forest (11-3, 7-1 ACC) became just the second team in program history to win double-digit games and tied the program record with 11 victories while also setting a program record with seven conference victories and finished the home season with a perfect 6-0 mark.

Head Coach Dave Clawson became the first coach in program history to win four bowl games as all four titles have come during the Deacs current six-game bowl appearance streak. This run ranks as the second-longest in the ACC, trailing just Clemson.

The Deacs forced Rutgers (5-8, 2-7 Big Ten) to turn the ball over twice as Zion Keith and Gavin Holmes snared their first interceptions of the season. The Deacs limited the Scarlet Knights to just 271 total yards in the game, including 106 yards rushing.

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Sam Hartman ended his historic single-season campaign with Gator Bowl MVP honors. The Charlotte, N.C. native tossed three touchdown passes in the game and threw for 304 yards.

Fellow redshirt sophomore A.T. Perry collected 10 of Hartman's passes for 127 yards and pulled in his 15th touchdown reception of the season, tied for the fifth most in conference history.

Seniors Traveon Redd and Luke Masterson led Wake Forest's defense with seven tackles apiece in their final game in the Old Gold & Black.
